Series Record: Penn State leads 17-11 (Last Meeting, PSU 68-66, Mar. 4, 2005)



lowa has won its last three road games, while Penn State has won two of its last three home contests. The game will be the only regular season match-up between the two teams. Iowa is currently in fourth place in the Big Ten standings, while Penn State is in eighth. The Hawkeyes have not lost consecutive games since falling to Rutgers (Dec. 4) and Iowa State (Dec. 8).

On the Radio • Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call the action for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the game on WHO 1040-AM in Des Moines and WMT 600-AM in Cedar Rapids.

lowa History • lowa has played 898 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, lowa's record is 549-349 (.611). That includes a 272-128 (.680) mark in Big Ten games and a 245-61 (.801) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Gold on the Road • Iowa will wear its gold uniforms in all road games this year after it had its black uniforms shrunk at the Odwalla Classic, Nov. 25-26. After the Hawkeyes played nationally-ranked Oklahoma on Nov. 25, the San Francisco Athletic Department, who hosted the tournament, accidentally overheated lowa's road uniforms while washing the uniforms for the lowa's consolation game vs. Rider.

Fifth Hawkeye Suffers Knee Injury • lowa Head Coach Lisa Bluder announced on Jan. 16 that freshman small forward Nicole VanderPol will be sidelined 3-6 weeks after suffering a partial tear to her medial collateral ligament in her left knee during the second half of Sunday's 80-48 victory at Northwestern.

The injury is the fifth knee setback to an Iowa women's basketball player in the last seven months. Point guard Lindsay Richards (June), small forward Johanna Solverson (July) and center Stacy Schlapkohl (December) all suffered season-ending ACL injuries to their right knee. Additionally, small forward Jenee Graham (September) had surgery to repair meniscus damage to her left knee, and returned by the start of the season.

"Unfortunately Nicole has suffered a partial tear in her ligament," said Bluder. "We are thankful that it is only a partial tear and she'll be back without requiring surgery. Again, we'll have to make some adjustments to our lineup, but we hope to have Nicole back before the end of the season."

VanderPol averaged 2.8 points and 2.1 rebounds in 16 games off the bench for the Hawkeyes. She was shooting 55.6 percent (15-27) from the field and 73.7 percent (14-19) from the foul line before sustaining the knee injury.

Crystal Smith Nets Career Point No. 1,000 • Crystal Smith became the 22nd lowa player to amass 1,000 career points when the senior netted 26 points vs. No. 8 Ohio State on Jan. 12 to eclipse the 1,000-point plateau. Smith currently ranks 19th in Hawkeye career scoring (1,053), 915 of which came the last 52 games (17.6 ppg). She also ranks sixth in career 3-pointers (102) and steals (190). Smith has scored double figures 30-straight games, dating back to last year, which ranks second in the league behind Ohio State's Jessica Davenport (36).

Smith averaged 1.1 points per game in 21 games her freshman year, followed by a 3.9 scoring average in 29 contests her sophomore season and 16.8 ppg her junior year. Smith currently averages 18.9 ppg through 19 games in her senior campaign. Smith's scoring average ranks first in the Big Ten and 23rd nationally. She has led lowa in scoring 12 times this season.

Scouting Penn State • Penn State returns home after playing three-straight road contests and four of its last five away from State College. The Lady Lions are coming off their best performance of the year, routing Northwestern 91-48 in Evanston on Sunday in Rene Portland's 800th career game as a head coach. Penn State out-rebounded the Wildcats by 19 (55-34) and limited Northwestern to only 19.6 percent (11-56) shooting from the field. Sophomore Kam Gissendanner tallied a game-high 21 points, while freshman Brianne O'Rourke collected 15 points, five rebounds and five assists to lead the Lady Lions.

Penn State is 4-4 in home games this season and average 6,041 fans per contest.

Gissendanner ranks first in team scoring (15.6) and second in assists (2.56) and steals (1.06). Junior Amanda Brown ranks second in scoring (14.8) and first in rebounding (7.0), while sophomore Adrienne Squire ranks third in scoring (11.7) and second in rebounding (4.6). Squire also ranks first in Big Ten free throw percentage (.981) for all games, while Brown ranks second in blocks (1.83).

The Lady Lions rank first in Big Ten free throw percentage (.754) for all games, but rank last in steals (6.78), turnover margin (-3.22) and 3-pointers made (3.11).

Penn State is coached by Rene Portland, who's in her 30th year (157-73, .683) as a head coach and her 26th (88-27, .765) with the Lady Lions. Portland is 17-1 against the Hawkeyes.

All-Time Series Record • Thursday will be the 29th meeting between lowa and Penn State, with the Lady Lions leading the series 17-11. Penn State boasts a 9-3 advantage in games played in State College. Penn State (.607) and Purdue (.541) are the only conference teams to have a winning percentage above .500 against the Hawkeyes.

The Lady Lions have won four straight over the Hawkeyes and have won four of the last five contests played at the Bryce Jordan Center. Penn State defeated lowa twice last year (77-71 in lowa City and 68-66 in the guarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament).

Iowa and Penn State Fast Breaks • Iowa scored 96 points in its 15-point win at Penn State in 2002. The 96 points are the most-ever scored by a Lady Lion opponent at the Bryce Jordan Center.

lowa's senior class is 1-5 against Penn State, including an 0-2 mark at the Bryce Jordan Center. Thursday will be Krista VandeVenter, Abby Emmert, Stacy Schlapkohl and Jeneé Graham's first trip to State College.

Senior Morgan Kasperek netted her career-high 11 points last year vs. Penn State in Iowa City. Iowa boasts a 7-2 mark when collecting 10 or more steals this season. The Hawkeyes rank fifth (9.53) in Big Ten steals in overall games. In conference games only, Crystal Smith and teammate Krista VandeVenter rank first in steals (2.75).

lowa is the only Big Ten team to have two players rank in the top five in scoring in league games only. Crystal Smith ranks third (17.1), while Megan Skouby ranks fifth (16.9).

RPI Ratings • lowa ranks 55th, while Penn State ranks 97th in the RPI ratings published Jan. 23 on www.collegerpi.com. The Hawkeyes also rank 37th in strength of schedule, while the Lady Lions rank 44th. All seven lowa losses came to opponents with a current RPI of 74 or better, including three in the top 20.

