THE SETTING

The University of Iowa women's basketball team will play its first true road game of the season Thursday, traveling to Chapel Hill to face the #14/15 North Carolina Tar Heels in the fourth annual ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Tip-off at Carmichael Auditorium is set for 6 p.m. (CT).

Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call Thursday's game for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Balbinot is in his seventh season as Iowa's play-by-play voice, while Till is in her sixth providing analysis.

IOWA HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,042 games, since beginning basketball in 1974. Iowa's overall record is 636-406 (.610). That includes a 318-158 (.668) mark in regular season Big Ten contests and a 300-87 (.775) mark in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

WIN NO. 300 AT HOME

The UI women's basketball program picked up victory No. 300 inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena with a 90-79 win over Central Michigan Nov. 21. The Hawkeyes have compiled a 300-87 (.775) record inside their home venue since it opened in 1983.

SCOUTING NORTH CAROLINA

The #14/15 North Carolina Tar Heels are 7-0 on the season. North Carolina is averaging 91.9 points per game and holds a +44.6 scoring margin over its opponents. The Tar Heels are shooting .460 (245-533) from the field.

The Tar Heels won three games in three days in Hawaii over Thanksgiving Break. North Carolina defeated Washington State (93-55), Illinois (87-58) and Hawaii (91-57).

Italee Lucas leads the team with 18.4 points per game. Jessica Breland is next with 13.1 points and a team-best eight rebounds. Chay Shegog rounds out the double figure scoring averages at 11.7 points. Four more Tar Heels are averaging seven or more rebounds per contest.

NORTH CAROLINA VS. IOWA NOTES

- Iowa is 0-3 in ACC/Big Ten Challenge games. The Hawkeyes lost to Georgia Tech (76-57) at home in 2007, at Duke (71-47) in 2008 and at home to Boston College (72-67) in 2009.
- Thursday is Iowa's second-consecutive game against an ACC opponent. The Hawkeyes defeated Virginia Tech (72-43) in the Caribbean Challenge last Friday. Iowa will play two Big 12 opponents (Kansas State and Iowa State) in its next two contests.
- Iowa leads the all-time series, 2-0. Thursday will be the first matchup between the two schools that will not be played on a neutral court. Iowa won the first meeting, 106-81, in the Hilton Head Island Shootout in Hilton Head, SC, during the 1989-90 season. The second matchup was a 73-64 victory for the Hawkeyes over then-No. 16 ranked North Carolina in Myrtle Beach, SC, at the Carolinas Holiday Beach Classic during the 1995-96 season.
- Lisa Bluder is 7-3 in the first true road game of the season while at Iowa.

IOWA IN THE RANKINGS

The Hawkeyes are ranked No. 18 in both the AP and the ESPN/USA Today top 25.

Four Iowa opponents are also ranked in the AP and ESPN/USA Today polls: Ohio State (6/6), North Carolina (14/15), Iowa State (19/17) and Michigan State (25/25).

Kansas State, Purdue, Northwestern and Penn State are receiving votes.

HAWKEYES LEAVE CANCUN WITH WIN OVER VIRGINIA TECH

Iowa improved to 7-0 on the season with a 72-43 win over Virginia Tech in the final game of the 2010 Caribbean Challenge in Cancun, Mexico.

Iowa took a 30-15 lead into the locker room at halftime and never looked back. The Hawkeyes were led by Jaime Printy with 15 points and six assists. Kelly Krei added 11 points while Kamille Wahlin chipped in 10.

The Hawkeyes shot a season-high .414 (12-29) from three-point distance. Printy and Krei made three long distance shots, while Wahlin, Kalli Hansen and Hannah Draxten each had two.

The Hawkeyes out-rebounded Virginia Tech, 42-35, and collected 17 offensive rebounds. Iowa also turned 23 Hokie turnovers into 24 points and received 26 points off the bench.

BLUDER CLOSING IN ON MILESTONE

Iowa Head Coach Lisa Bluder is just four wins away from becoming only the second coach in school history to reach the 200-win milestone.

Bluder currently has 196 wins in her 11 years at Iowa. C. Vivian Stringer is the only other Hawkeye head coach to reach the 200-win plateau at Iowa, finishing her time in Iowa City with 269 wins.

Ohio State Head Coach Jim Foster is the only other active Big Ten coach to have reached 200 wins at his/her current school.

HAWKEYES TIE SCHOOL RECORD AGAINST VIRGINIA TECH

Iowa tied a school record with 12 made three-pointers against Virginia Tech Nov. 26. Iowa went 12-29 from distance. The Hawkeyes made 12 three-pointers against Gonzaga (11/21/02) and Columbia (11/28/09).

