The Setting • lowa (7-4, 0-0) opens its Big Ten schedule at Indiana (6-5, 0-0) Thursday. Tip-off is slated for 6:05 p.m. (CST) at Assembly Hall (17,357). The Hawkeyes are 4-1 in conference openers

Thursday's game features two of the Big Ten's premiere scorers in Iowa's Crystal Smith (20.2 ppg) and Indiana's Cyndi Valentin (18.4 ppg). Both have scored 20 points or more five times this season.

On the Radio • Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call the action for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the game on WHO 1040-AM in Des Moines, WMT 600-AM in Cedar Rapids and KXIC 800-AM in Iowa City.

On This Date • lowa boasts a 6-2 record in games played on December 29, winning its last six.

lowa History • lowa has played 890 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, lowa's record is 544-346 (.611). That includes a 267-125 (.681) mark in Big Ten games and a 243-59 (.805) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Third Hawkeye Suffers ACL Injury • For the third time in six months, lowa had a starter suffer a season-ending ACL injury. Sophomore center Stacy Schlapkohl sustained an ACL injury in the first half of lowa's 74-64 triumph over Creighton last Friday. Schlapkohl started lowa's first 11 contests, ranking fifth in team scoring (6.9) and third in rebounding (3.8) in 21.1 minutes per game. She scored double figures four times, including a season-high 14 vs. Drake on December 18.

Schlapkohl joins small forward Johanna Solverson and point guard Lindsay Richards as Hawkeyes who have suffered season-ending ACL injuries to their right knee.

Steady Improvement • Senior Crystal Smith averaged 1.1 points per game in 21 games her freshman year, followed by a 3.9 scoring average in 29 contests her sophomore season and 16.8 ppg her junior year. Smith currently averages 20.2 ppg through 11 games in 2005-06. The native of Haughton, LA, averaged 20.0 ppg, 3.0 apg and 2.0 rpg in two games against Indiana last year.

Scouting Indiana • Indiana has won three of its last four games entering Thursday's home contest against the Hawkeyes. The Hoosiers started the season with four-straight home games and then finished their non-conference schedule with six-of-seven away from Assembly Hall. Indiana is 2-3 in home games this year.

The Hoosiers are led by seniors Cyndi Valentin and Jenny DeMuth. Valentin ranks third in Big Ten scoring (18.4) and seventh in assists (3.73). DeMuth ranks second in team scoring (14.4) and steals (1.18) and first in rebounding (7.7). Indiana has only two serious 3-point threats, Nikki Smith (22-48, .458) and Valentin (13-42, .310), while the rest of the team has shot a combined 9-42 (.214). The Hoosiers boast a +6.4 rebounding margin, which ranks fourth in the league. Indiana also ranks second in free throw shooting (.758), but ranks last in turnover margin (-4.0), steals (6.27) and assists (11.18).

Indiana is coached by Sharon Versyp (104-56, .650), who is in his sixth year as a head coach and her first with the Hoosiers (6-5, .545). Versyp became Indiana's seventh head coach after coaching five years at Maine. She is a native of Mishawaka, IN, and graduated from Purdue University in 1988.

RPI Ratings • Iowa ranks No. 79, while Indiana ranks 51st in the RPI ratings published on Dec. 27 on www.collegerpi.com. The Hawkeyes also rank 83rd in strength of schedule, while the Hoosiers rank 18th. All four Iowa losses came to opponents with a current RPI of 66 or better.

All-Time Series Record • Thursday will be the 47th meeting between lowa and Indiana. The Hawkeyes hold a commanding 35-12 advantage in the series. Iowa has won 16 of the last 19 overall meetings. Iowa is 13-8 in games played in Bloomington, including winning three of the last four at Assembly Hall.

The Hawkeyes defeated the Hoosiers (62-51) in last season's conference opener at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa also downed Indiana (56-53) in the regular season finale at Assembly Hall.

Last Meeting • In their final Big Ten regular season game, the Hawkeyes defeated the Indiana Hoosiers, 56-53. Iowa used a clutch 9-0 run late in the second half to finish 19-8 overall. Additionally, for the first time in school history the Hawkeyes finish league play with an even 8-8 record.

Indiana went on a 10-2 run late in the first half to give them a 24-22 lead. The Hawkeyes responded with a Jamie Cavey layup and a 3-pointer by Jenna Armstrong with four seconds left in the half. Iowa led 27-24 at halftime.

In the second stanza, Crystal Smith and Tiffany Reedy combined to score 11 points in 6:50 to give Iowa a 39-35 lead. After an Indiana layup at the 5:53 mark, Smith nailed a triple from the deep corner to put the Hawkeyes up 44-42 and they never looked back.