Conference Top Freshmen to be Showcased Thursday • Two of the leading candidates for Big Ten Freshman of the Year will be showcased Thursday at State College. Iowa center Megan Skouby ranks first in freshmen scoring (13.1) and blocks (1.58), second in field goal percentage (.562) and third in rebounding (4.4). Penn State guard Brianne O'Rourke ranks first in assists (5.33) and steals (1.83) and fourth in scoring (7.3).

IOWA CAPTAINS

Iowa captains for the season are seniors Morgan Kasperek, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith.

On This Date • lowa is 5-3 in games played on Jan. 26, losing its last two.

In the Rankings • lowa ranks 17th nationally in field goal percentage, 12th in assists, 23rd in scoring and 20th in fewest fouls per game through games played Jan. 23. Crystal Smith ranks 28th in scoring, while Megan Skouby ranks 28th in field goal percentage.

Last Meeting • Tanisha Wright scored 17 points to help Penn State rally in the second half and beat lowa 68-66 in a Big Ten tournament quarterfinal.

Jess Strom had 21 points and Ashli Schwab added 10 points and 12 rebounds for the third-seeded Lady Lions.

The Lady Lions looked to be in trouble trailing by eight points with less than nine minutes left, but Wright took over. She scored six points during an 8-0 run to put Penn State ahead 60-59 with 3:10 left.

Following an Iowa free throw to tie the game, Wright hit a jumper and Schwab grabbed an offensive rebound and scored to put Penn State up 64-60.

The Hawkeyes got within 68-66 after Crystal Smith's runner with nine seconds left. They had a chance to win it, but Smith's heave from beyond halfcourt fell short.

Jamie Cavey had 21 points, 10 rebounds and blocked an Iowa Big Ten Tournament record five shots for the Hawkeyes. Johanna Solverson scored 20 and Smith added 16 points, four assists and four steals.

Penn State took control of the game midway through the first half after building a 28-17 advantage. But the Hawkeyes used a 13-0 run to take a 30-28 lead with 2:30 left. The Lady Lions missed eight straight shots and went nearly six minutes without a basket.

lowa quickly built its lead to 42-33 early in the second half after Cavey's jumper. Penn State battled back, getting six-straight points from Strom to cut the deficit to 49-46 with 9:35 left.

Cavey responded with an off-balance jumper and Jenna Armstrong's 3-pointer pushed lowa's lead back to 54-46.

Last Time Out • Down at halftime for the first time in Big Ten play, Minnesota used a second-half scoring surge and another dominant performance from its bench to put away pesky lowa in an 80-68 victory in front of a season-high 7,005 fans Sunday at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The 12th-ranked Gophers used a 22-6 run to start the second half and a 30-15 advantage in bench scoring for their third straight win.

Liz Podominick had 13 points and Jamie Broback and Natasha Williams chipped in 12 points each for the Gophers. Minnesota won by double-digits for the third straight game, despite trailing the Hawkeyes 37-32 at halftime.

Podominick had six points during the run to start the second half, but it was the Gophers' defense that made the difference.

Minnesota forced the Hawkeyes into five missed shots and three turnovers in lowa's first eight possessions of the second half and stifled lowa's Crystal Smith into a 2-14 shooting day. Smith, the Big Ten's leading scorer going into the game, managed a season-low 11 points.

Shannon Bolden, Minnesota's defensive wizard, harassed Smith for most of the day, forcing her to take contested shot after contested shot.

Five players scored in double-digits for Minnesota, including Shannon Schonrock, who scored nine of her 11 points on 3-pointers.

Freshman center Megan Skouby led the Hawkeyes with 20 points. Sophomore forward Krista VandeVenter, who is a Minensota native, recorded her fifth career double-double and her second of the season, collecting 15 points and 12 rebounds.

lowa shot only 11.1 percent (1-9) from 3-point range in the loss.

Number of the Week -- 1 • Penn State sophomore Adrienne Squire and lowa freshman Wendy Ausdemore have both missed only one free throw, respectively, this season. Squire has converted 53-54, while Ausdemore has made 23-24.

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her sixth season as head coach at the University of lowa and her 22nd season as a college head coach. Bluder, 44, has a career record of 464-208 (.691), including a 108-66 (.621) record at lowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is lowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to five post-season



tournaments (3 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and three upper division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became lowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. Last season lowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (8) and Emma (5) and one son, David (3).

Skouby Leads Big Ten Freshmen • Freshman Megan Skouby has raised her game to a new level since taking over the starting center position for injured sophomore Stacy Schlapkohl. Skouby, who is the Big Ten freshmen scoring leader, averages 16.9 points, 5.4 rebounds and 1.5 blocks in conference play. The 6-6 standout ranks 13th in overall scoring (13.1) in the Big Ten, fifth in field goal percentage (.562), fourth in blocks (1.58). She ranks fifth in conference scoring (16.9), fourth in blocks (1.5) and 18th in rebounding (5.4). Skouby has led lowa in scoring six of the last nine contests, including the last three. She has posted 20 points or more four of the last six games, including the last two.

Skouby Quickly Climbed Freshman Chart • Megan Skouby has rejected 30 shots. She blocked a career-high five shots at Michigan on Jan. 5 to surpass Jennie Lillis for second place on lowa's freshman single season blocking list. Tangela Smith holds lowa's freshman mark with 73 blocks.

Smith Ranks First in Big Ten in Scoring • Senior Crystal Smith ranks first in Big Ten scoring (18.9) and 23rd nationally; Michigan State's Liz Shimek (18.9) also ranks first. Smith has led lowa in scoring in 12 of lowa's 19 contests.

Smith's 46 points at Louisiana Tech are the most scored in a game by any player in the nation this season. San Diego's Michelle Augustavo ranks second after netting 42 points vs. Clemson on Dec. 11.

Vandy is Dandy • Sophomore Krista VandeVenter is one of the top all-around threats in the Big Ten. VandeVenter, who has started every game (52) as a Hawkeye, ranks third in Big Ten rebounding (8.6), sixth in steals (2.42), 12th in blocks (0.84) and 29th in scoring (9.3). She has led the Hawkeyes in rebounding 14 times this season. The 6-2 power forward averaged 9.2 points, 8.9 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 3.1 steals in lowa's last ten contests. She has recorded two double-doubles (lowa State and Minnesota) this season and five in her career.

