The University of Iowa (4-0, 0-0) wrestling team faces Michigan State (2-3, 0-1) on Saturday at 7 p.m. (CT) on Mediacom Mat at Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,077).

Admission is \$12 for adults and \$8 for youth (high school age and younger).

THE SERIES

lowa leads the all-time series, 36-15-2, and has won the last six meetings, including a 41-0 win in lowa City last season. The Hawkeyes have won the last six meetings by an average of 23.8 points.

lowa has won 15 straight meetings against the Spartans at home. Michigan State's last win in lowa City was a 20-13 decision in 1970. The teams tied, 16-16, in 1974 in lowa City. The only other tie in series history was in 1973, 19-19. Since those consecutive ties, the Hawkeyes have won 30-of-32 meetings.

Michigan State's last win was a 19-17 win on Feb. 5, 2006, in East Lansing, Michigan.

BIG TEN OPENERS

Saturday is Iowa's Big Ten opener. The Hawkeyes have won 16 straight conference openers since losing to Penn State, 25-17, at home in 1997-98.

SORENSEN WINS HOME OPENER

Redshirt freshman Brandon Sorensen won his Carver-Hawkeye Arena debut on Nov. 29, defeating Iowa State's Gabe Moreno, 7-6. Moreno was a NCAA qualifier and Big 12 runner-up in 2014. The win pushed Sorensen into the ranking for the first time in his career. He is ranked No. 11 by Intermat and No. 16 by WIN Magazine.

Sorensen is 10-1 overall with three pins, two major decisions and one technical fall. His only loss this season was a 3-2 decision to Brody Grothus in the Luther Open semifinals.

7-FOR-7

Senior Bobby Telford has seven wins by fall against seven opponents this year. He also has a win via medical forfeit.

Telford has 26 career pins, nearing his single-season high of nine set as a redshirt freshman in 2011-12.

A LITTLE EXTRA FROM BROOKS

Sophomore Sammy Brooks won for the seventh time this season, all bonus-point wins, when he recorded his first major decision of the season over No. 18 Lelund Weatherspoon of Iowa State. Brooks entered the Iowa State dual with three pins and three technical falls.

Brooks is 8-0 overall including a win via medical forfeit. He has won 10 in a row dating back to last season.

KELLY RETURNS TO 157

Senior Michael Kelly is 9-0 with four falls this season at 157 pounds.

Kelly has a 31-3 career mark at 157, including an 18-1 record competing unattached in 2010-11. He was 5-1 as a redshirt freshman, and wrestled his entire sophomore campaign at 149. He wrestled at 157 once last year, falling to Indiana's sixthranked Taylor Walsh.

The veteran has 36 career dual starts under his belt, the fourth most on the team.

BRANDS GETS WIN NO. 150

The Hawkeyes' 11th straight win over Iowa State was Tom Brands' 150th career win at Iowa. He is 150-15-1 (.910) in eight-plus seasons as Iowa's head coach. Only Dave McCuskey (160) and Dan Gable (355) have more dual wins at Iowa.

UNDEFEATED ALL-AMERICANS

Iowa's four returning All-Americans -- Cory Clark (125), Mike Evans (174), Nathan Burak (197), and Bobby Telford (285) -- are a combined 28-0 this season with 17 pins.

Telford and Clark are both 8-0. Telford has seven pins and one win via medial forfeit. Clark has pinned six of his eight opponents. Evans has six wins by bonus points and a decision over a top 10 opponent.

Burak was 4-0 with one pin, one major decision, and one technical fall at the Luther Open, but he has not seen action since due to injury.

The Hawkeyes have crowned at least one All-American every year since 1972, a span of 43 seasons. Iowa has totaled 261 All-America honors during that stretch. The Hawkeyes crowned six All-Americans in 2014, including four-time All-American Derek St. John (157) and first-timers Clark (125) and Burak (197). Tony Ramos earned his third career All-America honor, winning the 133-pound bracket, and Evans (174) and Telford (285) were both named All-Americans for the second time in their careers.

40 YEARS SINCE NO. 1

Iowa will celebrate the 40th anniversary of its first national championship on Friday, Jan. 23, at 7 p.m. against Northwestern.

