Series Record: Iowa leads 29-17 (Last Meeting, IOWA 75-64, Jan. 9, 2006)

**The Setting** • lowa (14-9, 7-5) remains on the road for its second-straight contest against a nationally ranked opponent when it travels to East Lansing, MI, to face 14th-ranked Michigan State (19-7, 9-4). Tip-off is slated for 6:02 p.m. (CST) at the Breslin Center (14,759).

lowa snapped a three-game losing skid to Michigan State with a 75-64 triumph on Jan. 9 in Iowa City.

On the Tube • Thursday's game will be televised live on ESPNU. Beth Mowins and Nancy Lieberman will call the action. Check with your local cable or satellite provider for distribution in your area.

**On the Radio** • Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call the action for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the game on WHO 1040-AM in Des Moines and WMT 600-AM in Cedar Rapids.

The game can also be heard live over the Internet at <a href="www.hawkeyesports.com">www.hawkeyesports.com</a>. Just click "Hawkeye All-Access" is a subscription service.

Thursday's contest can also be heard live on XM Satellite Radio, channel 197.

**lowa History** • lowa has played 902 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, lowa's record is 551-351 (.611). That includes a 274-130 (.678) mark in Big Ten games and a 247-61 (.802) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

**Game Time Change •** The Big Ten Conference announced that lowa's regular season finale vs. Indiana will be televised live on Comcast SportsNet Chicago. Due to television, the game time has moved from 2 p.m. to 12 p.m. at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The game could potentially have an impact on the seeding for the 2006 Big Ten Tournament presented by Xbox Live. Indiana, which defeated lowa in Bloomington, 65-53, to open the conference season on Dec. 29, is currently fifth in the Big Ten with an 8-5 record and 14-10 overall. Iowa sits sixth at 7-5, with an overall mark of 14-9.

**Number of the Week - - 2** · lowa has recorded two victories over top-ten opponents this season (No. 9 Michigan State 75-64 and No. 8 Purdue 77-71, ot). The last time the Hawkeyes recorded two wins against top-ten teams in the same season was Head Coach Lisa Bluder's first season on the Hawkeye sidelines (2000-01). lowa picked up two victories over Purdue that year, first when it was ranked fifth (96-87 at lowa City) and second when the Boilermakers were ranked seventh (75-70 at Grand Rapids).

**Gold on the Road** • lowa will wear its gold uniforms in all road games this year after it had its black uniforms shrunk at the Odwalla Classic, Nov. 25-26. After the Hawkeyes played nationally-ranked Oklahoma on Nov. 25, the San Francisco Athletic Department, who hosted the tournament, accidentally overheated lowa's road uniforms while washing the uniforms for the lowa's consolation game vs. Rider.

**Crystal Smith Nets Career Point No. 1,000** • Crystal Smith became the 22nd lowa player to amass 1,000 career points when the senior netted 26 points vs. No. 8 Ohio State on Jan. 12 to eclipse the 1,000-point plateau. Smith currently ranks 18th in Hawkeye career scoring (1,100), 962 of which came the last 56 games (17.2 ppg). She also ranks sixth in career 3-pointers (107) and steals (198).

Smith averaged 1.1 points per game in 21 games her freshman year, followed by a 3.9 scoring average in 29 contests her sophomore season and 16.8 ppg her junior year. Smith currently averages 17.7 ppg through 23 games in her senior campaign. Smith's scoring average ranks second in the Big Ten and 49th nationally. She has led lowa in scoring 14 times this season.

**Scouting No. 14 Michigan State •** Michigan State enters Thursday's game winners of five conssecutive contests. Thursday will be the Spartans third-straight home game after posting wins over Minnesota (84-61) and Wisconsin (53-27). Michigan State needed a 20-2 run to end Sunday's game to rally from a 12-point second-half deficit to upend Wisconsin and remain fourth in the Big Ten standings. The Spartans boast a 13-1 home record, with its only setback coming on a last second shot to No. 7 Ohio State (67-65). The Big Ten's top four teams in the standings boast a 23-1 home record in league play this season.

Michigan State ranks first in Big Ten rebounding margin (+5.5) and steals (11.46) and second in turnover margin (+2.92) in conference games only. Senior Liz Shimek ranks second in Big Ten rebounding (8.7) and scoring (17.7) in overall games, while Lindsay Bowen ranks second in 3-pointers made (2.12), third in field goal percentage (.913) and fifth in assists (3.81).

The 75 points Michigan State allowed Iowa on Jan. 9 are the most the Spartans have yielded in Big Ten play this year.

Michigan State is coached by Joanne P. McCallie, who is in her 14th year (287-136, .678) as a head coach and his sixth season (120-63, .656) with the Spartans. McCallie is 4-6 against the Hawkeyes.

**All-Time Series Record** • Thursday will be the 46th meeting between Iowa and Michigan State, with the Hawkeyes leading the series 29-17. Iowa boasts a 13-8 advantage in games played in East Lansing. The Hawkeyes are 3-1 in games played at the Breslin Center under Coach Bluder.

Michigan State has won three of the last four in the series. Iowa snapped a three-game losing skid to the Spartans with a 75-64 victory in Iowa City on Jan. 9, 2006.

**lowa and Michigan State Fast Breaks** • lowa has raised its Big Ten-leading free throw percentage .24 points the last four contests. The Hawkeyes are 65-73 (.890) from the charity stripe its last four games. lowa is shooting a staggering 80.0 percent from the foul line in league games.

Two of the Big Ten's top-two prolific scorers will be featured Thursday in Iowa's Crystal Smith and Michigan State's Liz Shimek; both average 17.7 points in overall games. Additionally, Smith (.929) ranks behind Michigan State's Lindsay Bowen (.935) in conference games only free throw percentage.

Freshman Megan Skouby, who ranks third in Big Ten scoring in conference games only (16.7), has posted double figures 10-straight games -- a streak that ranks fourth-best in the league.

Crystal Smith scored a team-high 21 points against the Buckeyes, marking the eighth time this year the senior has eclipsed 20 points. She ranks fifth in the Big Ten in scoring 20 points or more in a game.

Two Hawkeyes posted career highs in the loss at No. 7 Ohio State. Tiffany Reedy drained a personal-best four triples on 4-5 shooting from behind the arc, while Kristi Smith dished out a career-best eight assists against the Buckeyes.

lowa defeated Michigan State in its previous meeting despite being out-rebounded by eight (40-32). The Hawkeyes are 9-0 when out-rebounding their opponents.

Megan Skouby had her best game statistically against Michigan State on Jan. 9. The native of Mentor, OH, tallied personal bests in points (27), field goals made (12) and attempted (20) and assists (3). She also pulled down eight rebounds.

Both Iowa and Michigan State played against former Iowa Head Coach C. Vivian Stringer's Rutgers squad this season. The Hawkeyes fell 57-51, while the Spartans held on for a 73-71 triumph.

