2010 FEDEX ORANGE BOWL POSTGAME NOTES
IOWA 24, GEORGIA TECH 14
Attendance: 66,131

Tonight's 49 degree temperature at kickoff is the coldest opening kickoff temperature in FedEx Orange Bowl history. The previous mark of 57 degrees was set in the 2008 game between Kansas and Virginia Tech.

Iowa defensive lineman Adrian Calyborn was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl. Clayborn finished the game with nine tackles, two sacks and two tackles for loss. Clayborn is the second defensive player in the last three years to be named game MVP, along with Kansas' Aqib Talib in 2008. The last defensive lineman to be named MVP was Florida's Carlos Dunlap in last year's BCS National Championship.

Iowa running back Brandon Wegher collected the 44th 100-yard rushing game in FedEx Orange Bowl game history and sealed tonight's win for the Hawkeyes with a 32 yard touchdown run with under two minutes to go in the game. The run was the longest of the freshman's career, besting a 28-yard rush at Penn State on September 26.

Georgia Tech collected nine first downs in tonight's FedEx Orange Bowl game, tied for the lowest mark since 1992 (Nebraska vs. Miami (FL)). Georgia Tech's 12 passing yards tonight is the fewest since 1961, when Missouri had five yards passing in a game vs. Navy.

Georgia Tech's 155 yards of total offense marks the first time since Nebraska in 1992 that a team in the FedEx Orange Bowl that a team did not surpass 200 yards of total offense. Tonight's Tech total is the lowest mark in FedEx Orange Bowl history since 1989 when Nebraska had 135 yards vs. Miami (FL).

Tech's two completions is tied for the fewest in the FedEx Orange Bowl since Oklahoma completed two passes in 1987 vs. Arkansas. The nine pass attempts in the fewest in the FedEx Orange Bowl since Colorado attempted nine passes vs. Notre Dame in 1990.

The Iowa Hawkeyes opened the scoring in tonight's FedEx Orange Bowl game with a 4-yard touchdown pass from Ricky Stanzi to Marvin McNutt at 8:10 of the first quarter. It marked the second time in two FedEx Orange Bowl game appearances that the Hawkeyes scored first. In the 2003 contest, Iowa's C.J. Jones returned the opening kickoff a bowl-record 100 yards for a score and a 7-0 lead in a loss to the USC Trojans.



Tonight's first score by Iowa marked the third straight FedEx Orange Bowl in which the Big 10 representative scored first. Including tonight, Iowa has scored first in each of their last four games after scoring first only three times in their first nine games of the year.

The Iowa Hawkeyes tallied two touchdowns (both Stanzi passes) in the first quarter of tonight's FedEx Orange Bowl. The last time a quarterback threw two touchdown passes in the first quarter of a FedEx Orange Bowl was 1999, when Florida's Doug Johnson threw the two scores to game MVP Travis Taylor against the Syracuse Orange.

For the second time in the last three FedEx Orange Bowls, a defensive player returned an interception for a touchdown (both times in the 1st quarter). Tonight, Georgia Tech's Jerrard Tarrant picked off Iowa's Ricky Stanzi and returned it 40 yards for a score. The last time there was an interception return for a touchdown in the FedEx Orange Bowl was in 2008 when Kansas's Aqib Talib picked off Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor and returned it 60 yards for a score. The interception return for a touchdown was the 12th in FedEx Orange Bowl history, but only the second since 1968.

Tonight's 21 combined points in the first quarter tied for the second-highest scoring opening period in FedEx Orange Bowl history. Florida and Maryland scored 21 points in the first quarter in the 2002 game and USC and Oklahoma matched that mark in 2005. The only FedEx Orange Bowl game that featured more combined first quarter points was the 1942 game when Georgia and TCU scored a total of 26 first quarter points (GA 19, TCU 7).

Georgia Tech and Iowa played a scoreless second quarter, the first scoreless second frame in FedEx Orange Bowl history since the 1992 game when Miami (FL) claimed the National Championship with a 22-0 win over Nebraska.

