HAWKEYES

- lowa will host 19th-ranked Indiana in a three-game series March 30-April 1 at Duane Banks Field. The Hawkeyes and Hoosiers open the series with 1:05 p.m. (CT) match-ups Saturday and Sunday, before closing play Monday. Monday's game time is yet to be announced.
- It is the Hawkeyes' fourth crack at a home-opener, as previous games against Nebraska-Omaha, Coe College, and Creighton were cancelled or postponed.
- Duane Banks Field goes 395 feet to dead center, and plays 329 feet down the left and right field lines. Iowa was 11-8 at home in 2012, including taking 2-of-3 games from No. 13 Purdue during the final weekend of the season.

This weekend's three-game series will be broadcast on the radio on AM-800 KXIC and AM-1360 KMJM. Brent Balbinot will handle the play-by-play, while Jeff Duncan will provide color commentary Saturday and Sunday and Zach Kenyon on Monday.

Sophomore Taylor Kaufman has been a key cog for the Hawkeyes this season, playing both ways. Kaufman has made seven pitching appearances, all in relief, posting a 1-0 record in 22 1/3 innings with a 2.42 ERA and 15 strikeouts. At the plate, Kaufman is hitting at a .292 clip with seven RBIs.

In nine years as the University of Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the UI baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence

Since taking over the Hawkeyes in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the lowa program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years. Dahm has guided the team to 30 or more wins two of the last six seasons.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21 in a victory over Western Illinois. Also in 2009, Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23 and notched his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories. In 2012, Dahm earned his 200th victory at Iowa as the Hawkeyes won at Indiana (4-0) on March 31

In Dahm's 19 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, nine freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his nine years at lowa, Dahm has coached 35 All-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Three Hawkeyes garnered all-league honors in 2012. Senior Phil Keppler earned second team All-Big Ten laurels along with freshman starting pitcher Sasha Kuebel. Kuebel and fellow left-handed pitcher Taylor Kaufman were named to the Big Ten's all-freshman squad. Kuebel was also named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after finishing 6-0 with a 2.67 ERA.

The Hawkeyes finished a game out of a four-way tie for sixth place and the final spot in the Big Ten Tournament in 2012. Iowa closed the season strong, taking 2-of-3 from No. 13 Purdue. The Hawkeyes were the only team all season to win a conference series against the Boilermakers. Iowa defeated Purdue in back-to-back games, earning its first win over a ranked foe since downing No. 25 Louisville in 2009.

While 11 freshmen saw action in 2012, Dahm coached two Hawkeye seniors to the top of the record books. Mike McQuillan closed his career first in singles (196) and second in hits (242). Jarred Hippen, a two-time second team All-Big Ten selection under Dahm, owns the lowa record for innings pitched (351.2) and ranks second in strikeouts behind Allen Rath with 244.

In the classroom, Dahm's teams have had success, as well. lowa's baseball team boasted an NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 95, which is 25 points above the national average for NCAA Division I baseball programs. During his lowa tenure, the head coach has seen 75 players named academic All-Big Ten, including a team-record 12 players in 2011. lowa had eight student-athletes recognized in 2010 and seven in 2012. That is the best nine-year total in the history of the program. Additionally, shortstop Kurt Lee was named Academic All-District first team in 2011.

THE SERIES

The Hawkeyes own a 76-62 advantage in their all-time series with Indiana. The Hoosiers won 2-of-3 games last season in Bloomington. Iowa won the middle game of the three-game set, winning 4-0. Matt Dermody started and collected the win, throwing seven scoreless inning and scattering four hits. The two teams last met in Iowa City in 2011, with Indiana taking 2-of-3 games.

SCOUTING INDIANA

Indiana enters the weekend ranked 19th by Baseball America. The Hoosiers own a 19-3 record (3-0 Big Ten) and have won 12-straight games, a streak that is tied for the longest in the country, and is the longest against Division-I competition. The Hoosiers most recent victory came on Wednesday, downing No. 10 Louisville, 6-2, in Bloomington.

Indiana leads the Big Ten in hitting with a .313 average, and boast three of the conference's top eight hitters. Kyle Schwarber leads the team and ranks second in the Big Ten in batting average (.416), hits (37), and RBIs (26). Schwarber paces the conference with five home runs. Dustin DeMuth hits at a .398 clip, placing him third among Big Ten athletes. Scott Donley has drove in a conference-best 27 runs, and ranks eighth in batting average (.369).

The Hoosiers also lead the Big Ten in pitching, registering a 2.00 ERA. Indiana's expected three-man rotation against the Hawkeyes -- LHP Joey DeNato, LHP Kyle Hart, and RHP Aaron Slegers -- are a combined 11-1. DeNato is 3-1 with a 2.51 ERA, Hart is 4-0 with a 1.53 ERA, and Slegers is 4-0 with a 1.37 ERA. The Hoosiers' pitching staff also features Scott Effross, who has posted Big Ten-best marks in ERA (0.38) and opposing batting average (.163) in 10 appearances this season.

