THE SETTING

The Iowa Hawkeyes (0-1) entertain Louisiana Monroe (0-1) Tuesday. Tip-off is slated for 7:35 p.m. at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Tuesday's contest will be played as part of a doubleheader; the Iowa women are scheduled to play Bradley at 5 p.m.

Tickets can be purchased at the UI Athletic Ticket Office. Tickets are \$10 for adults and FREE for youths (18-and-under) and UI students. Fans who purchased a ticket to the women's game can also stay and watch the men's game.

ON THE AIR

Radio: lowa games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network. Gary Dolphin handles the play-by-play, along with color commentator Bob Hansen. The network includes more than 40 stations that blanket the state of lowa and include portions of Illinois, Nebraska, Minnesota, Missouri and Wisconsin. The Hawkeye Radio Network coverage includes a 60-minute pregame show.

Television: Mediacom Connections will televise Tuesday's game in the state of Iowa. Rob Brooks and Mac McCausland will call the action. Hawkeye fans can also view the game live online at **video.bigtennetwork.com**.

IOWA HISTORY

lowa has played 2,564 games since beginning basketball in 1902. Iowa's overall record is 1,476-1,088 (.576). That includes a 934-340 (.733) record in home games, a 542-697 (.437) record in contests away from Iowa City, a 699-704 (.498) mark in Big Ten games and a 340-104 (.766) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa is one win from notching Big Ten victory No. 700.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

Fran McCaffery made his debut on the Hawkeye sideline Sunday. McCaffery has assembled one of the most experienced coaching staffs in the country. Assistant coaches Kirk Speraw, Sherman Dillard and Andrew Francis have over six decades of combined coaching experience. Furthermore, the entire coaching staff combines for 46 years of head coaching experience.

Director of Basketball Operations Jerry Strom is in his 30th season as a member of the lowa basketball staff. Also, former Hawkeye standout and professional basketball player Ryan Bowen has joined the staff as video coordinator and administrative assistant. Bowen was on four NBA rosters (Denver, Houston, New Orleans and Oklahoma City).

In addition, juniors Bryce Cartwright (6-1, 180) and Jordan Stoermer (6-2,185) are in their first year at lowa. Cartwright played as a rookie at Fresno State and Paris JC (Texas) his sophomore campaign. Stoermer played his first two seasons at Kirkwood CC (Iowa).

SEASON TICKETS ON SALE

lowa fans can purchase a season ticket for \$266 that includes 17 home games. UI Faculty and staff can purchase tickets for \$228, while the price is only \$75 for UI students. In addition, a \$6 postage and handling fee will be added to each order.

HAWKEYES DROP SEASON OPENER

South Dakota State forced 18 Hawkeye turnovers Sunday and scored the last 10 points of the first half to propel itself to a 79-69 victory over lowa in front of 11,700 fans in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The 11,700 fans were 3,214 more than last year's season opener (8,486).

Trailing by nine (38-29) at the half, lowa fought back and had a couple small leads midway through the second half, but the Jackrabbits ultimately pulled away down the stretch.

lowa played a better second half, shooting the ball with improved accuracy and committing only four turnovers the final 20 minutes.

Three Hawkeyes posted double figures in defeat: Eric May (20), Jarryd Cole (17) and Zach McCabe (11). Melsahn Basabe grabbed a game-high nine rebounds (eight defensive), while Cully Payne dished out a team-high six assists.

STAT SHEET STUFFER

Eric May had an outstanding start to his sophomore campaign. May scored a career-high 20 points, corralled four rebounds, collected two steals and had a block. Last season, May tallied a then-personal-best 18 points twice against Ohio State.

OFF AND RUNNING...

lowa starts the season with a busy nine days. The Hawkeyes start the 2010-11 season playing five games in nine days. After playing its first two games at home, the Hawkeyes will depart early Wednesday morning for the island of St. Thomas of the U.S. Virgin Islands. The eight-team, three-game tournament begins Friday and concludes next Monday. Iowa will face Xavier in the first round Friday at 7:30 p.m. (CT).

