SCOUTING OHIO STATE:

No. 27 Ohio State is 36-14 with a 15-6 Big Ten record. The Buckeyes are coming off of a 2-1 series win over No. 25 Illinois at Champaign, IL and play Eastern Michigan on Tuesday before hosting Iowa.

Offensively, the Buckeyes are in the top three in nearly every statistical category in the conference except triples, hits, hit-by-pitches, sacrifice flies and stolen bases. They are led by Ryan Dew who is in the top five in batting average, slugging percentage, on base percentage and total bases when being compared with other Big Ten hitters. Dew is hitting a high .393. Other Buckeye sluggers are Dan Burkhard with a team-high 55 RBI and Michael Stephens with a team-best 11 home runs. The team is hitting .330 with 11 players hitting over .300.

The Buckeye pitching staff has a 4.71 ERA in the conference and are led by starter Dean Wolosiansky with a 6-0 record in seven starters. Starter Alex Wimmers has a team-best 61 strikeouts in 49.1 innings pitched and Eric Best is the other Buckeye starter.

Iowa trails the all-time series between the two schools, 42-64-1.

FLANAGAN AS A STARTER:

Freshman **Sean Flanagan** has taken advantage of his opportunities and has made the transition from starting left fielder to starting first baseman.

Flanagan is hitting .306 with four home runs and a .556 slugging percentage.

HITS, HITS, HITS!

Seventeen Hawkeyes have recorded at least one multi-hit game this season. Leading the team is **Ryan Durant** with 21, followed by **Justin Toole** with 17 and **Kurtis Muller** with 15.

Seven players are hitting above .300 so far this season, four of which are freshmen who have capitalized on their chances to play.

OFFENSIVE FINAL HOMESTAND:

The Iowa offense put on a show at home last week, despite going 2-2, as a team the Hawkeyes hit .366 with eight doubles, two triples and four bombs.

Kurtis Muller also contributed by stealing four of Iowa's six stolen bases of the week.

7:1 HBP LAST WEEKEND:

Last week, in the Hawkeyes' four contests against UW-Milwaukee and Penn State, the Iowa pitching staff hit only one batsman, whereas the opposing pitchers hit seven Hawkeyes.

PENN STATE SUMMARY:

Iowa dropped its final home series to Penn State, 2-1 last weekend.

The Hawkeyes beat Penn State, 5-3, Sunday. A four-spot in the bottom of the seventh inning helped snapped Iowa's eight-game losing skid in the Big Ten.

Starter **Jarred Hippen** went a career-high seven one-third innings and earned the victory, his third of the year. He allowed only three runs, one earned, on four hits with six strikeouts. Hippen's teammates helped the freshman southpaw with their defense, registering three double plays the first three innings. The Iowa bullpen featured **Steve Turnbull**, who went the final one and two-third innings, collecting a save and three strikeouts.

The Black and Gold dropped an extra-inning thriller, 5-4, to Penn State Saturday. It was the first extra-inning contest of the year for the Hawkeyes.

Starter **Phil Schreiber** got the no decision despite throwing a season-best six innings and allowing only three runs on eight hits with a career-high seven strikeouts. Hawkeye closer **Mike Schurz** got the loss, pitching a career-high five innings allowing two runs on six hits with four strikeouts.

Iowa dropped game one of the three-game weekend series to Penn State, 8-5, Friday night after a two-hour rain delay. The Hawkeyes plated one run in five consecutive innings and an additional run in the ninth. Six of the Nittany Lions' eight runs were driven in by a home run. Four different players for Penn State hit a round tripper.

Last weekend **Ryan Durant** went 8-for-14 with two RBI to lead Iowa. **Kurtis Muller** went 5-for-11 with two runs scored, two RBI, three walks and two stolen bases. **Wes Freie** went 5-for-11 with a double, two homers and three RBI.

1. Look for **Ryan Durant**, **Kurtis Muller** and **Mike McQuillan** to continue their hit streaks. Durant is at eight, Muller at nine and McQuillan at 10.

