Series Record: Iowa leads 37-14 (Last Meeting, IND 67-53, March 1, 2007)

THE SETTING

Two of the hottest teams in the Big Ten clash Sunday at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa (14-7, 7-3) riding a season-best five-game winning streak, hosts Indiana (13-8, 6-3), who has won four of its last five at 1:05 p.m. (CST). Sunday will be the only regular season meeting between the two teams.

The Hawkeyes are in a three-way tie with Minnesota and Ohio State for first place in the conference standings, while the Hoosiers are only a half game behind. Iowa's five-game winning streak is the longest active winning streak in the league.

25 YEARS IN CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA CELEBRATION

lowa will honor and celebrate the completion of playing 25 seasons in Carver-Hawkeye Arena Sunday. There will be a special ceremony at halftime.

Coincidentally, Feb. 3 is the 23rd anniversary of the Iowa-Ohio State game where 22,157 fans packed the arena and shattered an NCAA women's basketball attendance record.

ON THE TUBE

Sunday's game will be televised live in Eastern Iowa on KCRG-TV9. John Campbell, Amy Herrig and Scott Saville will call the action. This will be Iowa's last game on KCRG-TV9 this season.

ON THE RADIO

Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call Sunday afternoon's game for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the contest on WHO 1040-AM in Des Moines, WMT 600-AM in Cedar Rapids and KXIC 800-AM in Iowa City. Balbinot is in his fourth season as Iowa's play-by-play voice, while Till is in her third providing analysis.

IOWA HISTORY

lowa has played 959 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, lowa's record is 582-377 (.607). That includes a 290-144 (.668) mark in Big Ten contests and 268-81 (.768) in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

ALL-TIME SERIES

Sunday will be the 52nd meeting between Iowa and Indiana, with the Hawkeyes leading the series 37-14. Iowa boasts a 20-3 record against the Hoosiers in Iowa City.

The Hawkeyes have won six of the last eight in the series, including 10-straight inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa defeated Indiana (71-67) on Jan. 11, at Bloomington, IN, but fell (67-53) on March 1, at Indianapolis in the Big Ten Tournament, in last year's two meetings.

SCOUTING INDIANA

The Hoosiers cruised to an 86-62 triumph over Wisconsin Thursday night at Bloomington, IN. The 86 points are the most the Hoosiers have scored this season. Five players netted double digits, led by junior Whitney Thomas (16). Indiana collected 12 steals and forced 23 turnovers, scoring 28 points off the Badgers' miscues. The Hoosiers also shot 50.8 percent (31-61) from the field in victory.

Sunday concludes a stretch of playing five of seven contests away from Assembly Hall. Indiana is 5-4 in true road games and 6-6 in all games away from Bloomington.

Four Indiana starters average double figures: Jamie Braun (14.8), Whitney Thomas (12.2), Amber Jackson (12.0) and Kim Roberson (11.1). Thomas nearly averages a double-double, averaging 9.5 rebounds per contest.

Indiana ranks first in Big Ten steals (9.3). The Hoosiers also rank second in turnover margin (+2.38) and third in rebounding (38.4).

Felisha Legette-Jack is in her second season (32-22, .593) as Indiana's head coach and seventh (89-85, .511) as a head coach.

LAST MEETING

The Iowa Hawkeyes fell (67-53) to the Indiana Hoosiers in the first round of the 2007 Big Ten Tournament.

lowa was plagued by cold shooting, as it shot just 35 percent from the field and made only 4-19 from long distance in its season-ending loss to the Hoosiers. The Hawkeyes, who missed their first 11 3-point attempts, entered the game as the second-best 3-point shooting team in the nation.

After scoring 103 points in its regular season finale vs. Wisconsin, Iowa stumbled out of the gate, failing to score in the first six minutes. The Hawkeyes fell behind 18-6 midway through the first half and 40-25 early in the second. Indiana's biggest advantage was 16 (48-32) with eight minutes to play.

