CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA

Iowa finished the 2011-12 home schedule with an 8-1 record inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,400). The Hawkeyes outscored their opponents 258-63 and set a national attendance record, averaging 9,014 fans in six home dates (Iowa City Duals do not count toward national attendance figures). Iowa has a 196-19 (.912) record in the arena, including 19 undefeated seasons, since moving from the UI Fieldhouse in 1983. The dual wrestling attendance record for Carver-Hawkeye Arena is 15,955, set when Iowa defeated Iowa State (20-15) on Dec. 6, 2008.

ATTENDANCE LEADERS AT IT AGAIN

Iowa hosted the third largest dual crowd in NCAA history (15,400) when Oklahoma State visited Carver-Hawkeye Arena on Jan. 7, 2012. In six home dates, the Hawkeyes averaged a national record 9,014 fans. That includes duals vs. Oklahoma State (15,400), Illinois (7,330), Northern Iowa (7,078), Northwestern (7,954), Minnesota (9,511) and Wisconsin (6,809).

This year's 9,014 average led the nation in attendance, and marked the fourth straight year Iowa averaged over 8,000 fans per dual. The Hawkeyes led the nation in attendance for the sixth straight season.

HAWKEYE WRESTLING HISTORY

Iowa's overall dual meet record is 906-219-31 (.797) in 102 seasons. The Hawkeyes have won 23 national titles and 34 Big Ten titles. Iowa's 51 NCAA Champions have won a total of 79 NCAA Individual titles, crowning six three-time and 16 two-time champions. The Hawkeyes' 105 Big Ten champions have won a total of 190 conference titles. There have been seven four-time, 18 three-time and 28 two-time Iowa winners. Iowa's 147 All-Americans have earned All-America status 297 times, including 17 four-time, 31 three-time and 37 two-time honorees.

2012 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW

Iowa advanced three wrestlers to the finals and crowned three All-Americans at the 2012 NCAA Championships in St. Louis. Matt McDonough won the 125-pound title and Derek St. John (157) and Montell Marion (141) each finished runner-up. Tony Ramos (3rd, 133), Ethen Lofthouse (7th, 174) and Bobby Telford (5th, 285) all earned their first All-America honors.

The Hawkeyes finished third in the team race with 107.5 points. Penn State won its second straight NCAA title with 143 points. Minnesota finished second (117.5), and Cornell (102.5) and Ohio State (68.5) rounded out the top five. A record 112,393 people attended the 2012 NCAA wrestling championships.

2012 BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW

Iowa crowned a pair of individual champions and placed third overall at the Big Ten Championships March 3-4 on the campus of Purdue. Junior Matt McDonough (125) and sophomore Derek St. John (157) each captured tournament titles. The Hawkeyes advanced a league-high six wrestlers to the conference finals, but Tony Ramos (133), Montell Marion (141), Mike Evans (165) and Bobby Telford (285) all had to settle for runner-up finishes. Ethen Lofthouse (174) and Grant Gambrall (184) placed third and fifth, respectively. Iowa's eight place-winners earned automatic bids to the 2012 NCAA Championships. Penn State won its second straight conference title and Minnesota placed second. Both schools earned nine automatic qualifying bids.

MCDONOUGH AMONG THE BEST

MCDONOUGH WENT BACK FOR SECONDS

Junior Matt McDonough claimed his second career conference title at the Big Ten Championships on March 4 and his second national title at the NCAA Championships on March 17. McDonough won the 2010 and 2012 NCAA titles. He finished runner-up in 2011. His 2012 championship appearance marked his third straight appearance in the NCAA finals. Only three Hawkeyes in school history have advanced to four NCAA finals. They include Ed Banach (1980-83), Duane Goldman (1983-86) and Lincoln McClravy (1993-95, 1997).

CLIMBING MOUNT ST. JOHN

Sophomore Derek St. John ran through the top three seeds to earn the 157-pound title at the 2012 Big Ten Tournament. A runner-up at last year's conference tournament, St. John entered this season's championship as the No. 6 seed after missing most of the season with an injured knee. He topped Nebraska's third-seeded James Green, 6-4, in the quarterfinals before defeating Penn State's second-seeded Dylan Alton, 4-2, in the semis. Both wins were decided in the first sudden victory period. He then scored a take-down in the closing seconds to defeat Northwestern's top-seeded Jason Welch, 4-3, in the finals. St. John was one of only two wrestlers not seeded No. 1 to win a Big Ten title (#5 Mario Gonzalez, Ill., 197 lbs.).

MCDONOUGH HITS 28

Junior Matt McDonough finished the season with a NCAA title and a 28-match winning streak, his longest streak since winning 32 in a row to start the 2009-10 season. McDonough's last loss was an 11-7 overtime decision to Illinois' Jesse Delgado (Dec. 2, 2011). He has since defeated Delgado twice -- first at the National Duals tournament (6-3) and most recently in the semifinals of the Big Ten tournament (4-3).