Jamie Cavey recorded her fifth double-double, scoring 16 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. Cavey also added two assists, two blocks and two steals. Smith also scored 19 points and had four assists.

lowa out-scored the Hoosiers 8-0 at the charity stripe. The Hawkeyes attempted 12 more free throws than Indiana (13-1). In fact, the one free throw attempt by Indiana is an Iowa school record for fewest free throw attempts by an opponent in a single game.

Indiana was led by Jamie Gathing and Jamey Chapman. Gathing tallied 13 points, while Chapman posted a double-double with 12 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

The Hawkeyes made two less field goals than the Hoosiers, but still came away with the win. The last time an opponent made more field goals than lowa and still lost was February 15, 2004, also at Indiana (28-26).

Last Time Out • lowa freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter added 18 points and a career-high six steals en route to a 74-64 victory over Creighton last Friday at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was lowa's third straight over the Bluejays and the third straight over a Missouri Valley Conference opponent.

After Creighton jumped out to an early 7-1 lead to start the game Skouby drilled five straight jumpers to tie the contest at 13-13. Iowa took its first lead with 8:29 left in the first half after a layup from freshman Wendy Ausdemore, but the Bluejays regained the lead after a Kristi Woodard bucket and did not trail the rest of the half.

Creighton out-rebounded the Hawkeyes 19-16 in the first half and scored 11 second chance points off nine offensive rebounds.

lowa trimmed the Creighton lead to just two at the start the second half but Ally Thrall sank a 3-pointer with 17:18 left to increase the Bluejay lead to seven. The Hawkeyes responded with a 7-0 run to regain a 44-43 lead with 13:29 left.

After Creighton's Angie Janis hit a jumper to put the Bluejays up by three, VandeVenter swiped one of her six steals for a layup to give lowa a 50-49 lead with 9:48 left and the Hawkeyes never relinquished the lead. A 3-pointer by senior Tiffany Reedy gave lowa a 54-49 lead and a 3-point play by freshman

IOWA CAPTAINS

Iowa captains for the season are seniors Morgan Kasperek, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith.

Nicole VanderPol with 5:59 left gave the Hawkeyes a comfortable advantage. Four free throws by Ausdemore down the stretch sealed the win for Iowa. Ausdemore is now a perfect 12-12 from the foul line this year.

Starting center Stacy Schlapkohl suffered a season-ending ACL injury early in the first half. The lowa post players responded very well in Schlapkohl's absence, outscoring Creighton 36-22 in the paint. Skouby scored 12 of her 22 points in the first half, while VandeVenter scored 16 of her 18 points in the second period.

For the second game in a row lowa's bench played a big part in the win, outscoring Creighton 36-19.

Creighton was able to gain an advantage on the boards and out-rebounded lowa 36-30, including 16 offensive rebounds. Angie Janis led Creighton with 19 points, while Kristi Woodard grabbed nine rebounds.

Crystal Smith had 13 points for lowa, which marked the first time since the season opener vs. UW-Milwaukee she did not lead the team in scoring.

VandeVenter Feasts on Creighton • There's something about playing Creighton that brings the best out of sophomore Krista VandeVenter. Last season VandeVenter recorded her first career double, posting career highs in points (19), field goals made (8) and attempted (11) and rebounds (14). The native of Osseo, MN feasted on the Bluejays again last Friday. VandeVenter was one point from equaling a career high in scoring, netting 18 points thanks to new career bests in field goals made (9) and attempts (14). She also collected a career-high six steals, besting her previous best of four set last year at Minnesota.

DE-FENSE! • lowa's perimeter defense has been stellar through 11 games. The Hawkeyes rank first in Big Ten 3-point field goal defense (.253). Last season lowa ranked 10th in the league in 3-point field goal defense (.361).

Smith Ranks Second in Big Ten Scoring • Senior Crystal Smith ranks second in Big Ten scoring (20.9), trailing only Michigan State's Liz Shimek (21.7). Smith's 20.9 scoring average also ranks 17th nationally. Only three lowa players have finished a season averaging 20 points or more. Cindy Haugejorde averaged 21.0 ppg (23 games) in 1977-78 and 23.2 ppg (29 games) in 1979-80. Michelle Edwards averaged 20.0 ppg (31 games) in 1987-88, while Franthea Price averaged 21.2 ppg (29 games) in 1989-90. Smith has led lowa in scoring the last eight contests.

Smith's 46 points at Louisiana Tech are the most scored in a game by any player in the nation this season. San Diego's Michelle Augustavo ranks second, after netting 42 points vs. Clemson on Dec. 11.

Underclassmen Start For Hawkeyes • lowa's probable starting lineup for the Hawkeyes' conference opener at Indiana includes two freshmen (Kristi Smith and Megan Skouby) and one sophomore (Krista VandeVenter).

VandeVenter has started all 44 games as a Hawkeye, including all 11 this season. The power forward ranks third in team scoring (9.5) and first in rebounding (8.7).