Freshman Lindsey Nyenhuis is the only lowa player that hails from Michigan (Grand Rapids).

lowa captains for the season are seniors Morgan Kasperek, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith.

**RPI Ratings** • lowa ranks 57th, while Michigan State ranks 21st in the RPI ratings published Feb. 13 on <a href="www.collegerpi.com">www.collegerpi.com</a>. All nine lowa losses came to opponents with a current RPI of 90 or better, including four in the top 10.

**Last Meeting** • Iowa scored 48 second half points en route to a 75-64 triumph over ninth-rated Michigan State inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was the Hawkeyes' first over a top-ten ranked team since defeating ninth-ranked Purdue 90-75 on Jan. 6, 2002 in Iowa City.

Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 27 points, while Crystal Smith added 18 and VandeVenter 17 to lead the Hawkeyes. Skouby and Smith also pulled down eight rebounds each, while VandeVenter grabbed a team-best nine.

Skouby dominated the Spartans' zone defense with turnaround jumpers and hook shots, and finished 12-20 from the field. Her point total was the most by an lowa freshman since Tiffany Gooden scored 36 in the 1994-95 season.

lowa forced 21 turnovers and held Michigan State to 4-16 on 3-point attempts. The Hawkeyes turned the 21 Spartan miscues into 17 points.

Michigan State held a 29-27 halftime lead before Skouby sparked the Hawkeyes with 19 second-half points on 6-6 shooting.

The Hawkeyes had a 10-0 run early in the second half to build a 46-36 lead. The Spartans shaved lowa's advantage to one (61-60) with 3:13, but lowa closed the contest on a 14-3 run.

Liz Shimek led Michigan State with 16 points and 15 rebounds. Lindsay Bowen added 13 points.

Crystal Smith was scoreless through the first 12 minutes before helping Skouby in a second-half scoring barrage. Smith hit a jumper with 7:05 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes their first lead at 20-19. She hit two others during a 10-2 run that padded lowa's lead to 22-19.

lowa's starters combined for 72 of its 75 points. The Hawkeyes outscored the Spartans 15-4 at the foull line. Michigan State attempted an lowa opponent season-low six free throws, just one game after converting 30-34 against nationally-rabked Rutgers.

**Last Time Out** • Ohio State won a battle between the conferences' top two scoring offenses Sunday as the seventh-ranked Buckeyes held on for an 88-77 win over lowa at Value City Arena.

Both teams started the game on fire as Ohio State made its first 11 field goal attempts (100%), while lowa made eight of its first 11 (72.7%) in the first 7:30 of the game. The Buckeyes finished the contest shooting a Big Ten-season-best 65.4% (34-52), including 53.8% (7-13) from 3-point range. lowa shot the ball well too, but not good enough as the Hawkeyes made 56.3% (27-48) of their field goals, including 53.3% (8-15) from behind the arc.

lowa trailed 40-25 late in the first half, but closed the period on a 14-2 run to only trail by three (42-39) at the break. The Hawkeyes tied the game at 50-50 at the 15:41 mark, but the Buckeyes answered with an 18-6 run to build a 12-point advantage and never looked back.

Ohio State all-American Jessica Davenport netted a game-high 24 points, while senior transfer Debbie Merrill collected 15 points, nine rebounds and seven assists.

Hawkeye senior Crystal Smith, who struggled in lowa's previous two games scoring a combined 10 points, erupted for 21 points and dished out four assists. Freshman Megan Skouby returned to her home state and scored 18 points in front of family and friends. Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 16 points, bolstered by 4-5 shooting from behind the arc, while freshman Kristi Smith dished out a game-high eight assists.

The 77 points are the most points Ohio State has allowed this season, besting Oklahoma's 71 scored on Jan. 9.

The win extended Ohio State's home-conference winning streak to 15, dating back to a 57-54 loss to Purdue on Feb. 8, 2004.

#### Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her sixth season as head coach at the University of lowa and her 22nd season as a college head coach. Bluder, 44, has a career record of 466-210 (.689), including a 110-68 (.618) record at lowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is lowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to five post-season



tournaments (3 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and three upper division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became lowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. Last season lowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (8) and Emma (5) and one son, David (3).

**lowa vs. Ranked Teams** • lowa has recorded at least one victory over a ranked opponent in each of the six years under Coach Bluder. lowa is 2-5 against ranked foes this season. These are lowa's most recent wins vs. nationally ranked opponents:

**In the Rankings** • lowa ranks fifth in the nation in free throw percentage, 17th nationally in field goal percentage, 13th in assists, 21st in scoring and 21st in fewest fouls through games played Feb. 13. Crystal Smith ranks 49th in scoring, while Megan Skouby ranks 18th in field goal percentage.

Michigan State ranks 17th in free throw percentage.

**Another First** • lowa never had a regulation lead in its thrilling 77-71 victory over Purdue on Feb. 2. The Hawkeyes' first lead came one minute into overtime. It is believed to be the first time in lowa women's basketball history that the Hawkeyes won a game without holding the lead in regulation.

**Skouby Trying to Join Elite List** • Megan Skouby is lowa's scoring leader in conference games only, averaging 16.7 points. Only two other freshman Hawkeyes have ever finished the season leading the team in scoring in league games only (Lisa Becker, 1984 and Tiffany Gooden, 1995). Skouby's 314 overall points ranks seventh in lowa freshman single-season scoring.

**Skouby Leads Big Ten Freshmen** • Freshman Megan Skouby has raised her game to a new level since taking over the starting center position for injured sophomore Stacy Schlapkohl. Skouby, who is the Big Ten freshmen scoring leader, averages 16.7 points, 5.7 rebounds and 1.83 blocks in conference play. The 6-6 standout ranks 12th in overall scoring (13.7) in the Big Ten, third in blocks (1.74) and fourth in field goal percentage (.573). She ranks third in conference scoring (16.7), fourth in blocks (1.83) and 17th in rebounding (5.6). Skouby has led lowa in scoring seven of the last 13 contests, including four of the last seven. She has posted 20 points or more five times this year.

**Skouby Quickly Climbed Freshman Chart** • Megan Skouby has rejected 40 shots. She blocked a career-high five shots at Michigan on Jan. 5 to surpass Jennie Lillis for second place on Iowa's freshman single season blocking list. Tangela Smith holds Iowa's freshman mark with 73 blocks.

**DE-FENSE!** • lowa's perimeter defense has been stellar through 23 games. The Hawkeyes rank first in Big Ten 3-point field goal defense (.274). Last season lowa ranked 10th in the league in 3-point field goal defense (.361).

**Smith Ranks Second in Big Ten in Scoring •** Senior Crystal Smith ranks second in Big Ten scoring (17.7) and 49th nationally; Ohio State's Jessica Davenport (19.4) ranks first. Michigan State's Liz Shimek (17.7) and Indiana's Cyndi Valentin (17.7) are tied with Smith for second. Smith has led lowa in scoring in 14 of lowa's 23 contests.

