IOWA IN THE ATTENDANCE GAME

Since Head Coach **Sharon Dingman**'s arrival prior to 2008 season, Hawkeye fans have been flocking to Carver-Hawkeye Arena in record numbers. Four of the top-five all-time attendance figures have been set during the Dingman era. The Hawkeyes set a school attendance record Nov. 7 vs. Penn State when 2,802 fans witnessed the Hawkeyes host the nation's top-ranked team. The record announced crowd broke the old mark of 2,191 set against Wisconsin on Oct. 13, 2007.

Head Coach Sharon Dingman on Hawkeye fans: "The support we continue to have is greatly appreciated. Hawkeye fans appreciate hard work and disciplined effort and it is our goal to give them that every time we take the court."

HAWKEYES DIG DEFENSE

lowa ranks third the Big Ten averaging 15.16 digs per set. Senior libero **Christina Meister** ranks second in the Big Ten with 4.42 digs per set. Since 1990, only three Hawkeyes have averaged more than four digs per set through an entire season: Pam Kavadas, 5.22 ('04); Emily Hiza, 4.74 ('06) and 4.52 ('07); Janet Moylan, 4.63 ('90).

HUFFMAN AND SCHIPPER BALANCE HAWKEYES

Senior OH **Megan Schipper** and junior OH **Aimee Huffman** have kept conference defenses guessing in 2009. Attacking from opposite ends of the net, Schipper and Huffman have totaled 118 and 117 kills, respectively, in Big Ten play. This season, Schipper leads Iowa with 269 total kills while Huffman has amassed a career-high 233.

SCHIPPER CONTINUES HER CLIMB

Senior Megan Schipper currently ranks 13th on Iowa's all-time list with 1,112 career kills. She needs nine kills to pass Jenny Rees (1,120) for 12th all-time. On October 23rd, the Hawkeye captain was honored for becoming the 16th player in program history to record 1,000 career kills. The Aplington, IA, native passed the elusive number in Iowa's 3-1 win at Wisconsin (9/23). She needs 31 kills in Iowa's six remaining games to reach the 300-kill mark for the third straight season. In 2007, she led the Hawkeyes with 309 kills as a sophomore. She tallied a career-high 345 kills in 2008, the second-highest total on the team (Catherine Smale, 380). This season, Schipper leads Iowa with 269 kills (3.02 kills per set).

KRIEGER KITTLE REACHES CENTURY MARK

Freshman **Emma Krieger Kittle** reached the 100-kill plateau Oct. 17 at Purdue. The freshman has totaled 138 kills this season and averages 2.08 kills per set in conference play, third best among Hawkeyes. Other current Hawkeyes to record at least 100 kills as freshmen include **Megan Schipper** (189, '06), **Aimee Huffman** (192, '07) and **Megan Eskew** (163, '07).

SCHIPPER AMONG ALL-TIME LEADERS

Senior **Megan Schipper** is the 11th player in program history to amass 1,000 career kills and 200 career blocks. Iowa's senior captain recorded block No. 200 in Iowa's five-set loss to Michigan (10/9). She picked up her 1,000th career kill in Iowa's 3-1 win at Wisconsin (9/23).

Head Coach Sharon Dingman



Sharon Dingman was hired as the eighth coach in Iowa volleyball history March 21, 2008.

The second-year head Hawkeye owns a career record of 360-245 (18 years) after leading Iowa to its most successful campaign in eight seasons in 2008. The Hawkeyes' 14 overall victories and six conference wins were the most by an Iowa Volleyball team

since 2000.

Dingman also reached a personal milestone in her inagural Hawkeye season, recording career victory No. 350 November 14 in a five-set victory over Northwestern.

Iowa re-established a home-court advantage in Dingman's first season, posting its first winning season at North Carver since 1998 and setting a program attendance record.

Dingman came to lowa after serving as head coach at Illinois State from 2000-07, where she compiled a 147-98 record. In 2007, Dingman led the Redbirds to their first at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament since 1997. Illinois State reached the championship match of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and finished with a 21-12 overall record.

Illinois State produced winning seasons in seven of the eight seasons under Dingman and never finished lower than fifth in the Missouri Valley Conference. Dingman produced 21 all-Missouri Valley Conference selections, including Player of the Year, Libero of the Year and two Freshman of the Year honorees.

Redbird teams under Dingman were also strong in the classroom. Eleven players were named to the league's scholar-athlete squad in her eight seasons. In 2004, four volleyball student-athletes earned perfect 4.00 grade-point-averages and the team recorded a 3.32 GPA.

