BREAKIN' RECORDS -- Iowa set four school records during the outdoor season. Sophomore **Tiffany Johnson** set marks in the triple jump and 100-meter hurdles. She broke the triple jump record of 40-7 1/2 set in 1988 by **Becki Borg** with a leap of 40-9 1/2 at the Mt. SAC Relays. She also broke the 100-meter hurdles record of 13.60 set in 1999 by **Colleen Prendergast** and in 2000 by **Paula Ruen** with the 13.57 she ran in the Big Ten Championship prelims. Sophomore **Becca Franklin** shattered the hammer throw record of 161-10 set in 1999 by **Kerri Blackstone** with an 181-11 at the Iowa Musco Twilight VII. The 6,400-meter relay of sophomores **Nikki Chapple** and **Jordan Laney**, and seniors **Katie Donlon** and **Michelle Sokol** also set a school record (20:39.12) at the Drake Relays. The previous record was 20:40.89 set in 2001 by **Sarah Arens, Atalie Barber, Katie Butler** and **Ericka Roberts**.

2004 NCAA OUTDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS REVIEW -- The Hawkeyes sent seven competitors to the 2004 NCAA Outdoor Championships in Austin, TX. Senior **Shellene Williams** and sophomore **Adam Hamilton** took home all-America honors. **Williams** placed sixth in the 400 meters with a school-record setting time of 51.94. **Hamilton** placed 10th in the hammer throw (206-9), throwing a collegiate-best 208-11 in the prelims. Freshman **Peaches Roach** placed 11th in the high jump (5-11 1/4), senior **Brad Daufeldt** placed 17th in the hammer throw (200-1) and 23rd in the discus (172-5) and junior **Ken Kemeny** placed 15th in the shot put (59-5 1/2). Also competing for Iowa were seniors **Sarah Arens** (3,000-meter steeplechase) and **Russell Peterson** (400-meter hurdles).

IOWA IN NCAA OUTDOOR HISTORY -- The Iowa men's track team has crowned 13 NCAA Champions and 80 all-Americans in program history. Its highest finish at the NCAA outdoor meet was tying for seventh in 1967. The women's team has crowned three NCAA Champions and 38 all-Americans, and its highest finish at the NCAA outdoor meet was 10th in 1992. Sophomore **Peaches Roach** and freshman **Kineke Alexander** both earned their first all-America honors during the 2005 indoor season. **Roach** placed sixth in the high jump (6-0) and **Alexander** placed sixth in the 400 meters (54.06).

2005 NCAA MIDWEST REGIONAL REVIEW -- The men's and women's teams each placed 17th at the 2005 NCAA Midwest Regional in Norman, OK, May 27-28. The women's team scored 17 team points, while the men scored 15, and both automatically qualified two competitors for the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Seniors **Ken Kemeny** and **Tim Brodersen** automatically qualified in the shot put and discus, respectively. **Roach** and **Alexander** placed second in the high jump and 400 meters, respectively, to earn automatic bids in those events.

JAMES GRANT HEAD COACH

20th Season at Iowa Eastern Michigan, 1971

James Grant is in his ninth season at the helm of the Iowa women's track and field program. Grant was the former assistant coach at Iowa for 11 years (1986-96).

The past three seasons have been outstanding ones for Grant and the Hawkeyes. Iowa placed third at the 2004 Big Ten Indoor Championships in Iowa City and sixth at the 2003 conference outdoor meet. Both were Iowa's highest placings during Grant's tenure, and the third-place indoor finish tied the team's highest conference finish in school history. In the last three seasons, the Hawkeyes have crowned 11 Big Ten Champions, 38 regional qualifiers, 15 all-region selections, 24 NCAA qualifiers and three all-Americans, and set 17 school records.

In 2004, Shellene Williams became the second student-athlete in program history to win four Big Ten titles, winning three titles in the 400 meters and one as part of the 1,600-meter relay. Despite the fact that she only competed for the Hawkeyes for two seasons (2003-04), she holds school records in three individual events and two relays. Peaches Roach gave Iowa its first Big Ten high jump titles, winning that event at the indoor and outdoor conference meets to earn outdoor Freshman of the Year honors.

In 2005, Roach and freshman Kineke Alexander became Grant's first indoor all-Americans. Roach defended her Big Ten indoor high jump title to become the second Hawkeye to win two consecutive Big Ten titles in the same event in school history. She also set the indoor school record in that event, breaking the 6-0 mark for the first time of her collegiate career. Sophomore Tiffany Johnson set school records in the indoor and outdoor triple jump and 100-meter hurdles, while sophomore Becca Franklin shattered the hammer throw record by over 20 feet. The 6,400-meter relay of sophomores Nikki Chapple and Jordan Laney, and seniors Katie Donlon and Michelle Sokol also set a school record.

Grant also had immense success in his first two seasons at the Hawkeye helm. Wynsome Cole was an all-American in the 400meter hurdles at the 1997 NCAA Championships. Iowa won six Big Ten event titles in those two seasons, and Erica Broomfield was named 1998 Big Ten Indoor Freshman of the Year.

