Iowa (12-18, 5-12) closes the regular season at Northwestern (8-19, 1-15) Tuesday, March 4 as the teams meet for the second time in two weeks. Game time is 8:05 p.m. in Welsh-Ryan Arena (8,117).

Iowa lost to Illinois 58-47 Saturday in Iowa City. Northwestern dropped a 68-43 decision at Purdue Saturday. Iowa defeated the Wildcats 53-51 in the first meeting.

ON THE AIR

Radio: Iowa games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network. Gary Dolphin handles the play-by-play, along with color commentator Bob Hansen. The Hawkeye Radio Network coverage includes a 60-minute pre-game show.

Television: The Big Ten Network will carry the game to a national cable audience. The game can also be viewed on DIRECTV (channel 220) and the DISH Network (channel 439). Mel Proctor and Jimmy Jackson will call the action.

<u>IOWA HISTORY</u>

Iowa has played 2,438 games since beginning basketball in 1902. Overall Iowa's record is 1,450-988 (.595). That includes a 912-316 (.743) record in home games, a 538-672 (.445) record in games away from Iowa City, a 689-677 (.504) mark in Big Ten games and a 318-90 (.779) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

<u>TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE CHANGES</u>

The Big Ten Conference has announced starting times and television coverage for all games in the Big Ten Conference Tournament. The event will take place March 13-16 at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

Three games will be played Thursday, March 13, at 11 a.m. and 1:30 and 4 p.m., CT. The Big Ten Network will televise the opening game, while games two and three will air on ESPN2.

Friday's action includes four games. Those times are 11 a.m. and 1:30, 5:30 and 8 p.m., CT. The first two games on Friday will air on ESPN, while the two evening games will be on the Big Ten Network.

The semi-final games on Saturday will start at 12:40 and 3 p.m., CT. Sunday's title game is set for 2:30 p.m., CT. CBS will televise both semi-final games and the championship contest.

A complete tournament bracket is included with this release. Tournament pairings will be released Sunday, March 9, following the completion of all regular season games. Iowa will play Thursday, at either 11 a.m. CT or 1:30 p.m. CT.

Coach Todd Lickliter

Todd Lickliter is in his first season as the head basketball coach at the University of Iowa. Lickliter spent the last six seasons as the head coach at Butler University.

Lickliter, in his seventh season as a college head coach, holds a career mark of 143-79 (.644), including a 12-18 record in his first season at Iowa. Lickliter posted a 131-61 (.682) record as Butler's head coach. He led Butler to four post-season tournament berths,



including trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2003 and 2007.

Lickliter was named the 2006-07 Division I Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and was recognized as the High-Major Coach of the Year by collegehoops.net. He was also named 2007 Horizon League Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year after guiding the Bulldogs to a school and league-record 29 victories.

He led Butler to the regular season co-championship in the Horizon League in 2007. The Bulldogs advanced to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament before falling to eventual national champion Florida (65-57).

Butler during the 2006-07 season won three games over top 25 opponents (Tennessee, Gonzaga, Maryland) and recorded eight victories over teams that participated in the NCAA Tournament.

Butler averaged 22 wins per year under Lickliter, winning league titles in 2002, 2003 and 2007 while winning at least 20 games in four of six seasons.

Lickliter led the Bulldogs to an unbeaten home record (12-0) in 2002-03, and mentored Butler to a 70-12 (.854) home mark in his six seasons. His Bulldog teams were 6-5 against teams ranked in the "Top 25" and compiled four of the top 10 winning streaks in Butler history.

In his first season as Butler's head coach, Lickliter guided the Bulldogs to a then school-record 26 victories and a third consecutive Horizon League regular season title.

Lickliter guided the 2003 Bulldogs to an even more impressive season in his second year as head coach. He led Butler to a 27-6 record, breaking the single-season mark for victories for a second consecutive year.

Lickliter served as an assistant coach at Butler and Eastern Michigan and was a high school head coach in Indianapolis and Danville, IL.

In his final two seasons as a Butler assistant coach, the Bulldogs compiled a 47-16 record, including "Top 25" wins over 10th-ranked Wisconsin and 23rd-ranked Wake Forest. The win over the Demon Deacons in the 2001 NCAA Tournament was Butler's first NCAA Tournament victory in 39 years.

Lickliter played his final two collegiate seasons at Butler, where he earned a B.S degree in secondary education in 1979.

Lickliter is 1-0 vs. Northwestern and Wildcat Coach Bill Carmody.

HAWKEYES IN NATIONAL STATS

In NCAA statistical rankings, Iowa ranks fifth in scoring defense (58.0) and 36th in field goal defense (40.5%).

Senior guard Justin Johnson ranks 44th nationally in threepoint field goals per game (2.9).

IN THE RANKINGS

Iowa has played a ranked opponent in six of its Big Ten games, while Ohio State (first meeting) and Purdue (second meeting) were also listed among teams receiving votes in both major polls.

Michigan State was ranked sixth in both the Associated Press rankings and the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll at the time of the first meeting and No. 17/19 last week. Indiana was No. 11/12 and No. 7/8 and Wisconsin was No. 24/25 and No. 8/8.

LICKLITER VS. RANKED TEAMS

Iowa Coach Todd Lickliter holds a 7-10 record when coaching against nationally ranked opponents, including a 1-5 mark at Iowa and a 6-5 record in six seasons at Butler.

This season, Iowa defeated sixth-ranked Michigan State (43-36), while dropping decisions to 11th-ranked Indiana (76-79), 24th-ranked Wisconsin (51-64), seventh-ranked Indiana (65-43), eighth-ranked Wisconsin (54-60) and 17th-ranked Michigan State (52-66).

Lickliter's Butler teams defeated ranked opponents Louisville (14th), Maryland (18th), Mississippi State (20th), Ball State (21st), Tennessee (22nd) and Gonzaga (23rd). His teams are 0-3 vs. top five opponents, including losses to third-ranked Oklahoma in 2003, third-ranked Florida in 2007 and fifthranked Duke in 2003.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Iowa Coach Todd Lickliter was named the 2007 Division I national Coach of the Year by the National Basketball Coaches (NABC) after leading Butler to 29 wins and a spot in the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

With Iowa football Coach Kirk Ferentz earning national Coach of the Year in 2002, Iowa is one of three Division I institutions to have a former football and men's basketball national Coach of the Year currently coaching their respective team. The others are Florida (Urban Meyer and Billy Donovan) and Tennessee (Phillip Fulmer and Bruce Pearl).

Five current Big Ten Conference head coaches have earned national Coach of the Year honors.

NORTHWESTERN COACH BILL CARMODY

Bill Carmody is in his eighth season at Northwestern and his 12th year as a college head coach. Carmody holds a career mark of 195-156, which includes a 103-131 mark at Northwestern. Carmody posted a record of 92-25 in four seasons at Princeton University, where he was a member of the basketball staff for a total of 18 seasons. His record in Ivy League games as the head coach at Princeton was 50-6 and Carmody led Princeton to four straight post-season appearances. Carmody was an assistant at Providence College for one season before joining the staff at Princeton in 1982.

Carmody is 6-7 vs. Iowa and 0-1 vs. Hawkeye Coach Todd Lickliter.

THE SERIES

Iowa holds a 105-51 advantage over Northwestern in the series that began with a 24-23 Wildcat win in 1905. The Hawkeyes won the first meeting this season, 53-51, Feb. 19 in Iowa City. Iowa won nine straight games in the series before Northwestern won four of seven. Iowa scored a 66-58 win in Iowa City in the only meeting in 2007. Northwestern rallied for a 51-48 win in Evanston in the only meeting in 2006. Each team won at home during the 2005 season and Iowa has won 22 of the last 29 meetings and three of the last four.

Iowa holds a 42-35 advantage in games played in Evanston, but the Wildcats have won the last three (all on last second shots) and five of the last six home games against Iowa. Iowa had won eight straight games in Welsh-Ryan Arena prior to losses in 2001 and 2002. The Hawkeyes scored a 68-63 win in Evanston in 2003.

IOWA RALLIES TO WIN FIRST MEETING

Iowa rallied from a 14-point deficit in the final 13 minutes to take a 53-51 win over Northwestern Feb. 19 in Iowa City. Both teams struggled throughout the first half, which ended with Northwestern holding a 17-15 advantage. Iowa was held to its lowest first half scoring total of the season, shooting just 21.1% while committing eight turnovers.

The Wildcats started fast in the second half, racing to a 36-22 advantage with 12:25 remaining. The deficit was still 10 when Tony Freeman connected on three straight three-point baskets, cutting the margin to 39-38 with 7:25 to play.

A steal and a lay-up by Dan Bohall gave Iowa its first lead of the second half and a basket by Cyrus Tate gave Iowa the lead for good at 42-41 with six minutes remaining. Iowa's biggest advantage (six points) came with 2:39 to play before another three-point basket by the Wildcats. Tate added two free throws with two minutes left for a 53-48 advantage before Northwestern's Craig Moore hit his fourth three-pointer of the half with 1:43 remaining.

The Hawkeye defense allowed just 12 points over the final nine minutes, but the Wildcats had a final chance with nine seconds to play following two missed free throws. Following a timeout, Moore's final three-point attempt was off the mark in the final seconds and Iowa had the victory.

The Hawkeyes shot 54.2% from the field and had just two turnovers in the second half, earning the win despite a 33-30 rebounding deficit. Northwestern shot 38% from the field.