2. Look for **Dallas Burke** to continue swinging the bat well after a tremendous two weeks.

3. Look for **Steve Turnbull** to pitch solid relief from the bullpen this week in Columbus, OH. Last week, the senior righty allowed no hits or runs in 3.2 innings of work. He amassed seven strikeouts in his two appearances.

BURKE TAKES CATCHING ROLE:

Freshman catcher **Dallas Burke** has seen a lot of action this season due to the injuries of **Tyson Blaser** and **Kody McManis** however, he has stepped up to the plate and excelled, offensively, for the Hawkeyes.

Burke has hit 13-for-29 (.448) the past two weeks as a starter, manning the two-spot. He is hitting .316 this season.

YOUNGSTERS GET CHANCE:

Last week at Duane Banks Field only three upperclassmen were in the lineup. Six freshmen, three sophomores, one junior and two seniors got at least one at bat this past week.

MCMANIS IS OUT AFTER HBP:

Kody McManis took a pitch off the face against Michigan State and after having surgery is out for the season.

HOEF DONE FOR THE YEAR:

Kevin Hoef attempted to steal home in the final Corridor Classic last week and injured his hand after a head first slide. The senior third basemen played the remainder of the game.

Hoef ended his season with a .294 batting average, team-best two triples and 19 hit-by-pitches. He ends his career with a record 68 hit-by-pitches.

TOOLE IS OUT FOR THE SEASON:

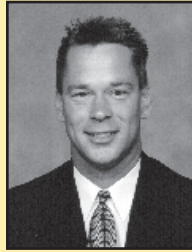
On his first at bat of game two against the Spartans, **Justin Toole** wore a pitch off his forearm. Despite being injured, Toole proceeded to steal two bases before being taken out of the game and to the hospital.

Toole ended the season with a .346 batting average, team-best 13 doubles and 15 stolen bases.

BLASER IS OUT FOR THE COUNT:

Tyson Blaser, who was plagued with injuries last season, had season-ending surgery on his hand about a month ago.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



Jack Dahm completed his fifth season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball team. He has compiled an 424-461-2 overall record and is 141-185 at Iowa. Dahm coached in his 800th career game on March 30th this year at Michigan. He is Iowa's third-winningest baseball coach.

In 2007, Iowa took another step forward by recording its best record in 14 years with a 31-23 mark. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13. Iowa earned its second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

In Dahm's 14 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his four years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 19 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers.

Before coming to Iowa City, Dahm spent 18 years as a member of the Creighton Bluejays baseball program. He left the Bluejays as the winningest coach in school history, having compiled 283 wins against 276 losses in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Twenty-seven of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues. In the past three years, nine Hawkeyes have inked contracts with professional teams, including three last spring.

In the classroom, Iowa is in the 90th-percentile in the NCAAs Academic Progress Report, placing them in the top 30 baseball programs, academically. During his Iowa tenure, Dahm has seen 33 players named academic all-Big Ten, including a team-record ten players in 2006. That is the best four-year total in the history of the program.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 15 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey.

The Hawkeyes have out scored opponents 56-37 in the second inning.

The Iowa bullpen is able to seal the deal and get the win if the team is winning after the seventh inning, Iowa is 13-0 in that situation.

HIPPEN PITCHES A GEM:

Freshman southpaw **Jarred Hippen** said his arm felt good Sunday after seven days of rest, to his normal five days. The starter went a career-high seven and one-third innings getting his third win of the season against the Nittany Lions.

SCHURZ GOES FIVE INNINGS:

Typical ninth inning go to guy, **Mike Schurz**, got the call to the bullpen in Saturday's game -- in the seventh inning. Despite getting the loss, Schurz pitched a career-high five innings allowing two runs on six hits with four strikeouts in the 11 inning game.

KEVIN LEE SHINES:

Pitcher **Kevin Lee** has seen action in 15 games this year and leads the team with a 3.38 ERA. Lee has pitched 13.1 innings and has 11 strikeouts.

