SCOUTING UW-MILWAUKEE:

The Panthers have a record of 12-24 this season, after splitting with Youngstown State University last weekend.

UW-Milwaukee played 30 straight games on the road and have a 7-22 record when away from home.

The Panthers are led, offensively, by Nick Wichser who is hitting an even .393 on the year with a .607 slugging percentage. The team as a whole swing the bat with authority, the team has a whopping 87 doubles and 18 home runs.

The Panther pitching staff is led by Brad Lusti who has a 4.34 ERA with seven starts and a 2-3 record. He has allowed 14 walks and 26 strikeouts.

Iowa trails the all-time series between the two schools, 6-4.

SCOUTING NORTHERN IOWA:

The Panthers topped Creighton last weekend, and have won four MVC series this year. They have accumulated a 23-11 record.

To lead UNI, offensively, is Brandon Douglas and Dane Embury,. Douglas is hitting .397 on the year with 18 doubles and 40 RBI. Embury leads the team in walks with 25 RBI.

The Panther pitching has a team ERA of 4.55. Tim Flattery is a reliever to watch for with 29 strikeouts in 30 innings.

A MILESTONE APPROACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is one win from getting his 400th career victory. Dahm had 283 wins at Creighton and is currently at 116 W's at Iowa.

Dahm started in 1994 with his alma mater, Creighton University, and moved on to coach the Hawkeyes in 2003.

IOWA OFFENSE IS STREAKING:

Caleb Curry's hitting streak ended last weekend against Northwestern, it was a team-high streak of 15-games. **Justin Toole** has been swinging the bat well, having gone the last nine games with a hit.

Curry leads the team in multi-RBI games with 12, followed by Toole and **Kurtis Muller** who have nine. **Kevin Hoef** has an 18 multi-hit games to lead Iowa and Curry has 16 multi-hit games this season.

GETTING OFF TO A GOOD START:

Last weekend the Hawkeyes got off to a great start in every ballgame, having scored in each game in the first inning.

DIAMOND THIEVES:

This season the Hawkeyes have out-run their opponents, going 80-for-104. Leading Iowa in steals is **Caleb Curry** (25), followed by **Justin Toole** (14) and **Kyle Riffel** with 11.

Iowa ranks first in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in thefts per game.

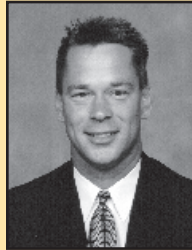

HAWKEYE SIGN EIGHT FOR 2009:

The Iowa Baseball program has signed eight recruits for next year. **Nick Brown**, **Sean Flanagan**, **Cory Glieden**, **Jarred Hippen**, **Mike McQuillan**, **Zach Robertson**, **Phil Schreiber** and **Chett Zeise** all signed national letters of intent to attend the University of Iowa.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



Jack Dahm is in his fifth season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball team. He has compiled an 399-417-2 overall record and is 116-141 at Iowa. Dahm coached in his 800th career game on March 30th this year at Michigan.

Last season, Iowa took another step forward by recording its best record in 14 years with a 31-23 mark. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13. Iowa earned its second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

In Dahm's 14 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his four years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 19 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers.

Before coming to Iowa City, Dahm spent 18 years as a member of the Creighton Bluejays baseball program. He left the Bluejays as the winningest coach in school history, having compiled 283 wins against 276 losses in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Twenty-seven of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues. In the past three years, nine Hawkeyes have inked contracts with professional teams, including three last spring.

In the classroom, Iowa is in the 90th-percentile in the NCAA's Academic Progress Report, placing them in the top 30 baseball programs, academically. During his Iowa tenure, Dahm has seen 33 players named academic all-Big Ten, including a team-record ten players in 2006. That is the best four-year total in the history of the program.

The 41-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married 14 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey.

BY THE NUMBERS IN THE BIG TEN:

Caleb Curry has taken the Big Ten by storm, when compared with the league's players he ranks in the top ten in: batting average (.406), on base percentage (.470), slugging percentage (.555), hits (52), runs batted in (39), hit-by-pitches (7) and stolen bases (23).

Other Hawkeyes who rank well in the conference include: **Justin Toole** is in the top ten in runs batted in (33), hits (52) and runs scored (36). **Kevin Hoef** leads the league in hit-by-pitches (15), is fourth in runs scored (38), is third in total plate appearances (167) and is fourth in triples (3). **Kyle Riffel** leads the league in sac bunts (7), and is ninth in the league in hit-by-pitches (6) and **Kurtis Muller** is second in the league in sac bunts (6). **Andrew Porter** is tied for first in appearances (22) and **Kyle Heim** is tied for second (19).