Nicole VanderPol was the only Hawkeye to reach double digits. The sophomore netted 12 points to go along with a game and career-high nine rebounds. Kristi Smith added nine points and Abby Emmert and Krista VandeVenter tallied eight each. Wendy Ausdemore, Iowa's second-leading scorer, was held scoreless, going 0-9 from the floor.

Seven of Smith's nine points came in the first half. Her seventh point was her 400th of the season, becoming only the 22nd Hawkeye to accomplish the feat.

The Hoosiers were led by Kim Roberson and Sarah McKay. Roberson came off the bench to lead all scorers with 21 points, while McKay contributed 19 points and six rebounds.

The Hawkeyes did out-rebound the Hoosiers by three (39-36).

IOWA. INDIANA NOTES

• Juniors Kristi Smith and Megan Skouby started their first career game at Indiana (Dec. 29, 2005). Skouby averages 12.5 points and 6.8 rebounds, while Smith averages 12 points and 4.3 assists in four games vs. the Hoosiers.

• Iowa is 14-2 when scoring 60 points or more and 12-1 when having a higher field goal percentage than the opposition.

• Iowa has held 12 opponents to 58 points or less this season (10-2).

Kristi Smith has netted 15 points, or more, a team-best eight times this year.
Iowa is in the middle of a stretch of playing four-of-five games at home,

with the road contest being at Northwestern.
lowa has begun playing its final 10 regular season games, a statistic that the NCAA Committee looks at when determining at-large berths for the NCAA Tournament. The Hawkeyes have started this final stretch 2-0.

• Iowa has three wins over top-40 RPI rated teams (Minnesota, 27; Penn State, 38; Purdue, 39). The Hawkeyes are 50th in the latest RPI rankings, while Indiana is 60th.

• Iowa is 114-15 when leading at the half in eight years under Coach Bluder. The Hawkeyes have led at half in seven of their 10 conference games this year. Iowa is 95-19 when holding opponents to 69 points or less, including a 44-3 mark when opponents score 59 points or less.

• Point guard Kristi Smith has collected seven assists four times this year (Dartmouth, Mississippi State, Western Illinois and Minnesota).

 lowa played five non-conference games against teams from a major conference: SEC (Mississippi State), Pac-10 (Arizona State), ACC (Georgia Tech), Big XII (Iowa State) and MWC (Wyoming).

• Iowa's 44-point win over N. Illinois (87-43) tied the program's 17th-largest margin of victory, equaling its 93-49 win over Iowa State (Nov. 29, 1987).

PROBLEM SOLVER

Sixth-year senior Johanna Solverson has played well the last three weeks. In Iowa's last eight games, the native of Lake Zurich, IL, averaged 11.9 points, 4.8 rebounds and 3.5 assists.

Solverson helped lead lowa to four victories the last 11 days (Illinois, Purdue, Michigan and Northwestern). The senior had five assists in each of lowa's wins over Illinois and Purdue, seven assists, seven rebounds and nine points in a road win at Northwestern and led all scorers with a career-high 28 points in the Hawkeyes' five-point triumph over Michigan last Sunday. Solverson shot at a 42 percent (8-19) clip from 3-point territory in the four victories.



Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her eighth season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 24th season as a college head coach. Bluder, 44, has a career record of 496-236 (.678), including a 140-94 (.598) record at Iowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to six post-season



tournaments (4 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and four upper-division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. In 2004-05, Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing. In 2005-06, Bluder mentored a team plagued by injuries to a fifth-place Big Ten finish and an NCAA Tournament berth.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (10) and Emma (7) and one son, David (5).

IOWA WINS FIFTH STRAIGHT WITH VICTORY AT NORTHWESTERN

lowa led by as many as 23 points en route to a 70-55 victory at Northwestern Thursday night. The Hawkeyes outrebounded the Wildcats by 15 (49-34) and Iowa's bench outscored Northwestern's reserves 29-0.