Smith's 46 points at Louisiana Tech are the most scored in a game by any player in the nation this season. North Carolina A&T's Shareka Glover ranks second after netting 45 points vs. Morgan State on Jan. 23.

**Vandy is Dandy •** Sophomore Krista VandeVenter is one of the top allaround threats in the Big Ten. VandeVenter, who has started every game (56) as a Hawkeye, ranks third in Big Ten rebounding (8.3), sixth in steals (2.26), 12th in blocks (0.74) and 29th in scoring (9.3). She has led the Hawkeyes in rebounding 16 times this season. The 6-2 forward has recorded three double-doubles (lowa State, Minnesota and Northwestern) this season and six in her career.

VandeVenter fouled out of her first career game Sunday at Ohio State.

**Dishing the Rock** • lowa ranks second in Big Ten assists, dishing the ball 17.30 times per game. Three Hawkeyes average 2.96 assists or better: Crystal Smith (3.30), Kristi Smith (3.04) and Krista VandeVenter (2.96).

**Triple Play •** Tiffany Reedy made 19 triples in each of her first three seasons. The senior drained a personal-best four 3-pointers at Ohio State to raise her total to 25, which is a new single-season best. She is shooting at a 39.7 percent clip from behind the arc, which ranks fourth in the Big Ten.

lowa ranks third in Big Ten 3-point field goal percentage (.373) after ranking fourth last year (.343). The Hawkeyes shot a Big Ten-season-best 69.2% (9-13) from behind the arc at Northwestern on Jan. 15. Iowa also converted 53.3% (8-15) from 3-point range at Ohio State on Feb. 12.

**Kristi Smith Matures Into Starting Role** • Hawkeye freshman Kristi Smith has done a fantastic job directing the lowa offense since taking over the starting role. In Big Ten play, Smith averages 7.3 points, 3.53 assists and 0.92 steals. She is averaging 11.0 points, 3.8 rebounds and 4.3 assists in the Hawkeyes' last four contests. Smith dished out a personal-best eight assists at Ohio State. She ranks fifth in Big Ten assists in league games only.

**Cashing in at the Free Throw Line** • Freshman Wendy Ausdemore became the first Hawkeye to start the season making her first 19 free throw attempts. She has made 32-34 (.941) from the charity stripe this season.

Senior Crystal Smith made her first 18 attempts from the foul line in lowa's first three conference contests, including draining all 11 attempts vs. Illinois. Smith's 11-11 performance tied a school and arena record for free throw percentage in a game. She is shooting a blistering 92.9 percent (52-56) from the free throw line in conference games, which ranks second behind Michigan State's Lindsay Bowen (.935).

**Underclassmen Start for Hawkeyes** • lowa's starting lineup includes two freshmen (Kristi Smith and Megan Skouby) and one sophomore (Krista VandeVenter). The last time lowa had two freshmen starters was during the 1998-99 campaign (Lindsey Meder and Leah Magner).

VandeVenter started all 56 games as a Hawkeye, including all 23 this season. The power forward ranks third in team scoring (9.3) and first in rebounding (8.3). She has pulled down 442 rebounds and is 40 rebounds from equaling all-American Michelle Edwards (482) for 17th on lowa's career rebounding chart.

Smith started the last 15 games at point guard for lowa. The native of Thornton, CO ranks fourth in team scoring (6.8) and second in assists (3.04).

Skouby will start her 13th contest Thursday. The 6-6 center ranks second in team scoring (13.7), first in blocks (1.74) and field goal percentage (.573), and fourth in rebounding (4.7).

lowa is one of two Big Ten teams with two or more freshmen starters. Michigan starts three, while lowa starts two.

**Big Ten Rankings** • lowa ranks first in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.274), scoring offense (73.5) and free throw percentage (.763), second in field goal percentage (.463), assists (17.30) and assist/turnover ratio (+1.01) and third in 3-point field goal percentage (.373).

Senior Crystal Smith ranks second in league scoring (17.7) and steals (2.39), sixth in free throw percentage (.852), ninth in 3-pointers made (1.73) and 12th in 3-point field goal percentage (.350). Freshman Megan Skouby ranks third in blocks (1.74) and fourth in field goal percentage (.573). Sophomore Krista VandeVenter ranks third in rebounding (8.3), sixth in steals (2.26), second in defensive rebounds (6.04) and 12th in blocks (0.74).



The Hawkeyes shoot 2.3 percent better from the field, including 12.1 percent from 3-point range in their victories. Iowa avearges 6.5 more rebounds in wins than losses. The Hawkeyes also have made more free throws (228) than its opponents have attempted (172) in its 14 wins. Iowa holds opponents to only 24.9 percent shooting from behind the arc in their wins. The Hawkeyes average only 14.4 assists in its nine defeats. Here are the wins and losses comparisons:

**High Octane** • lowa, who ranks first in Big Ten scoring offense (73.5), has scored 80 points or more in seven of its 23 games. The Hawkeyes are 12-2 when scoring 70 points or more; the two losses came in double overtime at Louisiana Tech (95-91) and at Ohio State (88-77).

Freshmen Step Up • Iowa's freshmen class (Megan Skouby, Wendy Ausdemore, Kristi Smith, Nicole VanderPol and Lindsey Nyenhuis) are averaging 30.3 ppg through 23 games. The trio of Ausdemore, Skouby and Smith tallied a freshmen season-best 57 points vs. No. 8 Purdue on Feb. 2.

Skouby ranks second in team scoring (13.7) and second in rebounding (4.7), while Ausdemore (6.8) and Smith (6.8) rank fourth in scoring. Smith also ranks second in assists (3.04).

**Five Spot •** Crystal Smith, who was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Nov. 28, broke or tied five school records during Thanksgiving week.

The senior broke school records for points (46) and free throws attempted (19) in a game and equaled school records in free throws made (15) and 3-pointers attempted (14) in lowa's 95-91 double overtime setback at Louisiana Tech on Nov. 22. The native of Haughton, LA, also matched the school record for field goal percentage (9-9, 1.000) in the Hawkeyes' 88-41 rout over Rider on Nov. 26.

In the three games, Smith averaged 28.3 points, 4.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.7 steals per game. She finished the week 26-of-55 (.473) from the field, 10-of-25 (.400) from the perimeter and 23-of-28 (.821) at the line.

**Movin' On Up** • Senior Crystal Smith (198) ranks sixth on lowa's career steals chart. She is seven thefts from equaling Jolette Law (205) for fifth. Smith (1,100) is also 29 points from catching Lisa Anderson (1,129) for 17th in career scoring at Iowa. Sophomore Krista VandeVenter (442) is 40 rebounds from matching all-American Michelle Edwards (482) for 17th in career rebounds.