Georgia Tech set their single game high with seven punts tonight. They matched their single-game season high with six first half punts. The Yellow Jackets entered tonight's game having not punted in their last 22 possessions. Prior to tonight, Tech last punted on November 14 at Duke. In the regular season, Tech punted six times on September 10 at Clemson.

In the third quarter of tonight's game, Georgia Tech quarterback Josh Nesbitt surpassed 1,000 yards rushing on the season. He joins Jonathan Dwyer to make the first 1,000 rush yards duo in Georgia Tech history.

Georgia Tech running back Anthony Allen scored his third career FedEx Orange Bowl touchdown in the third quarter on tonight's game. Allen scored two touchdowns in the



2007 games as a member of the University of Louisville, when the Cardinals topped Wake Forest, 24-13.

The Iowa Hawkeyes outrushed the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets, 172 yards to 143 yards, in tonight's FedEx Orange Bowl game. It marked the third time this season that Tech was outrushed by an opponent. The other two times came vs. Miami (FL) and at Georgia. Including tonight, Georgia Tech is 0-3 in games in which they were outrushed.

Tonight's game marked the fifth straight year an ACC team played in the FedEx Orange Bowl. The last time Georgia Tech played in the game was 1967, when they fell to the Florida Gators, 27-12. The Iowa Hawkeyes last played in the FedEx Orange Bowl in 2003, dropping a 38-17 decision to University of Southern California. Georgia Tech is now 3-3 in FedEx Orange Bowl contests, while Iowa is now 1-1.

Tonight's game marked Georgia Tech's first appearance in a BCS game. Iowa was making their second appearance (also 2003 FedEx Orange Bowl).

Iowa FedEx Orange Bowl Post-game Notes #11 Iowa vs. #10 Georgia Tech, Jan. 5, 2010

Iowa defeated Georgia Tech, 24-14 in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl. Iowa has appeared in bowls in eight of last nine seasons, including six January bowl games and two BSC bowl appearances.

Iowa is now 1-1 in the Orange Bowl. The Hawkeyes lost to Southern Cal, 38-17 in 2003 Orange Bowl.

Tuesday's game was the first meeting ever with Georgia Tech. Iowa was 0-7 previously against ACC.

Iowa finishes the season with an 11-2 overall record and a 6-2 league mark. The Hawkeyes posted double-figure wins for the fourth time under Head Coach Kirk Ferentz, including the third time in regular season. Additionally, Iowa has posted six league wins for third time under Ferentz.

The Big Ten went 4-3 in bowl games, including wins in the Rose Bowl, Capital One Bowl, Champs Sports Bowl and FedEx Orange Bowl.

Tonight was the final game for 17 Hawkeye seniors (Pat Angerer, Kyle Calloway, Joe Conklin, Dan Doering, AJ Edds, Rafael Eubanks, Chad Geary, Bryce Griswold, Taylor Herbst, Andy Kuempel, Travis Meade, Tony Moeaki, Jayme Murphy, Dace Richardson, Chris Rowell, Kyle Spading and Trey Stross).

Temperature at game time was 49 degrees, the coldest Orange Bowl ever. The previous low at game time was 57 degrees. Iowa also played in the coldest Gator Bowl (1983) in Jacksonville, FL, where the wind chill was minus 13 degrees. Iowa played five previous games in 2009 with a temperature of 50 degrees or less at game time, with the coldest being the home game vs. Michigan (33 degrees, also a night game). Iowa was 5-0 this season when the temperature was below 50 degrees at game time and 5-2 when the temperature was above 50 degrees. In addition to Michigan, other games that were 50 degree or less for Iowa this season were Arkansas State (50), Wisconsin (40), Michigan State (43) and Minnesota (45).

Georgia Tech won the toss and deferred. Iowa has started on offense in 113 of its last 130 contests. The Hawkeyes have started the game on offense in 115-of-136 games under Ferentz. Iowa games vs. Ohio State (11/14/07), Indiana (10/31/09), Purdue (11/15/08), Penn State (11/08/08), Wisconsin (10/10/08), Minnesota (11/10/07), at Northwestern (11/3/07), vs. Michigan State (10/27/07), at Penn State (10/6/07), vs. Iowa State (9/16/06), vs. Minnesota (11/19/05), vs. Michigan (10/22/05), at Purdue (10/8/05), at Minnesota (11/13/04), vs. Purdue (11/6/04), at Miami, OH (9/7/02) and at Michigan State (9/27/03) are the only contests that the Hawkeyes didn't start on offense. Iowa won 13 of the 17 games.

