ON THE MAT

The University of Iowa (3-0) wrestling team faces Iowa State (4-0) on Saturday in the annual Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series. The dual begins at 7 p.m. (CT) on Mediacom Mat at Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,077).

Admission is \$15 for adults and \$8 for youth (high school age and younger).

DAN GABLE TRAVELING TROPHY

The Iowa-Iowa State wrestling rivalry introduced the Dan Gable Traveling Trophy in 2010.

In a joint collaboration, the schools announced the annual dual would be wrestled for a trophy representing Iowa State's former two-time NCAA Champion and Iowa's 15-time NCAA championship coach.

lowa has won every meeting since the trophy's inception, including a 22-13 win at home in 2010, a 27-9 win in Ames in 2011, a 32-3 win in Iowa City in 2012, and a 23-9 win in Ames last season.

THE SERIES

Iowa leads Iowa State, 62-16-2, in the alltime series, and has won the last 10 meetings. The Hawkeyes own a 31-5-1 advantage in Iowa City.

Iowa State's last win in the series was 19-16 on Dec. 5, 2004, in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes have won four in a row and 27 of the last 28 on their home mat. Overall, Iowa has won 50 of the last 54 meetings.

The Hawkeyes have won 10 straight in the series on two occasions. Iowa won 30 in a row from 1987-2002, and 10 straight from 1981-86. A win on Friday would run Iowa's active win streak to 11.

IOWA CORN CY-HAWK SERIES

The Cy-Hawk Series is in its 11th season in 2013-14, being sponsored for the fourth time by Iowa Corn.

lowa State currently leads the series, 11-0, having secured wins in soccer, football, volleyball, and men's and women's cross country.

lowa wrestling owns a 9-1 lead in the Cy-Hawk Series duals. The Cyclones won the first meeting in 2004, and lowa has won the last nine. (lowa has won 10 straight overall, including a meeting at the National Duals.)

ALL-AMERICAN REMATCH

lowa sophomore Cory Clark and Iowa State junior Earl Hall both earned All-America honors at 125 pounds in 2014. Clark placed fifth at the national tournament, Hall placed eighth.

Both wrestlers moved up a weight in 2014-15. Clark is ranked No. 4 at 133, and Hall is ranked No. 14.

Clark is 2-0 all-time against Hall. He held on for an 8-7 win last year in Ames, and won 10-4 at the NCAA Championships.

SENIOR MOMENT AT 165

Iowa senior Nick Moore and Iowa State senior Michael Moreno meet for the fourth time in their careers.

Moore has defeated Moreno in each of the last two Cy-Hawk Series duals (3-2 in 2012; 3-1 in 2013), but Moreno has the only postseason win between the two -- a 5-3 win at the 2013 NCAA Championships.

Moreno, an All-American in 2013 and 2014, is ranked No. 3. Moore enters the match ranked No. 5. Both wrestlers are Iowa natives. Moore is from Iowa City. Moreno is from Urbandale.

VETERAN EVANS

Senior Mike Evans is the lone Hawkeye making his fourth appearance in the Cy-Hawk Series dual.

Evans lost to Andrew Sorenson, 4-3, as a redshirt freshman wrestling at 165 in 2011. He has since won two straight at 174, both 10-1 major decisions against Tanner Weatherman.

Evans is ranked No. 4 coming into Saturday's match. Weatherman is ranked No. 6.

Hawkeye seniors Bobby Telford (2-0), Nick Moore (2-0) and Michael Kelly (0-2) are making their third appearances in the series. Kelly has competed at 149 each of the last two seasons. Josh Dziewa defeated Gabe Moreno, 12-5, in his only Cy-Hawk dual appearance in 2013.

CY-HAWK DEBUTS

Sophomore Thomas Gilman is making his Cy-Hawk Series debut Saturday. Gilman defeated Iowa State's Drake Swarm, 21-4, in the opening round of the 2012 UNI Open. It is his only career meeting against Iowa State.

None of Iowa's three wrestlers listed at 149 pounds has wrestled in the Cy-Hawk Series. Edwin Cooper is in his first year at Iowa, Brandon Sorensen redshirted last season, and Brody Grothus was not in the lineup in 2012 or 2013.

Neither Kris Klapprodt nor Alex Meyer, both listed on the probable lineup, have wrestled in the Cy-Hawk Series.

Klapprodt could get the call against No. 3 Kyven Gadson at 197. Gadson defeated Sammy Brooks, 3-2, in 2013, and topped true freshman Nathan Burak, 5-4, in 2012.

SORENSEN WINS ROUND 2

Redshirt freshman Brandon Sorensen came out on top of a Joe Parisi Open 149-pound field that included junior Brody Grothus and junior Edwin Cooper, Jr.

Sorensen was 4-0 at the tournament with a 3-1 win over Cooper in the semifinals, it was their first career meeting. He then defeated Terrel Wilbourn, 4-1, in finals. Wilbourne had defeated Grothus, 3-1, in overtime on the top side of the semifinal bracket.

