This weekend is "Senior Day" at Duane Banks Field. This year's senior class includes: **Matt Douglas, T.J. Cataldo, Nick Erdman, Wes Freie, Kevin Hoef, Kody McManis, Mike Schurz, Justin Toole and Steve Turnbull.**

SCOUTING UW-MILWAUKEE:

The Panthers are 21-21 with an 8-17 record on the road. UW-Milwaukee split with Cleveland State last weekend in a four-game series.

The Panther offense is led by Tim Patzman with a team-best 10 homers, 36 RBI and .644 slugging percentage. Andy Gerhartz is someone to watch on the base paths for the Panthers, stealing 19 bases in 22 attempts this season.

UW-Milwaukee reliever Cameron Amsrud has appeared in 25 games with a 3-0 record and 3.04 ERA.

Iowa trails the all-time series between the schools, 4-7.

SCOUTING WESTERN ILLINOIS:

The Leathernecks are 12-28 and 1-3 against the Hawkeyes this year.

Drew Laidig and Tyler Metcalf lead the Leatherneck offense. Laidig is hitting a solid .385 and a team-best 57 hits. Metcalf leads the team in homers (11), RBI (42) and strikeouts (43).

The Western Illinois pitching staff has a 10.05 ERA and are led by starter Eric Eden with a 6.75 ERA in eight starts and 53.1 innings pitched. He leads the team with 45 strikeouts.

Iowa leads the all-time series between the two schools, 60-24-2.

SCOUTING PENN STATE:

The Nittany Lions are 22-22 with a 5-13 record in the Big Ten. They are looking to end an eight-game losing streak in the conference.

Penn State's offense is led by Jordan Steranka with a .386 batting average. He leads the team in hits (64), triples (3), homers (4), RBI (39) and slugging percentage (.548). Blake Lynd has 20 of the Nittany Lion's 50 stolen bases.

Starter T.J. Macy has a 4.35 ERA with a 3-4 record in 11 starts. He leads the team with 68.1 innings pitched and a whopping 82 strikeouts.

Penn State leads the series between the two schools, 30-21.

FLANAGAN AS A STARTER:

Freshman **Sean Flanagan** has taken advantage of his opportunities and has made the transition from starting left fielder to starting first baseman.

Flanagan is hitting .309 with four home runs and a .618 slugging percentage.

MINNESOTA SUMMARY:

The Gophers swept Iowa in three at Siebert Field last weekend in Minneapolis, MN.

Minnesota won game three to complete the sweep Sunday, 12-3. Gopher starter Seth Rosin was dominate, allowing only three Iowa hits and striking out seven in six and two-third innings of work.

Iowa lost game two Saturday to Minnesota, 26-9. The Gophers took a nine run lead in the first frame and never looked back--capitalizing on a season-high seven Hawkeye errors. The game featured six home runs.

The Hawkeyes dropped game one to Minnesota Friday, 4-3. The Gophers had a big seventh inning to take their first lead of the game and win. Iowa had the tying and winning runs aboard in the top of the ninth, however were unable to get the timely hit.

Dallas Burke led Iowa offensively, going 8-for-13 with two walks and six RBI. **Kurtis Muller** 5-for-10 from the leadoff spot of the lineup with four walks.

FRESHMEN STEP UP TO THE PLATE:

In Iowa's loss Saturday to Minnesota freshman **Dallas Burke** and **Sean Flanagan** drove in all nine Hawkeyes runs.

Burke hit a grand slam as well as an RBI single, collecting a season-high six RBI. Flanagan hit a three-run bomb, his fourth of the season.

HITS, HITS, HITS!

Seventeen Hawkeyes have recorded at least one multi-hit game this season. Leading the team is **Justin Toole** and **Ryan Durant** with 17 and **Kurtis Muller** with 13.

Six players are hitting above .300 so far this season, four of which are freshmen who have capitalized on their chances to play.

IOWA OFFENSE GETS GOING IN 2ND:

The Hawkeyes have out scored opponents 55-34 in the second inning.

The Iowa bullpen is able to seal the deal and get the win if the team is winning after the seventh inning, Iowa is 13-0 in that situation.

Injury Update

MCMANIS IS OUT AFTER HBP:

Kody McManis took a pitch off the face against Michigan State and after having surgery is out for the season.

HOEF DONE FOR THE YEAR:

Kevin Hoef attempted to steal home in the final Corridor Classic last week and injured his hand after a head first slide. The senior third basemen played the remainder of the game.

Hoef ended his season with a .294 batting average, team-best two triples and 19 hit-by-pitches. He ends his career with a record 68 hit-by-pitches.

TOOLE IS OUT FOR THE SEASON:

On his first at bat of game two against the Spartans, **Justin Toole** wore a pitch off his forearm. Despite being injured, Toole proceeded to steal two bases before being taken out of the game and to the hospital.

Toole ended the season with a .346 batting average, team-best 13 doubles and 15 stolen bases.

