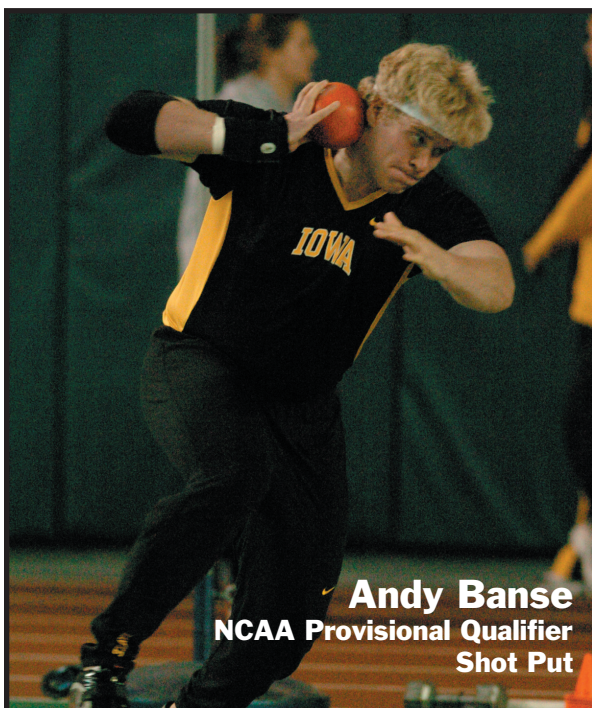
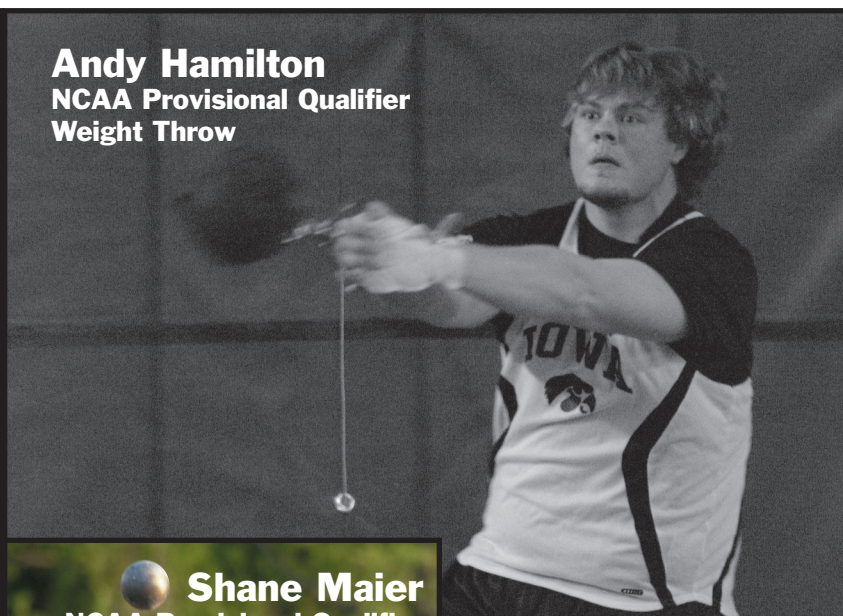

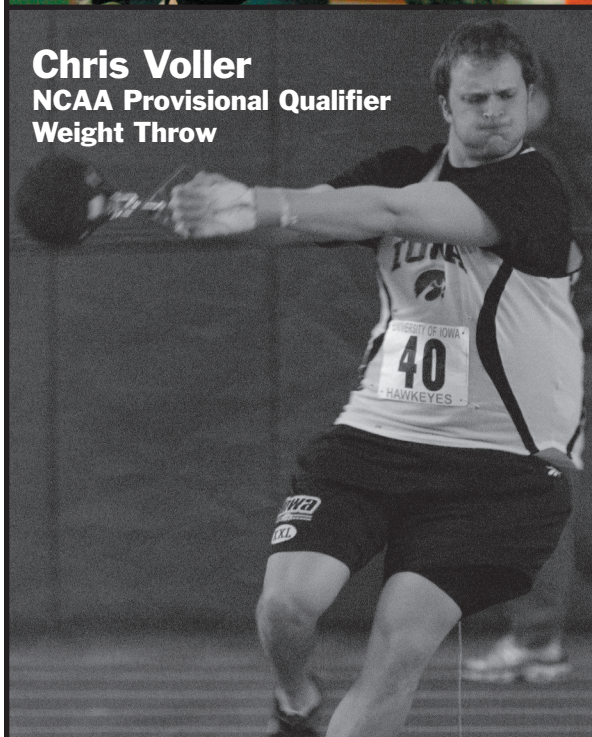

THIS WEEK -- The men's track team will compete at the 2005 Big Ten Indoor Championships Saturday and Sunday in West Lafayette, IN. All events will be held at Lambert Fieldhouse. All-session tickets are \$12 for adults and \$7 for students. Single-session tickets are \$7 for adults and \$4 for students. Tickets will be sold at the Lambert Fieldhouse west entrance.

