THE MATCHUP

- The Hawkeyes travel to Corpus Christi, Texas, this weekend to play in the Kleberg Bank College Classic.
- Iowa opens tournament play Friday against No. 14 Oklahoma at 2 p.m., before facing New Mexico on Saturday at 2 p.m. and host-Texas A&M Corpus Christi on Sunday at 1 p.m. All times are Central.
- Texas A&M Corpus Christi will host the event at Whataburger Field, home of the Corpus Christi Hooks, the Houston Astros' double-A affiliate. Dimensions of the park are 315 feet to left field, 400 feet to up the middle, and 325 feet to right field. The Hawkeyes have never played at Whataburger Field.
- The Hawkeyes will play in Texas for the first time since the 2011 season when they played eight games in the state. Iowa played four games in Lubbock, Texas, and four games in San Antonio.

THE SERIES

- The Hawkeyes have faced each of their opponents at the Kleberg Bank College Classic in the past.
- Iowa and Oklahoma have met once in program history, as the Sooners downed the Hawkeyes, 8-4, in 1974.
 - Iowa and New Mexico have met 13 times in program history. The two schools last played in 1985 when the Lobos downed the Hawkeyes, 4-0. New Mexico leads the all-time series 11-2.
 - Iowa and Texas A&M Corpus Christi have met twice, splitting the contests. Both games were played at the Texas Tech Invitational in Lubbock, Texas, in 2011.

In nine years as the University of Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the UI baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Hawkeyes in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Iowa program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years. Dahm has guided the team to 30 or more wins two of the last six seasons.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21 in a victory over Western Illinois. Also in 2009, Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23 and notched his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories. In 2012, Dahm earned his 200th victory at Iowa as the Hawkeyes won at Indiana (4-0) on March 31.

In Dahm's 19 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, nine freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his nine years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 35 All-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Three Hawkeyes garnered all-league honors in 2012. Senior Phil Keppler earned second team All-Big Ten laurels along with freshman starting pitcher Sasha Kuebel. Kuebel and fellow left-handed pitcher Taylor Kaufman were named to the Big Ten's all-freshman squad. Kuebel was also named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after finishing 6-0 with a 2.67 ERA.

The Hawkeyes finished a game out of a four-way tie for sixth place and the final spot in the Big Ten Tournament in 2012. Iowa closed the season strong, taking 2-of-3 from No. 13 Purdue. The Hawkeyes were the only team all season to win a conference series against the Boilermakers. Iowa defeated Purdue in back-to-back games, earning its first win over a ranked foe since downing No. 25 Louisville in 2009.

While 11 freshmen saw action in 2012, Dahm coached two Hawkeye seniors to the top of the record books. Mike McQuillan closed his career first in singles (196) and second in hits (242). Jarred Hippen, a two-time second team All-Big Ten selection under Dahm, owns the Iowa record for innings pitched (351.2) and ranks second in strikeouts behind Allen Rath with 244.

In the classroom, Dahm's teams have had success, as well. Iowa's baseball team boasted an NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 95, which is 25 points above the national average for NCAA Division I baseball programs. During his Iowa tenure, the head coach has seen 75 players named academic All-Big Ten, including a team-record 12 players in 2011. Iowa had eight student-athletes recognized in 2010 and seven in 2012. That is the best nine-year total in the history of the program. Additionally, shortstop Kurt Lee was named Academic All-District first team in 2011.

SCOUTING OKLAHOMA

Oklahoma currently owns a 6-0 record, sweeping a four-game series against Hofstra and a double-header against Arkansas Pine Bluff. The Sooners are tabbed in the top-25 in three different polls, as they are ranked 14th in the Collegiate Baseball top-25, 18th in the Baseball America top-25, and 15th in the NCBWA Division I poll.

Junior Matt Obereste leads the Oklahoma offense, entering the weekend hitting at a .455 clip (10-of-22). Obereste leads the Sooners in home runs (2) and RBIs (12).

Lefthander Dylan Overton is expected to start on the mound for Oklahoma against the Hawkeyes. Overton has made two appearances this season, pitching eight innings, allowing one earned run and striking out seven.

The Sooners are coached by Sunny Galloway. Galloway, who is in his eighth season as the head coach, has won 309 games at Oklahoma.

