Series Record: Iowa leads Austin Peay State 3-2, Iowa trails Illinois State 7-10.



THE SETTING:

Iowa will open its 2010 baseball season Saturday in Clarksville, TN, competing against Illinois State and Austin Peay in a doubleheader at Raymond C. Hand Park.

The first game is scheduled to start at 11 a.m. against Illinois State with the second starting shortly after, against Austin Peay. Saturday will be the first two of 18 games the Hawkeyes will play on the road before their home opener on March 26.

ON THE NET:

Iowa baseball fans can follow the Hawkeyes, as live stats will be available on hawkeyesports.com. Just click on the Gametracker link found on both the front page and the baseball schedule page. Whitsling Ray Gilmore enters his 33rd season with the Hawkeye baseball program and will be entering the stats.

FROM THE COACH:

"I am looking forward to this weekend, not only to start off the season but to finally get outside. I feel like there is not much more we can accomplish from inside the bubble. I like where the team is at right now, I like our work ethic so far and we will see where we stand after this weekend."

SCOUTING ILLINOIS STATE:

Illinois State is picked to finish fourth in the Missouri Valley Conference Preseason Coaches' Poll. In 2009, the Redbirds finished with a 25-23 record.

Illinois State returns seven position players and all three weekend starters. Last year's team produced the program's first winning season and conference tournament berth, since 2001. The Redbirds also welcome 14 newcomers.

Illinois State is led by redshirt junior Ryan Court, who hit .323 with a .488 slugging percentage, a team-best 41 RBI. The pitching staff is led by senior Ryan Copeland. He amassed a 3.63 ERA with a 4-5 record in 14 appearances and 12 starts. Copeland tossed 91.2 innings and compiled 69 strikeouts.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY:

Austin Peay State University's baseball team was picked to finish eighth of nine teams in the 2010 Ohio Valley Conference's preseason poll.

Austin Peay saw a streak of 10 consecutive OVC Tournament appearances end last season when the team finished 7-12 in league play. The Governors have 23 letter-winners back from last year's team, including nine positional starters and five starting pitchers.

Leading the Austin Peay squad is senior catcher Trey Lucas (.382, 20 doubles, 35 RBI), senior first baseman Matt Kole (.333, 9 home runs, 42 RBI). The Governors are led on the bump by junior Ryne Harper, won four games and had a team-low 4.12 E.R.A. a year ago.

MULLER IS BACK:

After a 2009 season of lingering injuries, junior outfielder **Kurtis Muller** was back to his old self this summer. He received several honors in the Northwoods League (NWL). Muller was named the NWL All-Star Game MVP after going 3-for-5 with a run scored and two stolen bases batting leadoff for the South division in a 4-2 win over the North. Muller finished the summer season named to the post season all-star team. He ranked in the top ten in batting average (.335), on base percentage (.409), stolen bases (19) and runs (40).

BLASER REDSHIRTS:

Redshirt junior, **Tyson Blaser**, has been MIA in the Hawkeye lineup essentially the past two seasons due to injuries and will start the 2010 campaign healthy after having season-ending surgery on his right thumb last April. Blaser took a medical redshirt.

INFIELD HAS NEW LOOK:

With former starters **Kevin Hoef**, **Justin Toole**, **TJ Cataldo** and **Wes Freie** out of the picture, the Hawkeyes have a lot of new faces in the infield. The only positive to Iowa's plague of injuries a year ago, is that every 2010 starter in the infield has game experience.

Sophomore **Chett Zeise** will take over as Iowa's starting third baseman this spring, and junior transfer, **Kurtis Lee**, will take over at shortstop. Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** will continue in the starting second baseman role, while sophomore **Sean Flanagan** will play at first.

ROBERTSON TEARS UP NWL:

Senior pitcher **Zach Robertson** had a tremendous summer in the NWL. The Rochester Honker ace not only won the league championship in a 7-4 triumph over the LaCrosse Loggers but set two league records. Robertson finished the season with a league-best career strikeouts record to 266 following the win. Also, the championship start extended his record-breaking total to 37 starts. He was also an all star selection and received post season all-star honors. The Des Moines native ended the summer season with a 7-3 record and compiled a 2.57 ERA with 95 strikeouts.