RAMOS IS DUAL DOMINANT

Sophomore Tony Ramos recorded five falls, four major decisions and three technical falls in 18 duals this season, racking up a team-high 74 points and a 17-1 dual record. He has just one loss in 30 career duals.

MARION HITS 90

Senior Montell Marion's 7-6 win over Cal Poly's Boris Novachkov on March 16 marked the 90th career victory for the 141-pound wrestler from Des Moines, Iowa.

Marion finished his career with 91-20 career record, including a 30-4 mark this season and a team-best 10 major decisions.

1-2-3 PUNCH

Iowa's three lower weights combined for a 99-9 (.925) record this season with 55 bonus-point victories. Junior Matt McDonough (125) led Iowa with 12 pins. Sophomore Tony Ramos (133) owned a team-best seven technical falls and senior Montell Marion (141) and McDonough shared the team lead with 10 major decisions.

NCAA EXPERIENCE

The Hawkeyes will have seven wrestlers return with NCAA championships experience in 2012-13. Junior Matt McDonough (125) won titles in 2010 and 2012 and finished runner-up in 2011. Sophomore Derek St. John (157) will return as a two-time All-American. Sophomore Ethen Lofthouse and Tony Ramos each earned All-America honors in their second NCAA appearance in 2012. Junior Grant Gambrall has reached the national tournament in each of the last two seasons, earning All-America honors in 2010. Redshirt freshmen Bobby Telford (285) and Mike Evans (165) advanced to the 2012 nationals, where Telford earned a fifth-place finish and All-America honors.

Iowa loses three-time All-American Montell Marion (141) to graduation. The senior from Des Moines, Iowa, placed second in 2010 and 2012, and earned a fourth place finish in 2011.

#900

The Hawkeyes topped Nebraska, 24-9, on Jan. 13 to earn the 900th dual win in program history. Iowa owns a 906-219-31 (.797) dual record in 102 seasons. Iowa State, Oklahoma State and Oregon State are the only other schools to record at least 900 dual wins.

ANOTHER 10

The Hawkeyes' 19-17 win over Minnesota on Jan. 29 marked Iowa's 10th dual win of the season. The Hawkeyes have won at least 10 duals in every season dating back to 1967-68 -- a span of 45 seasons. Iowa finished 2011-12 with 14 dual victories (14-4).

38 YEARS OF DOMINANCE

Since 1974, the year Iowa won its first NCAA team title, only seven schools have captured the NCAA Championship. During that 38-year span, the Hawkeyes have won 23 team titles, including nine straight from 1978-86. The other schools include Oklahoma State (7), Minnesota (3), Iowa State (2), Penn State (2), Arizona State (1) and Oklahoma (1).

PLANTING THE SEEDS - SEVEN IS BEST

Seven of Iowa's eight qualifiers earned seeds at the national tournament, and all seven were seeded in the top five -- more than any other school. Iowa's seeded wrestlers included Matt McDonough (1st-125), Tony Ramos (3rd-133), Montell Marion (3rd-141), Derek St. John (2nd-157), Mike Evans (5th-165), Ethen Lofthouse (5th-174), and Bobby Telford (5th-285).

Five of Iowa's wrestlers mirrored their seeds on the final stand. McDonough finished 1st, Ramos 3rd, St. John 2nd, Lofthouse 5th and Telford 5th.

HAWKS IN THE DANCE

The NCAA announced March 7 that eight Hawkeyes earned berths to the NCAA Championships. The Hawkeyes automatic qualifiers included Matt McDonough (125), Tony Ramos (133), Montell Marion (141), Derek St. John (157), Mike Evans (165), Ethen Lofthouse (174), Grant Gambrell (184) and Bobby Telford (285).

MCDONOUGH EARNS CONFERENCE HONOR

Junior Matt McDonough earned Big Ten Wrestler of the Week honors on Jan. 31. McDonough upset top-ranked Zach Sanders to help lead Iowa to a 19-17 victory over Minnesota on Jan. 29. He did not allow an offensive point while scoring two takedowns and a reversal against the previously unbeaten Sanders. The conference honor was the second of McDonough's career.

RAMOS NABS 2ND BIG TEN HONOR

Tony Ramos earned his second career conference honor when he was named Big Ten co-Wrestler of the Week on Jan. 10.

Ramos, a sophomore from Carol Stream, Ill., pinned Indiana's Joe Duca in the second period at Indiana (1/6) before earning a 4-3 overtime decision against Oklahoma State's top-ranked Jordan Oliver (1/7). He had previously won the award after a pair of bonus point victories against No. 7 Illinois (12/2) and Iowa State (12/4). He posted a 13-5 major decision over the Illini's B.J. Futrell, then-ranked No. 2 in the country, and recorded a second period pin against Iowa State's Shayden Terukina.

Ramos, currently ranked No. 3, owns a 28-3 record with five major decisions, seven technical falls and six pins.

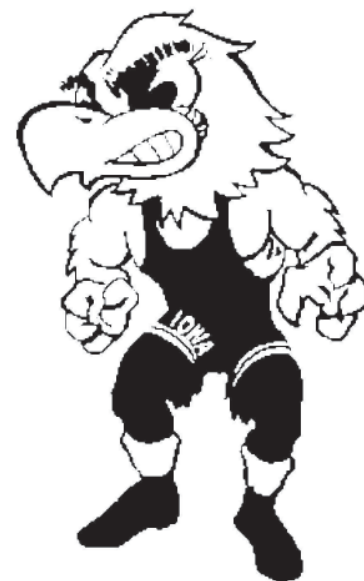

Tom Brands Head Coach

Three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year Tom Brands is in his sixth season as head wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. A 1996 Olympic gold medalist and member of wrestling's Hall of Fame, Brands is only the eighth wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. The former Hawkeye wrestler was a four-time All-American and three-time national champion (1989-92) at Iowa. He has a 111-10-1 (.914) overall and 43-5 (.896) Big Ten coaching record at Iowa, and a 128-30-1 (.814) career mark.

In five full years as Iowa's head coach, Brands has led the Hawkeyes to three NCAA and Big Ten team titles, crowning six NCAA champions, 10 Big Ten champions and 28 All-Americans. Iowa has 34 Academic All-Big Ten honorees, including a school-record 10 in 2010-11. The Hawkeyes have qualified 53 wrestlers for the NCAA Championships in the last six years, sending the entire 10-man lineup in 2009-10. Iowa

has also won four of the last five Big Ten regular season titles, posting perfect 8-0 conference dual records from 2008-2011.

During Brands' tenure, Iowa set school records for longest dual unbeaten (84) and winning streaks (69), longest dual road unbeaten (50) and winning streaks (44), most Carver-Hawkeye Arena victories (11) and most dual shutouts (8). Iowa also made another entry in the record books, setting the national collegiate dual meet attendance record of 15,955 when it hosted Iowa State Dec. 6, 2008, at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The previous record of 15,646 was set Feb. 1, 2002, when Minnesota hosted Iowa at the Target Center in Minneapolis. The Hawkeyes won the Iowa State dual, 20-15.

Brands was named 2008 NWCA Coach of the Year after leading the Hawkeyes to their first NCAA team title since 2000 and their first Big Ten team title since 2004. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009 and 2010, becoming the first coach in conference history to earn the honor in three consecutive seasons.

Brands served as head coach at Virginia Tech University for two seasons (2005-06), recording a 17-20 dual mark. In his first season with the Hokies, Brands led the team to the 2005 regular season Atlantic Coast Conference title, set a school record for dual meet wins (16) and had a school-record five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships. During his tenure, Virginia Tech crowned five ACC champions and had two All-Americans. Senior heavyweight Mike Faust was named 2006 ACC Wrestler of the Year.

Prior to taking the helm at Virginia Tech, Brands was an assistant coach at Iowa for 12 seasons (1993-2004). He helped the Hawkeyes to a 177-27 dual record, seven NCAA and eight Big Ten titles, while crowning 23 NCAA champions, 73 All-Americans and 36 Big Ten champions. He was named the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

In 2004, he was one of three coaches for the U.S. Olympic freestyle wrestling team, participating in Athens. Brands also served as assistant coach for the 2002 and 2003 U.S. Freestyle World Teams, earning Freestyle Coach of the Year honors from USA Wrestling both years. He was also a member of the U.S. coaching staff at the 2001 World Championships, and has coached a number of other U.S. teams in international competition.

As a competitor, Brands won the 1996 Olympic freestyle gold medal at 136.5 pounds in Atlanta. He also won a gold medal at the 1993 World Freestyle Championships in Toronto, two World Cup gold medals (1994, 1995) and was the 1995 Pan American Games champion. He won four U.S. National titles (1993-96) and made four straight U.S. World or Olympic teams (1993-96). Along with his twin brother, Terry, Tom was named 1993 USA Wrestling Athlete of the Year, the 1993 John Smith Outstanding Freestyle Wrestler and 1993 Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year. He was inducted into wrestling's Hall of Fame in 2001.

Brands was a four-time All-American at Iowa (1989-92). During his Hawkeye career, he won three NCAA titles and was named Outstanding Wrestler of the 1992 NCAA Championships. Also a three-time Big Ten champion, Brands won 95 percent of his matches at Iowa. His career mark of 158-7-2, included an undefeated season in 1991 (45-0).

The Sheldon, Iowa, native was born April 9, 1968. He earned his B.S. degree in physical education from Iowa in 1992. He and his wife, Jeni, have three children, Madigan, Kinsee and Tommy.