Iowa has scored the first 14 points of the game in its last three bowl games. Iowa led Texas 14-0 in the first period of the 2006 Alamo Bowl before falling to the Longhorns, 26-24. Iowa scored 31 straight points in a 31-10 win over South Carolina in the 2009 Outback Bowl.

Iowa did not score on its first possession, losing a fumble after a pass completion. Iowa scored on its initial drive in four games. Iowa scored a touchdown on its opening drive vs. Arizona and Arkansas State, and a field goal on its opening drive vs. Northern Iowa. Iowa did not score on its opening drives at Iowa State, at Penn State, vs. Michigan, at Wisconsin, at Michigan State, vs. Indiana, at Ohio State and vs. Georgia Tech.

Georgia Tech did not score on its opening possession. Iowa allowed just two opponents (Indiana, game nine, and Penn State, game four) to score on their opening drive in its last 26 games.

Iowa has scored the first points in eight of 13 games. The opponent scored first in the first four road games before Iowa opened the scoring at Ohio State with a field goal. Iowa State, Wisconsin and Michigan State opened with a field goal and Penn State opened with a touchdown. Iowa scored 35 straight points at Iowa State, 21 at Penn State and 20 at Wisconsin.



DE Adrian Clayborn had eight solo tackles in the first half, which matches a career-best (at Ohio State, 2009). He ended the game with nine tackles. His career high of 12 tackles came at Ohio State earlier this season. He also had two QB sacks in the first half, which matches his career best (at Michigan State, 2009). Clayborn was named the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl Most Outstanding Player.

WR Marvin McNutt had his eighth touchdown reception of the season in the first period. McNutt is tied for fourth in TD receptions in a single season. He trails Maurice Brown (11 in 2002), Quinn Early (10 in 1987) and Tim Dwight (9 in 1995) and is tied with Bill Happel (1985), Kahlil Hill (2001), Danan Hughes (1991) and Dwight (1997).

Junior QB Ricky Stanzi returned to the starting line-up for the first time since the 10th game of the season vs. Northwestern. He was injured in the first half of that game and did not play in Iowa's final two games. Junior LB Jeremiha Hunter also returned to the starting line-up after missing the final game of the regular season. Hunter's return to the line-up marked the only change in Iowa's starting defense.

Stanzi, with two touchdown passes in the first period, now has 17 TD passes this season and 31 in his career. He is tied for ninth in season scoring passes and ranks sixth in career touchdown passes. In the game he completed 17-29 passes for 231 yards and 2 touchdowns. His season total of 2,417 yards ranks 10th best for a single season and his career total of 4,373 ranks sixth.

Additionally, Kyle Calloway started at right guard after starting 11 straight games at right tackle. Julian Vandervelde started at left guard after starting eight games at right guard. Riley Reiff started at right tackle after starting three games at left tackle and the final seven games of the regular season at left guard. Also, Dace Richardson returned to action after missing the last four games due to injury.

Iowa was 2-3 in the red zone against Georgia Tech, collecting a passing touchdown in the first quarter and a field goal in the third period. Iowa failed to convert a fake field goal in the fourth period. Iowa has scored on 63 of the last 69 red zone possessions (39 TDs and 24 FGs), dating back to the Michigan State game in 2008. Iowa is 44-50 combined inside the red zone its last 16 games.

Georgia Tech was 1-1 in the red zone with a rushing touchdown in the fourth period. Iowa opponents are 24-29 in the red zone this season, with 10 FGs and 14 touchdowns.

Iowa did not score following an interception in the fourth quarter. Iowa has collected at least one turnover in 11-of-13 games this season, with no turnovers vs. Michigan State and Ohio State. The Hawkeye defense has collected at least one takeaway in 44 of its last 48 games, dating back to 2006. Iowa has scored 87 points (11 TDs, four FGs) following 31 opponent turnovers (21 interceptions, nine fumbles, one blocked punt).