**Freebies!** • Iowa has attempted 115 more free throws (456-341) than its opponents through 23 games. The Hawkeyes get to the foul line 5.0 more times than their foes. Furthermore, Iowa has made (348) more free throws than its opponents have attempted (341).

lowa is getting to the foul line 1.2 times more this year than it did last year. Last season, the Hawkeyes averaged 18.6 free throw attempts, while so far this year lowa averages 19.8 attempts.

**Reedy Set Go •** Senior Tiffany Reedy played in her 100th career game vs. Vermont on Dec. 3. The native of Dysart, IA, has had a solid 2005-06 campaign, averaging 6.8 ppg, 4.0 rpg and ranking third on the team in steals with 21. Reedy collected 14 thefts and averaged 3.9 ppg and 2.4 rpg in 33 contests last season.

**All-Tournament Selections** • Senior Crystal Smith and sophomore Krista VandeVenter were named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament team. Smith also garnered Odwalla Classic All-Tournament accolades for her efforts Nov. 25-26 in San Francisco, CA.

**Making the List** • lowa has recorded two victories by 40 points or more this season. The Hawkeyes posted a 40-point triumph (82-42) over UW-Milwaukee on Nov. 20. The 40-point win ranks as the 15th-largest margin of victory in school history. Iowa registered a 47-point victory (88-41) over Rider on Nov. 26. The 47-point win ranks as the ninth-largest margin of victory in lowa history.

lowa has posted six wins of 40 points or more under Coach Bluder (48 – UT-Pan American, 2001; 47 -- Rider; 45 – Western Illinois, 2000; 43 – Creighton, 2002; 40 – Northwestern, 2001; 40 -- UW-Milwaukee, 2005).



On This Date • lowa is 8-3 in games played on Feb. 16, including winning three straight. lowa is 1-1 against Michigan State on Feb. 16.

More on Smith's Records • Crystal Smith's 46 points bested Cindy Haugejorde's 44-point effort vs. Luther College on Jan. 12, 1977. In addition, the 46 points is the second-most scored in a single game in Big Ten history. Illinois' Kendra Gantt and Penn State's Kelly Mazzante both netted 49 points. The 46 points are the most ever scored by a Louisiana Tech opponent, besting the previous record of 43 points scored by USCs Cheryl Miller, and was one point from a Thomas Assembly Center record.

Smith's 19 free throws attempted topped the previous school record held by Nadine Domond and Amy Herrig. Domond attempted 16 foul shots vs. UCSB on Nov. 25, 1995, while Herrig attempted 16 free throws vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 19 free throws attempted ranks eighth in Big Ten annals with five others.

Smith's 15 free throws made equaled Amy Herrig's school record of 15 established vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 15 foul shots made ranks seventh in league history with eight others.

Smith's 14 three-pointers attempted equals the school record previously set by Lindsey Meder twice before. Meder attempted 14 at Colorado on Dec. 2, 2001 and vs. Ohio State on Jan. 3, 2002.

Smith's perfect 9-9 (1.000) shooting performance from the field matched Jamie Cavey's record of 9-9 (1.000) vs. Marquette on March 23, 2003. All of Cavey's field goals were two-point baskets, while four of Smith's five were from behind the arc.

**Attendance Rankings** • lowa ranks 23rd (3,756) nationally in the women's basketball attendance rankings released Feb. 13. Michigan State ranks 10th (6,836).

**Iowa Ties Arena Mark** • Iowa's 55 second-half points scored in its 84-65 triumph over Illinois on Jan. 1, matched the Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for most points in a second half. The Hawkeyes also scored 55 vs. Western Illinois on Nov. 25, 2000.

**Young Guns** • lowa is tied for 15th in the nation with the most underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes are tied with 16 other schools, including Big Ten schools Northwestern and Illinois, with nine underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes have four freshmen and five sophomores on its roster. Air Force (13) leads the nation, followed by New Orleans (12). Michigan is tied for seventh (10), while Penn State (8) and Wisconsin (8) are tied for 31st.

**Century Club** • Iowa Head Women's Basketball Coach Lisa Bluder reached another milestone on Dec. 3, as Bluder collected her 100th victory as Iowa Head Coach in Iowa's 79-57 triumph over Vermont on Dec. 3. Bluder, who is the second all-time winningest Iowa coach, boasts a 109-67 (.619) record in six years mentoring the Hawkeyes.

Home Grown Hawkeyes • lowa's roster features six players from the state of lowa (Wendy Ausdemore, Abby Emmert, Ebone Pope, Tiffany Reedy, Stacy Schlapkohl and Nicole VanderPol). The Hawkeyes also have four players from Illinois (Jenee Graham, Morgan Kasperek, Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson). Iowa's 15-person roster also features players from Colorado (Kristi Smith), Louisiana (Crystal Smith), Michigan (Lindsey Nyenhuis), Minnesota (Krista VandeVenter) and Ohio (Megan Skouby).

Hawkeyes Pen Quoie • lowa signed Woodbury, MN, native Zoraa Quoie to a National Letter of Intent last fall. She was an all-conference and honorable mention all-state selection her junior year. Quoie averaged 10.6 ppg and just fewer than four steals per game on a team that won its conference and finished 25-3 last season. Her Woodbury High School team also captured a league title and finished third at the Minnesota state tournament her sophomore year. Quoie was a reserve her sophomore year, but started last season. She was also an all-state sprinter on the track team her freshman year.

**Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series** • Iowa State leads the second annual Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series 11-4. Iowa State has recorded victories in women's soccer (2-1), football (23-3), women's basketball (77-61), men's basketball (72-60) and women's gymnastics (195.7-193.375). Iowa's two wins came in wrestling (20-15) and women's swimming and diving (156-144).

**Big Ten Tournament Tickets on Sale** • All-session tickets for the 2006 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament are \$55. Tickets can be purchased at the Conseco Fieldhouse box office, Ticketmaster outlets, www. ticketmaster.com or by calling Ticketmaster at (317) 239-5151.

The tournament returns to Indianapolis for the 11th time in 12 years and has attracted more than 30,000 fans for each of the last four events. Just two years ago, the Big Ten set a pair of attendance records when the 2004 championship game was played in front of a single-session record of 9,417 fans, which established an overall tournament record of 37,635 spectators. In the past 11 years of Big Ten Tournament play, the conference has welcomed more than 314,000 fans. Five different league representatives have become tournament champions. Purdue leads all teams with five titles followed by two championships for both lowa and Penn State and a single title for Indiana and Michigan State.

#### Game Summaries

#### Game 1 Iowa 82, UW-Milwaukee 42 Nov. 20, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY - -** lowa won its sixth-straight season opening game under Head Coach Lisa Bluder with an 82-42 rout over UW-Milwaukee in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes took a 15-point advantage into halftime and never looked back. lowa shot 61.5 percent (16-26) from the field in the second half and 58.5 percent (31-53) for the game. A majority of lowa's field goal attempts came from close range as the Hawkeyes out-scored the Panthers 42-18 in the paint.

