Opening Tip

After concluding a stretch of four out of five games on the road, the Illini return to Champaign for back-to-back games at the Assembly Hall beginning with Sunday's match-up with Iowa.

Illinois is trying to snap a six-game skid, its first under Coach Bruce Weber and longest since dropping seven straight from Jan. 3-23, 1999.

Illini Look to Extend Record Success against Hawkeyes

Illinois has won six consecutive games vs. Iowa, its longest winning streak ever against the Hawkeyes. The Illini previously won five in a row over Iowa from Jan. 5, 1963-Feb. 23, 1965.

The all-time series stood at 64-62 in favor of the Illini through the 1999 season. Illinois has since won 16 of 20 games, including 12 of 14 under Weber, to now hold a 80-66 advantage in the series.

Richardson Scores 1000; Paul Nears Milestone

Junior D.J. Richardson is the newest member of the Fighting Illini 1,000-point club. Richardson reached that milestone when he made a free throw with 1:12 left in Tuesday night's game at Ohio State, becoming the 45th player in Illini history to score 1,000 career points.

Fellow junior Brandon Paul will soon join Richardson in the exclusive club. Paul enters the Iowa game just two points shy of the 1,000 mark with 998 for his career.

Last Time Out

The offensive firepower of No. 8 Ohio State was on display early and often as the Illini fell to the Buckeyes by the score of 83-67 Tuesday night in Columbus. The Buckeyes jumped out to a 28-8 lead nearly 10 minutes into the game, making 11 of its first 12 shots. Illinois regrouped and outscored the hosts 18-14 the rest of the half to trail 42-26 at intermission, but the Illini could get no closer in the second half.

Meyers Leonard led the Illini with 21 points - just one shy of his career high. Leonard shot 7-of-12 from the field and made 7-of-9 at the line. D.J. Richardson also scored in double figures with 12 points and grabbed a game-high six boards.

Recent Defense Not the Norm for Illini

Illinois' lapse on defensive lately is a sharp contrast to the numbers the Orange and Blue have allowed in previous years as well as earlier this season.

In conference play, the Illini led the Big Ten in field goal percentage defense each of the last three years, topped the chart in 3-point field goal percentage defense two of the last three years, and ranked in the top three in scoring defense two of the last three years.

Taking a broader look at Weber's previous eight seasons in Champaign, the Illini led the conference in scoring defense four times, ranked in the top three in field goal percentage defense six times, and in the top three in 3-point field goal percentage defense five times.

Through the first nine games of Big Ten play this year, the Illini defense allowed 63.3 points (570) on 41.9 percent shooting from the field (203-485) and 35.2 percent shooting from 3-point range (50-142). But over the last six games, Illini opponents have averaged 76.3 points (458) on 54.2 percent shooting (162-299) and 47.4 percent shooting from behind the arc (46-97).

Paul Near Top of Big Ten Scoring List

Brandon Paul is one of the Big Ten's leading scorers during conference play, averaging 17.6 points to rank fourth on the league list. Paul has scored in double figures in all but two Big Ten games, with six outings of 20 or more points.

The last Illini player to lead the conference in scoring was Brian Cook during his senior season in 2003. Cook averaged exactly 20.0 points during league play, which also is the last time an Illini player averaged at least 20 points.

Leonard's Block Party

Meyers Leonard leads the Big Ten in blocked shots on the season. His average of 2.0 blocks per game currently ranks second on the Illini single-season list behind the record of 3.0 bpg set by Derek Holcomb in 1979. Leonard's 55 blocks, meanwhile, ranks fourth on the UI single-season chart. The Illini record is 86 rejections set by Holcomb in 1979.

Taking Down Another Top-10 Foe

Illinois defeated No. 9 Michigan State on Jan. 31, earning its second Top-10 win of the season. The Illini previously knocked off No. 5 Ohio State on Jan. 10. Illinois sits in rare company with at least two wins over Top-10 ranked opponents, one of 11 programs to accomplish the feat this season:

Illinois recently had eight straight games decided by five points or less (Jan. 4-Feb. 5). That was the UI's longest streak of the modern era and its longest in 83 years, since the Illini also had eight straight games decided by five or less during Big Ten play in 1929. It also was the nation's longest streak this season.

Overall, the Illini are 11-7 in games decided by single digits and 7-6 in games decided by five or less. That is an improvement from last year when Illinois could not get over the hump in a number of close contests, winning only two games by five or less while dropping eight games where the UI led, was tied, or trailed by one point in the final minute.

Illinois' seven victories by five points or less are the most in a season under Weber, and the most since the 1998-99 Illini won eight in that fashion. Following is a year-by-year look at the Illini in games decided by five points or less under Weber:

Looking Back at Last Year's Iowa Games:

• Illinois 87, Iowa 77 // Dec. 29 // Iowa City

The Illini opened Big Ten play with a 10-point win at Iowa. Illini started hot from the field, making nine of its first 10 shots, including its first seven 3-point attempts, in jumping out to a 23-15 lead. Illinois led by 12 at halftime and opened the second half on a 9-0 run to open its largest lead of the game at 58-39. The Hawkeyes answered with a 10-0 run of their own to cut the lead to nine. Iowa got as close as six points at 65-59 with less than eight minutes left, but Demetri McCamey scored back-to-back buckets on a long two followed by his fourth trey of the game to push the lead back to a comfortable 11 points from which the Illini did not look back.

Illinois' shooting was the story of the game with the Illini making 66.7 percent on the night and a school-record 72.2 percent from 3-point range. Five players scored in double figures, led by McCamey's 20 points. D.J. Richardson scored a season-high 17 and knocked down 5-of-7 treys.

Illinois' score of 87 was its highest point total ever at Carver-Hawkeye and most in a Big Ten road game since scoring 95 at Penn State on Jan. 31, 2001.