Smith has started the last three games at point guard for lowa. The native of Thornton, CO ranks sixth in team scoring (6.2) and fourth in assists (27).

Skouby will start her first contest Thursday at Indiana. The 6-6 center ranks second in team scoring (10.4), first in blocks (18) and field goal percentage (.622) and fourth in rebounding (3.7).

lowa is one of three Big Ten teams with two or more freshmen starters. Michigan starts three, while lowa and Penn State start two.

Ausdemore Perfect • Freshman Wendy Ausdemore has started the season making her first 12 free throw attempts. Ausdemore was a perfect 6-6 from the charity stripe entering the Creighton game and then sank all six of her free throws against the Bluejays.

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her sixth season as head coach at the University of lowa and her 22nd season as a college head coach. Bluder, 44, has a career record of 459-205 (.691), including a 103-63 (.620) record at lowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is lowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to five post-season



tournaments (3 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and three upper division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became lowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. Last season lowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (8) and Emma (5) and one son, David (3).

Cleaning the Glass • Sophomore Krista VandeVenter ranks third in Big Ten rebounding (8.7) and fourth in defensive rebounding (5.82). The native of Osseo, MN, has led the Hawkeyes in rebounding seven times this season. She has pulled down double digit rebounds four times this year, including two of the last four contests.

VandeVenter shattered lowa's single season freshmen rebounding record last year, pulling down 252 boards (7.6 rpg).

Nyenhuis Returns • After missing lowa's first five games to a foot injury, freshman Lindsey Nyenhuis hit the court for her first taste of game action vs. Vermont on Dec. 3. The native of Grand Rapids, MI, played the last three minutes and grabbed one rebound.

Nyenhuis scored her first collegiate points when she netted six points on 2-3 shooting from behind the arc in Iowa's 20-point triumph over Drake on Dec. 18.

Skouby Quickly Climbing Freshman Chart • Megan Skouby has already rejected 18 shots. She is only five blocks from claiming second place on lowa's freshman single season blocking list. Skouby is currently tied with Toni Foster for third.

Freshmen Step Up • lowa's freshmen class averaged 25.5 ppg in nonconference action. Megan Skouby, Kristi Smith and Wendy Ausdemore lead the freshmen offensive attack. Skouby ranks second in team scoring (10.4) and fourth in rebounding (3.7), Smith ranks sixth in scoring (6.2) and fourth in assists (27), while Ausdemore ranks seventh in scoring (5.9). VanderPol was lowa's first power forward off the bench at Northern lowa and Drake and matched career highs in rebounds (4) and assists (1) and also rejected her first career shot vs. the Bulldogs. Her minutes will now increase due to the loss of center Stacy Schlapkohl.

Five Spot • Crystal Smith, who was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Nov. 28, broke or tied five school records during Thanksgiving week.

The senior broke school records for points (46) and free throws attempted (19) in a game and equaled school records in free throws made (15) and 3-pointers attempted (14) in lowa's 95-91 double overtime setback at Louisiana Tech on Nov. 22. The native of Haughton, LA, also matched the school record for field goal percentage (9-9, 1.000) in the Hawkeyes' 88-41 rout over Rider on Nov. 26.

In the three games, Smith averaged 28.3 points, 4.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.7 steals per game. She finished the week 26-of-55 (.473) from the field, 10-of-25 (.400) from the perimeter and 23-of-28 (.821) at the line.

Attendance Rankings • lowa ranks 18th nationally in the women's basketball attendance rankings released Dec. 19.

Steak Busters • For the first time in 217 games lowa, failed to make at least one 3-pointer when the Hawkeyes shot 0-6 from behind the arc vs. No. 6 Rutgers on Dec. 4. The 216-game streak spanned seven seasons and started on March 13, 1998.

Reedy Set Go • Senior Tiffany Reedy played in her 100th career game vs. Vermont on Dec. 3. The native of Dysart, IA, has had a great start to the 2005-06 campaign, averaging 7.3 ppg, 4.3 rpg and ranking third on the team in steals with 15. Reedy collected 14 thefts and averaged 3.9 ppg and 2.4 rpg in 33 contests last season. She is also well on her way to surpassing her high mark of 19 triples made in each of her first three seasons. Reedy has already drained 14 treys and is shooting at a 42.4 percent clip from behind the arc, good enough to rank fifth in the Big Ten.

All-Tournament Selections • Senior Crystal Smith and sophomore Krista VandeVenter were named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament team. Smith also garnered Odwalla Classic All-Tournament accolades for her efforts Nov. 25-26 in San Francisco, CA.

Century Club • Iowa Head Women's Basketball Coach Lisa Bluder reached another milestone on Dec. 3, as Bluder collected her 100th victory as Iowa Head Coach in Iowa's 79-57 triumph over Vermont on Dec. 3. Bluder, who is the second all-time winningest Iowa coach, boasts a 103-63 (.618) record in six years mentoring the Hawkeyes.

