THE MATCH-UP

HAWKEYES

The fifth-seeded University of Iowa soccer team takes on No. 2-seeded and 11th-ranked Wisconsin in the Big Ten Tournament title game on Sunday at 2 p.m. (CT) at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex in West Lafayette, Indiana. The game will be televised live on BTN.

IOWA'S B1G TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- lowa is now 4-7-1 all-time in the Big Ten Tournament with all four victories coming since 2013.
- It is the second-straight season the Hawkeyes have advanced to the Big Ten Tournament title game. Last season lowa downed the No. 2 and No. 3 seeds (No. 8 Michigan, No. 20 Penn State) en route to a title game appearance -- a 1-0 loss to top-seeded Nebraska.
- The Hawkeyes are the fourth team in Big Ten history the first since Illinois in 2011 and 2012 to advance to consecutive tournament finals. Other teams include Penn State (1998-2001) and Wisconsin (1994-96).
- lowa is the No. 5 seed for the first time in program history. The Hawkeyes have been the No. 3 and No. 7 seeds once and the No. 6 and No. 8 seeds three times each.

B1G OUICKIES

- Junior goalkeeper Hannah Clark has a 4-1 record with a 0.33 goals against average in six career Big Ten Tournament games. She has 29 saves and four shutouts in six contests.
- Sophomore Natalie Krygier and senior Cloe Lacasse have accounted for Iowa's two goals in the Big Ten Tournament. Krygier scored in the team's 1-0 win over No. 23 Rutgers, while Lacasse sent in the game-winner in a 1-0 triumph over Northwestern.
- lowa's win over Rutgers was the team's first victory over a ranked opponent this season. The Hawkeyes are 1-2-1 against ranked teams.
- Friday's victory over Northwestern moves lowa's record to 14-6-1 this season. The 14 victories are the second most in a single season in school history. The Hawkeyes won a school-record 15 games last season.
- lowa will be without the services of first-team All-Big Ten defender Melanie Pickert, who suffered a season-ending injury in the first half in Wednesday's quarterfinal win over Rutgers.

TOP-5 FINISH

lowa finished in a tie with Minnesota for fifth place in the final Big Ten regular season standings with a 7-5-1 record. It is the fourth top-five showing in the program's 18-year history and the third since 2011. The Hawkeyes finished third in 1999 and tied for fifth in 2011 and 2013. The seven league victories are tied for the most in a single season in program history (1999).

HEAD COACH DAVE DIJANNI

Dave Dilanni was named the fifth head coach in University of Iowa soccer history on May 17, 2014. Dilanni spent the past 11 seasons as head coach at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 221-18-18 (.895) record and has guided the Lakers to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in the last eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths and coached 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage is the tops in NCAA Division II and the third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In 2013, Dilanni guided Grand Valley State to its third national title in five seasons and was named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year for a third time. The Lakers scored the second-most goals in program history (88), matched a program-high with 21 shutouts en route to winning the most games in school history. The team finished 24-0-1, claiming both the GLIAC regular season and tournament titles.

The Lakers opened the season with 13-straight shutouts, which matched the second-longest streak in Division II history, and five student-athletes garnered All-America recognition at season's end.

Dilanni led the Lakers to a 22-0-4 record in 2009 en route to his first national championship before winning a second-straight title in 2010. He was honored as the CaptainU Division II Women's Soccer Coach of the Year in 2009, and he coached the Division II National Player of the Year honoree in each season (Irie Dennis, 2009; Jenna Wenglinski, 2010).

Dilanni took over the Laker program in 2003 and swiftly guided Grand Valley State to a then-school best record of 17-2-2 to earn the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. In year three, Dilanni led the Lakers to their first conference and NCAA Great Lakes Regional Championship, finishing 19-3 overall, and his team finished eighth in the national poll.

By year four, Dilanni led Grand Valley State to the school's first NCAA Division II National Championship game, finishing 19-2-1 overall. A year later, the Lakers made a second-straight NCAA Final Four appearance, posting a 17-0-0 mark in the regular season before finishing 21-1-1 overall.

Dilanni joined Grand Valley State after a seven-year run as head coach of the Jackson Lumen Christi High School women's soccer team. He also spent three years as an assistant coach at Hillsdale College, where he helped begin the men's and women's soccer programs.

Dilanni has spent seven years working with the Olympic Development Program in Michigan, training and developing the highest level of soccer in the state. He coached the team to four Region 2 and four ODP national championships.

Dilanni, a USSF B-licensed coach, earned his associate's degree from Seneca College in 1993 and his bachelor's degree from Spring Arbor University in 1997. He and his wife, Kristy, have two daughters, Karissa (11) and Kelsey (7).

