- QB Nate Stanley has 6 touchdown passes and no interceptions in 2019. He has 58 career touchdowns passes, third all-time in program history. He trails Chuck Long (74) and Drew Tate (61) on the all-time list. (page 6)
- QB Nate Stanley has started the last 29 games at quarterback, and the Hawkeyes have averaged 29.6 points per game in those starts. That average ranks fifth in school history, and 10th nationally among active quarterbacks. (page 7)
- DE A.J. Epenesa leads a defense that ranks fourth in the Big Ten in scoring defense (10.3) and total defense (262.7). Epenesa had one sack and four quarterback hurries in Week 2. He led the Big Ten and ranked ninth in the country with 10.5 sacks in 2018. (page 7)
- WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette leads the team in receptions (11), receiving yards (194) and touchdowns (3). He set a career-high with 113 receiving yards in Week 2. (page 7)
- DB Michael Ojemudia is tied for the Big Ten lead with two interceptions. The Hawkeyes' three interceptions ties for fifth in the Big Ten.. Over the last three seasons, no school has more interceptions than Iowa. The Hawkeyes have 44 interceptions since 2017. Boston College is second with 43. (page 6)
- RB Mekhi Sargent leads the team in carries (40) and rushing yards (208), ties for second in receptions (9), and ranks third in receiving yards (102). His 310 all-purpose yards lead the team. (page 4)
- On this date in 1957, Iowa scored a school record 70 points hosting Utah State (70-14). The Hawkeyes have scored in every quarter this season (12 quarters).
- K Keith Duncan is 8-of-8 on field goal attempts. He is one of five kickers in the country to be perfect on at least eight field goal attempts. His eight field goals made ties for the Big Ten lead. Duncan is 4-of-4 on field goal attempts 40-yards or longer. (page 4)
- lowa has won 10 straight non-conference games since the 2017 season opener. Iowa has won six straight overall, its longest streak since winning the first 12 games of 2015.
- lowa is off to a 3-0 start for the third straight year, and the ninth time in the Ferentz era. The Hawkeyes are chasing their fifth 4-0 start under head coach Kirk Ferentz (2003, 2006, 2009, 2015). lowa went on to win 10 or more games in 2003, 2009, and 2015.

# HAWKEYE HISTORY

lowa has played 1,249 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 653-557-39 (.538). That includes a 407-221-16 (.644) record in home games, a 246-336-23 (.426) record in games away from Iowa City, a 330-378-25 (.467) mark in Big Ten games and a 291-186-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

When Iowa hosts Minnesota on Nov. 16, it will mark the 130th anniversary of Iowa football. The Hawkeyes played their first football game on Nov. 16, 1889, against Grinnell.

# **SERIES HISTORY**

Saturday is the first ever meeting between the two schools. Iowa is 6-1 all-time against current Conference USA. The Hawkeyes defeated North Texas 62-16 in their last meeting against Conference USA (Sept. 26, 2015 at Kinnick Stadium).

# **SARGENT LEADS RUNNING BACK BY COMMITTEE**

RB Mekhi Sargent leads the team in carries (40) and rushing yards (208), ties for second in receptions (9), and ranks third in receiving yards (102). His 310 all-purpose yards lead the team. He has started the last seven games and is named on the Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List.

RB Toren Young (22), RB Tyler Goodson (22) both have 20-plus carries. Young leads lowa with 5.5 yards per carry. Goodson has 22 carries and six receptions. His 28 combined touches ranks second on the team to Sargent (49). Iowa averages 173.0 rushing yards per game, sixth in the Big Ten.

Juniors Ivory Kelly-Martin, Sargent, and Young shared the workload in 2018. The trio combined for 392 carries, 1,723 rushing yards and 16 rushing touchdowns (nine by Sargent, five by Young, and two by Kelly-Martin). Sargent had 40.6 percent of the carries (159-745), Young had 34.7 percent of the attempts (136-637), and Kelly-Martin has 24.7 percent of the carries (97-341).

