Events will be held on Jim Duncan Track in Drake Stadium. The meet is expected to sellout for the 40th straight year, which is the longest streak in U.S. track history. 2005 DRAKE RELAYS REVIEW -- The Hawkeyes competed at the 96th annual Drake Relays in Des Moines. Senior **Ken Kemeny** was unable to defend his shot put title, placing second with a throw of 59-0 3/4. The Hawkeyes also snagged four third-place finishes. Senior **Chris Voller** placed third in the hammer with a collegiate-best 203-1, sophomore **Peaches Roach** placed third in the special invitation high jump (5-9 3/4), junior **Tim Brodersen** placed third in the discus (177-0) and the women's 1,600-meter relay of

senior **Aisha Hume**, sophomores **Lindsey McCalla** and **Erin Sheeley** and freshman **Kineke Alexander** placed third in 3:44.24.

HAWKEYES BREAK RECORDS -- Hawkeye juniors Micah VanDenend, Tiffany Johnson and Peaches Roach have set new school records this outdoor season. VanDenend broke a 38-year-old 5,000-meter record at the Stanford Invitational, running a collegiate-best 13:55.96 for sixth place in the event. Iowa Head Coach Larry Wieczorek set the previous record of 13:56.0 in 1968. Johnson broke her own 100-meter hurdles and triple jump records. Her collegiate-best 13.53 at the Mt. SAC Relays broke the hurdles record of 13.57 she set in 2005, and she smashed the triple jump record of 40-9 1/2 she set in 2005 with her collegiate best 41-3 1/4 leap at the Iowa Musco Twilight VIII. Johnson now holds school records in the indoor and outdoor triple jump, 60-meter hurdles, 100-meter hurdles and as part of the indoor 1,600-meter relay. Roach broke the 23-year-old school high jump record of 6-0 set in 1983 by Mary Mol with the collegiate-best 6-0 3/4 at the Mt. SAC Relays. Roach holds the school indoor high jump mark, which is also 6-0 3/4.

The list, compiled by Gary Verigin of www.trackwire.com, ranks schools according to a projected hypothetical score for the NCAA outdoor championships, which is generated by a power ranking of the top 12 athletes and relay squads in each NCAA event. Iowa is ranked 21st with 10 points after opening the outdoor season ranked 20th. Texas is first with 61.

LAST WEEK -- Iowa qualified 10 student-athletes for the NCAA Midwest Regional, set a school record and crowned nine event champions at the eighth annual Iowa Musco Twilight meet in Iowa City.

Junior Tiffany Johnson set a school and meet record in the triple jump with her winning 41-3 1/4, which bettered her previous qualifying mark. Iowa's other regional qualifiers were seniors Tim Brodersen (discus) and Tony Rakaric (3,000meter steeplechase); junior Peaches Roach (100 meters),; sophomores Kineke Alexander (200 meters), Matty Gorman (long jump), Shane Maier (discus) and Adam Hamilton (hammer); and freshmen A.J. Curtis (discus and shot put) and John Hickey (shot put).

Winning events for the Hawkeyes were Roach (100 meters, 400-meter relay), Alexander (200 meters, 400-meter relay), Johnson (triple jump, 400-meter relay), sophomore Tammilee Kerr (400-meter relay), senior Dan Haut (3,000 meters), Gorman (long jump), sophomore Kale Katt (long jump), Hamilton (hammer) and Maier (shot put).

University of Iowa Women's Head Coach



James Grant Head Coach 10th Season

James Grant is in his 10th season at the helm of the Iowa women's track and field program. Grant was the former assistant coach at Iowa for 11 years (1986-96).

Grant has coached eight all-Americans and 21 Big Ten champions during his tenure as head coach. Iowa placed third at the

2004 Big Ten Indoor Championships in Iowa City and sixth at the 2003 conference outdoor meet - the team's highest placings under Grant. The third-place indoor finish tied the team's highest conference finish in school history.

During the 2006 indoor season, sophomore Kineke Alexander became Grant's first NCAA Champion, and the third in school history, when she won the 400 meters at the national meet. Junior Peaches Roach and Meghan Armstrong also earned all-America honors. Alexander won the 200 and 400 meters at the Big Ten Championships, setting the 400-meter meet record.

In 2005, Roach and Alexander became Grant's first indoor all-Americans. Roach defended her Big Ten indoor high jump title to become the second Hawkeye to win two consecutive Big Ten titles in the same event in school history.

