Series Record: Iowa leads 24-19 (Last Meeting, OSU 67-60, Feb. 13, 2005)



The Setting • Iowa (10-5, 3-1) remains home Thursday when the Hawkeyes entertain No. 8 Ohio State (12-3, 2-0). Tip-off is slated for 7:05 p.m. inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,500). Tickets are \$7 for adults, \$5 for youths and University students are admitted free with student I.D.

Thursday's game features two of the league's top scoring threats in Iowa's Crystal Smith (19.6) and Ohio State's Jessica Davenport (17.8). Additionally, the Buckeyes rank first in league scoring (74.8), while the Hawkeyes rank second (74.7). Iowa has won six of its last seven games, while Ohio State has won five of its last six.

On the Radio • Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call the action for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the game on WHO 1040-AM in Des Moines, WMT 600-AM in Cedar Rapids and KXIC 800-AM in Iowa City.

The game can also be heard live over the Internet at www.hawkeyesports.com. Just click "Hawkeye All-Access" at the top right of the page. "Hawkeye All-Access" is a subscription service.

On the Tube • Thursday's game will be televised live in Eastern Iowa on KCRG-TV9. John Campbell, Amy Herrig and Scott Saville will call the action.

Iowa History • Iowa has played 894 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, Iowa's record is 547-347 (.612). That includes a 270-126 (.682) mark in Big Ten games and a 245-59 (.806) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

On This Date • Iowa is 4-3 in games played on January 12, losing its last two.

Smith Closes in on 1,000 • Senior Crystal Smith has amassed 988 career points and is only 12 points from becoming the 22nd Hawkeye to reach the 1,000-point plateau. The native of Haughton, LA, has scored 850 of her points the last two years (48 games). She currently ranks 22nd in career scoring, sixth in 3-pointers made (95) and seventh in steals (178).

Smith averaged 1.1 points per game in 21 games her freshman year, followed by a 3.9 scoring average in 29 contests her sophomore season and 16.8 ppg her junior year. Smith currently averages 19.6 ppg through 15 games in her senior campaign. Smith's scoring average ranks second in the Big Ten and 15th nationally. She has led Iowa in scoring 11 times this season.

The native of Haughton, LA, averaged 11.0 points, 1.0 rebounding, 2.0 assists and 1.0 steals in two games against Ohio State last year.

Scouting No. 8 Ohio State • Ohio State (11-2, 2-1) won a battle of top 25 teams Monday night as the eighth-ranked Buckeyes outlasted 16th-ranked Oklahoma 75-71 in Columbus. Four Buckeye starters scored in double figures and Ohio State outscored the Sooners, 14-5 at the foul line en route to victory. Brandie Hoskins scored a team-high 16 points, while Debbie Merrill tallied 12 points and grabbed a team-high nine rebounds.

The Buckeyes are led by preseason all-American Jessica Davenport, who ranks third in Big Ten scoring (17.8), first in rebounding (8.8), blocks (2.54) and field goal percentage (.614). Davenport has recorded a league-best six double-doubles through 13 contests. Kim Wilburn ranks first in Big Ten steals (4.23), while Marscilla Packer ranks second in 3-pointers made (2.23).

Ohio State's two losses came at No. 3 LSU (64-48) and at No. 18 Purdue (61-59). The Buckeyes have defeated Penn State (74-53) and Northwestern (82-54) in league play.

Ohio State is coached by Jim Foster, who is in his 28th year (588-252) as a head coach and his fourth season (84-27) with the Buckeyes. Foster is 4-0 against the Hawkeyes.

All-Time Series Record • Thursday will be the 44th meeting between Iowa and Ohio State, with the Hawkeyes leading the series 24-19. Iowa boasts a 15-5 advantage in games played in Iowa City.

Ohio State has won the last four in the series and five of the last six. Iowa's last victory over the Buckeyes came on Jan. 20, 2002 in Iowa City when the Hawkeyes won 70-65.

Iowa and Ohio State Notes • Ohio State and Iowa rank one-two in four Big Ten statistical categories. The Buckeyes rank first in scoring (74.8), assist/turnover ratio (1.4), field goal percentage (.483) and assists (18.85), while the Hawkeyes rank second in scoring (74.7), assist/turnover ratio (1.01), field goal percentage (.473) and assists (18.07).

Iowa and Ohio State have a long-storied rivalry. The Buckeyes defeated the Hawkeyes 73-72 in the 1993 Final Four semifinals. The two teams also met on Feb. 3, 1985 in Iowa City when 22,157 fans squeezed into Carver-Hawkeye Arena, shattering the NCAA attendance record. Ohio State won the contest (56-47).

Freshman Megan Skouby is the only Iowa player that hails from Ohio (Mentor). In fact, her grandfather played basketball for the Buckeyes.

RPI Ratings • Iowa's victory over Michigan State raised its RPI 11 points from No. 63 to No. 52 in the RPI ratings published on Jan. 10 on www.collegerpi.com. Ohio State ranks No. 7 in the RPI. The Hawkeyes also rank 35th in strength of schedule, while the Buckeyes rank 12th. All five Iowa losses came to opponents with a current RPI of 74 or better.

Common Opponents • Iowa and Ohio State share one common opponent: Oklahoma. The Hawkeyes lost to the Sooners (85-68), while the Buckeyes defeated Oklahoma (75-71).

Last Meeting • Jessica Davenport scored 21 points and converted a key 3-point play late in the game that enabled No. 2 Ohio State to hold off Iowa 67-60 in Iowa City.

Caity Matter added 18 points for the Buckeyes and hit a 3-pointer with just under five minutes left to break the game's final tie. Ohio State used a 16-0 run to erase a 12-point Iowa advantage in the first half, then went on a 13-2 second-half run to take the lead for good.

