LAST WEEK

The Hawkeyes dropped their Big Ten opener and second game this season last Friday at Michigan, but rebounded against Central Michigan with another shutout.

The Wolverines beat lowa in double overtime 3-2. Junior **Lauren Pfeiffer** scored both Hawkeye goals in the first half. Michigan scored two goals in the final five minutes of regulation to tie the game.

lowa defeated Central Michigan 3-0, the fifth shutout for the Hawkeyes this season. Pfeiffer scored two goals for the second consecutive game.

WHAT GRIESBAUM THOUGHT

"We suffered a devastating loss at Michigan." Griesbaum said. "We did not manage the clock well at all. We were able to dominate the first half but Michigan returned the favor in the second half and completely controlled the half. Our performance was not acceptable."

"We discussed rebounding and allowing our performance on Sunday to give us momentum for the week leading up to Indiana." Griesbaum said. "Our play against Central Michigan was solid and there are things we can take from the game to propel us into the next week."

"Our penalty corner execution was outstanding throughout the weekend." Griesbaum concluded.

lowa has scored 32 goals this season (10 games), nine more than last year after ten games (21).

PFEIFFER SCORES FOUR

Junior Lauren Pfeiffer scored four goals last weekend. She scored both lowa goals in a 3-2 double overtime loss against Michigan and added two more against Central Michigan in a 3-0 win.

Pfeiffer has recorded the second most goals in the Big Ten this season with a team high of eight.

MUNLEY EARNS FOURTH SHUTOUT

Junior goalkeeper **Lissa Munley** earned her fourth shutout of the season and seventh of her career against Central Michigan.

The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten with five shutout this season. Munley played all but nine minutes of the fifth shutout, therefore it not being credited to her.

IOWA RANKS IN BIG TEN

The Hawkeyes are first in the Big Ten in penalty corners awarded (93) shutouts (5) and tied for first in defensive saves (1). They are second in scoring average (3.15), shots (156), goals scored (29) and assists (21). Iowa also has accumulated the second best overall record (8-2) in the Big Ten. The are only behind Michigan State at 9-1.

FOUR ON TOP OF BIG TEN

Four lowa juniors lead the Big Ten in five categories. Lauren Pfeiffer in shots (51) and shots per game (5.11), Lindsey Duffy in gamewinning goals (3), Roz Ellis in defensive saves (1) and Lissa Munley in shutouts (4).

HAVE YOU SEEN THIS?

Junior **Roz Ellis** has a shot percentage of .545. That is the best percentage on the team, with the next closest being .333 by **Jess Werley** who has converted twice on six shots. Ellis has recorded six goals on only 14 shots.

HOW 'BOUT THEM HAWKEYES

The 2007 Hawkeyes have a record of 8-2, the best record in the first ten games since 2003.