• Illinois 81, Iowa 68 // Feb. 26 // Champaign

Illinois shot 55.4 percent, including 62.5 percent during the second half, en route to a 13-point victory over Iowa. Illinois started strong, scoring the game's first 10 points. Iowa fought back to tie it at 13 before the Illini went on a 16-2 run to open up a 29-15 lead. Iowa made one more push to cut the UI lead to five at halftime. Illinois led by eight early in the second half and then went on a 10-1 run to take its largest lead of the game at 60-43 with 11 minutes remaining. The lead remained in double figures the rest of the way as the Illini won its ninth straight over the Hawkeyes at the Assembly Hall.

Mike Tisdale scored a season-high 25 points on 10-of-14 shooting, while Mike Davis just missed a double-double, registering 20 points and nine rebounds. Demetri McCamey added 18 points on 7-of-11 shooting.

Nebraska Splits Season Series With Home Victory over Illini

Illinois' first visit to Lincoln, Neb. in 37 years was not a memorable one as Nebraska downed the Illini 80-57 on Saturday afternoon. Illinois looked strong early, jumping out to a quick 16-7 lead and maintaining a 24-16 advantage with eight minutes left in the first half. The Huskers then went on a tear, reeling off 14 unanswered points that swelled into a 36-4 run and gave the Huskers a 52-28 lead from which they did not look back.

The Illini had trouble once again from 3-point range, making just 6-of-23. The Huskers, meanwhile, made 10-of-20 treys and shot nearly 56 percent overall. D.J. Richardson led the Illini with 15 points while Tracy Abrams scored in double figures for the second straight game, totaling 11.

Illini Fall at Home to Purdue

Illinois fell to Purdue 67-62 last Wednesday in Champaign. The Illini trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half before cutting the deficit to three early after intermission. The Boilers then pushed their lead up to nine with 12 minutes remaining, but Illinois went on a 10-3 run to make it a two-point game at 51-49 with 9:19 left. The Illini closed to within two points on four more occasions with chances to tie or take the lead, but just could not convert offensively. Robbie Hummel, meanwhile, scored Purdue's last seven points in the final four minutes to seal the win for the Boilers.

The Illini were hurt by cold perimeter shooting, going just 3-for-21 from behind the arc. Tracy Abrams led the Illini with a career-high 22 points, while Brandon Paul scored 19 and Joseph Bertrand added 12.

Wolverines Outlast Illini in Ann Arbor

Illinois dropped a 70-61 decision at No. 22 Michigan on Feb. 12. The Illini scored seven of the game's first nine points but the Wolverines answered with a quick 10-1 run of its own to take the lead. With Meyers Leonard sidelined with two fouls for the majority of the first half, the Illini hung around thanks to the production of reserve Tyler Griffey, but Michigan's 56.5 shooting in the opening 20 minutes gave the hosts a six-point lead at the break. The Wolverines extended their lead to as many as 14 before the Illini cut it in half with a 7-0 run to pull within 58-51 with five minutes remaining. But the Illini could get no closer than seven the rest of the way as Michigan made 7-of-8 from the line to seal it.

Brandon Paul led the Illini with a game-high 21 points, his sixth 20-point performance in conference play. Griffey had his best game as an Illini, scoring a career-high 18 points and grabbing five boards in 29 minutes of action. D.J. Richardson also scored in double figures with 12.

Hoosiers Offense Too Much for Illini

The Illini battled Indiana on the Hoosiers' homecourt on Feb. 9 before eventually dropping an 84-71 decision. In a game that had 14 ties and six lead changes, Illinois was unable to overcome foul trouble and the Hoosiers' offensive production, both from the field and at the line.

Illinois committed 30 fouls and had three players foul out. That led to Indiana racking up 35 points on 42 attempts at the stripe. The 35 made free throws marked the most by an Illini opponent in a decade, since Purdue racked up 35 freebies on Jan. 9, 2002. And while Illinois topped 50 percent shooting for the second game in a row (52 percent), Indiana shot 50 percent en route to its 84 points, the most allowed by the Illini defense this season.

Illinois started strong behind Meyers Leonard's 15-first half points and trailed by just two at halftime. After the Hoosiers opened up an eight-point lead, the Illini cut it to three and nearly tied it on a D.J. Richardson 3-point attempt with 12:29 remaining. The bucket was waved off as Leonard was whistled for his fourth foul on a moving screen and went to the bench. The Hoosiers quickly extended the lead back to eight and the Illini could get no closer than six before the Hoosiers pulled away during the closing minutes.

Richardson led the Illini with 19 points and made a season-high five 3-pointers. Leonard finished with 17 points and Brandon Paul added 13 with five assists.

Illini Drop Rare Home Game To Northwestern

Illinois had one of its best offensive performances of the season on Feb. 5. Unfortunately, Northwestern's offense was even better as NU defeated the Illini 74-70 at the Assembly Hall to earn its first victory in Campaign since 1999. The Illini shot 54.2 percent from the field and tied a season-high with 11 three-pointers. But the Wildcats countered with 60.4 percent accuracy, the best by a UI opponent on the season, including 14-of-21 shooting in the second half (66.7 percent).

Brandon Paul led the Illini with 22 points and hit six 3-pointers while Meyers Leonard scored 21 – one shy of his career high – and grabbed a game-high nine boards.

Illini Defeat Ninth-Ranked Spartans in Defensive Tussle

Illinois was tough enough to defeat ninth-ranked Michigan State on Jan. 31, claiming a 42-41 victory in a physical game reminiscent of an early '80s Big Ten defensive battle.

Michigan State entered the contest averaging nearly 74 points in league play and leading the conference in both field goal percentage and 3-point percentage. But the Illini defense held MSU to season lows in all three categories. The Spartans managed just 24.1 percent from the field (14-58) – its worst shooting performance of the Tom Izzo era – and 21.4 percent from behind the arc (3-14) en route to its 41 points. MSU dominated the glass, grabbing 23 offensive rebounds and outrebounding Illinois 49-to-32. The Illini, however, matched the Spartans with 13 second-chance points.