In 2004, Shellene Williams became the second student-athlete in program history to win four Big Ten titles, winning three titles in the 400 meters and one as part of the 1,600-meter relay. Roach gave Iowa its first Big Ten high jump titles, winning that event at the indoor and outdoor conference meets to earn outdoor Freshman of the Year honors.

In 2003, the 1,600-meter relay of Aisha Hume, Nicole Charles, Sarah Steffen and Williams shattered the 15-year-old school record of 3:41.23 with the blistering 3:36.26 they ran at the NCAA Midwest Regional. The quartet also won Iowa's first Big Ten title in that event. Aisha James wowed the Drake Relays crowd when she set school, meet, stadium and Trinidad and Tobago records in the long jump with a then-world leading mark of 22-3 (6.78 m). James became the first Big Ten long jump champion in school history and the first Hawkeye field event champion since 1993 with her victory at the conference meet. Alana Redfern qualified for the NCAA Championships for the second straight year when she broke her own school javelin record by almost 20 feet and set the Canadian National record in that event. James and Redfern became Iowa's first Drake Relays champions in the long jump and javelin, respectively.

While improving in the league standings in considered a priority, Iowa's track and field team also concerns itself with performance in the classroom. During Grant's tenure, 44 Hawkeyes have earned 76 academic all-Big Ten honors.

As Iowa's assistant coach from 1986-96, Grant coached several Hawkeyes to success. In 1995, Yolanda Hobbs was an all-American in the 55 and 200 meters after winning the 55-meter Big Ten title. In 1994, Iowa's 400 meter-relay of Tina Floyd, Hobbs, Marlene Poole and Tanja Reid won Iowa's first Big Ten title in that event, earned all-America honors and set meet and school records. Karen Layne won the 1990 600-meter Big Ten title, while Senta Hawkins won the Big Ten 400 meters in 1988. In 1989, Iowa's 1,600-meter relay placed second at the Big Ten Indoor and Outdoor Championships.

A former Jamaican track standout, Grant coached at the high school level in Jamaica for 11 years prior to joining the Hawkeye program. From 1982-86, Grant coached men's and women's track at G.C. Foster College of Physical Education and Sport. There he led the men's team to two national titles and two second-place finishes, and the women's team to three national titles.

A graduate of Eastern Michigan University, Grant captained the 1970 and 1971 Huron track teams, earning all-America honors while specializing in the 400 meters, 400-meter hurdles, and the mile relay. He was the Jamaican 400-meter hurdle national record holder, with a time that was ranked in the top-20 in the world. Grant also represented Jamaica at the Pan American Games and the Commonwealth Games for six years. In 1991, he was inducted into the Eastern Michigan Hall of Fame.

He was the 1965 and 1966 Jamaican national champion in both the 200 and 400-meters as a high school athlete at Jamaica's Kingston College.

Grant received his bachelor's degree in sociology and history from Eastern Michigan, and his master's degree in physical education from the German College of Physical Education in Leipzig, Germany.

University of Iowa Men's Head Coach



Larry Wieczorek Head Coach 10th Season

Larry Wieczorek is in his 10th season as head men's track and field coach at the University of Iowa. He recently completed his 19th season as head men's cross country coach for the Hawkeyes. He served as an assistant track and field coach for 12 years before taking the helm in 1997.

A six-time Big Ten champion (including two in cross country) and four-time all-American at Iowa, Wieczorek once held conference marks in the one, two, three, four and five-mile runs. A member of Iowa's last Big Ten track championship team in 1967, he still owns Iowa record in the indoor two miles, as well as third-fastest mark in the cross country 8,000 meters. Hawkeye junior Micah VanDenend broke Wieczorek's 38-year-old 5,000-meter school record earlier this month. Wieczorek was honored for his collegiate accomplishments by being inducted into the University of Iowa's National Varsity Club Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998.

Wieczorek returned to his alma mater as a field event coach in 1985 before taking the helm of the cross country program in 1987. He has since shifted his track responsibilities to the distance corps.

Under Wieczorek, the cross country team has placed sixth or higher nine times at the NCAA Regional Championships, has posted 27 all-region selections and qualified for the NCAA Championships four times. In 2002, Wieczorek was named Midwest Region Coach of the Year honors by the United States Cross Country Association after the Hawkeyes won the NCAA Regional for the first time in school history. In 2004, the Hawkeyes recorded their highest placings under Wieczorek at the Big Ten (3rd) and NCAA Championships (13th).

