THE SETTING:

The Hawkeyes are in the home stretch of their 18 straight games on the road. Iowa will fly to Texas for a 10-day spring trip featuring nine games. The Hawkeyes will face third-ranked Texas in a four-game series (March 12-14), Texas San-Antonio in a two-game set (March 16-17) and Pan American in a three-game series (March 19-20), all on their home fields.

ON THE NET:

Iowa baseball fans can follow the Hawkeyes, as live stats will be available on hawkeyesports.com. Just click on the Gametracker link found on both the front page and the baseball schedule page. Whistlin' Ray Gilmore enters his 33rd season with the Hawkeye baseball program and will be entering the stats.

ALL-TIME SERIES NOTES:

Iowa trails the all-time series against Texas, 2-0. The last time the two schools faced was in 1930, in a two-game set. The Hawkeyes fell, 9-0 and 14-9.

The Hawkeyes also trail in the all-time series against Texas San Antonio, 1-0. Iowa faced the Roadrunners in 2006 and fell, 3-1.

The three-game series against Texas Pan American will be the first meeting in school history.

SCOUTING NO. 3 TEXAS:

The No. 3 Longhorns are 9-3 on the year and are led by a strong pitching staff and solid defense. Cameron Rupp leads the Texas offense in average (.333), hits (14) and total bases (19).

The Longhorns boast a solid pitching staff with a team ERA of 2.10. Friday night starter, Taylor Jungmann, leads the staff with a 0.83 ERA in 21.2 innings pitched in two starts. He has a 2-0 record with a team-high 26 strikeouts.

SCOUTING UTSA:

UTSA is 7-4 to start the season and will travel to Southeastern Louisiana before hosting the Hawkeyes. The Roadrunners are led, offensively, by Ryan Hutson. Hutson is hitting .300 with a team-high .550 slugging percentage, two homers and 11 RBI.

The UTSA pitching staff is led by Matt Crocker. The starter has a perfect 2-0 record in two starts having pitched a team-high 18.1 innings and amassed a team-best 14 strikeouts.

SCOUTING UTPA:

The Broncos are 6-3 on the year. UTPA hosts Notre Dame in a series finale this week and Stephen F. Austin in a three-game series next week, before hosting the Hawkeyes.

The Broncos are a solid hitting team that boasts a .357 team batting average, 28 extra base hits, 66 walks and a .471 on base percentage. (Vincent Mejia accounts for 17 walks.)

UTPA is led by starters Cody Plunk and Hayden Daugherty. The duo has a 3-0 record in four starts between them. They have pitched 15 innings each and struck out 25 batters.

STACKING UP IN THE BIG TEN:

The Hawkeyes rank in the top three in the following offensive statistical categories: batting average (.320), slugging percentage (.469), runs scored (66), hits (103), triples (5), home runs (7), total bases (151), hit by pitches (13) and they lead the conference in sac bunts (6). Iowa's offense also ranks in the top five in: on base percentage (.400), RBI (59), doubles (17), sac flies (6) and stolen bases (14).

Iowa's pitching ranks in the top five in: opposing batting average (.305), batters struck out looking (20) and saves (3).

LEE 'SAVES' ANOTHER:

Hawkeye closer **Kevin Lee** picked up his third career save in Iowa's win over No. 25 Kansas, he struck out two in the final inning.

With three saves, Lee is tied with Indiana's Chris Squires with the most in the Big Ten.

MULLER IS BACK:

Junior leadoff hitter **Kurtis Muller** is back to his freshman all-American self. After a sophomore season of injuries Muller is leading the Iowa offense.

Against No. 25 Kansas, Muller went 8-for-17 with three runs scored, two stolen bases and three doubles. On the year, Muller is hitting .474 with a team-best 10 runs scored, five doubles, .640 slugging percentage and four stolen bases.

SITUATIONALLY SPEAKING:

Lefty **Dallas Burke** is hitting .500 (5-for-10) against southpaw pitchers.

Iowa's pinch hitters are 3-for-9. Both Burke and **Andrew Host** are a perfect 1-for-1.

With runners in scoring position, **Dan Sheppard** leads the team with a .750 average (3-for-4) and **Kurtis Muller** is 7-for-14 with two outs.

The Hawkeyes deliver with two outs; 22 of its 66 runs scored have come with two out. Six different Hawkeyes have three or more RBI. **Kurt Lee** leads the way with four.

Jarred Hippen finds a way to get batters out, the lefty has a team-best 16 fly outs and 26 groundouts. **Zach Kenyon** is dominate against left-handed opponents, going a mere 2-for-12 against him.