# **DUNCAN NAMED BIG TEN SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

K Keith Duncan was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week and Lou Groza Award Star of the Week on Sept. 16 following his performance at Iowa State. Duncan connected on a career-best four field goals at Iowa State. His final kick from 39 yards provided the margin of victory with 4:51 remaining in the fourth quarter. He also connected from 25 yards on Iowa's first drive of the game and from 40 yards on the final play of the first half. He nailed a 42-yarder late in the third quarter.

Duncan has made all eight field goal attempts and 8-of-8 PAT attempts. He leads the team in scoring with 32 points. Duncan has made four kicks of at least 40 yards. He is seeing his first action since 2016, when he made 9-11 field goal attempts and 38-39 PAT attempts (one was blocked).

The Big Ten weekly honor is the second of his career. He was previously recognized in 2016, earning the weekly honor following lowa's 14-13 win over Michigan. Duncan contributed two field goals in that win, including the game-winner from 33 yards on the final play of the game.

# D.J. JOHNSON NAMED CO-BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

DB D.J. Johnson was named Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week on Sept. 16 following his performance at Iowa State. In his second career start, Johnson recorded a career-high eight tackles, including six solo tackles and two assists, and added two pass break-ups. The Big Ten weekly honor is the first of his career.

# **HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ**

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 21st season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry earlier this year. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015).
   Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fifth all-time with 155 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 92 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- lowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 146-80 (.646) overall mark and an 88-58 (.603) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 13 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 155-101 (.605) and an 92-72 (.561) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 155 wins. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 167-122 (.577).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
   Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013.
   Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

## **FERENTZ MOVES UP BIG TEN CHARTS**

Head coach Kirk Ferentz's 155 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonza Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (155).

Ferentz has 92 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 92 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz (155-101) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as lowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached lowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 21st season in 2019.

Both Ferentz (155, 92) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

## **FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY**

Kirk Ferentz is in his 21st season as lowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named lowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle are also in their 21st seasons on Iowa's staff. Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), enters his eighth season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

# **TROPHY COLLECTION**

lowa defended the Cy-Hawk Trophy with an 18-17 win at Iowa State on Sept. 14. The Hawkeyes are 14-3 in their last 17 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin), with all three losses coming to Wisconsin. Iowa has also won its last two bowl games, claiming trophies at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl and 2019 Outback Bowl. The Hawkeyes have won 10 straight non-conference games.

## STANLEY CLIMBS SCHOOL AND CONFERENCE CHARTS

QB Nate Stanley has six touchdown passes and no interceptions in 2019. He completed three touchdown passes in the season opener against Miami, Ohio, and three more in Week 2 against Rutgers. He has 58 career touchdowns passes, third all-time in program history. He trails Chuck Long (74) and Drew Tate (61) on the all-time list.

Stanley has 16 career multi-touchdown games. He has 10 career games with at least three passing touchdowns. Only Long has more in program history (11). He has started the last 29 games at quarterback, and the Hawkeyes have averaged 29.6 points per game in those starts. That average ranks fifth in school history, and 10th nationally among active quarterbacks.

Stanley has attempted 111 passes without throwing an interception, the ninth longest active streak in the country.

Stanley threw 26 touchdown passes in 2018, second most in the Big Ten, one shy of tying Chuck Long (1985) for the most in single season school history, and tied for second most all-time in single season history. Stanley also threw 26 touchdown passes in 2017. Stanley's 52 touchdown passes from 2017-18 are the most ever in school history over a two-year span. Long tossed 49 touchdown passes from 1984 (22) to 1985 (27).

Stanley threw for a career-high 2,852 yards in 2018, the seventh-highest single-season total in school history. He ranks seventh in career passing yards (6,040) and career total offense (5,969).

Stanley is named to six preseason watch lists and listed on the preseason Big Ten third team by Phil Steele.