Triple Play • Tiffany Reedy made 19 triples in each of her first three seasons. The senior has drained four 3-pointers in the last three games to raise her total to 21 to establish a new single-season high. She is shooting at a 37.5 percent clip from behind the arc, good enough to rank sixth in the Big Ten

lowa ranks third in Big Ten 3-point field goal percentage (.367) after ranking fourth last year (.343). The Hawkeyes shot a Big Ten-season-best 69.2 percent (9-13) from behind the arc at Northwestern on Jan. 15.

Dishing the Rock • lowa ranks second in Big Ten assists, dishing the ball 17.68 times per game. Four Hawkeyes average 2.42 assists or better: Crystal Smith (3.26), Krista VandeVenter (3.16), Kristi Smith (2.79) and Abby Emmert (2.42).

Possessing the Rock • The Hawkeyes struggled with turnovers in their first six games, collecting 21.0 miscues per game. However, lowa has done a better job maintaining the ball in its last 13 contests, only averaging 15.5 turnovers. The Hawkeyes only turned the ball over 14 times at Michigan and vs. #9 Michigan State, 13 times vs. #8 Ohio State and a season-low 11 times at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes rank second in turnover margin (+2.88) in conference games only. lowa is 8-2 when it has fewer turnovers than its opponent.

lowa ranks third in Big Ten turnover margin (+1.42) and second in assist/turnover ratio (1.02). Last year, the Hawkeyes ranked ninth in turnover margin (-1.55) and fifth in assist/turnover margin (0.87).

DE-FENSE! • lowa's perimeter defense has been stellar through 19 games. The Hawkeyes rank first in Big Ten 3-point field goal defense (.263). Last season lowa ranked 10th in the league in 3-point field goal defense (.361).

Cashing in at the Free Throw Line • Freshman Wendy Ausdemore became the first Hawkeye to start the season making her first 19 free throw attempts. She has made 23-24 (.958) from the charity stripe this season.

Senior Crystal Smith made her first 18 attempts from the foul line in lowa's first three conference contests, including draining all 11 attempts vs. Illinois. Smith's 11-11 performance tied a school and arena record for free throw percentage in a game. She is shooting a blistering 91.7 percent (44-48) from the free throw line in conference games, which ranks first.

Underclassmen Start for Hawkeyes • Iowa's starting lineup at Penn State includes two freshmen (Kristi Smith and Megan Skouby) and one sophomore (Krista VandeVenter).

VandeVenter started all 52 games as a Hawkeye, including all 19 this season. The power forward ranks third in team scoring (9.3) and first in rebounding (8.6). She has pulled down 415 rebounds and is 21 rebounds from equaling Virgie Dillingham (436) for 18th on lowa's career rebounding chart.

Smith started the last 11 games at point guard for lowa. The native of Thornton, CO ranks fifth in team scoring (5.9) and second in assists (2.79).

Skouby will start her ninth contest Thursday. The 6-6 center ranks second in team scoring (13.1), first in blocks (1.67) and field goal percentage (.562), and fourth in rebounding (4.4).

lowa is one of two Big Ten teams with two or more freshmen starters. Michigan starts three, while lowa starts two.

Big Ten Rankings • lowa ranks first in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.263) and scoring offense (73.6), second in field goal percentage (.461), assists (17.68), assist/turnover ratio (+1.02) and third in turnover margin (1.42), 3-point field goal percentage (.367) and scoring margin (+9.6).

Senior Crystal Smith ranks first in league scoring (18.9), fourth in steals (2.47), fifth in 3-point field goals made (1.89), seventh in free throw percentage (.842) and eighth in 3-point field goal percentage (.360). Freshman Megan Skouby ranks fifth in field goal percentage (.562) and fourth in blocks (1.58). Sophomore Krista VandeVenter ranks third in rebounding (8.6), second in defensive rebounds (6.21), sixth in steals (2.42) and 12th in blocks (0.84).

Home, Away Comparisons • In 10 home games, lowa has out-scored its opponents 748-630 (+11.8 margin), shooting 48.2 percent from the field and holding opponents to a 41.5 shooting percentage. lowa also has posted 183 assists to its opponents' 116 and attempted 76 more free throws (218-142). lowa converted 72.9 percent of its free throws at home, while 75.2 percent on the road. The Hawkeyes' free throw percentage is 2.3 percent better on the road than at home.

In nine games away from lowa City, lowa has out-scored its opponents 651-587 (+7.1 margin). Iowa has a better 3-point shooting percentage on the road (40.5%) than at Carver-Hawkeye Arena (32.5%). Also, the Hawkeyes rebound better on the road than at home, averaging 38.9 away from Iowa City and 36.4 at home. Here are the home and away comparisons:

Freshmen Step Up • Iowa's freshmen class (Megan Skouby, Wendy Ausdemore, Kristi Smith, Nicole VanderPol and Lindsey Nyenhuis) are averaging 28.3 ppg through 19 games. The fivesome tallied a freshmen season-best 43 points at Northwestern on Jan. 15.

Skouby ranks second in team scoring (13.1) and fourth in rebounding (4.4), while Smith (5.9) and Ausdemore (5.9) both rank fifth in scoring. Smith also ranks third in assists (2.79).

Five Spot · Crystal Smith, who was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Nov. 28, broke or tied five school records during Thanksgiving week.

The senior broke school records for points (46) and free throws attempted (19) in a game and equaled school records in free throws made (15) and 3-pointers attempted (14) in lowa's 95-91 double overtime setback at Louisiana Tech on Nov. 22. The native of Haughton, LA, also matched the school record for field goal percentage (9-9, 1.000) in the Hawkeyes' 88-41 rout over Rider on Nov. 26.

In the three games, Smith averaged 28.3 points, 4.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.7 steals per game. She finished the week 26-of-55 (.473) from the field, 10-of-25 (.400) from the perimeter and 23-of-28 (.821) at the line.