Georgia Tech did not score following a first period fumble, but returned an interception for a touchdown later in the period. Iowa opponents have scored 61 points following 28 Iowa turnovers (20 interceptions, eight fumbles). Georgia Tech, Michigan, Arkansas State and Arizona returned interceptions for touchdowns and Northern Iowa scored field goals following two Iowa fumbles. Penn State scored three points following an interception. Indiana scored a touchdown after recovering a fumble on an Iowa punt return and added a field goal following a third period interception. Northwestern recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown and OSU scored a rushing touchdown after a fourth period interception.

Senior OLB A.J. Edds had his fifth interception of the season in the fourth period. Edds finished his career with seven interceptions.

Instant replay was used in the second period. An Iowa pass was ruled complete. The call on the field was overturned and changed to an incompletion.

Adam Robinson finished with 14 carries for 59 yards. Robinson led Iowa's rushing attack for the season with 834 yards. His yardage is the most ever for an Iowa freshman. The previous mark of 679 yards was held by Ladell Betts (1998).

Iowa freshman RB Brandon Wegher scored his eighth rushing touchdown of the season in the fourth period. The eight touchdowns is a new Iowa record for a freshman. The previous record was seven, set last season by Jewel Hampton.

Iowa set two team bowl records on defense. The Hawkeyes allowed just 155 yards, which was the lowest total in Iowa bowl history. The previous mark was 206 yards against Texas Tech in the 1996 Alamo Bowl. Also, Iowa allowed just 12 passing yards in the Orange Bowl, an Iowa bowl record for fewest passing yards. The previous mark of 92 came against Florida in the 1983 Gator Bowl. Both of those numbers were also season bests for the Hawkeye defense.

Georgia Tech's pass completions (2), pass attempts (9) and passing yards (12) are the lowest numbers allowed during the Ferentz era.

Post-game Interview With:

COACH PAUL JOHNSON

JASON ALPERT: We'll open up with Coach Paul Johnson. Coach, talk about what you think might have gone wrong tonight for Georgia Tech.

COACH PAUL JOHNSON: Well, Iowa scored 24, and Georgia Tech scored 14 is what went wrong.

You know, I think we got off to a really slow start offensively in the first half. We hurt ourself right out of the chute with penalties. And we just never had any consistency offense. We had a hard time, you know, blocking them inside, and it made it tough to run on the perimeter. We could never hit a big play with our passing game. It's hard to get any consistency when we weren't out there much. We were struggling. We couldn't string together first downs until we got in the second half. I thought in the second half we moved the ball a little better.

But they're a very good defense. They had a good plan, and we had a hard time blocking them. You know, defensively we kind of hung in there with them. We gave up some yards in the first half. But I felt like at halftime we'd only be down 14-7, we were in pretty good shape. We came out in the third quarter, put together a pretty good drive. Had to overcome two penalties and we couldn't overcome them. We overcame the first one, and couldn't get by the second one. And we missed the field goal and just lost all the momentum we created. And we ran half the quarter out.

So, you know, we were our own worst enemy. But you have to give Iowa credit. They played hard and played a good game. And, you know, we just didn't get it done.

Q. Was there any sense of a confidence loss? I mean, you guys had run for two plus against just about everybody except Miami. In those first couple of drives did you get a sense the guys were a little shellshocked at the way you did struggle out of the gate?

COACH PAUL JOHNSON: You know, that very well could have been. I think the biggest thing that happened was, you know, the very first play of the game it looked like we were going to pop Jon Dwyer through there for a big gain. And we have a guy that jumps the count. We come up a few yards short. And then I think the second position, we come out and make seven or eight yards on first down and we get caught for a chop block. We can't overcome that.

Then the next time, I'm thinking off the top of my head, we come up about a yard short on fourth down, and then we got hung back on our end a couple times. They punted us back outside inside the 10-yard line. And that was pretty much the half. We never really got much going.

I don't know that the confidence was shaken. I think it's disappointing, because we haven't played very many games like that. You know, even you're talking about the Miami game. Even in the Miami game we'd move the ball and score some. We just had a hard time getting the ball. You know, we had plenty of opportunities in the first half, we just couldn't do much with it.