SCOUTING NEW MEXICO

New Mexico opened 2013 last weekend with a three-game series against Oklahoma State, going 1-2. The Lobos were ranked 21st in the preseason Baseball America top-25 and were also selected as a "sleeper" by the publication to advance to the 2013 College World Series. They are currently receiving votes for the NCBWA Division I rankings.

New Mexico boasts one of the nation's top players in junior DJ Peterson. Peterson was a Louisville Slugger first-team All-America honoree in 2012, as well as the 2012 Mountain West Co-Player of the Year after hitting .419 with 17 home runs and 78 RBIs. Peterson is hitting .455 this season with the team's only homer and a team-best six RBIs.

Lefty Kevin Baumgartner is the Lobo's expected starting pitcher on Saturday. Baumgartner made one appearance out of the bullpen against Oklahoma State, throwing five innings and fanning six batters. He allowed one earned run.

Ray Birmingham is in his sixth season as the New Mexico head coach, leading to the Lobos to 30-win seasons in four of the past five years.

SCOUTING TEXAS A&M CORPUS CHRISTI

Texas A&M Corpus Christi went 3-1 against Texas-Pan American last weekend to open its 2013 campaign.

Senior Eric Weiss leads the Islanders at the plate, driving in six of the team's 15 runs in the series.

Lefthander Adam Hoelscher is expected to start against Iowa. Hoelscher won his first start of 2013 after allowing three earned runs in five innings.

Texas A&M Corpus Christi is coached by sixth-year head coach Scott Malone, the only coach in school history to lead the Islanders to postseason play.

STATE OF IOWA TIES

Texas A&M Corpus Christi has three members of its team with ties to the state of Iowa.

- Assistant coach Chris Ramirez prepped at Fort Madison High School before playing junior college baseball at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids. Ramirez then began his coaching career at Southeastern Community College in West Burlington, Iowa.
- Junior Brad Lamberti is an Altoona, Iowa, native and played for Des Moines Area Community College before becoming an Islander.
- Classmate Brandon Tierney competed for Iowa Western Community College in Council Bluffs, Iowa prior to playing at Texas A&M Corpus Christi.

DAHM 3 WINS SHY OF 500

Iowa head coach Jack Dahm sits just three victories shy of 500 career wins. Dahm is in his 20th season as a head coach, winning 283 games at Creighton from 1994-2003 and 214 games at Iowa, beginning in 2004. His 214 wins at Iowa rank third in program history, trailing Duane Banks (810 wins) and Otto Vogel (440 wins).

1-RUN GAMES UNDER DAHM

During Jack Dahm's 10-year tenure at Iowa, the Hawkeyes have played 123 one-run games. Iowa is 57-66 in such contests. The Hawkeyes went 10-7 in one-run games in 2012, winning their final five.

HAWKEYES OPEN SEASON AT AUSTIN PEAY

The Hawkeyes opened its season Feb. 15-17 at Austin Peay, playing a three-game series at Raymond C. Hand Park in Clarksville, Tenn. Iowa went 1-2 against the Governors, winning the second game of the series. Senior Matt Dermody collected the win for the Hawkeyes after allowing one earned run and striking out four in five innings of work. Senior Dan Sheppard and Kris Goodman led Iowa offensively over the weekend. Sheppard drove in a team-best four runs, while Goodman registered a team-high five hits.

TEAM ERA RANKS SECOND IN B1G

The Iowa pitching staff posted a 1.80 ERA during its Feb. 15-17 series at Austin Peay, allowing just six earned runs in 25 innings. Through the first weekend of play, that figure ranks second in the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes trail Indiana, who own a 1.09 ERA.

HAWKEYES BIG DAY SETS B1G TEAM HIGHS

The Hawkeyes scored 13 runs and stole six bases at Austin Peay on Feb. 16. Both marks were the most among Big Ten teams during the opening weekend of the 2013 season.



BULLPEN DOES ITS JOB

The Iowa bullpen did not allow an earned run during a three-game series at Austin Peay on Feb. 15-17. Seniors Andrew Hanse and Ricky Sandquist, sophomores Taylor Kaufman, Andrew Hedrick, and Nick Hibbing, and freshman Josh Martsching combined to pitch 10.1 innings without allowing an earned run out of the bullpen against the Governors.

HANSE HANDLES HITTERS

Senior Andrew Hanse shined out of the bullpen for the Hawkeyes at Austin Peay on Feb. 16 and 18. In his two appearances, Hanse pitched 3.2 innings of scoreless baseball, as opposing hitters did not register a single hit against the Marion, Iowa, native. Hanse pitched an inning on Feb. 15, recording one strike out, and threw 2.2 innings Feb. 17.