Iowa led 53-47 when Krista VandeVenter scored on a put-back with 11:47 remaining, then made only two baskets the rest of the way. Jamie Cavey led the Hawkeyes with 22 points, 14 in the second half and 10 rebounds.

Beth Howe started Ohio State's decisive rally with a jumper and Davenport, who had been scoreless the first 13 minutes of the half, hit consecutive shots inside to tie it at 53. Then, with the score tied at 55, Iowa's Jenna Armstrong lost the ball driving into the lane and Kim Wilburn hit Matter for a wide open 3 on the right wing. Tamarah Riley followed with a basket inside to complete the run, making it 60-55.

Cavey's final basket cut the lead to three with four minutes to play, but Iowa came up empty on their next three possessions and the Buckeyes finally got the ball to Davenport on the low block. Davenport was fouled by Cavey as she hit a turnaround and sank the free throw, making it 63-57 with 1:15 left.

Brandie Hoskins added 14 points for Ohio State, while Wilburn finished with eight steals and six assists. Crystal Smith scored 12 for Iowa and Armstrong had 11.

Iowa made seven 3-pointers, three by Armstrong, and got four baskets inside from Cavey in zooming to its early lead. Iowa went on a 14-2 run to open a 34-22 lead with 6:07 left in the first half.

Iowa didn't score again in the half, missing eight straight shots.

IOWA CAPTAINS

Iowa captains for the season are seniors Morgan Kasperek, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith.

Last Time Out • Iowa won a 75-64 thriller over ninth-ranked Michigan State Monday at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The victory was the Hawkeyes' first over a top-ten ranked opponent since downing No. 9 Purdue 90-75 on Jan. 6, 2002 in Iowa City.

Hawkeye starters scored 72 of its 75 points en route to victory. Megan Skouby posted career bests in points (27) and assists (3) and equaled a career high in rebounds (8). The 27 points is the highest scoring outburst by an Iowa freshman since Tiffany Gooden tallied 36 during the 1994-95 season. Crystal Smith contributed 18 points, six rebounds and matched a career high with eight rebounds, while Krista VandeVenter added 17 points and team highs in rebounds (9) and steals (5). Smith reached double figures for the 50th time in her career.

With the game tied 36-36 at the 16:40 mark of the second half, the Hawkeyes scored on five-straight possessions on a 10-0 run to grab a 46-36 advantage. The Spartans trimmed Iowa's lead to one (61-60) at the 3:13 mark, but Iowa closed the contest on a 14-3 run.

Through 15 games, Iowa has not allowed an opponent to shoot 50 percent or better from the field or 40 percent or better from 3-point range. Iowa's defense held the Spartans to 45.2 percent (28-62) from the field and 25.0 percent (4-16) from behind the arc. Iowa converted 45.9 percent (28-61) of its field goals, including 26.7 percent (4-15) from 3-point range.

Skouby on the Rise • Freshman Megan Skouby has raised her game to a new level since taking over the starting center position for injured sophomore Stacy Schlapkohl. Skouby has averaged 15.75 points, 6.75 rebounds and 2.5 blocks in her first four starts. The 6-6 standout ranks 19th in overall scoring (11.8) in the Big Ten, third in field goal percentage (.585) and blocks (1.87). She ranks seventh in conference scoring (15.8), second in blocks (2.5) and 10th in rebounding (6.8). Skouby has led Iowa in scoring the last two games and three of five.

Skouby Quickly Climbed Freshman Chart • Megan Skouby has already rejected 28 shots. She blocked a career-high five shots at Michigan on Jan. 5 to surpass Jennie Lillis for second place on Iowa's freshman single season blocking list. Tangelia Smith holds Iowa's freshman mark with 73 rejections.

Vandy is Dandy • Sophomore Krista VandeVenter is one of the top all-around threats in the Big Ten. VandeVenter, who has started every game as a Hawkeye, ranks third in Big Ten rebounding (8.2), fourth in steals (2.4), 10th in field goal percentage (.512) and 26th in scoring (10.3). She has led the Hawkeyes in rebounding ten times this season. The 6-2 power forward averaged 9.5 points, 7.8 rebounds, 3.17 assists and 3.33 steals while shooting 52.8 percent (28-53) from the field in Iowa's last six contests.

Smith Ranks Second in Big Ten in Scoring • Senior Crystal Smith ranks second in Big Ten scoring (19.6) and 15th nationally; Michigan State's Liz Shimek (19.7) ranks first. Smith has led Iowa in scoring in 11 of Iowa's 15 contests.

Smith's 46 points at Louisiana Tech are the most scored in a game by any player in the nation this season. San Diego's Michelle Augustavo ranks second after netting 42 points vs. Clemson on Dec. 11.

In the Rankings • Iowa ranks 30th nationally in scoring offense (74.5) and 14th in field goal percentage (.473) and assists (18.1) in rankings through games played on Jan. 2, 2006. Crystal Smith ranks 15th in scoring.

DE-FENSE! • Iowa's perimeter defense has been stellar through 15 games. The Hawkeyes rank first in Big Ten 3-point field goal defense (.255). Last season Iowa ranked 10th in the league in 3-point field goal defense (.361).

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her sixth season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 22nd season as a college head coach. Bluder, 44, has a career record of 462-206 (.692), including a 106-64 (.624) record at Iowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to five post-season tournaments (3 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and three upper division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.



In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. Last season Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (8) and Emma (5) and one son, David (3).

Dishing the Rock • Iowa ranks second in Big Ten assists, dishing the ball 18.07 times per game. Four Hawkeyes average 2.33 assists or better: Crystal Smith (3.53), Krista VandeVenter (3.0), Kristi Smith (3.0) and Abby Emmert (2.33).

