SCOUTING WESTERN ILLINOIS:

Western Illinois is 5-11 with a series final against Arkansas-Little Rock Wednesday evening. A win against UALR Tuesday night ended the Leatherneck's eight game losing streak.

Western Illinois' offense is led by Tom Lilja who is hitting .458 with a team-best in hits (27), slugging percentage (.627), on base percentage (.514) and runs scored (15).

The Leatherneck pitching staff is led by closer David Hill. Hill has a team-best 1.04 ERA with seven appearances. He has one loss and two saves. The Leatherneck pitching staff has an 8.41 ERA and opponents are hitting .344.

SCOUTING SOUTH DAKOTA ST:

The Jackrabbits are 10-6 to start the year. After going 2-1 at Northern Colorado last weekend South Dakota State has a week off before traveling to Iowa City.

The Jackrabbits are hitting a solid .328 with 22 homers and 137 runs scored (averaging 8.5 runs a game). They are led by John Lee, Jesse Sawyer and Eric Cain.

South Dakota State's pitching is led by closer Trever Vermeulen. He has a 3-0 record with four saves to lead the team. Vermeulen has appeared in 11 games with 26 strikeouts in 19.2 innings.

KEPPLER SWINGS IT:

Redshirt sophomore **Phil Keppler** swung the bat well in the final four games of the spring trip. The first basemen went 4-for-10 with two runs scored, a career first grand slam and a team-best four RBI. He slugged a solid .700.

HAWKEYES ARE STREAKIN':

Junior **Kurtis Muller** had his 20-game hit streak end at No. 3 Texas. However, he is at it again, currently on a four-game hit streak. He has recorded at least one base hit in 15 of Iowa's 17 contests this season.

Redshirt sophomore **Phil Keppler** is currently on a season-best three-game streak.

PITCHING STAFF:

In the final four games of the spring trip, against UTSA and UTPA last week, the Iowa bullpen shined. **Patrick Brennan, Matt Dermody, Michael Jacobs, Kevin Lee, Jeff Pacha** and **Patrick Schatz** made up the pen.

The six pitchers amassed 14 strikeouts in 13.1 innings, allowing five earned runs on 11 hits.

Dermody, Jacobs, Lee and Pacha did not allow a run in seven and one-third innings.

PITCHING PACHA:

After pitching one and one-third innings total in three contests in 2009 and allowing four earned runs in the process, junior **Jeff Pacha** has excelled in 2010.

In two games against UTPA, the lefty picked up his fourth and fifth appearances of the year. He struck out three in three and one-third innings, allowing no hits or runs. Opponents are hitting .063 against him on the year, a team-best.

SITUATIONALLY SPEAKING:

Lefty **Dallas Burke** is hitting .400 (6-for-15) against southpaw pitchers.

Andrew Host is proving to be a clutch pinch hitter, going a perfect 3-for-3 in that role this year.

With runners in scoring position, **Dan Shepard** leads the team with a .500 average (4-for-8) and **Kurtis Muller** is 8-for-15 (.533) with two outs.

Jarred Hippen finds a way to get batters out. The lefty has a team-best 22 fly outs and 46 groundouts. He also leads the team with an average of 6.47 innings per appearance and a 2.3 strikeout to walk ratio. **Zach Kenyon** is dominant against left-handed opponents. They are a mere 5-for-30 against him.

Righty **Nick Brown** got his first action last week in Texas. Opponents couldn't get a hit off of him with two outs registered.

HIPPEN HAS STELLAR START:

Jarred Hippen threw a gem against No. 3 Texas on Mar 12th. The southpaw went eight and one-third innings (one out shy of his career best) and struck out eight Longhorns allowing only one run on five hits. He got a no decision.

On the spring trip, Hippen received a no decision and a loss. The loss came to Texas Pan American. He allowed two earned runs on eight hits in five innings with two Ks.

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

1. **Kurtis Muller** lost his 20-game hit streak against No. 3 Texas. But the lead-off hitter hit .500 (6-for-12) in the final four games of Iowa's road trip.

2. In the final four games of Iowa's spring trip, the Hawkeye pitching staff struck out 28 batters in 33 innings. Relief pitchers accounted for 14 of those.

3. The two-game series against South Dakota State fans are encouraged to wear black and 'black out' Duane Banks Field.

KENYON GETS A 'W':

Zach Kenyon got his first two starting nods on the spring trip in Texas. Despite getting hit with the loss against No. 3 Texas, the junior allowed only three earned runs with a career-best six strikeouts in five and two-third innings.