OFF TO A FAST START

Iowa's perfect 7-0 start is the best start to a season under Head Coach Lisa Bluder since the 2004-05 campaign, when the Hawkeyes won their first 13 games. The 2009-10 Hawkeye team is the sixth in school history to win its first seven games. Below is a list of consecutive wins to start a season in Iowa women's basketball history.

HAWKEYES HITTING THE BOARDS

Iowa's rebounding numbers through its first seven games are impressive, as the Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten in total rebounding (46.3 per game) and offensive rebounding (15.9).

The Hawkeyes have collected 39 more total rebounds and 23 more offensive rebounds through seven games this season than a year ago. Iowa's +8 rebounding margin this year is 5.3 points better than the same stat through seven games last year.

Kachine Alexander is Iowa's leading rebounder at 10 boards per contest. Her 18 rebounds against Central Michigan Nov. 21 are the most for any Big Ten player this season.

WINNING WITH DEFENSE

The Hawkeyes currently lead the Big Ten in field goal percentage defense (.338) and rank third in scoring defense (56.3).

Last year through seven games, Iowa's field goal percentage defense was at .384 and the Hawkeyes were allowing 63.7 points per game.

AT THE CHARITY STRIPE

Iowa is currently tied for first in the Big Ten with a .798 free throw percentage. Jaime Printy leads the league at .960 (24-25) and Kachine Alexander is 11th at .815 (44-54). Four Hawkeyes have already attempted 20 or more free throws.

The Hawkeyes went a combined 41-46 from the charity stripe at the Caribbean Challenge. Iowa was 27-30 against James Madison and 14-16 vs. Virginia Tech.

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her 11th season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 27th season as a college head coach. She is a three-time Big Ten and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year.

Bluder, 47, has a career record of 552-265 (.676), including a 196-123 (.614) record at Iowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose.

Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to nine post-season tournaments (7 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and seven upper-division finishes in the Big Ten Conference, including winning a share of the league championship in 2008 and tying for second place in 2009.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the *Women's Basketball News Service* and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to their first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. In 2004-05, Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and was the last Division I undefeated team standing. In 2005-06, Bluder mentored a team plagued by injuries to a fifth-place Big Ten finish and an NCAA Tournament berth.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in her last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons, building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

MOVING UP CAREER CHARTS

- Four Hawkeyes are currently working their way up the career records lists at Iowa.
- Kachine Alexander ranks 11th in career rebounding (685), 16th in career assists (250) and 30th in career scoring. She needs just seven more rebounds to move past Lisa Becker for 10th place on the rebounding list and three assists to move past Kristi Faulkner for 15th on the assists list.
 - Morgan Johnson ranks sixth in career blocks (93) and needs just two more to move past Jamie Cavey into fifth place.
 - Kamille Wahlin ranks seventh in career three-pointers made (124) and needs just two more to move past Johanna Solverson into sixth place.
 - Jaime Printy ranks 11th in career three-pointers made (97) and needs 12 more to move past Jenna Armstrong and into the top 10 of the list.

ALEXANDER NAMED CO-BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Kachine Alexander was named co-Big Ten Player of the Week Nov. 22 for her efforts against Bradley, Northeastern and Central Michigan. Alexander shared the weekly honor with Northwestern's Amy Jaeschke.

Alexander collected double-doubles in each of Iowa's three games and earned MVP honors at the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge.

Alexander's first double-double of the season came against Bradley, recording 14 points and 10 rebounds. Alexander was 8-10 from the free throw line and also had five assists and three steals.

Alexander started the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge with 21 points and 12 rebounds in a win over Northeastern, adding six assists, two steals and a block.

She wrapped up the tournament MVP award with 20 points and 18 rebounds against Central Michigan in the championship.

Alexander has now been named Big Ten Player of the Week five times in her career. She was a two-time award winner as both a sophomore and junior.

HAWKEYES LAND ON ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAMS

Senior Kachine Alexander was named MVP of both the Islander Tip-Off Tournament and the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge. Kamille Wahlin was named to the all-tournament team at both the Islander Tip-Off Tournament and the Caribbean Challenge. Morgan Johnson earned a spot on the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge all-tournament team.

SUCCESS UNDER BLUDER

Last year marked the seventh time in 10 seasons under Head Coach Lisa Bluder that Iowa has been selected for the NCAA Tournament, including each of the last three seasons. The Hawkeyes have participated in postseason play in all but one season under Bluder (two WNIT appearances).

In addition, Iowa finished with a winning record for the ninth time in 10 seasons under Bluder. Iowa's third place finish in the Big Ten is also the seventh time under Bluder the Hawkeyes recorded an upper-division finish in the conference.