PITCHING STAFF:

The Hawkeye bullpen featured seven pitchers in the four-game series against No. 25 Kansas.

Kevin Gates and **Jeff Pacha** earned their first action of the year. The duo combined for three innings, allowing no runs or hits. **Zach Kenyon** also had a quality outing, pitching four and two-thirds innings, allowing one run on four hits.

The bullpen also featured **Kevin Lee**, **Ricky Sandquist** and **Michael Jacobs**.

WHERE THE HAWKEYES RANK:

The Hawkeyes are making a splash in individual Big Ten rankings. Iowa players that rank in the top five include: **Kurtis Muller** in doubles (second), hits (second), batting average (fourth) and stolen bases (fifth)

Sean Flanagan ranks in hit by pitches (second). Flanagan and **Ryan Durant** in sac flies (second).

Trevor Willis and **Mike McQuillan** lead the conference in sac bunts (first) and **Kurt Lee** ranks in stolen bases (fifth).

Phil Schreiber ranks in opposing batting average (sixth), **Jarred Hippen** in innings pitched (fourth) and **Kevin Lee** leads the league in saves.

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

1. Junior **Kurtis Muller** entered the 2010 season with a 12-game hitting streak intact. With a team-best 18 hits this season, including recording at least one in each of Iowa's eight contests-- Muller is currently on a 20-game streak.

2. Junior **Zach Kenyon** is slated to start his first game of the season Sunday at No. 3 Texas.

3. Sophomore **Chett Zeise** has missed the last five games due to injury, but is expected to return to action this weekend against No. 3 Texas. He is batting .385 on the year.

WILLIS GETS HOT:

Junior **Trevor Willis** is on a seven-game hit streak. The outfielder boasts a .400 batting average and has a team-best two triples after collecting another one in Iowa's win over No. 25 Kansas last Friday.

HAWKEYES ARE STREAKIN':

Junior **Kurtis Muller** entered the 2010 season with a 12-game hitting streak intact. With a hot bat so far this season, Muller has continued on to an active 20-game streak entering this weekend's play at No. 3 Texas.

Trevor Willis is also on a roll. Willis is on a seven-game streak, having recorded a hit in every game this season but the season-opener against Illinois State.

2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:

Three Hawkeyes were drafted in the Major League Baseball's 2009 First-Year Player Draft. Right-handed fireballer **Steve Turnbull**, lefty relief pitcher **Kyle Heim** and closer **Mike Schurz** all signed contracts in June. Three-time all-Big Ten selection **Justin Toole** later signed a free agent contract.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Iowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, Iowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

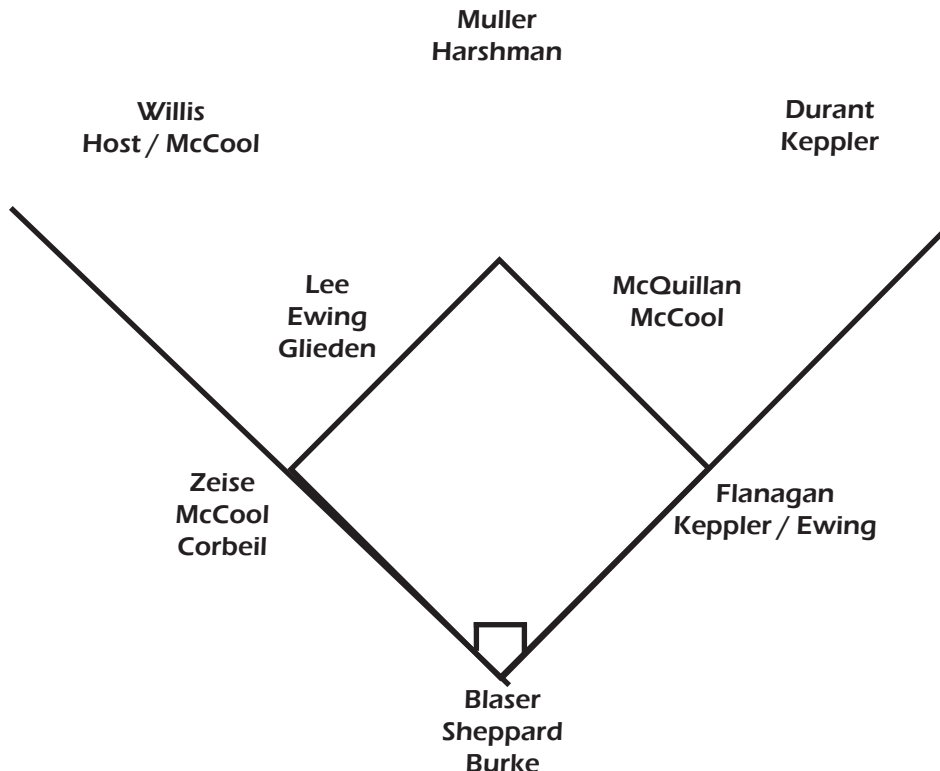

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM:

With a 2-1 record, Iowa had several quality performances in Florida (Feb. 26-28). Sophomore pitcher **Jarred Hippen** and senior outfielder **Ryan Durant**, however, were the two Hawkeyes to earn second team all-tournament honors by collegebaseball360.com.

