SCOUTING NORTHERN IOWA:

The Panthers are 15-24 with a 2-2 record at neutral sites. They are currently on a six-game skid, after losing two to Wichita State last weekend.

The Northern Iowa offense is led by Travis Bennett. He is hitting .340 with a team-best 37 RBI and .513 slugging percentage.

The Panthers are led by reliever Zach Zirbel with a 1.93 ERA in 15 appearances. He has amassed 21 strikeouts in 23.1 innings pitched.

Iowa leads the all-time series between the two schools, 68-23-1.

SCOUTING CREIGHTON:

The Jays are 23-18 and 5-10 on the road this season. They are slated to play South Dakota State Tuesday before coming to town Wednesday.

Darin Ruf leads the Jays, offensively. He is hitting .311 with a team best in home runs (7), RBI (40), slugging percentage (.536) and walks (28). The team is hitting .302 and has six starters who have played all 41 of its games.

The Creighton pitching staff has a 3.82 ERA and are led by starter Jonas Dufek. Dufek has a 3.62 ERA with nine starts and two complete games.

Iowa leads the series, 11-9.

SCOUTING MINNESOTA:

The Gophers are 27-12 and 10-4 in the conference after sweeping Purdue at home last weekend.

The Gopher offense is led by Derek McCallum who is hitting a team-best .395 overall with 11 homers, 55 RBI and a monster .704 slugging percentage. The team is hitting .323 in the conference, with McCallum leading the way with a .434 average and .849 slugging percentage.

Minnesota hurlers, Chauncy Handran, Tom Buske and Seth Rosin are slated to start against the Hawkeyes. Handran leads the staff in Big Ten strikeouts (27) Buske has the best ERA of a starter with a 2.34. Rosin leads the team with a 3-0 record in conference play.

Iowa trails the series between the schools, 165-105.

NUMBER OF THE WEEK = 10:

Ten of Iowa's 14 victories have come with Iowa scoring eight runs or more. The Hawkeyes have posted only four wins this year when plating seven runs or fewer.

MICHIGAN STATE SUMMARY:

The Michigan State Spartans completed a three-game sweep over the Iowa Hawkeye baseball team with a 14-5 win Sunday.

Iowa fell to Michigan State Saturday, 15-4. The Spartan offense came out swinging in the first and never trailed. The Hawkeyes left 15 on base, 11 of which were in scoring position and lost two starters due to injury in the competition.

The Hawkeyes dropped a slugfest Friday to Michigan State, 15-10. Despite scoring runs in six innings and outhitting the Spartans 15-14, Michigan State's offense pushed past the Hawkeyes.

To lead Iowa, offensively, last weekend was **Sean Flanagan** going 6-for-11 with two doubles, three walks and a homer. **Kody McManis** who went 4-for-6 with four RBI. **Mike McQuillean** went 7-for-13 with three RBI and a triple. **Dallas Burke** went 3-for-6, **Kevin Hoef** went 5-for-11.

OBERMUELLER THROWS 1ST PITCH:

Major League pitcher and former Hawkeye standout **Wes Obermueller** will throw out the first pitch at the final Corridor Classic.

Obermuller was drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the second round of the 1999 draft. Since then, he has played with the Milwaukee Brewers, Atlanta Braves and Florida Marlins. He has a 5.82 ERA in the majors and is currently a free agent.

Obermueller, a Vinton, IA native, transferred to Iowa his sophomore season from Kirkwood Community College. He was an outfielder at Kirkwood, came to Iowa as a shortstop and was moved to the mound as a junior. Obermueller collected 91 strikeouts during the 1999 season, while also compiling a .352 batting average with 24 RBI.

TOOLE IS OUT FOR THE SEASON:

On his first at bat of game two against the Spartans, **Justin Toole** wore a pitch off his forearm. Despite being injured, Toole proceeded to steal two bases before being taken out of the game and to the hospital.

Toole ended the season with a .346 batting average, team-best 13 doubles and 15 stolen bases.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



Jack Dahm completed his fifth season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball team. He has compiled an 422-454-2 overall record and is 139-178 at Iowa. Dahm coached in his 800th career game on March 30th this year at Michigan. He is Iowa's third-winningest baseball coach.

