Storylines

Up to Bat

Penn State baseball will look to earn its first Big Ten Tournament berth since 2012 when it concludes the regular season with a three-game series against lowa starting Thursday at 6:30 p.m. The series will continue Friday at 6:30 p.m. and conclude Saturday starting at 12:00 p.m. with Senior Day.

Class of 2016

A total of eight seniors will be honored following the season finale. The six student-athletes that will be honored will be **Jack Anderson**, **James Coates**, **Jared Fagnano**, **Greg Guers**, **Nick Hedge** and **Tyler Kendall**. Additionally, Jordan Donmoyer has served as a student assistant this season after playing previously, while Jesse Tull has been a team manager the past two seasons.

Senior Success

Penn State has garnered attention for its young lineup throughout the season with many newcomers stepping into big roles early, but it has been the seniors leading the team down the stretch. Over the last 10 games, seniors **Greg Guers** and **Tyler Kendall** have been the leading hitters, batting .395 and .359, respectively, while accounting for 17 of 31 RBIs, and **James Coates** is fourth on the team with a .364 on-base percentage. Senior LHP **Nick Hedge** turned in Penn State's best start on the mound during the recent stretch earning a win against Nebraska in seven innings of work, as he has reclaimed the opening game starter role. Senior **Jack Anderson** has earned saves in Penn State's last four wins.

B1G Battle

Penn State will be in search of at least two wins in order to secure its Big Ten berth. An extremely tight field from top to bottom has resulted in an intense race for the league championship and tournament seeding. Last season was the Big Ten's first with 13 teams and eight tournament slots, and a 9-14 record was good enough for Nebraska to qualify. This season, finishing at 12-12 will not be enough for teams that are not in favorable tie-breaker position, as just three games separate the third (Nebraska 13-8) and ninth and 10th-place (Illinois & Iowa, 10-11) teams.

Penn State's possibilities illustrate the craziness of the Big Ten series. The Lions can fall as low as a tie for 10th but, with help in the form of 15 games going their way, could finish as high as all alone in third. The Lions would need to sweep lowa, have Minnesota sweep Ohio State, Indiana sweep Nebraska, Illinois sweep Michigan and have Maryland win exactly two games against Michigan State.

In Control of Their Own Destiny

The good news for the Nittany Lions is that they do not need help from other teams to get into the field, currently sitting in a tie for seventh at 11-10, Penn State simply needs to win two of three to secure its berth.

Program Notes

First Varsity Sport

Baseball was Penn State's first varsity sport, playing its first games in 1875.

Five College World Series Appearances

Penn State has made five trips to the College World Series, placing as high as second in 1957. The Nittany Lions reached the CWS in 1952, 1957, 1959, 1963 and 1973. Penn State has reached the NCAA Tournament 19 times.

1996 Big Ten Champions

The 2016 season will mark the 20th anniversary of Penn State's first Big Ten Championship.

Nittany Lions in Cuba

Penn State participated in a weeklong, four-game tour of Cuba, Nov. 21-28, 2015. The Nittany Lions went 1-3 in the "Cuba Baseball Friendship Tournament." The Lions played against teams from Cuba's top "professional" league, the National Series, becoming the first United States team to play multiple teams from the league and the first to earn a victory.

The team also participated in lectures about Cuban baseball, Jose Marti and the history of Cuban sports and U.S. relations.

Penn State first played Industriales in Havana's Estadio Latinamericano, falling 2-1. With the game, Penn State became the first NCAA Division I team to compete against a Cuban National Series team, the first U.S. baseball team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties with Cuba, the second NCAA team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties (Coastal Carolina men's basketball, August 2015) and the fifth NCAA Division I baseball team to compete in post-revolutionary Cuba.

Penn State next played Ciego de Avila, the league's defending champion. Starting pitcher Victor Garcia had pitched for Cuba in the 2009 World Baseball Classic, and the Lions were defeated. 2-0.

Penn State earned the first victory for a United States team at any level over a Cuban National Series team in game three, defeating Mayabeque, 9-3.

Nittany Lions in the Pros

Accoring to Baseball-Almanac.com, 27 Nittany Lions have gone on to play Major League Baseball. A total of 72 have been drafted.

Did you know?

O.J. McDuffie is mostly known for his stellar career on the gridiron for Penn State and in the NFL, but he also played baseball in 1990. He stole 20 bases (t-3rd, single season-school history) on 21 attempts (96 percent clip), hit .336 and had a .969 fielding percentage. He was drafted by the California Angels in the 41st round of the 1991 MLB June Amateur Draft.

Medlar Field at Lubrano Park

Situated in the shadow of Beaver Stadium, the facility -- completed in June of 2006 -- is arguably one of the premier collegiate stadiums in the country.

The ballpark's signature is the breathtaking view of legendary Mt. Nittany, a local landmark that is near and dear to the heart of every Penn Stater. With the stadium opening to the east, spectators can peer unencumbered down the Nittany Valley for miles and on a clear day Tussey Mountain Ski Resort can be seen from 10 miles away.

Seating capacity for Medlar Field is 5,406 and 20 luxury suites allow area companies to treat clients and friends to an unmatched baseball experience. A party deck along the right field line provides a good place for friends to gather and the picnic pavilion beyond the left field fence is perfect for birthday parties and group outings.

Much like the rest of the park, the dimensions of the playing field are unique as well. A relatively short 325 feet to the left field pole stretches out to the deepest part of the park, the 410 foot nook in left center field. Straightaway center is 399 feet and the 320 foot right field fence is made more daunting with an 18.55 feet high wall, which commemorates the year Penn State was founded.

