### THE MATCHUP

- The Hawkeyes will play four games in three days in Little Rock, Ark., playing single games on Friday and Sunday and a doubleheader on Saturday.
- Iowa will face Arkansas-Little Rock on Friday (3 p.m.), Western Illinois (11 a.m.) and UALR (3 p.m.) on Saturday, and Wichita State (10 a.m.) on Sunday. All times are Central.
- The Hawkeyes will play all four games at Gary Hogan Field on the campus of Arkansas-Little Rock. Iowa last played at the venue in 2007.
- Head coach Jack Dahm enters the weekend one win shy of 500 career wins.

### THE SERIES

The Hawkeyes have faced Arkansas-Little Rock, Western Illinois, and Wichita State previously in program history.

- Iowa is 1-1 all-time against Arkansas-Little Rock. The teams played two games in Little Rock in 2007.
- The Hawkeyes own a 68-25-2 all-time series record against Western Illinois. The teams met once in 2012, as Iowa rallied to win, 8-7. The Hawkeyes have won 10 of the last 11 meetings, including the last four.
- Iowa has never defeated Wichita State, falling in all 10 meetings against the Shockers. The clubs last met in 2003. Head coach Jack Dahm coached against Wichita State 39 times while at Creighton from 1994-2003, winning his last four games over the Shockers.

In nine years as the University of Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the UI baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Hawkeyes in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Iowa program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years. Dahm has guided the team to 30 or more wins two of the last six seasons.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21 in a victory over Western Illinois. Also in 2009, Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23 and notched his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories. In 2012, Dahm earned his 200th victory at Iowa as the Hawkeyes won at Indiana (4-0) on March 31.

In Dahm's 19 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, nine freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his nine years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 35 All-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Three Hawkeyes garnered all-league honors in 2012. Senior Phil Keppler earned second team All-Big Ten laurels along with freshman starting pitcher Sasha Kuebel. Kuebel and fellow left-handed pitcher Taylor Kaufman were named to the Big Ten's all-freshman squad. Kuebel was also named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after finishing 6-0 with a 2.67 ERA.

The Hawkeyes finished a game out of a four-way tie for sixth place and the final spot in the Big Ten Tournament in 2012. Iowa closed the season strong, taking 2-of-3 from No. 13 Purdue. The Hawkeyes were the only team all season to win a conference series against the Boilermakers. Iowa defeated Purdue in back-to-back games, earning its first win over a ranked foe since downing No. 25 Louisville in 2009.

While 11 freshmen saw action in 2012, Dahm coached two Hawkeye seniors to the top of the record books. Mike McQuillan closed his career first in singles (196) and second in hits (242). Jarred Hippen, a two-time second team All-Big Ten selection under Dahm, owns the Iowa record for innings pitched (351.2) and ranks second in strikeouts behind Allen Rath with 244.

In the classroom, Dahm's teams have had success, as well. Iowa's baseball team boasted an NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 95, which is 25 points above the national average for NCAA Division I baseball programs. During his Iowa tenure, the head coach has seen 75 players named academic All-Big Ten, including a team-record 12 players in 2011. Iowa had eight student-athletes recognized in 2010 and seven in 2012. That is the best nine-year total in the history of the program. Additionally, shortstop Kurt Lee was named Academic All-District first team in 2011.

**SCOUTING UALR**

Arkansas-Little Rock enters the weekend with a 5-2 record. The Trojans have played all seven of their games at home.

John Clark paces UALR with a .409 batting average, while Bryson Thionnet leads the team in home runs (2) and RBIs (14).

The Trojans will pitch Chance Cleveland on Friday and Blake Huffman on Saturday. Cleveland has made two starts this season, posting a 1.17 ERA with 16 strikeouts in 15.1 innings. Huffman is 1-0 in two starts, posting a 1.69 ERA in 10.2 innings. Both Cleveland and Huffman are right-handed.

Arkansas-Little Rock is coached by Scott Norwood, who is in his fifth season at the school.

**SCOUTING WESTERN ILLINOIS**

Western Illinois is currently 2-4, playing all its games away from home.

The Leathernecks are led offensively by Manny Reyes, Dan Dispensa, and Jake Moore. All three players are hitting at a .308 clip or better this season. Reyes is tied for the team-lead with three RBIs, while Dispensa and Moore have accounted for both of WIU's home runs this season (one apiece).

Righthander John White will start on the mound for the Leathernecks on Saturday. White has made two relief appearances this season, allowing zero earned runs in 6.2 innings.