In 2007, Iowa took another step forward by recording its best record in 14 years with a 31-23 mark. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13. Iowa earned its second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

In Dahm's 14 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his four years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 19 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers.

Before coming to Iowa City, Dahm spent 18 years as a member of the Creighton Bluejays baseball program. He left the Bluejays as the winningest coach in school history, having compiled 283 wins against 276 losses in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Twenty-seven of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues. In the past three years, nine Hawkeyes have inked contracts with professional teams, including three last spring.

In the classroom, Iowa is in the 90th-percentile in the NCAAs Academic Progress Report, placing them in the top 30 baseball programs, academically. During his Iowa tenure, Dahm has seen 33 players named academic all-Big Ten, including a team-record ten players in 2006. That is the best four-year total in the history of the program.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 15 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey.

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** says that senior catcher **Kody McManis** is a "day-to-day" case and could see action this weekend at Minnesota.

McManis took a pitch off the face Saturday against Michigan State and missed game three of the series.

FLANAGAN AS A STARTER:

Freshman **Sean Flanagan** has started six of the last seven games out in left field for the Hawkeyes. He is hitting 11-for-23 (.478) as a starter with three doubles, two homers and a whopping .870 slugging percentage.

HITS, HITS, HITS!

Seventeen Hawkeyes have recorded at least one multi-hit game this season. Leading the team is **Justin Toole** with 17, followed by **Ryan Durant** with 16 and **T.J. Cataldo** with 12.

Nine players are hitting above .300 so far this season, five of which are freshmen who have capitalized on their chances to play.

BULLPEN KEEPS IOWA IN GAMES:

The Hawkeye bullpen has thrown well in the Big Ten -- with a 4.02 ERA in 49.2 innings pitched. Leading Iowa's relievers are **Kevin Lee**, **Kyle Heim**, **Jeff Pacha** and **Steve Turnbull**.

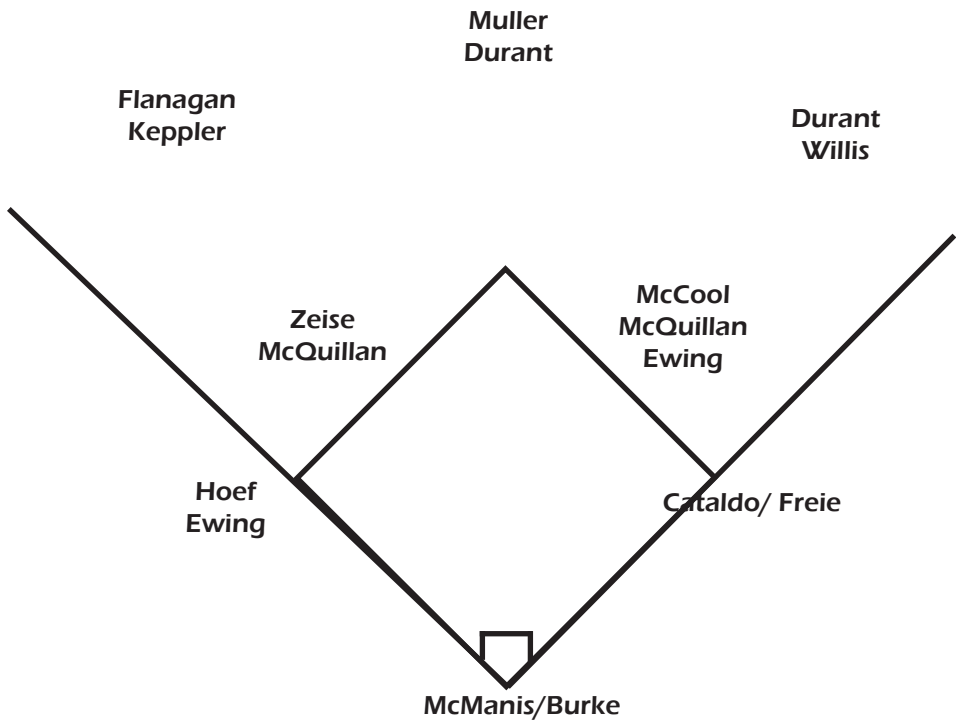

FRESHMAN BIG TEN STARTERS:

For the first time under Head Coach **Jack Dahm** the Hawkeyes are starting three freshman during Big Ten contests. **Nick Brown, Jarred Hippen** and **Phil Schreiber** will take the mound again this week.