A 2,500 square foot press box can accommodate traveling and local media and has private broadcast booths for up to three radio teams. A large video scoreboard towers above the left field wall capable of providing up to the minute stats and video replays.

The stadium is named for 1982 Penn State graduate Anthony Lubrano and former Nittany Lion Head Coach Charles "Chuck" Medlar. Lubrano chose to honor Coach Medlar with a generous financial gift toward the realization of the long-discussed project. Coach Medlar served at the helm of the Penn State program for 19 years and guided the Lions to two College World Series appearances.

Team No. 128

Penn State is playing its 128th baseball season in program history, but will honor its previous 127 teams this season, mounting a No. 127 jersey in the dugout each game.

Iowa Series Notes

All-Time vs. Iowa

Penn State and Iowa are meeting for the first time since 2013, capping only the second break in annual meetings since the teams first met in 1994. In fact, no member of the current Penn State team ever played at Iowa, as the 2013 series took place in Happy Valley with the Lions taking two of three. The Nittany Lions hold an all-time record of 38-28 with a 20-14 edge at home. The Lions also took two of three in 2012 for a two series winning streak heading into Thursday.

Head Coach Rick Heller

lowa native Rick Heller is entering his third season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball program. Heller was tabbed as the 20th head coach in program history on July 12, 2013. Heller has been head coach at four institutions -- Iowa (2014-present), Indiana State (2009-13), Northern Iowa (1999-2009), and Upper Iowa (1987-99) -- leading all four schools to NCAA postseason play. He is one of nine coaches all-time and one of five active coaches to lead three different Division I programs to NCAA Regional play.

Scouting Iowa

lowa earned its first NCAA Regional berth since 1990 last season, but enters the weekend with a 25-24 record overall and a 10-11 mark in Big Ten play. lowa will be looking to sweep Penn State in order to guarantee itself a Big Ten tournament berth, but can also advance to the postseason with two wins and some help. The Hawkeyes are hitting .299 over their last 10 games with five regulars hitting over .300. lowa posted a .324 average at Ohio State -- its best weekend of the season -- and had 35 hits, tying a season-high for a three-game series.

Slim Margin for Error

Where Penn State is disadvantaged in the standings is in tie-breaking scenarios, thus making an 0-3 weekend fatal and a 1-2 weekend a very dangerous situation.

- The Lions only hold tie breakers over Northwestern and Purdue, who are not factoring into the tournament race. Penn State only took one of three against its nearest competitors Michigan State (12-9), Maryland (11-10) and Illinois (10-11), and lowa is 10-11, so a 1-2 weekend would give the Hawkeyes an edge.
- For Penn State to advance going 1-2 and finishing 12-12, Maryland would have to get swept by Michigan State and Illinois would need to lose two or more games to Michigan.

Hedge Reclaims Opening Starter Role

- Nick Hedge is returning to the opening night starter role after serving in that role last season.
- Hedge had been used as a reliever and mid-week starter this season until starting Friday at Nebraska. He went seven-plus innings, allowing just three runs on seven hits and four walks with five strikeouts.
- He is enjoying a career year with a 5-2 record and 2.75 ERA in 52 1/3 innings pitched, the second most of his career.
- His next start will be the 36th of his career, tying him for ninth all-time at Penn State with Mike Bellaman (1982-85.)

Shifting Into High Guers

- Greg Guers is heating up at the plate again with hits in seven of his last eight games (14-for-31, .452), three home runs a triple, double and nine RBIs.
- The stretch includes four formidable opponents: Maryland, No. 10 TCU (3 games), Pitt and Nebraska (3 games).
- Guers now leads the team with 37 RBIs, one shy of matching his single season career high.
- Guers had four two-hit games to start the streak
- He was Penn State's leading hitter against TCU going 6-for-13.
- Guers doubled and homered in the TCU finale and then hit a three-run home run each late in back-to-back games at Pitt and Nebraska.
- In the finale against Nebraska, Guers went 4-for-4 with a triple.

Lengthy Season

- Penn State has played 52 games so far this season for its most since playing 56 in 2012.
- The Lions were actually forced to cancel a game this week against Villanova, since they had over-scheduled by one game. The NCAA allows for 56 exhibition and regular season games throughout the fall and spring (not including international games), and Penn State had scheduled 57 assuming at least one would be canceled due to weather.
- Inclement weather limited Penn State to 48 games last season, canceling seven games.
- The last time Penn State played 55 regular season games was in 2008.

Improving on the Mound

Much of Penn State's improved success this season can be credited to its pitching staff, which has improved in nearly every major statistical category.

- Penn State enters the weekend with a 3.76 team ERA, which ranks 65th in the country and seventh in the Big Ten.
- Jack Anderson leads the Big Ten and ranks fifth nationally with 13 saves and ranks second in the Big Ten and 44th nationally with 27 appearances.
- Anderson's 1.44 ERA is a career low and would rank eighth nationally if he was not two innings shy of the one inning pitched per team game minimum.
- Freshman Justin Hagenman is the first Penn State pitcher to reach six wins since 2011. The last Penn State pitcher to reach seven wins was Mike Watson, who had eight in 2000.
- Penn State's three shutouts are its most since earning four in 2011.

Shortening the Game

Jack Anderson is not the only Penn State reliever having a successful season.