OFFENSE HITS OVER THE FENCES:

Iowa currently has 36 home runs on the year, which is 14 more than all of last year. **Wes Freie** leads the way with eight and **T.J. Cataldo** has five bombs to lead the squad. (Freie had a total of four last season.) 12 Hawkeyes have recorded a round-tripper.

Wes Freie, Mike McQuillan and **Kurtis Muller** all hit big flies last week in Iowa's final homestand.

DURANT STRONG IN BIG TEN:

Ryan Durant has put together a solid junior campaign, including a season in conference play. When compared with other players at his position in the Big Ten, Durant ranks second-- just behind Purdue's Brandon Haveman. Durant is hitting .392 in the conference with 10 RBI and five stolen bases.

2009 UNITY COUNCIL:

The Unity Council is a group elected by their teammates to communicate internally with the coaches on behalf of their teammates. This year's council includes: senior **Kevin Hoef**, senior **Justin Toole**, junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Michael Jacobs** and sophomore **Kurtis Muller**.

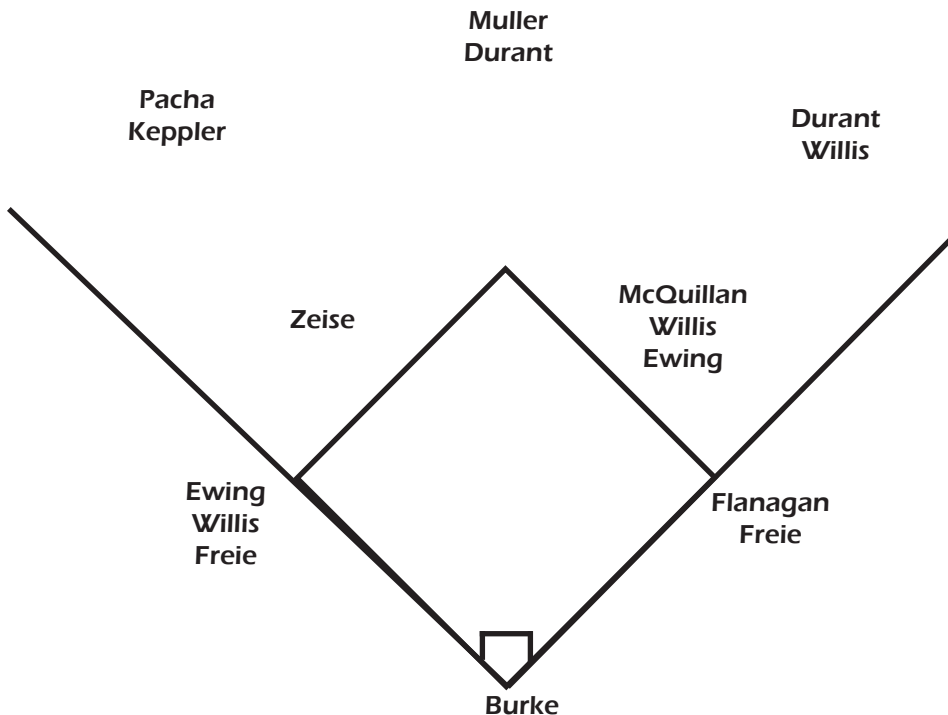

IOWA GETS THE WIN OVER NO. 25:

Iowa finished a three-game series against No. 25 Louisville, 1-2. Iowa upset the Cardinals on March 15 with a 2-1 score in Louisville, KY. The Hawk-eye pitching staff held Louisville to its lowest scoring output since April 20, 2008, against Villanova in a 3-1 loss.

Starter **Michael Jacobs** earned the win with a solid outing, going six innings and allowing just one run. Jacobs also earned Iowa's last win against a ranked opponent (6-3 win at No. 5 Vanderbilt last season). **Patrick Schatz** pitched one and two-third solid innings of relief -- forcing four Cardinal ground outs. **Mike Schurz** recorded the save going one and one-third innings with two strikeouts.