Grothus later pinned Cooper (0:53) in the consolation finals. Grothus is 2-0 alltime against Cooper.

Grothus was 5-0 with a pair of pins at the Luther Open on Nov. 15. He pinned his first two opponents before defeating Sorensen, 3-2, in the semifinals. He then won the 149-pound title with a 9-6 win in the finals over Cooper.

Grothus advanced to the 2014 NCAA Championships at 149, ending Iowa's threeyear postseason drought at the national tournament. He was 24-12 overall last year, including wins over the top four finishers at the NCAA tournament.

Sorensen is 1-1 all-time against Grothus. He defeated Grothus in the consolation finals of the Midlands tournament and was 24-4 last season competing unattached. He split the season between 149 and 157, opening with a 10-3 record at 157 before finishing the season 14-1 at 149.

Cooper won a national title for Iowa Central in 2012 at 149 pounds. He did not compete in 2013, and placed runner-up at the 2014 Division II NCAA Championships.

MEYER, KLAPPRODT SHOW DEPTH

Sophomore Alex Meyer and junior Kris Klapprodt each placed runner-up at the Luther Open behind a couple of Iowa All-Americans.

Meyer pinned three opponents and recorded a technical fall before losing, 6-0, to Evans in the 174-pound finals. He was 2-0 in Big Ten duals last season and placed seventh at Midlands. He was 4-0 last week en route to the 174-pound title at the Joe Parisi Open.

Klapprodt took Nathan Burak to overtime in the Luther Open finals at 197, but fell, 3-1, in the first sudden victory period.

He was 2-1 with a pin last week at the lowa City Duals. He finished 15-2 at 197 pounds last season, recording five pins and three major decisions.

KELLY RETURNS TO 157

Senior Michael Kelly is 8-0 with four falls this season at 157 pounds.

Kelly has a 28-3 career mark at 157, including an 18-1 record competing unattached in 2010-11. He was 5-1 as a redshirt freshman, and wrestled his entire sophomore campaign at 149. He wrestled at 157 once last year, falling to Indiana's sixthranked Taylor Walsh.

The veteran has 35 career dual starts under his belt, the fourth most on the team.

ALL-AMERICAN STREAK

lowa returns four All-Americans this year --Cory Clark (125), Mike Evans (174), Nathan Burak (197), and Bobby Telford (285). The Hawkeyes have crowned at least one All-American every year since 1972, a span of 43 seasons. Iowa has totaled 261 All-America honors during that stretch. The Hawkeyes crowned six All-Americans in 2014, includ-

ing four-time All-American Derek St. John (157) and first-timers Clark (125) and Burak (197). Tony Ramos earned his third career All-America honor, winning the 133-pound bracket, and Evans (174) and Telford (285) were both named All-Americans for the second time in their careers.

40 YEARS SINCE NO. 1

Gary Kurdelmeier led Iowa to its first NCAA Championship in 1975, and in the 40 years since, the Hawkeyes have accumulated 23 team titles, more than any other school --Oklahoma State (7), Penn State (4), Minnesota (3), Iowa State (2), and Arizona State (1).

THE ATTENDANCE GAME

In 2013-14, the University of Iowa wrestling program led the nation in attendance for the eighth consecutive season according to the annual Division I attendance report released March 4 by Roby Publishing.

lowa averaged 8,835 fans in seven duals, setting an NCAA single season attendance record of 61,843. The Hawkeyes averaged at least 8,000 fans for the sixth consecutive season, and own the three highest single season averages in NCAA history (9,014 in 2012; 8,764 in 2013).

In 2013-14, Iowa became the first school in NCAA history to host three duals with more than 10,000 fans -- Penn State (13,747), Minnesota (10,588), and Oklahoma State (10,141).

When considering the Iowa City Duals -- which Iowa hosted Nov. 22 against Baker, Cornell College, and Iowa Central -- a school record 67,556 fans attended wrestling meets inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

NCAA EXPERIENCE

The Hawkeyes return seven wrestlers with NCAA Championships experience. Seniors Mike Evans (174) and Bobby Telford (285) are three-time NCAA qualifiers. Telford earned All-America honors in 2012 and 2014, while Evans earned All-America honors in 2013 and 2014. Junior Nathan Burak (197) and sophomore Cory Clark (125) also advanced to the All-America stand in 2014. Burak was making his second NCAA tournament appearance, while Clark was making his first. Senior Nick Moore (165) has competed in two NCAA Championships (2013, 2014), and last year senior Josh Dziewa (141) and junior Brody Grothus (149) made their first career appearances.

TICKET INFORMATION

Season and single dual tickets are now available for purchase on <u>hawkeyesports.com</u>. Season tickets for eight home dates are available for \$95. UI students and kids five-years old and younger are admitted free to all wrestling events.

Adult tickets are \$15 for Iowa State (Nov. 29) and Virginia (Feb. 15) -- Iowa's opening round opponent of the Cliff Keen National Duals.