Kenyon earned the win against UTPA, pitching six solid innings allowing three runs on six hits with three strikeouts.

MULLER IS BACK:

Junior leadoff hitter **Kurtis Muller** is back to his freshman all-American form. After a sophomore season of injuries Muller is leading the Iowa offense.

Muller leads the Hawkeyes, offensively, in batting average (.400), at bats (65), runs (15), hits (26), doubles (7), triples (2), total bases (37), slugging percentage (.569), walks (7), stolen bases (8) and fewest errors (0).

ALL-TIME SERIES:

The Hawkeyes lead the all-time series with the Leathernecks, 60-24-2. The last time Iowa played Western Illinois, the Hawkeyes bats lifted them to a 20-7 victory on April 21, 2009 at Woodman Park in Davenport, IA.

In the win, the Hawkeyes pounded out 16 hits, nine of which were for extra bases.

Six Hawkeyes recorded multiple RBI, while five had multiple hits en route to victory. Ryan Durant extended his hitting streak to 12 games in the first inning and finished the contest 2-for-3 with two RBI, two doubles, three runs scored and a walk. Sean Flanagan went 2-for-4 with two runs scored, a double and an RBI. Mike McQuillan went 1-for-3 with a two-run homer and a walk.

This will be Iowa's first meeting with South Dakota State.

2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:

Three Hawkeyes were drafted in the Major League Baseball's 2009 First-Year Player Draft. Right-handed fireballer **Steve Turnbull**, lefty relief pitcher **Kyle Heim** and closer **Mike Schurz** all signed contracts in June. Three-time all-Big Ten selection **Justin Toole** later signed a free agent contract.

Other draftees included current Iowa freshmen: **Matt Dermody** and **Dan Sheppard**.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Iowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, Iowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

WEEKEND RECAP:

The Hawkeyes concluded its 18 road games with eight games on its annual spring trip. Iowa faced No. 3 Texas, UTSA and UTPA. Iowa ended the trip, 1-7.

The Black and Gold went 1-2 against UTPA. Iowa dropped the first two: 7-4 and 13-2 before breaking a nine-game losing streak with a 10-3 victory over the Broncs.

Leading Iowa in the series was **Kurtis Muller** and Iowa's bullpen. Muller went 5-for-9 with a double, two RBI and three runs scored. The Hawkeye bullpen featured **Patrick Brennan, Matt Dermody, Michael Jacobs, Kevin Lee, Jeff Pacha, Ricky Sandquist** and **Patrick Schatz**.

Iowa was scheduled to face UTSA twice, however due to rain, the two teams were only able to play one. The Hawkeyes fell 4-2.

Iowa was swept by No. 3 Texas in a four-game series at Austin, TX. The Hawkeyes dropped the series opener 2-1 in extras. The game featured an outstanding performance from starter **Jarred Hippen**. The lefty went eight and one-third innings before allowing a solo shot, to tie the game.

The Hawkeyes played the Longhorns close the next two games, losing 3-1, 5-2 but let the last one get away from them, losing, 18-0.