The game was played within a one-possession margin the entire first half. The Illini jumped out to a six-point lead early in the second half and held a 35-29 advantage with 7:45 remaining. Michigan State then went on a 9-0 run to take a 38-35 lead with four minutes left. The Spartans still led by three when Tracy Abrams made the biggest shot of his young career, nailing a 3-pointer from the top of the key to tie it at 40 with 2:11 to go. Brandon Paul then hit two free throws with 45 seconds remaining for the eventual game winning points as the Illini defense stood strong in the closing seconds.

Paul was the only Illini to score in double figures, recording a game-high 18 points. Paul had a great all-around game, adding nine boards, five assists, two blocks and two steals.

Illinois' 42 points was its fewest in a win since defeating Notre Dame, 40-38, on Dec. 8, 1947, and fewest in a conference win since beating Wisconsin, 38-31, on Jan. 1, 1946.

The Illini improved to 5-5 in home games against Top-10 opponents under Coach Bruce Weber. Three of those wins have now been against Michigan State. The Illini previously defeated the No. 7-ranked Spartans at the Assembly Hall in 2006 and beat No. 5-ranked MSU at The Hall in 2010.

Illini Drop OT Heartbreaker at Minnesota

Illinois dropped a heartbreaker in Minneapolis on Jan. 28, falling to the Gophers in overtime by the score of 77-72. After trailing by nine points with 11 minutes remaining, the Illini went on a 15-2 run over the next

four minutes to take the lead at 50-46. The Gophers fought back to tie the game with 1:06 left but D.J. Richardson scored on a breakaway to put the Illini up two. After a Minnesota turnover, Joseph Bertrand then made a driving layup to make it a 62-58 game with 32 seconds remaining. After a Gopher 3-pointer, Brandon Paul made a pair of free throws to put the Illini ahead 64-61 with 12 seconds left and seemingly put the game in hand. But on the ensuing possession, Minnesota's Austin Hollins drove to the basket and scored with four seconds left and Meyers Leonard was called for a foul, his fifth. Hollins then made the free throw, forcing overtime. The Gophers had momentum on their side in the extra session, jumping out to an eight-point lead. The Illini got within three near the end, but the Gophers hit two free throws with seven seconds left to close out the game.

Brandon Paul led the way for the Illini with 28 points and Meyers Leonard tallied his second straight double-double and seventh of the season with 17 points and 13 rebounds.

Wisconsin Ends Illini Homecourt Win Streak

Wisconsin came out on top of a back and forth battle, defeating the Illini 67-63 on Jan. 22 to snap the UI's 14-game home winning streak. It was a game that featured 11 lead changes and eight ties and was played within a 12-point margin the entire way. The Illini went on an 11-3 run late in the first half to take a 22-21 lead and the teams entered the locker room tied at 26. The Illini led by four midway through the second half when the Badgers went on a key 7-0 run to move ahead 53-50 with seven minutes remaining. The Illini later trailed by one when UW's Jared Berggren scored on an offensive rebound basket to put the visitors ahead 60-57 with 2:14 left. The Illini could get no closer as Jordan Taylor scored seven points in the final 32 seconds to close out the road win for the Badgers.

Meyers Leonard led the Illini, collecting his sixth double-double of the season with 16 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. Joseph Bertrand added 15 points, five rebounds and a career-high five assists. D.J. Richardson (13) and Brandon Paul (10) also scored in double figures.

Illini Fall in Familiar Fashion at Penn State

It was deja vu all over again for Illinois in Happy Valley, falling to Penn State 54-52 on Jan. 19. It marked the Illini's fourth loss in the last five years at University Park — all of which have gone down to the final possession and been decided by one or two points.

The Illini jumped out to a 17-9 lead but then went more than five-and-a-half minutes without a field goal as the Lions went on an 11-2 run to move ahead. PSU led by two at intermission and began the second half on a 10-3 spree to open up its largest lead of the night at 35-26 with 14 minutes remaining. The Illini then began to slowly chip away, drawing to within one point on three separate occasions before finally pulling even at 52-all on a 3-pointer by Brandon Paul with 40 seconds remaining. Tim Frazier scored on the Lions'

ensuing possession, hitting a pull-up jumper with eight seconds left to put the hosts up two. The Illini's bid to force overtime was denied when a PSU defender blocked Sam Maniscalco's layup at the buzzer.

Paul led the Illini with a game-high 20 points and Meyers Leonard added 15. While those two accounted for 35 points on 11-of-23 shooting, the rest of the Illini managed just 17 points on 6-of-26 from the field.

Paul Earns Pair of Honors

Brandon Paul was an obvious choice for individual accolades following his historic performance in the win over No. 5 Ohio State. Paul was named Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association and Big Ten Player of the Week by the conference office on Jan. 16. See box on Page 10 for more details.

Paul's Scoring Spree Leads Illini Past Fifth-Ranked Ohio State

Illinois overcame its largest deficit of the season – 11 points – to defeat No. 5 Ohio State at the Assembly Hall on Jan. 10, earning its first victory over a top-five opponent since beating No. 5 Michigan State on Feb. 6, 2010.

The Illini trailed 48-37 early in the second half before going on a 9-0 run with baskets by four different players to cut the deficit to two. After the Buckeyes pushed the lead back to seven, Illinois then went on a 10-0 run to take a 57-54 lead with 10:49 remaining. Brandon Paul scored eight of 10 points during the UI surge. Ohio State would not go away, regaining a two-point lead with three minutes left. That's when Paul took over, scoring the final 15 points for the Illini on a pair of 3-pointers and nine free throws. After hitting two free throws to tie the game, Paul's first three during his run gave the Illini a 69-66 lead with 2:02 to go. Following two more free throws, his second trey – and school-record tying eighth of the game – came with the shot clock expiring and OSU defender Aaron Craft blanketing him, putting the Illini ahead 74-70 with just 43 seconds left. He then hit five-of-six from the line in the final 22 seconds to close out the win.

Paul scored a career-high 43 points on the night, the third-highest single-game total in school history and the most by a Big Ten player in a league game in 18 years. Paul did more than just score, however, adding a game-high eight rebounds and career-high four blocked shots to his totals. Joining Paul in double figures were Meyers Leonard (14 points) and D.J. Richardson and Joseph Bertrand (10 each).

