Quick Hits

- lowa made its ninth consecutive postseason appearance (8 NCAA, 1 WNIT), earning an at-large bid to the WNIT last season.
- The Hawkeyes have made a postseason tournament appearance in 15 of head coach Lisa Bluder's 16 seasons at the helm of the program, receiving 12 NCAA Tournament and three WNIT (2003, 2005, 2016) opportunities.
- Bluder is one of 14 Division I head coaches to win 675 career games or more in her career. She has been a head coach for 32 seasons, including 16 at lowa.
- Iowa returns four of its five starters from last season in senior Ally Disterhoft, junior Chase Coley, and sophomores Tania Davis and Megan Gustafson.
- lowa's freshmen class of Bre Cera (2016 Journal Sentinel Player of the Year), Kathleen Doyle (Illinois Miss Basketball), Makenzie Meyer (Iowa Miss Basketball), Amanda Ollinger, (Gazette Female Athlete of the Year) and Alexis Sevellian (Finalist for Michigan Miss Basketball) was ranked No. 7 nationally by Blue Star -- the highest ranked recruiting class for head coach Lisa Bluder and her staff.
- Senior Ally Disterhoft was named Preseason All-Big Ten by the coaches and media, the Big Ten Conference announced Oct. 24. She led the Hawkeyes in scoring last season, averaging 17.1 points per game. The guard/forward netted double figures in every game last season and became the highest scoring junior in program history with 565 points.
- Disterhoft ranks 11th on lowa's all-time career scoring list with 1,542 career points. Former Hawkeye Cindy Haugejorde holds the scoring record with 2,059 points.
- Disterhoft earned Academic All-America of the Year and first team Academic All-America accolades last season. She owned the highest GPA (4.03) of any Academic All-American last season and was the only junior to be named to the first team.
- Bluder owns a 323-188 (.632) overall record and a 160-106 conference mark at lowa. In her 32 seasons as a head coach, Bluder is 679-330 (.673).
- In the last 42 seasons, lowa has compiled a 764-471 (.619) overall record and a 381-197 record in Big Ten play.

RECEIVING VOTES

- lowa is receiving three votes in the *USA Today* Preseason Coaches Poll. Three Big Ten teams are ranked in the poll, including No. 5 Maryland, No. 6 Ohio State, and No. 22 Michigan State, and Indiana (51), Michigan (10), Northwestern (7), and Iowa (3) are receiving votes.
- Three Big Ten teams are included in the Preseason Associated Press Top 25. They include No. 6 Maryland, No. 7
 Ohio State, and No. 23 Indiana. Michigan State is receiving 78 votes in the poll.

DISTERHOFT EARNS PRESEASON HONOR

Senior Ally Disterhoft was named Preseason All-Big Ten by the coaches and media, the Big Ten Conference announced Oct. 24. The lowa City, lowa, native was a second team All-Big Ten selection in 2015 and 2016 and an honorable mention All-Big Ten honoree in 2014. She was also named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team and Big Ten All-Tournament team in 2014.

SCOUTING LEWIS

- Lewis played to a 28-3 overall record and an 18-0 Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) mark last season to earn their fourth straight NCAA Division II Tournament appearance.
- The Flyers return 2016 GLVC Freshman of the Year Jessica Kelliher. The 2016 D2CCA All-Region selection averaged 18.3 points and 6.1 rebounds in her freshman campaign.
- Lewis also returns 2015 GLVC Player of the Year Jamie Johnson to the lineup.
 Johnson missed a majority of the 2015-16 season with a knee injury. The two-time first team All-GLVC selection owns a career scoring average of 15.4 points per game.

A SHOT AT HISTORY

Ally Disterhoft has netted 1,542 points in her career -- a mark that ranks 11th on lowa's all-time list. The senior is 517 points away from tying lowa's all-time scoring record of 2,059 set by former Hawkeye Cindy Haugejorde (1976-80). Disterhoft also ranks 12th on all-time in 3-point field goals (116), 14th in career blocks (53), and 18th (609) in rebounds.