DB Michael Ojemudia is tied for the Big Ten lead with two interceptions. He intercepted a pass in each of the first two weeks. LB Djimon Colbert recorded the first interception of his career in Week 2.

The Hawkeyes' three interceptions ties for fifth in the Big Ten. Iowa led the Big Ten and tied for second in the country in 2018 with 20 interceptions. Over the last three seasons, no school has more interceptions than Iowa. The Hawkeyes have 44 interceptions since 2017. Boston College is second with 43.

Entering this season, lowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 11 seasons, and 16 of the last 18 seasons.

## **POCKET PRESSURE**

DE A.J. Epenesa leads a defense that ranks fourth in the Big Ten in scoring defense (10.3) and total defense (262.7). Epenesa had one sack and four quarterback hurries in Week 2. He led the Big Ten and ranked ninth in the country with 10.5 sacks in 2018.

lowa's defense allowed just five first downs against Rutgers in Week 2. That ties for the fewest allowed in the Kirk Ferentz era (Syracuse, 2007). Rutgers' 125 yards of total offense ranks as the fifth lowest total in the Ferentz era.

Epenesa is named to four preseason All-America first teams, is listed on six preseason watch lists, and is preseason Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year by CollegeFootballNews.

Epenesa recorded at least one sack in nine of 13 games last season and was named first-team All-Big Ten by league media, and second-team All-Big Ten by league coaches. He ranked second in the conference and 16th nationally in forced fumbles (4), and ranked fourth in the Big Ten in tackles for loss. He totaled 37 tackles, four pass breakups, eight QB pressures, and a blocked punt in 2018. He recovered his own forced fumble and returned it 19 yards for a touchdown at Illinois.

The Hawkeyes ranked third in the Big Ten last season with 35 sacks, the second highest single-season total in the Ferentz era (2002, 40).

WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette has been named to the Paul Hornung Award watch list, an honor bestowed to the most versatile player in college football.

Smith-Marsette leads the team in receptions (11), receiving yards (194) and touchdowns (3). He set a career-high with 113 receiving yards in Week 2.

Smith-Marsette averages 28.9 yards on 31 career kickoff returns. The Big Ten record of average kickoff return yardage (minimum 40 returns) is 28.8, set by Stan Brown of Purdue (1968-70).

In 2018, Smith-Marsette led the Big Ten and ranked No. 2 in the country, averaging 29.5 yards on 24 kickoff returns. He was named Rodgers-Dwight Return Specialist of the Year in the Big Ten Conference. He had 23 receptions for 361 yards and three touchdowns. His 15.7 yards per catch led the Hawkeyes (minimum 20 receptions).

## **ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!**

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 16th season in 2019.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. All passengers must have a ticket. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes. Media credentials are accepted, as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to kickoff. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

## **BACK ON CAMPUS**

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2019. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his eighth year on staff, his third as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 12th year on the lowa staff. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with Hawkeye special teams.

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl games.

LB Dillon Doyle is the son of head strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle.

### SEEING DOUBLE

Senior offensive linemen Landan and Levi Paulsen started Weeks 1, 2, and 3, becoming the first set of twin brothers to start for the Hawkeyes since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980. The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

The Paulsens are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

### **IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 17 of the last 18 seasons. Iowa is 8-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (9) and Wisconsin (8) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 16-15-1 in 32 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- lowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (152-101) replaced Fry and completed his 20th season in 2018. Ferentz also served as lowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, lowa has appeared in the poll 323 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- lowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 69-46 (.596) since 2010.

- The Hawkeyes have had 180 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (70 draft picks/110 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (42 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 17 years, 150-of-175 (86 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 12 years, Iowa has had 44 NFL Draft picks, fourth most in the Big Ten

   Ohio State (63), Wisconsin (45), and Michigan (45). Since 2010, Iowa has had 37 players drafted in the NFL, tied for fourth most in the Big Ten Ohio State (62), Penn State (39), and Wisconsin (37).
- Iowa has had six first round picks in the last nine NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010;
   DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a seven-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2018.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for
  the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured
  reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former lowa center Brian Ferentz, now is
  his seventh year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's
  tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.