HAWKEYES CRUISE IN EXHIBITION

Six Hawkeyes scored in double figures en route to a 111-66 exhibition victory over Illinois-Springfield (UIS) on Nov. 7.

lowa benefited from its height advantage, outscoring the Prairie Stars 60-10 in the paint. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 61% (43-70) from the floor. Iowa was able to build a 30-point halftime advantage (57-27).

Sophomore Eric May led all scorers with 21 points and also collected five steals. Freshman Melsahn Basabe netted 19 points and grabbed eight boards. Other Hawkeyes in double figures included Bryce Cartwright (12), Jordan Stoermer (11), Roy Devyn Marble (11) and Zach McCabe (10).

Head Coach Fran McCaffery

Fran McCaffery is in his first season as the head basketball coach at the University of lowa and his 15th year overall as a college head coach. McCaffery spent five seasons (2005-10) as the head coach at Siena, six years at UNC-Greensboro (1999-2005) and three seasons at Lehigh (1985-88) before joining the Hawkeyes.



McCaffery has nearly three decades of Division I coaching experience. He is in his

29th season as a collegiate coach, 15 years as a head coach and 14 as an assistant.

McCaffery, 50, holds a career mark of 251-178 (.585) and guided his teams to six postseason appearances (five NCAA, one NIT). He is 0-1 (.000) at lowa.

McCaffery's five years at Siena were the best in its 70-year history. He led the Saints on an incredible run that ended with three straight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championships and NCAA Tournament appearances. In so doing, Siena became the only program in the country to win its regular season and postseason title the last three years.

McCaffery's Saints owned a 112-51 (.687) record in his five years with the program. He guided the Saints to four consecutive 20-win seasons, something that has never been accomplished before at the Siena.

The 2009 MAAC Coach of the Year and 2010 District I Coach of the Year is the third winningest coach, by percentage, in league history (68-22, .756). He is the only coach to guide a MAAC program to two NCAA Tournament wins. McCaffery led his 2008 and 2009 teams to first round NCAA Tournament victories over Vanderbilt and Ohio State, respectively.

In his final two seasons at Siena, he coached the Saints to back-to-back 27-win campaigns and boasted a combined 39-3 (.929) record against MAAC opponents, which included MAAC Tournament contests.

McCaffery began his coaching career as an assistant at Penn (1982-83) and Lehigh (1983-85). Then at age 26, he became the nation's youngest Division I head coach when hired by Lehigh in 1985. After three seasons as head coach at Lehigh, he spent 11 seasons as an assistant at Notre Dame (1988-99).

McCaffery played basketball at Wake Forest his freshman year (1977-78) and then concluded his collegiate playing career at Penn his final three seasons (1979-82).

He earned his B.S. degree in Economics from The Wharton School (Penn) in 1982. McCaffery also earned a Master of Education from Lehigh in 1985.

McCaffery has never faced Louisiana Monroe as a head coach.

ON POINT

lowa's point guard duo of Cully Payne and Bryce Cartwright shined in the Hawkeyes' exhibition. The tandem combined for 16 points, 15 assists and only two turnovers. Payne dished out a game-high 10 assists, with no turnovers, while Cartwright netted 12 points on 6-8 shooting from the field.

ALL-TIME SERIES

lowa leads the all-time series, 3-1 against Louisiana Monroe. The Hawkeyes won the first three meetings (1975, 1982 and 1993) before the Warhawks snapped the three-game losing skid with a 72-67 overtime win in lowa City on Nov. 30, 2007. lowa's victories in 1982 and 1993 came in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Louisiana Monroe is a member of the Sun Belt Conference. The Hawkeyes boast a 15-2 (.882) record against current members of the Sun Belt.

SCOUTING LOUISIANA MONROE

Louisiana Monroe (ULM) returns just one starter and two lettermen from last year's team. Of the three returning players, one (Fabio Ribeiro) played in just six games before taking a medical redshirt. Only lowa State has fewer returning players on its troster (two). The Warhawks have eight newcomers on the 2010-11 roster.