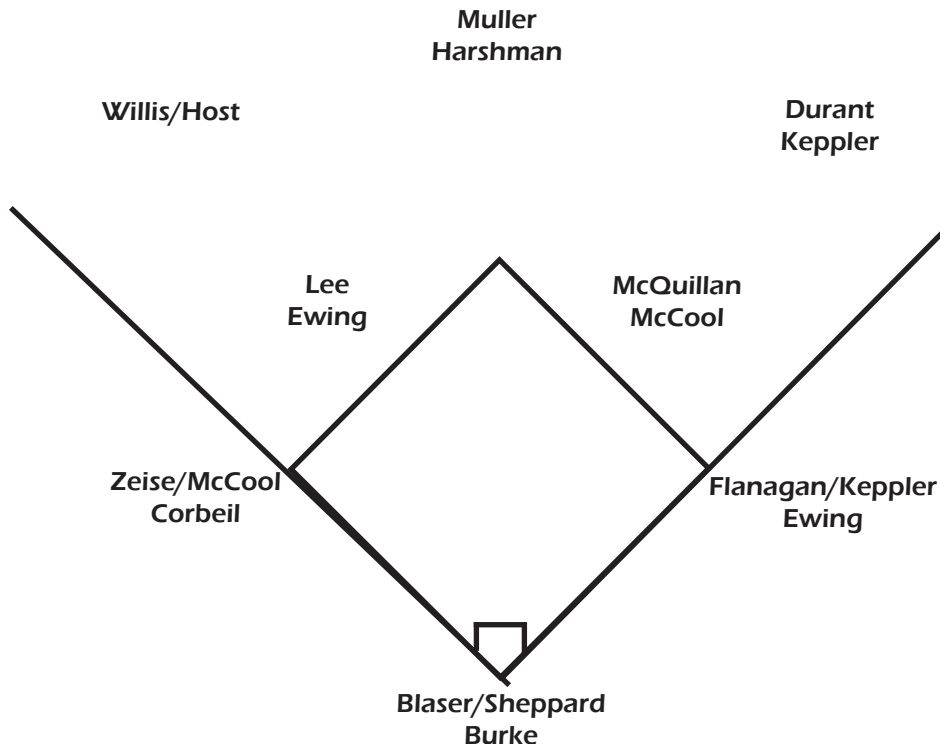

STACKING UP IN THE BIG TEN:

The Hawkeyes rank sixth or higher in these Big Ten offensive statistical categories: triples (2nd), hit-by-pitch (3rd), sacrifice bunts (2nd), sacrifice flies (6th) and stolen bases (6th).

The Iowa pitching staff ranks in the top five in: opposing batting average (2nd), saves (4th), earned runs allowed (5th) and home runs allowed (3rd).

WHERE THE HAWKEYES RANK:

Kurtis Muller and several Hawkeyes making a splash in conference statistics. Muller ranks in the top ten in; batting average (9th), doubles (4th) and fielding percentage (1st.)

Sean Flanagan ranks fourth in hit by pitches and **Phil Keppler** is tied with Muller for first with no errors.

Phil Schreiber ranks in the top ten in opposing batting average (6th) and games started (1st). **Jarred Hippen** ranks in batters struck out looking (3rd), innings pitched (6th) and games started (5th). **Zach Kenyon** has the eighth lowest opposing batting average, **Patrick Schatz** has the fifth most appearances and **Kevin Lee** is second in league saves.

IN IT FOR THE LONG HAUL:

Sophomore **Jarred Hippen** has both of Iowa's longest outings. The southpaw went eight and one-third innings against No. 3 Texas. Despite earning a no decision, he struck out eight batters.

Hippen tied a career best in his win against Rutgers. His eight and two-third innings performance was the longest the hurler had ever gone. (The last time a Hawkeye went eight and two-third innings was **Nick Brown** against Indiana Apr. 10, 2009).

Hippen has recorded two eight strikeout games, one shy of his career best (9, Michigan in 2009).

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM:

With a 2-1 record, Iowa had several quality performances in Florida (Feb. 26-28). Sophomore pitcher **Jarred Hippen** and senior outfielder **Ryan Durant**, however, were the two Hawkeyes to earn second team all-tournament honors by collegebaseball360.com.

Hippen got his first win of the year, by-way of an eight and two-third innings performance with eight Ks and only one walk. Durant went 6-for-11 with a double, homer and six RBI.

RBI ALERT:

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** drove in seven RBI to lead Iowa to victory over Illinois State Feb. 22. The RBI total is the most since Dallas Burke drove in six against Minnesota on May 2, 2009. Seven RBI also ties for the conference's game-high this year. (Tying with Coley Crank from Michigan.)

Iowa junior **Kurtis Muller** will be writing a weekly blog for pingbaseball.com this season. Hawkeye fans will be able to link to his weekly blog through hawkeyesports.com.

Muller was recognized as a freshman all-American by Ping! in 2008. The native of Sun Prairie, WI, is a three-time Unity Council member and an ISAAC representative.

IOWA NATIVE VOLUNTEERS:

Zach Dillon is in his first season as a volunteer coach at the University of Iowa.

Dillon, a native of Urbandale, IA, attended Baylor University and was subsequently selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 20th Round (595th overall) of the 2006 amateur entry draft as a catcher. His honors include 2005 ABCA second team all-Midwest Region selection, 2005 first team all-Big 12 Conference honoree and a nine time Big 12 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll recipient.

Dillon will work with the catchers, assist with hitters and take over as camp coordinator.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Zach Dillon**.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks than the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed

Iowa Head Baseball Coach **Jack Dahm** has announced that **Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski** and **Taylor Zeutenhorst** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and **Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler** and **Aaron Smit** intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area.