Q. Is there anything that is similar between this bowl loss and last year's loss to LSU in the Chick-fil-A?

COACH PAUL JOHNSON: No, you know, last year I think we self-destructed on special teams early in the game. This one we kind of hung in there until we had a chance at the end. We had a couple of possessions down three. We were way backed up, but we did have the possessions. You know, we just couldn't seem to get anything going or couldn't hit a pass play to get a jump start or couldn't hit a big play.

I don't know what our biggest play was tonight, but we didn't have a big play, and normally we've had several big plays either off the runs or play action or something. We just could never get going.

You know, it wasn't anything that we hadn't seen. I mean, they lined up pretty much the same way Clemson lined up, and the same way most everybody we've played lined up. They just did a better job of executing than we did.

Q. I know you guys obviously wanted to win this game, but being as far as you got this year, showing the improvement that you did, do you still feel like you guys showed a lot of things you can build on this season heading into next year?

COACH PAUL JOHNSON: Well, yeah. I told the guys in the locker room after the game I'm proud of them. They won 11 games, won the ACC Championship. We're still trying to lay a base or foundation. We've got a lot of areas that we need to get better at. We've got some guys hurt in certain areas, and there are still areas that gosh knows we've got to get a lot better at.

You know, we're going to keep working and try to get there. You're disappointed when you lose, and you should be because if it means anything, it ought to hurt. But you can't let that game take away from the season that they had. I'm very appreciative to the seniors on our team. We didn't have many. We had six scholarship seniors. But they've laid a foundation that hopefully we can build on.

Q. It looked like you were finally able to get some offensive yardage by going outside and toward the sidelines in the second half. What kind of adjustments were you able to make?

COACH PAUL JOHNSON: We had to double their inside guys. We were trying to combo-block and doing some of that in the first half. And quite honestly, we couldn't do it. We missed some blocks. It's like anything else, from an execution standpoint we weren't hitting any big plays. So when you miss the block or you miss the read, you got behind and you couldn't survive it.

You know, if you're making eight, nine, ten yards at a pop sometimes, you can survive a missed read or survive a missed block and get away with it. But, you know, in the first half the ends were able to play two guys because we weren't getting enough push inside. Then we tried

to block them some with the B-back and we missed. Missed a couple times. We missed a read or two, and that was it. When you're not making first downs, you're out of there. So they executed better than we did.

Q. Can you talk about the way your defense played. After giving up the first two scores, they seemed to really keep you guys in the game.

COACH PAUL JOHNSON: Yeah, we kept them off the scoreboard. You know, they moved the ball some. You know, we kind of buckled down after the first quarter, and really kept us in the game because it kept them off the scoreboard there. We had some chances to -- we had the ball twice with a chance to go ahead at 17-14. And we had it, you know, on our 6-yard line, and 8-yard line, but at least we had had it or 12 or whatever was backed up. I guess after they ran the fake field goal we had the ball at about the 12, I guess.

Then the first play we end up reversing field and getting tackled at the 1. Well, I think the first play after they ran the fake, we threw an interception there, so we kind of self-destructed ourself a little bit.

Q. You had just talked about kind of how you thought they'd line up. Was this a case of the physical superiority, the cancelling theory that you've talked about sometimes this season?

COACH PAUL JOHNSON: The defensive line for them was real good. We knew they were real good. I don't lay it all there. We just didn't execute very well. We put ourself behind the 8-ball with penalties, too. You know, when you start out two of the first three drives with penalties and we couldn't overcome it. When you don't have big plays, that's what happens.

There's a lot of areas that we've got to get better at. And that's one of them. We've got to get better inside. There is no joke about that. We've known that.

What does it mean to equal a program best 11 wins from 2002 and get the best BCS bowl win since the 1959 Rose Bowl when the Hawkeyes beat California?

“2002 was a long time ago for us. We have grown so much as a program. Our guys did such a great job preparing for this game. Most importantly, they just played a heck of a game tonight.”

Post-game Interview With:

COACH KIRK FERENTZ, RICKY STANZI & ADRIAN CLAYBORN

JASON ALPERT: Coach, if you could just open up by talking about what a FedEx Orange Bowl victory means to the Iowa football program.

