#### **THE SETTING:**

The University of Iowa women's basketball team opens the 2013-14 season this weekend, hosting the Hawkeye Challenge on Mediacom Court at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa faces UC Riverside on Friday at 6 p.m. (CT), before hosting No. 14 Dayton on Sunday at 1 p.m. UC Riverside and Dayton will meet Saturday at 2 p.m. Both Iowa contests are a part of women's/men's doubleheaders.

Tickets are \$10 for adults. Youth (18 and under) and UI students are admitted free. Tickets can be purchased online at hawkeyesports.com, over the phone at 1-800 IA-HAWKS, and at the UI Athletics Ticket Office in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

#### **PROMOTIONS:**

Free posters, schedule cards, magnets, schedule key tags, basketball key chains will be available while supplies last. Women's basketball season ticket holders can also pick up their "Bluder's Bunch" t-shirt (must have t-shirt ticket from season tickets). Sunday is Veterans Appreciation Day. Mini United States flags will be provided for the first 1,000 fans, and U.S. Veterans can purchase tickets for \$5 by contacting the UI Athletics Ticket Office or by presenting an ID at the ticket windows on the day of the game.

#### **AUDIO COVERAGE:**

Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call the action for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the contests on AM-800 KXIC in Iowa City, AM-1360 KMJM in Cedar Rapids, AM-1040 WHO in Des Moines or on the Hawkeye All-Access page of <a href="hawkeyesports.com">hawkeyesports.com</a>. Balbinot is in his 10th season as Iowa's play-by-play voice, while Till is in her ninth providing analysis.

#### **IOWA HISTORY:**

lowa has played 1,132 games since beginning basketball in 1974. lowa's overall record is 692-440 (.611). That includes a 348-178 (.662) mark in regular season Big Ten contests and a 335-97 (.775) mark in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

#### **HAWKEYES IN SEASON OPENERS:**

lowa is a perfect 12-0 in season openers under Head Coach Lisa Bluder. Friday will mark the 11th time in Bluder's 14 years that the Hawkeyes will open the season at home.

#### **IOWA IN THE RANKINGS:**

The Hawkeyes are receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Seven lowa opponents are also ranked in the Associated Press/USA Today polls: Nebraska (17/12), Penn State (13/15), Dayton (14/16), Michigan State (20/18), Colorado (19/19), Iowa State (23/20), and Purdue (18/23). In addition, Syracuse and Minnesota are receiving votes.

## 2013-14 Team Captains

lowa captains are senior Theairra Taylor and junior Samantha Logic.

#### **SCOUTING UC RIVERSIDE:**

UC Riverside downed Cal Baptist, 91-56, in an exhibition on Nov. 2. Six players finished in double-digit scoring, as the team shot 48.5 percent from the field. Brittany Crain paced the Highlanders with 16 points. Crain, the 2012-13 Big West Freshman of the Year, was selected to the 2013-14 Big West Preseason All-Conference Team. Last season, she averaged 14.3 points and 5.6 rebounds.

The Highlanders finished 11-18 overall last season, with a 4-14 conference mark.

UC Riverside is coached by John Margaritis. He has been at the helm of the program since 2004, coaching the Highlanders to three NCAA Tournaments and two WNIT appearances. Margaritis was the 2007 Big West Coach of the Year.

#### **SCOUTING DAYTON:**

The 14th-ranked Flyers were ranked No. 18 at the end of the 2012-13 season, finishing with a 28-3 mark overall. Dayton averaged 75.9 ppg, which was first in the Atlantic 10 and sixth in the NCAA.

The defending A-10 regular season champions were selected to finish first in the 2013-14 A-10 conference preseason poll.

The Flyers are coached by Jim Jabir — a two-time A-10 Coach of the Year — who is the program's all-time wins leader. Dayton has made four-straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

Dayton defeated the University of Indianapolis, 84-58, in an exhibition on Nov. 1 at UD Arena. Sophomore Amber Deane posted a double-double and finished with teamhighs in scoring (19) and rebounding (13). Five players scored in double digits.