Illini Come Up Big in Crunch Time in Win Over Nebraska

The game went down to the wire for the third straight time at Assembly Hall, and once again the Illini prevailed, posting a 59-54 victory over Nebraska on Jan. 7. Following a sloppy first half that saw the teams combine for 20 turnovers and a 25-22 score in favor of the Huskers, the offense heated up in the second half and the Illini did a better job taking care of the basketball. Illinois had just two turnovers after intermission and shot nearly 58 percent from the field. Nebraska, meanwhile, shot almost 53 percent in the second half but had eight more miscues to a record 20 turnovers.

The Illini trailed 48-45 with five minutes left but scored five straight points on a 3-point play by Joseph Bertrand and a jumper by Brandon Paul to take the lead. Nebraska would later tie the game on two occasions, but Bertrand put the Illini ahead for good, hitting another bucket with :54 seconds remaining to break a 54-all tie. The Illini added a trio of free throws in the final seconds to close it out.

Bertrand was unstoppable on the day, scoring a career-high 25 points. He made his first eight shots and finished 11-of-12 from the field. Paul also registered double figures with 11 while freshman Tracy Abrams added a career-high eight points.

Bertrand Does it Again

Joseph Bertrand made 13 consecutive shots from Dec. 22-27, hitting all nine of his attempts against Missouri and his first four attempts against Minnesota before finally missing. He then had a streak of 12 consecutive made shots from Jan. 4-7, connecting on all four of his second-half attempts at Northwestern and his first eight attempts vs. Nebraska before missing.

Bertrand's streaks were the Illini's best over the last 29 years, but did not set a school record. The Illinois mark still belongs to Derek Harper, who made 19 consecutive shots over a three-game stretch in 1983. Harper made his last seven shots vs. Michigan (Feb. 17), all 11 of his attempts vs. Michigan State (Feb. 19) and his first attempt vs. Purdue (Feb. 23).

Henry Free Throw & Leonard Block Key Illini Win at Northwestern

The Illini came out on top in another wild game in Evanston, defeating Northwestern 57-56 on Jan. 4. It marked the third game in the last four years decided by one point between the Illini and Wildcats at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Illini were victorious thanks to a pair of big plays by underclassmen. Myke Henry grabbed an offensive rebound and was fouled on a follow-up attempt with six seconds left. Henry made the first free throw to give the UI the lead. After missing the second, NU's Drew Crawford raced up court and shot the potential game-winner, which was swatted away by Meyers Leonard at the buzzer.

The victory completed an impressive comeback by the Illini, who trailed by 10 points with less than two minutes remaining in the first half. Illinois then went on a 16-2 run over the next five minutes to take a 42-38 lead. The Illini enjoyed its largest lead of the night at 55-47 with 1:43 remaining when the Wildcats made a late charge, outscoring the visitors 9-1 to tie the game at 56-all and set up the final plays by Henry and Leonard.

Illinois had three players score in double figures, led by Leonard's 12 points. Joseph Bertrand and Brandon Paul added 10 apiece, while Bertrand and Leonard each grabbed a game-high eight rebounds. The Illini also got a huge contribution from freshman Nnanna Ekwu, who scored nine points -- all in the first half.

A LOOK BACK AT BRANDON PAUL'S 43-POINT PERFORMANCE vs. OHIO STATE

Brandon Paul was named Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association and Big Ten Player of the Week by the conference office on Jan. 16 following his historic 43-point outing in Illinois' 79-74 win over No. 5 Ohio State on Jan. 10. Here are 10 notes about Paul's performance against the Buckeyes:

1. Paul scored a career-high 43 points, the third-most in a game in school history and the most since Andy Kaufmann scored 46 vs. Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 1990.
2. Paul's 43 points equaled the second-highest single-game total in the NCAA this season behind only Creighton's Doug McDermott, who scored 44 points vs. Bradley on Jan. 7.
3. Paul's 43 points were the most by a Big Ten player in a game since Glenn Robinson scored 44 vs. Kansas in the 1994 Sweet 16. They were the most in a Big Ten conference game since Robinson scored 49 vs. Illinois on March 13, 1994.
4. Paul made 8-of-10 from three-point range to match the Illinois record for most threes in a game. He shares the record with Dee Brown, Trent Meacham and Kevin Turner.
5. Paul was incredibly efficient in the game, hitting 11-of-15 (.733) field goals, 8-of-10 (.800) three-pointers and 13-of-15 (.867) from the line. With 43 points on just 15 field goal attempts, Paul is the first NCAA player in the past 16 seasons with 43+ points on 15 or fewer FGA.
6. Paul scored Illinois' final 15 points of the game over the last 2:40, outscoring OSU 15-8 down the stretch.
7. Paul also had a team-high eight rebounds and a career-high four blocks, including a key one late on Jared Sullinger with 30 seconds remaining. Over the past 10 seasons, the only other players with 40 points, eight rebounds and four blocks in a game are Al Thornton (2006-07) and Chris Kaman (2002-03).
8. The 43 points by Paul are the fourth-most ever scored against Ohio State and are the most against the Buckeyes since Central Michigan's Tommie Johnson had 45 on Jan. 2, 1987.
9. Paul's 43 points were more than the team total of five opponents Ohio State has defeated this season.
10. Paul scored 28 points in the second half, more than any UI player has scored in a full game this season.

Purdue Takes Down Illini in West Lafayette

Illinois dropped its Big Ten road opener at Purdue on New Years Eve. The Illini led by eight points early on and only trailed 26-24 at halftime. But Purdue broke the game open in the second half. Leading 34-29 just over three minutes in, the Boilers went on a staggering 18-0 run, with 12 of the points during that stretch coming off Illini turnovers.

Guards Brandon Paul and D.J. Richardson carried the scoring load for the Orange and Blue, combining for 32 points as Paul registered a game-high 17 while Richardson added 15.