LEE TAKES OVER AS CLOSER:

Junior **Kevin Lee** was recruited for the Hawkeyes as a catcher. But two years and a very successful summer season later—he will be heading to the bump in the ninth for Iowa.

In the Prospect League, Lee finished with a league-high 10 saves for the Quincy Gems. He appeared in 29 games and finished with a 1.89 ERA and 57 strikeouts in 38 innings. He earned the save in championship win for the Quincy Gems, winning the Prospect League.

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

1. Junior **Kurtis Muller** enters the 2010 season with a 12-game hitting streak intact. Look for the leadoff hitter to continue it in the season opener.

2. With two southpaw pitchers as probable starters, look for senior **Ryan Durant** and redshirt junior **Tyson Blaser** to swing the bat well. Durant hit .340 and Blaser .467 last season against lefties.

3. This is the first time since practice has started that the team gets to play outside.

RETURNING DEPTH:

Despite losing several key players from 2009, the Hawkeyes have a lot of experience returning. Returning lettermen in the outfield include: **Ryan Durant**, **Phil Keppler**, **Kurtis Muller**, **Jeff Pacha** and **Trevor Willis**.

The infield returns: **Tyson Blaser**, **Dallas Burke**, **Andrew Ewing**, **Sean Flanagan**, **Zach McCool**, **Mike McQuillan** and **Chett Zeise**.

The pitching staff also returns with a lot of depth, including: **Nick Brown**, **Jarred Hippen**, **Michael Jacobs**, **Zach Kenyon**, **Kevin Lee**, **Zach Robertson**, **Patrick Schatz** and **Phil Schreiber**.

HAWKEYES ARE STREAKIN':

Junior **Kurtis Muller** enters the 2010 season with a 12-game hitting streak intact.

Other Hawkeyes on a roll from a year ago are: **Phil Keppler** (6), **Chett Zeise** (3) and **Dallas Burke** (2).

ALL-TIME SERIES NOTES:

Iowa is 3-2 against Austin Peay and 7-9 vs. Illinois State.

Last season, the Hawkeyes went 1-2 against Austin Peay, March 6-8, 2009, in Clarksville, TN. Iowa won the series opener 15-9, but dropped the last two contests of the series 10-4 and 20-9. Chett Ziese went 3-for-5 and Ryan Durant went 4-for-12 against the Governors a year ago.

Illinois State dropped Iowa 9-6 last year in Normal, IL, on April 1, 2009. Durant recorded three hits and four RBI, while Kurtis Muller had two singles against the Redbirds last year.

2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:

Three Hawkeyes were drafted in the Major League Baseball's 2009 First-Year Player Draft. Right-handed fireballer **Steve Turnbull**, lefty relief pitcher **Kyle Heim** and closer **Mike Schurz** all signed contracts in June. Three-time all-Big Ten selection **Justin Toole** later signed a free agent contract.

Other draftees included current Iowa freshmen: **Matt Dermody** and **Dan Sheppard**.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Iowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, Iowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

SOPHOMORES EXCEL:

Sophomore pitchers **Jarred Hippen** and **Phil Schreiber** had a great summer season in the Prospect League. Combined, the two finished up with a 13-3 record, striking out 132 in 131 innings pitched.

JUNIOR TRANSFER TAKES OVER AT SHORT:

Junior transfer **Kurtis Lee** comes to Iowa from Redding, CA and will replace former Iowa standout **Justin Toole**. A unanimous all-Golden Valley Conference selection at shortstop, Lee was named best all-around player. Lee led Shasta with a .379 batting average, 41 runs scored, 24 walks and 17 steals.

DURANT NAMED MVP

Senior **Ryan Durant** was honored as the team's co-MVP Monday, Feb. 15 at the team's first annual Steak Fry.

In 2009, Durant was named first team all-conference after leading the Iowa team in batting average (.370), games played (49), at bats (181), multi-hit games (23) and ranked in the top five in several other categories.

Durant shared the honor with former Hawk-eye **Justin Toole**.

DERMODY MAKES HISTORY:

In June, **Matt Dermody** was drafted by the Pittsburgh Pirates, five days later, the Norwalk, IA, native, was making national news on the mound.