Dingman started her head coaching career in 1991 at Auburn, where she led the Tigers to a 22-13 record in her only season at the helm. Her 1991 squad become the first Auburn volleyball tem to receive votes in the national poll and Auburn's fourth place finish in the SEC that season marked the highest finish ever for Auburn at the time.

She then moved to Butler in 1992, where she served as head coach for eight seasons. Dingman led the Bulldogs to four 20 win seasons and three postseason tournaments, including an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1997 after capturing the Midwestern Collegiate Conference title. She was named MCC Coach of the Year in 1997 after compiling a 28-7 record.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Dingman spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at three Division I programs. After one season at Northern Michigan (1984), she assisted at Texas Tech for three seasons (1985-87). Dingman then spent three seasons at Kentucky (1988-90) and helped the Wildcats to an SEC Championship in 1988 along with three-straight regional finals appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

WISCONSIN

The Badgers are led by 11th-year Head Coach Pete Waite and senior OH Brittney Dolgner, a 2007 second-team all-American. The Hawkeyes trail the all-time series 40-19-1. The teams split the season series a year ago, with each team defending its own home floor. Iowa's 3-0 win over the Badgers in the 2008 Big Ten opener snapped the Hawkeyes' 26-match losing streak to Wisconsin. Iowa topped the Badgers, 3-1, in the 2009 Big Ten opener in Wisconsin (Sept. 23). The Hawkeyes have not defeated the Badgers on consecutive occasions since sweeping the season series in 1994.

MINNESOTA

Ranked 14th nationally by the AVCA Coaches Poll, the Golden Gophers are led by 14-year Head Coach Mike Hebert and MB Lauren Gibbemeyer. The junior leads Minnesota with 275 kills and 120 blocks. The Gophers own a 28-game winning streak vs. Iowa and lead the all-time series, 54-12. Iowa's last win vs. Minnesota came in 1995, a 3-1 win in Iowa City.

KRIEGER KITTLE VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

Freshman **Emma Krieger Kittle** has picked up her play vs. ranked opponents this season. Iowa's outside hitter picked up career highs in digs (3) and total blocks (3) vs. eighth-ranked Illinois (10/23). The Iowa City native recorded a career-high 12 kills vs. 11th-ranked Iowa State (9/11) and has collected 52 of her 138 kills in Iowa's seven games vs. ranked opponents, averaging 2.1 kills per set.

HAWKEYE CAPTAINS

Senior outside hitter **Megan Schipper** and junior setter **Mara Hilgenberg** are lowa's team captains for the 2009 season. Schipper leads the Hawkeyes in kills (269) and service aces (26) and ranks second in digs (263). Hilgenberg leads the Hawkeyes with 863 assists and is a third generation Hawkeye captain. Her great-uncle Wally and her uncle Jim were football team captains in 1963 and 1977, respectively.

HIT IT AND WIN IT

The Hawkeyes are 11-0 when attacking at a higher percentage than their opponent this season. Conversely, lowa's opponent has hit a higher percentage in each of the Hawkeyes' 15 losses.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

Four Big Ten squads are ranked in the top 15 of the latest coaches poll, while the same four teams are ranked in the top 10 of the latest NCAA RPI report, leading all conferences. Penn State returns as the conference champion, winner of the last two NCAA Championships and ranked atop the 2009 AVCA Coaches Poll. Other Big Ten schools ranked in the top 25 include Illinois (5), Minnesota (13) and Michigan (14).

SECOND GENERATION

Mara Hilgenberg's father Jay and Emma Krieger Kittle's father Bruce played football together at Iowa from 1977-1980. Jay was a four-time letterwinner and went on to win Super Bowl XX with the 1985 Chicago Bears. Bruce used a redshirt in 1980 and came back as a team captain for Hayden Fry's 1981 Big Ten Championship team.

Sharon Dingman is in her second season as the head Hawkeye. She is joined by second-year assistant **Jason Allen** and newcomers **Ben Boldt** and **Curt Sivertsen**.

Allen is in his second season as a assistant coach at Iowa. Allen was also promoted to the team's recruiting coordinator following the 2008 season. Allen previously served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Sam Houston State University prior to serving as the 16U head coach for the Texas Tornados club program in 2007.

Boldt is in his first season as an assistant coach at Iowa. Boldt spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Alabama. Prior to joining Alabama, Boldt served as a staff assistant for five seasons at the University of Nebraska. In his final season, the Cornhuskers finished 33-1 en route to the 2006 NCAA Championship.

Sivertsen is in his first season at Iowa after having served the last two years as head coach of the men's and women's programs at Missouri Valley College.

Angie Boldt is in her second season as the Director of Volleyball Operations. She came to Iowa City in 2008 after serving as the Director of Volleyball Operations at Alabama for two seasons.
