This weekend is separation weekend in the Big Ten; the Hawkeyes are one game out of fifth place and two from first in the conference. Iowa hosts Minnesota in a three-game series at Duane Banks Field this weekend. Weather permitting, game one is set for Friday night at 6:05 p.m. Both teams won a series last weekend, Iowa took two at Michigan and the Golden Gophers took two against Indiana at home, following a solid performance by starter Seth Rosin.

SCOUTING MINNESOTA:

Minnesota is 17-24 with a 6-6 conference record. The Golden Gophers have won three of its last four contests, including taking two from Indiana last weekend at the Metrodome.

The Golden Gopher offense is led by Michael Kvasnicka. He leads the team in batting average (.353), doubles (18), triples (2), homers (6), total bases (95), slugging percentage (.609), walks (33), on base percentage (.464).

Minnesota's pitching staff is led by righty Seth Rosin. Rosin was named Big Ten Pitcher of the Week on Monday. That was the second time this year he earned the honor (March 29, 2010)

Rosin combined on a shutout in a 14-0 victory over Indiana on April 23, pitching 7.2 innings, yielded only three hits, did not walk a batter and struck out seven.

McCOOL DOMINATES BIG TEN:

Zach McCool has had stellar performances in all four Big Ten series'.

In conference play, the junior is ranked in the top 10 amongst other Big Ten players in the following statistical categories: stolen bases (1st), batting average (2nd), on base percentage (2nd), hits (3rd), sac bunts (3rd) and slugging percentage (9th).

DURANT SOLID IN BIG TEN:

Iowa's cleanup hitter, **Ryan Durant** has hit a solid .319 in conference play. He leads the team with eight doubles, 16 RBI and is second (to Zach McCool) with a .489 slugging percentage.

Durant had a career game to lead Iowa to the doubleheader sweep in game two at Michigan. The senior tied a career high driving in four runs on a pair of doubles. Durant collected four RBI for the third time in his Hawkeye career, last accomplishing the feat at Illinois State a year ago.

HIPPEN TOSSES A GEM:

Jarred Hippen was dominate on the bump again, throwing his second career complete game and second in four appearances last Friday in Ann Arbor. The native of Rock Falls, IL, allowed only two runs, one earned, scattered six hits and struck out five en route to his third win in a 5-2 victory at Michigan.

Hippen's first career complete game was in the Big Ten opener at Michigan State.

He allowed three runs off seven hits and striking out two. The last Hawkeye to throw a complete nine was Nate Johnson in 2004.

IOWA TAKES SERIES:

On the shoulders of another strong pitching performance by pitching ace **Jarred Hippen**, Iowa beat Michigan, 5-2, in game one of Friday's doubleheader. Iowa's victory snapped an eight-game losing skid at Michigan. The Hawkeyes' last win in Ann Arbor came on April 10, 2005.

The Hawkeyes won game two at Michigan, 5-3, to sweep Friday's doubleheader. The win marked the first time Iowa swept a doubleheader since at Indiana on April 12, 2008.

The Black and Gold dropped the finale of a three-game series, 7-5, to Michigan Saturday afternoon. Despite the loss, Iowa won the series having picked up two wins in the twinbill at Ray Fisher Stadium Friday. The game featured 26 hits between both teams.

CLOTHING DRIVE:

The Hawkeyes and Neighborhood Centers of Johnson County are teaming up this Sunday. Iowa hosts Minnesota in the finale of a three-game series at Duane Banks Field at 1 p.m. that day.

Fans are encouraged to bring new or gently-used clothing for people in our area. Fans that are able to donate, tickets will be just \$2 for any patron.

LEE 'SAVES' ANOTHER:

In Iowa's mid-week victory over Nebraska Iowa's closer, **Kevin Lee**, picked up his team-best eighth save. Lee pitched the final frame, allowing no Husker runs. The eight saves ties Northwestern's Paul Snieder for first in the Big Ten.

ENDING A DROUGHT:

Junior **Trevor Willis** ended a home run drought for the Hawkeyes last weekend in Ann Arbor. The outfielder hit a 'no-doubter' in Iowa's loss to Michigan in the series finale. The bomb was Willis' first of the season.

The last Hawkeye to hit a homer was **Ryan Durant** in Iowa's loss to South Dakota State, March 30, at Duane Banks Field.

STACKING UP IN THE BIG TEN:

When compared to the conference's best several Hawkeyes rank in the top 10.

Kurtis Muller in on base percentage (7th) and stolen bases (5th). **Ryan Durant** is tied for second in sacrifice flies and **Zach McCool** ranks third in sacrifice bunts.

Ace **Jarred Hippen** ranks in batters struck out looking (1st), innings pitched (3rd), ERA (8th) and batters struck out (10th), **Kevin Lee** ranks first in saves and **Patrick Schatz** ranks fifth in appearances.

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

1. **Jarred Hippen** has been in a groove on the bump for the Hawkeyes. The southpaw has thrown two complete games this season.

2. **Ryan Durant** leads the Big Ten in doubles hit in conference games with eight. Last weekend, the senior had two in game two at Michigan.

3. Iowa is 15-6 this year when limiting opponents to five runs or less.

RECORD BREAKING McCOOL:

Junior **Zach McCool** tied yet another school record. McCool laced two consecutive triples in Iowa's victory over Western Illinois Tuesday. The last time that was done was in 1999 by Brian Burks.

McCool tied another individual-game record earlier in the season. He went 5-for-6 from the leadoff spot for Iowa in its series finale against the Spartans. McCool's five hits ties a single-game school record, last achieved by former Hawkeye standout, Justin Toole, in 2008.

