### THIS WEEK

The University of Iowa soccer team kicks off its 2010 season Friday night at the Iowa Soccer complex at 7 p.m. The Hawkeyes host the DePaul Blue Demons in their home opener.

### SCOUTING DEPAUL

DePaul finished the 2009 season 10-9-2 under third year Head Coach Erin Chastain. Despite being picked to finish last in the preseason coaches poll, the Blue Demons advanced to the Big East Tournament for the first time in program history.

The team returns 10 of its 11 starters from the breakout 2009 squad, including leading scorer Tara Strickland. The senior midfielder scored seven times for the Blue Demons and assisted six goals.

Friday nights match marks the first time the two teams have met.

### LAST SEASON

The Hawkeyes are returning to action with nine of their 11 starters from the 9-11 team. The Hawkeyes started last season with a program best 8-2 start, including seven wins in Iowa City, tying the program's highest number of home wins in a season.

## RAINEY IS WINNINGEST COACH

Head Coach Ron Rainey led the team to nine wins, giving him 32 wins in his four season, the most of any head coach at Iowa.

Notable Iowa wins posted last season were over in-state rivals Iowa State and Northern Iowa, as well as Drake, earning the mythical state crown. The Black and Gold also downed Michigan on senior night.