Illini Top Minnesota in 2OT in Big Ten Opener

It took 10 extra minutes but Illinois came out on top, defeating Minnesota 81-72 in double-overtime on Dec. 27. The Illini led by as many as 13 points early in the second half, but the Gophers went on a 19-6 run to pull even at 54 with six minutes remaining. Minnesota had a chance to win in regulation, owning a 64-62 lead and Julian Welch at the line with 15 seconds left. But Welch missed the front end of the 1-and-1, and the Illini forced overtime after Meyers Leonard was fouled and hit a pair of huge free throws with seven seconds remaining on the clock.

The first overtime played to a draw, but the Illini rolled in the second extra session, outscoring the Gophers 11-to-2. Brandon Paul and Leonard accounted for 10 of the UI's 11, Paul scoring six and Leonard adding four.

Five Illini players scored in double figures, led by Paul, who scored 21 points. Leonard registered his third straight double-double with 20 points and game-high 11 rebounds. D.J. Richardson and Joseph Bertrand added 13 points apiece, while Sam Maniscalco chipped in 10.

Leonard Earns Second Big Ten Player of the Week Award

Meyers Leonard earned Big Ten Player of the Week accolades on Dec. 26, receiving the honor after averaging 16.5 points, 14.5 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.5 blocks while shooting 62.5 percent from the field in a pair of games. Leonard recorded back-to-back double-doubles, tallying game highs of 19 points and a career-high 16 rebounds against Cornell followed by 14 points and a game-high 13 rebounds versus Missouri. Leonard received his second conference weekly award of the season, the first coming on Dec. 5.

Braggin' Rights Stay With Missouri

Illinois was unable to regain Braggin' Rights, falling to No. 9/8 Missouri 78-74 in a hard fought rivalry game in St. Louis on Dec. 22. The Illini roared back from a 14-point second-half deficit to grab a trio of 1-point leads, then a two-point advantage at 70-68 with 2:02 remaining. Mizzou, however, reeled off seven unanswered points while the UI committed back-to-back turnovers to move ahead 75-70 with 56 seconds remaining. The Illini twice pulled within three but could get no closer.

There were plenty of bright spots for the Illini despite the loss, none bigger than Joseph Bertrand's play off the bench. Bertrand erupted for a game-high 19 points in 28 minutes without missing a shot, hitting 9-of-9 from the field and adding one free throw. Bertrand scored all but two of his points in the second half, led by an incredible sequence where he accounted for 13 of the UI's 17 points over a six-minute stretch where the Illini cut the deficit from 12 points (55-43) to one (61-60).

Bertrand's 9-for-9 performance was the best by an Illini since Roger Powell made 10-of-10 shots at Penn State on Feb. 16, 2005. Bertrand was one of four Illini to score in double figures against Mizzou. Brandon Paul also had 19 points, Meyers Leonard tallied 14 and grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds for his fourth double-double of the season, and D.J. Richardson added 13.

Hot Start

Illinois' 10 straight wins to open the season marked its best start since 2005-06 when the UI went undefeated in non-conference play (14-0) and won its first 15 games. The 10-game winning streak was the fourth longest of the Weber era, and the longest since the 15 straight victories to open the 2005-06 season.

Leonard Big Ten Co-Player of the Week

Meyers Leonard was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 5, earning the first conference weekly award of his career and becoming the first Illini to win the award since Demetri McCamey last season (Jan. 3).

Leonard received the honor after averaging 16.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks while shooting 75 percent from the floor in a pair of wins over Maryland and Gonzaga. Leonard recorded 12 points on 6-of-9 shooting with six boards and a game-high three blocks in the Illini's road win at Maryland in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, then tallied a game-high 21 points on 9-of-11 shooting with six boards in the victory against No. 19/18 Gonzaga.

Leonard shared the award with Michigan State's Keith Appling.

Illini Defeat Gonzaga, Record Top-20 Win

The Illini beat No. 19 Gonzaga on Dec. 3 by the score of 82-75, defeating the highest ranked non-conference foe at home since topping No. 1 Wake Forest on Dec. 1, 2004. Illinois led nearly the entire way, trailing just twice early (2-0, 6-4). Each time Gonzaga made a run, the Illini answered. After the Bulldogs evened the contest early in the second half, the Orange and Blue reeled off seven straight points to open up 45-38 advantage with 15:54 remaining. Gonzaga later got to within two at 58-56, but the Illini outscored the Zags 11-4 over the next four minutes to make it a 69-60 game with 4:55 left. Illinois maintained at least a two-possession lead the rest of the way.

Meyers Leonard led the Illini with a game-high 21 points on 9-of-11 shooting and six rebounds. D.J. Rich-

ardson nailed four three-pointers on his way to 19 points. Brandon Paul added 13 points and Sam Maniscalco had 10 to go along with season highs of six assists and four steals, the most by an Illini this season.

Illini Take Down Terps; Win Third Straight Big Ten/ACC Challenge Contest

Illinois won its third straight game in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, defeating Maryland, 71-62, on Nov. 29. Illinois trailed by as many as nine points and faced its first halftime deficit of the year. But the Illini outscored the Terps 40-27 in the second half to secure the victory. The second half surge was fueled by a 10-0 run that turned a 41-37 Maryland lead into a 47-41 Illini advantage with 12:35 remaining, and the Orange and Blue led the rest of the way.

Sam Maniscalco scored 24 points, setting his career high at Illinois, and made 5-of-8 from 3-point land. Brandon Paul had 17 points, 13 of which came in the first half. Meyers Leonard was in double figures again with 12 points on 6-of-9 shooting and added six rebounds and three blocks. The Illini shot 90 percent from the free throw line (18-20), including perfect 6-of-6 in the final minute to secure the win.

Weber Wins 200

Bruce Weber recorded his 200th win at Illinois during the victory at Maryland. In only his ninth season in Champaign, Weber already ranks third on the school's all-time coaching wins list behind Lou Henson (423 wins in 21 seasons) and Harry Combes (316 wins in 20 seasons).