NORTHWESTERN SUMMARY:

Iowa dropped a series to Northwestern to fall to eighth in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes only came away with one victory in the four-game series.

Offensively, three Hawkeyes exploded. **Justin Toole** led the way going 12-for-16 (with four runs scored, three driven in, two doubles, a triple, two walks and three stolen bags. **Kevin Hoef** led the Hawkeyes in runs scored with five. He went 9-for-18 with two doubles, a homer and three-RBI. **Caleb Curry** went 7-for-16 with two stolen bases a double, triple, home runs and four RBI.

For the Iowa bullpen, **Patrick Schatz** did tremendous. He came in and pitched two and one-third innings of relief and allowed no runs and one hit. **Matt Mossey** also threw well from the hill, in his second Hawkeye start he picked up the lone Iowa win. Pitching five-quality innings and only allowing three runs.

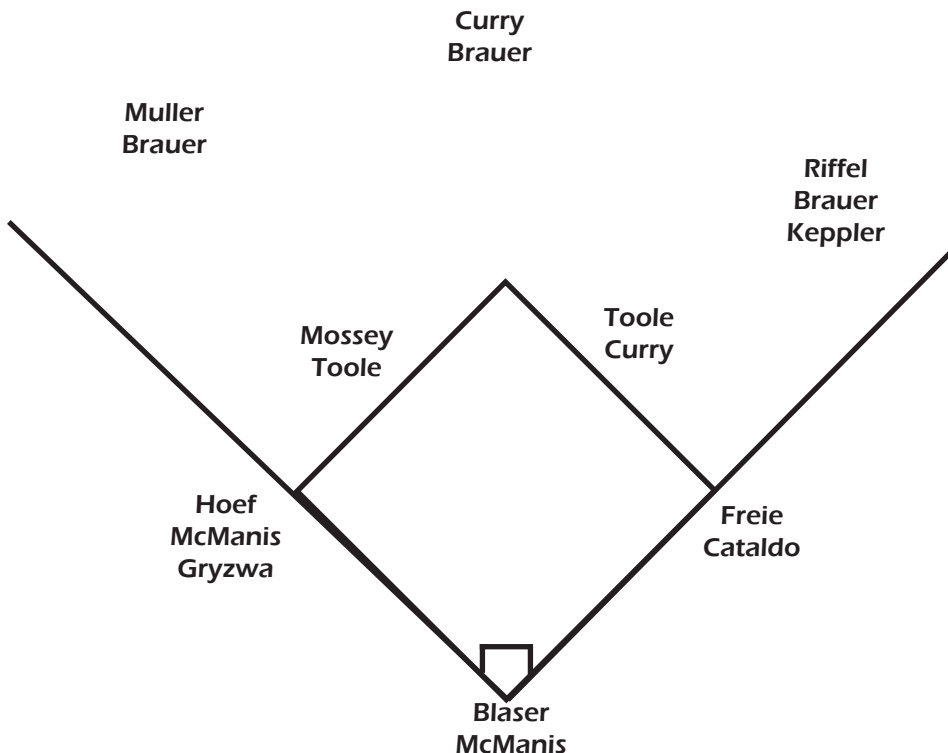

SUCCESSFUL WITH RUNNERS :

Several Hawkeyes have taken advantage of baserunners this season.

Caleb Curry is hitting .494 with runners on to lead the Black and Gold. **Justin Toole** is hitting .762 when runners are on third, while **Kurtis Muller** is 42-for-70 in advancing runners. **Kevin Hoef** is hitting .500 with the bases loaded.

UTILIZING THE SAC BUNT:

The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten in sacrifice bunts this season in the conference with 12. Leading the Black and Gold is **Kyle Riffel** with seven, followed by **Kurtis Muller** with six, and **Justin Toole** with four.

WEARING PITCHES:

Iowa has no problem taking one for the team. The Hawkeyes have 52 hit-by-pitches on the year which is more than any other team in the Big Ten and enough to rank them 37th in the country in the category.

To lead the Black and Gold is **Kevin Hoef** with 15, followed by **Caleb Curry** with seven and **Kyle Riffel** with six.

FRESHMAN STEPS UP:

Freshman **Kurtis Muller** has had a stellar season as hitting a solid .302. He has nine stolen bases, five doubles, one triple and two homers on the year. On top of that, he leads the league in sac bunts (6).

This past weekend, Muller was red-hot, going 7-for-13 with seven RBI.

McMANIS TAKES ON CATCHER:

Because **Tyson Blaser** is not 100% with a thumb injury and **Ben Geelan** sidelined with a boot-- utility infielder **Kody McManis** has had to take on the role of starting catcher.

