# **WOLVERINES**

#### **LEADING OFF**

HAWKEYES

• The Hawkeyes won 2-of-3 games against Nebraska in their season-opening Big Ten series. It was the team's first time winning their initial Big Ten series since 1998.

• Iowa is off to a 14-7 start to the 2014 season -- its best start since 1993 when the Hawkeyes began the year 17-5.

• lowa had a walk-off victory in the opener against the Huskers, scoring two runs in the bottom of the ninth inning to win, 2-1. It was the Hawkeyes' second walk-off victory this season (vs. Maine, 3/1).

• Junior Dan Potempa earned Big Ten Co-Player of the Week honors after hitting .727 with a 1.568 OPS in lowa's series victory over Nebraska last weekend. He is lowa's second honoree this season, joining senior Taylor Zeutenhorst, who was recognized Feb. 24.

• lowa is in the midst of a stretch of playing series against three of the top-four projected teams in the Big Ten preseason poll. The Hawkeyes took 2-of-3 from Nebraska, play at Michigan this weekend before hosting Big Ten favorite Indiana on April 4-6 in Iowa City.

• UI head coach Rick Heller won the 700th game of his 26-plus year coaching career March 15 with a 13-1 victory over Georgetown. He is 39th in the NCAA in winningest active coaches.

• Iowa has a Big Ten best 11 home runs -- three more than second-place Ohio State. Five different Hawkeves have hit at least one long ball.

• Sophomore Calvin Mathews has allowed three or fewer runs in all six starts this season. He is 2-1 with a 1.89 ERA with a Big Ten-leading 32 strikeouts.

• Junior Jake Yacinich has a Big Ten-best 13 steals, matching his total from his first two seasons as a Hawkeye.

Rick Heller was named the 20th head coach in University of Iowa baseball history on July 12, 2013. Heller joined the Hawkeyes after serving as head coach at Indiana State the last four seasons.

Heller, a native of Eldon, Iowa, has been head coach at three institutions -- Indiana State (2009-13), Northern Iowa (1999-2009), and Upper Iowa (1987-99) -- Ieading all three schools to NCAA postseason play. He led Indiana State to its first outright Missouri Valley Conference title in 2012. He led Northern Iowa to the 2001 MVC title and into the NCAA Tournament, the first regional appearance for the Panthers since becoming a Division I program in 1981. In 26-plus seasons as a head coach, Heller holds a career mark of 704-575-4.

Heller led the Sycamores to their first outright Missouri Valley Conference championship in school history and back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1995 during the record-setting 2012 season. Indiana State finished 41-19, including a 14-7 record in conference play to claim the regular season crown and earn an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament. The 41 wins were the most for the program since 1991.

During his tenure at Northern Iowa, Heller's teams won 270 games, including the 2001 Missouri Valley Conference championship and NCAA Regional Berth. While building the Panthers into an annual contender, Heller coached three MVC Most Valuable Players, one MVC Pitcher of the Year and helped put 22 players in professional baseball.

While at UNI, Heller's teams broke a total of 57 team or individual records, including setting team records for hits, runs batted in, doubles and extra base hits during the 2001 season. Heller led the Panthers to four MVC tournaments, winning the championship in 2001. All-American Ryan Brunner claimed the league MVP award and All-American Nic Ungs was named Pitcher of the Year.

The Panthers recorded back-to-back 30-plus win seasons in 2001 and 2002 for the first time in school history and set the school single-season record with 35 wins in 2001. Before taking over the Northern Iowa program prior to the 2000 season, Heller spent 12 years as a head coach at Upper Iowa University, a Division III institution. While at Upper Iowa, Heller recorded a 291-194-3 overall record and was named the Iowa Conference Coach of the Year four times.

#### **SCOUTING MICHIGAN**

• The Wolverines bring a 10-14-1 record into this weekend's three game series after downing Western Michigan, 12-4, in their home opener Wednesday in Ann Arbor. Michigan started the season 2-8-1 with losses at No. 6 North Carolina State and No. 19 UCLA. The Wolverines also lost three one-run games at Houston.