3-FOR-3

Three Hawkeyes -- sophomores Nick Day, Kris Goodman, and Jake Yacinich -- hit safely in all three games at Austin Peay from Feb. 15-17.

SHEPPARD OPENS SEASON IN STYLE

Senior Dan Sheppard was impressive in the Hawkeyes season-opening series against Austin Peay on Feb. 15-17. Sheppard hit .364 (4-of-11) and batted in a team-best five runs in the three-game set, including a 3-of-4, four RBI game on Feb. 16. Sheppard's three hits in a game tied a career-best, while his four RBIs set a new career-high. His four RBIs were the most by any Big Ten athlete during the opening weekend of play.

Behind the plate, Sheppard threw out four base runners over the three games.

GOODMAN'S BIG DAY

Sophomore Kris Goodman went 3-for-4 at the plate and scored three runs on Feb. 16 against Austin Peay, setting career-highs in both categories. The Apple Valley, Minn., native ended the series hitting .500 (5-of-10). Goodman currently leads the Hawkeyes in hits (5) and runs scored (4).

DAY GOES DEEP

Sophomore Nick Day hit the first home run of his collegiate career Feb. 17 at Austin Peay. Day led off the fourth inning by hitting a solo blast over the left field fence. It was the Solon, Iowa, native's only hit of the game.

HAWKEYE DEBUTS

Five Hawkeye newcomers made their Iowa debuts at Austin Peay. Freshman Blake Hickman made his collegiate debut Feb. 15, and started all three games at first base against the Governors. Junior Trevor Kenyon, a junior college transfer, and freshmen Nick Roscetti and Josh Martsching saw their first action as a Hawkeye on Feb. 16. Freshman Calvin Mathews made his debut on Feb. 17, starting on the mound.

A LINEUP FULL OF YOUTH

Nine of the 10 positional players, including the designated hitter, in Iowa's opening day on Feb. 15 against Austin Peay were underclassmen.

Sophomore Sasha Kuebel opened the contest on the mound for the Hawkeyes.

Freshman Blake Hickman started at first base, while sophomores Jake Mangler, Nick Day, and Jake Yacinich started at second base, third base, and shortstop.

In the outfield, sophomores Kris Goodman, Eric Toole, and Taylor Kaufman started from left to right, while sophomore Ryan Rumpf was Iowa's designated hitter.

Senior Dan Sheppard, who started at catcher, was the lone upperclassman in the lineup.

PRESEASON AWARDS

Two Hawkeyes earned preseason All-Big Ten honors. Sophomore Sasha Kuebel was a Preseason All-Big Ten pick by College Sports Madness and Perfect Game. Fellow sophomore Jake Yacinich joined Kuebel on College Sports Madness' Preseason All-Big Ten list.

Kuebel, Yacinich and senior Dan Sheppard were named to the Big Ten Watch List.

NO STRANGER TO THE BIG TEN

Senior Matt Dermody has made 17 career Big Ten starts, including Big Ten Tournament play, ranking third among active Big Ten pitchers. Dermody trails Illinois' Kevin Johnson and Penn State's Steven Hill, who have both started 24 career Big Ten games. The Norwalk, Iowa, native has made eight Big Ten starts in each of the last two seasons.

BREAKDOWN OF THE 2013 SCHEDULE

- The Hawkeyes will play 52 regular season games in 2013, including 24 home games.
- Iowa will play its first 13 games away from Iowa City.

- Iowa's first five games will be against 2012 NCAA Tournament teams, as it opens the season with a three game series against NCAA qualifier Austin Peay before facing Oklahoma, a NCAA Super Regional squad, and New Mexico, who played in the NCAA Regionals, at the Kleberg Bank College Classic in Corpus Christi, Texas.
- The schedule includes a 12-game home stand from March 27-April 13.

- The Hawkeyes open Big Ten play March 22-24 in Evanston, Ill., against Northwestern.

- During Big Ten play, Iowa hosts Indiana, Nebraska, Minnesota, and Michigan State at Duane Banks Field. The Hawkeyes go on the road to face Northwestern, Penn State, Michigan and Purdue. The top six teams will advance to the 2013 Big Ten Tournament at Target Field in Minneapolis.