- Led by Anderson, the Penn State bullpen has a 3.03 ERA in 196 1/3 innings pitched with a 10-6 record and 15 saves.
- Second to Anderson in innings pitched is Dakota Forsyth, who has thrown 412 1/3 innings over 19 appearances with a 2.34 ERA and 2-3 record. He earned the win at Pitt (5/11).
- **Nick Distasio** is third in the bullpen with 32 innings pitched over 16 appearances.
- After struggling in his season debut at then-No. 15 South Carolina, Tom Mullin has posted a 3.12 ERA in 17 1/3 innings over his last seven appearances since.
- Mullin pitched the final 5 1/3 innings against No. 10 TCU in the series opener. He faced just one over the minimum in a career-long outing, yielding just two hits and a walk.

Keep Watching

Closer Jack Anderson has been named to three prestigious watch lists this season.

- Anderson was one of 40 student-athletes named to the Midseason Watch List for the 12th annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) Stopper of the Year Award.
- The award will be given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball.
- Anderson is the Big Ten's lone representative on the list.
- The NCBWA will announce five finalists for the 2016 Stopper of the Year – the Division I national saves leader and four other relief pitching standouts – on Wednesday, June 8, prior to the start of NCAA Super Regional competition. The NCBWA's All-America Committee will select the winner, with this year's recipient to be announced during the 2016 College World Series.
- Anderson was one of 70 pitchers named to the preseason watch list for the award.
- Anderson was one of 72 pitchers named to the watch list for the National Pitcher of the Year Award, presented by the National College Baseball Hall of Fame. The award, sponsored by Diamond, will be presented on July 2 in Lubbock, Texas, as part of the annual Night of Champions event. Anderson is one of six pitchers from the Big Ten on the list.
- Anderson posted a team-best 2.98 ERA in 2015 to rank ninth in the Big Ten. He also led the Lions with 29 appearances, tallying four wins and five saves. His most impressive stretch in 2015 came late against Pitt, Rutgers and Michigan State when he made appearances in six consecutive games, throwing 14 innings with a 1.93 ERA, 1-1 record and three saves.

Do you know Jack?

- Jack Anderson is a unique pitcher as he uses "submarine" style delivery.
- The throwing motion allows the reliever to pitch multiple innings on consecutive days as well as warm-up quickly in the bullpen to enter the game on a moment's notice.
- Anderson relies on deception and ball movement to keep hitters off balance and typically induces ground outs.
- Of his 26 appearances this season, only five have been for an inning or less. He is averaging just under two innings per outing with a season high of 4 2/3 (Purdue, 4/2).
- The style also minimizes extra base hits.
 Of the 160 hits Anderson has allowed in
 161 innings pitched for his career. Just 24
 have gone for extra bases: 22 doubles, two
 triples and no home runs.

Rewriting the Record Books

- Jack Anderson holds the Penn State records for career appearances and career and single-season saves.
- He currently has 96 career appearances, which ranks in a tie for eighth amongst active players.
- With a career-high 13 saves this season, Jack Anderson has 25 for his career. He surpassed Drew O'Neil (2007-08) for both. O'Neil posted a single-season record 11 in back-to-back seasons.
- His career saves total ranks 11th amongst active pitchers.

 19 of Jack Anderson's 27 appearances this season have resulted in him factoring in the decision, as he has tallied a careerhigh 13 saves, matched his career high of

- four wins, and suffered just two defeats.
- Of his two losses, the first came at Richmond (3/13) and was due to an unearned run, and the second was after entering in the eighth inning in a tie game against No. 10 TCU.
- Anderson picked up his fourth win of the season by pitching the final three innings against Northwestern (4/15).
- He pitched a season-high 4 2/3 innings to earn the win in extra innings against Purdue (4/2, G2).

More Than Batting Average

- The Lions rank sixth in the Big Ten with 196 walks.
- At first glance it might be surprising that James Coates, is drawing regular starts with a .172 batting average, but the senior's patience at the plate has resulted in a team-best 35 walks as well as a .374 on-base percentage, which ranks third on the team.
- The 35 walks rank fifth in the conference.
- Coates entered the season with just one career home run, but is tied for the team lead with three this season.
- He ranks fifth all-time at Penn State with 101 career walks, 27 shy of the record.

- Penn State has used starting lineups featuring at least three freshmen in all but six games and has had no less than two freshmen starting each game.
- The Lions have had five start on 13 occasions with a season-high of six on three occasions.
- Freshman RHP Justin Hagenman leads the team with a 6-3 record and has a 3.50 ERA.
- Freshman middle infielder Conlin Hughes has started all but three games.
- Corner infielder Willie Burger is second on the team with 34 RBIs despite playing in just 37 of 52 games.

- Haley leads the team entering the week end with a .330 batting average, 12 doubles, three triples and 20 multi-hit games. He ranks third on the squad with 27 RBIs and two home runs.
- At Northwestern (4/17), Haley matched his career high of four hits, going 4-for-6 with two doubles and three runs. The game followed his first games of back-to-back no hits.
- For the first time in his career, he has drawn starts at third base this season.

Red-Hot Riotto

- Nick Riotto owns the team's longest active hitting streak at seven games.
- He missed seven games due to injury, but returned for the Maryland series (4/29-30) and led off the second game of the series with a solo home run. It stood as the game's lone run until the eighth inning when Penn State added an insurance run.
- The lead-off batter leads the team with a .423 on-base percentage and is second with a .325 batting average.
- Riotto batted .488 during a 10-game hitting streak (3/30-4/13), going 21-for-43 with a team-high 11 RBIs, a team-high 12 runs, a home run, two doubles and three walks and two hit-by-pitches for a .531 onbase percentage.
- It tied for the second longest streak for a Nittany Lion this year. Jim Haley posted a 10-game streak and an 11-game streak.
- His home run at Lafayette (4/6) was his first this season and the second of his career.