 Michigan began Big Ten play against preseason favorite Indiana, dropping 2-of-3 games. The Wolverines lost 5-3 in game one, 5-1 in game two before winning 3-2 in the finale. The Hoosiers held the Michigan hitters in check, as the Wolverines batted .203 with 13 hits in the series.

• The Wolverines have three every day players hitting above .300, but the team is hitting .242 collectively. Jackson Glines leads the squad with a .330 average with team-bests in doubles (9) and RBIs (17). Travis Maezes is hitting .316 with 18 runs, two long balls and eight steals, while Kyle Jusick has a .300 average.

• Michigan has a 3.52 team ERA with 194 strikeouts to 87 walks. The Wolverines will start redshirt senior RHP Ben Ballantine (2-1, 2.81 ERA) Friday, sophomore LHP Evan Hill (1-3, 4.93 ERA) Saturday and junior LHP Trent Szkutnik (0-3, 3.49 ERA) Sunday. Sophomore Jacob Cronenworth is 1-0 with a 0.96 ERA and a Big Ten-best five saves in six appearances.

#### THE SERIES

• The Wolverines own a 106-47 advantage against lowa in the all-time series. The Hawkeyes haven't

• The Hawkeyes lost 2-of-3 games last season in Ann Arbor, falling 5-4 in the opener, winning 4-3 in 12 innings in game two before falling 4-3 in the finale.

#### **KUEBEL KEYS IN ON WOLVERINES**

In his last two starts against Michigan, Sasha Kuebel is 1-0 with a 1.99 ERA over 18 1/3 innings with 11 strikeouts. In 2012, the southpaw pitched a complete game, allowing two runs (one earned) on six hits with three strikeouts in a 5-0 lowa win. Last season, Kuebel tossed a careerhigh 9 1/3 innings, allowing three runs on eight hits with eight strikeouts.

#### **QUICK HITTERS**

• The Hawkeyes have had at least 10 hits in 12 contests this season. Iowa had a string of five-straight games from Feb. 22-March 2. The Hawkeyes have had 17 hits twice (vs. Ball State, vs. Otterbein).

• Junior Dan Potempa currently leads the Big Ten and began the week ranking 10th nationally in hitting. He is 1-of-2 players with above .400, sitting at. 434 this season. The designated hitter is also leading the Big Ten in slugging (.566) and on-base (.537) percentage, the latter of which ranks 15th in the NCAA.

• Iowa's Calvin Mathews (32) and Tyler Peyton (29) and Michigan's Friday starter Ben Ballantine (28) are 1-2-3 in the Big Ten in strikeouts.

Sophomore Tyler Peyton had an lowa seasonbest 12-game hitting streak from Feb. 15-March 22 before the coming away hitless for the first time as a Hawkeye on March 26 against Bradley.
Junior Jake Yacinich has converted 13-of-15 stolen base attempts this season, which is tops in the Big Ten and 21st nationally.

• Iowa leads the Big Ten and ranks 11th in the NCAA in scoring at 7.3 runs per game. The Hawkeyes lead the conference in six offensive categories and are second in four more.

• The Hawkeyes are hitting .308 as a team with runners in scoring position. Seven lowa players have a .350 average or better and four are above .400 (Taylor Kaufman, .400, Jake Mangler, .464; Tyler Peyton, .429, Dan Potempa, .421).

• lowa has a Big Ten-leading 11 home runs this season. The home run total is the most for the Hawkeyes since the 2010 season when lowa had 28 long balls.

• The Hawkeyes have posted a .976 fielding percentage in each of the last two weekends -- their best fielding performances of the season.







#### **POTEMPA EARNS B1G HONORS**

Junior Dan Potempa was tabbed as the Big Ten Co-Player of the Week after posting multiple hits in each of Iowa's three games against Nebraska. He finished with weekend with a .727 batting average (8-of-11) and a 1.568 OPS. The Tinley Park, III., native had two hits in the opener and three hits in games two and three. He drove in a pair of runs in Iowa's four-run eighth inning to send the Hawkeyes to a Big Ten-opening series win.

