Sembower Field - Bloomington, IN April 16-18 (Three-Game Series)



THE SETTING:

After a mid-week win, the Hawkeyes will travel this weekend to Bloomington, IN, to take on Indiana in a three-game series. After winning its first Big Ten series since 2008 against Illinois last week, Iowa looks to continue improving its conference standing this weekend. The Hawkeyes have notched nine wins in its last 13 games. The series starts Friday at 2:05 p.m. (CST) and will continue throughout the weekend.

ON THE NET:

lowa baseball fans can follow the Hawkeyes, as live stats will be available on hawkeyesports.com. Just click on the Gametracker link found on both the front page and the baseball schedule page. Whistlin' Ray Gilmore enters his 33rd season with the Hawkeye baseball program and will be posting the stats.

ON THE RADIO:

Hawkeye fans can catch this weekend's games on AM-800 KXIC. The Voice of the Hawkeyes, Brent Balbinot, will handle the play-by-play. Ray Gilmore is slated to provide expert analysis.

The three-game Indiana series will be broadcast on the radio and online.

SCOUTING INDIANA:

The Hoosiers are 16-15, with a 5-3 home record. Indiana is coming off an 11-2 victory over Valparaiso Tuesday.

Indiana's offense is led by Jerrud Sabourin. and Alex Dickerson. The duo is hitting over .400, has compiled nearly 70 runs scored between them, as well as 20 doubles and home runs, and nearly 80 RBI. Dickerson has a whopping .815 slugging percentage.

The Hoosier pitching staff is led by starter Drew Leininger. The southpaw boasts a Big Ten-best 1.38 ERA and a team-best five wins. He leads the team in innings pitched (52.1) and strikeouts (28). Closer Chris Squires has five saves with 16 appearances and a 3.20 ERA.

TOSSING A COMPLETE ONE:

Southpaw **Jarred Hippen** went the extra mile last Friday against Michigan State. The starter tossed a complete game, the first of his career and earned the victory.

Hippen allowed three runs off seven hits and striking out two. The last Hawkeye to throw a complete nine was Nate Johnson in 2004.

McCOOL DOMINATES BIG TEN:

Zach McCool has had stellar performances in Big Ten play for Iowa, both at Michigan State and against Illinois.

In conference play, the junior leads the league in batting average (.632) and on base percentage (.650). He also is second in slugging percentage (.842) and hits (12).

BLASER IS RED HOT:

Redshirt junior **Tyson Blaser** has gone 7-for-14 in the past four games for the Hawkeyes. In those four games, he has a .571 slugging percentage and a .588 on base percentage. With a stolen base, two walks, a hit by pitch and a sacrifice bunt.

HAWKEYES ARE HOT IN THE FIRST:

Iowa has scored runs in the first frame in five straight contests. After posting three in Tuesday's win, Iowa has outscored opponents 33-13 in the first this season.

TAKING A SERIES:

lowa took two from Illinois last weekend at Duane Banks Field. The series win was the first for the Hawkeyes since 2008 (against Indiana).

After dropping the Friday night game, 9-8, the Hawkeyes came back strong Saturday and Sunday to win 6-4 and 4-2, respectively.

SAVING TWO:

Closer **Kevin Lee** picked up saves number five and six against the Illini. The righty appeared twice, pitching two innings allowing one run on two hits to seal the victories for lowa.

Lee leads the league with his six saves and is tied for first in conference saves, with two.

BROWN STARTS AND WINS:

Sophomore **Nick Brown** got his second start of the year, first conference start, against Illinois Saturday. Brown went eight innings, allowing three earned runs on six hits with two strikeouts.

The 'W' was Brown's second on the year.

SCHREIBER TOSSES GEM:

Sophomore **Phil Schreiber** picked up is teambest third win Sunday.

Despite a rough second inning, the righty bowed his neck and went a career-long eight innings. Allowing only two runs, one earned, on five hits and striking out three. Schreiber allowed only three base runners the final six innings he pitched.

SOLID OUTING BY Z-ROB:

Senior hurler **Zach Robertson** had a great outing against Milwaukee Tuesday. The lefty went a scheduled five innings, allowing no runs on four hits with three strikeouts and no walks. Panthers were hitting just .222 off him. Robertson left the game with a 3-0 lead, but Milwaukee tied it up and he got a no decision.

HAWKEYE BULLPEN NOTE:

In lowa's mid-week win, **Patrick Schatz** and **Zach Kenyon** had great outings. Schatz picked up his first win of the season, going two innings and allowing just one hit, no runs and striking out one. Kenyon went four innings, allowing one hit and striking out three.