Western Illinois is led by first-year head coach and former Hawkeye assistant Ryan Brownlee.

**SCOUTING WICHITA STATE**

Wichita State is 1-3 this season. The Shockers were swept at home against Pittsburgh to open the season before winning at Oral Roberts.

Wichita State is balanced offensively, as five players share the team-lead with three RBIs. Tanner Dearman boasts a team-best .364 (4-11) batting average.

The Shockers have not yet announced a starting pitcher for Sunday's game.

Wichita State is coached by Gene Stephenson. Stephenson, who is in his 36th season at WSU, has won 1,799 career games.

**DAHM 1 WIN AWAY FROM 500**

Iowa head coach Jack Dahm is one victory shy of 500 career wins. Dahm is in his 20th season as a head coach, winning 283 games at Creighton from 1994-2003 and 216 games at Iowa, beginning in 2004. His 216 wins at Iowa rank third in program history, trailing Duane Banks (810 wins) and Otto Vogel (440 wins).

**1-RUN GAMES UNDER DAHM**

During Jack Dahm's 10-year tenure at Iowa, the Hawkeyes have played 123 one-run games. Iowa is 57-66 in such contests. The Hawkeyes went 10-7 in one-run games in 2012, winning their final five.

**FAMILIAR FACES**

The Hawkeyes will see two familiar faces in the opposing dugout when they face Western Illinois on Saturday, as head coach Ryan Brownlee and assistant coach Dusty Napoleon are both former members of the Hawkeye program.

Brownlee was an assistant coach at Iowa for nine seasons, serving as the Hawkeyes' hitting coach, infield instructor, and recruiting coordinator. Brownlee's father, Jim, is currently Iowa's interim pitching coach.

Napoleon was an undergraduate assistant coach for the Hawkeyes in 2012. Napoleon also played at Iowa from 2006-07, appearing in 105 games before being drafted by the Oakland Athletics in the 19th round of the 2007 Major League Baseball Draft.

**HAWKEYES WIN 2-OF-3 IN TEXAS**

The Hawkeyes posted a 2-1 record at the Kleberg Bank College Classic, hosted in Corpus Christi Texas on Feb. 22-24. Iowa suffered a 3-1 setback against No. 14 Oklahoma to open the tournament before bouncing back to defeat New Mexico, 6-2, in 10 innings, and host-Texas A&M Corpus Christi, 4-2.

Sophomores Kris Goodman and Taylor Kaufman led the Hawkeye offense, as both players recorded six hits, while Kaufman (New Mexico) and senior Ricky Sandquist (Texas A&M Corpus Christi) picked up wins on the mound.

**ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**

Three Hawkeyes -- sophomores Taylor Kaufman, Kris Goodman and Sasha Kuebel -- were named to the Kleberg Bank College Classic All-Tournament team. Kaufman hit .545 with six hits and two RBIs, Goodman had six hits and an RBI, and Kuebel limited Oklahoma to two runs on eight hits over eight innings in the opener.

**KAUFMAN HEATS UP AT THE PLATE**

After going 0-for-9 at the plate in the first two games of the season, sophomore Taylor Kaufman has hit safely in a career-best four straight games. Kaufman is 7-for-15 (.467) over the four-game stretch, including 5-of-8 in the final two games of the Kleberg Bank College Classic (New Mexico, Texas A&M Corpus Christi).

Kaufman has also made two appearances pitching this season, throwing seven scoreless innings. Kaufman collected his first win of the season against New Mexico on Feb. 23, pitching four innings and striking out three. His first appearance came against Austin Peay on Feb. 16. The Glenwood, Iowa, native struck out a career-high four batters in three innings of work.

**GOODMAN STAYS HOT**

Sophomore Kris Goodman has hit safely in all six games this season, setting a career-best hitting streak. The Apple Valley, Minn., native followed a 5-for-10 performance in the Hawkeyes three-game series with Austin Peay (Feb. 15-17) by going 6-for-14 at the Kleberg Bank College Classic (Feb. 22-24).

Goodman has recorded a team-best three



multi-hit games, posting a career-high three hits against Austin Peay (Feb. 16) and Oklahoma (Feb. 22).

In addition, Goodman scored three runs against Austin Peay on Feb. 16, setting a career-high.

Goodman currently leads the Hawkeyes in hits (11), runs scored (5), and total bases (11).