Sacrifice Flies

- With 30 sacrifice flies, Penn State leads the Big Ten and ranks 14th in the country.
- Tyler Kendall ranks third in the Big Ten and 11th in the country with seven.
- Willie Burger is fourth in the league and 27th nationally with six.
- Kendall needs one more sac fly to tie the PSU single-season record, and with 11 for his career, needs two more to tie the career record.
- Greg Guers has 11 sacrifice flies at Penn State to rank two shy of the record.

<u>Last Time Out</u> Huskers Take Series from Penn State

- Penn State won the opening contest, but Nebraska rallied with victories in the final two.
- The win was Penn State's first ever Nebraska after meeting just four times previously.
- Greg Guers put the first game out of reach with his second three-run home run in as many games and his third game in a row with a home run.
- LHP Nick Hedge enjoyed one of the finest outings of his career, allowing three runs on seven hits and four walks with a season high-matching five strikeouts in seven-plus innings pitched. He kept Nebraska (31-18, 11-8 Big Ten) scoreless through the first six innings in his first Big Ten and weekend start of the season.

at Pitt (5/13) Penn State Rallies to Sweep Pitt

- Penn State rallied from a three-run deficit and broke open a tie game with five runs in the eighth inning.
- Senior RHP Jack Anderson secured the win to earn his team record 12th save of the season.
- The Nittany Lions trailed the Panthers 5-2 after the fourth inning, but outscored them 9-1 over the final five innings. The game was tied 6-6 entering the eighth inning, but catcher Alex Malinsky slapped a single through the right side to drive in the goahead run, an error allowed another run to score, and then Greg Guers blasted a three-run home run to right field to put the game out of reach.
- Tyler Kendall powered the Lion offense throughout the game, going 3-for-5 with three RBIs.
- The Nittany Lions struggled with command by issuing 12 walks and hitting three to

- nullify its 12-9 edge in hits. However, four Pitt innings ended with the bases loaded as it stranded 18 for the night. Conversely, Penn State stranded just five bases runners.
- A season-best outing by LHP Nick Hedge and multi-run first and fifth innings led Penn State to a shutout victory over Pitt earlier in the season.
- Hedge set season highs for innings-pitched (6.0) and strikeouts (5). He allowed just two hits and a walk.
- To complete the combined shutout, RHP Dakota Forsyth entered in the seventh and struck out three and walked one in two innings, and RHP Jared Fagnano struck out one and allowed a hit in the ninth.

In-State Winning Streak

Penn State has won its last 12 games against Pennsylvania opponents dating back to 2014. Penn State is 5-0 so far this season with two-game series wins over Pitt (4/5, 5/11), Lafayette (4/6) and Bucknell (4/13,19). The Lions went 5-0 against in-state foes Pitt, Villanova and Bucknell last season, with weather forcing the cancellation of a contest against Lafayette.

Anderson Named CoSIDA Academic All-District

Recent graduate Jack Anderson has been successful in the classroom and on the field, as the relief pitcher was elected to the Academic All-District First Team for District 2 (D.C., Delaware, Kentucky, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and West Virginia), as selected by the Collegiate Sports Information Directors of America (ČoSIDA.) A supply chain and information systems major, he received his degree before Penn State's Sunday game against No. 10 TCU. In yet another milestone for the 2016 Nittany Lions, Anderson is the first to receive Academic All-District honors since David Lutz in 2010 and the 12th in program history. As a first team selection, Anderson will be considered for Academic All-America honors later this month.

TCU (5/7-8)

Nittany Lions Battle Horned Frogs to the End Penn State was swept in a three-game home series against No. 10 TCU.

- The Nittany Lions were in all three games late. Penn State had the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth in both games during a doubleheader. The tying run was at the plate in the first game and the goahead run was on second in the second game.
- The finale was tied 5-5 entering the eighth inning.
- Greg Guers and Nick Riotto had strong weekends at the plate, both going 6-for-13 (.462). Guers hit his fourth home run of the season.

Uncommon Opponent

Penn State had a rare late-season non-conference series.

- No. 10 TCU became the first team from Texas and the first from the Big 12 other than West Virginia to play on the diamond at Penn State (5/7-8).
- The last time Penn State hosted a College World Series participant from the previous season was Indiana in 2014, and the last non-conference opponent to visit after going to Omaha was Kent State in 2013.
- TCU was the highest ranked nonconference opponent to ever play at Medlar Field at Lubrano Park and the highest ranked since No. 8 Illinois played at Medlar in April last season.

Penn State Gets One From Maryland

- Maryland claimed the opener and finale in a three-game series with Penn State.
- Jack Anderson broke Penn State's career saves record with his 23rd and matched the single season record with his 11th this year, as Penn State opened a doubleheader with a 2-0 victory.
- Sal Biasi, Dakota Forsyth and Anderson allowed right fielder Nick Riotto's leadoff home run in the bottom of the first inning to stand as the difference.
- It was Penn State's first shutout in a Big Ten game since May 17, 2013 against Michigan State (9-0) and its third combined shutout of the season.

Kent State (4/20, 27)

Midweek Success Spoiled

- Penn State saw a six-game winning streak and a 14-game midweek winning streak come to an end with a loss at Kent State (4/20).
- It was Kent State that had last defeated the Lions during the week on April 1, 2015.

Scholly Returns

Against Kent State, **Tim Scholly** made his first appearance since 2014. He threw a scoreless inning.