Tate scored 15 of his 18 points in the second half. He also had 11 rebounds for the third double-double of his career and added three steals. Freeman scored 14 points, Jake Kelly had 12 points and five assists and Justin Johnson added nine rebounds and six assists.

Moore led Northwestern with 15 points and 11 rebounds, and he added four assists and three steals. Kevin Coble added 12 points and Jason Okrzesik scored 11.

CLOSE CALLS AT NORTHWESTERN

Iowa has lost close games in each of its last three visits to Welsh-Ryan Arena. In the only meeting in 2006, Iowa held a 42-34 advantage with just over six minutes to play before Northwestern rallied. A three-point play by Vedran Vukusic with 29 seconds remaining gave Northwestern a 49-48 advantage. Vukusic added two free throws in the final seconds after Iowa had missed a potential game-winning shot.

In 2005, the Wildcats scored on a three-point basket as time expired in overtime to take a 75-74 win over Iowa. The Hawkeyes had led by 12 points in the last four minutes and missed a shot at the end of regulation that would have earned the win.

In 2004 The Wildcats scored a 51-49 win as Vukusic hit a 17-foot jumper with seven-tenths of a second remaining. Iowa's Jeff Horner had tied the score with 14 seconds remaining before Vukusic hit the game winner.

TOP THREE-POINT THREATS

Iowa and Northwestern feature three of the top three-point shooters in the Big Ten Conference. In league games only, Northwestern's Craig Moore ranks first in three-point baskets per game (3.3), while Iowa's Tony Freeman (3.0) and Justin Johnson (2.6) rank second and third, respectively.

For the season, Moore is first and Johnson second, while Freeman does not rank due to missing 10 games during the non-conference season. In three-point shooting for all games, Moore shoots 40.4%, Freeman 39.1% and Johnson 36.4%

ILLINOIS GETS PAST IOWA

Illinois built an early lead and held off an Iowa rally in taking a 58-47 win over the Hawkeyes in Iowa City in the only meeting of the season between the two teams. The Fighting Illini built an 11 point lead late in the first half, but Iowa scored the final five points over the last two minutes of the period, cutting the halftime deficit to 29-23.

Illinois maintained its advantage throughout the second half, holding a 43-31 lead with 10 minutes remaining. The Hawkeyes rallied from there, cutting the margin to five points on two occasions, the last at 50-45 with 2:21 to play. Illinois responded with a field goal with 1:48 remaining and added six straight free throws in the final 1:02 to seal the win.

Iowa, which enjoyed its best shooting performance of the season three days earlier in a loss at Penn State, shot just 35.9% from the field. Iowa made only 3-16 (18.8%) three-point attempts and shot just 59.3% (16-27) from the free throw line.

The Hawkeye defense held Illinois to 38.8% shooting, but the Fighting Illini shot 84.2% (16-19) from the foul line, won the rebounding battle 26-27 and forced 13 Hawkeye turnovers. Illinois also held an 18-4 advantage in bench scoring.

Tony Freeman led Iowa with 21 points, while Jake Kelly added 10. Cyrus Tate contributed eight rebounds and two steals.

NORTHWESTERN FALLS AT PURDUE

Purdue dominated the second half in taking a 68-43 win over Northwestern Saturday in West Lafayette. The Boilermakers outscored Northwestern 44-20 in the second half after leading by a 24-23 margin at halftime.

Purdue shot 61.9% in the second half after shooting just 30.4% in the opening period. Northwestern was nearly the opposite, shooting just 31.8% in the second half after making 47.6% of its field goal attempts in the first half. The Boiler-makers held a 36-26 rebounding advantage and held a 17-5 scoring advantage from the free throw line.

Ivan Peljusic led Northwestern with 13 points, while Kevin Coble added 10 points and seven rebounds.

IOWA TOUGH AT HOME

Iowa has won 42 of its last 52 games (.808) in Carver-Hawkeye Arena since the start of the 2004-05 season, including win streaks of 21-straight overall wins and 12-straight Big Ten Conference wins. Iowa has won 10 of its last 13 home games against ranked opponents. The Hawkeyes posted a 14-2 home record in 2006-07 (losses to Northern Iowa and Wisconsin) after a perfect 17-0 mark in 2006.

COLE TO MISS REMAINDER OF SEASON

Iowa freshman Jarryd Cole suffered a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee during Iowa's 57-50 win over Southeastern Louisiana Dec. 29 and will miss the remainder of the season. He had surgery Friday, Jan. 4.

Cole is a 6-7, 250-pound forward who played in Iowa's first 13 games, with six starts. He averaged 6.6 points and 4.8 rebounds, while shooting .667 from the field. He had season-bests of 15 points and nine rebounds against Iowa State.

Cole was in the starting line-up in Iowa's final non-conference win, contributing four points and four rebounds. His dunk with 11:55 remaining gave Iowa a 32-31 advantage. The injury occurred just after his basket.

The injury to Cole is the second major injury suffered by a member of the Hawkeye program this season. Junior guard Tony Freeman played in just three of Iowa's 13 non-conference games after suffering a foot injury during Iowa's preseason exhibition game.

IOWA GETS BIG TURNAROUND

Iowa's 53-48 win over Ohio State marked a 36-point turnaround from the first meeting, a 79-48 Buckeye win on Jan. 9. The point differential is the most for Iowa against an opponent since the 2002 season. Indiana defeated the Hawkeyes 79-51 in Bloomington on Feb. 5, 2002 before the Hawkeyes defeated the Hoosiers 62-60 March 9 in the semi-finals of the Big Ten Tournament in Indianapolis. The Hoosiers would later advance to the NCAA title game, in 2002, before falling to Maryland.

IOWA GAME NOTES

- Iowa made a season-high 12 three-point field goals in the loss at Penn State. Iowa's 54.5% (12-22) shooting from three-point range and 57,5% field goal shooting overall, are also season bests.
- Iowa had four players score in double figures in the loss at Penn State, marking the fourth game this season Iowa has had four score 10 or more. Iowa is 2-2 in those games, which includes the home win over Penn State.
- Iowa's 57.5% (23-40) field goal shooting at Penn State is the best percentage for Iowa in a road game since a win at Minnesota last season. Iowa shot 58.2% (32-55) in the 91-78 win in Minneapolis.
- Despite the loss at Michigan State, Iowa played well in certain aspects. MSU entered the game as the top team in the league in field goal percentage at over 49% for the season and over 50% in home games. The Hawkeyes held the Spartans to 39.1% shooting, including 4-16 (25%) three-point attempts.
- Iowa's win over Northwestern marked just the second time in 14 games Iowa has rallied to win after trailing at halftime.
- The 14-point deficit vs. Northwestern matches the largest Iowa has overcome this season to win. Iowa also trailed Southeastern Louisiana by 14 points before earning a 57-50 win.
- Iowa had 10 turnovers in the win over Northwestern, including just two in the second half. Iowa has had less than 10 turnovers in just two of 27 games.
- Iowa had a season-low 23 rebounds in the loss at Minnesota. The 31-23 rebounding deficit is Iowa's biggest in Big Ten play and second largest of the season.
- Iowa shot 52.8% (19-36) from the field in a loss at Purdue, its best shooting performance of the season. The 36 field goal attempts marked a season low as Iowa was guilty of 20 or more turnovers for the sixth time this season.

- Iowa had just 27 rebounds at Purdue, but the Hawkeyes still maintained a 27-21 rebounding edge over the Boilermakers.
- Iowa has won eight of its last 10 meetings against Penn State, including the last six in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.
- In a home win over Penn State, Iowa featured four players with 10 or more points for just the third time this season. The Hawkeyes also hit 19-22 (86.4%) free throws, surpassing 80% for just the third time. Jeff Peterson led the Hawkeyes at the line, hitting all nine of his attempts.
- Iowa's win at Michigan marked its third straight win in Ann Arbor, the first time Iowa has won more than two consecutive games there.
- Iowa's victory at Michigan was keyed by four players who reached career-bests in three different categories. Tony Freeman (28) and Cyrus Tate (21) had scoring highs, Seth Gorney (12) and Tate (11) had rebounding bests and Jeff Peterson matched his career best with nine assists.
- In defeating Michigan State 43-36, Iowa won a game while scoring less than 50 points for the first time since Nov. 30, 2005 when the Hawkeyes defeated North Carolina State, also in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.
- The 36 points scored by Michigan State in Iowa's 43-36 win are the fewest scored by an Iowa opponent since the Hawkeyes defeated Penn State 65-38 in Iowa City on March 1, 2006. The last time an Iowa opponent scored less than 36 points occurred Dec. 4, 1992 when Iowa defeated Texas-Pan American, 85-29.
- The 36 points scored by Michigan State match the second lowest total an opponent has scored against a Todd Lickliter team in his seven seasons as a college head coach. Butler allowed 34 points to Birmingham Southern in a 70-34 win on Dec. 1, 2001 and the Bulldogs defeated Detroit 56-36 Feb. 24, 2007.
- Iowa is allowing just 58 points per game, as nine opponents have been held to 50 points or less and only 11 have scored over 60.
- Iowa opponents are shooting 40.5% from the field as 15 opponents have shot less than 40%.
- Iowa opponents are shooting 33% from three-point range as 11 opponents have shot less than 30% from beyond the arc.
- Iowa holds a +1.8 rebounding advantage while collecting more rebounds than the opponent in 13 games.
- In a 62-55 win at Northern Iowa, the Hawkeyes made their final eight free throw attempts of the game. After missing the first attempt and making 1-2 in the first half, Iowa made all seven attempts in the final 20 minutes for a season-best 88.9% accuracy. Iowa has been over 80% from the foul line in four games.