Reedy Set Go • Senior Tiffany Reedy played in her 100th career game vs. Vermont on Dec. 3. The native of Dysart, IA, has had a solid 2005-06 campaign, averaging 6.9 ppg, 4.5 rpg and ranking third on the team in steals with 18. Reedy collected 14 thefts and averaged 3.9 ppg and 2.4 rpg in 33 contests last season.

Movin' On Up • Senior Crystal Smith (190) is tied with Jennie Lillis (190) for sixth on Iowa's career steals chart. She is 15 thefts from equaling Jolette Law (205) for fifth. Smith (1,053) is also 47 points from catching Shanda Berry (1,100) for 18th in career scoring at Iowa. Sophomore Krista VandeVenter (415) is 21 rebounds from matching Virgie Dillingham (436) for 18th in career rebounds.

All-Tournament Selections • Senior Crystal Smith and sophomore Krista VandeVenter were named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament team. Smith also garnered Odwalla Classic All-Tournament accolades for her efforts Nov. 25-26 in San Francisco, CA.

High Octane • lowa, who ranks first in Big Ten scoring offense (73.6), has scored 80 points or more in seven of its 19 games. The Hawkeyes are 6-1 when scoring 80 points or more.

Making the List • lowa has recorded two victories by 40 points or more this season. The Hawkeyes posted a 40-point triumph (82-42) over UW-Milwaukee on Nov. 20. The 40-point win ranks as the 15th-largest margin of victory in school history. Iowa registered a 47-point victory (88-41) over Rider on Nov. 26. The 47-point win ranks as the ninth-largest margin of victory in Iowa history.

lowa has posted six wins of 40 points or more under Coach Bluder (48 – UT-Pan American, 2001; 47 -- Rider; 45 – Western Illinois, 2000; 43 – Creighton, 2002; 40 – Northwestern, 2001; 40 -- UW-Milwaukee, 2005).

Iowa Ties Arena Mark • Iowa's 55 second-half points scored in its 84-65 triumph over Illinois on Jan. 1, matched the Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for most points in a second half. The Hawkeyes also scored 55 vs. Western Illinois on Nov. 25, 2000.

Smith Nominated for Senior CLASS Award • Seniors Crystal Smith is one of 30 seniors from Division I basketball programs around the nation who have been named as candidates for the Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award. The award, now in its fifth year, is presented annually to the nation's senior player-of-the-year. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. The award was launched during the 2001-02 season in response to the trend of college players leaving college early to turn professional. Smith joins Michigan State's Liz Shimek and Lindsay Bowen as the only three Big Ten student-athletes nominated. Sportscaster Dick Enberg, who initiated the idea for the award and now serves as honorary Chairman, will announce the winner during the CBS telecast of the NCAA Men's Final Four in April.

More on Smith's Records • Crystal Smith's 46 points bested Cindy Haugejorde's 44-point effort vs. Luther College on Jan. 12, 1977. In addition, the 46 points is the second-most scored in a single game in Big Ten history. Illinois' Kendra Gantt and Penn State's Kelly Mazzante both netted 49 points. The 46 points are the most ever scored by a Louisiana Tech opponent, besting the previous record of 43 points scored by USCs Cheryl Miller, and was one point from a Thomas Assembly Center record.

Smith's 19 free throws attempted topped the previous school record held by Nadine Domond and Amy Herrig. Domond attempted 16 foul shots vs. UCSB on Nov. 25, 1995, while Herrig attempted 16 free throws vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 19 free throws attempted ranks eighth in Big Ten annals with five others.

Smith's 15 free throws made equaled Amy Herrig's school record of 15 established vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 15 foul shots made ranks seventh in league history with eight others.

Smith's 14 three-pointers attempted equals the school record previously set by Lindsey Meder twice before. Meder attempted 14 at Colorado on Dec. 2, 2001 and vs. Ohio State on Jan. 3, 2002.

Smith's perfect 9-9 (1.000) shooting performance from the field matched Jamie Cavey's record of 9-9 (1.000) vs. Marquette on March 23, 2003. All of Cavey's field goals were two-point baskets, while four of Smith's five were from behind the arc.

Kristi Smith Maturing Into Starting Role • Hawkeye freshman Kristi Smith has done a fantastic job directing the lowa offense since taking over the starting role. In Big Ten play, Smith averages 5.5 points, 3.25 assists and 0.75 steals.



Freebies! • Iowa has attempted 99 more free throws (383-284) than its opponents through 19 games. The Hawkeyes get to the foul line 5.2 more times than their foes.

Difficult Home Stretch • lowa's last three home contests came against top-15 ranked opponents (No. 8 Ohio State, No. 9 Michigan State and No. 12 Minnesota). The Hawkeyes' next home game will also come against nationally ranked foe: No. 11 Purdue (Feb. 2).

Young Guns • lowa is tied for 15th in the nation with the most underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes are tied with 16 other schools, including Big Ten schools Northwestern and Illinois, with nine underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes have four freshmen and five sophomores on its roster. Air Force (13) leads the nation, followed by New Orleans (12). Michigan is tied for seventh (10), while Penn State (8) and Wisconsin (8) are tied for 31st.

Century Club • lowa Head Women's Basketball Coach Lisa Bluder reached another milestone on Dec. 3, as Bluder collected her 100th victory as lowa Head Coach in lowa's 79-57 triumph over Vermont on Dec. 3. Bluder, who is the second all-time winningest lowa coach, boasts a 108-66 (.621) record in six years mentoring the Hawkeyes.

Home Grown Hawkeyes • lowa's roster features six players from the state of lowa (Wendy Ausdemore, Abby Emmert, Ebone Pope, Tiffany Reedy, Stacy Schlapkohl and Nicole VanderPol). The Hawkeyes also have four players from Illinois (Jenee Graham, Morgan Kasperek, Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson). Iowa's 15-person roster also features players from Colorado (Kristi Smith), Louisiana (Crystal Smith), Michigan (Lindsey Nyenhuis), Minnesota (Krista VandeVenter) and Ohio (Megan Skouby).

Center of Attention • For the fifth time during Coach Bluder's lowa tenure, the Hawkeyes started the season with a different center. Jamie Cavey started for the Hawkeyes the last two years. She became lowa's first center to start consecutive seasons since Amy Herrig (1997-99). Randi Peterson was lowa's starter in 2000-01, followed by Beatrice Bullock (2001-02), Tracy Schrupp (2002-03) and Jamie Cavey (2003-05).

lowa's two centers on its 2005-06 roster are sophomore Stacy Schlapkohl and freshman Megan Skouby.