ULM lost its season opener at Texas Tech Friday night, 86-67. The Red Raiders collected 11 steals and forced 16 Warhawk turnovers. ULM shot the ball well from the free-throw line (13-16, .813) and 3-point territory (8-17, .471) in defeat. Fred Brown of ULM led all scorers with 25 points, bolstered by a blistering 7-10 shooting from beyond the arc. Lawrence Gilbert added 18 points, while Ribeiro snagged a gamehigh 10 rebounds for the Warhawks.

ULM is under the direction of first-year head coach Keith Richard, who is a Monroe alum. Richard was a point guard from 1979-82, leading the school to its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1982. Prior to becoming the head coach at Monroe, he served as the head coach at Louisiana Tech for nine seasons (1998-2007).

IOWA. ULM TIP-INS

- lowa has only played one previous game on Nov. 16, beating North Texas (112-64) in 1997.
- ULM Head Coach Keith Richard has coached in Carver-Hawkeye Arena before. Richard brought his Louisiana Tech team to Iowa City in 2001. The Hawkeyes defeated Louisiana Tech, 75-67 on Nov. 17, 2001.
- ULM's 13-player roster features two seniors, five juniors, one sophomore and five freshmen. Additionally, eight of the 13 transferred to ULM from another college. Their roster includes players from seven different states, Brazil, Cameroon and Nigeria.
- The lowa football team will host ULM in Kinnick Stadium next season on Sept. 24.

GATENS SIDELINED AFTER SUFFERING HAND INJURY

Junior Matt Gatens tore a tendon in his left, non-shooting hand, Oct. 26 during practice. The shooting guard had surgery Oct. 28. Gatens had a hard cast removed on Nov. 10. He did not play in lowa's season opener vs. South Dakota State and is doubtful Tuesday. His playing status for the Paradise Jam is undetermined at this point.

Gatens, who has started every game in his Hawkeye career, was lowa's leading scorer a year ago, averaging 12.3 points. The lowa City native was also lowa's top scoring threat from the free throw line (84-101, .832) and beyond the arc (58-177, .328) last season. Gatens earned all-Big Ten recognition as a freshman and sophomore. He was a member of the all-Big Ten Freshman team in 2009 and an honorable mention all-conference selection a year ago.

Senior center Jarryd Cole, junior guard Matt Gatens and sophomore Cully Payne are lowa's captains for the 2010-11 season.

Cole, a three-time captain, was lowa's leading field goal shooter a year ago, shooting at a 57% clip. He ranked second in team rebounding (5.2) and blocks (14) and averaged 8.1 points. The native of Kansas City, Mo., was also lowa's men's basketball Big Ten Sportsmanship Award Nominee. Gatens, who was an honorable mention all-conference honoree last season, led the Hawkeyes in three statistical categories: scoring (12.3), free throws (84-101, .832) and 3-pointers (58-177, .328). Payne directed the Hawkeye offense as a rookie, ranking among league leaders in assists. He was the only starting rookie floor general in the league in 2010. Payne averaged 8.7 points, 3.8 assists, three rebounds and ranked second on the team in triples with 42.

THE RETURNING CAST

lowa returns four starters and six lettermen from a year ago. The returning starters include senior center Jarryd Cole (6-7, 250), junior guard Matt Gatens (6-5, 215), sophomore guard Cully Payne (6-1, 190) and sophomore forward Eric May (6-5, 220). Gatens was lowa's leading scorer, averaging 12.3 points, while also pulling down 4.3 rebounds starting all 32 games. Cole also started every game and averaged 8.1 points ranked second in rebounding (5.2). Payne, who was the only starting freshman point guard in the Big Ten last season, dished out a team-best 122 assists to go along with an 8.7 scoring average. May started the last 23 contests last year, and averaged nine points, 4.6 rebounds and collected team bests in blocks (26) and steals (34).