The left-handed pitcher threw a perfect six-inning game in a 10-0 win. Not only was it a perfect game, but Dermody struck out all 18 batters he faced, a first for an Iowa high school athlete. Additionally, he helped out offensively, hitting a home run.

His efforts made ESPN's "SportsCenter" Wednesday night, among other national publications.

IOWA NATIVE VOLUNTEERS:

Zach Dillon is in his first season as a volunteer coach at the University of Iowa.

Dillon, a native of Urbandale, IA, attended Baylor University and was subsequently selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 20th Round (595th overall) of the 2006 amateur entry draft as a catcher. His honors include 2005 ABCA second team all-Midwest Region selection, 2005 first team all-Big 12 Conference honoree and a nine time Big 12 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll recipient.

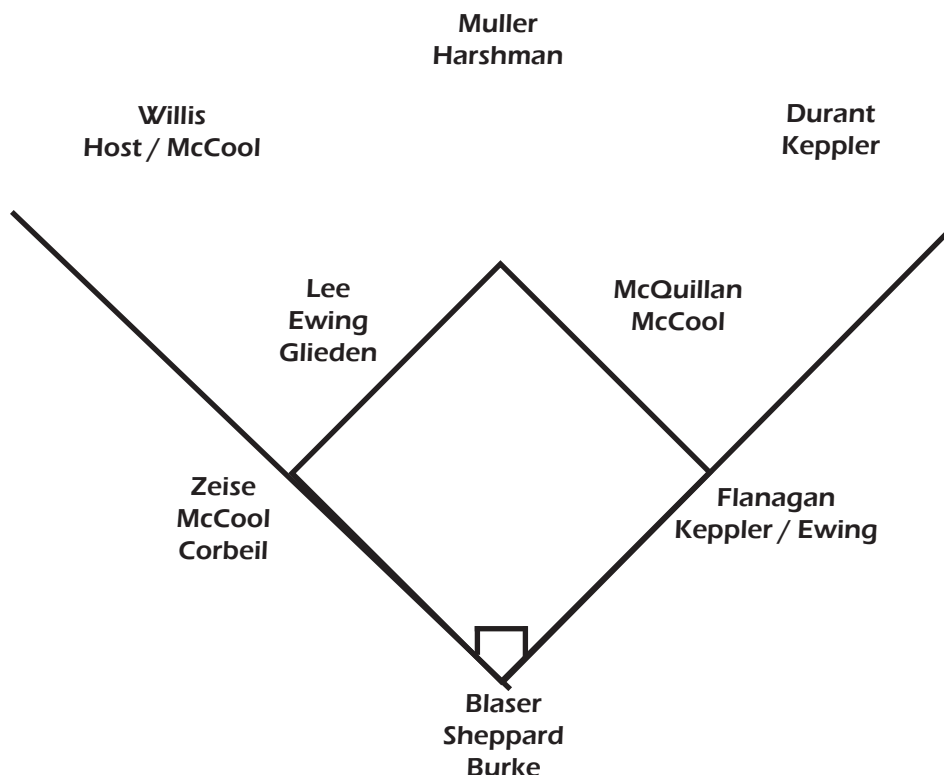
Dillon will work with the catchers, assist with hitters and take over as camp coordinator.

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

Every year the UI Athletics Department continues to upgrade Duane Banks Field. This year's primary addition is 500 new chair back seating behind home plate.

For the first time, season tickets are available for purchase. Fans can reserve their own chair backs for the 2010 season by calling the UI Athletic Ticket Office at 1-800-IA-HAWKS.

Besides that, in 2009, the Recreation Building underwent a complete makeover. Improvements included: a new locker room, lounge, training room and weight room.

LET THE BLOGGING BEGIN:

Iowa junior **Kurtis Muller** will be writing a weekly blog for pingbaseball.com this season. Hawkeye fans will be able to link to his weekly blog through hawkeyesports.com.

Muller was recognized as a freshman all-American by Ping! in 2008. The native of Sun Prairie, WI, is a three-time Unity Council member and an ISAAC representative.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 871-818-3 (.516).

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Zach Dillon**.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks than the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

Iowa Head Baseball Coach **Jack Dahm** has announced that **Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski** and **Taylor Zeutenhorst** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and **Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler** and **Aaron Smit** intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.