JOHNSON AMONG SINGLE GAME LEADERS

Senior guard Justin Johnson has made 87 three-point field goals. The 87 treys rank fourth best in a single season and his 248 attempts ties for second. Johnson has made eight treys in two home games (Indiana and Ohio State). The eight threepointers are the third most in a single game in Iowa history.

Chris Kingsbury twice had nine treys during the 1994-95 season. Johnson's eight treys are the most by a Hawkeye against Big Ten opponents and tie for ninth place in the Big Ten Conference. Johnson also made seven treys in two games (Idaho State and Eastern Illinois) this season. Johnson scored 12 points in the loss at Penn State, connecting on 4-5 three-point attempts.

He connected on six straight three-point shots in the final two minutes at home against Indiana, and even converted one of the attempts into a four-point play after being fouled. Johnson scored a career-best 29 points against Indiana, 19 of those in the final two minutes. He made his first two threepoint shots at Wisconsin, giving him eight straight over two games.

Johnson set a Hawkeye Challenge record with 13 three-point baskets in two games. He had 26 points vs. Louisiana-Monroe and added 25 points vs. Eastern Illinois in earning a spot on the all-tournament team. Johnson was also named to the all-tournament squad at the South Padre Island Invitational. He recorded his first career double-double against Louisiana-Monroe with 26 points and 10 rebounds.

Johnson is averaging 11.9 points and 4.9 rebounds per game. He had 24 points, seven rebounds and three assists in the win over Ohio State and 15 points in a loss at Minnesota. He contributed nine rebounds and six assists in the win over Northwestern.

Johnson ranks second in the Big Ten in three-point field goals per game (2.9) and third in minutes played (35.5). Following are Iowa's single-season leaders in three-point field goals:

FREEMAN HITS SCORING BEST

Junior guard Tony Freeman scored a career-high 28 points in Iowa's win at Michigan, hitting a career-best six three-point field goals and adding 6-9 free throws. He scored 19 or more in four straight games before adding 14 points at Indiana. Freeman scored 18 points in a home loss to Wisconsin and added 14 points in a win over Northwestern. He led the Hawkeyes with 21 points (13-15 FT's) in the loss to Illinois.

Freeman suffered a fracture to the fifth metatarsal in his left foot during Iowa's exhibition win over Simpson College Nov. 1. He saw his first action of the season in Iowa's 62-55 win at Northern Iowa (Dec. 5). Freeman played 24 minutes against Northern Iowa, collecting 15 points, three assists and one rebound. After missing the Iowa State game, he returned to play 22 minutes in the loss to Drake, contributing nine points. He added 15 points, seven rebounds, four assists and three steals in 34 minutes in Iowa's win over Southeastern Louisiana.

Freeman scored 21 points in a loss at Ohio State and added 22 and four steals in a win over Michigan State. He had 14 points, five rebounds and five assists in a loss at Penn State.

He is averaging 14.1 points and 3.2 assists in 20 games. He ranks second in the Big Ten in three-point field goals per game (3.0) in league games only and is sixth in scoring (14.2).

Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series

Iowa State currently leads the fourth annual Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series, 18-5. The Cyclones have picked up victories in football, men's golf, volleyball, men's cross country, women's basketball, women's swimming and diving, men's basketball and women's gymnastics. Both Iowa and Iowa State earned a point after a scoreless draw in women's soccer and Iowa gained two points in wrestling and women's cross country.

Iowa captured the third Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series, 14-9 in 2006-07. The Hawkeyes hold a 2-1 advantage in the in-state competition against their rivals from Iowa State that began in 2005.

Last season, the Hawkeyes captured victories in women's soccer (1-0, OT), football (27-17), wrestling (24-6) men's basketball (77-59), women's swimming & diving (181.5-117.5) and softball (2-1).

Iowa captured the inaugural Cy-Hawk Series in 2005 registering a 13-8 margin of victory. Iowa State evened the competition with its own 13-8 triumph in 2006.

The 12-sport series awards two points (except football, which is worth three) to the winning school in each head-to-head match-up between the two institutions. Additionally, one point is awarded to an institution if the graduation rate of its student-athletes is greater than the national average as reported each fall by the NCAA. Iowa earned the academic points all three years, whereas Iowa State failed to earn the extra points in 2004 and 2005.

A new total of 27 points (13 events) is up for grabs in 2007-08.

A commemorative Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series Cup, which stands 31 inches tall and weighs 19 pounds, is displayed on the winning team's campus for an entire year after a victory. Replica cups are also presented as "traveling trophies" for individual victorious teams in the head-to-head competition.

Academic Opportunities

Two points for an institution if the student-athlete graduation rate for all student-athletes is greater than the national average for all student-athletes, according to the annual graduation rate report issued each September/October by the NCAA.

TATE STEPPING UP

Junior Cyrus Tate has improved his numbers while stepping in and playing more minutes due to Jarryd Cole's injury. Tate scored a career-high 26 points in a loss at Michigan State, hitting 10-13 field goal attempts and 6-7 free throws, while also grabbing nine rebounds. Tate also had 18 points and 11 rebounds in a narrow win over Northwestern, his third career double-double. He was named Big Ten Conference Player of the Week for his play in those two games. Tate shot 77.2% (17-22) from the field in the two games.

He had 21 points (8-10 FGs) and 11 rebounds in a win at Michigan. Tate improved on his rebounding best with 13 in a win over Penn State. He added 11 points in the loss at Penn State, despite playing just 19 minutes due to foul problems. He led the Hawkeyes with eight rebounds against Illinois.

Tate has started all of Iowa's Big Ten games, averaging 10.4 points and 7.1 rebounds per game, while shooting 71.3% from the field. He leads the Big Ten in field goal percentage in league games only and ranks third in rebounding.

Tate had eight points and five rebounds at Indiana, 10 points at Ohio State and 10 points and five rebounds against Purdue (at home). He led Iowa with eight rebounds at Wisconsin and seven against Indiana. He collected nine points and seven rebounds in a win over Michigan State, added 15 points and eight rebounds in a home loss to Wisconsin and had 10 points and six rebounds in the second game with Michigan. For the season he is averaging 7.9 points and 5.1 rebounds while shooting 68.1% from the field.

GORNEY GETS REBOUND BEST

Senior Seth Gorney led Iowa's rebounding efforts in the win at Michigan with a career-best 12 rebounds. He added four points and two assists in the road win before playing one of the best all-around games of his career in a win over Ohio State. Gorney, an Ohio native, had 10 points, seven rebounds and a career-best four assists against the Buckeyes. He is averaging 4.4 points and 5.1 rebounds after collecting six points and eight boards in the loss at Michigan State.

Gorney contributed a season-best 11 points and eight rebounds in a win over Penn State, including the first three-point basket of his career. He added 10 points and four rebounds in a home loss to Wisconsin and had nine points and 10 rebounds at Minnesota.

Gorney's numbers have improved in conference action, where he is averaging 5.4 points and 6.4 rebounds.

LOOBY IN THE PAINT

Kurt Looby has played well in the paint during his senior season. Looby is averaging 4.9 rebounds and scoring 3.8 points a game while shooting 66.7% (50-75) from the field. Looby, who had a career-best 12 rebounds against Louisiana-Monroe, also leads Iowa with 40 blocked shots. Looby has 93 career blocks, moving into seventh on Iowa's career list. He matched his career-high for the sixth time with five blocked shots against Purdue (at home). His 93 blocks are the most by any two-year player at Iowa.

Hawkeyes Add Four Recruits

University of Iowa men's basketball Coach Todd Lickliter announced the signing of four student-athletes to national letters of intent to join the Hawkeye basketball program next fall.

The additions to the program are Iowa City native Matt Gatens, Anthony Tucker from Minnetonka, MN, Andrew Brommer from Rosemount, MN and Jermain Davis from Plymouth, MN.

Gatens (6-5, 210) attends Iowa City HS. He committed to the Iowa program as a 15-year-old ninth grader. A member of the varsity since his ninth grade season, Gatens averaged 18 points, 5.5 rebounds and four assists as a freshman.

He ranks as the all-time scoring leader at Iowa City HS with 1,353 career points heading into his senior season, a career average of 20 points per game. He is also an 82% career shooter from the free throw line.

At Iowa City High he has twice been named to the Iowa Newspaper Association all-state team and the Des Moines Register all-state team. He has earned all-conference recognition in the Mississippi Valley Conference in each of the past three seasons. His father, Mike, was an Iowa basketball letterman from 1974-76.

Tucker (6-4, 195) averaged 16.4 points and 5.7 rebounds as a junior at Minnetonka HS under Coach John Hedstrom. He has been a unanimous all-conference selection for three seasons and is the only player to be a unanimous selection as a ninth grader. He earned all-Metro honors and second team all-state recognition from the *St. Paul Pioneer Press*. He has scored 1,250 career points and could become Minnetonka's all-time scoring leader as a senior.

Tucker earned first team all-state honors last season after being named to the second all-state team as a sophomore. He is a twoyear team captain and was recently named to the Minnetonka Honor Society for Leadership.

Brommer (6-9, 220) is a versatile forward who attends Rosemount HS and played two seasons on the same summer AAU team (43 Hoops) with Tucker.

Brommer begins his final prep season with 838 career points. He averaged 17 points, nine rebounds, three assists and three blocks per game as a junior as his prep team posted a 9-17 overall record.

Brommer serves as team captain for Coach Mike Manning and earned all-conference honors as both a sophomore and junior.

