▶ SETTING THE SCENE

- Indiana (15-4) opens up Big Ten play this weekend as it travels to take on the Iowa Hawkeyes.
- Friday will be the 149th ever meeting between IU and Iowa and the first meeting since April 17, 2016, a 6-5 Hawkeyes victory in Bloomington.
- Iowa leads the all-time series between the two schools, 76-72.
- Indiana Head Coach **Chris Lemonis** is in his fourth season leading the Hoosier baseball program and his 24th overall year in coaching. He has posted a 116-76-2 record and has led the program to two regional at-large bids in his first three seasons.
- Iowa head coach **Rick Heller** is in his fifth season at the helm of the Hawkeyes baseball program. Entering this season, he has led the Hawkeyes to the best four-year stretch in program history, winning 140 games and advancing to two NCAA Regionals.

▶ LEADING OFF

- The Hoosiers entered the week ranked in all six polls. IU is ranked 11th by D1Baseball.com, 14th by Collegiate Baseball, 16th in the USA Today Coaches Poll and by the by the NCBWA, 18th by Perfect Game, and 19th by Baseball America.
- Indiana is coming off a weekend sweep of the Northern Illinois Huskies. After defeating the Huskies 18-0 on Friday, the Hoosiers earned a pair of 4-3 victories on Saturday and Sunday.
- IU carries a six-game winning streak heading into this weekend. Its the second winning streak of six or more games this season, as Indiana carried a seven-game streak from Feb. 17 to March 4.
- Entering this Tuesday junior **Logan Kaletha** has reached base in 17 straight games and junior **Matt Lloyd** has reached in 15 straight.
- Offensively, Indiana is first in the Big Ten in home runs (19), second in slugging percentage (.458), third in on base percentage (.380), doubles (42) and total bases (285), fourth in batting average (.286) and hits (178) and fifth in runs (117).
- The IU pitching staff is first in the Big Ten in ERA (2.66, 17th nationally), fewest earned runs allowed (50), fewest runs allowed (62), shutouts (3, T-10th), fewest walks per nine innings (2.82, 16th), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.85, 33rd), is tied for third in strikeouts (151), and tied for fifth in opposing batting average (.254).

INDIANA HOSTS 2017 BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- The 2017 Big Ten Baseball Tournament was held at Bart Kaufman Field on the campus of Indiana University. The eight-team tournament took place May 24-28, 2017.
- This marked the first time since 2010 (Columbus, Ohio) that a Big Ten school hosted the tournament and was the first time Indiana has hosted the Big Ten Tournament. The tournament will return to TD Ameritrade Park in Omaha, Nebraska, from 2018 to 2022.
- Bart Kaufman Field is no stranger to hosting premier college baseball tournaments, having served as a regional host site for the NCAA Tournament in 2013 and 2014. The Hoosiers have ranked among the top two in the Big Ten and the top 35 in the country in attendance since the stadium opened.