Attendance Rankings • lowa ranks 23rd nationally in the women's basketball attendance rankings released Jan. 23. Penn State ranks 13th with an average of 6,041.

Hawkeyes Pen Quoie • lowa signed Woodbury, MN, native Zoraa Quoie to a National Letter of Intent last fall. She was an all-conference and honorable mention all-state selection her junior year. Quoie averaged 10.6 ppg and just fewer than four steals per game on a team that won its conference and finished 25-3 last season. Her Woodbury High School team also captured a league title and finished third at the Minnesota state tournament her sophomore year. Quoie was a reserve her sophomore year, but started last season. She was also an all-state sprinter on the track team her freshman year.

Big Ten Tournament Tickets on Sale • All-session tickets for the 2006 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament are \$55. Tickets can be purchased at the Conseco Fieldhouse box office, Ticketmaster outlets, www. ticketmaster.com or by calling Ticketmaster at (317) 239-5151.

The tournament returns to Indianapolis for the 11th time in 12 years and has attracted more than 30,000 fans for each of the last four events. Just two years ago, the Big Ten set a pair of attendance records when the 2004 championship game was played in front of a single-session record of 9,417 fans, which established an overall tournament record of 37,635 spectators. In the past 11 years of Big Ten Tournament play, the conference has welcomed more than 314,000 fans. Five different league representatives have become tournament champions. Purdue leads all teams with five titles followed by two championships for both Iowa and Penn State and a single title for Indiana and Michigan State.

Game Summaries

Game 1 Iowa 82, UW-Milwaukee 42 Nov. 20, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - lowa won its sixth-straight season opening game under Head Coach Lisa Bluder with an 82-42 rout over UW-Milwaukee in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes took a 15-point advantage into halftime and never looked back. lowa shot 61.5 percent (16-26) from the field in the second half and 58.5 percent (31-53) for the game. A majority of lowa's field goal attempts came from close range as the Hawkeyes out-scored the Panthers 42-18 in the paint.

All 12 Hawkeyes that played netted at least two points. Furthermore, 10 Hawkeyes collected at least one assist, while eight lowa players recorded one steal or more. As a team, lowa generated 21 assists and 17 steals. Jenee Graham registered a game-high six assists, while UW-Milwaukee accumulated a team total of seven assists.

A trio of Hawkeye post players paced the Hawkeyes in victory. Stacy Schlapkohl, Krista VandeVenter and Megan Skouby each scored 12 points each. The trio combined to shoot 15-23 (.652) from the field and 6-8 (.750) from the foul line.

lowa finished the game strong, out-scoring UW-Milwaukee 23-6 in the final 12 minutes

lowa limited UW-Milwaukee to 15.6 percent (5-32) shooting from the field in the second half and 29.6 percent (16-54) for the the game. Traci Edwards led the Panthers, recording a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds).

With lowa enjoying a large lead for most of the game, Bluder was able to rotate her entire bench and not allow a single Hawkeye to play more than 21 minutes.

The 40-point triumph is lowa's largest season opening win since a 43-point victory (83-40) vs. Wyoming on Nov. 25, 1998 in the Hawaii Wahine Classic.

RUSTON, LA - - Louisiana Tech overcame a 19-point second half deficit with seven minutes remaining in regulation to outlast lowa 95-91 in a doible overtime thriller at the Thomas Assembly Center.

The Lady Techsters spoiled lowa senior Crystal Smith's homecoming, who was raised in nearby Haughton, LA, but not without a huge outing by Smith. Smith poured in a school-record 46 points, which is the most points by a Louisiana Tech opponent and was one point from an arena record. Smith also established a new school record for free throws attempted (19) and equaled the school record for foul shots made (15). She also set a career high with two blocked shots and matched a career best with eight rebounds.

lowa led 71-52 with 7:18 remaining in regulation, but turnovers and poor free throw shooting enabled the Lady Techsters to sneak back into the game and outscore the Hawkeyes 24-5 the final seven minutes of regulation. Louisiana Tech forced eight lowa turnovers on its press and converted the eight miscues into 12 points. Additionally, lowa was only 1-4 from the foul line, including missing two front ends of one-and-ones, in the final five minutes of regulation.

Smith missed a 10-foot jumper that would have given lowa the win at the end of regulation. Conversely, Louisiana Tech's Eboni Mangum missed a short jumper at the end of the first overtime that would have given the Lady Techsters the victory. Louisiana Tech out-scored the Hawkeyes 8-4 in the sixth period to lift the Lady Techsters to victory.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 10 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Krista Vandeventer added five points, 11 rebounds, five assists, two blocks and two steals in defeat

lowa lost only its third game in it last 21 contests when leading at the half.

The Sooners dominated the Hawkeyes in the post, out-scoring lowa 48-16 in the paint and scoring 27 second chance points for the game.

Senior Crystal Smith paced the Hawkeyes with a team-high 15 points and a game-high five steals. Sophomore Krista VandeVenter tallied seven points and grabbed a team-high 11 rebounds. Freshman Megan Skouby netted all of her 11 points in the second half and also corralled six rebounds in defeat.

Game 4 Iowa 88, Rider 41 Nov. 26, 2005, War Memorial Gym

SAN FRANCISCO, **CA - -** The lowa Hawkeyes led start-to-finish cruising to a lobsided 88-41 triumph over Rider in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic. The 47-point victory ranks as the ninth-largest in school history.

Leading 35-19 at halftime, the Hawkeyes scored the first 21 points of the second half and out-scored Rider 29-2 in the first 10:30 of the second stanza.

Senior Crystal Smith paced lowa, scoring a game-high 24 points and collecting five rebounds and four assists. Smith, who was named to the all-tournament team, equaled a school record for field goal percentage in a game, sinking all nine field goal attempts, including all four 3-pointers. She also drained both free throw attempts.

lowa had five players in double figures for the first time this season. In addition to Smith, freshman Megan Skouby netted 11, while senior Tiffany Reedy, freshman Nicole VanderPol and senior Stacy Schlapkohl all contributed 10 points. The 10 points by VanderPol is a career high. Additionally, senior Morgan Kasperek led all rebounders for the first time in her career with six boards.