Weber became the third active Big Ten coach to join the 200-win club, joining Michigan State's Tom Izzo and Wisconsin's Bo Ryan. Ohio State's Thad Matta has since reached 200 wins as well.

Big Ten Wins Conference Challenge over ACC for Third Straight Season

The Big Ten Conference owns bragging rights over the ACC for the third year in a row. The Big Ten won this year's Big Ten/ACC Challenge by a commanding 8-4 margin, which follows consecutive 6-5 victories in 2009 and 2010. Illinois, meanwhile, improved its all-time Challenge record to 6-7 with the win at Maryland. The Illini are tied with Ohio State and Wisconsin as the winningest Big Ten team over the 13-year history of the event.

Non-Conference Road Success

Illinois now has a five-game road non-conference winning streak that spans four seasons. It began with a 69-63 victory at Vanderbilt on Nov. 20, 2008, continued with a 76-74 win at Clemson on Dec. 2, 2009 and a 76-66 victory at Stony Brook on March 17, 2010, and then a 78-63 win at Western Michigan on Nov. 27, 2010. The 71-62 victory over the Maryland in College Park extended the streak to five straight.

Illini Win Cancun Challenge – Richardson MVP, Maniscalco All-Tourney

Illinois went 4-0 to win the Cancun Challenge, claiming its first tournament title since the 2008 South Padre Island Invitational. D.J. Richardson was chosen as Tournament MVP while Sam Maniscalco was voted to the All-Tournament team. Illinois defeated SIU Edwardsville and Lipscomb at the Assembly Hall before heading to Cancun, where it defeated Richmond in the semifinal and Illinois State in the championship.

Illini in the NBA

Illinois currently has two alumni in the NBA in Deron Williams and Brian Cook. Williams, the highest drafted player in Illinois history at No. 3 in the 2005 Lottery, has played six seasons in the NBA and is currently with the New Jersey Nets. Cook, chosen as the 24th pick in the first round of the 2003 draft, is an eight-year NBA veteran and is currently with the Los Angeles Clippers.

Orris Signs with the Orange & Blue

Illinois signed high school senior Michael Orris to a national letter of intent on Nov. 9. Orris is a 6-2, 180-pound point guard from Crete, Ill. and attends Crete-Monee High School, under the direction of head coach Tom Cappel. Orris averaged 10.2 points, 6.2 assists and 3.0 rebounds last season, leading Crete-Monee to a 25-4 record and the school's first-ever sectional championship.

An honorable mention All-State selection by the *Champaign-Urbana News-Gazette*, Orris shot 50 percent from the field, 39 percent from 3-point range and 75 percent from the free throw line. He is a member of the Illinois Old School AAU program, coached by Scott Lidskin. Orris received the lone scholarship Illinois had available for this year's recruiting class.

Filling the Void

Illinois entered the 2011-12 campaign looking to replace 69 percent of its scoring production from last season (1,665 of 2,413 points scored by non-returns). That's the highest percentage in 13 years, since the 1998-99 Illini lost 87.6 percent of points from the previous season (2,016 of 2,301 points scored by non-returns).

Illinois also is looking to replace its top three leading scorers for the first time since entering the 1998-99 season when the Illini had lost its top five leading scorers from the previous year.

Preseason Headlines – New Roles, New Faces and New Outlook in 2011-12

Illinois has quite a different look this season. The Illini have replaced four starters and five of its top seven scorers from a year ago. In fact, Illinois has returned just 31 percent of its points, 21.3 percent of its rebounds and 33.5 percent of its minutes played from the 2010-11 campaign.

Illinois returns five scholarship players and seven letterwinners overall. Head Coach Bruce Weber also welcomes seven new players to the mix in what is one of the largest groups of newcomers he's had in his 33 years coaching.

Returning for the Illini

The most experienced Illini is junior D.J. Richardson, a two-year starter at shooting guard who averaged 8.4 points last season and is a career 39 percent 3-point shooter.

Like Richardson, fellow junior Brandon Paul also has been a regular in the UI rotation. Paul started 24 games on the wing over his first two seasons and is Illinois' leading returning scorer after averaging 9.0 points last year.

The remaining Illini returnees all have an opportunity to seize expanded roles this year. Junior Tyler Griffey is a skilled forward who has range behind the arc, and sophomore center Meyers Leonard has the natural athletic and physical talent to become a force in the paint.

Sophomore Joseph Bertrand gives the Illini a boost of athleticism on the perimeter as a combo guard who excels in the open court and has shown the ability to be a strong defender.

Walk-on guards Jean Selus and Kevin Berardini also return for their second season with the Orange & Blue.

Bradley Transfer Bolsters Point Guard Spot

Illinois must replace the offensive production of four-year starting point guard Demetri McCamey, who left Champaign as one of only two players in Big Ten history to record career totals of 1,700 points and 700 assists. Fifth-year senior Sam Maniscalco will be looked upon to step in and help provide experience and leadership from the point guard position.

Maniscalco graduated from Bradley University in May. He received a transfer year of residence waiver from the NCAA to compete immediately with the Illini this year. Maniscalco – who also was granted a medical hardship waiver following ankle surgery last season – was a second-team All-Missouri Valley selection as a junior in 2010 after averaging 13.1 points and 3.4 assists. He played in 111 career games at Bradley, totaling 1,210 points and 355 assists.

Illini Staff Stacking Classes

For the third straight season, Illinois adds a top-15 ranked recruiting class to the roster. Six true freshmen have joined the squad this season: guard Tracy Abrams, wings Myke Henry and Devin Langford, and frontcourt players Nnanna Egwu, Mike Shaw and Ibby Djimde.