NCAA QUALIFIERS -- The Hawkeyes have provisionally qualified five individuals for the NCAA Indoor Championships, which will be held March 11-12 in Fayetteville, AR. Their events, qualifying marks and where they rank in the Big Ten and NCAA are listed below.

2004 INDOOR BIG TEN REVIEW -- Iowa placed 10th at the 2004 Big Ten Indoor Championships with 13 points. Wisconsin won the team title with 174.5. Iowa's highest event finish was fifth place by the 1,600-meter relay of **Zach Digney, Jason Nolting, Juan Coleman** and **Russell Peterson**. Freshman of the Year honors. **Bashir Yamini** earned the honor in 1996 for placing second in the high jump, and **Jeremy Allen** earned it in 1998 for placing second in the shot put. Former Hawkeye **Ed DeLashmutt** set the Big Ten Indoor Championships 1,500 meter record (3:49.90) in 1981. That record is now retired.

LAST WEEK -- The men's and women's team hosted the Hawkeye Open Friday at the Recreation Building in Iowa City. Competing teams included Iowa, Coe, Grinnell, Wartburg and Washington. Four Hawkeyes provisionally qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships at the meet. Seniors **Andy Banse** and **Ken Kemeny** qualified in the shot put, while junior **Adam Hamilton** and senior **Chris Voller** qualified in the weight throw. The men's team crowned nine event champions at the meet.

MEN'S TEAM CAPTAINS CHOSEN -- Seniors **Ken Kemeny**, **Juan Coleman** and **Bill Neumann** are tri-captains for the 2005 season. **Kemeny** is a five-time NCAA qualifier in the shot put, the 2004 Drake Relays champion in that event and has led the team in the shot put each of the last three years. **Coleman** is a four-time NCAA qualifier in the 1,600-meter relay, and ran the lead leg on the 2001 Big Ten Outdoor Champion 400-meter relay. **Neumann** is a two-time all-American and Big Ten Champion in the javelin. He won that event in five of six meets in 2003, and is the school record holder.

2005 SIGNINGS -- The Hawkeyes inked two recruits during the early signing period in November. The men's team signed sprinter **David Chaplin** of Stone Mountain, GA, and thrower **A.J. Curtis** of Brodhead, WI.

Chaplin is a National Elite Youth All-American and was one of Georgia's nominees for the Wendy's High School Heisman Trophy. He helped his Redan High School team to the 2004 state title. His best times are 10.42 in the 100 meters and 21.25 in the 200 meters. **Curtis** won the Division II state discus title for Brodhead High School with a personal-best 180-7, which ranks sixth among returning prep discus throwers in the nation. He was also state runner-up in the shot put with a throw of 59-7, which ranks 11th among returning prep shot putters in the nation.

NEXT COMPETITION -- The men and women's teams will compete March 5 at the Last Chance Meet in Ames, IA. All events will be at Lied Recreation Center on the Iowa State University campus. Field events are schedule to start at 9:30 a.m. and running events at 10:30 a.m.

HEAD COACH LARRY WIECZOREK

Larry Wiecezorek is in his 18th season as head men's cross country coach and ninth season as head men's track and field coach at the University of Iowa. He served as an assistant track and field coach for 12 years before taking the helm in 1997. A six-time Big Ten champion (including two in cross country) and four-time all-American at Iowa, Wiecezorek once held conference marks in the one, two, three, four and five-mile runs. A member of Iowa's last Big Ten track championship team in 1967, he still owns Iowa records in the outdoor 5,000-meters and the indoor two miles, as well as third-fastest mark in the cross country 8,000 meters. He was honored for his collegiate accomplishments by being inducted into the University of Iowa's National Varsity Club Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998.

Wiecezorek has coaching experience in all events. Returning to his alma mater as a field event coach at Iowa in 1985, he developed a strong squad that included two-time Big Ten long jump champion Quinn Early, Iowa's first-ever outdoor Big Ten shot put champion Chris Gambol, who still has the third-best mark in that event in outdoor school history, and Gary Kostrubala, who was the first discus thrower in the Big Ten's to throw over 200 feet when he set Iowa's current school record of 202-4. Kostrubala was also an NCAA indoor qualifier in the shot put (60-10 3/4) with the second-best mark in that event in indoor school history.

Wiecezorek took over the men's cross country program in 1987, and has since shifted his track responsibilities to the distance corps. He coached all-American distance runner Kevin Herd to Iowa's first-ever Big Ten 10,000-meter title in 1994. In 2000, Stetson Steele earned both indoor and outdoor all-America honors, becoming the first Hawkeye distance runner to earn both in the same year since Wiecezorek in 1967. Together, Wiecezorek and Steele hold school records in five of the seven distance events.