High Octane • lowa, who ranks second in Big Ten scoring offense, has scored 80 points or more in five of its first 11 games. The Hawkeyes are 4-1 when scoring 80 points or more.

lowa Quick Hitters • lowa ranks first in Big Ten 3-point field goal defense (.253). Michigan State ranks second, with its opponents shooting .284 from behind the arc.

lowa is 6-1 when leading at the half, 5-1 when limiting opponents to 59 points or less, 7-1 when having a higher field goal percentage and 5-0 when out-rebounding opponents.

lowa was whistled for a season-low 13 fouls and matched a season-low in 3-point field goal attempts (6) at Northern lowa.

lowa out-scored Northern Iowa and Creighton a combined 22-0 in fast break points, including 14-0 against the Bluejays.

Northern Iowa's Cassie Hager blocked six shots against Iowa becoming the first Hawkeye opponent player to reject five shots or more since Western Illinois' Zane Teilane blocked seven exactly a year to the date (Dec. 21, 2004).

Big Ten Rankings • lowa ranks first in field goal percentage (.480), 3-point field goal percentage defense (.253) and 3-point field goal percentage (.394), second in scoring offense (75.6), assists (18.0) and third in blocks (4.45).

Senior Crystal Smith ranks second in league scoring (20.2), seventh in 3-point field goals made (1.91), fifth in steals (2.27) and 13th in free throw percentage (.792). Freshman Megan Skouby ranks second in field goal percentage (.622) and third in blocked shots (1.64). Sophomore Krista VandeVenter ranks third in rebounding (8.7) and seventh in steals (2.18).

Making the List • lowa has recorded two victories by 40 points or more this season. The Hawkeyes posted a 40-point triumph (82-42) over UW-Milwaukee on Nov. 20. The 40-point win ranks as the 15th-largest margin of victory in school history. lowa registered a 47-point victory (88-41) over Rider on Nov. 26. The 47-point win ranks as the ninth-largest margin of victory in lowa history.

lowa has posted six wins of 40 points or more under Coach Bluder (48 – UT-Pan American, 2001; 47 -- Rider; 45 – Western Illinois, 2000; 43 – Creighton, 2002; 40 – Northwestern, 2001; 40 -- UW-Milwaukee, 2005).

More on Smith's Records • Crystal Smith's 46 points bested Cindy Haugejorde's 44-point effort vs. Luther College on Jan. 12, 1977. In addition, the 46 points is the second-most scored in a single game in Big Ten history. Illinois' Kendra Gantt and Penn State's Kelly Mazzante both netted 49 points. The 46 points are the most ever scored by a Louisiana Tech opponent, besting the previous record of 43 points scored by USCs Cheryl Miller, and was one point from a Thomas Assembly Center record.

Smith's 19 free throws attempted topped the previous school record held by Nadine Domond and Amy Herrig. Domond attempted 16 foul shots vs. UCSB on Nov. 25, 1995, while Herrig attempted 16 free throws vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 19 free throws attempted ranks eighth in Big Ten annals with five others.

Smith's 15 free throws made equaled Amy Herrig's school record of 15 established vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 15 foul shots made ranks seventh in league history with eight others.

Smith's 14 three-pointers attempted equals the school record previously set by Lindsey Meder twice before. Meder attempted 14 at Colorado on Dec. 2, 2001 and vs. Ohio State on Jan. 3, 2002.

Smith's perfect 9-9 (1.000) shooting performance from the field matched Jamie Cavey's record of 9-9 (1.000) vs. Marquette on March 23, 2003. All of Cavey's field goals were two-point baskets, while four of Smith's five were from behind the arc.

Movin' On Up • Senior Crystal Smith (168) is nine steals from equaling Nadine Domond (177) and Lisa Anderson (177) for seventh on lowa's career steals chart. Smith (916) is also 20 points from matching Randi Peterson (936) for 22nd in career scoring at lowa.

Smith Nominated for Senior CLASS Award • Seniors Crystal Smith is one of 30 seniors from Division I basketball programs around the nation who have been named as candidates for the Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award. The award, now in its fifth year, is presented annually to the nation's senior player-of-the-year. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. The award was launched during the 2001-02 season in response to the trend of college players leaving college early to turn professional. Smith joins Michigan State's Liz Shimek and Lindsay Bowen as the only three Big Ten student-athletes nominated. Sportscaster Dick Enberg, who initiated the idea for the award and now serves as honorary Chairman, will announce the winner during the CBS telecast of the NCAA Men's Final Four in April.

The Hawkeyes have four freshmen and five sophomores on its roster. Air Force (13) leads the nation, followed by New Orleans (12). Michigan is tied for seventh (10), while Penn State (8) and Wisconsin (8) are tied for 31st.