BLASER IS OUT FOR THE COUNT:

Tyson Blaser, who was plagued with injuries last season, had season-ending surgery on his hand about a month ago.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



Jack Dahm completed his fifth season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball team. He has compiled an 422-459-2 overall record and is 139-183 at Iowa. Dahm coached in his 800th career game on March 30th this year at Michigan. He is Iowa's third-winningest baseball coach.

In 2007, Iowa took another step forward by recording its best record in 14 years with a 31-23 mark. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13. Iowa earned its second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

In Dahm's 14 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his four years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 19 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers.

Before coming to Iowa City, Dahm spent 18 years as a member of the Creighton Bluejays baseball program. He left the Bluejays as the winningest coach in school history, having compiled 283 wins against 276 losses in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Twenty-seven of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues. In the past three years, nine Hawkeyes have inked contracts with professional teams, including three last spring.

In the classroom, Iowa is in the 90th-percentile in the NCAAs Academic Progress Report, placing them in the top 30 baseball programs, academically. During his Iowa tenure, Dahm has seen 33 players named academic all-Big Ten, including a team-record ten players in 2006. That is the best four-year total in the history of the program.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 15 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey.

Iowa currently has 32 home runs on the year, which is 10 more than all of last year. **Wes Freie** leads the way with six and **T.J. Cataldo** has five bombs to lead the squad. (Freie had a total of four last season.) Ten Hawkeyes have recorded a round-tripper.

Sean Flanagan, Phil Keppler, Dallas Burke and **Trevor Willis** all hit big flies last weekend at Minnesota.

SCHREIBER HAS QUALITY START:

Despite getting the no decision in Friday's 4-3 loss, Schreiber pitched well. He went five and one third innings allowing only two runs.

KEVIN LEE SHINES:

Pitcher **Kevin Lee** has seen action in 15 games this year and leads the team with a 3.38 ERA. Lee has pitched 13.1 innings and has 11 strikeouts.

2009 UNITY COUNCIL:

The Unity Council is a group elected by their teammates to communicate internally with the coaches on behalf of their teammates. This years council includes: senior **Kevin Hoef**, senior **Justin Toole**, junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Michael Jacobs** and sophomore **Kurtis Muller**.

IOWA GETS THE WIN OVER NO. 25:

Iowa finished a three-game series against No. 25 Louisville, 1-2. Iowa upset the Cardinals on March 15 with a 2-1 score in Louisville, KY. The Hawk-eye pitching staff held Louisville to its lowest scoring output since April 20, 2008, against Villanova in a 3-1 loss.

Starter **Michael Jacobs** earned the win with a solid outing, going six innings and allowing just one run. Jacobs also earned Iowa's last win against a ranked opponent (6-3 win at No. 5 Vanderbilt last season). **Patrick Schatz** pitched one and two-third solid innings of relief -- forcing four Cardinal ground outs. **Mike Schurz** recorded the save going one and one-third innings with two strikeouts.

DAHM TAKES OVER #3:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history Saturday in the 9-4 win over Western Illinois. Dahm currently has 139 wins at Iowa.

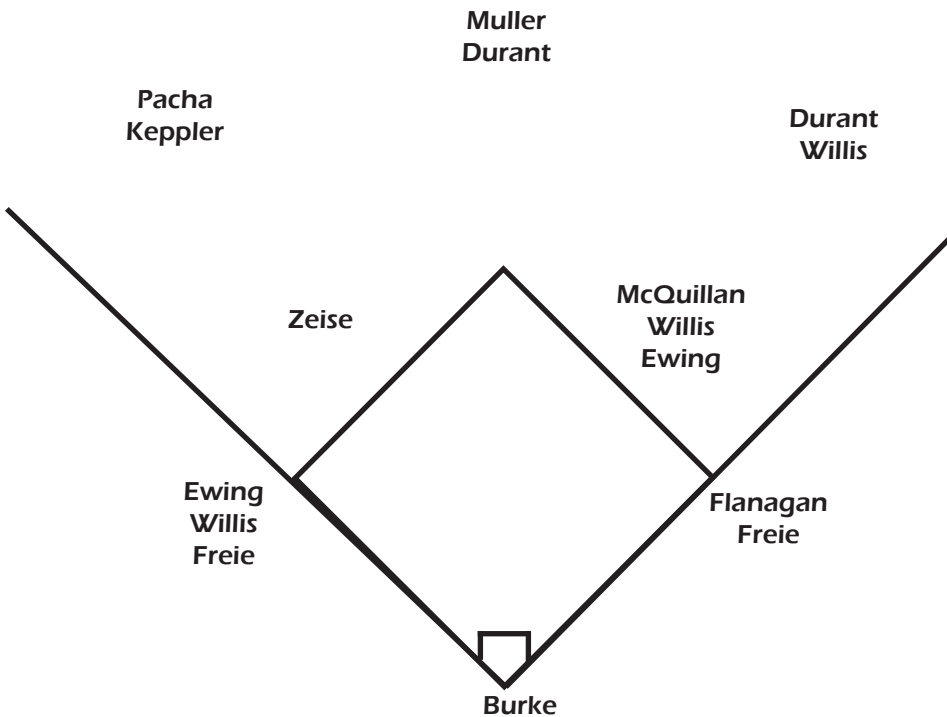
Last season, Dahm captured his 400th career victory on April 23 against UNI. Dahm recorded 283 victories at Creighton and has won 122 at Iowa.