The other returning lettermen are junior forward Andrew Brommer (6-9, 235) and redshirt junior Devon Archie (6-9, 225). Archie received a medical redshirt last season due to injury.

lowa's returning players, last season, played 65.6% of all minutes, accounting for 64.6% of lowa's points and grabbing 40% of lowa's rebounds. The group also had 75.3% of the steals and 75.1% of the assists last season. They combined to shoot 41.1% from the field, 30.8% from 3-point range and 70.9% from the free-throw line.

DIFFICULT SCHEDULE

The Hawkeyes will potentially play 20 games against teams that competed in the postseason a year ago, including 14 possible contests vs. teams that played in the NCAA Tournament.

In the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, lowa will travel to Wake Forest. Both teams will have a new head coach on the sidelines. New Hawkeye Head Coach Fran McCaffery played for Wake Forest one season (1977-78), helping the Demon Deacons post a 19-10 record while starting 11 games.

lowa will play two of its three in-state games at home. The Hawkeyes will host Northern lowa (Dec. 7) and lowa State (Dec. 10), while visiting Drake (Dec. 18).

SUPER SOPHS RETURN

Two of the Big Ten's most exciting and talented freshmen from a year ago return to the Hawkeyes. Eric May and Cully Payne were named to the Big Ten all-freshman team by *Sporting News*. May was also recognized on the conference's all-freshman squad.

Last year, May became lowa's first freshman to lead the team in blocks since Ryan Bowen in 1995. Furthermore, standing 6-foot-5, May became the shortest player to lead the team in rejections since 6-foot-5 James Winters did it in 1994. The native of Dubuque, lowa, also averaged nine points and 4.6 rebounds.

Payne was the only Big Ten freshman starter at point guard last season. Payne became only the fourth Hawkeye freshman to lead the team in assists since 1974-75. His 122 assists rank third-best for an lowa rookie in a single-season. The Schaumburg, III., native also averaged 8.7 points and three rebounds.



Hawkeyes Pen Two Talented Recruits

Josh Oglesby and Aaron White have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa.

Oglesby is a 6-5, 187-pound shooting guard from Cedar Rapids, Iowa. He will be a three-year starter and a senior captain for Washington High School this winter. As a junior, he averaged 16.3 points, five rebounds and two assists, and was tabbed second team all-state, all sub-state, and first team allconference and all-metro. Oglesby, who was named his team's Offensive Player of the Year, ranked sixth in conference scoring, and first in 3-point percentage (third in the state). He averaged 12 points, three rebounds and two assists his sophomore campaign. He was an honorable mention all-conference honoree and was named the team's Clutch Performer of the Year and Co-Offensive Player of the Year in 2009. He ranked seventh in the state in free throw percentage and 15th in 3-point percentage. Oglesby was also a member of the Iowa Barnstormers, where he was recognized on five all-tournament teams. He helped the Barnstormers to five tournament titles.

Oglesby enters his senior season with a rivals.com rating of 118 in the country and is considered the 36th-best shooting guard in the nation.

"We are ecstatic to have Josh Oglesby become part of the Hawkeye family," said Iowa Head Coach Fran McCaffery. "I had an opportunity to watch him over the summer and the fall, and he consistently showed an incredible amount of versatility. He's an outstanding shooter, but more importantly he's a really good basketball player. Josh wanted to be a Hawkeye and there's no question in my mind that he's going to have a tremendous career. He's going to be somebody people remember around here for a long time."

White is a 6-8, 215-pound forward from Strongsville High School in Strongsville, Ohio. White is a four-year lettermen and honor roll student. He enters his senior season as a preseason second team all-Ohio selection by Rise Magazine. He helped his high school to back-to-back runner-up finishes and reach the district levels his sophomore and junior seasons. White averaged 16 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and three blocks as a sophomore while being recognized on the second team all-conference and all-district squads. He improved his numbers his junior campaign, averaging 19.9 points, 15 rebounds, seven assists and five blocks while earning first team all-league and all-district accolades, and being named team MVP. Additionally, White was tabbed MVP of a national holiday tournament in Orlando last December. White also played AAU basketball the last two years with the Ohio Basketball Club.