Home Grown Hawkeyes • lowa's roster features six players from the state of lowa (Wendy Ausdemore, Abby Emmert, Ebone Pope, Tiffany Reedy, Stacy Schlapkohl and Nicole VanderPol). Center of Attention • For the fifth time during Coach Bluder's lowa tenture, the Hawkeyes started the season with a different center. Jamie Cavey started for the Hawkeyes the last two years. She became lowa's first center to start consecutive seasons since Amy Herrig (1997-99). Randi Peterson was lowa's starter in 2000-01, followed by Beatrice Bullock (2001-02), Tracy Schrupp (2002-03) and Jamie Cavey (2003-05).

lowa's two centers on its 2005-06 roster are sophomore Stacy Schlap-kohl and freshman Megan Skouby.

ACL Trio • In a span of six months, lowa had three players who suffered ACL injuries to their right knees. Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson and Stacy Schlapkohl all suffered season-ending injuries. Richards sustained her injury in June, followed by Solverson (July) and Schlapkohl (December).

Hawkeyes Pen Quoie • lowa signed Woodbury, MN, native Zoraa Quoie to a National Letter of Intent last fall. She was an all-conference and honorable mention all-state selection her junior year. Quoie averaged 10.6 ppg and just fewer than four steals per game on a team that won its conference and finished 25-3 last season. Her Woodbury High School team also captured a league title and finished third at the Minnesota state tournament her sophomore year. Quoie was a reserve her sophomore year, but started last season. She was also an all-state sprinter on the track team her freshman year.

The tournament returns to Indianapolis for the 11th time in 12 years and has attracted more than 30,000 fans for each of the last four events. Just two years ago, the Big Ten set a pair of attendance records when the 2004 championship game was played in front of a single-session record of 9,417 fans, which established an overall tournament record of 37,635 spectators. In the past 11 years of Big Ten Tournament play, the conference has welcomed more than 314,000 fans. Five different league representatives have become tournament champions. Purdue leads all teams with five titles followed by two championships for both lowa and Penn State and a single title for Indiana and Michigan State.

Game Summaries

Game 1 Iowa 82, UW-Milwaukee 42 Nov. 20, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - lowa won its sixth-straight season opening game under Head Coach Lisa Bluder with an 82-42 rout over UW-Milwaukee in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes took a 15-point advantage into halftime and never looked back. lowa shot 61.5 percent (16-26) from the field in the second half and 58.5 percent (31-53) for the game. A majority of lowa's field goal attempts came from close range as the Hawkeyes out-scored the Panthers 42-18 in the paint.

All 12 Hawkeyes that played netted at least two points. Furthermore, 10 Hawkeyes collected at least one assist, while eight lowa players recorded one steal or more. As a team, lowa generated 21 assists and 17 steals. Jenee Graham registered a game-high six assists, while UW-Milwaukee accumulated a team total of seven assists.

A trio of Hawkeye post players paced the Hawkeyes in victory. Stacy Schlapkohl, Krista VandeVenter and Megan Skouby each scored 12 points each. The trio combined to shoot 15-23 (.652) from the field and 6-8 (.750) from the foul line.

lowa finished the game strong, out-scoring UW-Milwaukee 23-6 in the final 12 minutes

lowa limited UW-Milwaukee to 15.6 percent (5-32) shooting from the field in the second half and 29.6 percent (16-54) for the the game. Traci Edwards led the Panthers, recording a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds).

With lowa enjoying a large lead for most of the game, Bluder was able to rotate her entire bench and not allow a single Hawkeye to play more than 21 minutes.

The 40-point triumph is lowa's largest season opening win since a 43-point victory (83-40) vs. Wyoming on Nov. 25, 1998 in the Hawaii Wahine Classic.

Game 2 Louisiana Tech 95, Iowa 91 Nov. 22, 2005, Thomas Assembly Center

RUSTON, LA - - Louisiana Tech overcame a 19-point second half deficit with seven minutes remaining in regulation to outlast lowa 95-91 in a doible overtime thriller at the Thomas Assembly Center.

The Lady Techsters spoiled lowa senior Crystal Smith's homecoming, who was raised in nearby Haughton, LA, but not without a huge outing by Smith. Smith poured in a school-record 46 points, which is the most points by a Louisiana Tech opponent and was one point from an arena record. Smith also established a new school record for free throws attempted (19) and equaled the school record for foul shots made (15). She also set a career high with two blocked shots and matched a career best with eight rebounds.

lowa led 71-52 with 7:18 remaining in regulation, but turnovers and poor free throw shooting enabled the Lady Techsters to sneak back into the game and outscore the Hawkeyes 24-5 the final seven minutes of regulation. Louisiana Tech forced eight lowa turnovers on its press and converted the eight miscues into 12 points. Additionally, lowa was only 1-4 from the foul line, including missing two front ends of one-and-ones, in the final five minutes of regulation.

