QUICK HITTERS

- lowa is second in the Big Ten with eight shutouts in 13 games this season, five by Hannah Clark and three by Kiley Beck. Clark had her streak of four-consecutive shutouts and 379:26 scoreless minutes snapped in a 1-0 loss to Maryland on Sept. 25.
- lowa is outscoring opponents by a margin of 21-10 and is outshooting opposing teams, 190-155, through 13 games this season.
- Senior Cloe Lacasse is tied for sixth in the Big Ten in goals (7), fifth in points (18), and second in shots
- lowa has used 10 different starting lineups in 13 games this season.

SCOUTING WISCONSIN

Wisconsin, ranked 12th in the NSCAA poll and 14th by Soccer America, brings an 11-2-0 overall and a 5-2-0 conference record into Wednesday's game. After reeling off four-straight wins, the Badgers had their streak come to a close when they dropped a 2-0 decision against No. 7 Penn State. It was the second time all season Wisconsin allowed two goals in a contest. The Badgers lead the league with nine shutouts. Senior goalkeeper Genevieve Richard has started all 13 contests, tallying 35 saves and a Big Ten-best seven shutouts. Nine different players have scored goals for Wisconsin, including two of the Big Ten's top scorers in senior Cara Wells (8) and junior Kinley McNicoll (7).

WISCONSIN VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

- The Badgers lead the all-time series, 10-5-2. Wisconsin won last year's meeting in Madison, 2-1.
- lowa has won two of the last three matches in the series with its most recent victory coming in 2012 when the Hawkeyes defeated the Badgers, 2-1, in Iowa City.

HEAD COACH DAVE DIJANNI

Dave Dilanni was named the fifth head coach in University of Iowa soccer history on May 17, 2014. Dilanni spent the past 11 seasons as head coach at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 221-18-18 (.895) record and has guided the Lakers to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in the last eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths and coached 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage is the tops in NCAA Division II and the third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In 2013, Dilanni guided Grand Valley State to its third national title in five seasons and was named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year for a third time. The Lakers scored the second-most goals in program history (88), matched a program-high with 21 shutouts en route to winning the most games in school history. The team finished 24-0-1, claiming both the GLIAC regular season and tournament titles.

The Lakers opened the season with 13-straight shutouts, which matched the second-longest streak in Division II history, and five student-athletes garnered All-America recognition at season's end.

Dilanni led the Lakers to a 22-0-4 record in 2009 en route to his first national championship before winning a second-straight title in 2010. He was honored as the CaptainU Division II Women's Soccer Coach of the Year in 2009, and he coached the Division II National Player of the Year honoree in each season (Irie Dennis, 2009; Jenna Wenglinski, 2010).

Dilanni took over the Laker program in 2003 and swiftly guided Grand Valley State to a then-school best record of 17-2-2 to earn the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. In year three, Dilanni led the Lakers to their first conference and NCAA Great Lakes Regional Championship, finishing 19-3 overall, and his team finished eighth in the national poll.

By year four, Dilanni led Grand Valley State to the school's first NCAA Division II National Championship game, finishing 19-2-1 overall. A year later, the Lakers made a second-straight NCAA Final Four appearance, posting a 17-0-0 mark in the regular season before finishing 21-1-1 overall.

Dilanni joined Grand Valley State after a seven-year run as head coach of the Jackson Lumen Christi High School women's soccer team. He also spent three years as an assistant coach at Hillsdale College, where he helped begin the men's and women's soccer programs.

Dilanni has spent seven years working with the Olympic Development Program in Michigan, training and developing the highest level of soccer in the state. He coached the team to four Region 2 and four ODP national championships.

Dilanni, a USSF B-licensed coach, earned his associate's degree from Seneca College in 1993 and his bachelor's degree from Spring Arbor University in 1997. He and his wife, Kristy, have two daughters, Karissa (11) and Kelsey (7)

LAST GAME

A second half surge from Michigan was too much to handle for the University of Iowa women's soccer team as the Hawkeyes fell, 4-2, to the Wolverines on Oct. 5 at the UM Soccer Stadium. After playing to a 2-2 tie in the opening half, Michigan scored 56 seconds into the second half before going on to claim the two-goal victory.

IN SEARCH OF WIN NO. 10

With its next victory, lowa will post its 10th win for the fourth-consecutive season -- extending the longest stretch in program history. The Hawkeyes won 13 games in 2011, 12 in 2012 and a school-record 15 games last season.

CLOE LACASSE...

- has scored in four contests this season, including three two-goal games, pushing her career total to 10 as a Hawkeye.
- tallied her 100th career point in lowa's 2-0 victory over Illinois on Sept. 11, assisting on Nicole Urban's strike. Lacasse is the second player in lowa history to reach the 100-point mark.
- currently ranks second in lowa history with 38 goals and 100 points. Sarah Lynch is the record holder with 112 points and 46 goals.
- has seven goals and four assists for 18 points in 2014. As a junior, she had six goals and seven assists in 23 games.

IOWA SIXTH IN REGIONAL RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes remain at the No. 6 spot in the NSCAA Great Lakes Region rankings for the second consecutive week. Last week, lowa defeated Michigan State, 1-0, before falling at Michigan, 4-2. Big Ten schools occupy seven spots in the 10-team rankings.

CLARK BREAKS SCHOOL RECORD

Junior Hannah Clark posted her eighth shutout of the year on Oct. 2 in a 1-0 victory at Michigan State. The shutout was the 16th of Clark's career, moving her into the top spot in program history.

