2016 NCAA REGIONAL

THIS WEEK

The 19th-ranked University of Iowa women's gymnastics team is set to compete in and host NCAA Regional competition inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena on April 2. The GymHawks are one of 36 teams nationally and one of eight Big Ten teams to qualify for regional competition at one of six different sites.

No. 19 Iowa will host No. 1 Oklahoma, No. 12 Nebraska, No. 13 Arkansas, No. 30 Kent State, and No. 35 Central Michigan, in the Iowa City, Iowa regional. The Hawkeyes also welcome individual competitors from Western Michigan, Centenary, and Ball State. Competition will begin at 4 p.m. (CT).

MEET COVERAGE

- Saturday's meet will be streamed live on Hawkeye All-Access free of charge. There will be four separate streams with one stream per event.

IOWA CITY NCAA REGIONAL TICKETS

Fans can purchase tickets by calling the University of Iowa Athletics Ticket Office at (319) 335-9323 between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (CT). Fans can also make their purchase at hawkeyesports.com/tickets or at NCAA.com/tickets. Tickets may be purchased in advance, or on the day of the meet at the north, west, and south entrances of Carver-Hawkeye Arena beginning at 3 p.m.

NCAA REGIONAL FORMAT

Six teams, four all-around competitors (who are not on a qualifying team), and two individual event specialists per event -- with a minimum Regional Qualifying Score (RQS) of 9.4 -- were named to each of the six predetermined host sites.

The top 18 teams are seeded nationally based on RQS and placed into the bracket. Teams 19-36 are organized into three pods (19-24, 25-30 and 31-36) and placed geographically at one of the six sites, beginning with teams 19-24, followed by teams 25-30, and finally teams 31-36. Seeding determined at the time of regional selections will be maintained throughout the championships. All-around competitors and event specialists are assigned to their respective geographic region.

IOWA'S NCAA POSTSEASON HISTORY

- Iowa has had representation at every NCAA Regionals since 2005 -- with three seasons of individual representation and nine team appearances.
- Libby has led Iowa to nine NCAA Regional appearances in 12 seasons, including this season.
- Last year, the GymHawks saw postseason action at the Auburn, Alabama, Regional where they tallied a 194.475 to secure a fifth place finish.
- Five GymHawks placed in the top 15 on individual events. Mollie Drenth posted a score of 9.825 on bars, good enough to secure a ninth place finish. Angel Metcalf and Johanny Sotillo both posted a 9.800 to tie for 12th on bars.

IOWA'S ROTATION SCHEDULE

Iowa will start with a bye then rotate to floor, vault, bars and beam, with another bye before bars.

The majority of GymHawks are underclassmen, with seven freshmen, six sophomores, six juniors, and three seniors on the roster.

NCAA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

The top two teams and the top two all-around competitors (who are not on an advancing team) from each regional will receive an automatic berth to the national championships in Fort Worth, Texas, April 15-16. The event is hosted by Texas Women's University and the Knight Eady Sports Group. The top two teams from the Iowa City, Salt Lake City, and Tuscaloosa regionals will compete in one of the semifinals, and the top two teams from the Minneapolis, Ann Arbor, and Athens regionals will compete in the other semifinal.

In addition, the event winners at each regional site will advance to the national championships (in that event only) if they are not part of a qualifying team or an all-around qualifier.

IN THE RANKINGS

Iowa is ranked No. 19 nationally with a Regional Qualifying Score of 196.330, marking the program's first top 20 ranking since 2011. There are 82 women's gymnastics teams in the nation. The GymHawks rank 17th nationally on bars (49.160 RQS) and vault (49.095), 23rd on beam (49.095), and 28th on floor (49.115).

Individually, junior Mollie Drenth ranks 22nd nationally in the all-around (39.340 RQS), while junior Angel Metcalf ranks 32nd (39.260) out of 119 gymnasts. For single events, Drenth ranks 17th on beam (9.895), Metcalf ranks 44th on beam (9.870), and senior Alie Glover ranks 52nd on floor (9.880). There are over 485 gymnasts ranked individually on each event.

REGIONAL QUALIFYING SCORE

Iowa is ranked No. 19 nationally with a Regional Qualifying Score of 196.330. RQS is determined by the six highest scores of the season -- at least three of which must be from away meets. The highest score is dropped, and the remaining five scores are averaged.

