SCOUTING UPPER IOWA:

The Peacocks are 5-13 on the year. Upper lowa was on a five-game winning streak after sweeping Pittsburg State in a four-game series and beating Truman State -- however are currently on a 10-game losing streak since. Ten of the Peacock's games have been postponed or cancelled this year.

Upper lowa is led by outfielders Tom Longoni and Kreston Albright they account for 25 of the Peacocks 76 RBI.

The Peacock pitching staff has an accumulative 6.07 ERA and opponents are hitting .312 off of them. Former Hawkeye Danny Bales leads the staff with 19 strikeouts in 17.1 innings. The southpaw transferred to Kirkwood Community College after sitting two years at lowa recovering from shoulder surgery.

lowa leads the all-time series, 22-7.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS STATE:

Illinois State is off to a 11-7 start this season, with a 3-1 record at home. The Redbirds are scheduled to take on the Illinois Fighting Illini Tuesday before the Hawkeyes come to town.

Redshirt sophomore Tyler McNeely leads the team with a .590 slugging percentage, eight doubles,11 walks and seven stolen bases.

The probable starter for the Redbirds is RHP Quinn Ewert. Ewert has a 12.15 ERA on the year with a 0-2 record. Opponents are hitting .414 against him in his four appearances on the mound.

lowa trails the series between the two schools, 9-7.

SCOUTING PURDUE:

Purdue is currently 10-10 on the year and 1-1 in the Big Ten after splitting with Northwestern last weekend and having the final game of the series snowed out. The Boilermakers are slated to play Louisville and IPFU at home this week before hosting the Hawkeyes.

The Boilermakers are led by Dan Black, who is only hitting 286 on the year but leads the team in at bats (70), home runs (8), RBI (25), walks (25), strikeouts (17) and on base percentage (.480).

The Purdue pitching staff is led by RHP Matt Bischoff and LHP Matt Jansen. Both have picked up two wins for the Boilermakers and have 37 and 38 strikeouts, respectively. Bischoff has a complete game under his belt, also.

The Hawkeyes lead the all-time series between the two schools, 80-60-1.

IOWA ENDS SEVEN-GAME LOSING STREAK TO WOLVERINES, BUT DROPS SERIES, 2-1:

lowa dropped the series finale against Michigan Sunday afternoon, 7-5. The game was delayed three hours after the lowa grounds-crew needed the extra time to remove last night's snow fall.

Three costly Hawkeye errors in the top of the eighth inning proved to be the difference in today's rubber match. In total, the Hawkeyes were charged with a season-high five errors.

lowa's bullpen of **Michael Jacobs**, **Nick Erdman** and **Patrick Schatz** had a solid performance, allowing only two unearned runs on three hits and struck out five in five and two-third innings.

The Hawkeyes snapped a sevengame losing streak to the defending Big Ten champion Michigan Wolverines with a 2-1 pitching dual victory Saturday.

In his first start as a Hawkeye, true freshman Jarred Hippen went six and two-third innings in a no decision. Hippen struck out a season-high nine Wolverines and scattered five hits and allowed only one earned run. Steve **Turnbull** faced five batters and picked up the win, only allowing one hit and striking out two in the seventh and eighth innings. Closer Mike Schurz earned his third save of the season. retiring the Wolverines in order in the ninth. Iowa's three pitchers accounted for a combined 12 strikeouts, which is one shy of a team season high (13 vs. South Alabama on Feb. 28).

lowa fell to Michigan in the late innings, 4-3, Friday. After scoring the first three runs of the game, Michigan scored the final four to escape with the win.

The Hawkeyes jumped to an early lead in the first; however Michigan pitcher Kevin Fetter silenced the lowa offense allowing only one hit in the next eight innings. Fetter threw his first of complete game the season to earn his fourth victory.

TOOLE GETS HOT IN BIG TEN PLAY: Justin Toole led the Hawkeye offensive effort in their series against the Wolverines. Toole went 4-for-11 (.364) with a run scored and a walk.

2009 BRINGS CHANGES:

Beginning with the 2009 season, Big Ten baseball series shall consist of three nine-inning games.

If weather or travel problems prevent play on the originally scheduled days, the teams may mutually agree to play on different days.

