# lowa at Michigan Ray Fisher Stadium - Ann Arbor, MI April 23-25 - (Three-Game Series)



## THE SETTING:

This weekend is separation weekend in the Big Ten and a key series for the Hawkeyes in moving up the league standings. Iowa travels to Ann Arbor, MI, for a three-game weekend series against Michigan. Game one of the series if Friday at 5:35 p.m. (CDT) at Ray Fisher Stadium. Three of Iowa's first four Big Ten series' have been on the road. Conversely, the Hawkeyes will conclude the season with three of four at home.

## **SCOUTING MICHIGAN:**

The Wolverines are currently on a three-game win streak and took two of three from Illinois last weekend in Big Ten play. Michigan has a 24-12 record and is 6-3 in the conference.

The Michigan offense is solid with five starters hitting above .300. Chris Berset leads the team with a .413 batting average, 57 hits and a .601 slugging percentage. Patrick Biondi leads the team with a .489 on base percentage and 24 stolen bags.

The Wolverine pitching staff has a 4.93 ERA. Closer Tyler Burgoon has a 3.10 ERA with six saves and five wins. He also has amassed 44 strikeouts in 40.2 innings pitched.

## RECORD BREAKING McCOOL:

Junior **Zach McCool** tied yet another school record. McCool laced two consecutive triples in lowa's victory over Western Illinois Tuesday. The last time that was done was in 1999 by Brian Burks.

McCool tied another individual-game record earlier in the season. He went 5-for-6 from the leadoff spot for lowa in its series finale against the Spartans. McCool's five hits ties a singlegame school record, last achieved by former Hawkeye standout, Justin Toole, in 2008.

# HAWKEYES ARE HOT IN THE FIRST:

lowa has scored runs in the first frame in 10 of its last 11 contests. The Hawkeyes currently are out scoring opponents 39-15 in the first.

## McCOOL DOMINATES BIG TEN:

**Zach McCool** has had stellar performances in all three Big Ten series'.

In conference play, the junior leads the team in batting average (.552), hits (16), slugging percentage (.724), walks (6) and is second in doubles (5) and on base percentage (.629).

## **CAREER OUTING FOR PACHA:**

Reliever **Jeff Pacha** had a career outing Wednesday night in lowa's loss to Northern Illinois. The lefty went a career-long three and one-third innings and struck out a career-high five Huskies.

## **TRIPLE TRIPLES:**

The Hawkeyes picked up three of their 10 triples this week in mid-week games. In fact, each game featured a first-inning triple.

In lowa's win over Western Illinois **Zach Mc-Cool** laced a triple in the first, and later in the third. In the Hawkeyes loss to Northern Illinois, **Kurtis Muller** started the inning off with a leadoff triple—the Hawkeyes lone hit until the eighth inning.

#### **DURANT SOLID IN BIG TEN:**

lowa's cleanup hitter, **Ryan Durant** has hit a solid .394 in conference play. He leads the team with six doubles, 12 RBI and is second (to Zach McCool) with a .576 slugging percentage.

# DERMODY HAS SOLID OUTING:

Freshman **Matt Dermody** got his third starting nod and a no decision in lowa's win over Western Illinois Tuesday evening. The southpaw went a career-long six innings, allowing four runs on seven hits with four strikeouts.

## TAKING FOUR:

Iowa clinched its fourth victory over Western Illinois Tuesday evening in extras, 6-5. The Hawkeyes face the Leathernecks five times this season.

lowa swept Western Illinois in three in their home opening series. With two come from behind ninth inning thrillers the Hawkeyes got their first sweep since 2007. (lowa swept Indiana in a three-game home series.)

In the series, **Kurtis Muller** went a stellar 5-for-11 with five runs scored, three RBI and a perfect 6-for-6 on the base path.

## **CLOTHING DRIVE:**

The Hawkeyes and Neighborhood Centers of Johnson County are teaming up on Sunday, May 2. Iowa hosts Minnesota in the finale of a three-game series at Duane Banks Field at 1 p.m. that day.

Fans are encouraged to bring new or gentlyused clothing for people in our area. Fans that are able to donate, tickets will be just \$2 for any patron.