LAST TIME OUT

The Hawkeyes posted a 195.875 to lead the morning session and tie for fifth place overall at the Big Ten Championships on March 19. Despite tough competition, six GymHawks tallied a total of nine top 20 finishes. Metcalf led the way for the GymHawks, finishing ninth in the all-around (39.225), 12th on beam (9.825), and 20th on bars (9.825). Drenth earned second place for her effort on vault (9.925) and tied her teammate for 20th on bars (9.825).

Michigan captured the Big Ten title with a score of 197.125. Nebraska finished runner-up (196.900), followed by Minnesota (196.575), Penn State (196.150), Iowa (195.875), Ohio State (195.875), Michigan State (195.475), Illinois (195.175), Rutgers (194.775), and Maryland (194.025).

METCALF, DRENTH NAMED TO ALL-CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

Three GymHawks received individual conference awards following the 2016 Big Ten Championship. Three GymHawks received individual conference awards. Juniors Mollie Drenth and Angel Metcalf were all named to the All-Championship Team for the second consecutive year, while sophomore Melissa Zurawski collected the Sportsmanship Award.

6 GYMHAWS NAMED WINTER ACADEMIC ALL-BIG TEN

Six University of Iowa gymnasts have been named to the 2016 Big Ten Winter Academic All-Conference team. The list includes Opua Calucag (health and human physiology), Alie Glover (psychology), Megan Ruzicka (actuarial science), Lanie Snyder (English), Johanny Sotillo (sports studies), and Nikki Youd (human physiology). The six women's gymnastics recipients are the most since 2012.

To be eligible for Academic All-Big Ten recognition, student-athletes must be letterwinners and be in at least their second academic year at the institution. They must also carry a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better.

SCOUTING THE SOONERS

- Oklahoma claimed its fifth straight Big 12 title, after earning a conference meet record score of 198.050 on March 19.
- The Sooners own a No. 1 national ranking with a RQS of 197.920.
- Oklahoma is ranked first on bars (49.575 RQS), floor (49.575) and beam (49.445), and third on vault (49.415).
- Seven Sooners -- Natalie Brown (First Team BB), Chayse Capps (First Team AA, UB, BB), AJ Jackson (First Team V), Keeley Kmieciak (First Team UB, Second Team AA), Nicole Lehrmann (Second Team UB), Haley Scaman (First Team FX), and McKenzie Wofford (First Team UB) -- earned a total of 10 regular season All-America honors (eight First Team and two Second Team) from the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches/Women.
- Oklahoma is led by head coach K.J. Kindler, who is in her 10th season.

SCOUTING THE CORNHUSKERS

- Nebraska took second (196.900) at the Big Ten Championships on March 12.
- The Cornhuskers rank 12th nationally with a RQS of 196.635.
- Nebraska is ranked eighth on beam (49.255 RQS), 14th on floor (49.260) and bars (49.180), and 16th on vault (49.105).
- Husker senior Hollie Blanske earned a regular season All-America honor from the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches/Women (NACGC/W). Blanske earned second-team honors in the all-around, completing the regular season with a RQS of a 39.420.
- The Cornhuskers are led by head coach Dan Kendig, who is in his 23rd season.

SCOUTING THE RAZORBACKS

- Arkansas scored a 196.500 to finish sixth at the SEC Championship on March 19.
- The Razorbacks are ranked 13th nationally with a RQS of 196.575.
- Arkansas is ranked 11th on vault (49.160 RQS), 12th on floor (49.280), 14th on beam (49.195), and 16th on bars (49.165).
- Razorback junior Amanda Wellick is ranked in the top 25 on two events. She owns a No. 12 ranking on vault (9.900 RQS) and a No. 19 ranking in the all-around (39.390).
- Arkansas is led by head coach Mark Cook, who is in his 13th season.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN FLASHES

- Kent State took fifth (195.325) at the MAC Tournament Championship on March 19.
- The Golden Flashes rank 30th nationally with a RQS of 195.595.
- Kent State is ranked 20th on floor (49.205 RQS), 35th on bars (48.940) and beam (48.915), and 47th on vault (48.675).
- Golden Flash gymnasts Rachel Stypinski and Jordan Hardison were named 2016 All-Mid-American Conference. Stypinski was named first team All-MAC for the second year in a row after earning 14 victories in MAC competitions this season. Hardison was named second team All-MAC after finishing the season with three victories on floor and the second highest floor RQS in the conference at 9.880.
- Kent State is led by head coach Brice Biggin, who is in his 25th season.

