IOWA SOFTBALL HAWKEYES TAKE 3-2 WIN IN 14th INNING

IOWA CITY – The University of Iowa softball team took a dramatic, 3-2 win in 14 innings over Penn State Friday night at Pearl Field.

With the score tied 2-2 in the bottom of the 14th, the Hawkeyes were able to take advantage of a pair of Penn State errors to break the tie and steal the win. Natalie Johnson led off with a walk, then advanced all the way to third when an attempted throw to first base went wild on Kylie **Murray's** bunt attempt. Murray advanced to second on the play.

Stacy May ended things with a sharp grounder off the glove of the second baseman, allowing Johnson to score the winning run.

Lisa Birocci pitched nine and two-thirds innings of relief to pick up the win, striking out 14 Nittany Lion hitters.

The Hawkeyes got on the board first with some textbook execution. Johnson led off with a double, moved to third on a sacrifice bunt from Murray, then scored on an RBI groundout off the bat of May.

Penn State then tied things up in the third off a Hawkeye error, then took the lead in the fifth on an RBI fielders choice.

Things looked bleak for Iowa, trailing 2-1 in the bottom of the seventh, but freshman Mindy Heidgerken came through with a pinch hit home run over the left field fence, sending the game into extra innings.

Iowa had a chance to end things in the bottom of the 13th when Elisha Huse ripped a single with runners at first and second, but Ali Arnold was thrown out at the plate by centerfielder Leigh Murray.

Iowa (31-17, 9-2) will battle Penn State (19-27, 4-9) in a rematch Saturday at noon.