Davis (6-4, 200) is a shooting guard who is in his first season at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids, IA after attending Southeastern Community College in Burlington as a freshman. In one season at Southeastern Davis averaged 10.9 points while leading the team in assists and ranking third in steals.

Davis attended Robbinsdale Cooper HS in New Hope, MN, where he helped his prep team post a 27-4 record as a senior. That team set a school record for wins in a season and finished second in the Class 4-A state tournament. Davis was named to the all-tournament team at the state tournament. He earned all-conference honors in the North Suburban Conference and shared conference MVP honors as a senior.

Davis averaged 15.3 points per game as a junior and senior and was named to the all-defensive team in the metro area. A solid defensive player, he also averaged four steals, five rebounds and 3.4 assists during his prep career. As a senior he shot 54% from the field, including 41% from three-point range.

Iowa on the Big Ten Network

A majority of Iowa's games throughout the 2007-08 season will appear on national cable television via the Big Ten Network.

The Big Ten Network is available on the basic level of service offered by 67 locally-owned and locally-operated cable television systems across the state of Iowa. It is also available through the nation's two satellite television companies, DirectTV and Dish Network. Currently, more than 50 percent of the homes in Iowa have access to the Big Ten Network, as do more than 30 million homes nationwide. The Big Ten Network is the fastest growing television network in television history, reaching 30 million homes in its first 30 days of existence.

Looby had 12 points and eight rebounds in a loss to Bradley and 10 points and eight rebounds vs. Utah State. He has 10 or more rebounds in three games and had nine points and eight rebounds in a win over Michigan State. Looby ranks fifth in the Big Ten in blocked shots for the season and ninth in Big Ten games. Following is a list of Iowa's career leaders in blocked shots:

KELLY SHARING THE BALL

Freshman guard Jake Kelly moved into the starting line-up in Iowa's last 23 games and has led the team in assists five times. Kelly played a key role in a home win over Northwestern, contributing 12 points (7-8 FTs) and five assists. He added nine points at Michigan State and had 17 points and four assists in a loss at Penn State. He scored 10 points in the loss to Illinois.

He scored 12 points in a home loss to Purdue and added six points, including two free throws in the final minutes, in the win at Michigan. Kelly scored 11 points (3-4 treys) in the win over Penn State. At Purdue, he contributed a three-point play to tie the score with five seconds left in the game. He led Iowa with 12 points in a loss to Michigan, along with five rebounds, three assists and two blocked shots.

He scored 19 points in a win at Northern Iowa, hitting 6-13 field goal attempts and 3-5 treys while collecting two steals. Kelly had six assists against Louisiana-Monroe and four assists in the win over Eastern Illinois. At Iowa State he contributed 13 points, five rebounds and five assists. Kelly is averaging 6.9 points and two assists per game.

PETERSON WAS PERFECT

Freshman guard Jeff Peterson was perfect in his shooting while scoring 19 points in Iowa's win over Penn State. On the eve of his 19th birthday, Peterson made all four of his field goal attempts (2-2 three-pointers) and all nine free throws. He added five assists, three rebounds and one steal in 27 minutes and made both of his field goal attempts (both treys) in a loss at Penn State. Peterson made 14 straight free throws before a miss at Purdue and is shooting 85.7% (24-28) from the line in Big Ten games.

Peterson did not play in the win over Northwestern due to a virus. He has started 11 games and ranks fourth in minutes played. He had 12 points, nine assists and no turnovers in his first college game. He added 20 points in a win over Northern Colorado and added nine points and four assists against Florida Gulf Coast.

Peterson matched his career-high with nine assists in the win at Michigan and added a pair of key free throws in the closing minutes. He is averaging 5.5 points and 3.3 assists per game and has 18 steals. He ranks ninth in the Big Ten in assists and 14th in assist/turnover ratio.

COLE HAD BEST NIGHT AT ISU

Freshman forward Jarryd Cole had the best game of his young college career in Iowa's loss at Iowa State. Cole connected on 7-10 field goal attempts, scoring 15 points and grabbing nine rebounds, both season-bests. He made all six of his field goal attempts while scoring 12 points and collecting five rebounds against Drake.

In an earlier loss to Wake Forest he came off the bench to score 14 points (7-10 FGs) and grab seven rebounds in 33 minutes. Cole, who started for the first time against Louisiana-Monroe, added 10 points and four rebounds in a win over Eastern Illinois. He averaged 6.6 points and 4.8 rebounds per game while shooting 66.7% from the field in 13 games. He will miss the remainder of the season after suffering a torn left ACL in a win over Southeastern Louisiana.

<u>TWO AMONG FRESHMAN LEADERS</u>

Iowa rookies Jake Kelly and Jeff Peterson rank among Iowa's top freshmen in several statistical categories with one game remaining in the regular season.

Kelly's three-point field goal percentage (.403) currently ranks first and his 77.4% shooting from the free throw line ranks second. Peterson is shooting 73.3% from the line, which would rank fifth among Iowa's top freshmen, and his 91 assists ranks seventh.

HAWKEYES FEATURE YOUNG LINE-UP

Iowa's starting line-up in four games included freshmen Jarryd Cole, Jeff Peterson and Jake Kelly. Cole is now out of action for the remainder of the season due to injury. Kelly has started 23 games and Peterson 11. The three have combined for 40 starts.

Iowa had not started three freshmen in a game since the 2000-01 season. That season, Brody Boyd, Jared Reiner and Glen Worley started in a game at Illinois. Boyd, Worley and Sean Sonderleiter started in a game at Michigan State and Boyd, Worley and Cortney Scott started in a game at Michigan.

<u>NEVER SAY NEVER ...</u>

It may have happened before 1920, but historical records of Iowa basketball do not show a game prior to Iowa's 56-51 loss to Drake (Dec. 14) in which the Hawkeyes failed to record a free throw attempt.

Drake was guilty of 10 fouls in the game, four in the first half. The Bulldogs were called for six fouls in the second half, the last at the 7:52 mark with Iowa holding a 39-38 advantage.

Prior to the 1920-21 season, Iowa's records do not show free throw attempts by game. From the beginning of the 1921-22 season, until the Dec. 14 contest vs. Drake, Iowa had made at least one free throw attempt in 2,147 consecutive games.

Prior to the contest vs. Drake, Iowa's lowest output from the free throw line, in recent history, occurred during a 61-53 loss to Michigan (March 1, 1979 in Iowa City) when the Hawkeyes made one of two free throw attempts.

HAWKEYES HIT THE BOARDS

In a 62-55 win at Northern Iowa, the Hawkeyes held a 37-16 rebounding advantage. No Northern Iowa player had more than five rebounds and only four of the nine Panthers who played had any rebounds. Kurt Looby led Iowa with seven rebounds, while six Hawkeyes had at least four.

The plus 21 rebounding advantage is the largest for Iowa since the second game of the 2006-07 season when the Hawkeyes held a 51-30 rebounding advantage in a 78-65 win over Toledo in the Paradise Jam.

HOME, AWAY COMPARISONS

In its 18 home games, Iowa has outscored its opponents by a 2.9 margin, shooting 41.4% from the field while holding its opponent to 38.3% shooting. Iowa holds a 33.7-31.6 rebounding advantage.

In 12 games away from Carver-Hawkeye Arena (including two neutral site games), Iowa has been outscored 63.8-54.4. The Hawkeyes are shooting 43.7% from the field while opponents are also shooting 43.7%. Iowa holds a 30.5-29.3 rebounding margin.

STARTING LINE-UPS

Iowa has used five starting line-ups in its 30 games, but the same line-up in all 17 Big Ten games. Ten of Iowa's 11 players have started at least two games.

OVERCOMING DEFICITS

The biggest deficit Iowa has overcome to earn a victory is 14 points. Iowa trailed by 14 in the first half of a 57-50 win over Southeastern Louisiana and by 14 in the second half of a 53-51 win over Northwestern, with both of those games in Iowa City.

The biggest deficit overcome by an Iowa opponent is 16. Louisiana-Monroe rallied for a 72-67 overtime win and Michigan won 60-52, both in Iowa City.

SCORING BY HALVES

Iowa has been outscored 759-810 in the first half and 909-913 in the second half. The Hawkeyes have been outscored 17-12 in their only overtime period.

Iowa has led at halftime in 13 games and has outscored its opponent in the second half in 12 games. The first half scoring was even in a home loss to Indiana and the second half scoring was even in four games.

IOWA FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Iowa has made at least 80% of its free throws in five games and at least 70% of its free throws in 11 games, with a seasonbest 88.9% (8-9) at Northern Iowa. The Hawkeyes shot 86.4% (19-22) from the line in their win over Penn State. Iowa has posted a 5-6 record when shooting at least 70% from the free throw line. The Iowa reserves are averaging 13.0 points and 7.3 rebounds per game, compared to 14.1 points and 8.3 rebounds by the opponent reserves.

Iowa is 8-6 when the reserves outscore the opponent's reserves, 4-11 when the opponent reserves score more points and 0-1 when reserve scoring is even. Iowa is 6-7 when the Hawkeye reserves have more rebounds than the opponent reserves, 6-10 when the opponent reserves have more rebounds and 0-1 when rebounding by the reserves is even. IOWA POSTS SEVEN STRAIGHT WINNERS

Iowa concluded the 2006-07 season with a 17-14 record, posting its seventh straight winning season. That streak ties a school record. Iowa's current streak began with a 23-12 record in 2000-01 and includes three seasons of more than 20 wins and six post-seasons appearances (three NCAA, three NIT).