Dahm started in 1994 with his alma mater, Creighton University, and moved on to coach the Hawkeyes in 2003.

2009 CAPTAINS:

This season the Hawkeyes voted on captains, marking the first time at Iowa under coach Dahm. Senior **Justin Toole** and juniors **Michael Jacobs** and **Tyson Blaser** were given the honor of captain this past fall.

OFFENSE GETS HOT AT SKYHAWK:

Iowa crushed Tennessee-Martin at Skyhawk Field March 18, 25-6. In the win, Iowa's bats came alive recording 25 hits, two from the school record (27 in 1986). Five Hawkeyes recorded home runs (the record is eight in a game) and nine had multi-hit games. It was the highest scoring Iowa game since 1989 (W, 32-0 vs. Quincy College).

TOOLE NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Justin Toole picked up his first Big Ten Player of the Week honor on March 23rd after an outstanding numbers on the spring trip. He scored nine runs while driving in six and raising his batting average 51 points to .353 mark. The senior tallied four multi-hit games in six contests and racked up four extra-base hits. For the week, Toole batted .440 with a .680 slugging percentage and a .533 on-base percentage to combine for an OPS of 1.213. He is currently on a 10-game hitting streak.

FREIE NAMED HONORABLE MENTION:

Wes Freie made his third career start against Georgetown after a two-year hiatus on the mound and picked up the win.

Freie hit a solo homer to tie the game in the fourth and pitched five innings with seven strikeouts -- keeping the Hoyas off balance.

For his pitching, as well as hitting at DH, Freie was named honorable mention at utility for the College Baseball 360 all-Tournament team. Freie ended the weekend going 2-for-8 with four runs scored, a home run, two RBI and three walks.

T.J. WALKS HIS WAY INTO RECORDBOOK:

T.J. Cataldo walked a career-high four times in Iowa's 15-7 victory over Purdue on April 3rd. His four walks puts him in the record books for a game high, the last time a Hawkeye did so was 2007 (Jason White). Cataldo currently has eight on the year.

SAME FACE, NEW PLACE:

Chris Maliszewski is the Hawkeyes' new pitching coach. Maliszewski replaces Nick Zumsande, who was Iowa's pitching coach the previous five seasons.

Maliszewski returns to his alma mater after serving two seasons as the outfield and catching instructor and recruiting coordinator at Valparaiso University.

He was a four-year letter winner with the Hawkeyes, posting a 7-10 career record with three saves. As a sophomore, he earned the victory over Illinois, sending Iowa to the conference tournament for the first time since 1991.

HAWKEYES SIGN THREE STANDOUTS:

Matt Dermody, **Ricky Sandquist**, and **Dan Sheppard** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa.

Dermody, a Norwalk, IA, native was recruited as a left-handed pitcher. He is the third-ranked pitcher in Iowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sandquist is from Fort Dodge, IA and will be used as a right-handed pitcher. He is the fourth-best pitcher in state of Iowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sheppard a Downers Grove, IL, native is an athletic catcher who can also play outfield. He is the top-ranked catcher in the state of Illinois by Perfect Game Cross Checker and Prep Baseball Report.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 869-813-3 (.521).

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Kris Welker**.

Ryan Brownlee embarks on his sixth season as Iowa's hitting, infield instructor and recruiting coordinator.

Over the past eight seasons, Brownlee has had 16 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts.

Last season, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and hitting helped establish several team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was in 1981. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Brownlee's recruiting was a success in 2008. The incoming class was ranked the 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker. Iowa's ranking of 49 is the highest of any Big Ten team.

Chris Maliszewski is starting his first season as assistant coach for the Hawkeyes, replace Nick Zumsande.

Maliszewski returns to his alma mater after serving two seasons as the outfield and catching instructor and recruiting coordinator at Valparaiso University.

Prior to joining Valparaiso's staff, Maliszewski was a volunteer assistant coach for Dahm and the Hawkeyes in 2005 and 2006. Working with the pitching staff in 2005, he helped lead the Black and Gold to one of their most successful seasons in the program's history, posting a 19-13 Big Ten mark.

Maliszewski has also coached in the Northwoods League, a top collegiate summer league.

Kris Welker is in his third season as the team's volunteer assistant. Welker works with the Iowa catchers and outfielders, prepares scouting reports, coordinates team travel, coaches first base and is Iowa's camp coordinator.

As a player, Welker was a key member of the Hawkeyes in 2004 and 2005. As a senior, Welker earned third team all-Big Ten honors, helping Iowa to a third-place finish in the Big Ten and a trip to the conference tournament. He lead the team with a .354 batting average, 46 RBI and 16 doubles.
