THE CY-HAWK SERIES

- Iowa leads Iowa State in the annual Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series, 12-10. A win over the Cyclones on Wednesday would seal the series win for the Hawkeyes.
- Since its inception in 2004, Iowa has won the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk series five times. The Cyclones clinched their sixth victory last season.
- Iowa softball owns a 32-29-2 advantage in the all-time series. The Cyclones defeated the Hawkeyes, 5-4, at Pearl Field last season.

SCOUTING IOWA STATE

- The Cyclones own a 19-29 overall record and a 1-11 mark in Big 12 Conference action.
- Four Cyclones are hitting above .300 on the season, including: Brittany Gomez (.406), Aly Cappaert (.350), Cathlin Bingham (.342), and Kirsten Caudle (.311).
- Emma Hylan leads the Cyclones in the circle with a 4.51 ERA and an 8-11 record.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

- A win over the Cyclones on Wednesday would seal the in-state sweep for the Hawkeyes.
- Iowa defeated Northern Iowa, 6-3, on April 12 at Bob Pearl Field, before registering a walk-off win over Drake in eight innings on April 13.

HEAD COACH MARLA LOOPER



Marla Looper concluded her fifth season as the head coach for the University of Iowa softball program in 2015. Looper owns a 132-179-1 overall and 53-80 Big Ten Conference record since the 2011 season.

In 2015, Looper led the Hawkeyes to their deepest Big Ten Tournament run since 2008. After earning the No. 10 seed with an 8-15 conference record (19-40 overall), the Hawkeyes overcame a three-run deficit against seventh-seeded Rutgers to win the opening round of the tournament on May 7. The Hawkeyes went on to upset the nationally ranked Gophers with a 2-0 victory, securing Iowa's third victory over a ranked opponent on the season (No. 17 UCF, No. 4 Michigan). After falling behind early in its semifinal game against third-seeded Nebraska, Iowa rallied to come within three runs, but could not complete the comeback as the Huskers notched the 9-6 victory.

Megan Blank earned her fourth-straight first team All-Big Ten honor and was a first team NFCA All-Midwest Region selection after leading the Hawkeyes in batting average, slugging percentage, on base percentage, hits, doubles, triples, home runs, RBIs, and total bases. She was also named to the conference's All-Defensive team. Blank broke or tied five school records in her final season as a Hawkeye, and went on to sign a professional contract in the National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) with the Chicago Bandits.

The Hawkeyes excelled in the classroom in 2015. Three Hawkeyes -- juniors Haley Hansel and Whitney Repole and sophomore Kara Misel -- were named to the spring Academic All-Big Ten team, while Hansel and

freshmen Sarah Kurtz and Cheyenne Pratt were recognized as National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-American Scholar Athletes. Hansel was also named a 2015 Big Ten distinguished scholar.

Looper collected her 100th career victory in the 2014 season finale, when Erin Erickson delivered a walkoff, two-run home run to lift the Hawkeyes past Ohio State, 3-2. On the season, Iowa posted 16 wins -- nine in conference action and three over ranked opponents (16-30-1).

Megan Blank earned her third-straight first team All-Big Ten honor and was a second team NFCA All-Midwest Region selection after leading the Hawkeyes in batting average, slugging percentage, hits, doubles, triples, RBIs and walks. Kayla Massey earned her second career Big Ten Pitcher of the Week nod on March 31 after recording two complete game wins over Wisconsin. Three earned Academic All-Big Ten accolades including Haley Hansel, Whitney Repole and Michelle Zoeller.

Looper led the Hawkeyes to 30 wins in 2013 (30-24) in her third year, marking the most wins for the program since finishing 42-16 in 2009. Iowa posted six wins over ranked opponents.

Three Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten honors -- Megan Blank was named to the first team, Johnnie Dowling earned second team honors, and Kayla Massey was named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team at pitcher. Blank earned her second-straight first team accolade, becoming the sixth Hawkeye in program history to earn first team honors in each of her first two seasons.