All 12 Hawkeyes that played netted at least two points. Furthermore, 10 Hawkeyes collected at least one assist, while eight lowa players recorded one steal or more. As a team, lowa generated 21 assists and 17 steals. Jenee Graham registered a game-high six assists, while UW-Milwaukee accumulated a team total of seven assists.

A trio of Hawkeye post players paced the Hawkeyes in victory. Stacy Schlapkohl, Krista VandeVenter and Megan Skouby each scored 12 points each. The trio combined to shoot 15-23 (.652) from the field and 6-8 (.750) from the foul line.

lowa finished the game strong, out-scoring UW-Milwaukee 23-6 in the final 12 minutes

lowa limited UW-Milwaukee to 15.6 percent (5-32) shooting from the field in the second half and 29.6 percent (16-54) for the the game. Traci Edwards led the Panthers, recording a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds).

With lowa enjoying a large lead for most of the game, Bluder was able to rotate her entire bench and not allow a single Hawkeye to play more than 21 minutes.

The 40-point triumph is lowa's largest season opening win since a 43-point victory (83-40) vs. Wyoming on Nov. 25, 1998 in the Hawaii Wahine Classic.

The Lady Techsters spoiled lowa senior Crystal Smith's homecoming, who was raised in nearby Haughton, LA, but not without a huge outing by Smith. Smith poured in a school-record 46 points, which is the most points by a Louisiana Tech opponent and was one point from an arena record. Smith also established a new school record for free throws attempted (19) and equaled the school record for foul shots made (15). She also set a career high with two blocked shots and matched a career best with eight rebounds.

lowa led 71-52 with 7:18 remaining in regulation, but turnovers and poor free throw shooting enabled the Lady Techsters to sneak back into the game and outscore the Hawkeyes 24-5 the final seven minutes of regulation. Louisiana Tech forced eight lowa turnovers on its press and converted the eight miscues into 12 points. Louisiana Tech out-scored the Hawkeyes 8-4 in the sixth period to lift the Lady Techsters to victory.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 10 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Krista Vandeventer added five points, 11 rebounds, five assists, two blocks and two steals in defeat

The Sooners dominated the Hawkeyes in the post, out-scoring Iowa 48-16 in the paint and scoring 27 second chance points for the game.

Senior Crystal Smith paced the Hawkeyes with a team-high 15 points and a game-high five steals. Sophomore Krista VandeVenter tallied seven points and grabbed a team-high 11 rebounds. Freshman Megan Skouby netted all of her 11 points in the second half and also corralled six rebounds in defeat.

lowa's underclassmen scored 44 of the Hawkeyes' 68 points, including 27 from freshmen.

lowa converted a season-best 89.5 percent (17-19) from the free throw line. Conversely, the Hawkeyes shot a season-low 38.3 percent (23-60) from the field. Oklahoma's win was its first victory over lowa in three tries.

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - - The lowa Hawkeyes led start-to-finish cruising to a lobsided 88-41 triumph over Rider in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic. The 47-point victory ranks as the ninth-largest in school history.

#### Game Summaries

Game 6 lowa 79, Vermont Dec. 3, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY (AP) --** Crystal Smith scored 26 points to lead lowa to a 79-57 victory over Vermont in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge, setting up a sentimental title game against No. 6 Rutgers.

For the first time since leaving lowa in 1995, Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer will coach against the Hawkeyes, a program she turned into a national powerhouse during her 12-year tenure in Iowa City.

After taking the lowa job in 1983, Stringer won a school-best 269 games, guided the Hawkeyes to six Big Ten titles and nine straight NCAA appearances before leaving to take the job at Rutgers.

The Scarlet Knights advanced to the championship game by beating San Jose State 76-64, behind 26 points from all-American guard Cappie Pondexter.

But it was Smith who ensured lowa a spot in the marquee matchup.

Five minutes into the second half, a fast-break layup by Vermont's Alexis Castro made the score 44-40, the closest margin since the game's opening minutes.

Then Smith took charge, scoring 10 points over the next nine minutes in a 20-10 lowa run

A 3-pointer by Wendy Ausdemore put Iowa up 47-40 at the 13:44 mark, and Smith's 3-pointer with 7:56 left stretched the lead to 15 points and put the game out of reach. Smith, last week's Big Ten Player of the Week, also had three assists and six steals

Stacy Schlapkohl added 12 points and seven rebounds for Iowa. The Hawkeyes also shot 46 percent and won praise from coach Lisa Bluder, who stressed all week the need to focus first on Vermont.

Ashleigh Cuncic led the Catamounts (2-4) with 17 points. Sy Janousek added 11 points, but Vermont shot just 32 percent and was outscored in the paint 24-8.

Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 17 points. VandeVenter topped her season best with 15 points and had six rebounds. The Hawkeyes shot 38 percent from the floor and 79 percent from the free throw line.

Stringer was cheered loudly as she strolled out of the locker room and along the sidelines, shaking hands with friends and university officials, during warmups and pregame introductions.

AMES, IA - - The Iowa State women's basketball team defeated Iowa 77-61 at Hilton Coliseum. The loss was Iowa's fifth-straight in Ames and increases Iowa State's lead in the Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series to 7-2.

#### Game Summaries

Game 9 lowa 92, Drake 72 Dec. 18, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY --** lowa returned to action after a 10-day layoff and cruised to a 92-72 victory over Drake in front of a season-high 5,556 fans at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

lowa dominated the undersized Drake squad, out-scoring the Bulldogs 44-32 in the paint. Hawkeye post players Krista VandeVenter, Stacy Schlapkohl and Megan Skouby combined for 47 points and 17 rebounds. The trio shot at a 77.8 percent clip (21-27) from the floor and 83.3 percent (5-6) from the foul line.

Skouby netted a career-high 19 points (9-11 FG, 1-2 FT). Skouby scored 15 of her 19 points in the second half, as the freshman only played four minutes in the first half after being whistled for two quick fouls.

VandeVenter scored 10 of her 14 points in the first half. The sophomore also corralled seven rebounds, dished out four assists, blocked one shot and matched a career high with four steals.

Schlapkohl contributed 12 of her 14 points in the first half. The native of Durant, IA, also grabbed a career-high eight rebounds and collected two assists.

Receiving her first collegiate start today was freshman Kristi Smith. She directed the Hawkeye offense for 25 minutes, scoring four points, dishing out four assists and pulling down two rebounds. Iowa's other Smith, Crystal, added a game-high 21 points (10-14 FG) and also collected four assists and four steals.

Drake, who lost for the fifth time in six tries, was led by Jill Martin. Martin tallied 17 points and grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds.

lowa started the game on fire, sinking 12 of its first 16 shots from the floor and claiming a 16-point advantage (28-12) by the second media timeout of the first period. lowa went into the locker room with a comfortable 45-29 lead. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 60.6 percent (20-33) from the field in the first stanza.