While improving in the league standings in considered a priority, Iowa's track and field team also concerns itself with performance in the classroom. During Grant's tenure, 44 Hawkeyes have earned 76 academic all-Big Ten honors. As Iowa's assistant coach from 1986-96, Grant coached several Hawkeyes to success. In 1995, Yolanda Hobbs was an all-American in the 55 and 200 meters after winning the 55-meter Big Ten title. In 1994, Iowa's 400 meter-relay of Tina Floyd, Hobbs, Marlene Poole and Tanja Reid won Iowa's first Big Ten title in that event, earned all-America honors and set meet and school records. Karen Layne won the 1990 600-meter Big Ten title, while Senta Hawkins won the Big Ten 400 meters in 1988. In 1989, Iowa's 1,600-meter relay placed second at the Big Ten Indoor and Outdoor Championships.

A former Jamaican track standout, Grant coached at the high school level in Jamaica for 11 years prior to joining the Hawkeye program. From 1982-86, Grant coached men's and women's track at G.C. Foster College of Physical Education and Sport. There he led the men's team to two national championships and two secondplace finishes, and the women's team to three national titles. During that time he coached world outdoor champion quartermiler Bert Cameron, and world indoor champion quarter-miler Devon Morris.

A graduate of Eastern Michigan University, Grant captained the 1970 and 1971 Huron track teams, earning all-America honors while specializing in the 400 meters, 400-meter hurdles, and the mile relay. During this time, he was the Jamaican 400-meter hurdle national record holder, with a time that was ranked in the top-20 in the world. Grant also represented Jamaica at the Pan American Games and the Commonwealth Games for six years. In 1991, he was inducted into the Eastern Michigan Hall of Fame.

He was the 1965 and 1966 Jamaican national champion in both the 200 and 400 meters as a high school athlete at Jamaica's Kingston College.

Grant received his bachelor's degree in sociology and history from Eastern Michigan, and his master's degree in physical education from the German College of Physical Education in Leipzig, Germany.

University of Iowa Men's Head Coach



LARRY WIECZOREK Head Coach

21st Season at Iowa University of Iowa, 1969

Larry Wieczorek is in his ninth season as head men's track and field coach at Iowa, and recently completed his 18th season as head men's cross country coach. He served as an assistant track and field coach for 12 years before taking the helm in 1997.

A six-time Big Ten champion and four-time all-American at Iowa, Wieczorek once held conference marks in the one, two, three, four and five-mile runs. A member of Iowa's last Big Ten track championship team in 1967, he still owns Iowa records in the outdoor 5,000-meters and the indoor two miles, as well as third-fastest mark in the cross country 8,000 meters. He was inducted into Iowa's National Varsity Club Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998.

Under Wieczorek, the cross country team has placed sixth or higher eight times at the NCAA Regional Championships, posted 22 all-region selections and gualified for the NCAA Championships three times. In 2002, Wieczorek was named Midwest Regional Coach of the Year honors by the United States Cross Country Association after the Hawkeyes won the NCAA Regional for the first time in school history and advancing to the NCAA Championships for the second time in five years. Iowa also tied a school record with five NCAA all-Region selections. In 2004, the Hawkeyes recorded their highest placing at the Big Ten Championships (3rd) and NCAA Championships (13th) under Wieczorek. Hawkeye sophomore Micah VanDenend earned second team all-Big Ten honors with his 14th place finish at the conference meet, which was hosted by Iowa on Ashton Cross Country Course. Iowa also crowned four all-region selections in seniors Matt Esche and Tony Rakaric, and juniors Dan Haut and Adam Roche.

Since Wieczorek was named head men's track and field coach in 1997, his plan to build a strong sprint program around a national power 1,600-meter relay, and strong throws program is being realized. In his nine years at the helm, Wieczorek has coached NCAA Champion long jumper Bashir Yamini, 23 all-Americans, 76 national qualifiers, 43 regional qualifiers and 36 Big Ten Champions. Iowa's 1,600-meter relay won the 1999 Big Ten outdoor title and has earned all-America honors twice during Wieczorek's tenure. The Hawkeyes recorded their highest conference indoor placing (fourth) in 1997, and their highest team finish at the Big Ten Outdoor Championships (second) in 33 years at the 1999 Big Ten outdoor meet.

Another of Wieczorek's goals as head coach was to create an annual outdoor home event for the Hawkeyes that would be entertaining for the community and feature outstanding competition for participating student-athletes. Now in it's seventh year of existence, the annual Iowa Musco Twilight Meet is just that. Named for Musco Lighting of Oskaloosa, IA, who supplies mobile lighting equipment, the co-ed meet which featured five teams in 2005, starts in the late afternoon and extends into the night. In its first four years, the meet had produced 43 NCAA provisional qualifiers. Since the creation of the regional qualifying system in 2003, 154 competitors have reached qualifying standards.

While improving in the league standings is considered a priority, the Hawkeyes also concern themselves with performance in the classroom. Under Wieczorek, former cross country runners Kevin Herd, Chad Schwitters and Stetson Steele earned academic all-America honors. Iowa has had an academic all-Big Ten selection each year during his tenure, totaling 53 honorees in cross country and 55 in track.

Wieczorek came to Iowa after 11 seasons as head track coach at Proviso (IL) West High School. He also served as an assistant there for three years. His prep teams were consistent placers on the state level and several of his athletes won state titles. He served on the Illinois track advisory board and founded the prestigious Proviso Indoor Track Classic. Wieczorek was inducted into the Illinois High School Track and Cross Country Coaches Hall of Fame in 2000.

Wieczorek was born on September 11, 1946, in Chicago, IL. He received his B.S. degree in physical education from Iowa in 1969 and his M.S. degree in physical education from Northern Illinois University in 1973. His wife's name is Jackie.
