SCOUTING MICHIGAN STATE:

The Spartans are 14-23 and 5-7 in conference play. Last weekend, Michigan State got a win against the Wolverines, but dropped the series, 2-1.

The Spartans' offense is led by Eli Boike. He leads the team in batting average (.313), doubles (7), homers (7), RBI (25), slugging percentage (.527), walks (25) and on base percentage (.426).

Michigan State's starters, Nolan Moody and AJ Achter lead the team with nine starts each. They combine for 72 strikeouts and just over a 3.3 ERA.

Iowa trails the all-time series between the two schools, 56-66-1.

HITS, HITS, HITS!

Seventeen Hawkeyes have recorded at least one multi-hit game this season. Leading the team is **Justin Toole** with 17, followed by **Ryan Durant** with 14 and **T.J. Cataldo** with 11.

Nine players are hitting above .300 so far this season, five of which are freshmen who have capitalized on their chances to play.

WESTERN ILLINOIS SUMMARY:

Iowa cruised to a 20-7 triumph over Western Illinois tonight in front of 1,234 fans at Modern Woodmen Park. In the victory, the Hawkeyes pounded out 16 hits, nine of which were for extra bases. The 20 runs are the second-most by Iowa this season (25 vs. Tennessee-Martin). Iowa scored at least one run in six of its eight at-bats.

Six Hawkeyes recorded multiple RBI, while five had multiple hits en route to victory. **Justin Toole** went a perfect 4-for-4 with a season-high five RBI, three runs, a home run and a double. **Ryan Durant** went 2-for-3 with two RBI, two doubles, three runs scored and a walk.

STREAKIN':

Junior Ryan Durant has an active 13-game hitting streak heading into this weekend's contests vs. the Spartans. The 13-game hit streak is second-best on the team this year; Justin Toole had a 15-game streak earlier in the year.

IOWA GETS GOING IN THE FIRST:

Against the Leathernecks this week, the Hawkeyes scored nine runs in the first, which is a fourth of their first inning total for the entire year.

IOWA COMES BACK AFTER THE 7TH:

In their ninth inning thriller against Northern Iowa, the Hawkeyes picked up their first win of the season when trailing after seven innings (1-19).

NORTHERN IOWA SUMMARY:

The Hawkeyes rallied with two late inning runs to propel Iowa to a thrilling 5-4 victory over in-state rival Northern Iowa tonight at Duane Banks Field. Iowa has now won three-straight games, matching a season high.

The Hawkeyes got the timely hit they needed in the bottom of the ninth, off the bat of **Ryan Durant**, who lined the game-winning hit into center field for his 25th RBI of the season, scoring **Kody McManis**. McManis drew a walk to start off the inning and **Trevor Willis** laid his team-best fifth sacrifice bunt to move him over. With one runner on, the Panthers elected to intentionally walk **Justin Toole**. After a wild pitch, moving runners to second and third, Hoef was intentionally walked to load the bases. Durant came up big with the walk off-two-out single to center.

Leading the Hawkeyes, offensively, tonight were Durant, Toole and McQuillan. Durant finished the game going 2-for-5, with two RBI and two runs scored. Toole went 2-for-4 and a walk, while McQuillan went 2-for-3 with two RBI.

NUMBER OF THE WEEK IS 12:

Iowa has had 12 different players see action in left field this season: **Ryan Durant, Jeff Pacha, Dallas Burke, Nick Brown, Zach McCool, Kurtis Muller, Sean Flanagan, Trevor Willis, Mike McQuillan, Chett Zeise, Phil Keppler** and **Andrew Ewing**.

Nine of the 12 have started at least one game; the only players not to start in left are Willis, Burke and Ewing. Flanagan has started the last three of the last four games in left, batting 5-13 (.385), with a home run and two RBI.

FRESHMAN BIG TEN STARTERS:

For the first time under Head Coach **Jack Dahm** the Hawkeyes are starting three freshman during Big Ten contests. **Nick Brown, Jarred Hippen** and **Phil Schreiber** will take the mound again this week.

"Each one of them has earned their starts, it wasn't given to them," Dahm said.

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

1. Junior **Ryan Durant** is streakin' with an 13-game hitting streak. Look for him to continue it. He is hitting a solid .359 and drove in the game winning run against UNI this week, with two out in the bottom of the ninth and the bases loaded.

2. **Justin Toole** is hitting a team-best .360 on the year after a tremendous two midweek games. Toole went 6-for-8 with five RBI and a homer this week and is on a five-game hitting streak.

3. Look for **Phil Schreiber** to continue hitting his spots Sunday. The freshman rightly picked up his second win of the season against Western Illinois Tuesday, throwing three innings and striking out two. He has the lowest ERA of a starter on the team with a 3.25.