Since he was named head men's track and field coach in 1997, Wieczorek has coached NCAA Champion long jumper Bashir Yamini, 23 all-Americans, 82 national qualifiers, 52 NCAA Midwest Regional qualifiers and 37 Big Ten Champions. Iowa's 1,600-meter relay won the 1999 Big Ten outdoor title and has earned all-America honors twice during Wieczorek's tenure. The Hawkeyes recorded their highest conference indoor placing (fourth) in 1997, and their highest team finish at the Big Ten Outdoor Championships (second) in 33 years at the 1999 Big Ten outdoor meet.

In 2006, sophomore Matty Gorman won the Big Ten indoor long jump title. He and junior Micah VanDenend (3,000 meters), senior Dan Haut (5,000 meters), sophomore Shane Maier (shot put) and junior Adam Hamilton (hammer throw) acheived

NCAA provisional qualifying marks in their respective events. VanDenend set the school 3,000-meter record, while sophomore Ryan Niver set the school heptathlon mark. During the outdoor season, the team has qualified nine student-athletes for the NCAA Midwest Regional Championships.

Another of Wieczorek's goals as head coach was to create an annual outdoor home event for the Hawkeyes that would be entertaining for the community and feature outstanding competition for participating student-athletes. Now in it's eighth year of existence, the annual Iowa Musco Twilight Meet is just that. Named for Musco Lighting of Oskaloosa, IA, who supplies mobile lighting equipment, the co-ed meet which featured 12 teams in 2006, starts in the late afternoon and extends into the night. In its first four years, the meet had produced 43 NCAA provisional qualifiers. Since the creation of the regional qualifying system in 2003, 187 competitors have reached qualifying standards at the twilight meet.

While improving in the league standings is a priority, the Hawkeyes also concern themselves with performance in the classroom. Under Wieczorek, former cross country runners Kevin Herd, Chad Schwitters and Stetson Steele earned academic all-America honors. Iowa has had an academic all-Big Ten selection each year during his tenure, totaling 57 honorees in cross country and 101 in track and field.

Wieczorek came to Iowa after 11 seasons as head track coach at Proviso (IL) West High School. He also served as an assistant at Proviso West for three years. His prep teams were consistent placers on the state level and several of his athletes won state titles. He served on the Illinois track advisory board and founded the prestigious Proviso Indoor Track Classic. Wieczorek was inducted into the Illinois High School Track and Cross Country Coaches Hall of Fame in 2000.

Wieczorek was born on September 11, 1946, in Chicago, IL. He received his B.S. degree in physical education from Iowa in 1969 and his M.S. degree in physical education from Northern Illinois University in 1973. His wife's name is Jackie.

mystery no more

Alexander makes her mark with 400 indoor title

As she trains for the outdoor track season, Iowa sophomore Kineke Alexander is no longer a mystery to her opponents.

She lost her anonymity by winning the 400-meter dash at the NCAA Indoor Meet earlier this month.

"Most of the coaches there were pretty amazed because everybody kept asking, 'Who is she, where is she from?" said Iowa women's track coach Jim Grant. "There were a few people there that thought she could win, but she surprised a lot."

Grant was among the few who believed in Alexander. He just kept it to himself.

"I knew that she had a very good chance because she is the type of runner that delivers when it's important," Grant said. "So I had it in the back of my mind that she could win, but I didn't tell her that."

Alexander, a sophomore from St. Vincent and the Grenadines in the Caribbean, entered the finals with the fourth fastest time and won the race in 52.16 seconds.

However, she ran in the slow heat, meaning she had to wait until the times were posted from the fast heat.

"I was frightened," Alexander said.

Fright quickly turned to jubilation, though, when Alexander learned she was the winner.

She is the first Hawkeye sprinter to win an NCAA title and the third NCAA champion overall from the University of Iowa, joining Tracy Dahl in the 5,000 in 1992 and 1993 and

Nan Doak in the 10,000 in 1985.

"We were sitting on pins and needles," Grant said. "And then when we saw the second race finished and they showed the times, everybody just kind of leaped in the air."

Grant said Alexander benefited from a strategy that emphasized patience.

"I told her that we were going to play a little cat and mouse," Grant said. "I didn't want her to try and win it all in the first 200 (meters).