Possessing the Rock • The Hawkeyes struggled with turnovers in their first six games, collecting 21.0 miscues per game. However, Iowa has done a better job maintaining the ball in its last nine contests, only averaging 15.7 turnovers. The Hawkeyes turned the ball over a season-low 14 times their last two contests (at Michigan and vs. #9 Michigan State).

ACL Trio • In a span of six months, Iowa had three players who suffered ACL injuries to their right knees. Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson and Stacy Schlapkohl all suffered season-ending injuries. Richards sustained her injury in June, followed by Solverson (July) and Schlapkohl (December).

Cashing in at the Free Throw Line • Freshman Wendy Ausdemore became the first Hawkeye to start the season making her first 18 free throw attempts.

Senior Crystal Smith made her first 18 attempts from the foul line in Iowa's first three conference contests, including draining all 11 attempts vs. Illinois. Smith's 11-11 performance tied a school and arena record for free throw percentage in a game. She has converted 27 of her last 28 free throw attempts.

Underclassmen Start for Hawkeyes • Iowa's probable starting lineup vs. Ohio State includes two freshmen (Kristi Smith and Megan Skouby) and one sophomore (Krista VandeVenter).

VandeVenter has started all 48 games as a Hawkeye, including all 15 this season. The power forward ranks third in team scoring (10.3) and first in rebounding (8.2).

Smith has started the last seven games at point guard for Iowa. The native of Thornton, CO ranks sixth in team scoring (6.5) and second in assists (3.0).

Skouby will start her fifth contest Thursday. The 6-6 center ranks second in team scoring (11.8) and field goal percentage (.585), first in blocks (1.87) and fourth in rebounding (4.5).

Iowa is one of three Big Ten teams with two or more freshmen starters. Michigan and Penn State start three, while Iowa starts two.

Big Ten Rankings • Iowa ranks first in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.255) and 3-point field goal percentage (.369), second in scoring offense (74.7), field goal percentage (.473), assists (18.07), turnover margin (+1.01) and third in blocks (4.43).

Senior Crystal Smith ranks second in league scoring (19.6), fifth in 3-point field goals made (1.93), sixth in steals (2.33) and ninth in free throw percentage (.832). Freshman Megan Skouby ranks third in field goal percentage (.585) and third in blocked shots (1.87). Sophomore Krista VandeVenter ranks third in rebounding (8.2) and fourth in steals (2.4).

Freshmen Step Up • Iowa's freshmen class (Megan Skouby, Wendy Ausdemore, Kristi Smith, Nicole VanderPol and Lindsey Nyenhuis) are averaging 27.5 ppg through 15 games. The trio of Ausdemore, Skouby and Smith have average 18.7 minutes or more per game.

Skouby ranks second in team scoring (11.8) and fourth in rebounding (4.5), Smith ranks sixth in scoring (6.5) and second in assists (4.5), while Ausdemore ranks seventh in scoring (6.2). VanderPol saw limited action through 11 games, but will see more time after Stacy Schlapkohl suffered a season-ending injury. VanderPol averaged 3.3 rpg and 2.7 ppg the first three Big Ten contests. Nyenhuis missed almost the entire non-conference schedule due to a foot injury.

High Octane • Iowa, who ranks second in Big Ten scoring offense, has scored 80 points or more in six of its first 15 games. The Hawkeyes are 5-1 when scoring 80 points or more.

Five Spot • Crystal Smith, who was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Nov. 28, broke or tied five school records during Thanksgiving week.

The senior broke school records for points (46) and free throws attempted (19) in a game and equaled school records in free throws made (15) and 3-pointers attempted (14) in Iowa's 95-91 double overtime setback at Louisiana Tech on Nov. 22. The native of Haughton, LA, also matched the school record for field goal percentage (9-9, 1.000) in the Hawkeyes' 88-41 rout over Rider on Nov. 26.

In the three games, Smith averaged 28.3 points, 4.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.7 steals per game. She finished the week 26-of-55 (.473) from the field, 10-of-25 (.400) from the perimeter and 23-of-28 (.821) at the line.

Reedy Set Go • Senior Tiffany Reedy played in her 100th career game vs. Vermont on Dec. 3. The native of Dysart, IA, has had a great start to the 2005-06 campaign, averaging 6.9 ppg, 4.4 rpg and ranking third on the team in steals with 15. Reedy collected 14 thefts and averaged 3.9 ppg and 2.4 rpg in 33 contests last season. She is also well on her way to surpassing her high mark of 19 triples made in each of her first three seasons. Reedy has already drained 17 treys and is shooting at a 37.0 percent clip from behind the arc, good enough to rank eighth in the Big Ten.

All-Tournament Selections • Senior Crystal Smith and sophomore Krista VandeVenter were named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament team. Smith also garnered Odwalla Classic All-Tournament accolades for her efforts Nov. 25-26 in San Francisco, CA.

Making the List • Iowa has recorded two victories by 40 points or more this season. The Hawkeyes posted a 40-point triumph (82-42) over UW-Milwaukee on Nov. 20. The 40-point win ranks as the 15th-largest margin of victory in school history. Iowa registered a 47-point victory (88-41) over Rider on Nov. 26. The 47-point win ranks as the ninth-largest margin of victory in Iowa history.

Iowa has posted six wins of 40 points or more under Coach Bluder (48 – UT-Pan American, 2001; 47 – Rider; 45 – Western Illinois, 2000; 43 – Creighton, 2002; 40 – Northwestern, 2001; 40 – UW-Milwaukee, 2005).