All games must be completed to nine innings unless the final game of the series is stopped because of rain or darkness. In that case, the last game will count if it has become regulation (four and one-half or five innings).

If a game is stopped before completion, it will become a suspended game and completed the following day. The suspended game must be played to its nine-inning conclusion before a new game can begin.

If Game 1 is not played on the first day, two nine-inning games shall be played on the second day. If Game 2 has not started on the second day, two nine-inning games shall be played on the third and final day.

ON THE TUBE:

The Hawkeyes will be on the Big Ten Network five times in 2009. The five scheduled dates tie for the most of any Big Ten school along with Michigan and Ohio State. Four of the five contests will be broadcasted from Duane Banks Field. Also, this year will mark the first year that that BTN will cover all Big Ten Tournament games.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



DAHM AT IOWA

Jack Dahm completed his sixth season as head coach of the University of lowa baseball team. He has compiled an 417-441-2 overall record and is 134-165 at lowa. Dahm coached in his 800th career game on March 30th this year at Michigan. He is lowa's third-winningest baseball coach.

Last season, lowa took another step forward by recording its best record in 14 years with a 31-23 mark. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13. Iowa earned its second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

In Dahm's 14 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his four years at lowa, Dahm has coached 19 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers.

Before coming to lowa City, Dahm spent 18 years as a member of the Creighton Bluejay base-ball program. He left the Bluejays as the winningest coach in school history, having compiled 283 wins against 276 losses in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Twenty-seven of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues. In the past three years, nine Hawkeyes have inked contracts with professional teams, including three last spring.

In the classroom, Iowa is in the 90th-percentile in the NCAAs Academic Progress Report, placing them in the top 30 baseball programs, academically. During his Iowa tenure, Dahm has seen 33 players named academic all-Big Ten, including a team-record ten players in 2006. That is the best four-year total in the history of the program.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 15 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey.

The ninth inning is also a Black and Gold battery favorite, outscoring opponents 17-7 in last inning rallies.

HAWKEYE OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS:

The Hawkeye offense is hitting .287 on the year and each individual has done its part in different situations.

Tyson Blaser leads the team in batting average against southpaw pitching (.467), whereas **Phil Keppler** is hitting a solid .400 against right-handed pitching.

Chett Zeise is hitting .400 with runners on base and T.J. Cataldo is hitting .387 with runners in scoring position -- having 11 RBI in two-out situations. Cleanup hitter Wes Freie is hitting a staggering .588 when he leads the inning off. Andrew Ewing is the Hawkeyes' pinch hitter of choice, hitting .400 in the situation.

JT IS STREAKIN':

Senior **Justin Toole** leads the Hawkeyes with a current 10-game hitting streak. Toole also leads the team in multi-hit games with 10.

IMPROVING PITCHING:

The Hawkeye pitching staff has gotten noticeably better each game throughout the season, improving the staff's overall ERA to 5.83 in the past few weeks.

Lefty swinging opponents are hitting .167 against **Phil Schreiber**, whereas right-handed hitters have yet to get a hit on **Kevin Lee** and are hitting only .120 on **Patrick Schatz**.

Freshman starter **Nick Brown's** bread and butter is getting opponents to ground out, having 26 of them doing so. **Michael Jacobs** has had five opponents hit into double plays against him, leading the team.

Hawkeye setup man, **Steve Turnbull** is averaging 4.3 strikeouts per walk.

TOOLE NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Justin Toole scored nine runs while driving in six and raising his batting average 51 points to .353 mark. The senior tallied four multi-hit games in six contests and racked up four extrabase hits. For the week, Toole batted .440 with a .680 slugging percentage and a .533 on-base percentage to combine for an OPS of 1.213. He is currently on a 10-game hitting streak.

OFFENSE HITS OVER THE FENCES:

lowa currently has 18 home runs on the year, three shy of the season total in 2008. **Wes Freie** and **T.J. Cataldo** lead the Black and Gold with four bombs, respectively. (Freie had a total of four last season.) Ten Hawkeyes have recorded a round-tripper.