SCOUTING THE CHIPPEWAS

- Central Michigan took fourth (195.600) at the Mid-American Conference Championships on March 19.
- The Chippewas rank 35th nationally with a RQS of 195.440.
- Central Michigan is ranked 24th on bars (49.045 RQS), 33rd on beam (48.945), and 40th on vault (48.795) and floor (48.995).
- Three Central Michigan gymnasts -- Taylor Bolender, Katy Clements, and Kasey Janowicz -- were named to the All-Mid-American Conference second team.
- The Chippewas are led by head coach Jerry Reighard, who is in his 29th season.

HAWKEYE NEWCOMERS

This season, the Hawkeyes welcomed eight newcomers -- junior transfer Savannah Borman and freshmen Misty-Jade Carlson, Nicole Chow, Sydney Hogan, Maria Ortiz, Rose Piorkowski, Lexy Wadsworth and Tessa Walsh -- to the 2016 squad.

3 GYMHAWKS EARN ALL-BIG TEN HONORS

- Senior Alie Glover and juniors Angel Metcalf and Mollie Drenth of the University of Iowa women's gymnastics team earned All-Big Ten honors, the conference office announced March 14. Drenth earned first team accolades, while Glover and Metcalf were both named to the second team. It is the first time Iowa has had three women's gymnasts recognized in the same season since 2011.
- Twenty-nine gymnasts were honored -- 16 to the conference's first team and 13 to the second team. All-Big Ten selections are determined by regional qualifying scores.
- Drenth ranks third in the conference on beam (9.895 RQS), fifth in the all-around (39.340), ninth on vault (9.845), 18th on bars (9.835), and 22nd on floor (9.840).
- Metcalf ranks 10th in the conference on beam (9.870 RQS), 11th in the all-around (39.235), 12th on bars (9.845), 22nd on vault (9.810), and 31st on floor (9.825).
- Glover ranks ninth in the conference on floor (9.880 RQS), 23rd on beam (9.830), and 26 on vault (9.785).

DRENTH NAMED STUDENT-ATHLETE OF THE MONTH

University of Iowa's Student-Athlete Academic Services recognized junior Mollie Drenth as February's female Student-Athlete of the Month. Voted on by their peers, this honor recognizes those student-athletes who have excelled not only in their sport, but in the classroom as well.

Undefeated in Big Ten competition this season with eight individual titles, Drenth ranks 12th nationally and third in the conference on beam. On Feb. 6, Drenth recorded career bests in vault (9.850), beam (9.925), and all-around (39.475) to lead Iowa to its first win over Nebraska in 17 years. Drenth's scores on beam and in all-around are the best of any Hawkeye in 2016. Drenth, a native of Riverview, Florida, is majoring in health and human physiology and has participated in numerous volunteer service events.

DRENTH LEADS THE GYMHAWKS AGAINST NEBRASKA

- The GymHawks earned a season-high team score to defeat No. 14 Nebraska, 196.650- 196.350, inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena on Feb. 6. The win marks the first time in 17 years that the Hawkeyes have topped the Cornhuskers.
- Drenth, a preseason Big Ten Gymnast to Watch, finished at the top of the podium on beam (9.925) and all-around (39.475), and finished second on vault (9.850) and bars (9.850) against No. 14 Nebraska.
- The junior took the all-around title for the third consecutive meet and the fifth time this season with a career-high score of 39.475. Her score earned her a No. 10-ranking in the Iowa record books for highest individual performance in the all-around.
- The Riverview, Florida, native set the pace for Iowa once again on beam, tallying a career-high 9.925 to earn first place overall. The junior's score earned her a No. 3-ranking in the Iowa record books for highest individual performance on beam.