"Each one of them has earned their starts, it wasn't given to them," Dahm said.

IN THE BIG TEN:

Iowa ranks third in Big Ten doubles (81), first in hit-by-pitch (61) and second in stolen bases (60).

HOEF'S HBP COUNT:

Kevin Hoef took one for the team against Michigan State this weekend, putting his season total at 18. He is now second in the season hit-by-pitch record book. The single season-high is 20, set by him a year ago.

SCHATZ EXCELS ON THE MOUND:

After seeing limited time on the mound a year ago, **Patrick Schatz** has made himself into one of Iowa's go-to guys in the long reliever role.

Schatz has a 2.86 ERA in 34.2 innings pitched. Opponents are only hitting .203 against him -- which is saying something, considering Schatz has come into the game in some sticky situations.

BLASER IS OUT FOR THE COUNT:

Tyson Blaser, who was plagued with injuries last season, had season-ending surgery about a month ago.

IOWA OFFENSE GETS GOING IN 2ND:

The Hawkeyes have out scored opponents 45-18 in the second inning.

The Iowa bullpen is able to seal the deal and get the win if the team is winning after the sixth inning, Iowa is 12-0 in that situation.

OFFENSE HITS OVER THE FENCES:

Iowa currently has 27 home runs on the year, which is four more than all of last year. **Wes Freie** leads the way with six and **T.J. Cataldo** has five bombs to lead the squad. (Freie had a total of four last season.) Ten Hawkeyes have recorded a round-tripper.

Kevin Hoef and **Sean Flanagan** hit big flies last weekend vs. Michigan State.

IOWA GETS THE WIN OVER NO. 25:

Iowa finished a three-game series against No. 25 Louisville, 1-2. Iowa upset the Cardinals on March 15 with a 2-1 score in Louisville, KY. The Hawk-eye pitching staff held Louisville to its lowest scoring output since April 20, 2008, against Villanova in a 3-1 loss.

Starter **Michael Jacobs** earned the win with a solid outing, going six innings and allowing just one run. Jacobs also earned Iowa's last win against a ranked opponent (6-3 win at No. 5 Vanderbilt last season). **Patrick Schatz** pitched one and two-third solid innings of relief -- forcing four Cardinal ground outs. **Mike Schurz** recorded the save going one and one-third innings with two strikeouts.

DAHM TAKES OVER #3:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history Saturday in the 9-4 win over Western Illinois. Dahm currently has 139 wins at Iowa.

Last season, Dahm captured his 400th career victory on April 23 against UNI. Dahm recorded 283 victories at Creighton and has won 122 at Iowa.

Dahm started in 1994 with his alma mater, Creighton University, and moved on to coach the Hawkeyes in 2003.

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

Every year the UI Department of Athletics make improvements to Banks Field. The baseball program is very excited about the installation of 500 stadium chair back seats behind home plate. The major installation should be complete this year.

2009 UNITY COUNCIL:

The Unity Council is a group elected by their teammates to communicate internally with the coaches on behalf of their teammates. This year's council includes: senior **Kevin Hoef**, senior **Justin Toole**, junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Michael Jacobs** and sophomore **Kurtis Muller**.

2009 CAPTAINS:

OFFENSE GETS HOT AT SKYHAWK:

Iowa crushed Tennessee-Martin at Skyhawk Field March 18, 25-6. In the win, Iowa's bats came alive recording 25 hits, two from the school record (27 in 1986). Five Hawkeyes recorded home runs (the record is eight in a game) and nine had multi-hit games. It was the highest scoring Iowa game since 1989 (W, 32-0 vs. Quincy College).

TOOLE NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Justin Toole picked up his first Big Ten Player of the Week honor on March 23rd after an outstanding numbers on the spring trip. He scored nine runs while driving in six and raising his batting average 51 points to .353 mark. The senior tallied four multi-hit games in six contests and racked up four extra-base hits. For the week, Toole batted .440 with a .680 slugging percentage and a .533 on-base percentage to combine for an OPS of 1.213. He is currently on a 10-game hitting streak.

