THE MATCH-UP

HAWKEYES

- The Hawkeyes will play a three-game series against Kansas State on April 12-14. The first two games of the series will be played at Duane Banks Field, with action beginning at 6:05 p.m. (CT) Friday and 1:05 p.m. (CT) Saturday.
- The series finale will be played Sunday at Principal Park in Des Moines, Iowa, home of the lowa Cubs, the Chicago Cubs Triple-A affiliate. The game is slated to begin approximately 30 minutes following the conclusion of the I-Cubs game that begins at 1:05 p.m. (CT).
- Duane Banks Field goes 395 feet to dead center, and plays 329 feet down the left and right field lines. Iowa is 2-6 at home this season, winning against Western Illinois (April 2) and Nebraska (April 7).
- The Hawkeyes last played at Principal Park in 2008, facing the lowa Cubs in an exhibition. It was the third exhibition meeting between lowa and the I-Cubs, as the teams also played in 2004 and 2006.

THE RADIO

The Hawkeyes three-game series against Kansas State will be broadcast on the radio on AM-800 KXIC and AM-1360 KMJM. Brent Balbinot will handle the play-by-play, while Jeff Duncan will provide color commentary Friday and Saturday. Zach Kenyon will provide color on Sunday.

In nine years as the University of Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the UI baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Hawkeyes in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the lowa program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years. Dahm has guided the team to 30 or more wins two of the last six seasons.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21 in a victory over Western Illinois. Also in 2009, Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23 and notched his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories. In 2012, Dahm earned his 200th victory at Iowa as the Hawkeyes won at Indiana (4-0) on March 31

In Dahm's 19 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, nine freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his nine years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 35 All-Big Ten selections, including eight first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Three Hawkeyes garnered all-league honors in 2012. Senior Phil Keppler earned second team All-Big Ten laurels along with freshman starting pitcher Sasha Kuebel. Kuebel and fellow left-handed pitcher Taylor Kaufman were named to the Big Ten's all-freshman squad. Kuebel was also named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after finishing 6-0 with a 2.67 ERA.

The Hawkeyes finished a game out of a four-way tie for sixth place and the final spot in the Big Ten Tournament in 2012. Iowa closed the season strong, taking 2-of-3 from No. 13 Purdue. The Hawkeyes were the only team all season to win a conference series against the Boilermakers. Iowa defeated Purdue in back-to-back games, earning its first win over a ranked foe since downing No. 25 Louisville in 2009.

While 11 freshmen saw action in 2012, Dahm coached two Hawkeye seniors to the top of the record books. Mike McQuillan closed his career first in singles (196) and second in hits (242). Jarred Hippen, a two-time second team All-Big Ten selection under Dahm, owns the lowa record for innings pitched (351.2) and ranks second in strikeouts behind Allen Rath with 244.

In the classroom, Dahm's teams have had success, as well. lowa's baseball team boasted an NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 95, which is 25 points above the national average for NCAA Division I baseball programs. During his lowa tenure, the head coach has seen 75 players named academic All-Big Ten, including a team-record 12 players in 2011. lowa had eight student-athletes recognized in 2010 and seven in 2012. That is the best nine-year total in the history of the program. Additionally, shortstop Kurt Lee was named Academic All-District first team in 2011.

WEEKEND PROMOTIONS

Hawkeye fans will have the chance to enjoy a pair of promotions at Duane Banks Field during the first two games of a three-game series against Kansas State. Fans are encouraged to wear gold to Friday's contest, as it is the "Be Bold, Wear Gold"game. Fans will also get the opportunity to play baseball movie trivia for a prize. Saturday is "Hawaiian Day" at the ballpark, and the first 100 fans in attendance will receive black and gold leis and a pair of sunglasses.

THE SERIES

Kansas State has won the last four meetings and holds a one-game advantage, 7-6, in the series between the Hawkeyes and Wildcats. The teams last met in 1999, as Kansas State won 5-4. Iowa last defeated the Wildcats in 1995, winning 6-2.

SCOUTING KANSAS STATE

Kansas State enters the weekend with a 24-10 record that includes a six-game winning streak. The Wildcats are 5-1 against Big Ten opponents, taking 2-of-3 against Minnesota and winning two match-ups against Nebraska.

The Wildcats are dangerous offensively, ranking third nationally in hitting with a .330 team average. K-State has eight regulars that hit .320 or better and have 20 or more RBIs. Junior Blair DeBord paces the team with a .385 batting average, while classmate Ross Kivett has tallied a team-best 34 hits and ranks second on the squad with a .381 batting average. Juniors Jared King and R.J. Santigate, and sophomore Austin Fisher share a team-lead with 24 RBIs. Sophomore Shane Conlon and senior Jon Davis are No. 1 and 2 on the team in home runs, as Conlon has hit six bombs and Davis has hit five, respectively.