SCHATZ EXCELS ON THE MOUND:

After seeing limited time on the mound a year ago, **Patrick Schatz** has made himself into one of lowa's go-to guys in the long reliever role.

Schatz has a team-best 2.25 ERA in 20 innings pitched and has allowed only five earned runs all year -- which is saying something, considering Schatz has come into the game in some sticky situations.

HIPPEN MAKES IMPACT:

Freshman southpaw **Jarred Hippen** has been consistent for the Hawkeyes on the mound. The lowa reliever turned starter against Michigan on Saturday, went six and two-third innings in a no decision performance. Hippen is third on the team with a 2.55 ERA and is tied for the most innings pitched on the year with 24.2.

IOWA GETS THE WIN OVER NO. 25:

lowa finished a three-game series against No. 25 Louisville, 1-2. Iowa upset the Cardinals on March 15 with a 2-1 score in Louisville, KY. The Hawkeye pitching staff held Louisville to its lowest scoring output since April 20, 2008, against Villanova in a 3-1 loss.

Starter **Michael Jacobs** earned the win with a solid outing, going six innings and allowing just one run. Jacobs also earned lowa's last win against a ranked opponent (6-3 win at No. 5 Vanderbilt last season). **Patrick Schatz** pitched one and two-third solid innings of relief -- forcing four Cardinal ground outs. **Mike Schurz** recorded the save going one and one-third innings with two strikeouts.

HOEF REMAINS IOWA'S "HUMAN PINATA":

The senior career hit-by-pitch leader has consistently been beamed by pitches all season. **Kevin Hoef** leads the Big Ten with 14 hit-by-pitches this season, tying his season total as a sophomore.

OFFENSE GETS HOT AT SKYHAWK:

lowa crushed Tennessee-Martin at Skyhawk Field March 18, 25-6. In the win, lowa's bats came alive recording 25 hits, two from the school record (27 in 1986). Five Hawkeyes recorded home runs (the record is eight in a game) and nine had multi-hit games. It was the highest scoring lowa game since 1989 (W, 32-0 vs. Quincy College).

DAHM TAKES OVER #3:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history Saturday in the 9-4 win over Western Illinois. Dahm currently has 131 wins at Iowa.

Last season, Dahm captured his 400th career victory on April 23 against UNI. Dahm recorded 283 victories at Creighton and has won 122 at lowa.

Dahm started in 1994 with his alma mater, Creighton University, and moved on to coach the Hawkeyes in 2003.

ZEISE CONTINUES TO SHINE:

Chett Zeise made his first career start as a Hawkeye against Georgetown and has played in every game since. The versatile freshman (who can play infield and outfield) is hitting .331 on the year.

FREIE NAMED HONORABLE MENTION:

Wes Freie made his third career start Sunday against Georgetown after a two-year hiatus on the mound and picked up the win.

Freie hit a solo homer to tie the game in the fourth and pitched five innings with seven strikeouts-- keeping the Hoyas off balance.

For his pitching, as well as hitting at DH, Freie was named honorable mention at utility for the College Baseball 360 all-Tournament team. Freie ended the weekend going 2-for-8 with four runs scored, a home run, two RBI and three walks.

2009 CAPTAINS:

This season the Hawkeyes voted on captains, marking the first time at lowa under coach Dahm. Senior **Justin Toole** and juniors **Michael Jacobs** and **Tyson Blaser** were given the honor of captain this past fall.

FRESHMEN GIVE DEPTH:

lowa's freshman class has was ranked the 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker last season. (The highest of any Big Ten team.)

Four true freshman, Nick Brown, Sean Flanagan, Jarred Hippen and Phil Schreiber, will give the pitching staff needed depth and make an early impact.

The other five freshman, Dallas Burke, Andrew Ewing, Andrew Host, Mike McQuillan and Chett Zeise will add a healthy internal competition and make the Black and Gold's experienced defense stronger.

SCHEDULE STRENGTH:

lowa will compete against some tough teams in 2009. The Hawkeyes' schedule has four NCAA Tournament qualifiers, including: Michigan, Louisville, Nebraska and St. John's.

The Hawkeyes will face three of the four on the road -- Louisville is rated 11th in the pre-season by NCBW.