Youth tickets (18 and younger) are \$8 for single duals.

Tickets to the second round of the Cliff Keen National Duals (Feb. 22) -- featuring eight teams and three rounds of competition -- are \$20 for all ages.

lowa's overall dual meet record is 944-224-31 (.799) in 105 seasons. The Hawkeyes have won 23 national titles and 34 Big Ten titles. Iowa's 53 NCAA Champions have won a total of 81 NCAA individual titles, crowning six three-time and 16 two-time champions. The Hawkeyes' 110 Big Ten champions have combined for 191 conference titles. There have been seven four-time, 18 three-time, and 29 two-time Iowa winners. Iowa's 150 All-Americans have earned All-America status 307 times, including 18 four-time, 32 three-time and 39 two-time honorees.

Tom Brands

Head Coach (University of Iowa, 1992)

Three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year Tom Brands completed his eighth season as head wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. A 1996 Olympic gold medalist and member of wrestling's Hall of Fame, Brands is only the eighth wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. The former Hawkeye wrestler was a four-time All-American and three-time national champion (1989-92) at Iowa. He has a 149-15-1 (.904) overall and 58-6 (.906) Big Ten coaching record at Iowa, and a 166-35-1 (.822) career mark.

In eight seasons as lowa's head coach, Brands has led the Hawkeyes to three NCAA and Big Ten team titles, crowning nine NCAA champions, 11 Big Ten champions and 44 All-Americans. Iowa has honored 61 academic all-Big Ten recipients, including a school-record 12 in 2011-12. The Hawkeyes have qualified 72 wrestlers for the NCAA Championships in the last eight years, sending the entire 10-man line-

up in 2009, 2010, and 2014. Iowa has also won or shared six of the last seven Big Ten regular season titles. During Brands' tenure, Iowa set school records for longest dual unbeaten (84) and winning streaks (69), longest dual road unbeaten (51) and winning streaks (44), most Carver-Hawkeye Arena victories (11) and most dual shutouts (8).

lowa also made another entry in the record books, setting the then-national collegiate dual meet attendance record of 15,955 when lowa defeated lowa State, 20-15, on Dec. 6, 2008, at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. lowa has led the nation in attendance in each of Brands' eight seasons, setting an NCAA all-time attendance average of 9,014 in 2011-12.

Brands was named 2008 NWCA Coach of the Year after leading the Hawkeyes to their first NCAA team title since 2000 and their first Big Ten team title since 2004. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009 and 2010, becoming the first coach in conference history to earn the honor in three consecutive seasons.

Brands served as head coach at Virginia Tech University for two seasons (2005-06), recording a 17-20 dual mark. In his first season with the Hokies, Brands led the team to the 2005 regular season Atlantic Coast Conference title, set a school record for dual meet wins (16) and had a school-record five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships. During his tenure, Virginia Tech crowned five ACC champions and had two All-Americans. Senior heavyweight Mike Faust was named 2006 ACC Wrestler of the Year.

Prior to taking the helm at Virginia Tech, Brands was an assistant coach at Iowa for 12 seasons (1993-2004). He helped the Hawkeyes to a 177-27 dual record, seven NCAA and eight Big Ten team titles, while crowning 23 NCAA champions, 73 All-Americans and 36 Big Ten champions. He was named the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000. In 2004, he was one of three coaches for the U.S. Olympic freestyle wrestling team, participating in

In 2004, he was one of three coaches for the U.S. Olympic freestyle wrestling team, participating in Athens. Brands also served as assistant coach for the 2002 and 2003 U.S. Freestyle World Teams, earning Freestyle Coach of the Year honors from USA Wrestling both years. He was also a member of the U.S. coaching staff at the 2001 World Championships, and has coached a number of other U.S. teams in international competition.

As a competitor, Brands won the 1996 Olympic freestyle gold medal at 136.5 pounds in Atlanta, GA. He also won a gold medal at the 1993 World Freestyle Championships in Toronto, two World Cup gold medals (1994, 1995) and was the 1995 Pan American Games champion. He won four U.S. National titles (1993-96) and made four straight U.S. World or Olympic teams (1993-96). Along with his twin brother, Terry, Tom was named 1993 USA Wrestling Athlete of the Year, the 1993 John Smith Outstanding Freestyle Wrestler, and 1993 Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year. He was inducted into wrestling's Hall of Fame in 2001.

Brands was a four-time All-American at Iowa (1989-92). During his Hawkeye career, he won three NCAA titles and was named Outstanding Wrestler of the 1992 NCAA Championships. Also a three-time Big Ten champion, Brands won 95 percent of his matches at Iowa. His career mark of 158-7-2 includes an undefeated season in 1991 (45-0).

The Sheldon, Iowa, native was born April 9, 1968. He earned his B.S. degree in physical education from Iowa in 1992. He and his wife, Jeni, have three children, Madigan, Kinsee and Tommy.