Hippen got his first win of the year, by-way of an eight and two-third innings performance with eight Ks and only one walk. Durant went 6-for-11 with a double, homer and six RBI.

IN IT FOR THE LONG HAUL:

Sophomore **Jarred Hippen** had a long day in his win against Rutgers. The lefty went eight and two-third innings, which was both a career best. (The last time a Hawkeye went eight and two-third innings was **Nick Brown** against Indiana Apr. 10, 2009).

Besides that, Hippen was one strikeout from his personal best (9, Michigan) and one from tying the Big Ten's game-high.

RBI ALERT:

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** drove in seven RBI to lead Iowa to victory over Illinois State Feb. 22. The RBI total is the most since Dallas Burke drove in six against Minnesota on May 2, 2009. Seven RBI also ties for the conference's game-high this year. (Tying with Coley Crank from Michigan.)

BIG TEN GAME HIGHS:

The Hawkeyes hold three team game highs in the conference. Iowa laced two triples (off the bats of **Trevor Willis** and **Mike McQuillan**) and also collected two sacrifice flies (by **Ryan Durant** and **Sean Flanagan**) in the Hawkeyes loss to West Virginia.

Iowa also hold Big Ten game highs in home runs (4) and total bases (35).

Four home runs in the win over Illinois State ties with Michigan and Northwestern.

Total bases, with 35, against Illinois State.

INFIELD HAS NEW LOOK:

With former starters **Kevin Hoef**, **Justin Toole**, **TJ Cataldo** and **Wes Freie** out of the picture, the Hawkeyes have a lot of new faces in the infield. The only positive to Iowa's plague of injuries a year ago, is that every 2010 starter in the infield has game experience.

Chett Zeise has taken over at third base this spring, and junior transfer, **Kurtis Lee**, is at shortstop. **Mike McQuillan** will continue in the starting second baseman role, while **Sean Flanagan** will play at first.

THE UNITY COUNCIL:

Senior **Michael Jacobs**, red shirt junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Kurtis Muller**, sophomore **Patrick Brennan** and freshman **Dan Sheppard**.

Despite losing several key players from 2009, the Hawkeyes have a lot of experience returning. Returning lettermen in the outfield include: **Ryan Durant**, **Phil Keppler**, **Kurtis Muller**, **Jeff Pacha** and **Trevor Willis**.

The infield returns: **Tyson Blaser**, **Dallas Burke**, **Andrew Ewing**, **Sean Flanagan**, **Zach McCool**, **Mike McQuillan** and **Chett Zeise**.

The pitching staff also returns with depth, including: **Nick Brown**, **Jarred Hippen**, **Michael Jacobs**, **Zach Kenyon**, **Kevin Lee**, **Zach Robertson**, **Patrick Schatz** and **Phil Schreiber**.

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

Every year the UI Athletics Department continues to upgrade Duane Banks Field. This year's primary addition is 500 new chair back seating behind home plate.

Iowa junior **Kurtis Muller** will be writing a weekly blog for pingbaseball.com this season. Hawkeye fans will be able to link to his weekly blog through hawkeyesports.com.

Muller was recognized as a freshman all-American by Ping! in 2008. The native of Sun Prairie, WI, is a three-time Unity Council member and an ISAAC representative.

IOWA NATIVE VOLUNTEERS:

Zach Dillon is in his first season as a volunteer coach at the University of Iowa.

Dillon, a native of Urbandale, IA, attended Baylor University and was subsequently selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 20th Round (595th overall) of the 2006 amateur entry draft as a catcher. His honors include 2005 ABCA second team all-Midwest Region selection, 2005 first team all-Big 12 Conference honoree and a nine time Big 12 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll recipient.

Dillon will work with the catchers, assist with hitters and take over as camp coordinator.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Zach Dillon**.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks than the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

Iowa Head Baseball Coach **Jack Dahm** has announced that **Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski** and **Taylor Zeutenhorst** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and **Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler** and **Aaron Smit** intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.