#### HAWKEYES TOP CONCORDIA-ST. PAUL IN EXHIBITION:

The Hawkeyes defeated Concordia-St. Paul, 92-68, last Sunday in an exhibition, making 36-of-63 (57.1%) from the field with 26 assists.

Nine of 11 Hawkeyes who saw playing time compiled assists, led by senior Theairra Taylor with six and junior Samantha Logic with five.

lowa had three players score in double figures, led by junior center Bethany Doolittle with 20 points. She made 10-of-16 field goals with five rebounds. Junior guard Melissa Dixon added 18 points by making 6-of-8 field goals — four of those coming from 3-point range. Thirty-three seconds into the game, Dixon had two 3-point baskets and the Golden Bears were forced to call a timeout, already in a 6-0 hole.

The Hawkeyes limited the Golden Bears to a 38.9 shooting percentage from the field.

#### **IOWA IN THE HAWKEYE CHALLENGE:**

lowa has won 20 of the previous 26 tournaments it has hosted, and holds an impressive 45-7 record in Hawkeye Challenge contests. No Hawkeye Challenge was held in 2012, as lowa competed in the preseason WNIT.

Tournament records for the Hawkeye Challenge can be found at the back of the game notes.

## **CLIMBING TO THE TOP:**

Lisa Bluder needs 19 wins to surpass Hall of Famer C. Vivian Stringer (269 wins) as lowa's all-time winningest coach. Bluder is 251-157 all-time as the Hawkeye head coach.

## **SEASON TICKETS:**

Season tickets are on sale for the 2013-14 lowa women's basketball season. General public season tickets are \$85. UI faculty/staff can purchase tickets for \$68. Seniors (50 and older) are also \$68, while youth season tickets (18 or younger) are \$20. UI students are admitted free to women's basketball games.

## **Head Coach Lisa Bluder**

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her 14th season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 30th season as a college head coach. She is a three-time Big Ten and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year.

Bluder has a career record of 607-299 (.670), including a 251-157 (.615) record at lowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose.



Bluder is lowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer (269 wins). She has guided the Hawkeyes to 12 postseason tournaments (10 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and nine upper-division finishes in the Big Ten Conference, including winning a share of the league championship in 2008 and taking home the conference tournament title in 2001.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to their first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. In 2004-05, Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and was the last Division I undefeated team standing. In 2005-06, Bluder mentored a team plagued by injuries to a fifth-place Big Ten finish and an NCAA Tournament berth.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in her last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons, building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, Iowa, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

#### **LOGIC NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN:**

Junior Samantha Logic was named Preseason All-Big Ten by league media, the conference office announced Thursday. Logic, a junior from Racine, Wis., started all 34 games last season and was a third team All-Big Ten selection. The 5-foot-9 guard set school records for single-season assists (217) and single-game assists (14 vs. Texas, Dec. 28). Logic tallied five double-doubles, and led the Big Ten and ranked 15th in the NCAA in assists per game (6.4).

#### NCAA STREAK LEADS THE BIG TEN:

lowa is the only Big Ten team, and one of only 13 teams in the country, to have appeared in the last six NCAA Tournaments.

## **IOWA SELECTED TO HOST NCAA 1ST AND 2ND ROUNDS:**

The University of Iowa and Carver-Hawkeye Arena have been selected by the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee to serve as one of 16 hosts for the first and second rounds of the 2014 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. Iowa is 1-of-8 schools chosen to host first/second round games for the second-straight year.

The 2014 NCAA Championship will mark the 13th time the University of lowa has served as a host. Iowa hosted its first NCAA action in 1986 when it was one of four regional final sites. Carver-Hawkeye Arena also hosted from 1986-90, 1992-94, 1996-98 and in 2009 and 2013. Carver-Hawkeye Arena has hosted the regional finals four times and first and/or second round games 11 times.

lowa hosted first and second round games in 2009. Despite having late afternoon and evening games on a Sunday in March of 2009, Iowa's site recorded the fourth-highest first round attendance (5,615).