Smith Nominated for Senior CLASS Award • Seniors Crystal Smith is one of 30 seniors from Division I basketball programs around the nation who have been named as candidates for the Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award. The award, now in its fifth year, is presented annually to the nation's senior player-of-the-year. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. The award was launched during the 2001-02 season in response to the trend of college players leaving college early to turn professional. Smith joins Michigan State's Liz Shimek and Lindsay Bowen as the only three Big Ten student-athletes nominated. Sports-caster Dick Enberg, who initiated the idea for the award and now serves as honorary Chairman, will announce the winner during the CBS telecast of the NCAA Men's Final Four in April.

More on Smith's Records • Crystal Smith's 46 points bested Cindy Haugejorde's 44-point effort vs. Luther College on Jan. 12, 1977. In addition, the 46 points is the second-most scored in a single game in Big Ten history. Illinois' Kendra Gantt and Penn State's Kelly Mazzante both netted 49 points. The 46 points are the most ever scored by a Louisiana Tech opponent, besting the previous record of 43 points scored by USC's Cheryl Miller, and was one point from a Thomas Assembly Center record.

Smith's 19 free throws attempted topped the previous school record held by Nadine Domond and Amy Herrig. Domond attempted 16 foul shots vs. UCSB on Nov. 25, 1995, while Herrig attempted 16 free throws vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 19 free throws attempted ranks eighth in Big Ten annals with five others.

Smith's 15 free throws made equaled Amy Herrig's school record of 15 established vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 15 foul shots made ranks seventh in league history with eight others.

Smith's 14 three-pointers attempted equals the school record previously set by Lindsey Meder twice before. Meder attempted 14 at Colorado on Dec. 2, 2001 and vs. Ohio State on Jan. 3, 2002.

Smith's perfect 9-9 (1.000) shooting performance from the field matched Jamie Cavey's record of 9-9 (1.000) vs. Marquette on March 23, 2003. All of Cavey's field goals were two-point baskets, while four of Smith's five were from behind the arc.

Movin' On Up • Senior Crystal Smith (178) is 12 steals from equaling Jennie Lillis (190) for sixth on Iowa's career steals chart. Smith (988) is also 36 points from matching Tiffany Gooden (1,024) for 21st in career scoring at Iowa.

Attendance Rankings • Iowa ranks 26th nationally in the women's basketball attendance rankings released Jan. 9.

Kristi Smith Maturing Into Starting Role • Hawkeye freshman Kristi Smith has done a fantastic job directing the Iowa offense since taking over the starting role. Since Big Ten play, Smith has averaged 7.5 points, 4.5 assists and 1.0 steals. She is on pace to crack the Iowa freshman single season assists top five list by the end of the season.

Century Club • Iowa Head Women's Basketball Coach Lisa Bluder reached another milestone on Dec. 3, as Bluder collected her 100th victory as Iowa Head Coach in Iowa's 79-57 triumph over Vermont on Dec. 3. Bluder, who is the second all-time winningest Iowa coach, boasts a 106-64 (.624) record in six years mentoring the Hawkeyes.

Young Guns • Iowa is tied for 15th in the nation with the most underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes are tied with 16 other schools, including Big Ten schools Northwestern and Illinois, with nine underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes have four freshmen and five sophomores on its roster. Air Force (13) leads the nation, followed by New Orleans (12). Michigan is tied for seventh (10), while Penn State (8) and Wisconsin (8) are tied for 31st.

Home Grown Hawkeyes • Iowa's roster features six players from the state of Iowa (Wendy Ausdemore, Abby Emmert, Ebone Pope, Tiffany Reedy, Stacy Schlapkohl and Nicole VanderPol). The Hawkeyes also have four players from Illinois (Jeneé Graham, Morgan Kasperek, Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson). Iowa's 15-person roster also features players from Colorado (Kristi Smith), Louisiana (Crystal Smith), Michigan (Lindsey Nyenhuis), Minnesota (Krista VandeVenter) and Ohio (Megan Skouby).

Center of Attention • For the fifth time during Coach Bluder's Iowa tenure, the Hawkeyes started the season with a different center. Jamie Cavey started for the Hawkeyes the last two years. She became Iowa's first center to start consecutive seasons since Amy Herrig (1997-99). Randi Peterson was Iowa's starter in 2000-01, followed by Beatrice Bullock (2001-02), Tracy Schrupp (2002-03) and Jamie Cavey (2003-05).

Iowa's two centers on its 2005-06 roster are sophomore Stacy Schlapkohl and freshman Megan Skouby.

Hawkeyes Pen Quoie • Iowa signed Woodbury, MN, native Zoraa Quoie to a National Letter of Intent last fall. She was an all-conference and honorable mention all-state selection her junior year. Quoie averaged 10.6 ppg and just fewer than four steals per game on a team that won its conference and finished 25-3 last season. Her Woodbury High School team also captured a league title and finished third at the Minnesota state tournament her sophomore year. Quoie was a reserve her sophomore year, but started last season. She was also an all-state sprinter on the track team her freshman year.

The tournament returns to Indianapolis for the 11th time in 12 years and has attracted more than 30,000 fans for each of the last four events. Just two years ago, the Big Ten set a pair of attendance records when the 2004 championship game was played in front of a single-session record of 9,417 fans, which established an overall tournament record of 37,635 spectators. In the past 11 years of Big Ten Tournament play, the conference has welcomed more than 314,000 fans. Five different league representatives have become tournament champions. Purdue leads all teams with five titles followed by two championships for both Iowa and Penn State and a single title for Indiana and Michigan State.

