### **HEAD COACH TOM BRANDS**



Former Hawkeye wrestler Tom Brands, a 1996 Olympic gold medalist and four-time all-American is in his first season as head coach at lowa. The three-time national champion and member of wrestling's Hall of Fame is only the eighth wrestling coach at the University of lowa.

Brands served as head coach at Virginia Tech University for two seasons (2005-06), recording a 17-20 dual mark. In his first season with the Hokies, Brands led the team to the 2005 regular season Atlantic Coast Conference title, set a school record for dual meet wins (16) and had a school-record five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships. During his tenure, Virginia Tech crowned five conference champions and two all-Americans. Prior to taking the helm at Virginia Tech, Brands was an assistant coach at lowa for 12 seasons (1993-2004). He helped the Hawkeyes to a 177-27 dual record, seven NCAA and eight Big Ten titles, while crowning 23 NCAA Champions, 73 all-Americans and 36 Big Ten Champions. He was named National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

As a competitor, Brands won the 1996 Olympic freestyle gold medal at 136.5 pounds in Atlanta, GA. He also won a gold medal at the 1993 World Freestyle Championships in Toronto, two World Cup gold medals (1994, 1995) and was the 1995 Pan American Games champion. He won four U.S. Nationals titles (1993-96) and made four straight U.S. World or Olympic teams (1993-96). Along with his twin brother, Terry, Tom was named 1993 USA Wrestling Athlete of the Year, the 1993 John Smith Outstanding Freestyle Wrestler and 1993 Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year. He was inducted into wrestling's Hall of Fame in 2001. Brands was a four-time all-American at Iowa (1989-92). During his Hawkeye career, he won three NCAA titles and was named Outstanding Wrestler of the 1992 NCAA Championships. Also a three time Big Ten champion, Brands won 95 percent of his matches at lowa. His career mark of 158-7-2, included an undefeated season in 1991 (45-0).

#### THIS WEEK

Iowa (0-0) will open the 2006-07 dual meet season Tuesday at Northern Iowa. The meet will begin at 7 p.m. in the new McLeod Center in Cedar Falls. Iowa will host Arizona State in it's first home dual of the season Saturday. Match time is set for 1:30 p.m. in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

#### ON THE AIR

Radio - Steven Grace and four-time Hawkeye all-American Mark Ironside will call this season's action live on AM-800, KXIC. All dual meets, not including the NWCA National Duals, will be broadcast live, as will action from the Big Ten and NCAA tournaments. Audio broadcasts from all of the season's competition will also be available online. #### **NORTHERN IOWA PANTHERS**

Northern Iowa will open its 2006-07 dual season against the Hawkeyes. Head Coach Brad Penrith has a 56-43-2 record in six seasons at Northern Iowa. Penrith was an NCAA champion and three-time NCAA finalist, all-American and Big Ten champion at Iowa from 1986-88.

The Panthers are led by seniors Nick Baima (165) and Tyler Rhodes (Hwt.), junior C.J. Ettelson (141), sophomore Andrew Anderson (197) and redshirt freshman Kyle Anson (125). Baima won a title at the Kaufman-Brand Open, while Anson placed first at the Harold Nichols Open.

lowa leads the series with Northern Iowa, 38-8-2, winning the last 30 meetings. The Hawkeyes hold an 18-5-1 advantage in Cedar Falls. Iowa's last win in the series was 25-11 on December 8, 2005. Northern Iowa's last win was 17-15 at Cedar Falls in 1974.

#### **ARIZONA STATE SUN DEVILS**

Arizona State is 2-0, with wins over Portland State (38-12) and Embry-Riddle (31-9). Head Coach Thom Ortiz is 59-32-1 in six seasons with the Sun Devils. Arizona State is led by returning NCAA runner-up Brian Stith (157) and NCAA qualifier Patrick Pitsch (165).

The Hawkeyes lead the series, 21-1-1, winning the last 15 meetings. Iowa is 9-0 in matches against the Sun Devils in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes' last win in the series was 26-13 on November 26, 2005. Arizona State's last win in the series was 22-18 at Tempe in 1988.

#### PERRY COMPETES AT NWCA ALL-STAR DUAL

Hawkeye junior 165-pounder **Mark Perry** lost a 3-1 decision to top-ranked Johny Hendricks of Oklahoma State Monday night at the NWCAAll-Star Dual in Dallas, TX. Perry, who is ranked second in the country, was the only wrestler representing the Hawkeyes at the annual meet.

Hendricks scored a reversal midway through the second period to take a 2-0 lead. Perry recorded an escape with 30 seconds left in the match to make the score 2-1, but Hendricks added an extra point with riding time to win the match, 3-1. Perry is 0-4 in his career against Hendricks.

#### **LAST WEEK**

Three Hawkeyes won individual titles and 12 placed at the Kaufman-Brand Open in Omaha, NE. The annual tournament featured approximately 650 wrestlers from 42 teams, making it the nation's largest single-day collegiate meet.