The Hawkeyes shot the ball extremely well, converting a season-best 63.2 percent (36-57) from the field and also drained 88.9 percent (8-9) from the charity stripe.

Nine Hawkeyes contributed to lowa's season-high 30 assists. Sophomore Abby Emmert dished out a career-high seven assists, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter collected five.

lowa was on fire in the second half, making its first six field goal attempts, including three-straight triples by Smith. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 68.8 percent (22-32), including 70.0 percent (7-10) from 3-point range, in the second period.

Rider was led by Monica Welborn, who netted 13 points. Iowa's defense limited the Broncs to only 24.5 percent (13-53) from the field for the game.

Game 6 Iowa 79, Vermont Dec. 3, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Crystal Smith scored 26 points to lead lowa to a 79-57 victory over Vermont in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge, setting up a sentimental title game against No. 6 Rutgers.

For the first time since leaving lowa in 1995, Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer will coach against the Hawkeyes, a program she turned into a national powerhouse during her 12-year tenure in lowa City.

After taking the lowa job in 1983, Stringer won a school-best 269 games, guided the Hawkeyes to six Big Ten titles and nine straight NCAA appearances before leaving to take the job at Rutgers.

The Scarlet Knights advanced to the championship game by beating San Jose State 76-64, behind 26 points from all-American guard Cappie Pondexter.

But it was Smith who ensured lowa a spot in the marquee matchup.

Five minutes into the second half, a fast-break layup by Vermont's Alexis Castro made the score 44-40, the closest margin since the game's opening minutes.

Then Smith took charge, scoring 10 points over the next nine minutes in a 20-10 lowa run

A 3-pointer by Wendy Ausdemore put Iowa up 47-40 at the 13:44 mark, and Smith's 3-pointer with 7:56 left stretched the lead to 15 points and put the game out of reach. Smith, last week's Big Ten Player of the Week, also had three assists and six steals

Stacy Schlapkohl added 12 points and seven rebounds for Iowa. The Hawkeyes also shot 46 percent and won praise from coach Lisa Bluder, who stressed all week the need to focus first on Vermont.

Ashleigh Cuncic led the Catamounts (2-4) with 17 points. Sy Janousek added 11 points, but Vermont shot just 32 percent and was outscored in the paint 24-8.

Five times lowa crept within two points in the second half, only to see Rutgers, which never trailed in the game, respond and stretch their lead by controlling the

Led by Mariota Theodoris' 16 rebounds, Rutgers outrebounded Iowa 40-31, including 17-8 on the offensive end, outscored lowa 28-16 on points in the paint and blocked six shots.

Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 17 points. VandeVenter topped her season best with 15 points and had six rebounds. The Hawkeyes shot 38 percent from the floor and 79 percent from the free throw line.

Stringer was cheered loudly as she strolled out of the locker room and along the sidelines, shaking hands with friends and university officials, during warmups and pregame introductions.

AMES, IA - - The Iowa State women's basketball team defeated Iowa 77-61 at Hilton Coliseum. The loss was Iowa's fifth-straight in Ames and increases Iowa State's lead in the Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series to 7-2.

Iowa freshman Megan Skouby made a 10-foot jumper with 7:00 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes a 25-24 advantage. The Cyclones responded in a big way, scoring 13 of the final 15 points to take a 37-27 lead into half. lowa only made only three of its last 18 field goal attempts in the first period.

lowa State opened the second half on an 8-0 run to stretch its lead to 18 (45-27). The Cyclones led 51-33 with 15:32 left before lowa went on a 15-3 run to trim the deficit to six (54-48) with 9:51 remaining, but that was as close as the Hawkeyes would get.

Iowa State played only six players. All five starters scored double figures, including junior guard Lyndsey Medders, who posted game highs in points (20) and assists (14). Three Cyclones pulled down double digit rebounds (Brittany Wilkins, 13; Nicky Wieben, 12; Megan Ronhovde, 11).

Iowa was led by Tiffany Reedy, Crystal Smith and Krista VandeVenter. Reedy scored 11 of her 13 points in the first 12:13 of the first half. The 13 points matched a season high. Smith also tallied 13 points and grabbed four rebounds. VandeVenter netted all 12 of her points in the second period. She also equaled a career high with 14 rebounds, collecting her fourth career double-double.

After failing to make any 3-pointers in its last game for the first time in 217 games, lowa converted 7-23 (.304) from behind the arc.

All 16 Hawkeye bench points came from freshmen. Skouby scored eight points on 4-7 shooting from the field, while Kristi Smith contributed six points and Wendy Ausdemore added two. Ausdemore also corralled a season-high five rebounds.

Hawkeye post players Krista VandeVenter, Stacy Schlapkohl and Megan Skouby combined for 47 points and 17 rebounds. The trio shot at a 77.8 percent clip (21-27) from the floor and 83.3 percent (5-6) from the foul line.

Skouby netted a career-high 19 points (9-11 FG, 1-2 FT). Skouby scored 15 of her 19 points in the second half, as the freshman only played four minutes in the first half after being whistled for two quick fouls.

VandeVenter scored 10 of her 14 points in the first half. The sophomore also corralled seven rebounds, dished out four assists, blocked one shot and matched a career high with four steals.

Schlapkohl contributed 12 of her 14 points in the first half. The native of Durant, IA, also grabbed a career-high eight rebounds and collected two assists.

Receiving her first collegiate start today was freshman Kristi Smith. She directed the Hawkeye offense for 25 minutes, scoring four points, dishing out four assists and pulling down two rebounds. Iowa's other Smith, Crystal, added a game-high 21 points (10-14 FG) and also collected four assists and four steals.

Drake, who lost for the fifth time in six tries, was led by Jill Martin. Martin tallied 17 points and grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds.

lowa started the game on fire, sinking 12 of its first 16 shots from the floor and claiming a 16-point advantage (28-12) by the second media timeout of the first period. lowa went into the locker room with a comfortable 45-29 lead. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 60.6 percent (20-33) from the field in the first stanza.

The 92 points are the most yielded by a Drake team since the Bulldogs surrendered 90 against lowa State on Dec. 5, 2001.