Gary Kurdelmeier led Iowa to its first NCAA Championship in 1975, and in the 40 years since, the Hawkeyes have accumulated 23 team titles, more than any other school -- Oklahoma State (7), Penn State (4), Minnesota (3), Iowa State (2), and Arizona State (1).

THE ATTENDANCE GAME

In 2013-14, the University of Iowa wrestling program led the nation in attendance for the eighth consecutive season according to the annual Division I attendance report released March 4 by Roby Publishing.

lowa averaged 8,835 fans in seven duals, setting an NCAA single season attendance record of 61,843. The Hawkeyes averaged at least 8,000 fans for the sixth consecutive season, and own the three highest single season averages in NCAA history (9,014 in 2012; 8,764 in 2013).

In 2013-14, lowa became the first school in NCAA history to host three duals with more than 10,000 fans -- Penn State (13,747), Minnesota (10,588), and Oklahoma State (10,141).

When considering the Iowa City Duals -- which Iowa hosted Nov. 22 against Baker, Cornell College, and Iowa Central -- a school record 67,556 fans attended wrestling meets inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

NCAA EXPERIENCE

The Hawkeyes have seven wrestlers with NCAA Championships experience. Seniors Mike Evans (174) and Bobby Telford (285) are three-time NCAA qualifiers. Telford earned All-America honors in 2012 and 2014, while Evans earned All-America honors in 2013 and 2014. Junior Nathan Burak (197) and sophomore Cory Clark (125) also advanced to the All-America stand in 2014. Burak was making his second NCAA tournament appearance, while Clark was making his first. Senior Nick Moore (165) has competed in two NCAA Championships (2013, 2014), and last year senior Josh Dziewa (141) and junior Brody Grothus (149) made their first career appearances.

TICKET INFORMATION

Season and single dual tickets are now available for purchase on <u>hawkeyesports.</u> com. Season tickets for eight home dates are available for \$95. UI students and kids five-years old and younger are admitted free to all wrestling events.

Single dual tickets are \$12 for duals against Michigan State (Dec. 6), Illinois (Jan. 16), Northwestern (Jan. 23), and Michigan (Feb. 13).

Adult tickets are \$15 for Virginia (Feb. 15) -- Iowa's opening round opponent of the Cliff Keen National Duals.

Youth tickets (18 and younger) are \$8 for single duals.

Tickets to the second round of the Cliff Keen National Duals (Feb. 21-22) -- featuring eight teams and three rounds of competition -- are \$10 for Saturday's quarterfinals and semifinals, and \$20 for Sunday's final round.

HAWKEYE WRESTLING HISTORY

lowa's overall dual meet record is 945-224-31 (.799) in 105 seasons. The Hawkeyes have won 23 national titles and 34 Big Ten titles. Iowa's 53 NCAA Champions have won a total of 81 NCAA individual titles, crowning six three-time and 16 two-time champions. The Hawkeyes' 110 Big Ten champions have combined for 191 conference titles. There have been seven four-time, 18 three-time, and 29 two-time Iowa winners. Iowa's 150 All-Americans have earned All-America status 307 times, including 18 four-time, 32 three-time and 39 two-time honorees.

CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA

The Hawkeyes are 4-0 inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena this season and have a 217-21 all-time record since at home since Carver started hosting wrestling duals in 1983. The Hawkeyes have recorded 20 undefeated season in Carver-Hawkeye Arena, the most recent in 2012-13 (9-0).

Carver-Hawkeye Arena has hosted three Big Ten Championships (1983, 1994, 2005) and four NCAA Championships (1986, 1991, 1995, 2001). The Hawkeyes have won five tournament titles on their home mat, including the 1983 and 1994 Big Ten Championships, and the 1986, 1991 and 1995 NCAA Championships.

On February 21-22, 2015, Carver-Hawkeye Arena will host the National Duals for the third time (1998, 1999).

BTN TO TELEVISE NATIONAL DUALS

The National Wrestling Coaches Association reached an agreement with the Big Ten Network to televise the Cliff Keen National Duals Tournament in Iowa City, Iowa, on Feb. 21-22.