TEAM NOTES

- Indiana's 15-4 start is its best 19-game start since the 2013 team also started the year 15-4.
- IU earned series win in which it took three of four games at the 13th-ranked San Diego Toreros (March 2-4). The Hoosiers hit .329 as a team in the four-game series and had 15 extra-base hits, including four home runs, nine doubles, and two triples.
- Indiana's 9-2 start was its best start since 2003, when the Hoosiers opened that season winning 10 of its first 11 games.
- Prior to the San Diego series, IU earned a clean sweep at the Snowbird Classic in Port Charlotte, Fla. The Hoosiers knocked off Rutgers (7-6), Boston College (4-0) and Chicago State (7-2).
- Indiana kicked off the 2018 season by going 3-1 at Baseball at the Beach in Myrtle Beach, S.C. After dropping the opener to No. 18 Oklahoma, the Hoosiers won the next three over Kansas State (5-0), No. 17 South Alabama (8-4) and Coastal Carolina (6-5).
- Two of IU's first four opponents in Myrtle Beach were ranked in at least one preseason poll (Oklahoma and South Alabama), while Coastal Carolina was the 2016 National Champion.
- IU was voted the preseason favorite to claim the 2018 Big Ten Baseball Championship as voted on by the conference coaches.
- Entering 2018, Indiana returned 100 percent of its starts, 94 percent of its wins, and 91 percent of its innings pitched and strikeouts. The Hoosiers also brought back 62 percent of its runs and hits, 61 percent of its RBIs, and 59 percent of its extra-base hits.
- Since the start of the 2008 season, Indiana leads the Big Ten in wins (359) and conference wins (147). The Hoosiers have made five NCAA Regionals over that span, the most out of any current Big Ten team.
- For the fourth time in five years, Indiana was selected to the 2017 NCAA Baseball Tournament field. The No. 2-seeded Hoosiers played in the Lexington Regional.
- Last season marked Indiana's seventh NCAA tournament appearance (1949, 1996, 2009, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017). Head Coach **Chris Lemonis** became the first coach in program history to make two regionals in his first three seasons as IU's skipper.
- It marked Indiana's second ever at large bid in the NCAA Tournament (1949, 1996, 2009, 2013 and 2014 were automatic bids), with both of those at large bids coming in the Lemonis era.
- The Hoosiers finished the 2017 regular season just one game out of third place in the Big Ten and only two games out of first place in the conference. IU played 18 games this season against Big Ten teams that qualified for the conference tournament, more than any other team partici-

pating in the field.

- The Hoosiers closed the 2017 regular season winning its last six series, dating back to the Minnesota series in April. Those six series included Minnesota, at No. 13 Michigan, No. 15 Maryland, Xavier, Penn State and at Ohio State. Indiana also won six series in a row in 2016, taking series from Purdue, Iowa, at Michigan State, Northwestern, at Minnesota and Illinois.
- Lemonis is in his fourth season as Indiana's head coach, posting an overall record of 116-76-2. Lemonis took over an IU program in 2015 that had gone 93-31 the previous two seasons, including its first-ever College World Series appearance in 2013 and the No. 4 overall seed in the 2014 NCAA Baseball Championship. With a new look roster, his program immediately lived up to the expectations, posting a 35-24 overall record and earning a berth into a third-straight NCAA Regional in 2015.
- As an assistant coach, Lemonis' imprint in elevating the Louisville program to new heights was evident. The former Cardinals' recruiting coordinator aided Louisville to three College World Series appearances (2007, 2013, 2014) and a 359-159 (.693) record during the past eight seasons, including back-to-back 50-win seasons in 2013 and 2014.
- Earning his 100th career win as IU skipper against Michigan on May 25, 2017, Lemonis became the seventh Hoosier head coach to hit the 100-win mark in his career. He is the fourth fastest coach in program history to reach that mark.
- After posting a school record fielding percentage of .975 in 2016, Lemonis' squad followed that up with another school record mark of .979 in 2017. In Lemonis' first four seasons as head coach at Indiana, the Hoosiers own three of the top four fielding percentages in program history.
- For the second-straight season in 2017, IU's three freshman team selections were the most in the Big Ten. Indiana has had eight freshman team selections during Lemonis' tenure, the most of any Big Ten team in that time span.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Indiana is first in the Big Ten in home runs (19), second in slugging percentage (.458), third in on base percentage (.380), doubles (42) and total bases (285), fourth in batting average (.286) and hits (178) and fifth in runs (117).
- Coming off the fourth most home runs in program history in 2017, Indiana has already carried that same type of production over to 2018.
- The Hoosiers hit six home runs on opening weekend in Myrtle Beach, with three coming from junior **Luke Miller**, two from senior **Logan Sowers**, and a walk-off grand slam against No. 17 South Alabama from junior **Logan Kaletha**.
- The Hoosiers stole nine total bases on the weekend in Myrtle Beach to open the season, including eight in the win over South Alabama on Feb. 17. It marked the most in a single game for IU since March 4, 2007 (9 at North Florida).
- Ranking second in the Big Ten with 75 long balls (T-29th nationally), Indiana had 11 different players that recorded at least one home run in 2017. The last time IU had at least 11 different players tally a home run was the 2010 season, when that squad had 13.
- Last season also marked the first time since the 2010 campaign that the Hoosiers have had four players record double-digit home runs (**Craig Dedelow** - 19, **Logan Sowers** - 13, **Matt Lloyd** - 11, **Luke Miller** - 10). The 2010 team also had four players hit the double-digit mark (Alex Dickerson - 24, Michael Earley -13, Josh Lyon - 11, Micah Johnson - 11).