Iowa also tallied its fifth 20-win season under Bluder, including each of the last three seasons.

ALEXANDER ON WATCH LISTS

Senior Kachine Alexander has been named to the watch lists for the Wade Trophy, the Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy. The "Wade Watch" List is made up of the top 25 preseason women's basketball players, the Wooden Award includes 30 student-athletes and the Naismith Trophy watch list is made up of 50 players.

The Wade Trophy, Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy are considered the three most prestigious awards in NCAA women's college basketball.

Alexander is also one of 30 Division I women's basketball players nationally to be selected as a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible, the candidates must show excellence in four categories: community, classroom, character and competition.

KASH IN THE BANK

- As a 5-9 guard, junior Kachine Alexander ranked second in the Big Ten and 23rd nationally with 10.4 rebounds per game last season.
- Alexander claimed the Big Ten rebounding title, averaging 11.1 boards per game in league games.
- Alexander was the top rebounding guard in the country under 5-10, and was one of only two guards in the entire country to average a double-double (16 points, 10.4 rebounds per game). She was also one of only three Big Ten players to average a double-double, with the other two being post players.
- Alexander had 15 double-doubles this season and has 24 in her career, which ties Amy Herzig for fourth most in school history.
- Alexander scored double figures in 22 of 27 games played, including eight 20-plus point performances. She had 10 or more rebounds in 17 of those games, with an impressive 10 games with 12 or more boards.
- Alexander averaged more rebounds than nine of the 10 players selected to the Division I State Farm Coaches' all-America Team. She averaged the same amount of rebounds (10.4) as Nebraska's Kelsey Griffin.
- Alexander had more double-doubles than seven all-Americans, despite playing between 12 and 14 fewer games than most of the honorees.

LEADING THE LEAGUE

Several Hawkeyes led the Big Ten in different statistical categories (both overall and league games only) last season.

- Junior Kachine Alexander claimed the Big Ten rebounding crown, averaging 11.1 boards per contest in league games. She also finished first in defensive rebounds (8.12 per game), in Big Ten games only. Alexander led the entire conference in offensive rebounds for all games (3.11).
- Sophomore Kamille Wahlin led the conference in three-pointers made per game for overall games (2.55) and league games only (2.59).
- Freshman Morgan Johnson led the Big Ten in field goal percentage, in conference games (.508).
- As a team, the Hawkeyes led the conference in free throw percentage (.771) and three-pointers made per game (7.91). In Big Ten games only, Iowa led the league in three-pointers made per game (7.72).

INIURY UPDATE

Iowa sophomores Theairra Taylor and Trisha Nesbitt are both sidelined with injuries.

Taylor suffered her third ACL tear in the last 20 months during preseason practice and will miss the entire season.

Nesbitt partially ruptured the plantar fascia in her right foot and will be out indefinitely. A timetable for Nesbitt's return has not been established.

TOUGH SCHEDULE IN 10-11

Iowa's schedule features 15 opponents who participated in postseason play last year (nine NCAA teams, five WNIT teams and one WBI team). The Hawkeyes will take on six 2010 NCAA Tournament teams before conference play.

Seven of Iowa's 12 non-conference games will be on the road, including two neutral site games at the Islander Tip-Off Tournament (Corpus Christi, TX) and the Caribbean Challenge (Cancun, Mexico). The Hawkeyes will also face South Dakota State, North Carolina and Drake on the road.

WELCOME ABOARD

Iowa has two new faces on its roster this year in Jade Rogers and Kalli Hansen.

Rogers is from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and prepped at Cedar Rapids Kennedy High School. She was a four-time all-state selection, including first team honors as a sophomore, junior and senior. She was also a four-time first team all-metro, all-district and all-conference pick. Rogers was a two-time conference Player of the Year and was also the metro Player of the Year as a senior.

Hansen is from Olin, Iowa and spent the last two years at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids. She helped lead Kirkwood to back-to-back NJCAA national championships. Kirkwood compiled an impressive 75-2 record during her two seasons. She was a first team All-American and all-region selection while at Kirkwood.

Mediacom will televise four Iowa home games, including Nov. 7 vs. Concordia-St. Paul (1 p.m.), Nov. 16 vs. Bradley (5 p.m.), Dec. 9 vs. Iowa State (7 p.m.) and Dec. 22 vs. Northern Iowa (7 p.m.).

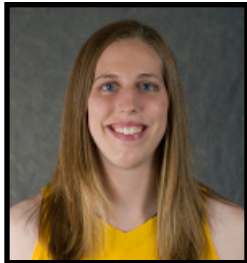