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: First of all, I just want to thank everybody here. Everybody involved with the FedEx Orange Bowl, Eric, Phyllis, everybody on the Committee. We've never had a bad bowl experience, and this one surpassed every one we've had. Everybody here was just absolutely unbelievably hospitable. We're very, very appreciative of that.

To win this game meant an awful lot to our football team, especially against a team the caliber of Georgia Tech. They earned the right to be the ACC champions, and they're an outstanding football team. It was a very hard fought game. I thought both teams really competed hard. That being said I just can't say enough about the job our coaching staff did getting the players ready. And most importantly, the job our players did. It still comes down to what they do on the field. I thought both sides of the football and our special teams, everybody played a great football game tonight. So I'm just really proud of everybody involved. Especially our players. I can't say enough about our seniors, what they've meant to our program, how they finished up these past two years of leadership they provided. It's going to be a big void for us, but we're going to enjoy tonight.

Just want to again, thank them and compliment them on the great job they've done throughout their careers.

Q. There was some talk about it had been 51 years since Iowa had won a major bowl, a Rose Bowl in '59. How does it feel to win a BCS level bowl?

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: Fantastic. I haven't really focused too much on that. When we won in San Antonio back in 2001, that was a pretty good feeling. But tonight is just outstanding. We knew it was going to be tough, and it was. And that's just how good football games are, when you play a good opponent like we did.

But to come down here, the job our players did the entire time they were here. They prepared well, they kept their focus. They enjoyed the town, but clearly tonight it showed they did a great job during the course of the last eight or nine days. It's just a great, great feeling. I'm just really pleased for our players most of all.

Q. I know you joked a little about there being a tiebreaker and the Big Ten coming out with a winning record. But how seriously do you take representing the conference? The Big Ten's four wins against ranked teams, two BCS bowl wins now, what does that do for the Big Ten?

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: Yeah, we've beaten a couple conference champions as well. You know, it's a good feeling. I think each and every one of us, every member institution takes a lot of pride every time we go out and take the field against a non-league opponent. You know, that's certainly part of the territory.

But all that being said, you know, my number one concern is our football team and our players. But, you know, it's gratifying. Just on the side, again, I think it's way too easy just to generalize, you know, boy, this conference is down, that conference is down. You know, maybe this will put some of those theories to rest for at least six more months, four more months, I don't know. It's a good feeling. We take pride every time we take the field. If we do well, it's great for

our conference and we're very proud of our team.

Q. Adrian, nobody has really stifled this Georgia Tech offense the way you guys did tonight. How? Why? What caused all this?

ADRIAN CLAYBORN: I would just say Norm Parker. He put together a great plan for us, and we executed it. That's pretty much the reason why we stopped it. I mean, without Coach Parker we wouldn't have been able to work our blocks and get off and make tackles.

Q. Following on that, that was the biggest question I think coming in was how are you going to handle the offense. Especially three quarters you guys locked down the offense. Did you have a confidence, Kirk, knowing that your defense could do that or were you surprised by how well they were playing out there?

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: You know, we've played good defense all season long. This was a different challenge. I think I walked into Norm's office probably three and a half weeks now, maybe four, somewhere in that ballpark. You know, it struck me. I walked out and he was talking about the option how they used to play it all the time in spring practice, preseason camp and all season long in the '60s and '70s. And a couple years ago everybody thought Norm was too old. Now maybe it's good we had that wisdom.

It seems no matter who we play, he gets our defense ready. Our defensive staff does a great job preparing our guys. And most importantly our players doing a fantastic job. The fact that Adrian won the MVP in a BCS Bowl it doesn't happen too often when a defensive lineman dominates the way he did. But our whole group up front did a good job. Everybody played great football. That's what it takes against a team like Georgia Tech. They put the pressure on all 11 guys.

Q. This game feel at all like any of the nail-biters during the regular season? You guys had some chances where you looked like you were going to run away with it and they kept it close until the final minutes. Did it feel like those kind of games during the season?