Indiana is coached by Tracy Smith, who is in his eighth season at the helm of the Hoosier program.

ON THE HORIZON

lowa returns to action Tuesday, April 2, hosting Western Illinois at Duane Banks Field. The Hawkeyes played the Leathernecks earlier this season, winning 7-3 on March 2 in Little Rock, Ark. Tuesday's game will be broadcast on BTN.com.

CREIGHTON GAME POSTPONED

The lowa-Creighton game scheduled for March 27 was called off due to standing snow and field conditions at Duane Banks Field. The game will be made up April 23 in lowa City beginning at 6:05 p.m. (CT).

B1G WINS LEADER

Senior pitcher Matt Dermody leads the Big Ten and is tied for ninth in the country with five wins. Dermody in 5-0 in six starts this season, picking up wins against Austin Peay (Feb. 16), Western Illinois (March 2), Georgetown (March

9), Nebraska-Omaha (March 17), and Northwestern (March 23). The Norwalk, lowa, native has thrown 42.1 innings, the most among Big Ten pitchers, and ranks ninth in the conference with a 1.91 ERA.

Dermody's five wins set a career-high, besting the four wins he recorded during his sophomore season. lowa has won all six of the games in which Dermody has started, as he has allowed two runs or less in five of the six starts.

Dermody recorded his third career complete game in his last start on March 23 against Northwestern. The 6-foot-5 lefthander allowed one unearned run and struck out five, scattering seven hits.

NO STRANGER TO THE BIG TEN

Senior Matt Dermody has made 18 career Big Ten starts, including Big Ten Tournament play, ranking third among active Big Ten pitchers. Dermody trails Illinois' Kevin Johnson and Penn State's Steven Hill, who have both started 25 career Big Ten games. The Norwalk, Iowa, native made eight Big Ten starts in 2011 and 2012.

THRIVING AGAINST LEFTIES

Five of lowa's regulars thrive against left-handed pitching. Sophomore Kris Goodman leads the team with a .421 (8-of-19) average against southpaws, while Taylor Kaufman (.375, 6-of-16), Keith Brand (.364; 4-of-11), Eric Toole (.357, 5-of-14) and Jake Yacinich (.350, 7-of-20) hit above .350.

GETTING ON BASE

Sophomore Taylor Kaufman has reached base safely in 15 consecutive games, setting a new career best. The streak began during the opening weekend of the 2013 season.

Kaufman is currently riding his second four-game hit streak of the season, going 6-for-15 (.400) over the stretch He posted his first four-game hitting streak from Feb. 17-24. The four game hit streaks are a career-best.

The Glenwood, Iowa, native has drawn a team-high 12 walks, ranking eighth in the Big

KUEBEL UNBLEMISHED IN B1G

Sophomore Sasha Kuebel is unblemished in eight career Big Ten starts. The southpaw went 4-0 with a 2.83 ERA in conference starts as a freshman en route to second team All-Big Ten honors.

Kuebel is 1-4 with a 5.08 ERA this season as lowa's Friday starter. Kuebel was the Sunday starter as a freshman.

LEGGING OUT TRIPLES

Junior Taylor Zeuternhorst has his a team-high two triples this season, tallying three-baggers against West Virginia (March 10) and Nebraska-Omaha (March 18). The two triples are tied for the second-most among Big Ten athletes.





FILLING BIG SHOES

Freshman Nick Roscetti started all three games at shortstop against Northwestern (March 22-23), filling in for an injured Jake Yacinich. Roscetti went 3-for-10 at the plate, registering the first hit of his Hawkeye career in series opener on March 22 after singling in the top of the fifth inning. The Sherman, Ill., native went 2-for-3 in the series finale (March 23), recording the first multi-hit game and extra-base hit of collegiate career.

BRINGING THEM HOME

Sophomore Jake Yacinich paces the Hawkeyes with 13 RBIs and is hitting .462(12-of-26) with runners in scoring position. Seven of his 13 RBIs have come during his current career-long seven game hitting streak. It is the second longest streak for a Hawkeye this season. Yacinich missed the Hawkeyes three-game series with Northwestern due to a concussion.

Yacinich has 23 hits this season, ranking second on the team. He is tied for the team lead with seven multi-hit games, which includes a pair of career-best three-hit contests (W. Illinois, Omaha).

SANDQUIST SHINES

Senior Ricky Sandquist has been one of lowa's best stories in 2013. After making an adjustment to his pitching mechanics, going to a 3/4 arm slot, the Fort Dodge, lowa, native has been spectacular.