Under Wiecezorek, the cross country team has placed sixth or higher eight times at the NCAA Regional Championships, has posted 22 all-region selections and qualified for the NCAA Championships three times. In 2002, Wiecezorek was named Midwest Regional Coach of the Year honors by the United States Cross Country Association after the Hawkeyes won the NCAA Regional for the first time in school history and

advancing to the NCAA Championships for the second time in the last five years. The Hawkeye harriers also tied a school record with five NCAA all-Region selections. Wiecezorek also coached Iowa's two Big Ten Cross Country Freshman of the Year in Jared Pittman (1993) and Reed Steele (1998).

In 2004, the Hawkeye harriers recorded their highest placing at the Big Ten Championships (3rd) and NCAA Championships (13th) under Wiecezorek. Hawkeye sophomore Micah VanDenend earned second team all-Big Ten honors with his 14th place finish at the conference meet, which was hosted by Iowa on Ashton Cross Country Course. Iowa also crowned four all-region selections as seniors Matt Esche and Tony Rakaric, and juniors Dan Haut and Adam Roche placed in the top-25 at the NCAA Midwest Regional meet.

Since Wiecezorek was named head men's track and field coach in 1997, his plan to build a strong sprint program around a national power 1,600-meter relay, and strong throws program is being realized. In his eight years at the helm, Wiecezorek has coached NCAA Champion long jumper Bashir Yamini, 23 all-Americans, 66 national qualifiers and 33 Big Ten Champions. Iowa's 1,600-meter relay won the 1999 Big Ten outdoor title and has earned all-America honors twice during Wiecezorek's tenure. The Hawkeyes recorded their highest conference indoor placing (fourth) in 1997, and their highest team finish at the Big Ten Outdoor Championships (second) in 33 years at the 1999 Big Ten outdoor meet.

When Wiecezorek joined the Iowa staff, several of his athletes were also members of the nationally-ranked Iowa football team. He has continued to foster a strong relationship with the Iowa football staff, which has resulted in outstanding contributions from several multi-sport athletes. Current NFL standout Tim Dwight was a two-time first team all-America wide receiver and return specialist for the Hawkeye football team from 1994-97, who scored a touchdown in the 1999 Super Bowl for the Atlanta Falcons. Dwight returned to Iowa City a few months later to compete for the track team during the outdoor season. He was named Male Athlete of the 1999 Big Ten Outdoor Championships after he won the 100 meters, ran the lead leg on the winning 400-meter relay and second leg on the winning 1,600-meter relay, and placed second in the 200 meters. In 2001, fullback Jeremy Allen became Iowa's only five-time all-American in the throws and the only Hawkeye to earn the honors solely in an individual event. He was a four-time Big Ten Champion and the only thrower in conference history to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors at both the indoor and outdoor conference meets.

Another of Wieczorek's goals as head coach was to create an annual outdoor home event for the Hawkeyes that would be entertaining for the community and feature outstanding competition for participating student-athletes. Now in its seventh year of existence, the annual Iowa Musco Twilight Meet is just that. Named for Musco Lighting of Oskaloosa, IA, who supplies mobile lighting equipment, the co-ed meet which featured 16 teams in 2004, starts in the late afternoon and extends into the night. In its first four years, the meet had produced 43 NCAA provisional qualifiers. Since the creation of the regional qualifying system in 2003, 130 competitors have reached qualifying standards at the twilight meet.

While improving in the league standings is considered a priority, the Hawkeyes also concern themselves with performance in the classroom. Under Wieczorek, former cross country runners Kevin Herd, Chad Schwitters and Stetson

Steele earned academic all-America honors. Iowa has had an academic all-Big Ten selection each year during his tenure, totaling 53 honorees in cross country and 47 in track.

Wieczorek came to Iowa after 11 seasons as head track coach at Proviso (IL) West High School. He also served as an assistant there for three years. His prep teams were consistent placers on the state level and several of his athletes won state titles. He served on the Illinois track advisory board and founded the prestigious Proviso Indoor Track Classic. Wieczorek was inducted into the Illinois High School Track and Cross Country Coaches Hall of Fame in 2000.

Wieczorek was born on September 11, 1946, in Chicago, IL. He received his B.S. degree in physical education from Iowa in 1969 and his M.S. degree in physical education from Northern Illinois University in 1973. His wife's name is Jackie.

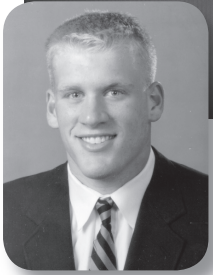

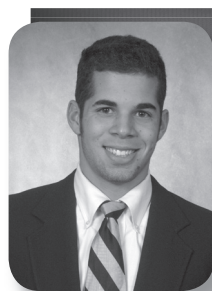