Iowa also had seven straight winning seasons from 1950 through 1956. Pops Harrison, Bucky O'Connor and Rollie Williams all coached the Hawkeyes during those years. Only a 10-10 record in 1949 kept Iowa from 13 consecutive winning seasons (1944-56).

Iowa is one of four Big Ten teams to post a winning record in each of the last seven seasons, joining Illinois, Michigan State and Wisconsin.

TOP HOME PERCENTAGE

Iowa posted a 44-5 (.896) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena over the last three seasons (2005-07), a mark that ranks as Iowa's best home court winning percentage over any three year period in which Iowa won at least 40 games.

Iowa's winning percentage in Big Ten home games (20-4, .833) over those seasons is also the schools best percentage since the conference began playing more than 14 league games in 1974.

HAWKEYES SET ARENA RECORD

Iowa set a Carver-Hawkeye Arena (opened in 1983) record with 12 consecutive Big Ten Conference home wins over the course of the 2006 and 2007 seasons. The streak was snapped Jan. 28, 2007 when second-ranked Wisconsin won in Iowa City. Following the loss to Wisconsin the Hawkeyes concluded the season by winning their final four home games, improving to 15-1 in Big Ten games and 31-2 overall over the past two seasons in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa's record for consecutive home wins in league play is 14 straight. That mark was set during the 1980-81 and 1981-82 seasons when home games were played at the Iowa Field House.

IOWA ON THE TUBE

All but one Iowa game throughout the 2007-08 season has been televised, with the only exception being the final round of the South Padre Island Invitational against Utah State.

The majority of Iowa's non-conference games appeared on the Big Ten Network. Iowa's home game with Wake Forest was televised on ESPN2. The contest at Northern Iowa was on FOX 28 and the game at Iowa State appeared on ESPNU. Iowa games at Michigan State and Minnesota, along with the home contest vs. Michigan, aired on ESPN.

IOWA PROGRAM REACHES 1,400 WINS

The Iowa basketball program reached 1,400 wins (now at 1,450) with a 79-46 victory over Texas-San Antonio on Nov. 26, 2005. Iowa ranks 34th on the all-time list for victories and is one of 41 NCAA Division I programs with as many as 1,400 wins. Iowa's basketball history includes 73 winning seasons and 24 years in which the Hawkeyes have won 20 or more games. Iowa (with 22) is one of 31 programs to earn more than 20 invitations into the NCAA Tournament.

THE HAWKEYE ROSTER

The Iowa roster includes 11 players. The squad includes three seniors, three juniors, two sophomores and three freshmen.

Along with Iowa native Dan Bohall, the roster includes two players from Illinois and Indiana and one from Maryland, Missouri, Ohio, Tennessee, Texas and St. John's, Antigua.

BIG TEN TOURNAMENT TICKETS ON SALE

All-session and single session tickets for the 2008 Big Ten Conference men's basketball tournament are currently on sale. Tickets are available at all 11 Big Ten university ticket offices, the Conseco Fieldhouse box office, Ticketmaster outlets at <u>www.ticketmaster.com</u>, or by calling Ticketmaster at (317) 239-5151. The 11th annual Big Ten Tournament will be held March 13-16, 2008 at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

All session tickets are on sale for \$150 or \$275, depending on seat location. Single-session tickets range from \$30 to \$85, based on seat location and session. Orders are limited to 12 all-session tickets or 12 single-session tickets.

NO THREE-POINTERS

Since the three-point shot became part of the college game, Iowa has played 14 games in which it has failed to make a three-point attempt. Iowa had made at least one three-point basket in 53 straight games before missing all five attempts in a 71-61 home win over Purdue in 2004. Iowa's current streak includes at least one three-point basket in 148 straight games.

Following is a list of games in which Iowa did not make a three-point basket (11-3 record). During the 1982-83 season, when the three-point shot was first added, the number of three-point attempts in some games is unavailable.

IOWA IN LAS VEGAS NEXT SEASON

Iowa will take part in the Las Vegas Invitational during the early portion of the 2008-09 season. The 2008 event will take place Nov. 28-29, 2008 at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas. Iowa's bracket of opponents in Las Vegas will include Kentucky, Kansas State and West Virginia.

Similar to the South Padre Island Invitational this season, Iowa will have two home games in the event before traveling to Las Vegas for two games. Possible first and second round opponents include Southeast Missouri State, Oakland University, Delaware State and Longwood University.

Kansas defeated eventual national champion Florida in the championship game of the tournament in 2006-07, while North Carolina won the event in 2007-08.

Participating schools will each have their share of tickets available to sell after this season in completed. The general public will have a chance to purchase a limited number of tickets for the final rounds in Las Vegas beginning Saturday, Nov. 3 at 1 p.m. EST at the Orleans Arena. IOWA IN TOURNAMENT PLAY

Iowa has fared well while taking part in regular-season tournaments over the past 25 years. In that time Iowa has won the Great Alaska Shootout (1986-87), the Cal-Irvine Anteater Classic (1986-87), the Maui Classic (1987-88), the San Juan Thanksgiving Shootout (1992-93), the San Juan Christmas Shootout (1997-98), the Big Ten Conference Tournament in 2001 and 2006 and its own invitational 24 times.

In addition, Iowa was runner-up in the 1985-86 Far West Classic, the 1987-88 All-College Tournament, the 1988-89 Chaminade Classic, the 1991-92 Tampa Tribune Holiday Invitational, the 1994-95 Rainbow Classic, the 1995-96 Great Alaska Shootout, the 1999-00 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, the 2001-02 Guardians Classic, the 2005-06 Guardians Classic, the 2002 Big Ten Conference Tournament and the 2004 Maui Invitational.

POST-SEASON OPPONENTS

Iowa's 2007-08 schedule includes 15 games against teams that advanced to post-season play a year ago. Iowa will play 11 games against six Big Ten opponents that appeared in the 2007 NCAA Tournament, including two games with national runner-up Ohio State. The Hawkeyes have four games against teams that were in the NIT a year ago (Michigan twice, Bradley, Utah State).

IOWA VS. THE FIELD

Iowa posted a 6-10 record while playing 11 teams that advanced to post-season play last season. That included a 4-9 record against eight teams that competed in the NCAA Tournament and a 2-1 record against three teams that were in the NIT.

IOWA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Iowa made its 22nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2006. Iowa earned the Big Ten Conference's automatic bid by virtue of claiming the league's tournament title.

The Hawkeyes hold an overall record of 27-24 in the tournament, advancing to the Final Four in 1955 (fourth), 1956 (second) and 1980 (fourth). Iowa reached the regional championship in 1987 and lost in the regional semi-final in 1988 and 1999.





2007-08 Game Summaries

(1) IOWA 58, IDAHO STATE 43 November 9, 2007, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

The Todd Lickliter era at Iowa began with a victory as Iowa opened the season with a 58-43 win over Idaho State. Trailing 4-2 in the opening minutes, Iowa used an 11-0 scoring run over the next four minutes to gain control. The Hawkeyes shot 52.4% from the field in building a 31-16 halftime advantage. Iowa shot 45.7% in the game, including 47.6% from three-point range.

The Iowa defense was impressive, holding Idaho State to 32.7% shooting in the game. The Bengals made just 1-20 (0.5%) from three-point range and Iowa held a 38-29 rebounding advantage.

Senior Justin Johnson led Iowa's scoring with a career-best 21 points, as he hit 7-12 three-point attempts. The seven treys rank as the third highest total at Iowa in a single game. Johnson added four rebounds and two blocked shots.

Freshman guard Jeff Peterson was responsible for getting the ball to Johnson, collecting nine assists and no turnovers while playing 38 minutes in his first college game. Peterson added 12 points and four rebounds. Senior Kurt Looby led the Hawkeyes with 10 rebounds and Dan Bohall added five points and six assists.

After trailing by one point with 14 minutes to play and being tied at 40-40 with just under eight minutes remaining, Iowa used a 19-7 scoring run to close the game in taking a 59-47 win over visiting Northern Colorado.

Iowa led throughout most of the first half and settled for a 26-20 advantage at the break. After hitting the first basket of the second half for a 28-20 advantage, the Hawkeyes saw Northern Colorado rally. Northern took its one-point advantage with 14:13 to play before freshman guard Jeff Peterson answered with a basket. Northern later erased a six-point deficit on back-to-back three point shots as the teams were tied at 38 and again at 40.

From there Iowa gained the lead on two free throws by Cyrus Tate, and, following another basket by Peterson, found some breathing room after a three-point basket by Justin Johnson. The Hawkeyes iced the win by hitting 12-14 free throws in the final seven minutes.

A strong second half led Iowa to a 62-49 win over Florida Gulf Coast in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The visitors hit six of their first seven shots from the field in taking a 14-8 advantage in the first three minutes. Iowa answered with a 9-0 scoring run over the next eight minutes to take a 17-14 advantage. Iowa also led by as many as six points in the opening half before scoring the last basket of the period to take a 32-30 advantage at the break.

The Hawkeye defense took over in the final 20 minutes, allowing the Eagles just 19 points in the second half. Iowa led throughout the second half, but the advantage was just four points with 8:52 to play. Iowa scored five straight points over the next two minutes and led by five or more the rest of the way, with the biggest advantage (61-47) coming with 1:11 to play.