Smith missed a 10-foot jumper that would have given lowa the win at the end of regulation. Conversely, Louisiana Tech's Eboni Mangum missed a short jumper at the end of the first overtime that would have given the Lady Techsters the victory. Louisiana Tech out-scored the Hawkeyes 8-4 in the sixth period to lift the Lady Techsters to victory.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 10 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Krista Vandeventer added five points, 11 rebounds, five assists, two blocks and two steals in defeat

lowa lost only its third game in it last 21 contests when leading at the half.

Game 3 #22 Oklahoma 85, Iowa 68 Nov. 25, 2005, War Memorial Gym

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - - Oklahoma's Paris twins combined for 44 points and 21 rebounds to propel the 22nd-ranked Sooners to an 85-68 victory over lowa in the first round of the Odwalla Classic in War Memorial Gym.

lowa opened the game with an 18-11 advantage, but Oklahoma closed the half on a 32-11 run to take a commanding 43-29 lead into half. Sooner junior Erin Higgins, who was 1-6 from 3-point range in last year's contest against the Hawkeyes in the Bahamas, scored all of her 14 points in the first half on 4-5 shooting from behind the arc.

Courtney Paris posted her third double-double of the season (30 points, 14 rebounds), while her sister Ashley collected 14 points and seven rebounds en route to victory in front of their hometown family and friends.

The Sooners dominated the Hawkeyes in the post, out-scoring lowa 48-16 in the paint and scoring 27 second chance points for the game.

Senior Crystal Smith paced the Hawkeyes with a team-high 15 points and a game-high five steals. Sophomore Krista VandeVenter tallied seven points and grabbed a team-high 11 rebounds. Freshman Megan Skouby netted all of her 11 points in the second half and also corralled six rebounds in defeat.

lowa's underclassmen scored 44 of the Hawkeyes' 68 points, including 27 from freshmen.

lowa converted a season-best 89.5 percent (17-19) from the free throw line. Conversely, the Hawkeyes shot a season-low 38.3 percent (23-60) from the field. Oklahoma's win was its first victory over lowa in three tries.

lowa will face Rider for the first time in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic.

Game 4 Iowa 88, Rider 41 Nov. 26, 2005, War Memorial Gym

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - - The lowa Hawkeyes led start-to-finish cruising to a lobsided 88-41 triumph over Rider in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic. The 47-point victory ranks as the ninth-largest in school history.

Leading 35-19 at halftime, the Hawkeyes scored the first 21 points of the second half and out-scored Rider 29-2 in the first 10:30 of the second stanza.

Senior Crystal Smith paced lowa, scoring a game-high 24 points and collecting five rebounds and four assists. Smith, who was named to the all-tournament team, equaled a school record for field goal percentage in a game, sinking all nine field goal attempts, including all four 3-pointers. She also drained both free throw attempts.

lowa had five players in double figures for the first time this season. In addition to Smith, freshman Megan Skouby netted 11, while senior Tiffany Reedy, freshman Nicole VanderPol and senior Stacy Schlapkohl all contributed 10 points. The 10 points by VanderPol is a career high. Additionally, senior Morgan Kasperek led all rebounders for the first time in her career with six boards.

The Hawkeyes shot the ball extremely well, converting a season-best 63.2 percent (36-57) from the field and also drained 88.9 percent (8-9) from the charity stripe.

Nine Hawkeyes contributed to lowa's season-high 30 assists. Sophomore Abby Emmert dished out a career-high seven assists, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter collected five.

lowa was on fire in the second half, making its first six field goal attempts, including three-straight triples by Smith. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 68.8 percent (22-32), including 70.0 percent (7-10) from 3-point range, in the second period.

Rider was led by Monica Welborn, who netted 13 points. Iowa's defense limited the Broncs to only 24.5 percent (13-53) from the field for the game.

Game 6 lowa 79, Vermont Dec. 3, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Crystal Smith scored 26 points to lead Iowa to a 79-57 victory over Vermont in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge, setting up a sentimental title game against No. 6 Rutgers.

For the first time since leaving lowa in 1995, Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer will coach against the Hawkeyes, a program she turned into a national powerhouse during her 12-year tenure in lowa City.

After taking the lowa job in 1983, Stringer won a school-best 269 games, guided the Hawkeyes to six Big Ten titles and nine straight NCAA appearances before leaving to take the job at Rutgers.

The Scarlet Knights advanced to the championship game by beating San Jose State 76-64, behind 26 points from all-American guard Cappie Pondexter.

But it was Smith who ensured lowa a spot in the marquee matchup.

Five minutes into the second half, a fast-break layup by Vermont's Alexis Castro made the score 44-40, the closest margin since the game's opening minutes.