<u>Game Summaries</u>

Game 11 Iowa 74, Creighton 64 Dec. 23, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter added 18 points and a career-high six steals en route to a 74-64 victory over Creighton at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was lowa's third straight over the Blueiays.

After Creighton jumped out to an early 7-1 lead to start the game Skouby drilled five straight jumpers to tie the contest at 13-13. Iowa took its first lead with 8:29 left in the first half after a layup from freshman Wendy Ausdemore, but the Bluejays regained the lead after a Kristi Woodard bucket and did not trail the rest of the half.

lowa trimmed the Creighton lead to two at the start the second half, but Ally Thrall sank a 3-pointer with 17:18 left to stretch the Bluejay lead to seven. The Hawkeyes responded with a 7-0 run to regain a 44-43 lead with 13:29 left.

After Creighton's Angie Janis hit a jumper to put the Bluejays up by three, VandeVenter swiped one of her six steals for a layup to give lowa a 50-49 lead with 9:48 left and the Hawkeyes never relinquished the lead. A 3-pointer by senior Tiffany Reedy gave lowa a 54-49 lead and a 3-point play by freshman Nicole VanderPol with 5:59 left gave the Hawkeyes a comfortable advantage. Four free throws by Ausdemore down the stretch sealed the win for lowa.

Starting center Stacy Schlapkohl suffered a season-ending ACL injury early in the first half. The lowa post players responded very well in Schlapkohl's absence, outscoring Creighton 36-22 in the paint. Skouby scored 12 of her 22 points in the first half, while VandeVenter scored 16 of her 18 points in the second period.

Creighton was able to gain an advantage on the boards and out-rebounded lowa 36-30, including 16 offensive rebounds. Angie Janis led Creighton with 19 points, while Kristi Woodard grabbed nine rebounds.

Crystal Smith had 13 points for lowa, which marked the first time since the season opener vs. UW-Milwaukee she did not lead the team in scoring.

Game 13 Iowa 84, Illinois 65 Jan. 1, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - A big second half lifted lowa to an 84-65 victory over Illinois inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win is Iowa's fifth-straight over the Fighting Illini. A crowd of 3,439 watched Iowa's first-ever New Year's Day game.

Crystal Smith ignited the Hawkeye offense, scoring a game-high 27 points on 7-13 shooting from the field and a perfect 11-11 from the foul line. Smith tallied 19 of her 27 points in the second period. Smith also collected seven rebounds, four steals and two assists.

Smith's perfect 11-11 shooting performance from the charity stripe tied a school record for free throw percentage in a game.

Krista VandeVenter had another big game for the Hawkeyes, scoring all 13 of her points in the second period and also posting game bests in rebounding (7) and assists (6). The six assists matched a career high for Vande-Venter. Nicole VanderPol added four points and four rebounds.

Illinois started the game on fire, draining seven of its 12 field goal attempts in the first six minutes to grab a commanding 17-2 advantage. The Hawkeyes started the contest ice-cold from the floor, missing six of their first seven field goal attempts. Iowa regained its shooting touch later in the half, as a Wendy Ausdemore 3-pointer capped an Iowa 11-0 run to tie the contest at 23 with 3:59 left. Ausdemore netted 11 of her career-high 14 points in the first stanza.

lowa silenced Illinois starter Janelle Hughes for the first 17 minutes, but the senior scored the Fighting Illini's final nine points on four-straight possessions of the half to propel Illinois to a six-point (34-29) halftime advantage.

Crystal Smith sparked a 17-2 scoring run in the second half to help give the Hawkeyes a 55-45 advantage with 11:30 left in the game. Smith scored nine of the 17 points during the scoring run.

Illinois' Erin Wigley and Hughes each scored 20 points to lead Illinois. Audrey Tabon pulled down seven rebounds to lead the Fighting Illini.

Game 14 Iowa 77, Michigan 63 Jan. 5, 2006, Crisler Arena

ANN ARBOR, MI - - Four Hawkeye starters scored in double figures as the lowar Hawkeyes won its sixth-straight game over Michigan 77-63 inside Crisler Arena.

Megan Skouby had a career night as the 6-6 center posted career bests in points (20), rebounds (8) and blocks (5). Krista VandeVenter, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith each contributed 13 points en route to victory. In addition to her 13 points, Smith collected seven rebounds, four steals and a career-high nine assists.

Iowa's frontcourt duo of Megan Skouby (7) and Krista VandeVenter (7) scored 15 of Iowa's 17 points as the Hawkeyes jumped out to a 17-10 advantage in the first eight minutes and would never look back.

The Hawkeyes built their lead to 10 by half (42-32), but Michigan opened the second period on a 10-3 run to trim lowa's advantage to three (45-42) with 16:46 left. Iowa's lead swelled back to nine (53-44) after an 8-2 run with 11:20 remaining. The Wolverines tried to mount one last comeback in the final minutes, but lowar drained three 3-pointers in the final three minutes to secure the victory.

lowa's aggressive play generated 11 more free throw attempts than Michigan. The Hawkeyes made 16-20 (.800) from the foul line, while the Wolverines only made nine trips to the charity stripe - making eight (.889).

lowa only attempted two triples in the first half - missing both, but found its shooting touch in the second stanza, sinking 5-9.

Michigan were led by reserves Ta'Shia Walker and Katie Dierdorf. Walker netted a game-high 24 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Dierdorf added 10 points

Through 14 games, lowa has not allowed an opponent to shoot 50 percent or better from the field or 40 percent or better from 3-point range. Iowa's defense held the Wolverines to 37.9 percent (25-66) from the field and 35.7 percent (5-14) from behind the arc. lowa converted 49.1 percent (28-57) of its field goals, including 45.5 percent (5-11) from 3-point range.

Game Summaries

Game 15 Iowa 75, #9 Michigan State 64 Jan. 9, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) - - Iowa scored 48 second half points en route to a 75-64 triumph over ninth-rated Michigan State inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was the Hawkeyes' first over a top-ten ranked team since defeating ninth-ranked Purdue 90-75 on Jan. 6, 2002 in Iowa City.

Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 27 points, while Crystal Smith added 18 and VandeVenter 17 to lead the Hawkeyes. Skouby and Smith also pulled down eight rebounds each, while VandeVenter grabbed a team-best nine.