The 92 points are the most yielded by a Drake team since the Bulldogs surrendered 90 against lowa State on Dec. 5, 2001.

Game 10 lowa 65, Northern Iowa 54 Dec. 21, 2005, UNI Dome

**CEDAR FALLS**, IA - - Hawkeye senior Crystal Smith poured in a game-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds as the lowa Hawkeye women's basketball team downed the Northern Iowa Panthers for the 10th-straight time 65-54 at the UNI Dome.

lowa had a nine-point halftime cushion, but Northern lowa came out of the locker room on fire. The Panthers scored the first nine points of the second stanza to even the contest at 31 with 15:53 remaining. The Hawkeyes answered with a 12-4 run the next four minutes to rebuild their lead back to eight (43-35) with 11:20 left.

Northern Iowa continued to fight back and trimmed the Hawkeye advantage to six with 2:15 remaining, but back-to-back triples by Hawkeyes Tiffany Reedy and Abby Emmert helped seal Iowa's second-straight win over a Missouri Valley Conference opponent. Iowa converted 4-6 from the foul line the final minute to secure the 11-point victory.

Smith scored 13 of her 22 points in the first half, including netting lowa's final first half points. The native of Haughton, LA, attempted and made lowa's first 3-pointer of the game at the 15:40 mark of the second half to halt a 9-0 Northern lowa scoring run. Smith has tallied 20 points or more five times already this season.

Northern Iowa limited Hawkeye starters Krista VandeVenter and Stacy Schlapkohl to a combined three points on 0-8 shooting from the field and 3-5 from the foul line. However, Iowa's bench stepped up to fill the scoring void as the Hawkeye reserves out-scored the Panthers 24-8. Freshman Megan Skouby scored eight, while freshman Wendy Ausdemore and sophomore Abby Emmert each added seven.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed seven of her 10 points in the second half and also corralled five rebounds.

Northern lowa was led by senior Cassie Hager, who scored 17 points and blocked a game-high six shots. lowa's stifling 2-3 zone defense made it difficult for the Panthers to have open looks. Northern lowa converted only 31.1 percent (19-61) from the field, including only 17.2 percent (5-29) from behind the arc.

Game 11 Iowa 74, Creighton 64 Dec. 23, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY - -** Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter added 18 points and a career-high six steals en route to a 74-64 victory over Creighton at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was lowa's third straight over the Bluejays.

After Creighton jumped out to an early 7-1 lead to start the game Skouby drilled five straight jumpers to tie the contest at 13-13. Iowa took its first lead with 8:29 left in the first half after a layup from freshman Wendy Ausdemore, but the Bluejays regained the lead after a Kristi Woodard bucket and did not trail the rest of the half.

lowa trimmed the Creighton lead to two at the start the second half, but Ally Thrall sank a 3-pointer with 17:18 left to stretch the Bluejay lead to seven. The Hawkeyes responded with a 7-0 run to regain a 44-43 lead with 13:29 left.

After Creighton's Angie Janis hit a jumper to put the Bluejays up by three, VandeVenter swiped one of her six steals for a layup to give lowa a 50-49 lead with 9:48 left and the Hawkeyes never relinquished the lead. A 3-pointer by senior Tiffany Reedy gave lowa a 54-49 lead and a 3-point play by freshman Nicole VanderPol with 5:59 left gave the Hawkeyes a comfortable advantage. Four free throws by Ausdemore down the stretch sealed the win for lowa.

Starting center Stacy Schlapkohl suffered a season-ending ACL injury early in the first half. The lowa post players responded very well in Schlapkohl's absence, outscoring Creighton 36-22 in the paint. Skouby scored 12 of her 22 points in the first half, while VandeVenter scored 16 of her 18 points in the second period.

Creighton was able to gain an advantage on the boards and out-rebounded lowa 36-30, including 16 offensive rebounds. Angie Janis led Creighton with 19 points, while Kristi Woodard grabbed nine rebounds.

The Hoosiers opened up their biggest lead at 16 points with 13:53 left, using an 8-0 run capped by a 3-point play by Jenny DeMuth. lowa cut the lead to six at the 7:28 mark with a 9-0 run, all of which were 3-point baskets. Lindsey Nyenhuis drained her first basket of the game and back-to-back treys by Smith cut the Hoosier lead to 43-36.

Indiana fought back and gained a nine point lead with 1:58 left, but a 3-point play by Smith cut the Hoosier advantage to six once again. This was the closest lowa would come to gaining a lead as the Hoosiers sunk six free throws down the stretch to secure the victory.

Skouby recorded 10 points and two blocks in only 19 minutes of action, while VandeVenter played the entire 40 minutes. Kristi Smith added a careerhigh six assists for the Hawkeyes.

Indiana was led by Cyndi Valentin who scored a game-high 20 points. Jenny DeMuth notched a double-double 13 points and 10 rebounds, while Angela Hawkins scored 12 for the Hoosiers. Indiana outscored lowa 28-18 in the paint, while outrebounding the Hawkeyes 41-31.

#### Game Summaries

Game 13 Iowa 84, Illinois 65 Jan. 1, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY - -** A big second half lifted lowa to an 84-65 victory over Illinois inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win is lowa's fifth-straight over the Fighting Illini. A crowd of 3,439 watched lowa's first-ever New Year's Day game.

Crystal Smith ignited the Hawkeye offense, scoring a game-high 27 points on 7-13 shooting from the field and a perfect 11-11 from the foul line. Smith tallied 19 of her 27 points in the second period. Smith also collected seven rebounds, four steals and two assists.

Smith's perfect 11-11 shooting performance from the charity stripe tied a school record for free throw percentage in a game.

Krista VandeVenter had another big game for the Hawkeyes, scoring all 13 of her points in the second period and also posting game bests in rebounding (7) and assists (6). The six assists matched a career high for Vande-Venter. Nicole VanderPol added four points and four rebounds.

Illinois started the game on fire, draining seven of its 12 field goal attempts in the first six minutes to grab a commanding 17-2 advantage. The Hawkeyes started the contest ice-cold from the floor, missing six of their first seven field goal attempts. Iowa regained its shooting touch later in the half, as a Wendy Ausdemore 3-pointer capped an Iowa 11-0 run to tie the contest at 23 with 3:59 left. Ausdemore netted 11 of her career-high 14 points in the first stanza.

lowa silenced Illinois starter Janelle Hughes for the first 17 minutes, but the senior scored the Fighting Illini's final nine points on four-straight possessions of the half to propel Illinois to a six-point (34-29) halftime advantage.

Crystal Smith sparked a 17-2 scoring run in the second half to help give the Hawkeyes a 55-45 advantage with 11:30 left in the game. Smith scored nine of the 17 points during the scoring run.

Illinois' Erin Wigley and Hughes each scored 20 points to lead Illinois. Audrey Tabon pulled down seven rebounds to lead the Fighting Illini.