McManis has improved behind the plate and also from the batters box, as well. On the season, McManis is hitting a solid .318 with a double and five RBI. Coming into the season, McManis had a career .186 batting average.

HAWKEYES GO YARD:

The Hawkeyes added another three home runs to their Big Ten total. Iowa hit three long balls in the four game series. The grand total is now at 14.

Against Northwestern, **Kevin Hoef** hit his third career homer, **Caleb Curry** hit a shot for his second one this week and **Wes Freie** hit a bomb to give him his third this season.

11 of Iowa's 14 homers this season have been in Big Ten play (Three vs. Northwestern, five at Indiana and three vs. Purdue).

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Nick Zumsande**, along with volunteer coach **Kris Welker** and Director of Baseball **Matt Haddy**.

Ryan Brownlee enters his fifth season as Iowa's hitting, infield instructor and recruiting coordinator.

As hitting coach, Brownlee saw the team's batting average vault 55 points from 2005 to 2007 (.269 to .324). Additionally, the team also scored more runs (273 to 401) had more RBIs (249 to 345) and walks (152 to 245) during that time span. **Nick Zumsande** enters his fifth year as the Iowa pitching coach.

Under Zumsande's guidance, the Hawkeye pitching has had a pitcher named first team all-Big Ten three of the last four years, and a pitcher named all-conference in each of his four years.

Kris Welker is in his second year as the team's volunteer assistant. Welker works with the Iowa catchers and outfielders, prepares scouting reports and coaches first base.

As a senior, Welker earned third team all-Big Ten honors, helping Iowa to a third-place finish in the Big Ten and a trip to the conference tournament. He led the team with a .354 batting average, 46 RBIs and 16 doubles. Welker also received the Bob Oldis, Jr MVP Award

Matt Haddy is in his third season as the Director of Baseball Operations for the University of Iowa.

SAME FACES, NEW PLACES:

When you look around the diamond this season, your eyes don't deceive you. There are several familiar faces in the lineup playing different positions. Senior **Caleb Curry** moved to center field from left field and also has taken on shortstop and second base. Junior **Justin Toole** also will move from second to shortstop on occasion.

SCHEDULE STRENGTH:

Iowa will play one of its toughest schedules in 2008 as it will face nine teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. The Hawkeyes will welcome NCAA Tournament teams Minnesota, Nebraska and Ohio State to Iowa City and will take on Albany, Creighton, Michigan, Rutgers, Stetson and Vanderbilt on the road. Iowa will face three teams in conference action that advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

CURRY RECEIVES HONOR:

Senior **Caleb Curry** received *CollegeBaseballHub.com's* Heartland Hitter of the Week honor for his performance against Rutgers.

Curry went 8-for-13 with seven RBI, two walks and three runs scored in the series.

LAST SEASON:

Iowa posted a 31-23 record in 2007, the Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13, and earned their second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

During the season, Iowa defeated five teams (Nebraska, Fresno State, Ohio State, Minnesota and Michigan) that reached the NCAA Tournament. The Hawkeyes also posted a 12-game winning streak, which is the second-longest in school history.

Included in the streak was a school-record 10-game Big Ten winning streak.

BIG TEN PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

Wes Freie was named Big Ten Player of the Week on March 4. In addition, **Brock Alberts** earned co-Pitcher of the Week accolades, sharing the honor with Phil Isaksson.

Freie had a stellar weekend helping lead Iowa to a 2-1 record, including a 6-3 upset win over fifth-ranked Vanderbilt, at the Music City Classic in Nashville, TN. The first baseman, who was named tournament MVP, was 9-for-12 with a double, home run, two RBI and two walks. The junior led the Black and Gold against No. 5 Vanderbilt, going a perfect 4-for-4 with an RBI.

Alberts had a great season debut in Iowa's come-from-behind win over Xavier Feb. 29. The senior right hander threw five and one-third innings in relief for the win. He allowed no runs, scattered five hits with no walks and struck out a career-high 10 of the 21 batters he faced.

HAWKEYES HIT THE CLASSROOM:

In October, the Iowa baseball team was awarded the 2007 NCAA Public Recognition Award for being in the 90% percentile of Academic Progress Report (APR) for baseball.

2008 MUSIC CITY CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM:

After going 2-1 at the tournament and upsetting Vanderbilt, the Hawkeyes received six of the 12 spots on the all-tournament team, including the MVP.

Hawkeyes honored were: **Justin Toole** at second, **Kevin Hoef** at shortstop, **Kyle Riffel** in the outfield, **Caleb Curry** in the outfield and **Wes Freie** as utility and MVP.

BIG TEN NETWORK SCHEDULE:
