SCOUTING ILLINOIS

- The Fighting Illini bring an 8-3-3 record into Thursday's match, including a 2-3-3 mark in Big Ten play. Last weekend, Illinois battled Michigan State to a 1-1 draw on Oct. 8, before falling to Michigan, 3-1, on Oct. 11.
- Illinois has scored 23 goals in 14 games this season with Jannelle Flaws leading the team with nine goals and six assists.
- Flaws leads the team -- and the Big Ten-- with 67 shots this season. Flaws also paces the league in assists (6), shots per game (4.79) and points (24), while ranking second in goals (9) and game-winning goals (4).
- The Fighting Illini's Claire Wheatley has played every minute in goal, where she has posted 1.08 goals against average. Her 69 saves rank third-best in the league.
- Illinois is led by head coach Janet Rayfield, who is in her 14th season with the program.

HEAD COACH DAVE DIIANNI

Dave Dilanni is entering his second season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 235-25-19 (.876) career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history and his current .876 winning percentage is third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In his first season in lowa City, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 14-7-1 overall and a 7-5-1 Big Ten record to notch the program's third top-five league finish since 2011. The seven Big Ten victories tied the program record for Big Ten wins in a single season and the 14 wins were the second-most in school history.

After entering the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 5 seed, lowa posted victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Northwestern to advance to the tournament championship game for a second straight season. Two seniors -- Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert -- capped their Hawkeye careers with first-team All-Big Ten and first-team all-region honors. They were the first pair in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in the same season and the first two players to garner first-team all-region recognition.

The Hawkeyes finished 2014 with a school-record 14 shutouts in 22 games to rank 20th nationally with a .545 shutout percentage. lowa's defense also was in the top-35 in the country in saves percentage (31st, .838) and goals against average (35th, .754).

Academically, the Hawkeyes garnered the NSCAA Team Academic Award for an eighth straight season and nine soccer student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors. Seniors Caitlin Brown and Emily Scott were also received Scholar All-Region recognition.

lowa Soccer Complex on Sept. 11. The win was lowa's first over the Fighting Illini since 2008 and it was lowa's first Big Ten-opening victory since 2007.

SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN

- The Wildcats -- ranked 24th in the NSCAA poll -- bring a 10-3-2 record into Sunday's match, including a 4-2-1 mark in Big Ten play. Their only blemishes came against Michigan, No. 19 Santa Clara, and No. 9 Penn State.
- •Northwestern split last weekend, falling 1-0 to Michigan on Oct. 8, before shutting out to Michigan State, 1-0, on Oct. 11.
- The Wildcats have scored 17 goals in 15 games this season with Addie Steiner leading the team with four goals and five assists.
- The Wildcats' Lauren Clem has played every minute in goal, where she has posted 0.51 goals against average that ranks third in the league. Clem's nine shutouts this season rank second in the Big Ten.
- Northwestern is led by head coach Michael Moynihan, who is in his fourth season with the program.

NORTHWESTERN VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

- Northwestern leads the all-time series, 11-7-1.
- The Hawkeyes have won four of the last five meetings, including three straight 1-0 victories. Iowa defeated Northwestern twice in 2014 -- 1-0 in Iowa City on Sept. 14 and 1-0 in the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament.

OUICK HITTERS

- Senior Hannah Clark leads the Big Ten in saves (79), saves per game (5.64), and is seventh in save percentage (0.814).
- Junior Bri Toelle ranks second in the Big Ten in shots (64), third in shots per game (4.62) and is ninth in points per game (1.00).

- The Hawkeyes tallied seven shots against No. 14 Minnesota on Oct. 11 the most in a Big Ten game this season. The Hawkeyes have registered a total of 169 shots in 14 games this season.
- Sophomore Karly Stuenkel is second on the team with three goals, two assists, and eight points this season. She notched her first game-winning goal in lowa's, 2-1, overtime victory over UNI.
- The Hawkeyes have used a different starting lineup in 13-of-14 contests. Five players -- Hannah Clark, Brooke Backes, Kyrie Seying, Rachele Armand, and Amanda Lulek -- have started every game.
- •The Hawkeyes finished nonconference play with a 6-1 record. lowa is 36-2 in the nonconference during the last five seasons.

LAST GAME

lowa fell to No. 14 Minnesota, 2-0, at home on Oct. 11. Clark finished with a season-high 12 saves in 90 minutes of action.

RECORD-BREAKING CROWD

lowa had a school-record crowd of 1,847 fans in attendance during its Big Ten Conference home opener against Ohio State on Sept. 25. The Hawkeyes have had two of the top three crowds in program history in 2015. A crowd of 1,314 -- third-most all-time -- was in attendance Sept. 11 for the lowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game against lowa State.

CLARK EYES HISTORY

Senior Hannah Clark has been in goal for 35 wins in her UI soccer career. With her next victory, Clark will move past former Hawkeye Emily Moran as the winningest goalkeeper in program history. Clark is also the school record holder in career shutouts (26), and is third all-time with 295 saves.

GAME WINNERS

Five different Hawkeyes have scored game-winning goals this season. Bri Toelle has tallied two, while Brooke





Backes, Tory Harman, Jenna Kengen, and Karly Stuenkel have each recorded one.

Toelle's two game winners currently rank ninth in the Big Ten.

TOELLE TIES PROGRAM RECORD

Junior Bri Toelle tied the school record for single game assists after notching three assists in Iowa's 4-0 victory over Nebraska Omaha on Aug. 23. The total is the high water mark in the Big Ten this season.

Toelle shares the lowa school record with Morgan Showalter (Sept. 23, 2008) and Jenna Sorensen (Sept. 5, 1997).

QUICK STRIKES

- Freshman Hannah Brobst notched her first career goal, minutes into her first game as a Hawkeye in Iowa's 3-0, win over UIC on Sept. 13.
- lowa scored two goals in the span of 1:39 seconds in its 2-1 win over Utah State.
- The Hawkeyes scored their third and fourth goals in a span of 29 seconds in their 4-0 win over Omaha on Aug. 23.

MAGRUDER NAMED B1G FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

University of lowa midfielder Alina Magruder was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Aug. 25 after scoring a pair of goals in lowa's 4-0 victory over Omaha. The honor is the first of Magruder's career and she is the first Hawkeye freshman to earn the weekly conference honor since Hannah Clark on Oct. 8, 2012.

TEAM CAPTAIN

Senior Hannah Clark has been named lowa's team captain for the 2015 season. She is joined on lowa's Leadership Council by senior Sarah Mazur, juniors Corey Burns and Amanda Lulek, and redshirt freshman Aubree Larson.

B1G IN THE POLLS

Penn State, Minnesota, Northwestern, and Rutgers are ranked in the NSCAA Top 25 poll as of Oct. 13.

Penn State was voted No. 9, Minnesota is 11th, Northwestern is 24th, and Rutgers sits at No. 25.