Game 14 Iowa 77, Michigan 63 Jan. 5, 2006, Crisler Arena

**ANN ARBOR, MI - -** Four Hawkeye starters scored in double figures as the lowa Hawkeyes won its sixth-straight game over Michigan 77-63 inside Crisler Arena.

Megan Skouby had a career night as the 6-6 center posted career bests in points (20), rebounds (8) and blocks (5). Krista VandeVenter, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith each contributed 13 points en route to victory. In addition to her 13 points, Smith collected seven rebounds, four steals and a career-high nine assists.

lowa's frontcourt duo of Megan Skouby (7) and Krista VandeVenter (7) scored 15 of lowa's 17 points as the Hawkeyes jumped out to a 17-10 advantage in the first eight minutes and would never look back.

The Hawkeyes built their lead to 10 by half (42-32), but Michigan opened the second period on a 10-3 run to trim lowa's advantage to three (45-42) with 16:46 left. lowa's lead swelled back to nine (53-44) after an 8-2 run with 11:20 remaining. The Wolverines tried to mount one last comeback in the final minutes, but lowa drained three 3-pointers in the final three minutes to secure the victory.

lowa's aggressive play generated 11 more free throw attempts than Michigan. The Hawkeyes made 16-20 (.800) from the foul line, while the Wolverines only made nine trips to the charity stripe - making eight (.889).

lowa only attempted two triples in the first half - missing both, but found its shooting touch in the second stanza, sinking 5-9.

Michigan were led by reserves Ta'Shia Walker and Katie Dierdorf. Walker netted a game-high 24 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Dierdorf added 10 points and four rebounds.

Through 14 games, lowa has not allowed an opponent to shoot 50 percent or better from the field or 40 percent or better from 3-point range. lowa's defense held the Wolverines to 37.9 percent (25-66) from the field and 35.7 percent (5-14) from behind the arc. lowa converted 49.1 percent (28-57) of its field goals, including 45.5 percent (5-11) from 3-point range.

#### Game 15 Iowa 75, #9 Michigan State 64 Jan. 9, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY (AP) - -** Iowa scored 48 second half points en route to a 75-64 triumph over ninth-rated Michigan State inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was the Hawkeyes' first over a top-ten ranked team since defeating ninth-ranked Purdue 90-75 on Jan. 6, 2002 in Iowa City.

Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 27 points, while Crystal Smith added 18 and VandeVenter 17 to lead the Hawkeyes. Skouby and Smith also pulled down eight rebounds each, while VandeVenter grabbed a team-best nine.

Skouby dominated the Spartans' zone defense with turnaround jumpers and hook shots, and finished 12-20 from the field. Her point total was the most by an lowa freshman since Tiffany Gooden scored 36 in the 1994-95 season.

lowa forced 21 turnovers and held Michigan State to 4-16 on 3-point attempts. The Hawkeyes turned the 21 Spartan miscues into 17 points.

Michigan State held a 29-27 halftime lead before Skouby sparked the Hawkeyes with 19 second-half points on 6-6 shooting.

The Hawkeyes had a 10-0 run early in the second half to build a 46-36 lead. The Spartans shaved lowa's advantage to one (61-60) with 3:13, but lowa closed the contest on a 14-3 run.

Liz Shimek led Michigan State with 16 points and 15 rebounds. Lindsay Bowen added 13 points.

Crystal Smith was scoreless through the first 12 minutes before helping Skouby in a second-half scoring barrage. Smith hit a jumper with 7:05 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes their first lead at 20-19. She hit two others during a 10-2 run that padded lowa's lead to 22-19.

lowa's starters combined for 72 of its 75 points. The Hawkeyes outscored the Spartans 15-4 at the foull line. Michigan State attempted an lowa opponent season-low six free throws, just one game after converting 30-34 against nationally-rabked Rutgers.

**IOWA CITY (AP) - -** Jessica Davenport scored a season-high 34 points, grabbed 16 rebounds and had six assists to lead No. 8 Ohio State past Iowa 72-62 inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena, the Buckeyes' sixth win in seven games.

Debbie Merrill added 15 points for Ohio State, which never trailed as the Buckeyes' post players dominated play. Led by Davenport's seventh double-double of the season, Ohio State outrebounded lowa 39-30 and outscored the Hawkeyes 52-30 in the paint.

Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 26 points and Megan Skouby added 11. Smith became the 22nd player to amass 1,000 career points in an Iowa uniform late in the first half.

lowa trailed by as many as 16 points before staging a rally midway through the second half. The Hawkeyes went on a 21-11 run and got within 55-49 on a 3-pointer by Smith with 11:22 left.

The teams traded baskets for the next five minutes before Davenport converted a 3-point play with 6:00 left to push Ohio State's lead to 66-55.

Iowa - which upset No. 9 Michigan State three days earlier - never got closer than 68-59 after that.

Davenport scored the Buckeyes' last nine points. She broke the game open with 11 straight points during a 15-1 run midway through the first half that gave the Buckeyes a 39-21 lead. Iowa was unable to stop Davenport from establishing position inside, and she took advantage with five baskets from inside 10 feet during a 3:33 span.

lowa recorded a season-low 13 turnovers in defeat, including only three by its guards. Abby Emmert came off the bench and directed the Hawkeye offense for most of the second half. The sophomore finished with seven points and three assists.

#### Game Summaries

#### Game 16 Iowa 80, Northwestern 48 Jan. 15, 2006, Welsh-Ryan Arena

**EVANSTON, IL --** lowa built a 21-point first-half lead and cruised to an 80-48 triumph over Northwestern at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The win was lowa's largest conference win since recording a 40-point win over Northwestern on Jan. 25, 2001 in Evanston. The victory was also lowa's 10-straight over the Wildcats, all under Head Coach Lisa Bluder.

Megan Skouby and Crystal Smith were lowa's offensive catalysts today. Skouby netted a game-high 18 points (8-16 FG, 2-2 FT), marking the 11th time this year she has scored double figures. The Big Ten's leading freshman scorer, has tallied double digits four-straight contests and five of lowa's six league games. Smith added 13 points in only 18 minutes of action.

Tiffany Reedy had a solid all-around game, converting 3-4 from 3-point range for nine points and collecting seven rebounds, four assists and three steals.

lowa had a better 3-point shooting percentage (.692, 9-13) than Northwestern did free throw percentage (.615, 8-13). Reedy and Lindsey Nyenhuis drained three triples each, Smith nailed two, while Abby Emmert made one.

Leading 16-7, lowa went on a 12-0 run to expand its advantage to 28-7. lowa converted 10 of its first 13 field goal attempts, while Northwestern made only three of its first 19. The Hawkeyes made only two field goals the last nine minutes of the first stanza. lowa led by 16 at the half (36-20).

Northwestern was led by reserve forward Lauren Roberts and Nadia Bibbs. Roberts tallied a team-high 10 points, while Bibbs recorded a career-high eight robounds.