- Indiana's 75 home runs during the 2017 campaign stand for fourth all-time in the program's 124-year history.
- During the 2017 regular season, Indiana had eight different series in which it hit at least four home runs for the weekend. That marks the most for the program since at least 2004.
- The Hoosiers were the only team in the conference to have four players rank in the top 10 in home runs (Dedelow - 17, 2nd; Lloyd - 11, T-5th; Miller - 10, T-7th; Sowers - 9, T-10th).
- Additionally, Indiana led the Big Ten in home runs for conference games only with 36, leading in that category by six. The Hoosiers were the only team in the conference to have four players rank in the top eight for home runs in league games only. (Dedelow - 8, 2nd; Lloyd - 7, T-3rd; Sowers - 6, T-5th; Miller - 5, T-8th).
- The Hoosiers hit eight home runs in the series sweep at Northwestern (March 24-26), as well as the three-game set in the NCAA Lexington Regional (four vs. Ohio, four vs. Kentucky). It marked the most home runs in a three-game series for Indiana since also hitting eight at Iowa April 5-7 in 2014.
- Indiana got off to a fast start in the long ball department in 2017, as it hit nine home runs through its first seven games. The last time the Hoosiers hit at least nine through the first seven contests was the 2002 season, when IU also hit nine through its first seven.

CATCHERS

- For the third consecutive season in 2018, catcher **Ryan Fineman** has been named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List, an award that recognizes the nation's top catcher.
- The junior backstop has played in 124 career games, making 110 starts in three seasons. Of those 110 starts, 103 have come behind the dish.
- The junior has thrown out 12 out of 21 attempted base stealers. Those 12 caught stealing rank first in the Big Ten.
- In the Friday night game at San Diego, Fineman made a strong return to his home state, as he put together a 3-for-4 effort, which included his first home run of the year and four runs driven in.
- An All-Big Ten Freshman selection, a Johnny Bench Award Watch Lister, and Indiana's primary catcher in 2016, Fineman appeared in 54 games, making 50 starts (47 behind the plate).
- During his rookie campaign in 2016, the California native finished tied for third on the team with 51 hits, while also adding eight doubles (T-3rd),

- three home runs (T-5th) and 25 RBI (T-3rd).
- Fineman was second in the Big Ten catching 15 runners trying to steal and was third in fewest stolen bases allowed amongst starting catchers.
- Junior **Wyatt Cross** provides a reliable and experienced backup behind the plate to Fineman. In his five starts behind the dish this season, Cross is 2-for-2 throwing out attempted base stealers.
- In the midweek win over Western Illinois on March 16, he reached base four times, was 1-for-1, drove in three runs and scored three times.
- Cross spent 2017 at San Jacinto Junior College prior to spending his freshman campaign at North Carolina.
- With the Tar Heels in 2016, he appeared in 15 games as a freshman.

FIRST BASE

- Sharing time with utility player Matt Lloyd at first base this season is sophomore **Scotty Bradley** and freshman **Elijah Dunham**.
- After receiving a medical redshirt in 2017, Bradley returns for his second season in 2018.
- The New Jersey native has made five starts at first base this season, and hit his second career homer in the win against Chicago State on Feb. 25.
- In the 4-3 win over Northern Illinois on March 18, Bradley hit a two-out, walk-off RBI single in the bottom of the ninth.
- An All-Big Ten Freshman Team selection in 2016, Bradley appeared in 43 games, making 29 starts.
- Bradley is the son of Scott Bradley, an MLB catcher from 1984 to 1992 with the New York Yankees, the Chicago White Sox, Seattle and Cincinnati. Bradley was the catcher for Randy Johnson's no-hitter on June 2, 1990. Scott has been the head coach at Princeton since 1998, where he has led the Tigers to seven NCAA Regional appearances.