Blank was also named a 2013 NFCA First Team All-Midwest Region selection, earning her second all-region honor in as many seasons. Blank became the sixth Hawkeye in program history to garner all-region honors in each of her first two seasons. In the classroom, a school-record 10 Hawkeyes were named to the 2013 spring Academic All-Big Ten team.

During her second season with the Hawkeyes, Looper led the team to a runner-up finish in the Big Ten -- the program's highest finish since winning the league title in 2003. Iowa dropped two of its first three conference series before winning five straight to close out the season. It was the first time the team had won five straight series since the 2004 season.

Iowa entered the final weekend with a conference title within reach, but it couldn't close the gap with Michigan despite taking 2-of-3 games at Minnesota. The Hawkeyes finished with a 27-26 overall and 16-8 conference record in 2012.

Five players garnered All-Big Ten recognition, including three first team selections. Senior Liz Watkins, sophomore Kayla Massey and freshman Megan Blank earned first team accolades, sophomore Michelle Zoeller was a second team honoree and junior Johnnie Dowling was a third team selection.

Blank also garnered NFCA second team all-region honors during her freshman campaign. She is the ninth Hawkeye to earn first team All-Big Ten and all-region honors during her freshman season.

The Hawkeyes finished second in the Big Ten in pitching (2.31 ERA) and third in fielding (.967). The squad turned 26 double plays during the course of the season to rank sixth nationally in double plays per game (.49).

Looper guided the Hawkeyes to a 27-24 overall and a 9-11 Big Ten record in her first season in Iowa City. The first year head coach led the UI to a pair of six game winning streaks in her opening campaign and a tournament title at the Stetson Classic.

Iowa opened Big Ten Conference play strong, jumping out to an 8-3 record. Among the victories was a 4-2 triumph at No. 1 Michigan. The win, which pushed the overall mark to 26-16, was Iowa's first over a No. 1 ranked opponent since the 2005 season and the first over a ranked foe since 2008.

Looper's Hawkeyes were on the verge of completing a series sweep in Ann Arbor before the Wolverines rallied from a 2-0 deficit in the bottom of the seventh inning to claim the victory and halt Iowa's momentum.

A pair of Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten recognition at the conclusion of the season. Liz Watkins was tabbed as a second team selection, while Katie Keim earned third team accolades.

Looper took over the reigns of the Iowa program after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Texas for 11 seasons (1999-2010). Looper helped lead the Longhorns to three College World Series appearances (2003, 2005 and 2006) and nine NCAA Tournament berths.

MULLARKEY AT ILLINOIS

Kaitlyn Mullarkey led the team with a .429 clip in three games against Illinois last weekend. The junior registered three hits in seven at bats, including a double and two singles. Mullarkey reached base in all three contests.

IN HER HOME STATE

The Hawkeyes have played 11 games in the state of Illinois this season, including five at the Total Control Sports Invitational, three at Northwestern, and three at Illinois. Junior Kaitlyn Mullarkey is batting .406 in those games. The Park Ridge, Illinois, native has registered 13 hits, four home runs, two doubles, seven RBIs, and a .844 slugging percentage in her home state this season.

4-RUN 3RD LEADS HAWKEYES PAST PENN STATE

The Hawkeyes scored four runs in the third inning to defeat Penn State, 4-1, on Saturday, April 23. Redshirt junior Sammi Gyerman, redshirt senior Holly Hoffman, junior Claire Fritsch, and sophomore Sarah Kurtz each recorded hits in the inning, while Hoffman and Kurtz both plated a pair of runs.

WIEGAND SILENCES NITTANY LIONS

Elizabeth Wiegand recorded a 1.56 ERA in nine innings pitched against Penn State last weekend. The junior earned the complete-game win in the circle on Saturday, April 23, allowing one earned run on five hits. She walked one and struck out two in seven innings of work.

FRITSCH HEATS UP

Junior Claire Fritsch hit .625 in three games against the Nittany Lions last weekend. Fritsch registered five hits in eight at bats over the three game series. Freshman Mallory Kilian (.500), redshirt junior Sammi Gyerman (.444), and senior Whitney Repole (.429) also hit above .400 on the weekend.