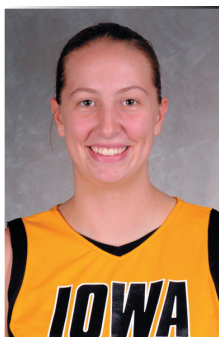

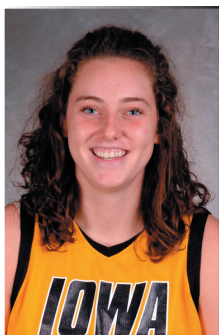

Game Summaries

Game 1

Iowa 82, UW-Milwaukee 42

Nov. 20, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - Iowa won its sixth-straight season opening game under Head Coach Lisa Bluder with an 82-42 rout over UW-Milwaukee in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes took a 15-point advantage into halftime and never looked back. Iowa shot 61.5 percent (16-26) from the field in the second half and 58.5 percent (31-53) for the game. A majority of Iowa's field goal attempts came from close range as the Hawkeyes out-scored the Panthers 42-18 in the paint.

All 12 Hawkeyes that played netted at least two points. Furthermore, 10 Hawkeyes collected at least one assist, while eight Iowa players recorded one steal or more. As a team, Iowa generated 21 assists and 17 steals. Jenée Graham registered a game-high six assists, while UW-Milwaukee accumulated a team total of seven assists.

A trio of Hawkeye post players paced the Hawkeyes in victory. Stacy Schlapkohl, Krista Vandeventer and Megan Skouby each scored 12 points each. The trio combined to shoot 15-23 (.652) from the field and 6-8 (.750) from the foul line.

Iowa finished the game strong, out-scoring UW-Milwaukee 23-6 in the final 12 minutes.

Iowa limited UW-Milwaukee to 15.6 percent (5-32) shooting from the field in the second half and 29.6 percent (16-54) for the game. Traci Edwards led the Panthers, recording a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds).

With Iowa enjoying a large lead for most of the game, Bluder was able to rotate her entire bench and not allow a single Hawkeye to play more than 21 minutes.

The 40-point triumph is Iowa's largest season opening win since a 43-point victory (83-40) vs. Wyoming on Nov. 25, 1998 in the Hawaii Wahine Classic.

Louisiana Tech 95, Iowa 91

Nov. 22, 2005, Thomas Assembly Center

RUSTON, LA - Louisiana Tech overcame a 19-point second half deficit with seven minutes remaining in regulation to outlast Iowa 95-91 in a doable overtime thriller at the Thomas Assembly Center.

The Lady Techsters spoiled Iowa senior Crystal Smith's homecoming, who was raised in nearby Houghton, LA, but not without a huge outing by Smith. Smith poured in a school-record 46 points, which is the most points by a Louisiana Tech opponent and was one point from an arena record. Smith also established a new school record for free throws attempted (19) and equaled the school record for foul shots made (15). She also set a career high with two blocked shots and matched a career best with eight rebounds.

Iowa led 71-52 with 7:18 remaining in regulation, but turnovers and poor free throw shooting enabled the Lady Techsters to sneak back into the game and out-score the Hawkeyes 24-5 the final seven minutes of regulation. Louisiana Tech forced eight Iowa turnovers on its press and converted the eight miscues into 12 points. Additionally, Iowa was only 1-4 from the foul line, including missing two front ends of one-and-ones, in the final five minutes of regulation.

Smith missed a 10-foot jumper that would have given Iowa the win at the end of regulation. Conversely, Louisiana Tech's Eboni Mangum missed a short jumper at the end of the first overtime that would have given the Lady Techsters the victory. Louisiana Tech out-scored the Hawkeyes 8-4 in the sixth period to lift the Lady Techsters to victory.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 10 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Krista Vandeventer added five points, 11 rebounds, five assists, two blocks and two steals in defeat.

Iowa lost only its third game in its last 21 contests when leading at the half.

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - Oklahoma's Paris twins combined for 44 points and 21 rebounds to propel the 22nd-ranked Sooners to an 85-68 victory over Iowa in the first round of the Odwalla Classic in War Memorial Gym.

Iowa opened the game with an 18-11 advantage, but Oklahoma closed the half on a 32-11 run to take a commanding 43-29 lead into half. Sooner junior Erin Higgins, who was 1-6 from 3-point range in last year's contest against the Hawkeyes in the Bahamas, scored all of her 14 points in the first half on 4-5 shooting from behind the arc.

Courtney Paris posted her third double-double of the season (30 points, 14 rebounds), while her sister Ashley collected 14 points and seven rebounds en route to victory in front of their hometown family and friends.

The Sooners dominated the Hawkeyes in the post, out-scoring Iowa 48-16 in the paint and scoring 27 second chance points for the game.

Senior Crystal Smith paced the Hawkeyes with a team-high 15 points and a game-high five steals. Sophomore Krista VandeVenter tallied seven points and grabbed a team-high 11 rebounds. Freshman Megan Skouby netted all of her 11 points in the second half and also corralled six rebounds in defeat.

Iowa's underclassmen scored 44 of the Hawkeyes' 68 points, including 27 from freshmen.

Iowa converted a season-best 89.5 percent (17-19) from the free throw line. Conversely, the Hawkeyes shot a season-low 38.3 percent (23-60) from the field.

Oklahoma's win was its first victory over Iowa in three tries.

Iowa will face Rider for the first time in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic.

Iowa 88, Rider 41

Nov. 26, 2005, War Memorial Gym

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - The Iowa Hawkeyes led start-to-finish cruising to a lopsided 88-41 triumph over Rider in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic. The 47-point victory ranks as the ninth-largest in school history.

Leading 35-19 at halftime, the Hawkeyes scored the first 21 points of the second half and out-scored Rider 29-2 in the first 10:30 of the second stanza.

Senior Crystal Smith paced Iowa, scoring a game-high 24 points and collecting five rebounds and four assists. Smith, who was named to the all-tournament team, equaled a school record for field goal percentage in a game, sinking all nine field goal attempts, including all four 3-pointers. She also drained both free throw attempts.