- Bradley's uncle is Bob Bradley, the former USA Soccer National Team head coach from 2006-11. Bob's son and Scotty's cousin, Michael, has been a midfielder for Team USA since 2006.
- Dunham has also seen time at first base and has made an impact as a rookie.
- Of his 12 starts this season, five have come at first base with the other seven being at the designated hitter spot.
- The Evansville, Ind. native is tied for second on the team in doubles (5), is third in on base percentage (.400), fourth in batting average (.300), and tied for fourth in walks (6).
- Dunham was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week after the San Diego series, as he went 6-for-12 on the weekend, posting a .500 batting average to go along with two doubles, an RBI and eight total bases. He also scored four runs while posting at least one hit in all four games.

THIRD BASE

- Junior third baseman **Luke Miller** was drafted in the 31st round (916th overall) by the Minnesota Twins in the 2017 MLB Draft, but opted to return to Bloomington in 2018 for his junior season.
- His return to IU has meant a lot to the Hoosiers this season, as he is first in the Big Ten in home runs (7, T-14th nationally), fourth in total bases (48), sixth in slugging percentage (.623) and 11th in RBI (17).
- Five of his seven home runs this season have come when Indiana is either trailing or in a tied game, and have resulted in the Hoosiers tying the game or taking the lead.
- In 2017, he was tied for third in the Big Ten in runs (52), tied for eighth in home runs (10), and was 11th in total bases (109).
- In conference games only, the Muncie, Ind. native finished tied for third in doubles (9), tied for 8th in home runs (5), tied for 10th in home runs (22).

- During the season, he had a reached base streak of 23-straight games snapped on April 14th against Minnesota, IU's longest reached base streak for an individual player in 2017.
- Miller was named a 2016 Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American. He was Indiana's first Freshman All-American since RHP Scott Effross in 2013. Since the 2008 season, Indiana has had nine Freshman All-Americans.
- An All-Big Ten Freshman Team selection in 2016, Miller played in 53 games, making 51 starts, and finished second on IU in batting average (.284), hits (54), doubles (11), third in stolen bases (7) and sixth in RBI (23).
- The Muncie, Ind. native's .333 batting average in Big Ten games only in 2016 ranked 10th in the conference.

SHORTSTOP

- A 2017 Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection, shortstop **Jeremy Houston** started 48 games at shortstop for the Hoosiers last season. He missed the other 12 games in the middle of the season with an injury.
- The sophomore has started 67 career games for the Hoosiers, all at shortstop. He has stolen 12 career bases on 15 attempts, including 4-for-4 this season.
- Known for being sure handed defensively, Houston made eight errors last season, with two of them coming in the first two games of the season and two more coming on a double error. In his last

- 45 games, Houston had just seven errors.
- In the win at Indiana State on March 11 last season, Houston recorded 10 assists in the field without making an error. The 10 assists were the most in a single game for IU since Casey Rodrigue also had 10 on April 4, 2015 against Michigan.
- The Chicago native hit his first career collegiate home run in the win over Maryland on April 30. It marked the first home run hit in any game he has played since he was 14 years old.
- He has hit two career home runs, with the other coming against Minnesota in the 2017 Big Ten Tournament.

OUTFIELD

- Senior **Logan Sowers** has played and started in 181 games of his Indiana career.
- The Lafayette, Ind. native is tied for eighth in the Big Ten in walks (12), is ninth in on base percentage (.443), 10th in slugging percentage (.554), and tied for 13th in total bases (36).
- In the 4-3 victory over Northern Illinois on March 17, he hit the game-winning home run in the bottom of the eighth inning with the contest tied.
- A second team All-Big Ten selection in 2017 and Indiana's Team MVP, Sowers led the conference in doubles (17), was tied for 10th in home runs (9), and tied for 12th in total bases (105).
- In conference games only, he finished tied for third in doubles (9), fourth in slugging percentage (.633), tied for fourth in total bases (62), tied for fifth in home runs (6), tied for sixth in hits (35), tied for eighth in RBI (23), and 10th in batting average (.357).
- Named Indiana's 2016 Team MVP, Sowers played and started in 44 games for the Hoosiers in 2016, leading IU in slugging percentage (.466), on base percentage (.377) and home runs (8).
- The Lafayette, Ind. native ranked ninth in the Big Ten in home runs and in conference games only, was tied for fifth in home runs (4), tied for ninth in walks (14) and 11th in RBI (16).
- Sowers was an All-Big Ten Freshman Team selection in 2015 and a four-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week (3/2, 3/9, 4/14, 5/18), the most honors by any Big Ten freshman and tied for the most weekly conference recognitions in the league.
- He was selected by the San Diego Padres in the 31st round of the 2014 MLB amateur draft.
- Sophomore **Matt Gorski** has served as IU's primary left fielder in 2018.
- The sophomore is tied for fifth in the Big Ten in stolen bases (7) and is tied for sixth in batting average (.375, leads team).
- Gorski had a team-best 10-game hitting streak snapped against Northern Illinois on March 17.