- Four of the freshmen – Chicagoans Abrams, Egwu, Henry and Shaw – were all Top 100 recruits according to various recruiting services. The 2011 recruiting class is ranked 11th nationally by both Rivals.com and ESPN and No. 13 by Scout.com.
- Abrams earned all-state accolades after averaging 17.7 points, 6.2 rebounds and 4.6 assists last season at Mount Carmel High School.
- Egwu also earned all-state honors after averaging 16 points, 10 rebounds and five blocks last year at St. Ignatius Prep.
- Henry is an explosive scorer who averaged 25 points and 11 rebounds last season at Orr Academy, earning all-state recognition.
- Shaw also was an all-state pick who averaged 13 points and 7.5 rebounds last year and finished his career as the all-time leading scorer at De La Salle Institute.
- Langford hails from Huntsville, Ala., and averaged 21 points, 14 rebounds and seven assists last season, leading Lee High School to a state runner-up finish after winning state during his junior season.
- Djimde attended high school for two years in the United States after arriving from Bamako, Mali. He spent his senior year at Huntington Prep in West Virginia, averaging 10 points and eight rebounds.

Italy Recap

Illinois got a head start on its preparations for the upcoming season by participating in an international tour of Italy. Overseas trips are allowed once every four years under NCAA rules, and with so many new players on the roster, the timing was perfect for the Illini. The team held 10 days of practice during the summer, then toured Italy from Aug. 10-20 with stops in Rome, Florence, Venice and Como. While there the Orange and Blue played games against the New Zealand National Team, three Italian professional teams and also scrimmaged West Virginia University and select military personnel at the Aviano Air Base. In addition to the basketball competition, the Illini enjoyed the travel camaraderie and incredible sight-seeing and tourist opportunities.

Another 20-Win Season for the Illini

Illinois tallied 20 victories last season, recording the program's 11th 20-win season in the last 12 years and 29th all-time, as well as the seventh 20-win season in eight years under Bruce Weber.

Lock Down "D"

Illinois has led the Big Ten in field goal percentage defense during conference play in each of the last three years. Illini league opponents shot 39.6 percent last season after shooting 39 percent in 2010 and 39.4 percent in 2009.

Illinois, meanwhile, has topped the Big Ten in 3-point field goal percentage defense during league play twice in the last three seasons. Illini conference opponents shot 29.9 percent from behind the arc last year. In 2009, UI league opponents also shot 29.9 percent from 3-point land.

Oh So Close

Illinois was agonizingly close to victory in the majority of its losses last season. The Illini either led or were tied during the second half in 11 of its 14 losses. And eight of those went down to the wire, as the Illini led or were tied during the final minute in three of the losses or trailed by one point during the final minute in five of the losses.

D.J. Richardson scored 20 points to lead four players in double figures and the No. 24 Illini beat Coppin State 80-63.

After failing to get any sort of offensive rhythm in a narrow win against St. Bonaventure, Illinois shot 56 percent from the floor against Coppin State's zone defense, including a season-best 10 three-pointers.

Illinois hung on to remain one of nine undefeated teams in the nation despite a second-half surge from the Eagles.

After Illinois jumped out to a 17-point lead in the opening minutes of the second half, Coppin State went on a 20-5 run to cut the lead to 59-57. Illinois responded with a 13-3 burst after Illinois center Meyers Leonard and Coppin State guard Taariq Cephas both received technical fouls when the two got tangled up and had to be separated.

Following the pair of technicals, Illinois head coach Bruce Weber switched to a four-guard rotation alongside Leonard, and the group turned to Leonard to provide enough offense down the stretch.

Tony Gallo scored 21 points for Coppin State, which also made 10 3-pointers.

Leonard had 18 points and 11 rebounds for his second career double-double, while guards Sam Maniscalco and Brandon Paul each scored 12 points.

The starting backcourt trio of Maniscalco, Paul and Richardson combined for nine of Illinois' 10 3-pointers, most of which came against Coppin State's zone defense.

Maniscalco had five assists and no turnovers, while the rest of the team had 21 assists and nine turnovers.

The 10 victories to start the season marks the best opening for an Illini team since 2005, and it is the fourth-longest winning streak for Illinois under Weber.

The Cornhuskers had a chance at the other end, but Bo Spencer settled for a long jumper on the run that missed.

Paul came up with the ball and, on the break, drew an intentional foul going to the basket. As Sadler argued the call, the junior hit two free throws to put the game all but out of reach at 58-54 with 21 seconds to play.

Spencer led Nebraska with 13 points. McCray added 12, and Brandon Richardson scored 10.

Both teams were sloppy. Nebraska finished with 20 turnovers, and Illinois had 14.

One big difference, Weber said, was that Illinois cleaned up its turnover problem in the second half. Both teams had a dozen in the first 20 minutes, but Illinois had just two in the second half.

Nebraska didn't score in the game's first 4-plus minutes, giving Illinois a chance to race ahead, but the Illini muffed the opportunity. Illinois put up just five points in those first 4 minutes.

Brandon Paul scored a career-high 43 - the third best scoring performance in Illinois basketball history - to lead the Illini past the No. 5 Buckeyes 79-74.

The most important of Paul's shots was an off-balance 3-pointer that, with 43 seconds left, gave Illinois a 74-70 lead that all but finished the Buckeyes.

Paul scored the final 15 points for the Illini.

Ohio State led 39-34 at halftime, and was up 64-61 with just over five minutes to play.

But with the game tied at 66 with just over two minutes to play, Joseph Bertrand swiped the ball from William Buford, putting the ball in Paul's hands for a baseline 3-pointer that put the Illini up 69-66.

Paul's 43 points was the third-highest scoring performance in Illini history and he tied a school record with eight 3-pointers. He also had a team-high eight rebounds.

Leonard added 14 for Illinois and Bertrand and D.J. Richardson scored 10 each.

Deshaun Thomas scored 23 points and Jared Sullinger added 21 for Ohio State. William Buford had 15 points for the Buckeyes and Aaron Craft added 12.

Ohio State looked ready to put the Illini away early in the second half, stretching its lead to 48-37 in the opening two minutes on an efficient run that yielded nine points over four possessions. Illinois ran off its own 7-0 run, pulling to within two at 48-46 on a 3-pointer by Richardson.