Iowa had five players in double figures for the first time this season. In addition to Smith, freshman Megan Skouby netted 11, while senior Tiffany Reedy, freshman Nicole VanderPol and senior Stacy Schlapkohl all contributed 10 points. The 10 points by VanderPol is a career high. Additionally, senior Morgan Kasperek led all rebounders for the first time in her career with six boards.

The Hawkeyes shot the ball extremely well, converting a season-best 63.2 percent (36-57) from the field and also drained 88.9 percent (8-9) from the charity stripe.

Nine Hawkeyes contributed to Iowa's season-high 30 assists. Sophomore Abby Emmert dished out a career-high seven assists, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter collected five.

Iowa was on fire in the second half, making its first six field goal attempts, including three-straight triples by Smith. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 68.8 percent (22-32), including 70.0 percent (7-10) from 3-point range, in the second period.

Rider was led by Monica Welborn, who netted 13 points. Iowa's defense limited the Broncs to only 24.5 percent (13-53) from the field for the game.

Game 6

Iowa 79, Vermont

Dec. 3, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Crystal Smith scored 26 points to lead Iowa to a 79-57 victory over Vermont in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge, setting up a sentimental title game against No. 6 Rutgers.

For the first time since leaving Iowa in 1995, Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer will coach against the Hawkeyes, a program she turned into a national powerhouse during her 12-year tenure in Iowa City.

After taking the Iowa job in 1983, Stringer won a school-best 269 games, guided the Hawkeyes to six Big Ten titles and nine straight NCAA appearances before leaving to take the job at Rutgers.

The Scarlet Knights advanced to the championship game by beating San Jose State 76-64, behind 26 points from all-American guard Cappie Pondexter.

But it was Smith who ensured Iowa a spot in the marquee matchup.

Five minutes into the second half, a fast-break layup by Vermont's Alexis Castro made the score 44-40, the closest margin since the game's opening minutes.

Then Smith took charge, scoring 10 points over the next nine minutes in a 20-10 Iowa run.

A 3-pointer by Wendy Ausdemore put Iowa up 47-40 at the 13:44 mark, and Smith's 3-pointer with 7:56 left stretched the lead to 15 points and put the game out of reach. Smith, last week's Big Ten Player of the Week, also had three assists and six steals.

Stacy Schlapkohl added 12 points and seven rebounds for Iowa. The Hawkeyes also shot 46 percent and won praise from coach Lisa Bluder, who stressed all week the need to focus first on Vermont.

Ashleigh Cuncic led the Catamounts (2-4) with 17 points. Sy Janousek added 11 points, but Vermont shot just 32 percent and was outscored in the paint 24-8.

#6 Rutgers 57, Iowa 51

Dec. 4, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Cappie Pondexter scored 22 points and No. 6 Rutgers held off Iowa 57-51 to win the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge.

The victory also capped an emotional weekend for Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer, who coached against her old team for the first time since leaving Iowa City to take the Scarlet Knights' job.

Pondexter, who scored 26 points in the tournament's opening round, was voted MVP. But Rutgers also relied on its size and strength inside to wear down the Hawkeyes inside and cut short each rally.

Seven of Pondexter's points came at key moments late in the game.

After Iowa pulled to 46-44 on a short jumper by Krista VandeVenter, Pondexter answered with a long 3-pointer.

In the final minute with Rutgers leading by four, Pondexter milked the clock on all alone on the perimeter before driving an Iowa defender into the paint and swishing a short jumper.

Five times Iowa crept within two points in the second half, only to see Rutgers, which never trailed in the game, respond and stretch their lead by controlling the boards.

Led by Mariota Theodoris' 16 rebounds, Rutgers outrebounded Iowa 40-31, including 17-8 on the offensive end, outscored Iowa 28-16 on points in the paint and blocked six shots.

Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 17 points. VandeVenter topped her season best with 15 points and had six rebounds. The Hawkeyes shot 38 percent from the floor and 79 percent from the free throw line.

Stringer was cheered loudly as she strolled out of the locker room and along the sidelines, shaking hands with friends and university officials, during warmups and pregame introductions.

Dec. 8, 2005, Hilton Coliseum

AMES, IA -- The Iowa State women's basketball team defeated Iowa 77-61 at Hilton Coliseum. The loss was Iowa's fifth-straight in Ames and increases Iowa State's lead in the Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series to 7-2.

Iowa freshman Megan Skouby made a 10-foot jumper with 7:00 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes a 25-24 advantage. The Cyclones responded in a big way, scoring 13 of the final 15 points to take a 37-27 lead into half. Iowa only made only three of its last 18 field goal attempts in the first period.

Iowa State opened the second half on an 8-0 run to stretch its lead to 18 (45-27). The Cyclones led 51-33 with 15:32 left before Iowa went on a 15-3 run to trim the deficit to six (54-48) with 9:51 remaining, but that was as close as the Hawkeyes would get.

Iowa State played only six players. All five starters scored double figures, including junior guard Lyndsey Medders, who posted game highs in points (20) and assists (14). Three Cyclones pulled down double digit rebounds (Brittany Wilkins, 13; Nicky Wieben, 12; Megan Ronhovde, 11).

Iowa was led by Tiffany Reedy, Crystal Smith and Krista VandeVenter. Reedy scored 11 of her 13 points in the first 12:13 of the first half. The 13 points matched a season high. Smith also tallied 13 points and grabbed four rebounds. VandeVenter netted all 12 of her points in the second period. She also equaled a career high with 14 rebounds, collecting her fourth career double-double.

After failing to make any 3-pointers in its last game for the first time in 217 games, Iowa converted 7-23 (.304) from behind the arc.