Lefthander Joe Flattery, and righthanders Matt Wivinis and Blake McFadden will make-up Kansas State's three-man rotation against the Hawkeyes. Flattery is 2-2 with a 4.34 ERA in eight starts, tossing 45 2/3 innings. Wivinis owns a 5-1 mark in eight starts, registering a 4.20 ERA over 49 1/3 innings. McFadden has made nine appearances, including five starts. He is 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA.

Kansas State is coached by Brad Hill, who is in his 10th season at the helm of the Wildcat program.

The Hawkeyes travel to Papillon, Neb., for a mid-week game with Nebraska-Omaha on April 16. The game will be played at Werner Park, a 6,434 seat stadium built in 2011. Iowa and UNO have already met this season, playing a three-game series in Wichita, Kan., on March 16-18. The Mavericks won 2-of-3. The Hawkeyes won the middle game of the three-game set, 4-1, behind a strong pitching effort by senior Matt Dermody. Dermody allowed one run on five hits in 7 1/3 innings, striking out a season-high eight batters.

RAIN CANCELS SERIES FINALE VS. KU

The Hawkeyes scheduled April 10 game against Kansas was canceled due to overnight thunderstorms and the projected forecast at game time.

The Jayhawks won the first game of the scheduled two-game series, 8-3, on April 9 at Duane Banks Field. Sophomore Kris Goodman and freshman Nick Roscetti both went 3-for-4 at the plate for the Hawkeyes.

SWINGING THE STICK

The Hawkeyes have been swinging a hot bat lately, recording 10 or more hits in five straight contests and in seven of the last eight games. lowa's best output over the stretch came April 6 against Nebraska, tallying 14 hits. The 14 hits are the second-most in a game this season, falling one short of a season-high 15 hits recorded Feb. 16 at Austin Peay.

THRIVING AGAINST LEFTIES

Five of lowa's regulars thrive against left-handed pitching. Sophomore Taylor Kaufman leads the team with a .440 (11-of-25) average against southpaws, while Keith Brand (.417; 5-of-12), Kris Goodman (.370, 10-of-27), Eric Toole (.350, 7-of-20), and Jake Yacinich (.333, 9-of-27) hit above .333.

TURNING 2

The Hawkeyes have turned 34 double plays through 27 games this season, ranking 34th nationally. Iowa ranks 11th in double plays per game (1.15). The Hawkeyes last double play sealed a victory, as they turned a 4-6-3 double play with one out in the bottom of the ninth inning April 7 against Nebraska to secure a 6-5 win.

OUCH!

The Hawkeyes have been hit by 54 pitches this season, the most of any Big Ten team. lowa leads second place Indiana by 13, as the Hoosiers have been plunked 41 times this season.

Four Hawkeyes -- senior Keith Brand, junior Taylor Zeutenhorst and sophomores Kris Goodman and Jake Yacinich -- rank in the top-eight in the Big Ten in hit-by-pitches. Brand has been hit three times in a game on three occasions (UALR, Maine, UNO) en route to getting plunked a team and conferencehigh 14 times. Zeutenhorst, Goodman, and Yacinich have all been hit seven times, placing them tied for eighth in the Big Ten.

Iowa was hit by a pitch seven times March 1 against Arkansas-Little Rock, the most a Big Ten club has been hit in a game this season.

ROSCETTI SHINES AGAINST KANSAS

Freshman Nick Roscetti had the best game of his brief Hawkeye career April 9 against Kansas, going 3-for-4 at the plate with a run scored. The three hits were a season best, and marked the third time this season Roscetti





has recorded two or more hits in a game. The Sherman, III., native is hitting .306 this season with two runs scored and three RBIs. He has seen his playing time increase over the past 11 games, starting nine of the 11 contests. Roscetti did not record a start in the Hawkeyes' first 16 games.

B1G WINS LEADER

Senior pitcher Matt Dermody is tied for first in the Big Ten with five wins. Dermody in 5-1 in eight starts this season, picking up wins against Austin Peay (Feb. 16), Western Illinois (March 2), Georgetown (March 9), Nebraska-Omaha (March 17), and Northwestern (March 23). The Norwalk, Iowa, native has thrown 52 1/3 innings, the seventh-most among Big Ten pitchers, and leads the team with 34 strikeouts. His 34 strikeouts are tied for 10th in the conference.

Dermody's five wins set a career-high, besting the four wins he recorded during his sophomore season. Iowa has won six of the eight games in which Dermody has started. as he has allowed two runs or less in five of the eight starts.