"Aaron White is a versatile front court player who's tremendously skilled," said McCaffery. "He can really shoot and pass the ball, and put it on the floor. He's long and also very athletic. Aaron can finish in traffic, has tremendous court demeanor, doesn't rattle, he's very concentrated and really thinks the game. He's a guy who is really fun to play with because he understands how to win. Aaron is a tremendous team player who can lead his team in scoring or assists."

BROMMER IMPROVES FREE THROW SHOOTING

Junior Andrew Brommer has made remarkable improvement in his free throw shooting. After converting only 23 percent of his foul shots as a freshman, Brommer made 75 percent last season, missing only six attempts.

THREE STATE CHAMPS

lowa's roster of 15 players includes three who won four state titles. Matt Gatens won a state title for lowa City HS in 2008. Eric May won a state title for Dubuque Wahlert in 2008, while Zach McCabe's Bishop Heelan captured the state title in 2009 and 2010.

NO 3-POINTERS

Since the 3-point shot became part of the college game, lowa has played 14 games in which it has failed to make a 3-point attempt. Iowa had made at least one 3-point basket in 53-straight games before missing all five attempts in a 71-61 home win over Purdue in 2004. Iowa's current streak includes at least one 3-point basket in 213 straight games.

IOWA IN CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA

lowa has compiled a 340-104 (.766) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena since the facility opened in January, 1983. lowa is 159-83 (.657) in Big Ten games and 181-21 (.896) in non-Big Ten contests.

HAWKEYES ARE TOUGH AT HOME

lowa has won 64 of its 87 games (.736) in Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,500) over the last five seasons, including win streaks of 21 straight overall and 12 straight Big Ten Conference wins. Iowa has won 10 of its last 19 home games against ranked opponents. Iowa was a perfect 17-0 at home in 2006, 14-2 in 2007, 10-8 in 2008, 13-4 in 2009 and 9-9 a year ago.

<u>IOWA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT</u>

lowa made its 22nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2006. Iowa earned the Big Ten Conference's automatic bid by virtue of claiming the league's tournament title.

The Hawkeyes hold an overall record of 27-24 in the tournament, advancing to the Final Four in 1955 (fourth), 1956 (second) and 1980 (fourth). lowa reached the regional championship in 1987 and lost in the regional semi-final in 1988 and 1999.



Carver-Hawkeye Arena Renovation & Practice Facility Project - Completion Expected August 2011



A \$47 million addition and renovation project, which is ecpedt to be completed by August 2011, will enhance what is arguably one of the top college basketball facilities in the nation. The entire funding is self-generated with no state tax dollars.

The Carver-Hawkeye Arena - Addition and Renovation Project will include the construction of a practice facility immediately north of the Arena for use by the UI's men and women's basketball and volleyball programs; renovation of the practice, fitness and weight-training facilities utilized by the UI's wrestling program; state-of-the-art, 12,000-square foot fitness and weight-training space in the Arena utilized by the majority of lowa's 24 sports teams; the renovation and expansion of locker rooms in the facility; and the renovation of existing and the creation of new office, meeting, and storage space for use by administrative and coaching staff of the UI Athletics Department.

The men's and women's basketball teams will see the most obvious benefit from the renovation, although there will also be a new, expanded wrestling space and locker room.

The revitalization of the Arena will also extend into spaces used by the general public on game days and nights including renovation of select concessions and restroom facilities. There will also be a creation of hospitality and meeting spaces combined with club facilities for fans of the Hawkeyes who choose to participate in a variety of premium seating options similar to those which are available in the Paul W. Brechler Press Box at historic Kinnick Stadium.

Finally, the project will also upgrade the fire alarm, elevator and mechanical systems of the 25-year-old facility.

Knutson Construction Services, which has completed several other projects at the UI, received the Carver-Hawkeye Arena bid.

Carver-Hawkeye Arena was built in 1983 at a price tag of \$18.4 million.