Florida Gulf Coast shot just 28.6% from the field in the second half and just 38% for the game. The visitors also made just 6-23 (26.1%) three-point attempts and 5-11 (45.5%) free throws. After connecting on 42.9% of its first half field goals, Iowa shot 55% from the floor in the second half and 47.9% for the game. Senior guard Justin Johnson led Iowa with 19 points, seven rebounds, three assists and three steals. Freshman guard Jeff Peterson added nine points and four assists, while senior forward Seth Gorney grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds. Senior forward Kurt Looby added eight points and five rebounds and freshman forward Jarryd Cole contributed seven points, four rebounds and three steals.

Iowa saw its four-game winning streak come to an end with a 67-56 loss to Bradley in the third round of the South Padre Island Invitational. Bradley used a 19-2 scoring run over an eight minute stretch in the first half to gain control and the Braves were able to hold off Iowa runs over the final 30 minutes of the contest. Iowa started fast in building a 15-8 margin in the first seven minutes before the Braves rallied. After trailing by 10 points in two occasions in the first half, Iowa closed to within four points before Bradley hit a three-pointer just before the buzzer to take a 37-30 halftime advantage.

Iowa trailed by as many as 14 points in the second half before cutting the deficit to five points with 8:46 remaining and six points with 3:33 to play. The Braves answered Iowa's final run with three-point baskets in consecutive possessions to secure the win.

(6) UTAH STATE 75, IOWA 62

Utah State shot 50% from the field, 58.8% from three-point range and 81% from the free throw line in taking a 75-62 win over Iowa in the consolation game of the South Padre Invitational.

The Aggies built a 9-4 advantage in the first four minutes and never trailed. Iowa stayed close throughout the first half, cutting an early eight point deficit to two with eight minutes left. The lead expanded to as many as 12 points before Utah State led 36-27 at the break.

Iowa was never able to close the gap to less than five in the second half, as the Aggies would answer every Hawkeye run with points at their end of the floor. (7) WAKE FOREST 56, IOWA 47

November 26, 2007, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

A slow start proved to be too much to overcome as the Hawkeyes dropped a 56-47 decision to Wake Forest Monday in Iowa City to kick off the 2007 Big Ten/ACC Challenge. Iowa shot just 33.3% from the field in the opening half and trailed the Demon Deacons 33-17 at halftime. The Hawkeyes were guilty of 14 turnovers in the first half and were outrebounded by a 20-17 margin.

The Hawkeyes played much better in the second half, cutting the deficit to eight points, 27-35, with 14:23 to play. Wake Forest did not record its first field goal of the second half until the 14 minute mark.

The Demon Deacons expanded their lead to as many as 17 points with five minutes to play before Iowa rallied. Iowa cut the margin to seven in the final minutes, but could get no closer than 47-54 with 13 seconds remaining.

Iowa shot just 38% from the field, including just 13.3% from three-point range and 38.9% from the free throw line. The Hawkeye defense was strong, allowing Wake Forest to shoot just 33.9% from the field, including just 26.1% in the second half. Iowa held a 40-39 rebounding advantage, but was guilty of a season-high 22 turnovers after having just seven in its most recent game against Utah State.

Freshman forward Jarryd Cole came off the bench to score a career-high 14 points to lead the Hawkeyes in scoring, hitting 7-10 field goal attempts and also collecting seven rebounds. Freshman Jake Kelly added nine points and freshman Jeff Peterson added seven assists. Senior forward Kurt Looby led Iowa's inside game with a game-high 10 rebounds and three blocked shots.

Too many turnovers proved costly as Iowa dropped a 72-67 overtime decision to Louisiana-Monroe in the opening round of the Hawkeye Challenge. The Hawkeyes were guilty of 29 turnovers, including 17 in the second half.

Iowa used a 10-0 scoring run early in the game to take control, and led 31-22 at halftime after shooting 52.2% from the field and holding the visitors to 37.5% shooting. Iowa continued to shoot well early in the second half, building its biggest advantage to 41-25 with 16 minutes to play.

Louisiana-Monroe rallied behind some solid shooting, as the Warhawks shot 50% in the second half, including 36.4% from three-point range.

Two free throws by Cyrus Tate gave Iowa a 53-48 advantage with 3:17 to play, but the Warhawks got a three-point basket from Jonas Brown and a lay-up by Tony Hooper to tie the score with 1:08 remaining. A rebound basket by Kurt Looby gave Iowa a 55-53 lead with 32 seconds left before two free throws by Hooper with 23 seconds remaining tied the score again. Iowa missed a field goal attempt in the closing seconds and had a chance to win after Looby was fouled with 2.6 seconds left, but both free throw attempts were off the mark.

The Warhawks hit four straight three-point baskets to start the overtime period and Iowa could not catch up. Johnson led Iowa with 26 points and he completed his first career double-double with 10 rebounds. Looby added nine points and a career-best 12 rebounds and Jake Kelly added six assists.

Iowa held Eastern Illinois to 37.8% shooting from the field in taking a 57-45 win in the consolation game of the Hawkeye Challenge.

Senior guard Justin Johnson hit the first two field goals of the game as Iowa jumped to a 5-0 advantage. The Hawkeyes never trailed and led by as many as 12 points in the first half before taking a 24-19 lead into the halftime break

The Hawkeyes improved their shooting eye in the second half, improving to 52% in the period and ending the game at 45.7%. Iowa made 6-11 (54.5%) of its three-point attempts in the second half. Iowa's biggest advantage (44-24) came with 13:29 left on a dunk by Kurt Looby. Eastern Illinois was never closer than 12 the rest of the way.

Iowa held a 29-23 rebounding advantage and was guilty of 16 turnovers after having 29 the previous night in an opening round loss.

Johnson led Iowa with 25 points and he added five rebounds. Johnson set a tournament record with 13 three-point baskets. Johnson connected on seven treys against Eastern Illinois, which ties for third best in a single game at Iowa. He was named to the all-tournament team for the second straight year.

Looby added eight rebounds, six points and two steals, while freshman Jarryd Cole had 10 points and four rebounds.

Iowa used a solid shooting night, a dominating performance on the backboards and a solid defensive effort in taking a 62-55 win over Northern Iowa in the McLeod Center. The attendance of 7,043 set a record for the largest crowd for a basketball game in the facility.

The two teams battled back and forth throughout the night, as the game was tied six times and included seven lead changes. Iowa shot 56.5% in the first half, connecting on 6-8 (75%) three-point attempts. Northern Iowa led 27-23 with 3:30 left in the period before a 10-3 scoring run gave Iowa a 33-30 advantage at the break.

The Panthers connected on a pair of three-pointers to start the second half, gaining the lead at 38-35 with 15 minutes to play. A three-point basket by Justin Johnson tied the score and Iowa took the lead for good on a pair of free throws by Jake Kelly with 14:33 remaining. The Hawkeyes led the rest of the way, building their biggest advantage to eight with just under six minutes left.

The Hawkeyes ended the game with a 37-16 rebounding advantage while shooting 50% from the field and 58.8% from three-point range. The Hawkeyes made their final eight free throw attempts and shot 88.9% from the foul line. Kelly led Iowa with a career-high 19 points, while Freeman, in his first action of the season, scored 15 and Johnson had 13. Kurt Looby led Iowa with seven rebounds.

(11) IOWA STATE 56, IOWA 47 December 8, 2007, Hilton Coliseum, Ames, IA

Iowa suffered its coldest shooting game of the season in a 56-47 loss at Iowa State, failing to shoot over 40% from the field for the first time in 11 games. Iowa State used an aggressive defense to contribute to Iowa's shooting woes and outscored the Hawkeyes 20-5 from the free throw line in earning the victory.

Both teams started slow as Iowa shot just 29% in the opening half, compared to 28.6% for the Cyclones. Iowa led by as many four points in the early going, but Iowa State held a 26-22 halftime advantage.

The Hawkeyes never led in the second half, but cut the deficit to seven points on back-to-back baskets by Jarryd Cole with just under 10 minutes remaining. That was as close as Iowa would get.

The Hawkeyes shot just 32.1% for the game, including 28.6% (6-21) from three-point range and 50% (5-10) from the free throw line. The Iowa defense held Iowa State to 31.4% shooting, but the Cyclones connected on 20-27 (74.1%) free throw attempts. Iowa held a slight 41-40 rebounding advantage and had just 12 turnovers, but nine of those came in the second half.

Cole led Iowa with 15 points and nine rebounds, both career-bests for the freshman forward. Freshman Jake Kelly added 13 points, five rebounds and five assists.

Iowa rallied for a 57-50 win over Southeastern Louisiana in Iowa City to conclude non-conference action. The Hawkeyes trailed by 14 points in the first half and by seven at halftime before winning for the first time this season after trailing at intermission.

The Hawkeyes started the game by hitting their first two field goal attempts to take a 5-0 advantage in the first minute. Iowa was then held scoreless for nearly 13 minutes as the visitors scored 17 straight points. Iowa used two three-point baskets by J.R. Iowa rallied in the final two minutes after trailing by 13 points, but time ran out as No. 11/12 Indiana left Carver-Hawkeye Arena with a 79-76 win. The Hoosiers used an 11-1 scoring run to take a 70-57 advantage with 2:10 remaining before Iowa senior Justin Johnson went on a three-point spree that nearly carried Iowa to an upset victory.

Johnson hit six three-point baskets in the final 1:55, and even added a free throw after being fouled on one of the attempts for a four-point play. His final trey came from roughly 40-feet with four seconds to play to cut the deficit to 78-76. Indiana's Lance Stemler then hit one of two free throws and Iowa was unable to get a final shot attempt as time expired.

Johnson ended the game with a career-high 29 points (10-15 FG, 8-13 treys). He also collected six rebounds, three assists and three blocked shots. Tony Freeman added 12 points and nine assists and Seth Gorney had seven points and 10 rebounds.