Eleven of Iowa's 12 players scored, including 33 points from the Hawkeye bench. Also, Iowa's freshmen netted a season-high 43 points.

The Hawkeyes outrebounded the Wildcats by 11 (49-38) and collected 24 assists to Northwestern's 14.

#### Game 19 #12 Minnesota 80, Iowa 68 Jan. 22, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY (AP) --** Down at halftime for the first time in Big Ten play, Minnesota used a second-half scoring surge and another dominant performance from its bench to put away pesky lowa in an 80-68 victory in front of a season-high 7,005 fans at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The 12th-ranked Gophers used a 22-6 run to start the second half and a 30-15 advantage in bench scoring for their third straight win.

Liz Podominick had 13 points and Jamie Broback and Natasha Williams chipped in 12 points each for the Gophers. Minnesota won by double-digits for the third straight game, despite trailing the Hawkeyes 37-32 at halftime.

Game 20 Penn State 72, Iowa 61 Jan. 26, 2006, Bryce Jordan Center

**STATE COLLEGE, PA - -** Amanda Brown and Kam Gissendanner each netted 24 points to propel Penn State to a 71-61 triumph over Iowa at the Bryce Jordan Center. The win was the Lady Lions' fifth-straight over the Hawkeyes.

The loss is lowa's second-straight defeat and also snapped a three-game road winning streak in the Big Ten.

A trio of Hawkeyes scored double figures: Crystal Smith (16), Megan Skouby (12) and Wendy Ausdemore (12). Skouby also led Iowa with five rebounds.

Penn State was able to build a double digit lead, and maintain that advantage, for most of the contest due to strong rebounding and creating high percentage shots through lowa's 2-3 zone. The Lady Lions shot a blistering 56 percent (29-52) from the field. lowa shot 43 percent (23-54) from the field for the contest.

In addition to scoring a game-high 24 points, Brown corralled a game-high 11 boards to record her third double-double of the season and sixth of her career.

lowa had a 12-10 lead at the 13:09 mark of the first half, but then its offense stalled, scoring only one basket the next 7:09. Penn State took advantage of lowa's anemic offense, going on a 12-2 run to claim a 22-14 advantage. Lindsey Nyenhuis drained a 3-pointer from the baseline at the 6:00 mark to halt the scoring drought.

Penn State's lead swelled to 11 by halftime as the Lady Lions concluded the first period on a 12-5 run. Penn State dominated lowa on the boards in the first stanza, out-rebounding the Hawkeyes by 10 (22-12). The Lady Lions out-rebounded lowa by eight (33-25) for the game. The 25 rebounds is a season-low for the Hawkeyes.

lowa's leading rebounder Krista VandeVenter, who entered the game averaging 8.6 rebounds, was only able to pull down a season-low three rebounds. She did contribute eight points.

#### Game Summaries

Game 21 Iowa 77, #8 Purdue 71 (OT) Feb. 2, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY - -** A trio of lowa freshmen combined for 57 points en route to a thrilling 77-71 overtime win over eighth-ranked Purdue at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The 77 points are the most scored by a Purdue opponent this year.

The victory snapped the Hawkeyes' seven-game losing streak to the Boiler-makers. lowa's triumph also halted Purdue's 13-game overall winning streak and nine-game streak in Big Ten play.

The Hawkeyes trailed the entire game, as much as 11 points in the second half, but a Wendy Ausdemore baseline jumper with 17 seconds left concluded a 6-0 lowa run to tie the game at 65 and send the contest to overtime.

lowa scored the first four points of the extra session and never looked back as the Hawkeyes out-scored Purdue 12-6 in overtime.

Hawkeye freshmen Megan Skouby, Kristi Smith and Ausdemore sparked lowa. Ausdemore tallied a game and career-high 23 points. Smith contributed a career-high 15 points, while Skouby added 19 points. Skouby also posted career bests in rebounds (9) and blocks (5).

Crystal Smith, who entered the game as the Big Ten's second-leading scorer, only scored four points. In fact, the Boilermakers held Smith scoreless until the 2:09 left in the second half. Although Smith did not score her usually double figures, she did collected seven assists and six rebounds.

Purdue was led by Aya Traore, Erin Lawless and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton. Traore netted a team-high 19 points, Lawless added 16 points and Wisdom-Hylton chipped in with 13. Lawless fouled out of the contest with 1:05 remianing in regulation. The Boilermakers blocked a season-high 10 shots in defeat.

lowa out-scored Purdue 19-7 at the foul line. The Hawkeyes converted a season-high 90.5 percent (19-21) from the charity stripe.

The win was lowa's second over a top-ten ranked opponent in 2005-06.

**IOWA CITY - -** lowa won its 11th-straight game over Northwestern with a 76-61 triumph at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

lowa's frontcourt of Megan Skouby, Krista VandeVenter and Morgan Kasperek sparked the Hawkeyes. The trio combined for 37 points on 16-26 shooting from the field (61.5%) and 5-6 from the foul line (83.3%) and also grabbed 24 rebounds. VandeVenter posted her third double-double of the season and sixth of her career, collecting 13 points and 13 rebounds. She also dished out four assists. Skouby netted a game-high 16 points, while Kasperek added eight points.

#### Game Summaries

Game 23 #7 Ohio State 88, Iowa 77 Feb. 12, 2006, Value City Arena

**COLUMBUS, OH - -** Ohio State won a battle between the conferences' top two scoring offenses as the seventh-ranked Buckeyes held on for an 88-77 win over Iowa at Value City Arena.

Both teams started the game on fire as Ohio State made its first 11 field goal attempts (100%), while lowa made eight of its first 11 (72.7%) in the first 7:30 of the game. The Buckeyes finished the game shooting a Big Ten-season-best 65.4% (34-52), including 53.8% (7-13) from 3-point range. lowa shot the ball well too, but not good enough as the Hawkeyes made 56.3% (27-48) of their field goals, including 53.3% (8-15) from behind the arc.

lowa trailed 40-25 late in the first half, but closed the period on a 14-2 run to only trail by three (42-39) at the break. The Hawkeyes tied the game at 50-50 at the 15:41 mark, but the Buckeyes answered with an 18-6 run to build a 12-point advantage and never looked back.

Ohio State all-American Jessica Davenport netted a game-high 24 points, while senior transfer Debbie Merrill collected 15 points, nine rebounds and seven assists.

Hawkeye senior Crystal Smith, who struggled in Iowa's previous two games scoring a combined 10 points, erupted for 21 points and dished out four assists. Freshman Megan Skouby returned to her home state and scored 18 points in front of family and friends. Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 16 poits, bolstered by 4-5 shooting from behind the arc, while freshman Kristi Smith dished out a game-high eight assists.

The 77 points are the most points Ohio State has allowed this season, besting Oklahoma's 71 scored on Jan. 9.

The win extended Ohio State's home-conference winning streak to 15, dating back to a 57-54 loss to Purdue on Feb. 8, 2004.