Dermody recorded his third career complete game March 23 against Northwestern. The 6-foot-5 lefthander allowed one unearned run and struck out five, scattering seven hits.

NO STRANGER TO THE BIG TEN

Senior Matt Dermody has made 20 career Big Ten starts, including Big Ten Tournament play, ranking third among active Big Ten pitchers. Dermody trails Penn State's Steven Hill and Illinois' Kevin Johnson, who have both made 26 career Big Ten starts. The Norwalk, Iowa, native has made three Big Ten starts in 2013 after starting eight Big Ten contests in 2011 and 2012.

THE HUMAN MAGNET

Junior Keith Brand has been prone to getting plunked by opposing pitchers this season. The Northbrook, III., native has been hit by 14 pitches, the most of any Big Ten athlete and the sixth-highest total nationally. Brand ranks first nationally in hit-by-pitches

The 14 hit-by-pitches is the sixth-highest season total in program history, tying Kurtis Muller (2008) and Kevin Hoef (2007). Hoef holds the single season and career hitby-pitch record, as he was plunked 20 times in 2008 and 62 times over his Hawkeye career (2006-09).

THE IRON MAN

Sophomore Kris Goodman is the only Hawkeye to start all 27 games this season, starting 13 games in left field, 11 in right field, and three in center field. Goodman made 22 starts as a freshman, starting 14 games in center field and seven in left. Classmates Jake Mangler and Taylor Kaufman have each started 25 contests, the second-most on the team.

A TOUGH OUT

Sophomore Jake Mangler has been a tough out for opposing pitchers. The Clinton, lowa, native ranks 20th nationally in the toughest to strike out category, which divides a players' plate appearances by his strikeouts. Mangler has struck out six times in 102 atbats, giving him a score of 14.0. Mangler is hitting .255 with 12 runs scored and 11 RBIs this season.

THE THIEF

Sophomore Eric Toole is 13-of-15 in stolen base attempts this season. Toole's 13 swipes are a team-best and are three off the Big Ten lead, placing him tied for third among Big Ten athletes. The Council Bluffs, lowa, native has stolen six bases during Big Ten play (nine games), ranking second in the conference.

KENYON PROVIDES POP

Junior Trevor Kenyon has provided a muchneeded lift to the middle of the lowa batting order since being inserted into the starting lineup March 30 against Indiana. The Davenport, lowa, native has played at first base and hit fourth in all eight contests. Kenyon is 15-for-34 (.411) with four doubles, a triple, and 10 RBIs over the stretch, raising his batting average by 208 points (.154 to .362). His .362 average is tops on the team.

Kenyon has tallied a hit in all eight games and has delivered two hits in six of the eight contests, including a season-best three hits April 6 against Nebraska.

Kenyon is hitting .414 (12-of-29) with eight RBIs in Big Ten play, ranking seventh in RBIs and 10th in bating average.

STARTING OFF WITH A BANG

Sophomore Eric Toole, the Hawkeyes leadoff hitter, has been on a tear as of late. The Council Bluffs, lowa, native is hitting at a .361 (17-of-47) clip with 10 runs and six stolen bases over the 11 games, collecting a hit in nine of the last 11 contests. The stretch includes six multi-hit games and two threehit performances.

Toole has reached base in 22 of the Hawkeyes' last 23 games, including the last eight games and a career-best 14 game streak from Feb. 16-March 23.

SANDQUIST RETURNS

Senior Ricky Sandquist has made two relief appearances over the last five games, his first action since suffering an arm injury over three weeks ago. It has been a big lift to the Hawkeye bullpen, as the Fort Dodge, Iowa, native has been spectacular this season after making an adjustment to his pitching mechanics, going to a 3/4 arm slot.

Sandquist is 1-0 with a 1.73 ERA. He has allowed two earned runs in seven relief appearances, holding opponents scoreless in six of the seven outings. Sandquist collected his first save April 7 against Nebraska, inducing a 4-6-3 double play to end the game.

He tallied his first win March 24 after tossing three innings against Texas A&M Corpus Christi. Sandquist has also made two starts, posting a 3.12 ERA over 8 2/3 innings.

LEGGING OUT TRIPLES

Junior Taylor Zeutenhorst has a team-high two triples this season, tallying three-baggers against West Virginia (March 10) and Nebraska-Omaha (March 18). The two triples are tied for the fifthmost among Big Ten athletes.

GOOD(MAN) HITTING

Sophomore Kris Goodman has been one of the Hawkeyes top offensive threats this season, leading the team in hits (39), runs scored (21), and total bases (42). The Apple Valley, Minn., native ranks second on the team with a .361 batting average.