The Hoosiers led by as many as nine points in the first half, but Iowa rallied late in the period and the score was knotted at 34 at intermission. Iowa rallied from an eight point deficit in the second half and trailed 59-56 with 6:50 remaining before Indiana regained control with its scoring run over the next five minutes.

Iowa shot 43.1% from the field, compared to 49.1% for Indiana. The Hoosiers connected on 71.9% from the foul line (23-32), compared to 60% (15-25) for Iowa. The rebounding was even.

(15) WISCONSIN 64, IOWA 51 January 5, 2008, Kohl Center, Madison, WI

Wisconsin used a 17-4 scoring run over a nine minute period in the second half in taking a 64-51 win in Madison. The Hawkeyes trailed by six, 28-22 at intermission, but scored the first six points of the second half to pull even.

From there the Badgers held Iowa without a field goal for just under nine minutes in gaining control. Iowa was able to cut the deficit to nine, 54-45, with just under five minutes remaining, but could get no closer.

The Hawkeyes had trailed by as many as nine in the first half before closing the gap to two points, 24-22, in the last two minutes of the period. Iowa shot 52.9% from the field in the opening half, including 57.1% (4-7) from three-point range. Iowa was unable to maintain that accuracy in the second half, shooting just 35.7%.

After shooting 31% in the first half, Wisconsin shot 55% in the second half and added 12-18 (66.7%) free throws after the break. For the game Wisconsin shot 70.4% from the foul line, compared to just 46.7% (7-15) for Iowa.

Wisconsin won the rebounding battle 34-31 and collected seven steals while forcing 14 Iowa turnovers. Ten of Iowa's turnovers occurred in the first half and the Hawkeyes were guilty of a season-high 27 personal fouls.

Justin Johnson led Iowa with 13 points, while Cyrus Tate, Tony Freeman and Jeff Peterson each added eight. Johnson made his first two three-point attempts, running his streak to eight straight before missing. Tate led Iowa with eight rebounds, while Freeman and Jake Kelly each collected three assists.

Iowa dropped its third straight conference game with a 79-48 loss at Ohio State.

The Hawkeyes trailed by four points, 18-14, after a three-point basket with just under 11 minutes to play in the first half when Ohio State took control. The Buckeyes used a 15-1 scoring run over a seven minute period to increase their advantage to 33-15. A 12-2 burst by Ohio State left the Buckeyes with a commanding 45-17 halftime advantage as Iowa matched its lowest scoring first half of the season.

The Buckeyes shot 58.8% from the field in the opening 20 minutes, controlled the rebounding (18-12) and collected five steals and had no turnovers. Iowa, on the other hand, shot just 28.6% from the field and aided the Buckeyes with nine turnovers.

Iowa improved its shooting in the second to 37.1%, but for the game shot 33.9% overall and just 18.2% (6-33) from three-point range against OSU's zone defense. OSU ended the game at 52.4% and held a 36-33 rebounding advantage.

Junior Tony Freeman led Iowa with a career-best 21 points. He added three assists and three rebounds. Cyrus Tate added 10 points and six rebounds and Justin Johnson had nine points and seven rebounds.

(17) IOWAS 43, MICHIGAN STATE 36

January 12, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa ended a three-game losing streak with a 43-36 win over sixth-ranked Michigan State in Iowa City, earning Coach Todd Lickliter his first win in the Big Ten Conference.

Michigan State scored the first seven points of the game and held an 18-9 advantage with 8:08 to play in the first half. The Spartans failed to score the rest of the half, as Iowa scored the final 11 points of the period to lead 20-18 at the break.

The Spartans ended their scoring draught two minutes into the second half, but Iowa answered each Spartan run to maintain a small advantage throughout the second half. Iowa led by five with 14 minutes remaining before the Spartans closed to within one on three occasions, the last at 35-34 with 3:48 remaining. Kurt Looby hit one of two free throws before Tony Freeman hit a three-point basket to give Iowa a 39-34 advantage with 1:12 remaining. Freeman added two free throws with 53 seconds to play and the Spartans were never closer than seven the rest of the way.

Iowa shot just 27.5% from the field and 55.2% from the free throw line, but the Hawkeyes had just 10 turnovers (four in the second half) and allowed Michigan State just four free throw attempts.

Michigan State shot just 30.8%, including 25% from three-point range (3-12) and the free throw line (1-4). MSU held a 40-35 rebounding advantage, but was guilty of 18 turnovers.

Freeman led Iowa with a career-best 22 points, hitting 5-9 treys and 7-9 free throws. He added four steals and three assists. Looby added nine points and eight rebounds and Tate collected nine points and seven rebounds.

The Hawkeye offense featured one of its most balanced games of the season, with four starters scoring in double figures. Tony Freeman led the scoring with 19 points, while Jake Kelly added 12 and Gorney and Cyrus Tate each had 10. Justin Johnson led Iowa with nine rebounds, Gorney had eight and Kurt Looby contributed five blocked shots.

Indiana's defense gained control from there, as Iowa made just two of its final 18 field goal attempts. Iowa shot 34.1% for the game, including 29.4% 9-17) from three-point range.

The Hoosiers were on target most of the night, shooting 59.3% in the first half and 53.2% for the game. Indiana scored 31 points following 20 Iowa turnovers and collected 32 points in the paint. The 20 miscues by the Hawkeyes mark a high in Big Ten games this season. Indiana collected 10 steals and held a 30-28 rebounding advantage.

Tony Freeman led Iowa's scoring with 14 points and Cyrus Tate added eight. Tate and Seth Gorney led Iowa with five rebounds.

2007-08 Game Summaries

(21) IOWA 64, PENN STATE 49 January 26, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa scored the first five points of the game and never trailed in taking a 64-49 win over Penn State. Iowa led by as many as 18 points in the first half as the Nittany Lions scored just nine points in the first 15 minutes. Penn State rallied at the end of the half and trailed 29-17 at intermission. Iowa shot 52.6% from the field in the opening half, while holding the visitors to 29.2%. Penn State made just one of its six three-point attempts in the opening 20 minutes.

Penn State closed its deficit to nine points twice in the second half, the last at 40-31 with 12:29 remaining. Iowa responded with five straight points and led by 11 or more the rest of the way. Iowa ended the game shooting 47.4% from the field, including 36% from three-point range. Iowa also connected on 19-22 free throws (86.4%), surpassing 80% from the line for just the fourth time in 21 games.

The Hawkeye defense held its 10th opponent to less than 50 points. Penn State shot just 39.2% from the field, including 25% from threepoint range. Iowa held a 34-22 rebounding advantage.

Freshman guard Jeff Peterson came off the bench to lead Iowa's attack. On the eve of his 19th birthday, Peterson scored 19 points by connecting on all four of his field goal attempts (2-2 three-pointers) and 9-9 free throws. He added five assists and three rebounds.

Iowa's balanced attack featured four players in double figures, as Seth Gorney, Justin Johnson and Jake Kelly all added 11 points. Cyrus Tate led Iowa with a career-best 13 rebounds and Gorney added eight. Tony Freeman matched Peterson with five assists.

Iowa rallied to tie the game with five seconds remaining before Purdue used a free throw with one second remaining to take a 51-50 win over the Hawkeyes in West Lafayette.

Trailing by as many as seven points in the second half, Iowa fought back from a 50-45 deficit with 1:54 remaining. Jeff Peterson scored from the lane to cut the Purdue advantage to three points with 47 seconds to play and the Hawkeye defense forced a missed shot with 12 seconds left. Peterson grabbed the rebound and passed up court to Jake Kelly, who drove to the basket and was fouled with five second remaining. Purdue was called for goal tending on the play and Kelly made his free throw attempt to tie the game.

After each team used its last timeout, Purdue's Keaton Grant drove to the basket and was fouled with 1.4 seconds remaining. His first attempt was good and Iowa was unable to get a shot when the second attempt was missed.

The Hawkeyes enjoyed their best shooting night of the season, shooting 52.8% (19-36) from the field. Iowa shot 43.8% from three-point range and held a 27-21 rebounding advantage, but the Hawkeyes were guilty of 22 turnovers and shot just 55.6% (5-9) from the foul line. Kelly's free throw to tie the game in the final seconds was Iowa's only free throw attempt of the second half.

The Boilermakers led by five points on two occasions in the first half. Iowa rallied to lead by as many as three late in the half before Purdue led 25-24 at intermission. Overall, the game featured four ties and 10 lead changes.

Justin Johnson led Iowa's scoring attack with 14 points, while Tony Freeman added 13. Johnson, Freeman, Cyrus Tate and Seth Gorney each had five rebounds, while Gorney added three assists and Freeman collected three steals.

(23) IOWA 53, OHIO STATE 48 February 2, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa rode a solid defensive effort and hot shooting by Justin Johnson from three-point range to take a 53-48 win over Ohio State in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes earned a season split with the Buckeyes.

The Iowa defense allowed Ohio State to shoot just 37.5% from the field, including 14.3% (3-21) from three-point range. The game included three ties and six lead changes, all in the first half. Iowa led by seven points in the opening eight minutes, but Ohio State rallied for an 18-17 advantage with six minutes left in the opening half. A basket from the lane by Seth Gorney gave Iowa a 24-22 advantage with three minutes left in the half and Iowa led the rest of the way. A three-point basket by Johnson gave Iowa a 27-22 halftime advantage.