**A WINNING SWITCH**

Head coach Jack Dahm inserted sophomore Kris Goodman into the lead-off spot against New Mexico (Feb. 23) and Texas A&M Corpus Christi (Feb. 24). The switch resulted in a pair of Hawkeye victories, as they defeated New Mexico, 6-2, in 10 innings and Texas A&M Corpus Christi, 4-2. Goodman hit in the No. 9 spot during Iowa's first four games.

**BRAND STEPS UP IN 1ST START**

Junior Keith Brand earned his first start of the season Feb. 24 at Texas A&M Corpus Christi, serving as the Hawkeyes' designated hitter. Brand responded by delivering a double in the top of the eighth that plated the game-winning run.

**DAY'S FIRST**

Sophomore Nick Day has notched the first home run and multi-hit game of his collegiate career this season.

Day's posted his first multi-hit game Feb. 23 against New Mexico, going 2-for-4 against the Lobos.

Day hit his first home run Feb. 17 at Austin Peay. The Solon, Iowa, native led off the fourth inning by hitting a solo blast over the left field fence.

**CAN'T TOUCH THIS**

Sophomore Eric Toole is a perfect 4-of-4 in stolen base attempts this season. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native's four steals lead the team.

**THE CLOSER**

Senior Andrew Hanse has finished three games on the mound this season, ranking tied for first in the Big Ten. The Marion, Iowa, native picked up his first save after throwing a perfect ninth inning on Feb. 24 against Texas A&M Corpus Christi. Hanse has tossed 5.1 innings in three appearances, posting a 1.69 ERA and three strikeouts.

**YACINICH HIT STREAK**

Sophomore Jake Yacinich hit safely in the Hawkeyes first five games this season, tying a career-best hitting streak. Yacinich is tied for the team lead with three multi-hit games and ranks second in hits (8).

**KUEBEL AMONG B1G BEST**

Sophomore pitcher Sasha Kuebel ranks in the top-five in the Big Ten in two statistical categories. The St. Louis native ranks second in batters struck out looking (5) and fourth in innings pitched (13.0).

**DON'T RUN ON SHEPPARD**

Through six games, senior Dan Sheppard has caught five baserunners attempting to steal. The mark is tops in the conference, as no one else has thrown out more than three baserunners. Sheppard threw out four baserunners in Iowa's season-opening series at Austin Peay (Feb. 15-17).

**STINGY PITCHING STAFF**

The Iowa pitching staff has been among the best in the Big Ten so far this season, ranking in the top-three in six statistical categories. The Hawkeyes rank second in ERA (1.70), runs allowed (18), and earned runs allowed (10) and third in opposing batting average (.230), hits allowed (45), and walks allowed (22).

**BULLPEN DOES ITS JOB**

The Iowa bullpen has been stellar this year, allowing one earned run in 19.1 innings and collecting two of the team's three wins.

Seniors Andrew Hanse and Ricky Sandquist, and sophomore Taylor Kaufman allowed one earned run in nine innings at the Kleberg Bank College Classic on Feb. 22-24, as Kaufman (New Mexico) and Sandquist (Texas A&M Corpus Christi) both picked up wins.

The bullpen did not allow an earned run in the Hawkeyes' three-game series at Austin Peay on Feb. 15-17. Hanse, Sandquist, Kaufman, sophomores Andrew Hedrick and Nick Hibbing, and freshman Josh Martsching combined to pitch 10.1 innings without allowing an earned run out of the bullpen against the Governors.

**GETTING PLUNKED**

The Hawkeyes rank second in the Big Ten with 10 hit by pitches in their first six games. Freshman Blake Hickman has been plunked by three of those pitches, ranking first on the team and second in the conference.

**UNSELFISH HAWKEYES**

Iowa has laid down eight sacrifice bunts this season, the second-most among Big Ten teams. Sophomore Eric Toole leads the effort, as he has posted a team and conference -best three sacrifice bunts.

**SHEPPARD OPENS SEASON IN STYLE**

Senior Dan Sheppard was impressive in the Hawkeyes season-opening series against Austin Peay on Feb. 15-17. Sheppard hit .364 (4-of-11) and batted in a team-best four runs in the three-game set, including a 3-of-4, four RBI game on Feb. 16. Sheppard's three hits in a game tied a career-best, while his four RBIs set a new career-high. His four RBIs were the most by any Big Ten athlete during the opening weekend of play.

**HAWKEYE DEBUTS**

Five Hawkeye newcomers made their Iowa debuts at Austin Peay. Freshman Blake Hickman made his collegiate debut Feb. 15, and started all three games at first base against the Governors.