HOFFMAN IN B1G ACTION

Holly Hoffman is swinging the hot bat for the Hawkeyes in conference action. The redshirt senior is hitting .407 in Big Ten play. In 20 conference games, Hoffman is slugging .763. She has registered 12 extra-base hits (7 doubles, 1 triple, and 4 home runs) during that span.

WIEGAND DELIVERS

Junior Elizabeth Wiegand registered the complete-game win over Wisconsin on April 16. After surrendering a pair of runs on four hits in the top of the first inning, Wiegand (6-9) settled in. The Moscow Mills, Missouri, native gave up just three hits in the final six innings, and tied her season-high with six strikeouts.

ATTENDANCE RECORD

The Hawkeyes played in front of 2,192 fans at Pearl Field from April 15-17. The mark set a new three-game weekend series attendance record.

- Junior Kaitlyn Mullarkey is tied for 14th on Iowa's all-time list with eight home runs this season.
- Mullarkey's 14 career blasts ties her for 18th on Iowa's all-time career home runs list.

CLUTCH MULLARKEY

Down by two in the bottom of the seventh inning against Drake on April 13, junior Claire Fritsch started a two-out rally when she reached on an error by the Drake second baseman. It proved to be costly as junior Kaitlyn Mullarkey blasted the game-tying, two-run home run over the wall in left center to send the game into extras. Mullarkey came through with the bases loaded in the top of the eighth, hitting a rocket off the glove of the Drake first baseman that scored the game-winning run.

6-RUN 4TH LEADS HAWKEYES PAST UNI

The Hawkeyes put up six runs in the bottom of the fourth to defeat Northern Iowa on April 12. Sophomore Angela Schmiederer led off the inning with a single, before senior Whitney Repole and freshman Mallory Kilian were both hit by a pitch. Sophomore Sarah Kurtz came through with an RBI single to put the Hawkeyes on the board. After a wild pitch allowed Repole to score, Claire Fritsch reached on an error that plated Kilian. Junior Kaitlyn Mullarkey followed with an RBI double to left, before redshirt junior Sammi Gyerman plated two more runs on a single up the middle.

AROUND THE BIG TEN

- The Hawkeyes are sixth in the conference with 50 stolen bases.
- Iowa pitchers have struck out 83 batters looking this season -- the second most in the Big Ten.
- Junior Kaitlyn Mullarkey is tied for third in the Big Ten with 12 hit by pitches, fifth in triples (3), and 11th in stolen bases (13).
- Redshirt junior Sammi Gyerman is tied for fifth in the conference with three sacrifice flies this season.

IN BIG ACTION

- Iowa is tied for seventh in the conference with 17 stolen bases in Big Ten games.
- The Hawkeyes rank eighth in the Big Ten with 17 home runs in conference games this season.
- Iowa pitchers have struck out 27 batters looking in conference action -- the sixth-most in the conference.
- Iowa has turned nine double plays in Big Ten action this season -- tied for the fifth-most in the conference.
- Senior Holly Hoffman ranks third in the Big Ten with seven doubles in conference action. Hoffman also ranks eighth in total bases (45), ninth in slugging (.763), 12th in hits (24), 13th in RBIs (18), and 14th in batting average (.407).

SCHMIEDERER MAKES HISTORY

Sophomore Angela Schmiederer's two-run home run against Northwestern on April 9 hit the top of the roof of McGaw Hall -- the building that sits beyond the left field wall at Drysdale Field in Evanston, Illinois. Schmiederer became the first opposing player in history to hit the roof of McGaw Hall.

4 HOME RUNS

The Hawkeyes registered four home runs in game one against Northwestern on April 9. Junior Kaitlyn Mullarkey hit a two-run shot in the top of the first inning. One batter later, redshirt senior Holly Hoffman followed with a solo blast. Hoffman marked a new career high with her second blast of the game in the top of the fifth, before sophomore Angela Schmiederer hit a two-run home run in the top of the seventh.