"I told her the race starts at 300 (meters). So at 300, I wanted her to be right on the lead runner's shoulder through 200, and then at 300, make a move."

Alexander said she had her doubts heading into the meet, which was in Fayetteville, Ark.

"During the week, when I was raining, the feeling wasn't there," she said. "But then when I got there and started the competition, I was really hyped to just go out there and win."

She now embraces the challenge of being the person to beat in the outdoor 400 this spring. She isn't afraid to say that anything less than an outdoor national title in the 400 would be a disappointment.

"I feel like I have to go out there and take it away," she said. "It's a good feeling.

"It makes me want to work harder at training."

The fact that Alexander won the indoor title is more impressive because of what she had to overcome. Her tall and lanky frame is more suited for the outdoor 400.

So is her background.

"Indoor is harder because of the tight turns; especially for her, she's a very tall runner," Grant said. "She's grown up running outdoors. This is just her second season running indoors.

"She still hasn't learned how to

run indoors yet."

Grant smiles when he speaks about Alexander's potential. He thinks she has a chance to break the 50-second barrier in the 400. Alexander already holds the school record in the outdoor 400 at 51.71.

"To be honest, I tell people every day that she doesn't know how good she can be," Grant said. "She proves it every day.

"Every day she never ceases to amaze me. I think the sky is the

limit."

Alexander credits Grant for much of her success. Grant understands what it takes to win the 400 because he was an accomplished sprinter growing up in Jamaica and at Eastern Michigan University in the early 1970s.

He earned all-America honors while specializing in the 400 and the 400 hurdles.

"I feel more confident working with him being that he has run the event," Alexander said. "He knows what to look for. He knows my

weaknesses and strengths, too.'

"It was in the papers and everything," she said. "They were really happy."

Another chance

Bone-marrow transplant gives Iowa thrower new life

Tim Brodersen was living the typical life of a busy high school athlete when the bruises showed up one day.

It wasn't unusual for Tim to have bruises, considering how active he was, but this was unusual. Tim had bruises all over his body, especially on his chest.

He had been goofing off with a friend the day before and he figured the bruises came from when they were wrestling.

But Tim couldn't explain the severity of the bruises, nor could his mother, despite being a nurse.

Tim was scheduled to start practice for his junior year of high school football the next day, but now that was secondary to his health.

The day he saw the bruises was the start of a nearly two-year struggle to overcome a life-threatening blood disorder called aplastic anemia.

Tim not only has over-

come the illness, he now is doing things as a member of the Iowa track team that make it hard to believe he ever was sick.

The same kid who spent a good portion of his junior and senior years of high school in the hospital is now a Big Ten champion in the discus.

The same kid whose health cost him a chance of earning a Division I scholarship coming out of high school is now performing better than a lot of throwers on scholarship.

"I just kept working and didn't give up on it and four

years later, I'm on top," Tim says proudly.

Tim now weighs about 230 pounds and he could double as Paul Bunyon with his thick, red beard and thick body.

He is grateful to so many people for helping him to survive, but his sister, Trisha, always will have a special place in his heart.

She always will be a part of him, too, because it was Trisha's bone marrow that ultimately saved Tim's life.

Tim needed a bone-marrow transplant to stay alive and Trisha luckily met all the requirements to be a donor.

"I wouldn't be here right now," Tim says. "My blood counts were going way down."

As the only children in their family, Tim and Trisha always have been close. But going through a life-threatening experience has taken their relationship to a new level.

"We don't talk about it a lot, but there's kind of an unspoken bond about the situation," Tim says. "I'm just grateful to have her in my life."

Trisha, 25, says she often thinks about her younger brother and what he has gone through. She is proud of what he has accomplished and proud to have helped him gain a new outlook on life.

"We were always close as brother and sister, but I think that just kind of bonded us forever," Trisha says. "It kind of made me 66We don't talk about it a lot, but there's kind of an unspoken bond about the situation. I'm just grateful to have her in my life. ??

feel like that was my purpose in life to be the match for him."

Tim beat the odds when you consider that his only sibling prove to be a match for a bone-marrow transplant.

He also beat the odds by becoming a Big Ten champion in an event that relies heavily on strength.

Tim now is preparing to compete in the NCAA Midwest Regional Championships today and Saturday in Norman, Okla. He is ranked first in his region and 11th nationally in the discus.

"I know Tim and he is so determined," says his mother, Karol Brodersen. "I think it's more just pride than anything. I'm just really proud of him."