RETURNING EXPERIENCE

- lowa returns four of its five starters from last season in senior Ally Disterhoft, junior Chase Coley, and sophomores Tania Davis and Megan Gustafson.
- Senior Ally Disterhoft garnered second team All-Big Ten accolades by coaches and media for the second consecutive season and received lowa's Sportsmanship Award. The preseason All-Big Ten pick by coaches and media scored in double figures in every game last season and in 78 of her 84 consecutive starts.
- Tania Davis and Megan Gustafson were named to the 2016 Big Ten All-Freshman Team.
- Davis was one of two Big Ten freshmen to lead her team in assists per game (3.4) and average at least one steal per game (1.2) last season. She has dished out 111 assists in 33 games played, the second-highest total recorded by a freshman at lowa (Samantha Logic; 136).
- Gustafson was the only freshman and one of three players in the conference overall to lead her team in field goal percentage (.554), rebounds (225), and blocks (58) last season.
- Chase Coley averaged 11.1 points per game last season the second highest mark
 on the team. The junior compiled 365 points, 194 rebounds, 53 assists, 37 blocks,
 and 24 steals in her sophomore campaign to receive lowa's Most Improved Award.

QUALITY YOUTH

- lowa's freshman class was ranked No. 7 nationally by Blue Star -- the highest ranked recruiting class for head coach Lisa Bluder and her staff.
- Iowa's freshmen class consists of Bre Cera (2016 Journal Sentinel Player of the Year), Kathleen Doyle (Illinois Miss Basketball), Makenzie Meyer (Iowa Miss Basketball), Amanda Ollinger (2016 Gazette Female Athlete of the Year), and Alexis Sevellian (finalist for Michigan Miss Basketball).

HAWKEYES CONTINUE POSTSEASON STREAK


- lowa made its ninth straight postseason appearance (8 NCAA, 1 WNIT) with an at-large bid to the WNIT in 2016.
- The Hawkeyes were selected to host a first round contest inside Carver-Hawkeye
 Arena, but made an early exit, falling to Ball State, 77-72.
- Following the loss, lowa is 7-3 all-time in the WNIT and 3-1 in games played in lowa City.
- lowa was one of six Big Ten Conference teams (Minnesota, Michigan, Nebraska, Northwestern, Rutgers) and one of three teams from lowa (Drake, UNI) to be included in the WNIT field of 64.

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir), the all-time winningest coach in program history, completed her 16th season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 32nd season as a college head coach in 2015-16.

Under her direction, the Hawkeyes have advanced to 15 postseason appearances (12 NCAA and three WNIT) in 16 seasons, including NCAA Tournament berths in eight of the last nine seasons.

Bluder, the 2015 Carol Eckman Award winner, has posted a 323-188 (.632) record at lowa and her career record stands



Bluder, 1-of-14 active Division I coaches with 675 or more wins, is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2001, 2008 and 2010) and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year (2001 and 2008). She has guided lowa to a winning record in 15 of her 16 years at lowa, including 11 upper-division finishes in the challenging Big Ten Conference. Bluder, who ranks third among Big Ten coaches all-time in league victories (160), has led lowa to nine 20-win seasons in her 16 years, including seven of the last nine years.

Bluder has coached numerous players to different awards in her 16 years in lowa City. She has mentored 19 players to 47 All-Big Ten honors, including 12 first team picks, 16 second, 11 third and eight honorable mention selections. She has also had two Big Ten Freshman of the Year award winners, two Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year recipients, eight members of the Big Ten All-Freshman team and three players named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team, with Kachine Alexander earning the honor twice.

Five players during Bluder's tenure have earned a total of seven Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) all-region team accolades and six players have earned a total of 11 honorable mention All-America honors. Bluder coached her first consensus All-American in Samantha Logic, who earned the honor after being named a WBCA Division I Coaches All-American, USBWA All-American, ESPN Second Team All-American, and Third Team Associated Press All-American.