2 HAWKEYES NAMED ALL-BIG TEN

Seniors Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert were tabbed as first-team All-Big Ten selections in 2014. The pair is the second and third players in program history to garner first-team all-conference honors and the first since 2001. Senior Caitlin Brown was selected as lowa's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree.

QUICK HITTERS

- lowa ranks second in the Big Ten with 12 shutouts, nine by Hannah Clark and three by Kiley Beck. The 12 shutouts are the most in a single-season in school history. Clark's nine shutouts are the second-most individually in a single season all-time.
- lowa has allowed 16 goals in 21 contests for a 0.75 goals against average. The goals allowed and goals against average are the fourth-best in the Big Ten.
- Senior Cloe Lacasse is tied for second in the Big Ten in goals (12), ranks second in points (30), fourth in shots (81), and tied for 10th in assists (6).
- Among active players in the NCAA, Lacasse ranks ninth in career points (110), 15th in career goals (42), and ranks 19th in career assists (26). The senior is also one of 14 active players to amass at least 30 goals and 20 assists throughout her career, ranking sixth. Lacasse's goal and three shots in Friday's semifinal game of the Big Ten Tournament are not accounted for.
- Senior Melanie Pickert is tied for third in the conference with four game-winning goals, which are tied for the sixth most in a single season in school history.
- lowa has used 11 different starting lineups in 22 games this season.

SCOUTING WISCONSIN

Wisconsin finished second in the Big Ten during the regular season, posting a 9-2-2 record in league play, and is 17-2-2 overall. The Badgers bring one of the most prolific offenses in the Big Ten into Sunday's championship matchup against lowa. Wisconsin, ranked 11th in the country, ranks first in the conference in shots (309), second in goals (39), fourth in assists (28), and third in points (106). The Badgers roster features five players that earned All-Big Ten honors, including Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year, Genevieve Richard. The fifth-year senior has helped Wisconsin to 14 of its 16 shutouts through 21 games this season and has a conference-best 0.34 goals against average and .908 save percentage.

WISCONSIN VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

lowa is 5-10-3 all-time against Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes have won two of the last four in the series and battled the Badgers to a scoreless draw earlier in the season on Oct. 8

lowa and Wisconsin have never met in the postseason prior to Sunday's championship matchup.

DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN TOTALS

lowa posted its 10th win of the season for the fourth-consecutive year when it defeated Indiana, 1-0, on Oct. 17 -- extending the longest stretch in program history. The Hawkeyes won 13 games in 2011, 12 in 2012 and a school-record 15 games last season.

CLOE LACASSE...

- earned first-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior -- her second career All-Big Ten recognition.
- has scored in eight contests this season, including four two-goal games, pushing her career total to 11 as a Hawkeye.
- tallied her 100th career point in lowa's 2-0 victory over Illinois on Sept. 11, assisting on Nicole Urban's strike. Lacasse is the second player in lowa history to reach the 100-point mark.
- tied the career points record in Iowa's 1-0 semifinal victory over Northwestern. She is tied with Sarah Lynch with 112 points.
- currently ranks second all-time at lowa in goals scored with 43. Sarah Lynch is the record holder with 46 goals.
- has 26 career assists, one shy of tying Morgan Showalter for the most in program history. Lacasse also has the most shots in lowa history with 305.
- has 12 goals and six assists for 30 points in 2014. The 12 goals and 30 points are tied for the third most in a single season in program history. The forward holds three of the top-five single season goal totals in school history. Lacasse's 81 shots are tied for the most all-time.

THE HAWKEYES ARE...

- 9-2 when leading at the half
- 13-4 when scoring first this season

HANNAH CLARK...

- broke the school record for career shutouts in lowa's
 1-0 victory at Michigan State on Oct. 2. Clark currently has 19 career shutouts.
- is 10-5-1 with nine shutouts and a 0.84 goals against average in 2014. The nine shutouts are the second most in a single season, while the 10 wins are the sixth-most in program history. Clark also holds the school record in both categories, posting 10 shutouts and 15 wins in 2013.
- has a 4-1 record with a 0.33 goals against average in six career Big Ten Tournament games. She has 29 saves and four shutouts in six contests.
- had four consecutive shutouts from Sept. 7-20, where she had sevens saves over 379:26 scoreless minutes. It was the second-straight season she had a four-game shutout streak.
- Clark has 29 career victories, the second-most in lowa history, and her 210 career saves rank third in the UI record books.