HOFFMAN BATS 1.000

Holly Hoffman had a career game at the plate in game one of a doubleheader against Nebraska on April 6. The redshirt senior registered career-bests in hits (4) and doubles (2). The Osceola, Indiana, native went 4-for-4 with two singles, two doubles, and two RBIs.

POWER SURGE

After registering 11 extra-base hits in all of 2015 (59 games), junior Kaitlyn Mullarkey has hit 21 in 48 games this season. The Park Ridge, Illinois, native leads the team in home runs (8), and triples (3), and is tied for first on the team in doubles (10).



INCREASED SPEED

- After stealing 18 bags in all of 2015, Iowa has swiped 50 bases in 48 games this season.
- Junior Kaitlyn Mullarkey leads the team with 13 stolen bases, while junior Claire Fritsch and sophomore Katy Taylor each have nine.

MS. UTILITY

Sophomore Angela Schmiederer has registered 30 starts at three different positions this season. She has made 13 starts behind the plate, 15 in the outfield, and four as Iowa's designated player. Ten of Schmiederer's 26 hits this season have been for extra bases, including a game-winning grand slam against Lamar on March

SCHMIEDERER SLAM

Angela Schmiederer registered the game-winning grand slam against Lamar on March 6. The sophomore entered the game as a pinch hitter in the top of the fifth. After singling and scoring a run, Schmiederer remained in the game as Iowa's offensive player. An RBI fielder's choice and the game-winning grand slam followed. She registered a career-high five RBIs on the afternoon.

THE DUGOUT

The Hawkeyes re-launched their blog, The Dugout, for the 2016 season. The blog will reach out to fans and provide them with the opportunity to connect with the student-athletes, coaches, and staff who work hard every day to make the Hawkeye softball program a success. NEWCOMERS

- Junior transfer Elizabeth Wiegand joins the team after spending two seasons with UT Martin. Wiegand appeared in 26 games with 21 starts for the Skyhawks in 2015. She led UT Martin in ERA (2.94), wins (12), appearances (26), starts (21), complete games (16), shutouts (3), innings pitched (135.2), and strikeouts (63) as a sophomore.
- Sophomore transfer Katy Taylor joins the Hawkeyes after spending a season at Labette Community College. Taylor helped the Cardinals to a 38-16 overall record and a Region VI Championship. She led the nation in stolen bases (89) and paced the Cardinals in hits (76), doubles (10), triples (3), walks (21), batting average (.435), and on base percentage (.485).
- Freshmen Erin Riding (pitcher), Mallory Kilian (pitcher/utility), and Brooke Rozier (catcher/utility) will all make their Hawkeye debuts in 2016.

STAFF UPDATES

- Jake Schumann joined the Iowa softball staff on Aug. 5, 2015. Schumann will handle the Hawkeye offense. He joins the staff after spending last season as the associate head coach at Ole Miss. He has also served as the head coach at Florida International (2011-14), Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (2007-11), Texas A&M-Kingsville (2003-07), and Carl Albert State College (2001-03).
- Former Hawkeye Rachel West is Iowa's new volunteer assistant coach. West appeared in 202 games for the Hawkeyes from 2005-09. The Burlington, Iowa, native still stands as one of the best base stealers in program history. West swiped 86 bags during her four-year career -- a mark that ranks fourth in program history.
- Sharon Palma is in her first year as the director of operations for the Iowa softball program. The Grand Rapids, Michigan, native came to Iowa after spending the 2014 season as an assistant coach at Ole Miss. A former professional pitcher for the Carolina Diamonds in the National Pro Fastpitch League, Palma has also spent time as an assistant coach at Florida International (2014) and IUPUI (2013), and a volunteer assistant coach at Michigan State (2012).

HAWKEYE TRADITION

Iowa has made four Women's College World Series appearances (1995, 1996, 1997, 2001) and played in 16 NCAA Tournaments in school history. The 16 appearances are the second most in Big Ten history, and the four WCWS appearances equal the second most in conference history. The Hawkeyes have won four Big Ten Conference regular season championships (1989, 1997, 2000, 2003) and two Big Ten Tournament titles (2001, 2003). Iowa holds a 1283-828-5 (.608) record in 38 seasons.