Redshirt freshman **Brent Metcalf** won the 149-pound elite division title, while freshman **Billy Murphy** (133) and sophomore **Dan Erekson** (197) won titles in the amateur division. Metcalf pinned his first two opponents and scored three decisions en route to the title, defeating former Hawkeye Todd Meneely of Nebraska-Omaha, 7-3, in the finals. Murphy went 6-0 on the day, scoring a 6-4 win over Hawkeye sophomore **Daniel Dennis** in the finals. Erekson went 4-0 on the day, defeating Nebraska-Kearney's Kelsey Empting, 3-0, in the finals.

lowa also had four runners-up in the tournament in redshirt freshman **Phillip Keddy** (184), junior **Matt Fields** (Hwt.), Dennis (133) and redshirt freshmen **Rick Loera** (184). In the elite division finals, Keddy lost a 5-3 decision in the first sudden victory period to Duke Burk of Northern Illinois, while Fields lost a 3-2 decision to Tervel Dlagnev of Nebraska-Kearney. Loera lost a 9-1 major decision to Oklahoma State's Cody Hill in the amateur division finals.

lowa's other placewinners were seniors **Mario Galanakis** (133-3rd) and **Eric Luedke** (174-3rd), junior **Alex Tsirtsis** (141-3rd), and redshirt freshmen **Joe Slaton** (133-4th), **Dan LeClere** (141-5th) and **Ryan Morningstar** (157-4th) in the elite division, and freshman **Aaron Janssen** (165-5th) in the amateur division.

#### **HAWKEYES SIGN TWO**

lowa signed two student-athletes to national letters of intent in the early signing period. **Jordan Johnson** of Bettendorf, IA and **Brodie Ambrose** of Eldridge, IA, are Tom Brands' first signings as lowa's head coach.

Johnson won the 2006 Class AA Illinois state heavyweight state title at Naperville North High School. He moved to Bettendorf, IA, and will be competing for Bettendorf High School this season.

Ambrose placed third at 171 pounds at the 2006 Class 3A state tournament for North Scott Eldridge High School. He will compete at 189 pounds this season and is a projected 197-pounder for the Hawkeyes. Ambrose also is a 189-pound Fargo freestyle all-American.

#### **IOWA WRESTLING HISTORY**

lowa's overall dual meet record is 795-209-30 (.783) in 94 seasons. The Hawkeyes have won 20 national titles, including nine of the last 16, and 31 Big Ten titles. Iowa's 47 NCAA Champions have won a total of 73 NCAA individual titles, crowning six three-time and 13 two-time champions. The Hawkeyes' 99 Big Ten Champions have won a total of 180 conference titles. There have been seven four-time, 18 three-time and 24 two-time lowa winners. Iowa's 129 all-Americans have earned all-America status 263 times, including 16 four-time, 27 three-time and 32 two-time honorees.

#### IOWA TICKET INFORMATION

Season tickets and single meet tickets for lowa's eight home duals are on sale at the University of Iowa Athletic Ticket Office at 1-800-424-2957, 319-335-9327 or www.hawkeyesports.com. University of Iowa students will be admitted free of charge for all matches with a student ID. Season tickets are \$56 for the general public and \$49 for University faculty and staff. Single match tickets purchased in advance are \$8 for adults and \$4 for youth/non-University of Iowa students. Single match tickets purchased at the door are \$10 for adults and \$5 for youth/non-University of Iowa students

#### CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA

Carver-Hawkeye Arena has been the home of lowa wrestling since 1983. The Hawkeyes are 150-15 (.909) in the arena, which includes a record 10 victories during the 1986 season. Iowa has recorded 16 undefeated seasons in the arena, with the most recent (8-0) occurring in 2002-03. The dual wrestling attendance record for Carver-Hawkeye Arena is 15,291, set when Iowa defeated Iowa State on February 22, 1992. The arena seats 15,500 for a dual wrestling meet.

#### **CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE**

The Hawkeye wrestling staff of **Tom Brands**, **Dan Gable**, **Wes Hand**, **Doug Schwab** and **Mike Zadick** earned a total of two Olympic gold medals, seven NCAA titles, 10 conference titles and 15 all-America honors. Their combined college career wrestling record is 605-84-2 (.877), including three undefeated seasons.

#### **OH BROTHER**

Seniors Ben and Brett Stedman from Sioux City, IA, are the lone set of brothers on the 2006-07 Hawkeye roster. There have been 10 sets of brothers to wrestle together in the Hawkeye varsity lineup since the 1950s. They are **Don** and **Tom Huff** (1961), **Mark** and **Scott Trizzino** (1981), **Lenny**, **Larry** and **Jim Zalesky** (1981-82), **Ed** and **Lou Banach** (1981-83), **Marty** and **Lindley Kistler** (1984-85), **Jim** and **John Heffernan** (1987), **Tom** and **Terry Brands** (1989-92), **Troy** and **Terry Steiner** (1991-93), **Ryan** and **Randy Fulsaas** (2001) and **Luke** and **Ty Eustice** (2003-04).

The Stedman's are also the fifth set of twins to wrestle at lowa. **Ed** and **Lou Banach**, **Tom** and **Terry Brands**, **Troy** and **Terry Steiner** and **Randy** and **Ryan Fulsaas** are the other four.