2009 BRINGS CHANGES:

Beginning with the 2009 season, Big Ten baseball series shall consist of three nine-inning games.

If weather or travel problems prevent play on the originally scheduled days, the teams may mutually agree to play on different days.

All games must be completed to nine innings unless the final game of the series is stopped because of rain or darkness. In that case, the last game will count if it has become regulation (four and one-half or five innings).

If a game is stopped before completion, it will become a suspended game and completed the following day. The suspended game must be played to its nine-inning conclusion before a new game can begin.

If Game 1 is not played on the first day, two nine-inning games shall be played on the second day. If Game 2 has not started on the second day, two nine-inning games shall be played on the third and final day.

ON THE TUBE:

The Hawkeyes will be on the Big Ten Network five times in 2009. The five scheduled dates tie for the most of any Big Ten school along with Michigan and Ohio State. Four of the five contests will be broadcasted from Duane Banks Field. Also, this year will mark the first year that that BTN will cover all Big Ten Tournament games.

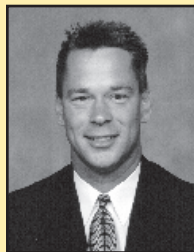

Head Coach Jack Dahm



Jack Dahm completed his sixth season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball team. He has compiled an 422-451-2 overall record and is 139-175 at Iowa. Dahm coached in his 800th career game on March 30th this year at Michigan. He is Iowa's third-winningest baseball coach.

In 2007, Iowa took another step forward by recording its best record in 14 years with a 31-23 mark. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13. Iowa earned its second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

In Dahm's 14 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his four years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 19 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers.

Before coming to Iowa City, Dahm spent 18 years as a member of the Creighton Bluejays baseball program. He left the Bluejays as the winningest coach in school history, having compiled 283 wins against 276 losses in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Twenty-seven of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues. In the past three years, nine Hawkeyes have inked contracts with professional teams, including three last spring.

In the classroom, Iowa is in the 90th-percentile in the NCAAs Academic Progress Report, placing them in the top 30 baseball programs, academically. During his Iowa tenure, Dahm has seen 33 players named academic all-Big Ten, including a team-record ten players in 2006. That is the best four-year total in the history of the program.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 15 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey.

Former Hawkeye standout **Danan Hughes** will return to Duane Banks Field this weekend as an analyst for the Big Ten Network (HD).

Hughes played outfield for the Hawkeye baseball team and is one of the best two-sport athletes in Iowa history. Hughes was drafted in the 3rd round of the 1992 draft by the Milwaukee Brewers.

Hughes played wide receiver for Iowa from 1989 to 1992.

IN THE BIG TEN:

Iowa ranks third in Big Ten doubles (75), first in hit-by-pitch (56) and second in stolen bases (52).

SCHUTZ GETS A WIN:

This week against UNI, **Mike Schurz** picked up his first win since returning from Tommy John. Schurz entered the game in the ninth inning and faced four batters, striking out two, to give the Hawkeyes a chance at winning in the bottom of the ninth.

“Q” COMES UP BIG:

Freshman **Mike McQuillan**, known as “Q” to the guys, came up big against Northern Iowa, getting an eighth inning RBI double to tie up the ballgame, 4-4. McQuillan went 2-for-3 with two RBI on the night.