Tim credits his parents for helping him to get through the mental anguish that comes with being seriously ill. His mother spent countless days sitting next to him in the hospital room at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn.

Tim was five hours away from his home in Vermillion, S.D., so having mom around was reassuring.

"My mom never left my side and my dad would drive back and forth every week," Tim says. "My mom would sleep in my hospital room, there was a little couch behind my bed.

"" "She used to bug me and stuff. But now looking back on it, she just cared for me."

Tim says his parents always reminded him of the big picture.

"They always encouraged me to take the positive from the situation and they never let me feel sorry for myself," Tim says. "When you're (in the hospital), there's so many people there that are in the same situation and there's a lot of people that are in way worse situations."

Tim saw that while he and his parents stayed at the Ronald McDonald House during part of his recovery.

"There's always kids around there that are terminally ill and they're not going to be there another year," Tim says. "So knowing that you at least have a chance to get better kind of puts everything more in perspective."

The disease actually hit Tim in two different stages. He was treated initially and was thought to be recovering until he suffered a relapse as a high school senior.

Remarkably, Tim recovered after having the bone-marrow transplant in time to finish second in the discus at the state meet as a senior.

He won the state discus title as a junior.

"I remember doing a lot of visualizing in the hospital about throwing," Tim says. "I think that helped a lot once I got out there.

"It's just like riding a bike."

The fact that Tim attends a school that has a hospital on cartills is no coincidence. The University of Iowa had what his mother was looking for in terms of access to medical treatment.

"That was definitely a big factor because he had to keep going back and forth to the doctor that first year pretty often and have things checked," Karol says. "He had a lot of blood tests.

"It was reassuring to have the hospital right there."

Tim's life is still affected by the illness. For him, having a cold or the flu is more than just a painful annoyance that everybody goes through.

"When I get sick, a lot of times I can't recover on my own because my immune system is kind of low," Tim said. "So I have to go get antibiotics.

"That's happened to me probably three or four or five times in college because you're in the dorms and you get sick like that."

But you get better and move on. Life is all about overcoming obstacles.

"I learned that I'm a pretty determined person," Tim says. "I just try to use bad situations as inspiration to achieve goals that you might not otherwise even thought of."

Everything coming up Peaches

It's simple.

The best thing about the high jump for Iowa junior Peaches Roach is winning. And she will try to do just that this week at the NCAA outdoor track championships in Sacramento, Calif.

Roach's second-place finish a season best $5-11\frac{1}{4}$ — in the high jump at the NCAA Midwest regional in Norman, Okla., on May 28 secured her a spot in the championships. With many wins in collegiate competition, Roach is entering the meet as a strong competitor looking to finish in the top five.

"From high-school, Peaches showed the potential to not only be a qualifier for the NCAA championships but also a NCAA All-American or even a top-three NCAA finisher," Iowa women's track coach James Grant said.

Leaving hometown Kingstown, Jamaica, to come to the UI was a decision she made because of what Iowa could offer her.

"It was influenced by the fact of a great athletics and academic program, and also the coach is Jamaican," she said.

In seventh grade, she began competing in the high jump, and since then, she has racked up an impressive list of accomplishments. In high school, she was the 2003 Jamaican national champion and high-school national champion in the high jump. She also placed sixth in the high jump at the 2002 World Junior Championships.

Her success has continued into her collegiate career, with

"Peaches brings a great deal of leadership and a high academic standard to the team," Grant said. "Also a great deal of pleasantries that kind of radiate to the rest of her team members."

Roach practices around 10-13 hours a week with the team. and all of her hard work will come in handy when she hopes to reach a new personal record.

"A victory would be very personal for me," she said. "A new personal record would probably

put me in the top five."

Her collegiate personal best is 5-11¹/₄, which she scored at both the indoor and outdoor Big Ten championships in 2004. She also has competed in the 60-, 100-, and

While her accomplishments on the track are obvious, she has also garnered recognition in academics.

Roach, a biology major, was one of the 54 Hawkeye athletes named to the 2005 spring academic all-conference team.

In order to be chosen for the team, an athlete must be in at least her or his second academic year and have a 3.0 GPA. or higher.

When she enters her junior year next fall, she has many

future opportunities in her collegiate track and field career, including defending her Big Ten high-jump title.

As for her plans for the high jump after college, Roach will weigh the possibilities of a professional career.

"I'll take the high jump as far as it takes me," she said.
