As we finish the first half and begin the second half of conference play, it is critical that we stay focused on raising our level of play and then maintaining that with consistent effort and execution."

IOWA ON THE BTN

The 2009 Hawkeyes will make two appearances on the Big Ten Network this season. Iowa opened the Big Ten season on the Big Ten Network with a 3-1 win at Wisconsin, Sept. 23. The rematch between the Hawkeyes and Badgers, Wednesday, Nov. 11, will be broadcast live from Carver-Hawkeye Arena at 7 p.m.

SCHIPPER CLIMBS THE CHARTS

Senior **Megan Schipper** became the 16th player in program history to record 1,000 career kills in Iowa's 3-1 win at Wisconsin (9/23). The Hawkeye captain currently ranks 13th on Iowa's all-time list with 1,070 career kills. She picked up her 200th kill of the 2009 season in Iowa's 3-0 win over 18th-ranked Michigan State (10/11). Schipper has collected at least 300 kills in each of the previous two seasons, including 2007, when she led the Hawkeyes with 309 kills as a sophomore. The Aplington native tallied a career-high 345 kills in 2008, the second-highest total on the team (Catherine Smale, 380). This season, Schipper leads Iowa with 3.29 kills per set.

MEISTER DIGS DEFENSE

Senior libero **Christina Meister** ranks second in the Big Ten with 4.43 digs per set. Since 1990, only three Hawkeyes have averaged more than four digs per set through an entire season: Pam Kavadas, 5.22 ('04); Emily Hiza, 4.74 ('06) and 4.52 ('07); Janet Moylan, 4.63 ('90).

KRIEGER KITTLE REACHES CENTURY MARK

Freshman **Emma Krieger Kittle** reached the 100-kill plateau Oct. 17 at Purdue. The freshman has totaled 106 kills this season and averages 1.96 kills per set in conference play, third best among Hawkeyes. Other Hawkeyes to record at least 100 kills as freshmen include **Megan Schipper** (189, '06), **Aimee Huffman** (192, '07) and **Megan Eskew** (163, '07).

KRIEGER KITTLE VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

Competition can bring out the best in people, just ask freshman **Emma Krieger Kittle.** The lowa City native recorded a career-high 12 kills vs. 11th-ranked lowa State (9/11) and has collected 41 of her 106 kills in lowa's five games vs. ranked opponents, averaging 2.16 kills per set.

HIT IT AND WIN IT

The Hawkeyes are 10-0 when attacking at a higher percentage than their opponent this season. Conversely, lowa's opponent has hit a higher percentage in each of the Hawkeyes' 10 losses.

Head Coach Sharon Dingman



Sharon Dingman was hired as the eighth coach in Iowa volleyball history March 21, 2008.

The second-year head Hawkeye owns a career record of 359-240 (18 years) after leading lowa to its most successful campaign in eight seasons in 2008. The Hawkeyes' 14 overall victories and six conference wins were the most by an lowa Volleyball team

since 2000.

Dingman also reached a personal milestone in her inagural Hawkeye season, recording career victory No. 350 November 14 in a five-set victory over Northwestern.

Iowa re-established a home-court advantage in Dingman's first season, posting its first winning season at North Carver since 1998 and setting a program attendance record.

Dingman came to lowa after serving as head coach at Illinois State from 2000-07, where she compiled a 147-98 record. In 2007, Dingman led the Redbirds to their first at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament since 1997. Illinois State reached the championship match of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and finished with a 21-12 overall record.

Illinois State produced winning seasons in seven of the eight seasons under Dingman and never finished lower than fifth in the Missouri Valley Conference. Dingman produced 21 all-Missouri Valley Conference selections, including Player of the Year, Libero of the Year and two Freshman of the Year honorees.

Redbird teams under Dingman were also strong in the classroom. Eleven players were named to the league's scholar-athlete squad in her eight seasons. In 2004, four volleyball student-athletes earned perfect 4.00 grade-point-averages and the team recorded a 3.32 GPA.

Dingman started her head coaching career in 1991 at Auburn, where she led the Tigers to a 22-13 record in her only season at the helm. Her 1991 squad become the first Auburn volleyball tem to receive votes in the national poll and Auburn's fourth place finish in the SEC that season marked the highest finish ever for Auburn at the time.

She then moved to Butler in 1992, where she served as head coach for eight seasons. Dingman led the Bulldogs to four 20 win seasons and three postseason tournaments, including an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1997 after capturing the Midwestern Collegiate Conference title. She was named MCC Coach of the Year in 1997 after compiling a 28-7 record.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Dingman spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at three Division I programs. After one season at Northern Michigan (1984), she assisted at Texas Tech for three seasons (1985-87). Dingman then spent three seasons at Kentucky (1988-90) and helped the Wildcats to an SEC Championship in 1988 along with three-straight regional finals appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

NORTHWESTERN

The Wildcats are led by 10th-year Head Coach Keylor Chan and libero Kate Nolio, Northwestern's all-time leader in digs. The senior needs seven digs to become the first player in program history to reach 2,000 career digs. Northwestern leads the all-time series, 32-25-1. Iowa won both meetings in 2008, including a 3-1 victory in Iowa City.

ILLINOIS

The Fighting Illini are led by first-year Head Coach Kevin Hambly and libero Ashley Edinger. The senior earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors after averaging 6.3 digs per set against Northwestern and Minnesota. Illinois leads the all-time series, 45-13. The Hawkeyes were swept by the Fighing Illini last season and have not defeated Illinois since winning 3-0 at Illinois in 2005. Iowa's last win over the Illini in Iowa City was a 3-1 victory in 2002.

IOWA IN THE ATTENDANCE GAME

lowa ranks 30th in national attendance, averaging 1,267 fans per game. lowa opened the season (Sept. 11) vs. lowa State in front of 2,111 fans, the second-largest crowd in program history (2,191 vs. Wisconsin, 10/13/07).

HAWKEYE CAPTAINS

Senior outside hitter **Megan Schipper** and junior setter **Mara Hilgenberg** are lowa's team captains for the 2009 season. Schipper leads the Hawkeyes in kills (210) and service aces (23) and ranks second in digs (188). Hilgenberg leads the Hawkeyes with 634 assists and is a third generation Hawkeye captain. Her great-uncle Wally and her uncle Jim were football team captains in 1963 and 1977, respectively.

SECOND GENERATION

Mara Hilgenberg's father Jay and Emma Krieger Kittle's father Bruce played football together at lowa from 1977-1980. Jay was a four-time letterwinner and went on to win Super Bowl XX with the 1985 Chicago Bears. Bruce used a redshirt in 1980 and came back as a team captain for Hayden Fry's 1981 Big Ten Championship team.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

The Big Ten is widely recognized as one of the nation's premier conferences. Penn State returns as the conference champion, winner of the last two NCAA Championships and ranked atop the 2009 AVCA Coaches Poll. Other Big Ten schools ranked in the top 25 include Illinois (8), Minnesota (9) and Michigan (11).