DAHM TAKES OVER #3:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history Saturday in the 9-4 win over Western Illinois. Dahm currently has 141 wins at Iowa.

Last season, Dahm captured his 400th career victory on April 23 against UNI. Dahm recorded 283 victories at Creighton and has won 122 at Iowa.

Dahm started in 1994 with his alma mater, Creighton University, and moved on to coach the Hawkeyes in 2003.

2009 CAPTAINS:

This season the Hawkeyes voted on captains, marking the first time at Iowa under coach Dahm. Senior **Justin Toole** and juniors **Michael Jacobs** and **Tyson Blaser** were given the honor of captain this past fall.

TOOLE NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Justin Toole picked up his first Big Ten Player of the Week honor on March 23rd after an outstanding numbers on the spring trip. He scored nine runs while driving in six and raising his batting average 51 points to .353 mark. The senior tallied four multi-hit games in six contests and racked up four extra-base hits. For the week, Toole batted .440 with a .680 slugging percentage and a .533 on-base percentage to combine for an OPS of 1.213. He is currently on a 10-game hitting streak.

FREIE NAMED HONORABLE MENTION:

Wes Freie made his third career start against Georgetown after a two-year hiatus on the mound and picked up the win.

Freie hit a solo homer to tie the game in the fourth and pitched five innings with seven strikeouts -- keeping the Hoyas off balance.

For his pitching, as well as hitting at DH, Freie was named honorable mention at utility for the College Baseball 360 all-Tournament team. Freie ended the weekend going 2-for-8 with four runs scored, a home run, two RBI and three walks.

T.J. WALKS HIS WAY INTO RECORDBOOK:

T.J. Cataldo walked a career-high four times in Iowa's 15-7 victory over Purdue on April 3rd. His four walks puts him in the record books for a game high, the last time a Hawkeye did so was 2007 (Jason White). Cataldo currently has eight on the year.

HAWKEYES SIGN THREE STANDOUTS:

Matt Dermody, **Ricky Sandquist**, and **Dan Sheppard** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa.

Dermody, a Norwalk, IA, native was recruited as a left-handed pitcher. He is the third-ranked pitcher in Iowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sandquist is from Fort Dodge, IA and will be used as a right-handed pitcher. He is the fourth-best pitcher in state of Iowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sheppard a Downers Grove, IL, native is an athletic catcher who can also play outfield. He is the top-ranked catcher in the state of Illinois by Perfect Game Cross Checker and Prep Baseball Report.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "**Whistlin'**" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 871-815-3 (.521).

Over the past eight seasons, Brownlee has had 16 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts.

Last season, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and hitting helped establish several team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was in 1981. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Brownlee's recruiting was a success in 2008. The incoming class was ranked the 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker. Iowa's ranking of 49 is the highest of any Big Ten team.

Chris Maliszewski is starting his first season as assistant coach for the Hawkeyes, replace Nick Zumsande.

Maliszewski returns to his alma mater after serving two seasons as the outfield and catching instructor and recruiting coordinator at Valparaiso University.

Prior to joining Valparaiso's staff, Maliszewski was a volunteer assistant coach for Dahm and the Hawkeyes in 2005 and 2006. Working with the pitching staff in 2005, he helped lead the Black and Gold to one of their most successful seasons in the program's history, posting a 19-13 Big Ten mark.

Maliszewski has also coached in the Northwoods League, a top collegiate summer league.

Kris Welker is in his third season as the team's volunteer assistant. Welker works with the Iowa catchers and outfielders, prepares scouting reports, coordinates team travel, coaches first base and is Iowa's camp coordinator.

As a player, Welker was a key member of the Hawkeyes in 2004 and 2005. As a senior, Welker earned third team all-Big Ten honors, helping Iowa to a third-place finish in the Big Ten and a trip to the conference tournament. He lead the team with a .354 batting average, 46 RBI and 16 doubles.