MAZUR EARNS ACADEMIC HONOR

Junior Sarah Mazur was named to the Capital One Academic All-District 6 team on Oct. 30. The defender/midfielder from LaGrange, Illinois, is majoring in electrical engineering, where she carries a 4.13 cumulative grade point average.

FIRST TIMERS

Sophomore Natalie Krygier became the fourth Hawkeye this season to score her first career goal when she found the back of the net in lowa's game at Michigan on Oct. 5. Freshman Aubree Larson and sophomores Amanda Lulek and Corey Burns have also scored their first career goals in 2014.

GAME-WINNING GOALS

Sophomore Natalie Krygier and senior Emily Scott both recorded their first game-winning goals in wins over Indiana and Purdue. Eight different Hawkeyes have scored game-winners during the 2014 season. Senior Melanie Pickert leads the way with four gamewinners.

HAWKEYES DISTRIBUTING

lowa has tallied 26 assists through 21 games this year. Eight different Hawkeyes have recorded an assist this season. Sophomore Corey Burns leads the team with seven, which are tied for the fifth-most in a single season in lowa history.

IOWA IN NCAA STATS

As of Nov. 6, Iowa ranks in the top-55 in two categories through 21 games. The Hawkeyes are tied for 31st in shutout percentage (0.550) and 46th in goals against average (0.785). Iowa's semifinal round game against Northwestern on Nov. 7 has not been accounted for.

LACASSE, PICKERT IN TOP DRAWER RANKINGS

Seniors Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert were recognized in Top Drawer Soccer's Midseason Big Ten player rankings, a time frame that covered games from Aug. 8 to Oct. 17. Lacasse was ranked the sixth-best player in the Big Ten and the fourth-best forward. Pickert came in as the second-best defender in the conference and No. 9 overall.

SEASON HONORS

- Senior Melanie Pickert and sophomore Corey Burns were named to Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week on Sept. 16 after leading lowa to a pair of shutout victories over Illinois and Northwestern.
- Pickert was also named CS 360's National Primetime Player of the Week on Sept. 16.
- Junior Hannah Clark was tabbed as the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week by College Sports Madness on Sept. 16. She made a combined seven saves in a pair of shutouts over Illinois and Northwestern. On Sept. 23, Clark was tabbed as the Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week after compiling five saves in Iowa's 1-0 shutout victory at Minnesota.
- Senior Cloe Lacasse was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week by the league office on Oct. 20. The honor is the second of Lacasse's career. Lacasse was also recognized as the Big Ten Player of the Week by College Sports Madness on Oct. 21 and an honorable mention at the forward position on Top Drawer Soccer's latest Team of the Week released on Oct. 22.

The Sudbury, Ontario, native scored two goals and tallied a pair of assists in leading the Hawkeyes to victories over Indiana and Purdue.

BROWN: A CONSTANT

Senior Caitlin Brown is the only lowa player to log every minute of game action this season. The defender has played every minute for the past 55 games dating back to the 2012 season -- a streak of 5,179 minutes.

SENIOR EXPERIENCE

Prior to suffering a season-edning injury in the quarterfinals of the 2014 Big Ten Tournament, senior Melanie Pickert had started every game of her lowa career, a streak of 84 games. Fellow seniors Caitlin Brown and Cloe Lacasse have started 84-of-85 games as Hawkeyes.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Seniors Kiley Beck, Caitlin Brown, and Melanie Pickert have been voted team captains for the 2014 lowa soccer team.

IOWA MAKES HISTORY

The week of Sept. 21 was a big one for the Hawkeyes. After starting 3-0 in Big Ten play, marking lowa's best start in league play in program history, The Hawkeyes were ranked No. 13 in the Sept. 23 Soccer America rankings, the highest ranking in program history. lowa also broke into the Top Drawer Soccer Top-25, coming in at No. 25 and received votes in the NSCAA poll.

LACASSE HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

In three-plus years, junior Cloe Lacasse has made her mark on the lowa soccer program.

The Sudbury, Ontario, native is currently second in career goals (42), points (110), shots (302), gamewinning goals (12), and assists (26).

Lacasse led lowa in goals scored, points, and shots taken in both the 2011 and 2012 seasons. She capped off her junior year by garnering second-team All-Big Ten selection and second-team NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region honors.

NEW FACE AT THE HELM

First-year head coach Dave Dilanni takes over the Hawkeyes' program after a successful run at Grand Valley State. DIIANNI IN GOOD COMPANY

In 11 seasons at Grand Valley State, head coach Dave Dilanni posted a 221-18-18 overall record for a .895 winning percentage. The mark was the third-best all-time in women's soccer history entering the 2014 season.