Guers Heats Up

- Greg Guers was batting just .189 through his first 24 games dating to the April 1 game against Purdue, but hit at a .510 clip over the next 12 to raise his season average 131 points to a season-high .320.
- Guers posted a season-high seven-game hitting streak (4/2-4/20), of which the first six games were all multi-hit games.

Rutgers (4/22-24)

Sloniger Named B1G Baseball Freshman of the Week

- Catcher Ryan Sloniger batted .500 for the week and belted his first home run as a Nittany Lion to earn the Big Ten Baseball Freshman of the Week award for the week of Apr. 18-24.
- In three starts behind the dish, Sloniger went 5-for-10, getting hits in all three games he played, and tying for the team lead with five RBIs for the week.
- Sloniger played major roles in Penn State's victories over Bucknell and Rutgers. Against Bucknell, he went 2-for-4 with a double and his third four-RBI game of the season. He then helped lead the Lions past Rutgers in the series finale Sunday, as he went 2-for-3 with his first home run and two runs scored in the 7-5 victory.

Collecting B1G Hardware

Lions have collected six individual weekly honors from the Big Ten this season.

- The six awards are the most for Penn State since 2007 (seven).
- Penn State's six awards this season are one more than the previous four combined.
- A Penn State student-athlete collected at least one Big Ten weekly award threestraight weeks, marking just the third time the Lions have assembled a three-week streak.
- Three different Nittany Lions have been named Player of the Week (Willie Burger, Nick Riotto and Greg Guers) for the second time ever and the first since 2003 (Wes Reohr, Mike DeRenzo, Clint Eury).
- Entering the season, Penn State had never had multiple winners of the rookie weekly honor, which was first introduced in 2011.
- Prior to Burger and Sloniger, Jim Haley (2014) and Sal Biasi (2015) were the only previous Penn State freshman honorees.

Penn State baseball received National Letters of Intent from five signees in November. The class, which will begin participation in the 2016-17 academic year, includes two pitchers, an infielder, an outfielder and one two-way player. Three of the five are Pennsylvania natives, including **Dante Biasi** (Hazel Township/Hazelton Area), the younger brother of current Penn State baseball sophomore **Sal Biasi**, **Myles Gayman** (Greencastle/Greencastle Antrim) and **Mason Nadeau** (Lansdale/North Penn). **Cole Bartels** (Belmont/Belmont H.S.) hails from Massachusetts, while **Logan Goodnight** (Wheeling/The Linsly School) is the top-ranked player from West Virginia.

Bucknell (4/13, 19)

Bucknell Swept

- The win (4/19) extended Penn State's winning streak to six and completed a twogame series-sweep of Bucknell.
- It was also the Nittany Lions' 11th-straight victory over an in-state opponent.

At Northwestern (4/15-17)

Guers Named NCBWA National Hitter of the Week

Greg Guers batted .765 from Apr. 11-17, making just four outs in four games going 13-for-17 with eight RBIs, a home run, two doubles and five stolen bases. He also added two walks for a .789 on-base percentage.

Guers, Burger Draw Weekly Big Ten Baseball Accolades

- Greg Guers and Willie Burger were both recognized for outstanding offensive performances, as Guers became the third different Nittany Lion to be named the Big Ten Baseball Player of the Week this season and Burger earned his second freshman accolade.
- Burger returned from injury to bat .467 (7for-15) with a home run and five RBIs for the week in his first action since March 26.

Milestone Wins

- The sweep of Northwestern was Penn State's first on the road in conference action since taking four at Illinois in 2004.
- At 8-4 in the Big Ten, it was the Lions best start since posting the same record in 2000 (NCAA Super Regional) year.

Nittany Lions Sweep Wildcats

- Greg Guers and James Coates both slugged two-run home runs as Penn State completed a sweep of Northwestern with an 11-3 victory Sunday.
- Guers went 9-for-13 during the three-game Northwestern series.
- In the opener, Willie Burger hit a tworun home run and Evanston-native Jack Anderson pitched the final three innings to earn the win as Penn State defeated Northwestern, 4-2.

Michigan State (4/8-10)

B1G Finishes

The finales of Penn State's first three Big Ten series featured ninth-inning or later dramatics.

- An error on a chopper hit by Jordan Bowersox in the bottom of the ninth, gave the Lions a walk-off win against Michigan State (4/10). The Lions trailed by one entering the inning.
- The week prior, an RBI- double by catcher Alex Malinsky gave the Lions a walk-off win over Purdue (4/2, G2) in the bottom of the 12th inning. The Lions trailed by two entering the inning.
- Willie Burger hit a bases-clearing double in the top of the ninth inning at Illinois (3/26, G2) to break open a 1-1 game.

Riotto Named Big Ten Player of the Week

Nick Riotto was named the Big Ten Baseball Player of the Week for the week of Apr. 4-10.

- Riotto went 12-for-22 (.545) with a .583 onbase percentage, home run, two doubles, eight runs scored and six RBIs. He had four-multi-hit games, including three threehit games.
- Perhaps his most important performance came in Penn State's lone victory over Michigan State Sunday, as he accounted for five of the seven runs Penn State scored by crossing home plate three times and driving in two more. He reached base four

- times going 3-for-4 with two RBIs and a hit by pitch, with the latter coming in the decisive bottom of the ninth, and he later scored the game-tying run.
- To start the week, Riotto led the Nittany Lions at the plate in its biggest win of the season based on RPI, going 3-for-4 with a double and two runs against Pitt (No. 24 in RPI at the time). He then led the Nittany Lions at Lafayette the very next day going 3-for-5 with a home run, double, four RBIs, three runs and a walk.