Megan Skouby, who entered the game averaging 19.7 points in three previous games against the Wildcats, poured in a season-high 23 points (7-13 FG, 9-10 FT). She also hauled in seven rebounds. Also cleaning up the glass was Jenee Graham with a game-high 11 rebounds, while Johanna Solverson and Wendy Ausdemore secured seven boards each.

Northwestern cut Iowa's double-digit lead to only seven with 10:35 remaining, but Hawkeye point guard Kristi Smith took over. Smith netted 12 of her 15 points in the final 10 minutes to help re-establish a double-digit cushion.

lowa was victorious despite allowing Northwestern to shoot 63 percent (17-27) from the field in the second stanza. The Wildcats started the contest shooting 12.5 percent (3-24).

· Jenee Graham matched a career high with seven assists. It was the third time in her career she assisted on seven field goals in a single game.

• Iowa only had 11 turnovers against the Wildcats. The Hawkeyes had a season-low nine turnovers in their last game vs. Michigan last Sunday.

· Iowa assisted on 11 of its 13 first-half field goals and 19 of its 25 for the game. Iowa recorded all 19 assists despite Iowa's assist leader, Kristi Smith, not collecting a single assist.

• Northwestern trailed 40-21, but went on a 13-1 run to cut the Hawkeye lead to seven (41-34) with 10 minutes left in the game. Iowa went on a 6:41 field goal scoring drought during the Wildcat surge.

 Both teams started the game ice-cold from the floor; lowa missed its first seven field goal attempts, while Northwestern missed its first four. Iowa held Northwestern to only two points (1-12 FG) the first 9:30 of the game. Furthermore, five different Hawkeyes scored Iowa's first five field goals of the contest.

BLUDER APPROACHES MILESTONE

Head Coach Lisa Bluder, the dean of Big Ten coaches, is only three victories (497) from reaching her 500th career win. Bluder amassed 169 wins at St. Ambrose (1984-1990), 187 victories at Drake (1990-2000) and 141 at Iowa (2000-07).

SMITH AND SOLVERSON'S NUMBERS RISE DURING BIG TEN PLAY

Point guard Kristi Smith and small forward Johanna Solverson's numbers have improved since conference play.

Smith averaged 11 points and 3.2 assists in Iowa's 11 non-conference games. In Iowa's 10 Big Ten games, she is averaging 15.4 points and 3.2 assists. Furthermore, she is averaging 16.7 points and 2.7 assists the last seven games.

Solverson, a team co-captain, averaged 5.8 points and 1.8 assists during non-league play and 11.4 points and 3.4 assists during conference action. She is Iowa's assists leader during conference play.

Last season lowa ranked last in Big Ten scoring defense (71.7) and field goal percentage defense (.447).

Through 21 games this year, lowa ranks first in conference field goal percentage defense (.376), third in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.296) and scoring defense (58.6).

DOWNTOWN SUCCESS

lowa has been very accurate shooting the ball behind the arc this season. The Hawkeyes rank third in the Big Ten, shooting 36.4 percent (116-319) from 3-point range. Three Hawkeyes have combined for 103 of their 116 triples (Wendy Ausdemore, 48; Kristi Smith, 31; Johanna Solverson, 26). Iowa has shot 40 percent or better from 3-point range nine times this year, including a season-best 62.5 percent (10-16) against Northern Illinois. Last season, Iowa ranked third nationally in 3-point shooting percentage (.402).

Ausdemore currently ranks fourth in 3-pointers made for an Iowa junior (48).

SHARP-SHOOTER

Junior Wendy Ausdemore doesn't get to the free throw line very much, only 1.6 attempts in 80 games the last three years, but rarely misses when she toes the line. She equaled her season high with six free throw attempts (making five) in Iowa's win over Purdue.

Ausdemore has missed only 13 free throws in her career (.887, 110-123). The native of Neola, IA, broke the lowa single-season free throw percentage (.902, 55-61) and Big Ten-season free throw percentage (.975, 39-40) records her sophomore campaign.