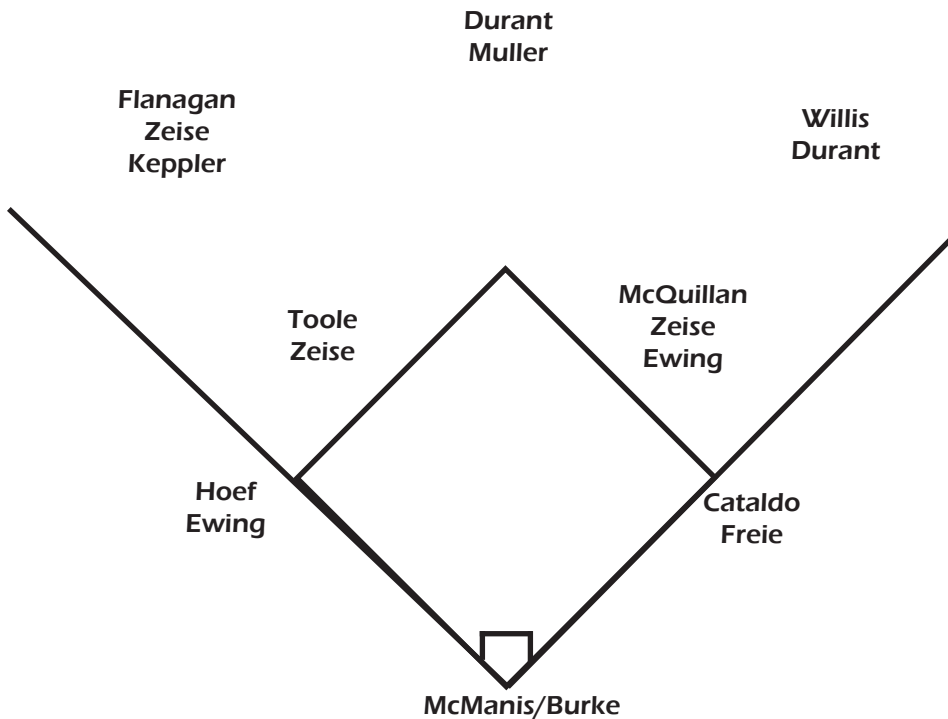

FIVE RBI GUYS:

Two Hawkeyes this year have driven in five RBI. **T.J. Cataldo** did earlier this season and **Justin Toole** against Western Illinois this week. Toole went a perfect 4-for-4, propelling Iowa to a 20-7 victory.

HOEF'S HBP COUNT:

Kevin Hoef took one for the team against Northern Iowa this week, putting his season total at 17. He is now tied for second in the season hit-by-pitch record book. The single season-high is 20, set by him a year ago.

SCHATZ EXCELS ON THE MOUND:

After seeing limited time on the mound a year ago, **Patrick Schatz** has made himself into one of Iowa's go-to guys in the long reliever role.

Schatz has a 2.20 ERA in 32.2 innings pitched. Big Ten opponents are only hitting .100 against him -- which is saying something, considering Schatz has come into the game in some sticky situations.

BLASER IS OUT FOR THE COUNT:

Tyson Blaser, who was plagued with injuries last season, had season-ending surgery about a month ago.

ZEISE CONTINUES TO SHINE:

Chett Zeise made his first career start as a Hawkeye against Georgetown and has played nearly every game since. The versatile freshman (who can play infield and outfield) is hitting a solid .301 with seven doubles. Zeise has played second, shortstop, third and left field this season.

IOWA OFFENSE GETS GOING IN 2ND:

The Hawkeyes have out scored opponents 45-18 in the second inning.

The Iowa bullpen is able to seal the deal and get the win if the team is winning after the sixth inning, Iowa is 12-0 in that situation.

OFFENSE HITS OVER THE FENCES:

Iowa currently has 25 home runs on the year, which is four more than all of last year. **Wes Freie** leads the way with six and **T.J. Cataldo** has five bombs to lead the squad. (Freie had a total of four last season.) Ten Hawkeyes have recorded a round-tripper.

IOWA GETS THE WIN OVER NO. 25:

Iowa finished a three-game series against No. 25 Louisville, 1-2. Iowa upset the Cardinals on March 15 with a 2-1 score in Louisville, KY. The Hawk-eye pitching staff held Louisville to its lowest scoring output since April 20, 2008, against Villanova in a 3-1 loss.

Starter **Michael Jacobs** earned the win with a solid outing, going six innings and allowing just one run. Jacobs also earned Iowa's last win against a ranked opponent (6-3 win at No. 5 Vanderbilt last season). **Patrick Schatz** pitched one and two-third solid innings of relief -- forcing four Cardinal ground outs. **Mike Schurz** recorded the save going one and one-third innings with two strikeouts.

DAHM TAKES OVER #3:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history Saturday in the 9-4 win over Western Illinois. Dahm currently has 139 wins at Iowa.

Last season, Dahm captured his 400th career victory on April 23 against UNI. Dahm recorded 283 victories at Creighton and has won 122 at Iowa.

Dahm started in 1994 with his alma mater, Creighton University, and moved on to coach the Hawkeyes in 2003.

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

Every year the UI Department of Athletics make improvements to Banks Field. The baseball program is very excited about the installation of 500 stadium chair back seats behind home plate. The major installation should be complete this year.

2009 UNITY COUNCIL:

The Unity Council is a group elected by their teammates to communicate internally with the coaches on behalf of their teammates. This year's council includes: senior **Kevin Hoef**, senior **Justin Toole**, junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Michael Jacobs** and sophomore **Kurtis Muller**.

2009 CAPTAINS:

This season the Hawkeyes voted on captains, marking the first time at Iowa under coach Dahm. Senior **Justin Toole** and juniors **Michael Jacobs** and **Tyson Blaser** were given the honor of captain this past fall.