Nittany Lions Rally Against Spartans

Michigan State took two of three games from Penn State, as the Nittany Lions rallied in the finale for a walk-off win.

- Penn State was limited to six hits and no runs in the opener, as Michigan State ended Penn State's winning streak at eight and home winning streak at 10.
- For the second weekend in a row, Penn State concluded a Big Ten baseball series with a walk-off win, rallying from a one-run deficit in the bottom of the ninth to defeat Michigan State, 7-6.
- With two outs in the bottom of the ninth and Michigan State leading 6-5, **Tyler Kendall** drove in the tying run and advanced **Jim Haley** to third with a single to right field. Freshman **Jordan Bowersox** followed with a high-bouncing chopper to the second baseman but the throw pulled the first baseman off the bag, allowing Bowersox to reach safely and Haley's game-winning run to count.

Pitt and at Lafayette (4/5-6) Penn State Extends Winning Streak to Eight

- The pair of games completed a stretch where Penn State won 12 of 14 games and eight in a row for its longest winning streak since the 2000 NCAA Super Regional team won 11 in a row.
- The Nittany Lions started 10-1 at home, dropping only the opener for a Medlar Field at Lubrano Park record 10-game streak.
- The Lions last won 10 in a row at home in 1989, and that streak continued into 1990 before ending at 15.

Very Offensive

- Penn State prevailed in a slug fest with Lafayette as strong winds blowing out led to a combined 32 runs, 30 hits and four home runs.
- Jack Anderson capped the game by making his Penn State record 86th career pitching appearance.
- Penn State led by as much as 16-2 after the top of the fourth inning, sending 13 batters to the plate in the third for nine runs.
- Its 20 runs were the most it scored since scoring 22 against Michigan State in 2010.
- Nick Riotto led the Nittany Lions going 3-for-5 with a home run, double, four RBIs and three runs. Jim Haley also went 3-for-5 and added three RBIs and two runs, and Ryan Sloniger matched Riotto's four RBIs.
- RHP Nick Distasio earned the win in relief, striking out a career-high seven in 4 2/3 innings of work. He allowed four runs on five hits and two walks.
- Alex Nickels led Lafayette with a grand slam and a three-run home run after entering the game in the top of the fourth inning.
- Penn State scored the game's first 13 runs, scoring nine in the third inning- all with two outs. Lafayette fought back and came as close as 16-11.

Purdue (4/1-2)

Penn State Sweeps Purdue

- Penn State swept Purdue for a 4-2 start to Big Ten play.
- The finale was won in the 12th inning on a walk-off double by Alex Malinsky.

Unlikely Hero

- In the second game, the teams were tied from the sixth inning until the top of the 12th. Jack Anderson helped keep it close with a season-high 4 2/3 innings pitched, entering in the eighth inning.
- The Boilermakers broke the tie in the top of the 12th with two unearned runs, but with runners on the corners in the bottom half and one out, Alex Malinsky was an unlikely hero.
- Malinsky entered the game defensively in the top of the 12th and was just 1-for-14 on the season. His lone hit was in the season's second game in February, but he delivered on a 1-1 pitch by driving a liner to leftcenter, and it split the outfielders, allowing Jordan Bowersox and James Coates to both score.

At Illinois (3/25-26)

Milestone Win at Illinois

- Penn State dropped its first two contests at Illinois but broke a tie game open in the ninth inning to win the finale.
- Freshmen Justin Hagenman and Willie Burger were the heroes for Penn State. Hagenman pitched 8 1/3 innings while Burger hit a pinch-hit, bases-clearing double in the top of the ninth inning to break a close game open.
- It snapped a pair of Illinois winning streaks.
 The defending Big Ten champions had won their last 22 regular season games against Big Ten opponents. The Fighting Illini had also won the previous 11 games against Penn State dating back to 2013. The Lions had won the previous five meetings and had last won in Champaign in 2010.
- Hagenman became the first Lion to pitch beyond the eighth since Greg Welsh threw a complete game on May 17, 2013 against Michigan State buy going 8 1/3 innings.
- Hagenman was charged with three runs

 an unearned run in the first and two
 earned runs in the ninth when runners he
 was responsible for scored after he left. He
 matched his career high of six strikeouts
 and allowed just four hits and two walks.

Penn State earned its 300th Big Ten win by defeating Illinois (3/26). The Nittany Lions joined the conference in 1992.

Niagara (3/18-3/20) Burger Named B1G Player and Freshman of the Week

Freshman infielder **Willie Burger** claimed both the Big Ten Baseball Player and Freshman of the Week honors for the week of Mar. 14-20. Burger drove in six runs, batted .636 (7-for-11) and scored four times. His best game was in the series finale when he went 4-for-4 with four runs, three RBI and two walks. He became the first Nittany Lion to receive the conference player of the week honor since 2012 (Jordan Steranka). It marks the second consecutive season Penn State has had a freshman of the week, as **Sal Biasi** received the honor following the same week last year (March 23, 2015.)

Swing and Connect

For the first time since April 26, 2008 at Illinois, Penn State batters did not strikeout a single time in against Niagara (G1).

Ouch

- Niagara plunked seven Penn State batters in (3/19, G2), the most since Penn State began computerized stats in 2004.
- It was the most hit batsmen for Penn State since Bucknell plunked five Lions on April 15, 2015.
- Niagara struggled to find the strike zone early in the second game, as the Lions sent 12 batters to the plate with none getting a hit off three different Niagara pitchers. The six runs were the result of an error, six walks, two hit batsmen and a wild pitch.
- In total, seven Niagara pitchers combined to issue eight walks and hit seven.