Tom Brands Head Coach (University of Iowa, 1992)

Three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year Tom Brands completed his eighth season as head wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. A 1996 Olympic gold medalist and member of wrestling's Hall of Fame, Brands is only the eighth wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. The former Hawkeye wrestler was a four-time All-American and three-time national champion (1989-92) at Iowa. He has a 150-15-1 (.910) overall and 58-6 (.906) Big Ten coaching record at Iowa, and a 167-35-1 (.822) career mark.

In eight seasons as Iowa's head coach, Brands has led the Hawkeyes to three NCAA and Big Ten team titles, crowning nine NCAA champions, 11 Big Ten champions and 44 All-Americans. Iowa has honored 61 academic all-Big Ten recipients, including a school-record 12 in 2011-12. The Hawkeyes have qualified 72 wrestlers for the NCAA Championships in the last eight years, sending the entire 10-man line-

up in 2009, 2010, and 2014. Iowa has also won or shared six of the last seven Big Ten regular season titles. During Brands' tenure, Iowa set school records for longest dual unbeaten (84) and winning streaks (69), longest dual road unbeaten (51) and winning streaks (44), most Carver-Hawkeye Arena victories (11) and most dual shutouts (8).

lowa also made another entry in the record books, setting the then-national collegiate dual meet attendance record of 15,955 when lowa defeated lowa State, 20-15, on Dec. 6, 2008, at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. lowa has led the nation in attendance in each of Brands' eight seasons, setting an NCAA all-time attendance average of 9,014 in 2011-12.

Brands was named 2008 NWCA Coach of the Year after leading the Hawkeyes to their first NCAA team title since 2000 and their first Big Ten team title since 2004. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009 and 2010, becoming the first coach in conference history to earn the honor in three consecutive seasons.

Brands served as head coach at Virginia Tech University for two seasons (2005-06), recording a 17-20 dual mark. In his first season with the Hokies, Brands led the team to the 2005 regular season Atlantic Coast Conference title, set a school record for dual meet wins (16) and had a school-record five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships. During his tenure, Virginia Tech crowned five ACC champions and had two All-Americans. Senior heavyweight Mike Faust was named 2006 ACC Wrestler of the Year.

Prior to taking the helm at Virginia Tech, Brands was an assistant coach at Iowa for 12 seasons (1993-2004). He helped the Hawkeyes to a 177-27 dual record, seven NCAA and eight Big Ten team titles, while crowning 23 NCAA champions, 73 All-Americans and 36 Big Ten champions. He was named the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000

Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

In 2004, he was one of three coaches for the U.S. Olympic freestyle wrestling team, participating in Athens. Brands also served as assistant coach for the 2002 and 2003 U.S. Freestyle World Teams, earning Freestyle Coach of the Year honors from USA Wrestling both years. He was also a member of the U.S. coaching staff at the 2001 World Championships, and has coached a number of other U.S. teams in international competition.

As a competitor, Brands won the 1996 Olympic freestyle gold medal at 136.5 pounds in Atlanta, GA. He also won a gold medal at the 1993 World Freestyle Championships in Toronto, two World Cup gold medals (1994, 1995) and was the 1995 Pan American Games champion. He won four U.S. National titles (1993-96) and made four straight U.S. World or Olympic teams (1993-96). Along with his twin brother, Terry, Tom was named 1993 USA Wrestling Athlete of the Year, the 1993 John Smith Outstanding Freestyle Wrestler, and 1993 Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year. He was inducted into wrestling's Hall of Fame in 2001.

Brands was a four-time All-American at Iowa (1989-92). During his Hawkeye career, he won three NCAA titles and was named Outstanding Wrestler of the 1992 NCAA Championships. Also a three-time Big Ten champion, Brands won 95 percent of his matches at Iowa. His career mark of 158-7-2 includes an undefeated season in 1991 (45-0).

The Sheldon, Iowa, native was born April 9, 1968. He earned his B.S. degree in physical education from Iowa in 1992. He and his wife, Jeni, have three children, Madigan, Kinsee and Tommy.