All 16 Hawkeye bench points came from freshmen. Skouby scored eight points on 4-7 shooting from the field, while Kristi Smith contributed six points and Wendy Ausdemore added two. Ausdemore also corralled a season-high five rebounds.

Iowa 92, Drake 72

Dec. 18, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY -- Iowa returned to action after a 10-day layoff and cruised to a 92-72 victory over Drake in front of a season-high 5,556 fans at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa dominated the undersized Drake squad, out-scoring the Bulldogs 44-32 in the paint. Hawkeye post players Krista VandeVenter, Stacy Schlapkohl and Megan Skouby combined for 47 points and 17 rebounds. The trio shot at a 77.8 percent clip (21-27) from the floor and 83.3 percent (5-6) from the foul line.

Skouby netted a career-high 19 points (9-11 FG, 1-2 FT). Skouby scored 15 of her 19 points in the second half, as the freshman only played four minutes in the first half after being whistled for two quick fouls.

VandeVenter scored 10 of her 14 points in the first half. The sophomore also corralled seven rebounds, dished out four assists, blocked one shot and matched a career high with four steals.

Schlapkohl contributed 12 of her 14 points in the first half. The native of Durant, IA, also grabbed a career-high eight rebounds and collected two assists.

Receiving her first collegiate start today was freshman Kristi Smith. She directed the Hawkeye offense for 25 minutes, scoring four points, dishing out four assists and pulling down two rebounds. Iowa's other Smith, Crystal, added a game-high 21 points (10-14 FG) and also collected four assists and four steals.

Drake, who lost for the fifth time in six tries, was led by Jill Martin. Martin tallied 17 points and grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds.

Iowa started the game on fire, sinking 12 of its first 16 shots from the floor and claiming a 16-point advantage (28-12) by the second media timeout of the first period. Iowa went into the locker room with a comfortable 45-29 lead. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 60.6 percent (20-33) from the field in the first stanza.

The 92 points are the most yielded by a Drake team since the Bulldogs surrendered 90 against Iowa State on Dec. 5, 2001.

CEDAR FALLS, IA -- Hawkeye senior Crystal Smith poured in a game-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds as the Iowa Hawkeye women's basketball team downed the Northern Iowa Panthers for the 10th-straight time 65-54 at the UNI Dome.

Iowa had a nine-point halftime cushion, but Northern Iowa came out of the locker room on fire. The Panthers scored the first nine points of the second stanza to even the contest at 31 with 15:53 remaining. The Hawkeyes answered with a 12-4 run the next four minutes to rebuild their lead back to eight (43-35) with 11:20 left.

Northern Iowa continued to fight back and trimmed the Hawkeye advantage to six with 2:15 remaining, but back-to-back triples by Hawkeyes Tiffany Reedy and Abby Emmert helped seal Iowa's second-straight win over a Missouri Valley Conference opponent. Iowa converted 4-6 from the foul line the final minute to secure the 11-point victory.

Smith scored 13 of her 22 points in the first half, including netting Iowa's final first half points. The native of Haughton, IA, attempted and made Iowa's first 3-pointer of the game at the 15:40 mark of the second half to halt a 9-0 Northern Iowa scoring run. Smith has tallied 20 points or more five times already this season.

Northern Iowa limited Hawkeye starters Krista VandeVenter and Stacy Schlapkohl to a combined three points on 0-8 shooting from the field and 3-5 from the foul line. However, Iowa's bench stepped up to fill the scoring void as the Hawkeye reserves out-scored the Panthers 24-8. Freshman Megan Skouby scored eight, while freshman Wendy Ausdemore and sophomore Abby Emmert each added seven.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed seven of her 10 points in the second half and also corralled five rebounds.

IOWA CITY - Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter added 18 points and a career-high six steals en route to a 74-64 victory over Creighton at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was Iowa's third straight over the Bluejays.

The Iowa post players responded very well in Schlappkohl's absence, outscoring Creighton 36-22 in the paint. Skouby scored 12 of her 22 points in the first half, while VandeVenter scored 16 of her 18 points in the second period.

Indiana 65, Iowa 53

Dec. 28, 2005, Assembly Hall

BLOOMINGTON, IN - Iowa opened the Big Ten season with a 65-53 loss to Indiana at Assembly Hall. Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 14 points, while Krista VandeVenter grabbed eight rebounds in the loss.

After a back-and-forth first half, Indiana used a 14-0 run in the final 6:47 of the half to gain a 27-16 advantage. Wendy Ausdemore nailed a 3-pointer as time expired to cut the halftime deficit to 27-19. Ausdemore's triple was Iowa's first bucket in the half since the 7:05 minute mark.

Megan Skouby, who started her first career game at center, was whistled for two quick fouls in the first two minutes, spending the remaining 18 minutes of the period on the bench.

The Hoosiers opened up their biggest lead at 16 points with 13:53 left, using an 8-0 run capped by a 3-point play by Jenny DeMuth. Iowa cut the lead to six at the 7:28 mark with a 9-0 run, all of which were 3-point baskets. Lindsey Nyenhuis drained her first basket of the game and back-to-back treys by Smith cut the Hoosier lead to 43-36.

Indiana fought back and gained a nine point lead with 1:58 left, but a 3-point play by Smith cut the Hoosier advantage to six once again. This was the closest Iowa would come to gaining a lead as the Hoosiers sunk six free throws down the stretch to secure the victory.

Skouby recorded 10 points and two blocks in only 19 minutes of action, while VandeVenter played the entire 40 minutes. Kristi Smith added a career-high six assists for the Hawkeyes.

Indiana was led by Cyndi Valentin who scored a game-high 20 points. Jenny DeMuth notched a double-double 13 points and 10 rebounds, while Angela Hawkins scored 12 for the Hoosiers. Indiana outscored Iowa 28-18 in the paint, while outrebounding the Hawkeyes 41-31.