In 2013, the first round of the lowa City Regional drew 6,836 fans, which was the third-best attended site among the 16 host sites. In addition, lowa City had the sixth-best figure for second round games (4,942) and the fifth-highest total attendance (11,778).

#### SUCCESS UNDER BLUDER:

Last season marked the 10th time in 13 seasons under head coach Lisa Bluder — one of 13 active Division I coaches with 600 or more wins — that lowa has been selected for the NCAA Tournament, including each of the last six seasons. The Hawkeyes have participated in postseason play in all but one season under Bluder (two WNIT appearances).

It also marked the seventh time in Bluder's 13 seasons that the Hawkeyes reached 20 wins. Iowa has collected 20 or more wins in five of the last six years. In addition, Iowa finished with a winning record for the 12th time in 13 seasons under Bluder.

#### **GOLDWIRE JOINS HAWKEYE STAFF:**

Lacey Goldwire joined the UI coaching staff in August, after spending the 2012-13 season as an assistant coach at Morehead State. Prior to joining the Eagles' staff, Goldwire served on the Oklahoma State staff for four seasons -- two as a student assistant and two as a graduate assistant.

Following Oklahoma State's tragic loss of its head and assistant coach during a plane crash in November of 2011, Goldwire was elevated to interim assistant coach where she took on added recruiting duties. During her time with the program, the Cowgirls won 80 games and advanced to the postseason all four years, winning the 2012 WNIT championship.

Goldwire, an Oklahoma City native, played collegiately at East Central (Okla.) University where she ranks fifth in career scoring with 1,340 points. Goldwire, an all-state and all-city player at Del City (Okla.) High School, graduated from Oklahoma State with a bachelor of science in education and a master's degree in teaching, learning and leadership.

## **MOVING UP CAREER CHARTS:**

- Samantha Logic is tied for 10th in career assists (353). She needs five more assists to move past Nadine Domond for ninth place.
- Melissa Dixon ranks 12th in career 3-pointers (113). She needs four more 3-pointers to move past Crystal Smith for 11th place.

#### **RETURNING ALL-BIG TEN HONOREES:**

Two Hawkeyes that earned Big Ten honors return in 2013-14:

- Sophomore Melissa Dixon was named Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year. She is the second Hawkeye in school history to earn the award (Megan Skouby, 2008).
- Sophomore Samantha Logic was a third team All-Big Ten selection by the media and an honorable mention pick by the coaches.
   She was a unanimous selection to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team in 2012.

#### **HAWKEYES PLAY TOUGH SCHEDULE:**

lowa faced 10 teams a year ago that participated in the NCAA Tournament, finishing 6-8 against those teams. The Hawkeyes played five nonconference games against NCAA Tournament teams (Florida State, Middle Tennessee, West Virginia, North Carolina and Iowa State). Six Big Ten teams, including Iowa, were selected (Purdue, Michigan, Penn State, Nebraska and Michigan State).

#### **ANOTHER TOP ATTENDANCE YEAR:**

lowa ranked 19th in the country in attendance in 2013, averaging 4,567 fans per contest, marking the third-straight season that lowa has ranked inside the top 20 in attendance.

#### **HAWKEYES LIKE TO SHARE:**

- lowa broke the school record for single-season assists last year in the win over Miami (March 24). The previous record
  of 514 was set in 2011-12. lowa finished with 531 assists.
- lowa finished second in the Big Ten and 26th in the NCAA with 15.7 assists per game. lowa recorded at least 17 assists in 15 games, including five games with 20 or more.