UPSET IN CHAMPAIGN

Eighteen top five finishes lifted Iowa over 21st-ranked Illinois, 196.275-195.125, inside Huff Hall on Feb. 13. The win marks the Hawkeyes' third upset victory of the season and the first time they have topped Illinois in Champaign, Illinois, since Jan. 24, 2009.

Nine GymHawks earned a total of 18 top five finishes to highlight the competition. Leading the pack was junior Mollie Drenth who finished at the top of the podium on beam (9.875) and all-around (39.300), third on vault (9.800), and fifth on bars (9.800) and floor (9.825). Drenth claimed the all-around title for the sixth consecutive meet.

DOWN GOES NO. 25

Fifteen season bests and a season high team score in every event helped the GymHawks upset 25th-ranked Ohio State, 196.375-195.025, on Jan. 23. The win marks the first time the Hawkeyes have topped Ohio State since February 6, 2010. The Hawkeyes' overall score is a season best for the team, replacing their previous high of 194.900 at Michigan State on Jan. 15.

Ten GymHawks earned a total of 15 season bests, while the team earned season high scores on vault (49.000), bars (49.175), beam (49.000), and floor (49.200) to highlight the competition. Senior Alie Glover paced the GymHawks with a trio of bests on vault (9.800), beam (9.825), and floor (9.900). Junior Angel Metcalf registered her own trio of bests on vault (9.775), beam (9.875), and floor (9.825).

GYMHAWKS MAKE HISTORY IN EAST LANSING

Thirteen top five finishes lifted the GymHawks over Michigan State, 194.900-192.575, inside the Jenison Field House on Jan. 15. The win marked the first time the Hawkeyes topped Michigan State in East Lansing since Jan. 7, 2011.

Six GymHawks earned a total of 13 top five finishes to highlight the competition. Leading the pack was junior Mollie Drenth who finished at the top of the podium on vault (9.775) and all-around (39.125), second on floor (9.800) and beam (9.750), and fourth on bars (9.800).

METCALF, DRENTH NAMED TO BIG WATCH LIST

Angel Metcalf and Mollie Drenth were recognized on the 2016 Big Ten Gymnasts to Watch List released on Dec. 10. Metcalf, who was also featured on the 2014 Big Ten Watch List, registered Iowa's individual season bests on beam (9.900 at No. 20 Ohio State, Jan. 24) and in the all-around (39.400 vs. No. 15 Illinois, Feb. 14) last season. She earned fourth on floor (9.900), 19th in the all-around (38.575) and 26th place on bars (9.825) at the Big Ten Championships on March 21, and was named to the All-Championship Team for her efforts. She ended the season at the NCAA Auburn Regional on April 4 with a fifth place finish in the all-around (39.175) and 12th place result on bars (9.800).

Drenth, a 2015 Big Ten All-Championship Team member, competed in every meet last season and owns Iowa's individual season best on uneven bars (9.925). Drenth earned the first Big Ten Event Specialist of the Week accolade of her career on March 16 after capturing an event title on bars (9.925) at the Big Five meet. Last season, the junior earned a second place finish on beam (9.900) and a ninth place finish on bars (9.775) at the Big Ten Championships on March 21. Drenth ended the season at the NCAA Auburn Regional where she earned ninth on bars (9.825) and eighth in the all-around (39.050).

HEAD COACH LARISSA LIBBY

Larissa Libby enters her 12th year as head coach, and 16th year overall, at the University of Iowa in 2015-16. In 2015, the GymHawks were selected for NCAA Regional competition, marking the program's seventh postseason berth in the last eight years. Five GymHawks placed in the top 15 for individual events, leading Iowa to a fifth place regional finish and a score of 194.475. Libby coached the GymHawks to a season high score of 196.500 at the Big Ten Championships -- the team's best championship team result since 2010. Iowa's performance also marked the highest team score for the program at the Big Ten Championships since March 20, 2004.

Under Libby, Iowa was ranked in the top 25 for six consecutive weeks during the 2015 season. The GymHawks ended the season ranked No. 23 nationally, marking the program's first Top 25 ranking since 2012. Libby led sophomores Mollie Drenth and Angel Metcalf, junior Alie Glover, and senior Sydney Hoerr, to earn spots on the All-Championship Team. Libby is also responsible for the only other gymnast named to the All-Championship Team (Emma Stevenson, 2012) in program history.