OFFENSE GETS HOT AT SKYHAWK:

Iowa crushed Tennessee-Martin at Skyhawk Field March 18, 25-6. In the win, Iowa's bats came alive recording 25 hits, two from the school record (27 in 1986). Five Hawkeyes recorded home runs (the record is eight in a game) and nine had multi-hit games. It was the highest scoring Iowa game since 1989 (W, 32-0 vs. Quincy College).

TOOLE NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Justin Toole picked up his first Big Ten Player of the Week honor on March 23rd after an outstanding numbers on the spring trip. He scored nine runs while driving in six and raising his batting average 51 points to .353 mark. The senior tallied four multi-hit games in six contests and racked up four extra-base hits. For the week, Toole batted .440 with a .680 slugging percentage and a .533 on-base percentage to combine for an OPS of 1.213. He is currently on a 10-game hitting streak.

FREIE NAMED HONORABLE MENTION:

Wes Freie made his third career start against Georgetown after a two-year hiatus on the mound and picked up the win.

Freie hit a solo homer to tie the game in the fourth and pitched five innings with seven strikeouts -- keeping the Hoyas off balance.

For his pitching, as well as hitting at DH, Freie was named honorable mention at utility for the College Baseball 360 all-Tournament team. Freie ended the weekend going 2-for-8 with four runs scored, a home run, two RBI and three walks.

FRESHMEN GIVE DEPTH:

Iowa's freshman class has been ranked the 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker last season. (The highest of any Big Ten team.)

Four true freshman, **Nick Brown**, **Sean Flanagan**, **Jarred Hippen** and **Phil Schreiber**, will give the pitching staff needed depth and make an impact.

The other five freshman, **Dallas Burke**, **Andrew Ewing**, **Andrew Host**, **Mike McQuillan** and **Chett Zeise** will add a healthy internal competition and make the Black and Gold's experienced defense stronger.

T.J. WALKS HIS WAY INTO RECORDBOOK:

T.J. Cataldo walked a career-high four times in Iowa's 15-7 victory over Purdue on April 3rd. His four walks puts him in the record books for a game high, the last time a Hawkeye did so was 2007 (Jason White). Cataldo currently has eight on the year.

SAME FACE, NEW PLACE:

Chris Maliszewski is the Hawkeyes' new pitching coach. Maliszewski replaces Nick Zumsande, who was Iowa's pitching coach the previous five seasons.

Maliszewski returns to his alma mater after serving two seasons as the outfield and catching instructor and recruiting coordinator at Valparaiso University.

He was a four-year letter winner with the Hawkeyes, posting a 7-10 career record with three saves. As a sophomore, he earned the victory over Illinois, sending Iowa to the conference tournament for the first time since 1991.

HAWKEYES SIGN THREE STANDOUTS:

Matt Dermody, **Ricky Sandquist**, and **Dan Sheppard** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa.

Dermody, a Norwalk, IA, native was recruited as a left-handed pitcher. He is the third-ranked pitcher in Iowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sandquist is from Fort Dodge, IA and will be used as a right-handed pitcher. He is the fourth-best pitcher in state of Iowa by Perfect Game Crosschecker.

Sheppard a Downers Grove, IL, native is an athletic catcher who can also play outfield. He is the top-ranked catcher in the state of Illinois by Perfect Game Cross Checker and Prep Baseball Report.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 869-805-3 (.521).

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Kris Welker**.

Ryan Brownlee embarks on his sixth season as Iowa's hitting, infield instructor and recruiting coordinator.

Over the past eight seasons, Brownlee has had 16 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts.

Last season, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and hitting helped establish several team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was in 1981. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Brownlee's recruiting was a success in 2008. The incoming class was ranked the 49th-best class according to Perfect Game Cross Checker. Iowa's ranking of 49 is the highest of any Big Ten team.

Chris Maliszewski is starting his first season as assistant coach for the Hawkeyes, replace Nick Zumsande.

Maliszewski returns to his alma mater after serving two seasons as the outfield and catching instructor and recruiting coordinator at Valparaiso University.

Prior to joining Valparaiso's staff, Maliszewski was a volunteer assistant coach for Dahm and the Hawkeyes in 2005 and 2006. Working with the pitching staff in 2005, he helped lead the Black and Gold to one of their most successful seasons in the program's history, posting a 19-13 Big Ten mark.

Maliszewski has also coached in the Northwoods League, a top collegiate summer league.

Kris Welker is in his third season as the team's volunteer assistant. Welker works with the Iowa catchers and outfielders, prepares scouting reports, coordinates team travel, coaches first base and is Iowa's camp coordinator.

As a player, Welker was a key member of the Hawkeyes in 2004 and 2005. As a senior, Welker earned third team all-Big Ten honors, helping Iowa to a third-place finish in the Big Ten and a trip to the conference tournament. He led the team with a .354 batting average, 46 RBI and 16 doubles.