With Bluder on the lowa sidelines, student-athletes have been named Academic All-Big Ten 75 times, including a program-best eight honorees in 2011 and 2012. The 75 honorees is the highest total mentored by any of the Big Ten coaches. Bluder has also mentored three Academic All-Americans in Ally Disterhoft (2015, 2016), Logic (2015), and Lindsey Meder (2001, 2002). Disterhoft was also named Academic All-America of the Year in 2015.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in her last six years, including five postseason appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons, building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, Iowa, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

CALL ON ME

- Ally Disterhoft averaged a team-leading 36.6 minutes per contest last season.
- The senior led lowa in points per game (17.1) last season, scoring double figures in every game.
- She became the program's highest scoring junior last season, netting 565 points to break Michelle Edwards' record of 564 points in 1986-87.
- Disterhoft has played in every game of her collegiate career with 84 consecutive starts. She has netted double figures in 78 of her 84 career starts.
- The lowa City, lowa, native closed the 2015-16 season with a .535 field goal percentage, a team-best .413 3-point field goal percentage and a .727 free throw percentage.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

- In the last 13 games of the 2015-16 season, Megan Gustafson posted nine double-doubles -- the first of her career.
- The sophomore recorded double-doubles against Michigan (12 rebounds, 10 points), at Northwestern (15 points, 13 rebounds), at Indiana (12 points, 10 rebounds), Ohio State (13 points, 11 rebounds), at Minnesota (14 points, 19 rebounds), at Penn State (15 points, 11 rebounds), and Illinois (16 points, 10 rebounds) in the regular season. She also added 25 points and 10 boards against Michigan in the Big Ten Tournament and 22 points and 12 boards against Ball State in the first round of the WNIT.
- Following the 2015-16 campaign, Gustafson was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. She led league freshmen in blocks (58), was second rebounding (225), and fourth in scoring (352). She was one of just two freshmen in the conference to lead their team in rebounds.

THE BLUDER FILE

- Head coach Lisa Bluder begins her17th season at the helm of the lowa women's basketball program this season. She owns a 323-188 (.632) overall record and a 160-106 Big Ten record at lowa. In her 32 seasons as a head coach, Bluder is 679-330 (.673).
- Bluder is one of 14 active Division I coaches to collect 675 or more career wins.
- The head Hawkeye is second in career Big Ten wins (160) and in total wins among Big Ten coaches. She trails only C. Vivian Stringer who has compiled 189 Big Ten wins and 971 career wins.
- Bluder ranks third all-time among all Big Ten coaches with 160 conference victories.

ACADEMIC PROWESS

- Ally Disterhoft was named Academic All-America of the Year for Division I women's basketball and a CoSIDA first team Academic All-American last season. Disterhoft became the only junior to earn first team Academic All-America recognition and owned the top GPA (4.03) of all Academic All-Americans this year.
- Christina Buttenham, Ally Disterhoft, Alexa Kastanek, and Hailey Schneden, earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition following the 2015-16 season. To be eligible for Academic All-Big Ten, student-athletes must be letterwinners and be in at least their second academic year at the institution. They must also carry a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better.
- In 2014-15, Iowa was the only program to have two Academic All-Americans in Disterhoft and Samantha Logic.
 There were 15 total honorees.

2015-16 IOWA TEAM AWARDS

- Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection Megan Gustafson earned Best Rebounder and Field Goal Percentage Leader recognition following the 2015-16 season. The Port Wing, Wisconsin, native compiled 225 boards, the fourth-highest total recorded by a freshman in program history. Gustafson tallied nine double-doubles in the final 13 games of the season, averaging just shy of a double-double (13.6 points, 9.6 rebounds) in her 14 starts.
- Tania Davis, also a Big Ten All-Freshman Team pick, took home awards for Best Defense and Assists Leader. The Grand Blanc, Michigan, native tallied 37 steals, the third-highest total of all freshmen in program history. Davis paced the Hawkeyes with 111 assists in her 33 games played. She is only the second player in the history of the program to dish out more than 100 assists in her freshman campaign.
- Chase Coley was credited with the Most Improved honor. The Minneapolis native had her best season as a
 Hawkeye last year, compiling 365 points, 194 rebounds, 53 assists, 37 blocks, and 24 steals. She recorded six
 double-doubles, scored in double figures in 19 of 33 games, and netted 20 points or more five times.
- Hailey Schneden received the Coaches Award. The two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree is a positive presence on and off the court for the Hawkeyes. The Davenport, Iowa, native also shared the Community Service Award with Alexa Kastanek.
- Ally Disterhoft took home the Dr. Christine Grant Leadership Award. The team captain was a consistent leader throughout the year for the Hawkeyes, scoring in double figures in every game last season and averaging a teamhigh 17.1 points per game.