QB Nate Stanley threw 3 touchdowns to raise his career total to 55, 1 behind Ricky Stanzi (56) for third all-time in program history. He has 15 career multi-touchdown games.

QB Nate Stanley had 252 yards passing, raising his career total to 5,603 and passing C.J. Beathard for eighth all-time in school history.

LG Landan Paulsen and RG Levi Paulsen became the first set of twin brothers to start for the Hawkeyes since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980. The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

K Keith Duncan scored 8 points (1 FG, 5 PAT). Duncan had not played in game since January 1, 2017 at the Outback Bowl.

WR Oliver Martin made his Hawkeye debut and caught a 9-yard touchdown. Martin had one receiving touchdown for Michigan in 2018.

# MISCELLANEOUS

Iowa is 97-32-2 (.740) in season-opening games, including a 18-3 mark under coach Kirk Ferentz. The Hawkeyes have won six straight season openers and are 18-1 since 2001. Iowa has won nine straight nonconference games over the last two seasons.

Iowa opened the season under the lights at Kinnick Stadium for the first time in program history. Iowa has hosted 19 night games in Kinnick Stadium's history, holding a 13-6 record in those contests.

Miami won the toss and elected to defer. The Hawkeyes have played 254 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 190 times (117-73). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 64 times (36-28).

Ten different Hawkeyes had at least one reception. Including career firsts from TE Sean Beyer, WR Oliver Martin (first as a Hawkeye), and RB Tyler Goodson.

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin tied a career-long with a 25-yard reception to set up Iowa's second touchdown.

PK Keith Duncan connected on a career-long 46-yard field goal in the second quarter.

LB Djimon Colbert recorded his first career interception (6-yard return). The turnover set up a 19-yard field goal before halftime.

DB Michael Ojemudia recorded an interception, his second of the season and fifth of his career.

Iowa retains possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy. Iowa is 14-3 in its last 17 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

Iowa has won five straight in the series, its longest streak since winning 15 in a row from 1983-97. The Hawkeyes have won four straight in Ames. Iowa improved to 45-22 in the series.

Saturday's game is the second event in the 16th annual Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk series. Iowa leads the 2019-20 Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series, 5-0 with wins in soccer and football.

## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Nate Stanley totaled 222 yards of offense, raising his career total to 5,979, seventh most in school history. He passed James Vandenberg (5,853) and Matt Sherman (5,948) in today's game.

K Keith Duncan set a career high with four field goals (25, 40, 42, 39). His 39-yard field goal with 4:51 left in the fourth quarter proved to be the game winner. He is 8-8 on field goal attempts this season, and 4-4 on attempts 40 yards or longer.

P Michael Sleep-Dalton averaged 47.2 yards on five punts. He had punts of 50 and 51 yards.

WR Nico Ragaini led Iowa with a career-high five receptions.

DB D.J. Johnson led Iowa with a career-high nine tackles. He had seven solo stops, one tackle-for-loss, and two pass breakups.

FS Jack Koerner had a career-high eight tackles. LB Djimon Colbert and DB Geno Stone matched their career highs with eight tackles.

## **MISCELLANEOUS**

Iowa held a 2-0 advantage in turnovers, including a fumble recovery in the fourth quarter to clinch the game. Iowa has not had a turnover against Iowa State since 2015.

Iowa has won 10 straight non-conference games since the 2017 season opener.

The game was delayed twice due to weather for a total of 2 hours and 55 minutes. The first delay lasted 49 minutes. The second delay lasted 2 hours and 6 minutes. . It is the second time Iowa has experienced an in-game weather delay (Iowa vs. Tennessee Tech, Sept. 3, 2011,