Clark posted four-straight shutouts from Sept. 7-20 -- a streak that saw 12 saves over the course of 379:26 scoreless minutes. Clark has recorded a streak of four-straight shutouts in back-to-back seasons.

PICKERT FINDING HER GROOVE

Senior Melanie Pickert has scored in back-toback games for the Hawkeyes, netting goals at Michigan State on Oct. 2 and Michigan on Oct.5. The Canton, Michigan, native is second on the team in goals scored with six. Three of Pickert's six goals came via corner kicks.

FIRST TIMERS

Sophomore Natalie Krygier became the fourth Hawkeye this season to score her first career goal when she found the back of the net in lowa's Oct. 5 game at Michigan. Freshman Aubree Larson and sophomores Amanda Lulek and Corey Burns have also scored their first career goals in 2014.

STELLAR DEFENSE

If you don't shoot, you can't score. lowa's defense has allowed four or fewer shots on goal in 7-of-13 games this season, and the Hawkeyes have allowed fewer than 10 shots in six contests.

HAWKEYES DISTRIBUTING

lowa has tallied 19 assists through 13 games this year. Seven different Hawkeyes have recorded an assist this season with senior Cloe Lacasse and sophomores Bri Toelle and Corey Burns all tied for a team-high with four.

NOT 1, BUT 2 GKS

Senior Kiley Beck and junior Hannah Clark have split time in goal during the 2014 season. Beck is 4-1 with a 0.43 goals against average with 11 saves and three shutouts. Clark is 5-3 with a 0.94 goals against average with 32 saves and five shutouts. Iowa is tied for 19th nationally with a 0.615 shutout percentage.

Prior to the 2014 season, Beck had played in five total games in her first three seasons as a Hawkeye. She posted her first career shutout and win in her first career start -- a 1-0 double overtime victory at Northern Iowa on Aug. 23.

IOWA IN NCAA STATS

lowa ranks in the top-50 in two categories through 13 games. The Hawkeyes rank 19th in shutout percentage (0.615) and 45th in goals against average (0.537).

SEASON HONORS

 Senior Melanie Pickert and sophomore Corey Burns were named to Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week on Sept. 16 after leading lowa

- Pickert was also named CS 360's National Primetime Player of the Week on Sept. 16.
- Junior Hannah Clark was tabbed as the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week by College Sports Madness on Sept. 16. She made a combined seven saves in a pair of shutouts over Illinois and Northwestern. On Sept. 23, Clark was tabbed as the Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week after compiling five saves in Iowa's 1-0 shutout victory at Minnesota.

BROWN: A CONSTANT

Senior Caitlin Brown is the only lowa player to log every minute of game action this season. The defender has played every minute for the past 47 games dating back to the 2012 season -- a streak of 4,439 minutes.

SENIOR EXPERIENCE

Senior Melanie Pickert has started all 77 games of her lowa career, while fellow seniors Caitlin Brown and Cloe Lacasse have started 76-of-77 games as Hawkeyes.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Seniors Kiley Beck, Caitlin Brown, and Melanie Pickert have been voted team captains for the 2014 Iowa soccer team.

IOWA MAKING HISTORY

The week of Sept. 21 was a big one for the Hawkeyes. After starting 3-0 in Big Ten play, marking lowa's best start in league play in program history, The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 13 in the Sept. 23 Soccer America rankings, the highest ranking in program history. lowa also broke into the Top Drawer Soccer Top-25, coming in at No. 25 and received votes in the NSCAA poll.

LACASSE HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

In three-plus years, junior Cloe Lacasse has made her mark on the lowa soccer program.

The Sudbury, Ontario, native is currently second in career goals (38), points (100), shots (282), game-winning goals (12), and assists (24).

Lacasse led lowa in goals scored, points, and shots taken in both the 2011 and 2012 seasons. She capped off her junior year by garnering second-team All-Big Ten selection and second-team NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region honors.

NEW FACE AT THE HELM

First-year head coach Dave Dilanni takes over the Hawkeyes' program after a successful run at Grand Valley State. Dilanni amassed a 221-18-18 record with the Lakers and guided the team to three NCAA Division II national championships and nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference titles.

Assistant coach Erica Demers joins the Hawkeye staff after spending the last nine years with Dilanni at Grand Valley State.

DIJANNI IN GOOD COMPANY

In 11 seasons at Grand Valley State, head coach Dave Dilanni posted a 221-18-18 overall record for a .895 winning percentage. The mark was the third-best all-time in women's soccer history entering the 2014 season.

RETURNING ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS

Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert return for their senior seasons after earning second-team All-Big Ten honors a year ago. Sophomore Amanda Lulek was selected to the Big Ten All-Freshmen team last season.

HAWKEYES ON TV

The Hawkeyes' Sept. 25 home contest against Maryland will be broadcast live on BTN. The network will also be televise the Big Ten Tournament from Nov. 5-9 in West Lafayette, Ind.

lowa will also appear four times -- Illinois (Sept. 11), Northwestern (Sept. 13), Indiana (Oct. 17), and Purdue (Oct. 19) -- on BTN Plus (which can be accessed via www.btn2go.com).

B1G IN THE POLLS

Penn State, Wisconsin, and Rutgers are ranked in the latest NSCAA Top 25 poll of the 2014 season. The Nittany Lions are ranked No. 6, the Badgers follow at No. 12, and the Scarlet Knights come in at No. 20. Michigan and Illinois are also receiving votes.

NEXT UP

The Hawkeyes are off until Oct. 17 when they host Indiana at the UI Soccer Complex at 7 p.m. (CT). The match, which will be streamed live on BTN Plus, will serve as Iowa's Senior Night.