The Hawkeyes led by as many as eight in the second half, but could never pull away. The Buckeyes trailed by two, 46-44, with just under six minutes to play when another three-pointer by Johnson extended Iowa's lead. The Hawkeyes held a slim 49-46 advantage with 34 seconds left when Tony Freeman connected on two free throws. Cyrus Tate rebounded an OSU miss and added two additional free throws with 27 seconds to play and the Buckeyes could only add one field goal in the closing seconds.

Iowa shot 43.2% from the field, including 44% from three-point range, and made four of five free throws in the final minute.

Johnson led Iowa with 24 points, hitting 8-13 treys. The eight three-point baskets are one shy of the Iowa school record for a single game. Johnson also made eight in a home loss to Indiana. He added seven rebounds and three assists. Gorney also had a solid all-around performance, collecting 10 points, seven rebounds and four assists.

Wisconsin outscored Iowa 16-10 over the last six minutes in taking a 60-54 win over the Hawkeyes in Iowa City. The score was tied seven times and there were 13 lead changes, the last coming with 6:15 to play when Wisconsin's Marcus Landry converted two free throws to give the Badgers a 45-44 advantage.

Iowa's Justin Johnson hit a three-point basket with 3:44 remaining to cut Iowa's deficit to 48-47 before the Badgers connected on all 10 of their free throw attempts in the final four minutes. Cyrus Tate added a rebound basket for the Hawkeyes with 1:32 left to cut the margin to 54-51 and Jeff Peterson hit a three-pointer to move Iowa within two, 56-54, with 26 seconds remaining.

Joe Krabbenhoft made it a four-point advantage for Wisconsin with 21 seconds left, and, after a missed three-point attempt by Iowa, Landry added two final free shots with 11 seconds to play.

The game was close throughout. Iowa led by as many as five points in the first half and led 29-26 at the break. The Hawkeyes shot 44% from the field in the first half, but just 26.1% in the second half. Iowa shot 35.4% for the game, compared to 43.5% for the Badgers. Wisconsin hit 5-11 (45.5%) three-point shots, compared to 7-20 (35%) for Iowa. The Hawkeyes held a 35-31 rebounding advantage. Iowa had just nine turnovers, its second lowest total of the season and lowest number in Big Ten games.

Tony Freeman led Iowa's scoring with 18 points, while Cyrus Tate added 15 and Seth Gorney scored 10. Tate led Iowa with eight rebounds and Johnson added six.

(25) MINNESOTA 63, IOWA 50 February 9, 2008, Williams Arena, Minneapolis, MN

Minnesota used a 16-3 scoring run over an eight minute period late in the second half in taking a 63-50 win over Iowa in Minneapolis. Minnesota started fast, scoring the first eight points of the game before Iowa scored its first basket at the 15:44 mark. Iowa trailed by just four, 26-22, before the Gophers closed the half with an 8-3 run to take a 34-25 halftime advantage.

The Hawkeyes kept the deficit in single digits through the early portion of the second half. A three-point play by Cyrus Tate with 11:16 to play gave Iowa a 42-41 advantage, its only lead of the game. Spencer Tollackson hit two free throws and the Gophers scored following an Iowa turnover to regain control. The Hawkeyes scored just eight points after Tate's three-point play as Minnesota's scoring burst included nine straight points.

Iowa used solid shooting to stay in the game, despite being outrebounded 31-23 and committing 21 turnovers. Minnesota collected 10 steals and scored 21 points following Iowa mistakes. Iowa shot 55.6% in the first half, but just 40% in the second half and 47.4% for the game. Iowa shot 42.9% (9-21) from three-point range and 71.4% (5-7) from the foul line.

Justin Johnson led Iowa's scoring with 15 points and Tony Freeman added 12. Seth Gorney scored nine points (4-4 FGs) and added 10 rebounds, while Freeman added five assists and two steals.

(26) MICHIGAN 60, IOWA 52

February 14, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Michigan used a hot shooting second half to rally for a 60-52 win over Iowa in Iowa City, leaving the teams with a split for the season.

The Wolverines trailed 27-16 at halftime before shooting 54.2% from the field in the second half, scoring 44 points in the final 20 minutes. Michigan made 6-12 three-pointers and 12-15 (80%) free throws in the second half as well. Michigan hit five of its first six shots in the second half, pulling within two points (31-29) in the first four minutes of the half. Iowa used a 7-0 spurt to regain control, but the Wolverines came right back.

Michigan took its first lead of the half at 42-40 with nine minutes to play and the visitors led the rest of the way. Iowa cut the deficit to four (50-54) with one minute remaining before Michigan hit six of its final eight free throw attempts.

Iowa held Michigan to 16 points in the first half as the Wolverines made just 6-18 field goal attempts. The 16 points matched the lowest first half total by an Iowa opponent this season. Michigan's 44 second half points are the second most allowed by Iowa in a second half this season.

The Hawkeyes struggled with their shooting, hitting just 36.5% from the field and 25% (7-28) from three-point range. Iowa had just 12 turnovers.

Jake Kelly scored 12 points to lead Iowa's scoring, while Cyrus Tate added 10 and Seth Gorney and Justin Johnson nine. Gorney led the Hawkeyes with eight rebounds and collected a career-best three steals. Tate added six rebounds and Jeff Peterson led the team with four assists.

(27) IOWA 53, NORTHWESTERN 51 February 19, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa rallied from a 14-point deficit in the final 13 minutes to take a 53-51 win over Northwestern in Iowa City. Both teams struggled throughout the first half, which ended with Northwestern holding a 17-15 advantage. Iowa was held to its lowest first half scoring total of the season, shooting just 21.1%.

The Wildcats started fast in the second half, racing to a 36-22 advantage with 12:25 remaining. The deficit was still 10 when Tony Freeman connected on three straight three-point baskets, cutting the margin to 39-38 with 7:25 to play.

A steal and a lay-up by Dan Bohall gave Iowa its first lead of the second half and a basket by Cyrus Tate gave Iowa the lead for good at 42-41 with six minutes remaining. Iowa's biggest advantage (six points) came with 2:39 to play before another three-point basket by the Wildcats. Tate added two free throws with two minutes left for a 53-48 advantage before Northwestern's Craig Moore hit his fourth three-pointer of the half with 1:43 remaining.

The Hawkeye defense allowed just 12 points over the final nine minutes, but the Wildcats had a final chance with nine seconds to play following two missed free throws. Following a timeout, Moore's final three-point attempt was off the mark in the final seconds and Iowa had the victory.

The Hawkeyes shot 54.2% from the field and had just two turnovers in the second half. Northwestern shot 38% from the field.

Tate scored 15 of his 18 points in the second half. He also had 11 rebounds for the third double-double of his career and added three steals. Freeman scored 14 points, Jake Kelly had 12 points and five assists and Justin Johnson added nine rebounds and six assists.

Michigan State bolted to a 20-1 lead while holding Iowa without a field goal the first 10 minutes of the game, and went on to a 66-52 win in East Lansing. The Hawkeyes missed their first nine shots and could never dig out of the opening deficit.

(29) PENN STATE 65, IOWA 64 February 27, 2008, Bryce Jordan Center, State College, PA

Penn State converted a three-point play with 18 seconds remaining to score a 65-64 win over Iowa in State College. PSU's David Jackson rebounded a missed three-point attempt and scored, then converted the free throw after the foul to give Penn State its first lead since the opening seconds of the second half.

Iowa had several opportunities in the final seconds. A shot in traffic from the lane rimmed out and two attempted tip-in shots also failed to fall. Iowa was awarded the ball under its own basket with 1.2 seconds remaining, but Justin Johnson was stripped of the ball before he could get a shot.

The loss spoiled Iowa's best shooting night of the season. The Hawkeyes shot 57.5% from the field, 54.5% (12-22) from three-point range and 85.7% (6-7) from the foul line. The rebounding was even (21-21), but Iowa was guilty of 17 turnovers. Penn State also had a 14-6 advantage in made free throws.

Iowa scored the final five points of the first half to pull within one, 31-30, at the break, shooting 63.2% from the field in the opening half. The Hawkeyes added the first 12 points of the second half to build a 42-31 advantage. Iowa led by as many as 12 in the second half, the last time at 45-33 with 15 minutes left.

The Hawkeyes led by seven with 2:40 to play, but failed to score from there. Dan Bohall hit four straight free throws to provide that margin (64-57) before Penn State took advantage of two Hawkeye turnovers in the final minute.

Jake Kelly led Iowa's balanced scoring attack with 17 points. Tony Freeman added 14, Johnson scored 12 and Cyrus Tate 11. Seth Gorney and Freeman each had five rebounds and Freeman added five assists.

Illinois built an early lead and held off an Iowa rally in taking a 58-47 win over the Hawkeyes in Iowa City in the only meeting of the season between the two teams.

The Fighting Illini built an 11 point lead late in the first half, but Iowa scored the final five points over the last two minutes of the period, cutting the halftime deficit to 29-23. The teams traded baskets in the early going, and the score was tied for the final time at 11 following a Cyrus Tate free throw with 11:59 remaining.

Illinois maintained its advantage throughout the second half, holding a 43-31 lead with 10 minutes remaining. The Hawkeyes rallied from there, cutting the margin to five points on two occasions, the last at 50-45 with 2:21 to play. Illinois responded with a field goal with 1:48 remaining and added six straight free throws in the final 1:02 to seal the win.

Iowa, which enjoyed its best shooting performance of the season three days earlier in a loss at Penn State, shot just 35.9% from the field. Iowa made only 3-16 (18.8%) three-point attempts and shot just 59.3% (16-27) from the free throw line.