Iowa 84, Illinois 65

Jan. 1, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY -- A big second half lifted Iowa to an 84-65 victory over Illinois inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win is Iowa's fifth-straight over the Fighting Illini. A crowd of 3,439 watched Iowa's first-ever New Year's Day game.

Crystal Smith ignited the Hawkeye offense, scoring a game-high 27 points on 7-13 shooting from the field and a perfect 11-11 from the foul line. Smith tallied 19 of her 27 points in the second period. Smith also collected seven rebounds, four steals and two assists.

Smith's perfect 11-11 shooting performance from the charity stripe tied a school record for free throw percentage in a game.

Krista VandeVenter had another big game for the Hawkeyes, scoring all 13 of her points in the second period and also posting game bests in rebounding (7) and assists (6). The six assists matched a career high for VandeVenter. Nicole VanderPol added four points and four rebounds.

Illinois started the game on fire, draining seven of its 12 field goal attempts in the first six minutes to grab a commanding 17-2 advantage. The Hawkeyes started the contest ice-cold from the floor, missing six of their first seven field goal attempts. Iowa regained its shooting touch later in the half, as a Wendy Ausdemore 3-pointer capped an Iowa 11-0 run to tie the contest at 23 with 3:59 left. Ausdemore netted 11 of her career-high 14 points in the first stanza.

Iowa silenced Illinois starter Janelle Hughes for the first 17 minutes, but the senior scored the Fighting Illini's final nine points on four-straight possessions of the half to propel Illinois to a six-point (34-29) halftime advantage.

Crystal Smith sparked a 17-2 scoring run in the second half to help give the Hawkeyes a 55-45 advantage with 11:30 left in the game. Smith scored nine of the 17 points during the scoring run.

Illinois' Erin Wigley and Hughes each scored 20 points to lead Illinois. Audrey Tabon pulled down seven rebounds to lead the Fighting Illini.

Iowa 77, Michigan 63

Jan. 5, 2006, Crisler Arena

ANN ARBOR, MI -- Four Hawkeye starters scored in double figures as the Iowa Hawkeyes won its sixth-straight game over Michigan 77-63 inside Crisler Arena.

Megan Skouby had a career night as the 6-6 center posted career bests in points (20), rebounds (8) and blocks (5). Krista VandeVenter, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith each contributed 13 points en route to victory. In addition to her 13 points, Smith collected seven rebounds, four steals and a career-high nine assists.

Iowa's frontcourt duo of Megan Skouby (7) and Krista VandeVenter (7) scored 15 of Iowa's 17 points as the Hawkeyes jumped out to a 17-10 advantage in the first eight minutes and would never look back.

The Hawkeyes built their lead to 10 by half (42-32), but Michigan opened the second period on a 10-3 run to trim Iowa's advantage to three (45-42) with 16:46 left. Iowa's lead swelled back to nine (53-44) after an 8-2 run with 11:20 remaining. The Wolverines tried to mount one last comeback in the final minutes, but Iowa drained three 3-pointers in the final three minutes to secure the victory.

Iowa's aggressive play generated 11 more free throw attempts than Michigan. The Hawkeyes made 16-20 (.800) from the foul line, while the Wolverines only made nine trips to the charity stripe - making eight (.889).

Iowa only attempted two triples in the first half - missing both, but found its shooting touch in the second stanza, sinking 5-9.

Michigan were led by reserves Ta'Shia Walker and Katie Dierdorf. Walker netted a game-high 24 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Dierdorf added 10 points and four rebounds.

Through 14 games, Iowa has not allowed an opponent to shoot 50 percent or better from the field or 40 percent or better from 3-point range. Iowa's defense held the Wolverines to 37.9 percent (25-66) from the field and 35.7 percent (5-14) from behind the arc. Iowa converted 49.1 percent (28-57) of its field goals, including 45.5 percent (5-11) from 3-point range.

Iowa 75, #9 Michigan State 64

Jan. 9, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Iowa scored 48 second half points en route to a 75-64 triumph over ninth-rated Michigan State inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was the Hawkeyes' first over a top-ten ranked team since defeating ninth-ranked Purdue 90-75 on Jan. 6, 2002 in Iowa City.

Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 27 points, while Crystal Smith added 18 and VandeVenter 17 to lead the Hawkeyes. Skouby and Smith also pulled down eight rebounds each, while VandeVenter grabbed a team-best nine.

Skouby dominated the Spartans' zone defense with turnaround jumpers and hook shots, and finished 12-20 from the field. Her point total was the most by an Iowa freshman since Tiffany Gooden scored 36 in the 1994-95 season.

Iowa forced 21 turnovers and held Michigan State to 4-16 on 3-point attempts. The Hawkeyes turned the 21 Spartan miscues into 17 points.

Michigan State held a 29-27 halftime lead before Skouby sparked the Hawkeyes with 19 second-half points on 6-6 shooting.

The Hawkeyes had a 10-0 run early in the second half to build a 46-36 lead. The Spartans shaved Iowa's advantage to one (61-60) with 3:13, but Iowa closed the contest on a 14-3 run.

Liz Shimek led Michigan State with 16 points and 15 rebounds. Lindsay Bowen added 13 points.

Crystal Smith was scoreless through the first 12 minutes before helping Skouby in a second-half scoring barrage. Smith hit a jumper with 7:05 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes their first lead at 20-19. She hit two others during a 10-2 run that padded Iowa's lead to 22-19.

Iowa's starters combined for 72 of its 75 points. The Hawkeyes outscored the Spartans 15-4 at the foul line. Michigan State attempted an Iowa opponent season-low six free throws, just one game after converting 30-34 against nationally-ranked Rutgers.