Skouby dominated the Spartans' zone defense with turnaround jumpers and hook shots, and finished 12-20 from the field. Her point total was the most by an lowa freshman since Tiffany Gooden scored 36 in the 1994-95 season.

lowa forced 21 turnovers and held Michigan State to 4-16 on 3-point attempts. The Hawkeyes turned the 21 Spartan miscues into 17 points.

Michigan State held a 29-27 halftime lead before Skouby sparked the Hawkeyes with 19 second-half points on 6-6 shooting.

The Hawkeyes had a 10-0 run early in the second half to build a 46-36 lead. The Spartans shaved lowa's advantage to one (61-60) with 3:13, but lowa closed the contest on a 14-3 run.

Liz Shimek led Michigan State with 16 points and 15 rebounds. Lindsay Bowen added 13 points.

Crystal Smith was scoreless through the first 12 minutes before helping Skouby in a second-half scoring barrage. Smith hit a jumper with 7:05 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes their first lead at 20-19. She hit two others during a 10-2 run that padded lowa's lead to 22-19.

lowa's starters combined for 72 of its 75 points. The Hawkeyes outscored the Spartans 15-4 at the foull line. Michigan State attempted an lowa opponent season-low six free throws, just one game after converting 30-34 against nationally-rabked Rutgers.

Game 16 #8 Ohio State 72, Iowa 62 Jan. 12, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) - - Jessica Davenport scored a season-high 34 points, grabbed 16 rebounds and had six assists to lead No. 8 Ohio State past Iowa 72-62 inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena, the Buckeyes' sixth win in seven games.

Debbie Merrill added 15 points for Ohio State, which never trailed as the Buckeyes' post players dominated play. Led by Davenport's seventh double-double of the season, Ohio State outrebounded lowa 39-30 and outscored the Hawkeyes 52-30 in the paint.

Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 26 points and Megan Skouby added 11. Smith became the 22nd player to amass 1,000 career points in an Iowa uniform late in the first half.

lowa trailed by as many as 16 points before staging a rally midway through the second half. The Hawkeyes went on a 21-11 run and got within 55-49 on a 3-pointer by Smith with 11:22 left.

The teams traded baskets for the next five minutes before Davenport converted a 3-point play with 6:00 left to push Ohio State's lead to 66-55.

Iowa - which upset No. 9 Michigan State three days earlier - never got closer than 68-59 after that.

Davenport scored the Buckeyes' last nine points. She broke the game open with 11 straight points during a 15-1 run midway through the first half that gave the Buckeyes a 39-21 lead. Iowa was unable to stop Davenport from establishing position inside, and she took advantage with five baskets from inside 10 feet during a 3:33 span.

lowa recorded a season-low 13 turnovers in defeat, including only three by its guards. Abby Emmert came off the bench and directed the Hawkeye offense for most of the second half. The sophomore finished with seven points and three assists.

Game Summaries

Game 16 Iowa 80, Northwestern 48 Jan. 15, 2006, Welsh-Ryan Arena

EVANSTON, IL - - lowa built a 21-point first-half lead and cruised to an 80-48 triumph over Northwestern at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The win was lowa's largest conference win since recording a 40-point win over Northwestern on Jan. 25, 2001 in Evanston. The victory was also lowa's 10-straight over the Wildcats, all under Head Coach Lisa Bluder.

Megan Skouby and Crystal Smith were lowa's offensive catalysts today. Skouby netted a game-high 18 points (8-16 FG, 2-2 FT), marking the 11th time this year she has scored double figures. The Big Ten's leading freshman scorer, has tallied double digits four-straight contests and five of lowa's six league games. Smith added 13 points in only 18 minutes of action.

Tiffany Reedy had a solid all-around game, converting 3-4 from 3-point range for nine points and collecting seven rebounds, four assists and three steals.

lowa had a better 3-point shooting percentage (.692, 9-13) than Northwestern did free throw percentage (.615, 8-13). Reedy and Lindsey Nyenhuis drained three triples each, Smith nailed two, while Abby Emmert made one.

Leading 16-7, lowa went on a 12-0 run to expand its advantage to 28-7. lowa converted 10 of its first 13 field goal attempts, while Northwestern made only three of its first 19. The Hawkeyes made only two field goals the last nine minutes of the first stanza. lowa led by 16 at the half (36-20).

Northwestern was led by reserve forward Lauren Roberts and Nadia Bibbs. Roberts tallied a team-high 10 points, while Bibbs recorded a career-high eight robounds.

Eleven of Iowa's 12 players scored, including 33 points from the Hawkeye bench. Also, Iowa's freshmen netted a season-high 43 points.

The Hawkeyes outrebounded the Wildcats by 11 (49-38) and collected 24 assists to Northwestern's 14.

Game 19 #12 Minnesota 80, Iowa 68 Jan. 22, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) - - Down at halftime for the first time in Big Ten play, Minnesota used a second-half scoring surge and another dominant performance from its bench to put away pesky lowa in an 80-68 victory in front of a season-high 7,005 fans at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The 12th-ranked Gophers used a 22-6 run to start the second half and a 30-15 advantage in bench scoring for their third straight win.

Liz Podominick had 13 points and Jamie Broback and Natasha Williams chipped in 12 points each for the Gophers. Minnesota won by double-digits for the third straight game, despite trailing the Hawkeyes 37-32 at halftime.

Podominick had six points during the run to start the second half, but it was the Gophers' defense that made the difference.

Minnesota forced the Hawkeyes into five missed shots and three turnovers in lowa's first eight possessions of the second half and stifled lowa's Crystal Smith into a 2-14 shooting day. Smith, the Big Ten's leading scorer going into the game, managed a season-low 11 points.

Shannon Bolden, Minnesota's defensive wizard, harassed Smith for most of the day, forcing her to take contested shot after contested shot.

Five players scored in double-digits for Minnesota, including Shannon Schonrock, who scored nine of her 11 points on 3-pointers.

Freshman center Megan Skouby led the Hawkeyes with 20 points. Sophomore forward Krista VandeVenter, who is a Minensota native, recorded her fifth career double-double and her second of the season, collecting 15 points and 12 rebounds.