STREAKING HAWKEYES:

Zach McCool leads lowa with a six-game hit streak intact going into the series against Indiana. **Tyson Blaser** currently has collected a hit in four consecutive contests.

Muller and McQuillan lead Iowa with 12 multi-hit games and Durant has a team-best seven multi-RBI games.

BIG TEN OPENER VICTORY:

With a gem of a pitching performance from **Jarred Hippen**, Iowa picked up its first conference-opening win since a 9-5 triumph over Michigan in 2003.

Besides that, lowa had won six of its last seven games and snapped Michigan State's 11-game win streak.

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

- **1. Nick Brown** got his first conference start last weekend. He notched a win, going eight solid innings.
- 2. As a team, lowa stole eight bases in the last four games. **Kurtis Muller** has 17 on the season and ranks 22nd in stolen bags per game.
- **3. Kevin Lee** picked up two saves against Illinois last weekend. He ranks 17th nationally in saves.

WHERE THE HAWKEYES RANK:

Kurtis Muller ranks sixth in on base percentage (.478) and fifth in stolen bases (17). **Mike McQuillan** ranks fourth in sac bunts (4) and **Sean Flanagan** ranks third in hit by pitches (6).

Jarred Hippen ranks sixth in ERA (3.17)m second in innings pitched (54), eighth in batters struck out (39) and first in games started (8). Phil Schreiber ranks 10th in opposing batting average (.263) and first in games started (8). Kevin Lee is first in the league with six saves and ranks fifth in games finished (9).

Muller is tied for first in fielding percentage (1.000) and **Phil Keppler** ranks ninth in put outs (136).

THREE-GAME SWEEP:

The Hawkeyes swept Western Illinois in three in their home opening series. With two come from behind ninth inning thrillers the Hawkeyes got their first sweep since 2007. (lowa swept Indiana in a three-game home series.)

In the series, **Kurtis Muller** went a stellar 5-for-11 with five runs scored, three RBI and a perfect 6-for-6 on the base path.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

lowa leads the all-time series with Indiana, 74-55. The last time lowa was in Bloomington, IN, they came out with a series win-- winning three of the four games.

Last season, the Hoosiers swept lowa in a three-game series at Duane Banks Field.

2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:

Three Hawkeyes were drafted in the Major League Baseball's 2009 First-Year Player Draft. Right-handed fireballer **Steve Turnbull**, lefty relief pitcher **Kyle Heim** and closer **Mike Schurz** all signed contracts in June. Three-time all-Big Ten selection **Justin Toole** later signed a free agent contract.

Other draftees included current lowa freshmen: **Matt Dermody** and **Dan Sheppard**.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



DAHM AT IOWA

In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the lowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections,

including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, lowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.


SLUGGING A SCHOOL RECORD:

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM:

With a 2-1 record, lowa had several quality performances in Florida (Feb. 26-28). Sophomore pitcher **Jarred Hippen** and senior outfielder **Ryan Durant**, however, were the two Hawkeyes to earn second team all-tournament honors by **collegebaseball360.com**.

Hippen got his first win of the year, by-way of an eight and two-third innings performance with eight Ks and only one walk. Durant went 6-for-11 with a double, homer and six RBI.

RBI ALERT:

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** drove in seven RBI to lead Iowa to victory over Illinois State Feb. 22. The RBI total is the most since Dallas Burke drove in six against Minnesota on May 2, 2009. Seven RBI also ties for the conference's game-high this year. (Tying two other Big Ten players.)

THE UNITY COUNCIL:

Senior Michael Jacobs, red shirt junior Tyson Blaser, junior Kurtis Muller, sophomore Patrick Brennan and freshman Dan Sheppard.

RETURNING DEPTH:

Despite losing several key players from 2009, the Hawkeyes have a lot of experience returning. Returning lettermen in the outfield include: Ryan Durant, Phil Keppler, Kurtis Muller, Jeff Pacha and Trevor Willis.

The infield returns: Tyson Blaser, Dallas Burke, Andrew Ewing, Sean Flanagan, Zach McCool, Mike McQuillan and Chett Zeise.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach Jack Dahm is assisted by coach Ryan Brownlee and coach Chris Maliszewski, along with volunteer coach Zach Dillon.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks then the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin" Ray Gilmore, who serves as lowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for lowa Baseball.

lowa Head Baseball Coach Jack Dahm has announced that Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski and Taylor Zeutenhorst have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler and Aaron Smit intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.