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: For us this is a rout. Was it ten points, this is a rout for us. We were all breathing a sigh of relief. But very similar. Including our losses. We lost two ballgames by a touchdown and an overtime field goal.

That's just been the nature of our team this year. We've played an awful lot of close ballgames. Again, I think it's a real credit to our players. They just stay the course out there on the field. They don't get too high, too low. No matter what happens, they keep playing, and I tell you, they're a mentally tough group, and that's what it takes to finish games.

Q. Ricky, how did you feel out there? And how gratifying was it for you to finish this season like this?

RICKY STANZI: You know, coming into the game I felt great. The trainers did a great job of putting together a schedule to get me back in feeling healthy before the Bowl game. You know, this layover was a long time, but in a sense it was probably a good thing for me because I was able to heal up completely and not feel anything, any type of pain tonight.

It was just nice to be back out there with the guys and to get another game in on such a big stage. I mean, everyone did a tremendous job. It starts at the top with Coach Ferentz and the way he prepared us last year and following up this year with both those Bowl victories. You can't say enough.

The layover was so long. We could have had a million excuses, but he wasn't going to let that happen. And everyone did a great job of getting on board and taking the reins and doing what we had to do to get this victory.

Q. Adrian, you made a proclamation a couple weeks ago about your plans for next season. This highlight reel you had out there, are you not going to change anything?

ADRIAN CLAYBORN: No, nothing changed. I'm here for the long haul. I'm going into my fifth season as a senior, and I'll be back with the Hawks.

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: He's shooting for national awards now. That was a little prelim.

Q. A lot has been made of Derrick Morgan and some of the match-ups he was going to have. But it seemed like all night whether it was a freshman or Bulaga or even Tony Moeaki on a few plays blocking him, you seemed to take care of him. What did you think of the performance on him?

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: He's an

excellent player. We had a ton of respect for Derrick. You know, he broke loose a couple times. Had Rick on the flush a few moments or a few plays. But I thought our guys competed well. I was asked that question yesterday. We try not to change schemes. We really try to encourage our guys just to really focus and play with great technique. It's a little like playing their offense. When you play a guy like Morgan, you really have to be on top of your game each and every play because he's an explosive player. If you give him a crack, he's going to get through it.

I thought our guys competed hard up front, including our tight ends. You know, it's probably as good, as well as we've played maybe up front all season. I haven't seen the tape yet, but that was my impression on the sidelines.

I thought the guys really prepared well. We had some ups and downs, but I thought they came out and competed hard tonight. It wasn't a perfect game, but they competed hard.

Q. The fake field goal, was that called from the sidelines or did Murray call that when he got out there? How did that come about?

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: It's a (laughing) yeah, okay. It's a play that we have. We have to okay it from the sidelines going in. If we think we get the look, then we run it. And we did have the look. Their guy just did a good job of tracking Daniel down. But at that point the field goal would have affected the game, the touchdown would have dramatically affected the game. We thought we had a chance to execute it. I guess it worked better at Ohio State back in '03.

Q. Can you talk about the openings you saw and why you thought you were so successful tonight.

ADRIAN CLAYBORN: Like I said before, Coach Norm Parker's game plan really put us in position to make plays. They told us to play a minute and a half and just focus on the dot and come off from the quarterback. And that's what me and Bulaga did, and that's why we were so successful.

Q. How nice did that last play in the first half feel?

ADRIAN CLAYBORN: It felt great. I was surprised to be so free. I'm just lucky I caught him, because that's a fast quarterback.

Q. Are you figuring that you're probably going to finish 8th in the country again this year and be back in the position that you were for a couple of years? Just talk about being at the altitude that you are again.

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: I hadn't thought about what number we'd end up. But we told the guys at the beginning of the month, it's pretty academic. I think we're in most polls' 10. If we win tonight we move into the top 10; if we lose, we slide I don't know how far. We took care of that. It's very special. I think it makes it four out of eight years we've been in the Top 10. That doesn't come easy. Throw in a top 20 last year, so we're really happy about that.

But to win 11 games, that's significant. The second time it's been done. You look at the seniors, I've got two juniors sitting next to me. But the seniors with 20 wins in the last two years, that is awfully significant, too. These guys are a big part of that though. Both of these guys were a big part of what we did last year, certainly a huge part of what we've done this year. We'll enjoy this one for a couple of days and start thinking about next year.