Spring Break Trip (3/5-3/13) Three-Hitter

- Eli Nabholz, Nick Hedge and Jack Anderson combined to hold Duke to just three hits (3/9)
- It was the fewest hits allowed by Penn State since Central Connecticut State managed just two hits against Taylor Lehman and Sal Biasi 3/29/15.

Finding a Way to Win

Penn State totaled just seven hits in a pair of games against UNCW and Duke, but won both by scores of 5-4 and 2-1.

Season Notes

Young Experience

Penn State has a young pitching staff with many underclassmen in key roles, but many pitched as freshmen. Returning freshmen from last season (Schuyler Bates, Sal Biasi, Marko Boricich, Nick Distasio, Taylor Lehman and Jake Pilewicz) accounted for 161 2/3 of last season's 424 innings pitched, while graduating seniors and non-returners accounted for just 38 1/3 innings pitched.

New Lineup

Penn State lost four starting position players. Most notably was outfielder Aaron Novak, who led the 2015 team in batting average (.326), hits (59) and on-base percentage (.398). Novak was one of only four players to start at least 45 of PSU's 48 contests. Another was infielder Taylor Skerpon, who started in all but two games during the 2015 season. Skerpon finished third on the roster in runs scored (32) and fourth in hits (45) while providing stellar defense and second base.

Summer Success

Some Nittany Lions saw success in the summer.

- RHP Jack Anderson finished with a 3.64 ERA pitching in the prestigious Cape League. He went 3-2 with 32 strikeouts in 31 innings pitched over 20 appearances. Cotuit finished with a 17-27 record and was eliminated in the first round of the playoffs.
- OF Nick Riotto was named first-team All-Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League after earning a mid-season all-star nod. He finished third in the league with a .385 batting average in 29 games, belting a home run and 14 RBIs and swiping 11 bases.
- RHP Dakota Forsyth helped the Redbirds win their fourth consecutive Cal Ripken League Championship. He posted a 1.83 ERA and 4-1 record in nine appearances with seven starts, totaling 34 1/3 innings pitched and 27 strikeouts. If the first game of the best-of-three championships series, Forsyth worked 4 2/3 innings, allowing two runs on six hits and three walks.

Rob Cooper is in his third season at the helm of the Nittany Lion baseball program in 2016. He was selected as the 14th head baseball coach in Penn State history on August 9, 2013 after a successful nine-year stint as the head coach at Wright State.

Cooper brought an accomplished resume to Penn State that included three NCAA tournament appearances as a head coach and five more as an assistant coach, including two trips to the College World Series with Miami (Florida). As a head coach, seven of the players he coached were drafted, including eventual Major Leaguer Joe Smith, and 12 more signed professional free agent contracts. He was twice named the Horizon League Coach of the Year and guided Wright State to three league tournament championships and two regular season championships after the team suffered six losing seasons in the seven years before his arrival.

Not shy about stating his goal of building a Nittany Lion program that will compete in Omaha in June, Cooper has made tremendous progress in just two seasons in Happy Valley. The Lions totaled 18 wins against a schedule ranking in the bottom third nationally during his inaugural campaign, but rose to the challenge under his leadership in 2015, matching the previous season's 18 wins despite playing a schedule that ranked in the upper third in difficulty and involved 10 games against top-25 opponents.

A major part of Cooper's scheduling philosophy involves getting the Lions in "NCAA regional environments" to prepare them for success beyond Memorial Day. The Lions certainly did that in 2015, travelling to traditional powers Texas A&M and South Carolina. Five 2015 opponents ultimately advanced to the NCAA Regionals and two advanced to the Super Regionals.

The early season tests paid off in Big Ten play, as the Nittany Lions rallied from a 7-0 deficit against No. 21 Indiana for their first win over a ranked opponent in three seasons and gave eighth-ranked Illinois its biggest scare during its record winning streak, battling for 15 innings. Penn State ultimately won one more conference game than the year before, despite the Big Ten enjoying arguably its most competitive season to date with a league-record five teams earning NCAA tournament bids.

Penn State's improvement on the field could be traced to the development of its returners and the ability for freshmen from Cooper's first recruiting class to step up in vital roles. Senior Aaron Novak and redshirt junior Greg Guers both enjoyed career seasons, as the duo combined for 12 of Penn State's 16 home runs on the season after the team hit just five the year before. The 220 percent increase dramatically outpaced the national average of 44 percent credited to lowered seams on the game ball. Talented sophomore shortstop Jim Haley also became an offensive force, leading PSU in batting in Big Ten games with a .333 average.

On the mound, juniors Nick Hedge and Jack Anderson enjoyed their finest seasons to date, while newcomers accounted for nearly half of the team's inning pitched. Freshmen Taylor Lehman and Nick Distasio drew weekend starts. while Sal Biasi tallied three saves as a key reliever.

Although Cooper has proven himself to be a great head coach on the field, his strong belief in the first part of the term "student-athlete" is perhaps the top reason he has proven to be an excellent fit at PSU. Even with state-of-the-art facilities, the chance to take on elite competition and a program history that includes five trips to the College World Series, Cooper cites the value of a Penn State degree as one of the top reasons to join his program. The last message to the team before departing the bus upon return from a road trip – no matter the hour – is often a stern reminder to be in class on time and take care of school work.