Then Smith took charge, scoring 10 points over the next nine minutes in a 20-10 lowa run

A 3-pointer by Wendy Ausdemore put Iowa up 47-40 at the 13:44 mark, and Smith's 3-pointer with 7:56 left stretched the lead to 15 points and put the game out of reach. Smith, last week's Big Ten Player of the Week, also had three assists and six steals

Stacy Schlapkohl added 12 points and seven rebounds for Iowa. The Hawkeyes also shot 46 percent and won praise from coach Lisa Bluder, who stressed all week the need to focus first on Vermont.

Ashleigh Cuncic led the Catamounts (2-4) with 17 points. Sy Janousek added 11 points, but Vermont shot just 32 percent and was outscored in the paint 24-8.

Game Summaries

Game 7 #6 Rutgers 57, Iowa 51 Dec. 4, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) - - Cappie Pondexter scored 22 points and No. 6 Rutgers held off lowa 57-51 to win the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge.

The victory also capped an emotional weekend for Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer, who coached against her old team for the first time since leaving Iowa City to take the Scarlet Knights' job.

Pondexter, who scored 26 points in the tournament's opening round, was voted MVP. But Rutgers also relied on its size and strength inside to wear down the Hawkeyes inside and cut short each rally.

Seven of Pondexter's points came at key moments late in the game.

After lowa pulled to 46-44 on a short jumper by Krista VandeVenter, Pondexter answered with a long 3-pointer.

In the final minute with Rutgers leading by four, Pondexter milked the clock on all alone on the perimeter before driving an lowa defender into the paint and swishing a short jumper.

Five times lowa crept within two points in the second half, only to see Rutgers, which never trailed in the game, respond and stretch their lead by controlling the boards.

Led by Mariota Theodoris' 16 rebounds, Rutgers outrebounded lowa 40-31, including 17-8 on the offensive end, outscored lowa 28-16 on points in the paint and blocked six shots.

Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 17 points. VandeVenter topped her season best with 15 points and had six rebounds. The Hawkeyes shot 38 percent from the floor and 79 percent from the free throw line.

Stringer was cheered loudly as she strolled out of the locker room and along the sidelines, shaking hands with friends and university officials, during warmups and pregame introductions.

AMES, IA - - The Iowa State women's basketball team defeated Iowa 77-61 at Hilton Coliseum. The loss was Iowa's fifth-straight in Ames and increases Iowa State's lead in the Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series to 7-2.

lowa freshman Megan Skouby made a 10-foot jumper with 7:00 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes a 25-24 advantage. The Cyclones responded in a big way, scoring 13 of the final 15 points to take a 37-27 lead into half. lowa only made only three of its last 18 field goal attempts in the first period.

lowa State opened the second half on an 8-0 run to stretch its lead to 18 (45-27). The Cyclones led 51-33 with 15:32 left before lowa went on a 15-3 run to trim the deficit to six (54-48) with 9:51 remaining, but that was as close as the Hawkeyes would get.

Iowa State played only six players. All five starters scored double figures, including junior guard Lyndsey Medders, who posted game highs in points (20) and assists (14). Three Cyclones pulled down double digit rebounds (Brittany Wilkins, 13; Nicky Wieben, 12; Megan Ronhovde, 11).

lowa was led by Tiffany Reedy, Crystal Smith and Krista VandeVenter. Reedy scored 11 of her 13 points in the first 12:13 of the first half. The 13 points matched a season high. Smith also tallied 13 points and grabbed four rebounds. VandeVenter netted all 12 of her points in the second period. She also equaled a career high with 14 rebounds, collecting her fourth career double-double.

After failing to make any 3-pointers in its last game for the first time in 217 games, lowa converted 7-23 (.304) from behind the arc.

All 16 Hawkeye bench points came from freshmen. Skouby scored eight points on 4-7 shooting from the field, while Kristi Smith contributed six points and Wendy Ausdemore added two. Ausdemore also corralled a season-high five rebounds.

The game featured four ties and three lead changes.

Game Summario

Game 9 Iowa 92, Drake 72 Dec. 18, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - lowa returned to action after a 10-day layoff and cruised to a 92-72 victory over Drake in front of a season-high 5,556 fans at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

lowa dominated the undersized Drake squad, out-scoring the Bulldogs 44-32 in the paint. Hawkeye post players Krista VandeVenter, Stacy Schlapkohl and Megan Skouby combined for 47 points and 17 rebounds. The trio shot at a 77.8 percent clip (21-27) from the floor and 83.3 percent (5-6) from the foul line.

Skouby netted a career-high 19 points (9-11 FG, 1-2 FT). Skouby scored 15 of her 19 points in the second half, as the freshman only played four minutes in the first half after being whistled for two quick fouls.

VandeVenter scored 10 of her 14 points in the first half. The sophomore also corralled seven rebounds, dished out four assists, blocked one shot and matched a career high with four steals.