Ohio State did pull away yet again, going up 52-46 on a short turnaround jumper by Sullinger over Leonard with 14:25 left in the game.

The Illini then scored eight straight, taking the lead 55-54 with a baseline jumper by Leonard with 11:18 to play.

On Illinois' next possession, Paul drew what the officials judged to be an intentional foul by Craft, sinking two of his three shots and giving the Illini a 57-54 edge with just under 11 minutes left. Buford answered a long miss by Paul with two points on outside jumper that tied the game again at 61.

Then, after a Leonard turnover, he drained a 3-pointer for a 64-61 Ohio State lead with 6:18 to play.

Frazier finished with 12 points and nine assists for the Nittany Lions, who ended a three-game losing skid.

Off a timeout, Frazier drove at the top of the key before Jon Graham's pick freed him from hounding defender Brandon Paul.

The Illini lost for the first time since re-entering the AP Top 25 this week. They had a short stay atop the Big Ten as the league's lone one-loss team in conference play.

Paul had 20 points to pace the Illini, while Meyers Leonard added 15.

The Illini chipped away at a nine-point deficit several times in the second half thanks in part to better ball movement. Paul's 3 from the left wing with 39 seconds left tied the game at 52.

But Illinois couldn't break through after shooting 33 percent in the first half and going scoreless for an 8-minute stretch spanning both periods. Illinois shot 34 percent (17 of 49) for the game.

Cammeron Woodyard finished with 17 points for Penn State, while Marshall finished with seven points and five rebounds.

But the highlight of Marshall's night was his lunging tip to deflect Maniscalco's shot at the end of the game.

Illinois' poor start from the field warmed Nittany Lions fans hoping to witness another tight game with the Illini on a chilly, snowy night in Happy Valley. Five of the last eight games in the series have been decided by two points or less. Penn State won 57-55 at home last season, over then-No. 16 Illinois.

They pulled out another close one, this time to get first-year coach Patrick Chambers his first victory over a ranked opponent in Happy Valley.

With 2:09 left and Michigan State up 40-37, Illinois freshman Tracy Abrams hit a 3-pointer to tie the game.

Hulls' 3-pointer broke a 46-46 tie. Zeller then drew a foul on a dunk and completed the three-point play to give Indiana a 52-46 lead. After Watford grabbed a loose ball and called time out, Zeller drove in for a layup to make it 54-46 with 15:24 to play.

Illinois responded with 3s from Paul and Richardson on consecutive possessions. Paul followed that with a layup, then hit 1 of 2 free throws to get the Illini within 57-55 with 10:58 to go.

With Illinois within 62-59, Zeller and Oladipo changed the equation by drawing fouls.

They combined to make 5 of 6 free throws, starting the late 15-6 run that gave Indiana a 77-65 lead with 4:49 to go.

Illinois didn't get closer than 10 points the rest of the way.

Tim Hardaway Jr. scored 15 points and Evan Smotrycz added 13, helping No. 22 Michigan remain unbeaten at home with a 70-61 win over Illinois.

Trey Burke added 14 points for the Wolverines, but it was Smotrycz and Hardaway who provided a big lift by shaking off their shooting slumps in the first half. Hardaway entered the game shooting 19 percent from 3-point range in conference play. Smotrycz wasn't much better at 24 percent, but they each went 2 for 2 from beyond the arc before halftime.

Brandon Paul led Illinois with 21 points and Tyler Griffey added 18. The Fighting Illini have lost six of seven and are on the NCAA tournament bubble despite wins over Ohio State and Michigan State.

Hardaway's poor outside shooting and Smotrycz's ineffectiveness have been concerns for Michigan, but both players were sharp Sunday, especially early. Hardaway gave the Wolverines a 10-8 lead with a 3-pointer from the left wing, and he later rattled in a shot from the baseline - after Smotrycz had stolen an Illinois pass - to make it 25-20.

Smotrycz made a nice backdoor pass to Matt Vogrich for an easy basket, then added a 3-pointer of his own to make it 30-21. Michigan was ahead 37-31 at halftime and pushed the lead to double digits early in the second.

It was 53-44 after Paul made a 3-pointer for Illinois, but Vogrich connected from long distance for the Wolverines and Jordan Morgan scored to put Michigan up by 14.

Illinois went on a 7-0 run to cut the lead in half, but Morgan broke up Paul's pass into the post, and Hardaway made a layup in transition to make it 60-51.

Illinois center Meyers Leonard, who at 7-foot-1 had at least a 5-inch height advantage over every Michigan starter, was in foul trouble early and finished only with five points, although he did have 12 rebounds. The Illini had 14 offensive rebounds to Michigan's six but couldn't take advantage.

Zack Novak scored 12 points for Michigan.

Deshaun Thomas scored 19 points and No. 8 Ohio State regained its shooting touch by hitting 65 percent from the field, rolling over Illinois 83-67 to remain in the thick of the Big Ten race.

William Buford, maligned for his recent poor shooting, had 17 points on 7 of 9 from the field, and Aaron Craft added 11 points to go with five assists. Jared Sullinger, third in the conference at 17.5 points a game, managed just nine before fouling out - but the Buckeyes didn't really need him.

Ohio State was coming off a 58-48 loss at Value City Arena to Michigan State on Feb. 11 that ended a 39-game home winning streak. The Buckeyes made only 14 of 53 shots against the Spartans, an arena-record low of 26.4 percent for the home team. They connected on 2 of 15 3-pointers.

In their most recent game, a 56-51 loss to No. 17 Michigan on Saturday, they shot 38.8 percent.

Meyers Leonard had 21 for Illinois, which has lost six in a row and nine of 10.

The game was a dramatic turnaround for Brandon Paul, who had 43 points in Illinois' 79-74 stunner over then-No. 5 Ohio State on Jan. 10. Paul almost destroyed the Buckeyes by himself, making 11 of 15 shots from the field - including 8 of 10 3-pointers - and 13 of 15 free throws.

But on this night, he managed just nine points on 2 of 9 shooting.

The Illini never got closer than 16 points over the last 25 minutes.