Michigan will come to town for the Big Ten opener in March, ranked 30th preseason by NCBW.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin" Ray Gilmore, who serves as lowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for lowa Baseball.

lowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 864-795-3 (.521).

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

Every year the UI Department of Athletics make improvements to Banks Field. The baseball program is very excited about the installation of 500 stadium chair back seats behind home plate. The major installation should be complete this year.

2009 UNITY COUNCIL:

The Unity Council is a group elected by their teammates to communicate internally with the coaches on behalf of their teammates. This years council includes: senior **Kevin Hoef**, senior **Justin Toole**, junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Michael Jacobs** and sophomore **Kurtis Muller**.

SAME FACE, NEW PLACE:

Chris Maliszewski is the Hawkeyes' new pitching coach. Maliszewski replaces Nick Zumsande, who was lowa's pitching coach the previous five

seasons.

Maliszewski returns to his alma mater after serving two seasons as the outfield and catching instructor and recruiting coordinator at Valparaiso University.

He was a four-year letter winner with the Hawkeyes, posting a 7-10 career record with three saves. As a sophomore, he earned the victory over Illinois, sending lowa to the conference tournament for the first time since 1991.

HAWKEYES SIGN THREE STANDOUTS: Matt Dermody, Ricky Sandquist, and Dan Sheppard have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa.

Dermody, a Norwalk, IA, native was recruited as a left-handed pitcher. He is the third-ranked pitcher in lowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sandquist is from Fort Dodge, IA and will be used as a right-handed pitcher. He is the fourth-best pitcher in state of lowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sheppard a Downers Grove, IL, native is an athletic catcher who can also play outfield. He is the top-ranked catcher in the state of Illinois by Perfect Game Cross Checker and Prep Baseball Report.

LAST SEASON:

The lowa baseball team finished its season 22-33 overall and 10-22 in conference play.

lowa's Big Ten triumphs included a series win over Indiana, taking three from the Hoosiers in Bloomington. Iowa finished as the fourth-best hitting team in the conference with a .316 average, fifth in fielding with a .960 and ninth in pitching with a 6.63 ERA.

Nationally, the team was third in stolen bases, 19th in hit by pitches, 29th in triples, 39th in sacrifice flies and 44th in batting average.

One of the biggest triumphs of 2008 was a victory against No. 5 Vander-bilt on the Commodores' home field, 12-9.

Another season highlight was midweek games. Iowa went 7-4 during these non-conference games.

As a team, the Black and Gold broke a couple school records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team, the previous record of 127 was set in 1981.

The team also set a record with a team total of 86 hit-by-pitches, breaking the previous record of 83, which was set last season.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach Jack Dahm is assisted by coach Ryan Brownlee and coach Chris Maliszewski, along with volunteer coach Kris Welker.

Ryan Brownlee embarks on his sixth season as lowa's hitting, infield instructor and recruiting coordinator.

Over the past eight seasons, Brownlee has had 16 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts.

Last season, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and hitting helped establish several team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was in 1981. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Brownlee's recruiting was a success in 2008. The incoming class was ranked the 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker. lowa's ranking of 49 is the highest of any Big Ten team.

Chris Maliszewski is starting his first season as assistant coach for the Hawkeyes, replace Nick Zumsande.

Maliszewski returns to his alma mater after serving two seasons as the outfield and catching instructor and recruiting coordinator at Valparaiso University.

Prior to joining Valparaiso's staff, Maliszewski was a volunteer assistant coach for Dahm and the Hawkeyes in 2005 and 2006. Working with the pitching staff in 2005, he helped lead the Black and Gold to one of their most successful seasons in the program's history, posting a 19-13 Big Ten mark.

Maliszewski has also coached in the Northwoods League, a top collegiate summer league.

Kris Welker is in his third season as the team's volunteer assistant. Welker works with the lowa catchers and outfielders, prepares scouting reports, coordinates team travel, coaches first base and is lowa's camp coordinator.

As a player, Welker was a key member of the Hawkeyes in 2004 and 2005. As a senior, Welker earned third team all-Big Ten honors, helping lowa to a third-place finish in the Big Ten and a trip to the conference tournament. He lead the team with a .354 batting average, 46 RBI and 16 doubles.