Sandquist is 1-0 with a 1.19 ERA -- the third best mark in the Big Ten. He has allowed zero earned runs in all five of his relief appearances. He tallied his first win March 24 after tossing three innings against Texas A&M Corpus Christi. Sandquist has also made two starts, posting a 3.12 ERA over 8 2/3 innings.

GOOD(MAN) HITTING

Sophomore Kris Goodman has been one of the Hawkeyes top offensive threats this season, leading the team in batting average (.360), hits (27), runs scored (13), and total bases (28). His 27 hits and .360 batting average both rank 11th in the Big Ten. He has posted seven multi-hit games, including a career-best three hits on five different occasions. The Apple Valley, Minn., native opened the year with a career-best eight-game hitting streak.

TOOLE THE THIEF

Sophomore Eric Toole is 8-of-9 in stolen base attempts this season. Toole's eight swipes are a team-best and are two off the Big Ten lead, ranking sixth in the conference. The Council Bluffs, lowa, native stole seven bases in 2012, ranking fourth on the team.

DON'T RUN ON SHEPPARD

Senior Dan Sheppard has caught five base runners attempting to steal this season. The mark

is tied for seventh in the conference. Sheppard threw out four base runners in Iowa's seasonopening series at Austin Peay (Feb. 15-17).

HIBBING WITH THE SAVE

Sophomore Nick Hibbing leads the Hawkeyes with two saves. Hibbing earned his first save of against Western Illinois on March 2, throwing two scoreless innings in relief of starter Matt Dermody. Hibbing's second save came March 10 against West Virginia, as he pitched the 12th inning and induced a game-ending double play.

OUCH!

The Hawkeyes have been hit by 39 pitches this season, the most of any Big Ten team. Four Hawkeyes -- senior Keith Brand, junior Taylor Zeutenhorst and sophomores Kris Goodman and Jake Yacinich -- rank in the top-six of the Big Ten in hit-by-pitches. Brand has been hit three times in a game three times (UALR, Maine, UNO), getting plunked a team-high 10 times -- the second most in the conference. Zeutenhorst, Goodman, and Yacinich have all been hit five times, placing them tied for sixth in the Big Ten.

lowa was hit by a pitch seven times March 1 against Arkansas-Little Rock, the most a Big Ten club has been hit in a game this season.

SACRIFICING YOURSELF

lowa has laid down a Big Ten-best 20 sacrifice bunts this season. Sophomore Eric Toole has delivered five of the sacrifices, leading the team and ranking second the conference.

BULLPEN DOING ITS JOB

The lowa bullpen has been stellar this year, allowing 16 earned runs in 69 innings and collecting three of the team's nine wins.

Two Hawkeye relievers -- senior Ricky Sandquist and sophomore Ryan Rumpf -- have not allowed an earned run out of the bullpen, while senior Andrew Hanse and sophomore Taylor Kaufman have been Mr. Reliable.

Hanse has allowed three earned runs in a team-high nine appearances. The right-hander has 13 strikeouts in 15 2/3 innings, and has a 1.72 ERA.

Kaufman has allowed zero runs in 6-of-7 appearances. He threw four innings of four-hit relief in picking up a victory in lowa's win over New Mexico. The lefty has a 2.42 ERA with 15 strikeouts over 22 1/3 innings.

SHUTTING OPPONENTS DOWN

The lowa pitching staff has 2.75 ERA this season, ranking fourth in the Big Ten behind Indiana (2.00), Ohio State (2.35) and Northwestern (2.46). The Hawkeyes 2.75 ERA ranks 26th in the nation. In addition, the staff ranks first in home runs allowed (3) and second in walks allowed (57).

lowa head coach Jack Dahm won his 500th career game as a collegiate coach in the Hawkeyes 7-3 triumph over Western Illinois on March 2.

Dahm, who is in his 20th season as a head coach, currently has 505 career victories, winning 283 games at Creighton from 1994-2003 and 222 games at lowa, beginning in 2004. His 222 wins at lowa rank third in program history, trailing Duane Banks (810 wins) and Otto Vogel (440 wins).

HAWKEYES SWEEP SNOWBIRD CLASSIC

The Hawkeyes posted a 3-0 record, defeating Maine, 9-2, on March 8, Georgetown, 7-2, on March 9, and West Virginia, 6-4, in 12 innings on Sunday. It is the first time lowa has won three games at a three day tournament since sweeping three games at the Austin Peay Tournament in 2006.

Senior Matt Dermody and sophomores Sasha Kuebel and Nick Hibbing collected wins on the mound, while junior Taylor Zeutenhorst led the offense by hitting .556 (4-of-9) with a double, a triple, four runs, and three RBIs.

HAWKEYE DEBUTS