In two years at PSU, 23 of Cooper's student-athletes have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors. As a military history buff, his speeches to the team often include historical references. He even arranged to have the team visit the

headquarters of the Navy SEAL Team VI headquarters and speak with a pair of Navy SEALs – one a Penn State alum – during a travel day on the team's 2015 spring break trip.

Shortly after Cooper accepted the PSU head coaching position in 2014, the California native traveled to Taichung, Taiwan to serve as the head coach of USA Baseball's 18U National Team at the IBAF U18 World Cup. Cooper steered Team USA to an 8-1 record in World Cup play, including seven consecutive victories to win the gold medal.

Not long after the triumph in Taiwan, Cooper received one of the highest honors bestowed in the profession, as he was announced as the Rod Dedeaux USA Baseball Coach of the Year. With the honor, Cooper became just the 16th individual in the award's history to receive the accolade, joining the likes of Scott Brosius, Davey Johnson and Tommy Lasorda.

Cooper was also a member of the coaching staff for the 2007 and 2009 USA College National teams. The 2007 team earned a silver medal at the Pan Am Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Fourteen of the 20 players on the 2007 team reached the Major Leagues, including 2013 All-Star Pedro Alvarez. Fourteen of the 22 members of the 2009 team have also reached the Major Leagues, including 2015 All-Stars Gerrit Cole and Yasmani Grandall.

Cooper methodically built Wright State into a perennial contender in the Horizon League with seven 30-win seasons, two Horizon League regular-season titles, three Horizon League Tournament crowns and six Horizon League Championship game appearances. In nine seasons starting in 2005, Cooper accumulated a 286-230 record, including a pair of wins over No. 1-ranked opponents Virginia (3/5/10) and Georgia (3/24/09).

Cooper saw 47 players earn all-conference accolades and 18 garner all-newcomer honors. He also produced five Horizon League Players of the Year, one Pitcher of the Year, three Relief Pitchers of the Year and two Newcomers of the Year.

During the 2012 campaign, Cooper recorded career win No. 250. The Raiders also posted the program's secondlongest winning streak ever as they reeled off 14-straight victories during March and April, outscoring their opponents 185-67 in the process. The 2011 season saw Cooper record his 200th coaching victory and earn the Horizon League Coach of the Year award for the second consecutive year. The Raiders won their second-straight Horizon League regular season title with a 16-7 record, claimed the league tournament crown by winning three-straight games and advanced to the NCAA Regionals in College Station, Texas. In 2010, Cooper was selected as the Horizon League Coach of the Year as WSU finished 31-25. The Raiders won the Horizon League regular-season title with a mark of 17-6, the first regular-season conference crown for the program since the 1997 squad won the Midwestern Collegiate Conference title. The 2009 Wright State Raiders compiled a 33-30 overall record and returned to the NCAA tournament following a Horizon League tournament championship.

At season's end in 2008, Cooper watched as a school and Horizon League record three players were drafted during the 2008 Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft. Horizon

League Player of the Year Jeremy Hamilton, Justin Parker and Ross Vagedes were all selected during the draft in the fifth, sixth and 35th rounds, respectively. The 2008 squad set school records for batting average and slugging percentage, while Hamilton (.410) became the fifth WSU player to post a batting average of .400 or better.

In 2007, Wright State enjoyed one of the most prolific offensive seasons in school history as it broke three career records and 11 single-season school records. Ross Oeder, now a Penn State assistant coach on Cooper's staff, was named the Horizon League Player of the Year and garnered second team All-America Honors. The 2006 edition of the Raiders set six school records and posted the most season wins in five years. Cooper's squad defeated nationally-ranked TCU on the road, topped national-powerhouse Notre Dame in South Bend and was on the brink of an upset against eventual national champion Oregon State in the NCAA Corvallis Regional.

Before coming to WSU, Cooper served as the hitting coach, recruiting coordinator and bench coach at Oral Roberts University. A perennial power of the Mid-Continent Conference (now Summit League), ORU advanced to the inals of the NCAA Austin Regional in 2004, beating TCU twice and losing to top-seeded Texas 7-3, and 7-5. The Golden Eagles, who finished with an overall mark of 50-11 in 2004, also boasted regular-season wins over national powers Arkansas, Arizona State (twice), Creighton (three times) and Wichita State. Oral Roberts also had five players selected in the Major League Baseball draft, two honored as All-Americans by the ABCA and three named All-Americans by the College Baseball Insiders website.

Cooper began his coaching career at national power Miami (Fla.), spending two seasons (1994-95) as a student/ graduate assistant on the Hurricanes' staff. While at Miami, Cooper helped lead the Hurricanes to College World Series berths in 1994 and 1995.

Cooper spent the 1996 season as an assistant and team academic coordinator at Wake Forest, then moved on to Tulane for the next two seasons, serving as the Green Wave's hitting coach. During his tenure as an assistant coach at Miami and Tulane, his teams advanced to NCAA Tournament in 1994-95 (Miami) and 1998 (Tulane). In 1997, the Green Wave won the Conference USA regular-season crown.

Cooper left Tulane following the 1998 season and returned to Sacramento City College, where he starred in the early 1990's before lettering at Miami in 1993. In his first season at Sac City, Cooper helped guide SCC to the California Community College State Tournament championship. Sac City was then the runner-up in 2002.

Along with his college coaching experience, Cooper also was an associate scout for the Los Angeles Dodgers from 1990-92 and has been selected to four coaching stints with USA Baseball in 2000, 2007, 2009 and 2013.

Cooper earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Miami in 1994 and a master's in sports sciences/administration from Miami in 1996. He is married to his wife, Maureen, and has two sons, Jake and Tyson.