- He was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week after San Diego series, as he hit .529 on the week, going 7-for-19 with a run scored, double, triple, five RBI, a stolen base and 12 total bases in the 3-1 series win.
- An All-Big Ten Freshman team selection, Gorski made an impact in his first season with IU, serving as the primary first baseman.
- He was named IU's Rookie of the Year, appearing in 51 games, making 45 starts, primarily at first base.
- The Fishers, Ind. native finished tied for 10th in the Big Ten in stolen bases (15), which included eight swipes in conference games (T-4th).
- An outfielder in high school, Gorski made the switch to the outfield for the Hoosiers this off-season after playing first base last season.
- In his first season with the Hoosiers, junior **Logan Kaletha**, a transfer from John A. Logan College, has made an immediate impact as IU's lead-off hitter and starting centerfielder.
- Having reached base safely in his last 17 games, the Michigan City, Ind. native is second in the Big Ten in on base percentage (.495) and runs scored (22, 46th nationally), tied for fourth in triples (2, T-42nd nationally), is eighth in slugging percentage (.580), tied for eighth in walks (12), and is 11th in total bases (40).
- Kaletha also has been hit by a pitch 12 times this season, which is second nationally.
- His first career home run as a Hoosier was a memorable one, as he hit a walk-off grand slam in the third game of the season against No. 17 South Alabama in Myrtle Beach, S.C.
- At John A. Logan College, where he was an NJCAA All-American selection, Kaletha hit 17 home runs in two seasons with 113 runs, 105 RBI and 43 stolen bases.

UTILITY

- An ABCA Rawlings First Team All-Region selection in 2017, junior **Matt Lloyd** returned for his second season in Bloomington in 2018. Lloyd has started nine games at first base, seven games at second base, three games at designated hitter and is IU's primary closer.
- Lloyd racked up preseason laurels from the NCBWA, earning second team Preseason All-American honors and a spot on the Stopper of the Year Watch List, an award recognizing the nation's top relief pitcher.
- The Alberta, Canada native is tied for first in the Big Ten in doubles (9), tied for eighth in total bases (42) and is 14th in slugging percentage (.532).
- In the win over the San Diego on March 4, Lloyd hit a towering home run clearing the 452 sign on the roof of Manchester Apartments. According to San Diego Athletics, Lloyd was the first player since 2005 (USD's Shane Buschini) to land one on the roof of the apartment complex.
- A second team All-Big Ten selection in 2017, Lloyd finished tied for third in the conference in doubles (16), fifth in slugging percentage (.554), tied for seventh in home runs (11), tied for ninth in RBI (46), and tied for 13th in total bases (107). His nine saves were good for a share of fourth in the league.
- In conference games only, Lloyd finished third in slugging percentage (.674) and total bases (64), tied for third in home runs (7) and doubles (9), tied for eighth in RBI (23), ninth in batting average (.358), tied for 10th in hits (34), 12th in on base percentage (.419). His six saves in league games only was tied for second in the Big Ten.

