HAWKEYES SPLIT FOUR GAME SERIES WITH HOO-SIERS -- The Hawkeyes won the first and third games of the weekend series with Indiana at Sembower Field in Bloomington.

In the opener, Iowa got a superb outing from senior starter Nathan Johnson and came away with a 7-3 victory. Johnson gave up three runs on five hits in the opening two frames, but settled down to dominate the Hoosier batters. The senior struck out a career-high 14 batters and allowed no runs and scattered three hits over the final seven innings.

In the fifth inning, Iowa scored three runs to take a 5-3 lead. Freshman Jason White provided the Hawkeyes with some instant offense as he lifted a two-run shot over the right field fence.

On Saturday, Iowa scored three runs in the top of the seventh inning to take a 4-2 lead. With two runners on base and the Hawkeyes trailing by one run, White hit a sharp single through the middle to tie the game. After an Andy Lytle single, senior Jim Reid came up with the clutch two-out single to give Iowa the 4-2 advantage.

Indiana put together a late inning rally of its own in the bottom of the inning against Iowa closer Tim Gudex. The Hoosiers got three straight hits to start the inning and Ryan Parker hit a game-winning single to right field to drive in the winning run.

The final two contests of the weekend turned into slug fests. The Hawkeyes scored a season-high 12 runs and came away with the 12-7 victory. Kris Welker went 2-for-3 in the game with a solo home run.

With Iowa looking to win its first series of the season, the Hoosier bats awoke and pounded out 22 hits in the 25-9 victory. Indiana smacked seven homeruns on the day, including a grand slam by Reggie Watson.

Jack Dahm enters his first season as Iowa's head baseball coach and has a 283-276 career record. Prior to coming to Iowa, Dahm spent 10 years as the Head Coach at Creighton University, where he is the school's all-time winningest coach. Dahm also played for four years for the Bluejays under current Chicago Cubs General Manager Jim Hendry.

Assistant Coach **Nick Zumsande** is in his first season as Iowa's pitching coach after collecting 14 years of coaching experience throughout the Midwest. Prior to joining the Hawkeyes, Zumsande served as the pitching coach for Indiana State. Before joining the Sycamores, Zumsande coached for one year at Iowa State University where he helped lead the team to their first Big 12 Tournament appearance in school history.

Assistant Coach **Ryan Brownlee** is in his first season as Iowa's hitting/fielding instructor and recruiting coordinator. Prior to coming to Iowa, Brownlee was the hitting/fielding coach at James Madison University, where he led the Dukes to school records in fielding percentage. Before going to JMU, Brownlee served as an assistant at his alma mater, Evansville.

Volunteer Assistant Coach **Spencer Allen** is in his first season with the Hawkeyes. Allen will coach first base during game days and is responsible for outfield instruction. Allen earned his B.A. in 2001 from Iowa State, where he was a three-year starter at second base.

HAWKEYES SCORE SEASON-HIGH IN RUNS -- Iowa scored a season-high 12 runs in the second game of the doubleheader last Saturday against Indiana. In the game, the Hawkeyes scored five runs in the third inning and four in the fourth.

The five runs is the most the team has scored in one frame since scoring six runs in one inning against Stetson in Florida. The nine runs is the most the squad has scored in back-to-back innings this season.

SHAKIN' THINGS UP -- For the first time in since March 17, 2002, the regular Hawkeye starting shortstop, Jeff Gremley wasn't in the line-up. In the first two games of the series, freshman Jason White got the nod at short. Gremley had started all but two games in his career.

Andy Lytle, who has hit primarily in the bottom of the order, moved to the lead-off spot all weekend and started two games at second and third base.

WELK'S BAT COMES ALIVE -- Junior Kris Welker was the Hawkeyes' best hitter in the four-game set with Indiana last weekend. Welker, who was a perfect 4-for-4 in the finale, raised his batting average .61 points after batting .600 (9-15) with five RBIs and four runs scored. The catcher had three extra base hits (2 doubles, 1 HR) with a .933 slugging percentage.

Welker, who batted in the clean-up slot the final three games, is tied for fifth with a .271 average on the season. He has 13 RBIs, four doubles, one home run and is leading Big Ten with 12 HBP.

REID TAKES ADVANTAGE OF PT -- Fifth-year senior Jim Reid was inserted into the line-up in the fourth inning on Friday night and never relinquished his spot in the order the rest of the weekend.

Reid, who won the Iowa batting title as a sophomore with a .338 average, is leading the team with a .357 average on the season. Reid started the final two games as the DH and finished the weekend going 6-15 (.400). Five of his six hits went for extra bases (three doubles, two triples) and he crossed the plate seven times. The two triples is the most in conference games this season.

HOME RUN TOTAL DOUBLES AT SEMBOWER -- The Hawkeyes entered the weekend series at Sembower Field with four long balls thru 28 games, but the short confines and strong winds helped Iowa hit four home runs in four games.

Jesse Brownell hit his team-leading third home run, while Gabe Haugland, Jason White and Kris Welker each tallied thier first career homer in Black and Gold. Haugland's was the first hit of his career.

THE HAWKEYE WORKHORSE -- Senior Nathan Johnson struck out a career-high 14 batters against the Hoosiers after throwing 146 pitches. Johnson allowed three runs, two unearned, on five hits in the first two frames. After settling down, Johnson scattered three hits over the final seven innings to pick up his third win of the season.

Johnson has been the Hawkeyes' most reliable starter this season. He has a 49-11 K/BB ratio in 54 2/3 innings pitched with a respectable 3.95 ERA in nine starts.