Q. At least with us, with the big picture it's always fairly narrow. But wins like this tend to validate a career or become defining to a career. Have you given that much thought that this is a BCS win, Orange Bowl win?

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: Whose career (laughing)?

Q. Yours.

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: No, I haven't. I really haven't. We try to prepare as far as we can. We try to go out and compete as hard as we can. If we lost tonight, it wasn't going to be the end of the world. I would have been disappointed, and our players would have been, too. But it still would have been a great season.

You take it a week at a time, you do what you can. If you do everything you can and play well, then that's a good thing. You know, really the only Bowl game that sticks with me is the one last time we were here. Not because we lost, but just because the way we played that night. It was hardly representative of the kind of football team we had in 2002. To finish that way, it's tough to live with.

Tonight could have gone either way. We

were playing a great football team. We're thrilled to get the win, you know, big picture stuff again. I don't get too hung up on that. You know, we'll just take it as it comes.

Q. Ricky or Adrian, neither of you are seniors. How much does this win mean not only for the program but for guys that have been leaders since you've been at school here?

RICKY STANZI: I think it means a lot for the program and the guys that are here right now, especially the young guys. Like Coach said, you know, the senior leadership that we've had, it doesn't just start in the season, it started back in the off-season. You know, guys held each other accountable this year. You could sense that everyone wanted to accomplish something. You know, if we took it one week at a time. Like Coach Ferentz would always say, things would work out for us. We won't look ahead and we won't now. I think that's what's going about the way this team's built and the type of leadership that was handed down from last year's team, who was able to finish very strong.

You know, the seniors this year have just done a tremendous job of keeping that torch going and keeping good football -- keep that thing going and keeping it played here at Iowa.

Q. Did you envision a night like this? Not necessarily the stats or whatever, but just being able to play at this high a level personally? And could you talk about, I think it was a 3rd and 7 in the fourth quarter where you eluded and outran Morgan for the first down?

RICKY STANZI: As far as coming in and playing well, we've done a lot of preparation as a team and that started during Bowl prep. Which seems like forever ago, I don't even know how long or when we even started. But we've had so many practices that we knew what our game plan was and we just wanted to execute. That's what good football always comes down to.

And our defense played tremendous. They're the heart and soul of this team. They always have been, all season long. We were able to feed off their momentum and energy and we were able to get some points on the board.

I think everyone felt good about what the game plan was and how we could attack them and kind of exploit some things. Of course when the defense is playing so well and giving us opportunities, you're able to make more plays.

Q. It's easy to look right now at the foundation that you have and what you may have coming back next year. So do you catch yourself looking ahead that next year could be even more special, if you want to say that, than this year? And also the seniors that you have that are leaving in their last game?

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: Yeah, they go together. The big challenge for us a year ago, we didn't have a big senior class. It's really very similar to this year. Both teams on the field tonight are relatively young. Not a lot of seniors on either side of the football.

But last year the guys we lost were not only great players, but they gave us such a strong base of leadership. It won't be any different this year. You look at Pat Angerer comes to mind right off the bat. And Edds over there, two linebackers that are very, very savvy guys. And offensively there is a guy like Tony out there at the tight end position, so I'll go right down the line. It's going to start with that.

That being said we've got a very strong junior class and some guys coming up the ladder. Wegher had a nice night, and Robinson, certainly. So we'll get some players back. But we'll have our challenges.

You flash back to after our first ballgame coming off the field. I don't think anybody envisioned us sitting here tonight with our 11th win. That's just a good reminder of how tough it is to win in college football. Nothing comes easy. It just happened. Doesn't matter how many seniors are experienced players, we come back and we'll have to earn it all again next year. But it's going to be fun trying.

Q. The Big Ten, you got the win to give them four?

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: Yeah, that was you in that room yesterday that threw that at me.

Q. Right.

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: I was having a great day until then. But, no, we're thrilled.

Q. Well, you're having a great evening.

COACH KIRK FERENTZ: Yeah, we are. We're going to enjoy it a little bit longer, too.