BIG TEN RANKINGS

lowa ranks third in nine Big Ten statistical categories: 3-point field goal percentage defense (.296), field goal percentage (.430), 3-pointers made (5.52), assists (14.81), 3-point field goal percentage (.364), scoring margin (+5.5), rebounds allowed (33.8), scoring defense (58.6) and assist/turnover ratio (0.89). The Hawkeyes also rank first in field goal percentage defense (.376). Individually, Wendy Ausdemore ranks second in 3-pointers made (2.29), 3-point field goal percentage (.421) and 23rd in scoring (10.8). Kristi Smith ranks ninth in assist/turnover ratio (1.29), 10th in 3-pointers made (1.48), 11th in assists (3.19) and scoring (13.1) and 12th in free throw percentage (.789).

SOLVERSON RETURNS FOR SIXTH SEASON

Johanna Solverson has been granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA after missing the last two seasons due to consecutive ACL tears in her right knee. Solverson has played with 27 different players during her six years at lowa.

The 6-2 small forward played in all but one game her first three seasons. One of Iowa's most versatile players, she boasts a career average of 8.5 points, 4.4 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.6 steals in 115 games.

Solverson becomes only the second lowa women's basketball player to receive a sixth year from the NCAA. Simone Edwards (1993-97) received a sixth year after suffering two season-ending knee injuries. Edwards played two full seasons and a partial third with the Hawkeyes after transferring to lowa from Seminole Junior College.

HAWKEYES PEN FIVE TO NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT

Hannah Draxten, Shante Jones, Kelly Krei, Tia Mays and Kamille Wahlin have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa.

"This is a large balanced class that covers every position," said Head Coach Lisa Bluder.

Draxten, a 6-0 wing player, has been a varsity starter since eighth grade, starting in 104 consecutive games for Fergus Falls High School in Minnesota. She has been the team's leading scorer all four years. A two-year team captain, Draxten holds the all-time Fergus Falls High School records (boys and girls) for scoring (1,830) and rebounding (755). She has averaged 17.6 points and 7.3 rebounds over her career. Draxten is a two-time Class 3A first team all-state and all-conference honoree.

Wahlin, a native of Crookston, MN, is a 5-8 left-handed point guard who averaged 19.9 points for her Crookston High School basketball team that went 24-3 a year ago. A third-year captain, she boasts career averages of 16.5 ppg, 4.8 apg and 3.0 spg. Wahlin established school records in scoring, assists, steals and field goals. Her team finished second in the Minnesota state tournament her sophomore campaign, where she was recognized on the all-tournament squad. She was tabbed Minnesota Coaches Association All-State and was her team's MVP the last two seasons. Wahlin sank 47 consecutive free throws last year. Wahlin played on the same AAU team (North Tartan Larson) as Draxten last summer.

Krei, a native of Iowa City, has averaged 17.9 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 2.1 assists the last three years for City High. A two-time captain, she was a first team all-state honoree her freshman and junior years and was a second team selection as a sophomore. Krei is a three-time first team all-conference, all-district and all-area honoree. The 6-2 forward was named the 2007 Mississippi Valley Conference Player of the Year in basketball and track.

Mays, a native of Des Moines, is a four-year starter for Des Moines East High School. She was a pre-season Street & Smith's honorable mention all-American in 2006. Last season as a junior, she was an all-state, all-conference and all-district performer. A second-year captain, she helped lead her team to a school-best 19-5 record and a berth to the Girls State Tournament. A 6-1 forward, she led the Lady Scarlets in points (15 ppg), rebounds (10 rpg), blocks (4 bpg) and field goal percentage (63%).

Jones is a 5-9 guard/forward from Dayton, OH. Jones played her first two years at Stivers School for the Arts and competed for Carroll High School last season. She averaged 17.8 points her junior year and was tabbed first team all-league and second team all-conference, all-district and all-southwest. Jones was named MVP of Carroll High School her junior season. She was selected first team all-league, all-conference and all-district her sophomore campaign. Jones was the highest scorer in the area her sophomore year (28.0 ppg) and named Stivers High School MVP.