#### **LOGIC BREAKS ASSIST RECORD:**

- Samantha Logic became lowa's single-season assist record holder, breaking the mark in lowa's win at Northwestern (March 3). Logic entered the game tied with Cara Consuegra (2000-01) at 191 assists. Logic collected seven assists at Northwestern and finished with 217.
- Logic led the Big Ten and ranked 15th in the NCAA with 6.4 assists per game.
- Logic recorded seven or more assists in 15 games, including four games with 10 or more. She had at least five assists in 24 games.
- Logic's six games with double digit assists are the second most in lowa history. Cara Consuegra had nine games in her career with 10 or more assists. The next closest Hawkeyes on the list are Kachine Alexander, Jolette Law and Michelle Edwards, with two career games.

## **LOGIC DOUBLE-DOUBLE FACTS:**

- Samantha Logic recorded her fourth double-double of the season, and the 12th of her career, in lowa's win over Miami (March 24). Logic finished with 23 points and 11 rebounds. Logic has 10 double-doubles of the points/rebounds variety, one with points/assists and one with assists/rebounds. She also has one career triple-double.
- Logic posted a double-double in each of her first two career NCAA tournament games. She finished with 11 points and 11 assists against California in 2011-12.
- Logic tallied the second 20-point performance of the season, and the fourth of her career, in the win over Miami. Her other 20-point game came as a freshman, finishing with a career-high 26 at Purdue (Feb. 17).
- With 11 rebounds against Miami in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, Logic collected her 12th career double
  digit rebounding performance. Logic had six games last season with 10 or more rebounds. As a freshman, Logic
  tallied six games, including a stretch of four-straight during Big Ten play.

#### **BLUDER GETS WIN NO. 600:**

Head coach Lisa Bluder became the 42nd coach in NCAA women's basketball history (all divisions) and only the 25th Division I head coach (minimum 10 years at a DI school) to collect 600 wins Jan. 20 vs. Purdue.

Bluder is one of 13 active Division I coaches with 600 or more wins.

#### **A LOOK BACK AT 2013:**

lowa finished the 2012-13 campaign with a 21-13 overall record, including an 8-8 mark in Big Ten play.

The Hawkeyes were an at-large selection for the NCAA Tournament, earning a No. 9 seed and hosting the first and second rounds. Iowa knocked off No. 8 seed Miami, 69-53, in the first round before falling to No. 1 seed and second-ranked Notre Dame, 74-57. The Fighting Irish advanced to the Final Four.

#### **IOWA CONTINUES TREND AGAINST RANKED FOES:**

- The Hawkeyes have recorded at least one win against a top-25 team in all but two seasons under Bluder. In nine of those seasons, lowa has knocked off at least one top-15 opponent.
- Last season marked just the second time in school history that lowa defeated three ranked teams prior to Big Ten play (No. 12 West Virginia, No. 22 Iowa State, No. 20 Texas). The only other time lowa defeated three ranked opponents was in 1993 (No. 4 Louisiana Tech, No. 20 Missouri State, No. 9 Southern California).
- Last year was only the sixth time in school history that lowa played at least three ranked teams prior to conference action. lowa faced five ranked opponents in 1990 (2-3 record) and three in 1999 (0-3), 1995 (2-1), 1993 (3-0) and 1989 (1-2).
- lowa tied the school record for number of wins over ranked teams in a season with seven. The Hawkeyes have accomplished the feat three other times (1995-96, 1993-94, 1992-93). lowa faced 11 ranked teams last season, which tied for the most games against ranked opponents in a season. The only other time lowa played 11 ranked teams in a season was in 1992-93 (7-4 record).

#### **INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL/B1G RECORDS BROKEN:**

- Samantha Logic became lowa's single-season assist record holder, breaking the mark in lowa's win at Northwestern.
   Logic collected seven assists at Northwestern to break the record and finished with 217.
- Samantha Logic broke lowa's school record for assists in a single game against Texas, finishing with 14. Her 14
  assists were the most by a Big Ten player last season.
- Melissa Dixon tied the school record for 3-pointers made by an lowa player in Carver-Hawkeye Arena with six against Northwestern.