#### **TURNING AROUND A PROGRAM**

 Under first-year head coach Rick Heller, the Hawkeyes started the season with a 9-1 record -- the program's best start since 1940. Iowa's current record of 14-7 is the best for the program since 1993 when the team started 17-5. After starting 9-1, lowa received votes in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) rankings on March 3.

 The Hawkeyes won 2-of-3 games in the Big Ten series opener against Nebraska. It was the team's first conference-opening series win since 1998.

 lowa's series win over Nebraska was the first for the Hawkeyes since the Huskers joined the Big Ten and Iowa's third-straight conference series win dating back to last season (Michigan State, Purdue, Nebraska).

## **AMONG THE B1G BEST**

The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten in on-base percentage (.393) and home runs (11) and rank second in batting average (.306), slugging percentage (.419), runs (153), hits (227), RBIs (134), doubles (43) and total bases (311). Iowa and Michigan are pacing the conference with 36 stolen bases.

Individually, Dan Potempa leads the conference in batting average (.434), slugging (.566) and on-base (.537) percentage, while Jake Mangler and Taylor Zeutenhorst are tied for the league-lead with 21 RBIs. Zeutenhorst also is tied for the B1G-best with four home runs.

## FRIDAY NIGHT ACE

 Sophomore Calvin Mathews has gone eight innings in each of his last two starts against Georgetown and Nebraska. He is 1-0 with a 0.56 ERA in the two-game stretch, allowing one run on nine hits to go along with 14 strikeouts.

 Mathews scattered three hits in a 13-1 win over Georgetown and struck out a career-high nine batters. After giving up a leadoff single, he retired 16-straight batters.

 Mathews allowed one run on six hits and had five strikeouts in his first career Big Ten start

against Nebraska. He wasn't involved in the decision.

 The right-hander has a team-best three quality starts this season and has allowed three or fewer runs in all six of his starts. Mathews has pitched into the eighth inning in three of his last four starts.

• Mathews is leading the Big Ten in strikeouts (32), third in innings (38), tied for fourth in opposing batting average (.200) and fifth in ERA (1.89).

## **GIVING HIS TEAM A CHANCE TO WIN**

 Sophomore Tyler Peyton has a pair of quality starts, has allowed three or fewer runs in three starts and pitched into the seventh three times. He has a 3-0 record with a 4.86 ERA in six starts as the team's Sunday starter.

 The right-hander struck out 10 batters against Saint Joseph's on March 16 in 5 2/3 innings, allowing four runs on eight hits. The 10 strikeouts are tied for the Big Ten single game high this season and are the most by a Hawkeye pitcher since Brock Alberts struck out 10 against Xavier on Feb. 29, 2008.

• Peyton is second in the Big Ten in strikeouts (29), tied for seventh in innings (37) and 10th in opposing batting average (.234). His three victories are also tied for the second-most in the Big Ten.

Day is hitting .429 during his six-game hitting streak with nine hits in 21 at-bats. He has three two-hit games during the stretch.

## PEYTON DOES IT BOTH WAYS

Sophomore Tyler Peyton is producing as a two-way player for the Hawkeyes this season. The Grimes, Iowa, native starts the opening two games as lowa's first baseman, where he is hitting .395 with six RBIs and nine runs scored. He hit safely in his first 12 games -- a season-long streak for the team. As Iowa's Sunday starter, the

#### **HELLER REACHES 700**

First-year head coach Rick Heller earned his 700th career victory in Iowa's 13-1 victory over Georgetown on March 15 in Port Charlotte, Fla. Heller is 39th among winningest active head coaches in the NCAA.

#### WALKOFF WINS

The Hawkeyes have posted a pair of walkoff victories in 2014, coming from behind to defeat Maine (March 1) and Nebraska (March 21).

Junior Nick Hibbing has a team-high three saves this season converting three of his four save opportunities. The right-hander has a team-high nine appearances, where he has struck out 13 batters in 11 innings. Hibbing has nine career saves.