#### **Z-ROB GETS A LOT OF ACTION:**

Southpaw **Zach Robertson** has had a lot of action on the bump for lowa. The senior has thrown in four of lowa's last five contests, including a start in Wednesday's game.

In Robertson's past four games pitched, he has gone three and two-third innings allowing three earned runs with eight strikeouts.

## STREAKING HAWKEYES:

**Kurtis Muller** is the only Hawkeye currently streaking, with three consecutive games with a hit.

Muller and **Mike McQuillan** lead lowa with 13 multi-hit contests and **Ryan Durant** lead lowa with eight multi-RBI games this season.

# 3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

- **1. Zach McCool** has been on fire in Big Ten play. The junior went 4-for-10 last weekend in Bloomington. Collecting five walks, three RBI and two runs scored.
- **2.** Look for lowa to get started in the first inning. The Hawkeyes have plated at least one run in the first frame 10 of its last 11 games.
- **3.** Iowa's first three hitters in the lineup (Muller, McCool, McQuillan) boast an OBP of over .400.)

## **LEE PICKS UP SECOND WIN:**

In Iowa's mid-week game against Western Illinois, several pitchers were used. Closer **Kevin Lee** pitched two innings to earn the victory, improving to 2-0 on the season.

## **SPEEDY GAME PLAY:**

The Hawkeyes have played with pace this season. Four of lowa's last 13 games have been under the three hour mark.

Also, 15 games of the Hawkeyes' 34 this season have been under the three hours.

## IN THE BIG TEN:

Zach McCool is ranked in the top 10 in several statistical categories for his conference play. Amongst other Big Ten players, McCool ranks in on base percentage (1st), stolen bases (1st), doubles (2nd), batting average (3rd) and slugging percentage (9th).

**Ryan Durant** ranks in: doubles (1st), RBI (3rd), sacrifice bunts (3rd) and sacrifice flies (3rd).

## **ALL-TIME SERIES:**

Michigan leads the all-time series between the two schools, 98-41.

The last time the two schools faced off, Michigan took two of the three games (2009).

lowa dropped the series finale against Michigan, 7-5, at soggy Duane Banks Field. The game was delayed three hours after the lowa groundscrew needed the extra time to remove snow.

Errors were the difference in the rubbermatch. **Andrew Ewing** went 1-for-3 with an RBI double. And both **Patrick Schatz** and **Michael Jacobs** had strong outings.

## **2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:**

Three Hawkeyes were drafted in the Major League Baseball's 2009 First-Year Player Draft. Right-handed fireballer **Steve Turnbull**, lefty relief pitcher **Kyle Heim** and closer **Mike Schurz** all signed contracts in June. Three-time all-Big Ten selection **Justin Toole** later signed a free agent contract.

Other draftees included current lowa freshmen: **Matt Dermody** and **Dan Sheppard**.

## **Head Coach Jack Dahm**



**DAHM AT IOWA** 

In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the lowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections,

including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, lowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

In the bottom of the 10th, with runners on second and third Western Illinois reliever Chris Fuchs was in the process of giving **Mike McQuillan** an intentional pass until the second pitch glanced off the mitt of the catcher, which sent the winning run home. It marked the second time in three years lowa won a game on a pass ball during a pitch sequence of an intentional walk (Ohio State in 2008).

In the win, McCool laced a pair of triples to

tie an lowa individual game record last done in 1999 by Brian Burks (vs. Saint Louis). He went 2-for-4 with two runs scored and two RBI. **Ryan Durant** connected for his 11th double and his fifth sacrifice fly of the season; both team-bests.


lowa fell to Northern Illinois, 13-2, Wednesday night.

## THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach Jack Dahm is assisted by coach Ryan Brownlee and coach Chris Maliszewski, along with volunteer coach Zach Dillon.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. lowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, lowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks then the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

## WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin" Ray Gilmore, who serves as lowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for lowa Baseball.

lowa Head Baseball Coach Jack Dahm has announced that Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski and Taylor Zeutenhorst have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler and Aaron Smit intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.

Lala, a native of Marion, IA, is a right-handed pitcher from Kirkwood Community College. Lala appeared in 18 games. He amassed 45 strikeouts in 40.1 innings of work and finished the year with a 4.86 ERA.