PRESERVING THE LEAD:

Iowa has done a very good job this season winning the games where it has had the lead late. The Hawkeyes are a perfect 15-0 when leading after eight innings, 14-2 when leading after seven and 13-2 when maintaining the advantage after six frames.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

Minnesota leads the all-time series between the two schools, 165-105.

In 2009, the Golden Gophers swept Iowa in a three-game series in Minneapolis, MN. Iowa's offense was led by freshman **Dallas Burke**. The catcher went 8-for-15 in the series. The two teams split a four-game series the last time Minnesota played in Iowa City (2008).

2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:

Three Hawkeyes were drafted in the Major League Baseball's 2009 First-Year Player Draft. Right-handed fireballer **Steve Turnbull**, lefty relief pitcher **Kyle Heim** and closer **Mike Schurz** all signed contracts in June. Three-time all-Big Ten selection **Justin Toole** later signed a free agent contract.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Iowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, Iowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

IOWA SPLITS MIDWEEK GAMES:

The Hawkeyes split a pair of midweek games. On Tuesday, Iowa defeated Nebraska, 5-2, at Duane Banks Field. The Hawkeyes capitalized on a season-high four Husker errors en route to victory. The last Iowa win over Nebraska was on Mar. 4, 2007 (12-8) in DeLand, Florida.

Iowa's offense out-hit the Huskers, scattering nine. Leading the Hawkeyes was **Mike McQuillan** going 2-for-4 with two RBI and a double. **Ryan Durant** and **Kurtis Muller** both picked up a pair of hits.

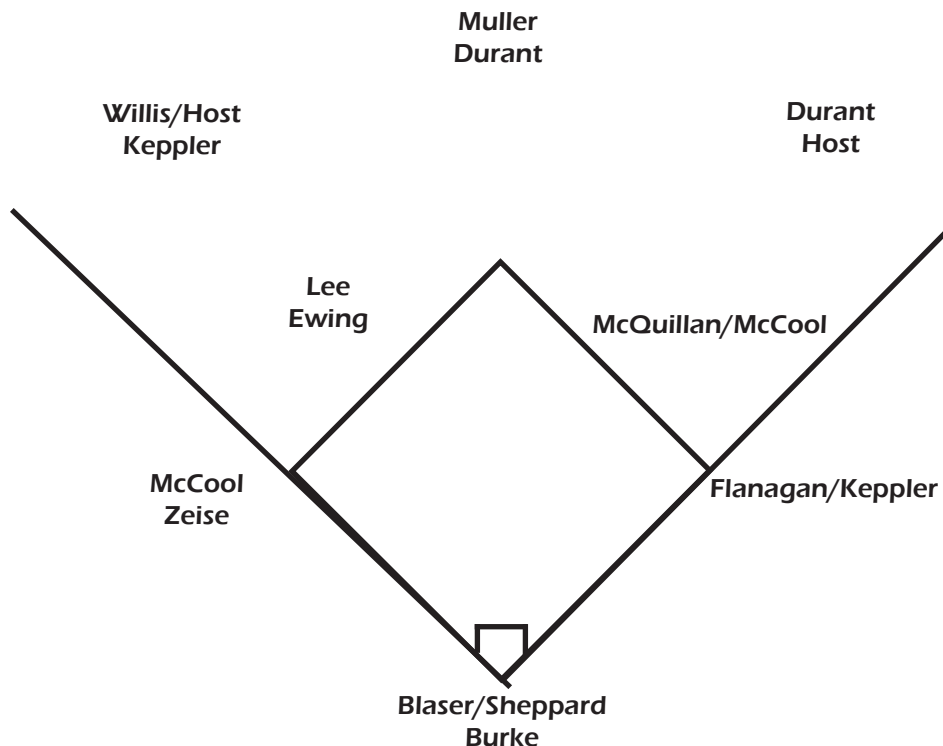
The Hawkeyes fell to Creighton, 15-10, Wednesday night in front of 1,803 fans at a windy Rosenblatt Stadium. The Hawkeyes scored all 10 of their runs in the final three innings after Creighton scored the first 14 runs.

Iowa's one-five hitters collected eight of its 12 hits and seven of its 10 RBI. **Zach McCool**, **Ryan Durant** and **Tyson Blaser** all had two hits for the Hawkeyes. McCool and Blaser registered three and two RBI, respectively. Durant also worked two walks. **Trevor Willis** had a single, a walk, an RBI and three runs scored in defeat.

BIG TEN OPENER VICTORY:

With a gem of a pitching performance from **Jarred Hippen**, Iowa picked up its first conference-opening win since a 9-5 triumph over Michigan in 2003.

Besides that, Iowa had won six of its last seven games and snapped Michigan State's 11-game win streak.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM:

With a 2-1 record, Iowa had several quality performances in Florida (Feb. 26-28). Sophomore pitcher **Jarred Hippen** and senior outfielder **Ryan Durant**, however, were the two Hawkeyes to earn second team all-tournament honors by collegebaseball360.com.

Hippen got his first win of the year, by-way of an eight and two-third innings performance with eight Ks and only one walk. Durant went 6-for-11 with a double, homer and six RBI.

RBI ALERT:

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** drove in seven RBI to lead Iowa to victory over Illinois State Feb. 22. The RBI total is the most since Dallas Burke drove in six against Minnesota on May 2, 2009. Seven RBI also ties for the conference's game-high this year. (Tying two other Big Ten players.)

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Zach Dillon**.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks than the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa Head Baseball Coach **Jack Dahm** has announced that **Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski** and **Taylor Zeutenhorst** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and **Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler** and **Aaron Smit** intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.