FREIE NAMED HONORABLE MENTION:

Wes Freie made his third career start against Georgetown after a two-year hiatus on the mound and picked up the win.

Freie hit a solo homer to tie the game in the fourth and pitched five innings with seven strikeouts -- keeping the Hoyas off balance.

For his pitching, as well as hitting at DH, Freie was named honorable mention at utility for the College Baseball 360 all-Tournament team. Freie ended the weekend going 2-for-8 with four runs scored, a home run, two RBI and three walks.

FRESHMEN GIVE DEPTH:

Iowa's freshman class has been ranked the 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker last season. (The highest of any Big Ten team.)

Four true freshman, **Nick Brown**, **Sean Flanagan**, **Jarred Hippen** and **Phil Schreiber**, will give the pitching staff needed depth and make an impact.

The other five freshman, **Dallas Burke**, **Andrew Ewing**, **Andrew Host**, **Mike McQuillan** and **Chett Zeise** will add a healthy internal competition and make the Black and Gold's experienced defense stronger.

T.J. WALKS HIS WAY INTO RECORDBOOK:

T.J. Cataldo walked a career-high four times in Iowa's 15-7 victory over Purdue on April 3rd. His four walks puts him in the record books for a game high, the last time a Hawkeye did so was 2007 (Jason White). Cataldo currently has eight on the year.

SAME FACE, NEW PLACE:

Chris Maliszewski is the Hawkeyes' new pitching coach. Maliszewski replaces Nick Zumsande, who was Iowa's pitching coach the previous five seasons.

Maliszewski returns to his alma mater after serving two seasons as the outfield and catching instructor and recruiting coordinator at Valparaiso University.

He was a four-year letter winner with the Hawkeyes, posting a 7-10 career record with three saves. As a sophomore, he earned the victory over Illinois, sending Iowa to the conference tournament for the first time since 1991.

HAWKEYES SIGN THREE STANDOUTS:

Matt Dermody, **Ricky Sandquist**, and **Dan Sheppard** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa.

Dermody, a Norwalk, IA, native was recruited as a left-handed pitcher. He is the third-ranked pitcher in Iowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sandquist is from Fort Dodge, IA and will be used as a right-handed pitcher. He is the fourth-best pitcher in state of Iowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sheppard a Downers Grove, IL, native is an athletic catcher who can also play outfield. He is the top-ranked catcher in the state of Illinois by Perfect Game Cross Checker and Prep Baseball Report.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 869-808-3 (.521).

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Kris Welker**.

Ryan Brownlee embarks on his sixth season as Iowa's hitting, infield instructor and recruiting coordinator.

Over the past eight seasons, Brownlee has had 16 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts.

Last season, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and hitting helped establish several team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was in 1981. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Brownlee's recruiting was a success in 2008. The incoming class was ranked the 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker. Iowa's ranking of 49 is the highest of any Big Ten team.

Chris Maliszewski is starting his first season as assistant coach for the Hawkeyes, replace Nick Zumsande.

Maliszewski returns to his alma mater after serving two seasons as the outfield and catching instructor and recruiting coordinator at Valparaiso University.

Prior to joining Valparaiso's staff, Maliszewski was a volunteer assistant coach for Dahm and the Hawkeyes in 2005 and 2006. Working with the pitching staff in 2005, he helped lead the Black and Gold to one of their most successful seasons in the program's history, posting a 19-13 Big Ten mark.

Maliszewski has also coached in the Northwoods League, a top collegiate summer league.

Kris Welker is in his third season as the team's volunteer assistant. Welker works with the Iowa catchers and outfielders, prepares scouting reports, coordinates team travel, coaches first base and is Iowa's camp coordinator.

As a player, Welker was a key member of the Hawkeyes in 2004 and 2005. As a senior, Welker earned third team all-Big Ten honors, helping Iowa to a third-place finish in the Big Ten and a trip to the conference tournament. He led the team with a .354 batting average, 46 RBI and 16 doubles.