PITCHING NOTES

- A big part of Indiana's success in recent years has been its pitching staff, with eight pitchers over the last three seasons going on to play professionally with MLB organizations.
- Under the tutelage of Associate Head Coach/Pitching Coach **Kyle Bunn**, the Hoosiers in 2016 ranked second in the country in walks allowed per nine innings (2.31), fifth in WHIP (1.15) and 11th in team ERA (3.09). Indiana led the Big Ten in fewest walks per nine innings, WHIP, strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.17), was second in team ERA and second in hits allowed per nine innings (8.02).
- Bunn has been known nationally for developing his pitchers as 54 of them have gone on to play professional baseball. During his 16-year stint as an assistant at Ole Miss (2002-07), Clemson (2008-09), Alabama (2010), East Tennessee State (2012-14) and Indiana (2015-present), a total of nine of his pitchers have reached the Major Leagues. Bunn's staffs have poured out three first round draft picks and 22 top five round draft picks.

- The IU pitching staff is first in the Big Ten in ERA (2.66, 17th nationally), fewest earned runs allowed (50), fewest runs allowed (62), shutouts (3, T-10th), fewest walks per nine innings (2.82, 16th), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.85, 33rd), is tied for third in strikeouts (151), and tied for fifth in opposing batting average (.254).
- A strength early in the season has been Indiana's bullpen. The Hoosier bullpen has logged 74.1 innings allowing just 15 earned runs (1.82 ERA), striking out 62.
- In the series victory over San Diego, Hoosier relievers logged 16.2 innings on the weekend, allowing just three earned runs (1.62 ERA).
- IU's bullpen did not allow a single earned run during its weekend sweep in Port Charlotte, as the Hoosiers logged 10.1 innings of relief allowing just seven hits (vs. Rutgers, Boston College and Chicago State).
- The week prior, the bullpen had a dominating opening weekend in Myrtle Beach, allowing just two earned runs in 18 innings of relief.

STARTING PITCHING

- Junior right hander **Jonathan Stiever** is in his third season with the Hoosiers and his second season as IU's Friday night starter.
- The Cedarburg, Wis. native is first in the Big Ten in strikeouts (38) and fifth in innings (30.1).
- The junior earned Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for the first time of his career on March 19, as he threw six scoreless innings in the win over Northern Illinois.
- He allowed only two hits, while striking out six Huskies.
- Stiever had one of the best starts of his career against Pacific, as he went eight innings, striking out a career-high 12 hitters.
- The 12 strikeouts were the most for a Hoosier pitcher in a single game since Joey DeNato punched out 12 against Michigan on April 27, 2012.
- Additionally, his 12 Ks are tied for the most in a game by a Big Ten pitcher this season (Riley McCauley, Michigan State).
- He finished 2017 second in the Big Ten and 11th nationally in walks allowed per nine innings (1.05), while finishing first in the Big Ten and 14th nationally in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.33)
- Junior right hander **Pauly Milto** mans the Saturday slot for the Hoosiers.
- The Greenwood, Ind. native is second in the Big Ten in innings (32.1), tied for second in strikeouts (32), third in ERA (1.95), tied for third in wins (3), and is fourth in opposing batting average (.202).
- He was named Big Ten Pitcher of the Week, as he tossed his first complete game in a 4-0 victory over Boston College at the Snowbird Classic in Port Charlotte, Fla.

- He scattered just four hits in the shutout, striking out eight hitters and walking none
- With the victory, Milto opened the year with a no earned runs in his first 15 innings pitched. He had allowed just five hits over those 15 innings and struck out 13.
- In his first start of the season against Kansas State the week prior, he allowed just one hit in six innings, striking out five and picking up the win. Milto retired 16 of the last 17 batters he faced and had a no-hitter through 5.2 innings.
- In the win over Pacific on March 10, he matched his career-high in strikeouts (9) and allowed just three hits in seven innings.
- A Third Team All-Big Ten selection and IU's Pitcher of the Year in 2017, Milto led the team with 78.0 innings and 56 strikeouts.
- In conference games only, he was tied for first in the Big Ten in wins (5), ninth in innings pitched (47.0) and strikeouts (40) and 15th in ERA (3.64).
- Sophomore **Cam Beauchamp** will be making his third start of the season against the Hawkeyes.
- In his start against Northern Illinois, he logged a career-high six innings, allowing just four hits and no runs.
- His first start came at San Diego, where he pitched four innings, allowed three hits and a run to pick up the win.