Schlapkohl contributed 12 of her 14 points in the first half. The native of Durant, IA, also grabbed a career-high eight rebounds and collected two assists.

Receiving her first collegiate start today was freshman Kristi Smith. She directed the Hawkeye offense for 25 minutes, scoring four points, dishing out four assists and pulling down two rebounds. lowa's other Smith, Crystal, added a game-high 21 points (10-14 FG) and also collected four assists and four steals.

Drake, who lost for the fifth time in six tries, was led by Jill Martin. Martin tallied 17 points and grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds.

lowa started the game on fire, sinking 12 of its first 16 shots from the floor and claiming a 16-point advantage (28-12) by the second media timeout of the first period. Iowa went into the locker room with a comfortable 45-29 lead. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 60.6 percent (20-33) from the field in the first stanza.

The 92 points are the most yielded by a Drake team since the Bulldogs surrendered 90 against Iowa State on Dec. 5, 2001.

Game 10 Iowa 65, Northern Iowa 54 Dec. 21, 2005, UNI Dome

CEDAR FALLS, IA - - Hawkeye senior Crystal Smith poured in a game-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds as the Iowa Hawkeye women's basketball team downed the Northern Iowa Panthers for the 10th-straight time 65-54 at the UNI Dome.

Iowa had a nine-point halftime cushion, but Northern Iowa came out of the locker room on fire. The Panthers scored the first nine points of the second stanza to even the contest at 31 with 15:53 remaining. The Hawkeyes answered with a 12-4 run the next four minutes to rebuild their lead back to eight (43-35) with 11:20 left.

Northern Iowa continued to fight back and trimmed the Hawkeye advantage to six with 2:15 remaining, but back-to-back triples by Hawkeyes Tiffany Reedy and Abby Emmert helped seal lowa's second-straight win over a Missouri Valley Conference opponent. Iowa converted 4-6 from the foul line the final minute to secure the 11-point victory.

Smith scored 13 of her 22 points in the first half, including netting lowa's final first half points. The native of Haughton, LA, attempted and made lowa's first 3-pointer of the game at the 15:40 mark of the second half to halt a 9-0 Northern lowa scoring run. Smith has tallied 20 points or more five times already this season.

Northern Iowa limited Hawkeye starters Krista Vande Venter and Stacy Schlapkohl to a combined three points on 0-8 shooting from the field and 3-5 from the foul line. However, Iowa's bench stepped up to fill the scoring void as the Hawkeye reserves out-scored the Panthers 24-8. Freshman Megan Skouby scored eight, while freshman Wendy Ausdemore and sophomore Abby Emmert each added seven.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed seven of her 10 points in the second half and also corralled five rebounds.

Northern Iowa was led by senior Cassie Hager, who scored 17 points and blocked a game-high six shots. Iowa's stifling 2-3 zone defense made it difficult for the Panthers to have open looks. Northern lowa converted only 31.1 percent (19-61) from the field, including only 17.2 percent (5-29) from behind the arc.

Game Summaries

Game 11 Iowa 74, Creighton 64 Dec. 23, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter added 18 points and a career-high six steals en route to a 74-64 victory over Creighton at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was lowa's third straight over the Bluejays.

After Creighton jumped out to an early 7-1 lead to start the game Skouby drilled five straight jumpers to tie the contest at 13-13. Iowa took its first lead with 8:29 left in the first half after a layup from freshman Wendy Ausdemore, but the Bluejays regained the lead after a Kristi Woodard bucket and did not trail the rest of the half.

lowa trimmed the Creighton lead to two at the start the second half, but Ally Thrall sank a 3-pointer with 17:18 left to stretch the Bluejay lead to seven. The Hawkeyes responded with a 7-0 run to regain a 44-43 lead with 13:29 left.

After Creighton's Angie Janis hit a jumper to put the Bluejays up by three, VandeVenter swiped one of her six steals for a layup to give Iowa a 50-49 lead with 9:48 left and the Hawkeyes never relinquished the lead. A 3-pointer by senior Tiffany Reedy gave Iowa a 54-49 lead and a 3-point play by freshman Nicole VanderPol with 5:59 left gave the Hawkeyes a comfortable advantage. Four free throws by Ausdemore down the stretch sealed the win for Iowa.

Starting center Stacy Schlapkohl suffered a season-ending ACL injury early in the first half. The lowa post players responded very well in Schlapkohl's absence, outscoring Creighton 36-22 in the paint. Skouby scored 12 of her 22 points in the first half, while VandeVenter scored 16 of her 18 points in the second half.

Creighton was able to gain an advantage on the boards and out-rebounded lowa 36-30, including 16 offensive rebounds. Angie Janis led Creighton with 19 points, while Kristi Woodard grabbed nine rebounds.

Crystal Smith had 13 points for lowa, which marked the first time since the season opener vs. UW-Milwaukee she did not lead the team in scoring.
